

BRADMORE PARISH CONSTABLE'S ACCOUNTS 1779-1903

Who governed the locals before Local Government? Who cleared the drains and mended the roads before Severn Trent and the Highways Dept.? Who provided social services before Social Services Dept.? Who dealt with law-breakers before the Police? In village communities, the answer is the parish or "vestry" Constable. He (never she!) was always a ratepayer, and of sufficient financial standing to be able to wait for reimbursement of expenses. Elected by the other ratepayers in the village for one year at a time, he took on an exhausting list of responsibilities.

It was the Constable who called local folk out to serve in the militia when an army was needed, and apprehended local miscreants, sending them on to the magistrates' court. He collected local taxes and had power to make payments to the deserving poor, some of whom lived in "Town Houses", the precursors of later council houses. He did a lot to support paupers, providing employment such as repairing the Town Houses or acting as village "crier" to announce sales of goods. He paid for clothing for their children and found them apprenticeships. He paid medical expenses when they were sick (including gin and brandy, for medicinal purposes of course!) and paid their funeral expenses. He could send people to the Workhouse, or to hospital. And he had to make sure that anyone passing through the village – vagrant, tramp, migrant, soldier going home from the wars – was supervised and if necessary helped until they moved on into the next parish. All this came to an abrupt end during the early 1800s, as various Acts of Parliament rationalised powers and absorbed those of the Constables into the modern systems of local government.

We are very fortunate in Bradmore that our Constables' accounts records survive from 1779, though they dwindle to almost nothing by 1850 with further occasional entries up to 1903 as the Waywarden's accounts. They are often repetitive, and very detailed, but give flashes of vivid (and often amusing) insight into the realities of 18th and early 19th century life here in our village, and they have formed a vital element in the histories of the village families.

The originals are held in Nottinghamshire County Archives, and a transcript is shown here - a resource to dip into, and to enjoy!

Ricd Attenborough Proes to pay to Willm Olevr the sum of 12 pounds if the Nebers of the said parish refosses to pay the said Willm Olever 12 silons a yare for the term of 20 yares as the agrement is as he is to Bueld it a Coveing to ac le padonmt.

Disbursements of George Attenborough constable of Bradmore for 1779.

Starts August 16th, paid 4/6 for the book. Weekly payments to Sarah Tompson, 1/6, Mary Smith, 2/6, Ann Manchester, 1/6, and Mary Brown 1/-. Sarah Tompson had 7/6 for her quarter's rent. Payments for passes at 1d each for travellers passing through.

Payments for catching sparrows to Thomas James, 1d. Samuel Taylor, for rat catching, 14/-, and another 6/5 later.

Mary Stevenson had half a strike of Bencorn, 2/-. Mr Brotherhood received £1/4/- for John Allsop's rent, by quittance. Ann Manchester and Mary Stevenson had 52 cwt coals, £1/10/4, and Mary Smith and Mary Brown had 62 cwt coals, £1/16/2.

At the meeting at Clifton, paid 2/6 for 3 bills and the freeholders' bill 1/-, and claimed expenses 1/10. October, paid at the sessions for a dubble quarter's pay, 4/4, and claimed expenses of 2/-. Fine to the Clerk of the Peace 1/6. Meeting at Clifton for 10 quarters pay, 18/1, and expenses 1/8; 3 bills 3/6.

Oct.25th, Common Fine 4d.

November, when Joseph Leeson went to agree with Wilford, 1/6d.

Fetching a quarter of lime from Leake Hills for Thomas Attewell, 4/-.

1780, January, paid Mary Brown for doing for Ann Manchester, 3/-, and to Mary Stevenson for doing for Ann Manchester 6d. Mary Bennet for doing for Ann Manchester 6d. Mr Stevenson and Richard Bennet for burying Ann Manchester, 2/6. To John Brown for 4 lb mutten for Ann Manchester, 1/-.

John James for a brest of veale 4 1/2d, and 1 lb butter for Ann Manchester 8d, a coffin and other expenses 10/6. Received from Ann Manchester's effect, £6/7/8.

Widow Letherland's rent, 12/6. Weekly payments to Sarah Tompson, Mary Smith and Mary Brown, and passes to travellers. To 2 soldgers with a pass, 4d. Sam Taylor, 5/4.

At sessions, a double quarter's pay 4/1, and claimed expenses 6/- Paid 2/- for making duplicates. 6/8 for the book keeping. Last entry is for 24th January.

Total disbursements £49/10/7 1/2d. Received two 6d levies £38, a 2d levy £6/6/8, Ann Manchester's effects, and brought forward from old constable's accounts, total £52/11/6 1/2d.

Coals for Mary Stevenson and Mary Brown, and Joseph Priestly. December, coal for Ann Priestley. Mary Stevenson also had 2 cwt coals when we met about Joseph Leason at Lanes, 1/6. Passes to travellers. Paid 6d to a poor man that was sick. To a woman and 2 children with a pass, 2d. Paid the militia man's wife £1/11/6. To a poor man for lodging and supper, 6d. To a poor woman that was ill with 3 children, 1/-.

John Allsop's rent £1/4/-, and 12/- later. £1/1/- to clothe his boy. Expenses when we went about Allsop's children, £1/-/10, and one week's pay for them 3/6. To John Allsop's boy for clothes 12/6. Expenses when we went about John Allsop, 1/2. Oct 11th went to the Sessions on John Allsop's account, 8/9, and on 16th 4/- when we were agreed about John Allsop.

Feb 2 at Codlingstock, 20 qtrs dues £2/4/4, and claimed expenses 1/8. March 8th paid at the Sise Bill meeting 1/-, and expenses 1/6. 28th at Clifton for Overseers' warrant and bills, 3/6, expenses 1/6.

1781, January 1st, for 25 score thatch for the Townshouse at 1/6 per score, £2/2/-, and pay for Bands 1/6. Paid Thomas redfern for thatching, 10 days, 1/-, and Henry Mariot for sarving (assisting) 10d.

Paid to overseers of Mary's parish on John Allsop's Account, £8.

Paid to Bunny Book 4/8. To repair the pinfold, 7/4. Keeping the Book 6/8.

Total spent £57/12/-. Received three 6d levies £56/2/9, with £1/12/1 brought forward, remaining 1/10.

This was paid as expenses when we went to Chilwell about Isaac Buttery.

Bought clothing for soldier's girl, in all £1/3/-. Bought for Selbie's girl a blous, aprons, 1/-, and cloth of gown and other things 2/-.

Paid Thos Davy for a edhogg 2d. To Widdow Staton (of Bunny) for mole catching, £1/2/-. Many payments for sparrows, catchers not named.

April 25th paid at a meeting at County Hall when the new overseers of the poor was appointed, 3/6.

Payments to Overseers of Calverton, and to the militia man's wife and child. Paid Henry Henson 5/- and 2/6 when we went to Clifton about him on May 6th. 15th May for fetching Henry Henson's goods, 5/-. October, paid at Militia Meeting expenses 1/2.

April 14th, paid 5/- for 5 yds linin cloth for shirts. Paid John Lane for ale when loading Gravy, 1/6.

Paid Thomas Peet for a woman and 5 children lodging and breakfast, 1/-, and paid him for ale when loading gravel 2/-.

Paid to Bunny Book £4/5/2 1/2d.

1782 January 1st, paid for a man and a horse going to Nottingham with a deserter, 1/-. Paid to make up the Militia £6/2/6. Paid to Highways for 2 years past, £10/3/10. Paid to William Nixon for a mistake in the same accounts 3/-.

Jan 21st, paid Thomas Rodgering for thatching Richard Kington's (Knyfton's?) house. 23rd, paid William Henson for church service £1/17/-, and John Peet for work done in the church £1/-/6.

Jan 24th paid Dr Wickers for John Darker's son £5/15/6.

Paid Samuel Underwood for a room, 16/6. Mary Brown had a petticoat 4/6, and gown 2/6, and apron.

Paid to prisoners 1/- 1/6. Paid Will Henson for tools and work at the New Dike 2/6. Samuel Taylor for rat catching, £1/11/6. Joseph Buxton for moles, £1/8/- . Keeping the book, 6/8.

Robert Roobotham's bill for work done at Henery Tomson's House, 3/11.

Total disbursements £72/11/-. Received three 6d levy £56/19/3, and a 5d levy £15/16/5. and on account of militia 3/6. Total receipts £71/18/1, surplus 19/8, Richard Walker out of pocket.
