The Parish Council has responded to the "Review of Polling Districts and Places" and asked that the Community Hall be retained as a Polling Station.

### **VARIOUS**

The Government has issued new rules allowing press and public to film and digitally report meetings.

The Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 received Royal Assent on 30<sup>th</sup> January and sets out a new audit framework for local public authorities which are currently covered by the Audit Commission regime. Small authorities with an annual turnover not exceeding £25,000, including parish councils, will be exempt from routine external audit. Instead these parish councils will be subject to new transparency requirements.

Bunny Parish Council, in partnership with NCC, RBC and Nottingham University, are to undertake the preservation/conservation of the historic wall around Bunny Park and will be applying to the Heritage Lottery Fund to help fund this project. Bradmore Parish Council would send a letter in support of the application.
