

TO THE REGISTRAR GENERAL OF BIRTHS, DEATHS, AND
MARRIAGES IN ENGLAND.

I the undersigned Joseph Nixon of Bradmore in the County of Nottingham Farmer Do hereby, under and by virtue of an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to amend the law relating to the certifying and registering Places of Religious Worship of Protestant Dissenters," certify that a certain Building known by the name of Wesleyan Methodist Chapel situated at Bradmore in the County aforesaid within the Superintendent Registrar's District of Basford is forthwith intended to be used, and will be forthwith used as a Place of Meeting for Religious Worship by a Congregation or Assembly of Protestant Dissenters from the Church of England of the Denomination called Wesleyan Methodists. And I request that this Certificate may be recorded in the General Register Office pursuant to the said Act. Dated this tenth day of May 1854.
