Electoral register – ARE YOU ON IT?

Your vote matters – but can you vote? Only if you're on the register. You must get on the electoral register by Monday 20 April. Three elections take place on Thursday 7 May – General, Borough and Parish. The 2015 elections are the biggest since 1979.

The way you register changed in 2014 under Individual Electoral registration (IER) – individuals now have to register themselves, rather than under the old system where a household was registered. Register at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Don't leave it to the deadline to register, as we may need more information to prove your identity, before we register you.

All the information you need – deadlines, what to do, how to do it, whether you are on the register, postal and proxy voting and more can be found online or by calling us. You can also find out who is standing for election, your nearest polling station and a FAQ which should answer most common questions. The Clerk attended a Town and Parish Forum held on 11th February. Which focused on Planning Legislation and the forthcoming Elections (Parliamentary, Borough and Parish).

Concerns remain on the short-changing by some principal councils of Government funding for council tax support. The National Association of Local Councils identified more than 30 such councils this financial year, and its research shows that the number of principal councils not passing on any council tax support funding to town and parish councils will increase in 2015-16. Rushcliffe Borough Council are known to be considering this step.
