CORRESPONDENCE

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Grants were being offered to commemorate the Great War but none of the permitted categories were applicable to Bradmore.

Consultation on Spending Proposals (2016/2017). The Parish Council has responded to the proposals regarding the cutbacks on transport which would affect schoolchildren, libraries and other services. www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/budget.

The National Association of Local Councils is currently drawing up a new Audit Regime for Town and Parish Councils. More information will be given when known.

FINANCE

Budget - The Transitional Protection from the Rushcliffe Borough Council towards the Precept has now ceased, resulting in the Parish Council having to raise the Precept from £2,940 to £3,000. Cllr Adair had given £100 from the NCC Community Support Scheme to assist with any forthcoming projects.

Funding totalling £1,120 has been received from the Nottingham Association of Local Councils to help towards the cost of launching the website. Cllr Adair offered assistance for funding in the future if required.

PARISH WEBSITE

The village website is in the final stages of being launched. It would be very good to get more input from younger residents than had been received to date. Sheila Clark has kindly expressed a willingness to assist in the development of the village history section.

Report circulated prior to the meeting. Cllr Colwill had contacted the NCC for advice on removing a tree trunk which is blocking a stile situated near Rancliffe House on Loughborough Road. Cllr Colwill confirmed that cyclists had a right of way on Bridleways but not Footpaths.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (Cllr S Maxwell)

Recent crime figures and information from the last PPSG meeting had been posted to the website. Future information would also be posted on the website. Cllr Maxwell would investigate the possibility of procuring supplies of the Smartwater solution for residents.

PARKING AND SAFETY

Cllr Maxwell has been looking at the problem of parking on Farmer Street and the possibility of having visibility mirrors sited at both corners on Farmer Street. Residents would be informed of the outcome.
