The Bradmore Parish Council is maybe the smallest in Basford Rural District, for it consists of only five members.

At the moment the council consists of Mr.F.W.Carnell (Chairman), Miss.O.A.Ingram, Mr.R.Jackson, Mr.W.J.Harrison and Mr.E.W.Randall.

Mr.Carnell has been Chairman of the Council since 1944.

REMARKABLE RECORD OF PARISH COUNCILLORS AT BRADMORE

At the end of March this year, the 3-year term of office for the present Parish Council at Bradmore comes to an end, and nomination forms for the new Council will be available from the Clerk, Mr.V.A.Attewell from this week-end.

Anyone on the Electoral Roll in the village can stand for election. The number of Council members at Bradmore is five.

If an election is necessary, it will be held on May 8.

The Council at Bunny are also ending their term of office. They have nine members.

Nominations have to be sent to Basford R.D.C office by April 14.

CLERK FOR 41 YEARS!

Bradmore Parish Council, whilst it is one of the smallest in the Rural District of Basford, has one of the finest records for years of service in the district.

The Clerk, Mr. V.A.Attewell, of Main Street, has been in office 41 years.

The number of years' service for members of the Council are as follows:

Mr.F.W.Carnell 25 years (for the past 16 years he has been chairman).

Mr.W.Harrison, 20 years.

Mr.R.Jackson, 18 years.

Mr.E.W.Randall, 13 years.

Miss.O.Ingram, 13 years.

The total years' service by councillors and the Clerk is 130. This is the highest number, for the number of members on the council, in the county.
