BAGGALEY

Robert Baggally born c1824, buried Bunny 11.10.1839 age 15, then of Bradmore.

William Baggaley, born Carlton, Nottm, 1835, son of John, cottager, and Winifred. 1851 William age 16 in parents' house, John Baggaley 36, cottager, with wife Winifred 28 cottager and daughter Ellen (sic) 20 plus a visitor, all born Carlton, at Carlton. July qtr 1856, Basford district, William Baggaley married Ann Blackner, dressmaker, daughter of John, farmer of 30 acres, and Ann of Colwick village. 1861 age 27 cottager with wife Ann and children Ann, John and Frederick, at Carlton. 1871 age 36, farmer of 34 acres with wife Therza 40 born Sneinton and children Ann, John, Frederick, and George at Moor Lane, Carlton. 1877 renting the grazing on Plumtree and Pendock lanes, Bradmore, on Pendock lane 1878, and Plumtree Lane 1880 and 1882. 1881 age 46, farmer 182 acres employing 3 labourers and 1 boy, with wife Thirza and children Anne Winifred, John and George, plus visitor Adah Briley, 22 born Mansfield, and indoor servants William Collington and George Burton, in farm house, (Bradmore1881/1). 1881 and 1888 Kellys Directory entry, farmer. 1885/6 Whites Directory, farmer, and farm bailiff to Mr Ford. On Bradmore electoral roll with land & tenement, 1886-1892. 1891 age 56 (born Wymeswold), farmer, with wife Thirza and farm servants John Hood and Thomas Elliott, and domestic servant Sarah Challand (Bradmore1891/51). 1901 age 66 widower, cowkeeper (milk) on own account, at 67 Lees Hill St, Nottingham. 1911 age 77 widower, retired farmer, living his son Frederick's house at 504 Meadow Lane, Sneinton, 6 rooms. William Baggaley born 1835 died April quarter 1914, Nottingham district.

Ann Baggaley born 1831 Colwick, nee Blackner, daughter of John and Ann of Colwick. 1841 age 10 in parents' house. 1851 age 20 dressmaker in parents' house. Married William Baggaley July qtr 1856, Basford district. 1861 age 30 married to William. Died Jan.qtr 1870, Basford district.

Ann Winifred Baggaley, born Carlton, 1857, daughter of William and Ann. 1861 age 4 in parents' house. 1871 age 14 in parents' house. In Bradmore by 1877. 1881 age 24, single, in parents' house (Bradmore1881/1). Married 17.5.1881, daughter of William, farmer, to John Smeeton, farmer of Bradmore, son of Thomas Bowes Smeeton, farmer. See Smeeton.

John William Baggaley, born Carlton 1859, son of William and Ann. Joiner and wheelwright. 1861 age 2 in parents' house. 1871 age 12 in parents' house. In Bradmore by 1877. 1881 age 22, single, wheelwright, in parents' house (Bradmore1881/1). 1885/6 Whites Directory, wheelwright. 18-21.5.1885 Sunday School minutes record Mr Baggaley to make 5 new tables and 12 trestles, estimate £4 (10/- crossed out). 1886 Sunday School minutes Mr J Baggaley to make the platform (ie for Sunday School Anniversary), agreed sum £5/5/-. 25.5.1886 Mr Baggaley paid £5 in Sunday School accounts for "Chiln Gallery" (Children's Gallery) Also repaired the church ceiling – prior to its collapse. 1887 built the new ceiling for the Bradmore Methodist Chapel after the original collapsed. 2.1.1888 age 29, wheelwright of Reddish, Lancs (where his brother Fred was living, see below), married Etty Dalby age (over) 21 of Bradmore, daughter of William Dalby, shoemaker. Children Daisy Ellen, Ralph William, Herbert Dalby (Bert), Ethel Alice Mary (Tet), Montague Jack (Jack), Frank Ronald, and two other children. Moved to a colliery company at Selston when business was slack at Bradmore. 1891 age 32, wheelwright, with wife Etty and children Daisy E and Ralph William, at Selston. 1901 age 42 colliery policeman with wife Etty and children Daisy E, Ralph William and Herbert D born Selston, and Etty's sister Olga M Baggaley (should be Dalby!) age 23 born Bradmore, at Station Road, Selston. 1911 John Baggaley age 52 joiner at colliery with wife Etty and children Daisy Ellen, Ralph William, Herbert Dalby Baggaley, Montague Jack and Frank Ronald, at Station Road, Selston Notts. John Baggaley died March qtr 1930, Basford district.

Etty Baggaley nee Dalby, born Bradmore 29.5.1866, daughter of William, shoemaker, and Mary. Married at Bunny 2.1.1888 to John Baggaley. 1891 age 24 at Selston married to John. 1901 age 34 married to John. 1911 age 44 (married 23 years with 7 children), married to John. Etty Baggaley died 1931.

Daisy Ellen born 12.10.1888, Reddish, Lancs, daughter of John William and Etty. 1891 at Selston age 1 in parents' house. 1901 age 12 in parents' house. 1911 age 22 in parents' house. Married at St Helens Selston to Thomas William Smalley born 29.6.1884 (died 21.6.1964), had children Jos, policeman 1914-1980; Winifred Etty (Win) 1924, married Frederick Thomas Randall; Ralph Donald 1926-1969 married Thelma Catherine Jones at Chilwell Methodist. Daisy Ellen died 27.12.1962.

Ralph William Baggaley born 1890 Selston, son of John William and Etty. 1891 age 1 in parents' house. 1901 age 11 in parents' house. 1911 age 21, bricklayer, in parents' house.

Ethel Alice Mary (Tet) Baggaley born 1.6.1893. Selston, daughter of John William and Etty. Methodist Sunday school scholar Vestry girls 25.9.1898 – June 1899, 3rd class July 1899-June 1902,

absent August 1899 and 1900, 2nd class July 1902 – June 1904, absent August 1902 and 1903, 1st class July 1904 to end of 1905 (next register missing). 1901 age 8 living with grandparents William and Mary Dalby on Loughborough Turnpike, Bradmore (Bradmore51/1901). 1908 invited to teach in Sunday School. 1911 age 18 single in grandmother Mary Dalby's house (Bradmore10/1911). 1922 on Sunday School Sports Committee. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main Road, no local vote, 1929-40, May 1945-1975 (Loughborough Road). Alice Ethel Mary of Loughborough Rd., Bradmore died 5.4.1975 age 81, leaving £19,584 (£19,461 net).

Herbert (Bert) Dalby Baggaley born 1895, Selston Notts, son of John William and ETTY. 1901 age 6 in parents' house. 1911 age 16 colliery errand boy in parents' house. Died 15.5.1969.

Montague Jack Baggaley born 1906, Selston, son of John William and ETTY. 1911 age 5 in parents' house. Married Mary Bentley July qtr 1938. Montague Jack Baggaley died 3.4.1976.

Frank Ronald Baggaley, born 1908 Selston, son of John William and ETTY. 1911 age 3 in parents' house. March qtr 1938 married Lydia Topham, in Selston. Frank Baggaley died Feb 1981.

Frederick Baggaley born Carlton 1860, son of William and Ann. 1861 age 1 in parents' house. 1871 age 11 in parents' house. Jan.qtr 1888 married Elizabeth Ann Gough, Stockport district. 1891 age 31 butcher with wife Elizabeth A 24 and children Sarah A 2, Clara 3 mths, at Gorton Rd., Reddish, Lancs. 1901 age 40 butcher, shopkeeper on own account with wife Elizabeth Ann 34 and children Sarah Ann 12, Clara 10, Charley 8, at 50 Stockport Rd., Cheadle. 1911 age 51, dairyman on own account, with wife Elizabeth age 43 born Stockport and children Sarah Ann age 22 lace finisher, Clara age 20 folder blouses, son Charley age 18 dairyman all born Reddish, and his father William age 77, widower, retired farmer. Frederick Baggaley died June qtr 1922, Nottingham.

George Baggaley, born Carlton 1863, son of William and Ann. 1871 age 8 in parents' house. 1881 age 18, single, in parents' house (Bradmore1881/1). George Baggaley died March qtr 1924, Nottingham.

Thirza Baggaley, born 1831, Sneinton, nee Crossland, formerly Goodhead, daughter of Samuel, pork butcher, and Sarah. 1861 Thirza age 30, widow, dressmaker at parents' house, St Anns. Apr.qtr 1870 Thirza Goodhead married William Baggaley, widower (his 2nd wife). 1871 age 40, married to William. 1881 age 50 married to William (Bradmore1881/1). 1891 age 60, married to William (Bradmore1891/51). Died Jan qtr 1896, Nottingham district..

BAGGULEY

William Bagguley born c1801. 1841 age 40, framemaker, in the household of Mary Marriott (Bradmore1841/34).

William Bagguley born c1823/6. 1841 age 15 in the household of Mary Marriott (Bradmore1841/34). Possibly son of William age 40 in same household. William Bagguley of Bradmore married Elizabeth Smith, under age, daughter of John Smith saddler of Bradmore, at Bunny 28 November? 1844. 1851 age 28, framework knitter born Caythorpe married to Elizabeth with son Robert, living in Ruddington. 1861 William Bagguley age 38, framework knitter born Caythorpe, with wife Elisabeth and children Robert, William age 9, winder, born Ruddington, and nursechild Richard Hardy age 10 mths born Ruddington, at No.40 Poke Nook, Ruddington.. 1871 age 48, framework knitter married to Elizabeth, living on Shaw St., Ruddington. Jan.qtr 1877 William Bagguley married Ruth Cross, stocking seamer daughter of John, farm lab., and Ann of Proudman's Row, Ruddington. 1881 age 58, bag hosier, with wife Ruth 38 seamstress at Distillery St., Ruddington. 1891 age 68, hosier with wife Ruth 48 and daughter Ruth 7, scholar, at Distillery St., Ruddington. William Bagguley hosier of Ruddington died 15.6.1892, probate Nottingham 29.6.1892 to William Price and Robert Bagguley, hosiers; effects £279/13/9.

Elizabeth Bagguley born 1827 Bradmore nee Smith, daughter of John, saddler, and Ann. Elizabeth Smith age 16/17 married William Bagguley 28 Nov? 1844, Bunny. 1851 age 23 married to William. 1861 age 33 seamer married to William. 1871 age 43 married to William. Elizabeth Bagguley born c1828 died Jan. quarter 1876, Basford district.

Robert Bagguley, born 1847, son of William and Elizabeth. 1851 age 2 in parents' house. 1861 age 12 winder in parents' house. 1869 married Martha daughter of Abraham Sharpe of Ruddington. 1871 age 22 framework knitter with wife Martha and children William 4, Alfred 3, Andrew 1 all born Ruddington, at Ruddington. 1881 age 32 stocking framework knitter with wife Martha and children William 14 framework knitter, Alfred, Andrew, Robert, Horatio 7 scholar, Percy 3 and Walter Lionel 2 all born Ruddington, at The Leys, Ruddington. 1891 age 42 framework knitter with wife Martha and children Andrew, Robert, Percy 13 lace winder and Walter L 12 scholar, at Parkyns St., Ruddington. Had 7 sons, including 4 who did not live in Bradmore (William born 1866, Ruddington, married Ellen Price, had 3 daughters and a son, lived at Heanor, died 1936; Horatio born 1873, twin brother of Robert, died 1890, Ruddington; Percy born 1877, died 1898, Ruddington; Walter born

1878, died 1897 Ruddington. Percy and Walter were both framework knitters and professional cricketers). Moved to Bradmore c1898 when son Robert took on Blackcliffe Farm. 1901 Robert age 52, ag.lab. with wife Martha and son Robert, and visitors Louisa Bagguley and Frederick J Johnson, living on the Village Street (Bradmore1/1901). After son Robert's marriage, Robert and Martha moved to one of the farm cottages on Loughborough Road for the remainder of their lives (Source: Reg Bagguley). 1911 Robert age 62, farm labourer (dairy), with wife Martha in a house with 4 rooms on the Loughborough Road (Bradmore5/1911). On Bradmore electoral roll with land & tenement 1900-1911, and with house 1911and continuing to 1933/4, noted as Main Rd from 1920. At some point lived in the south wing of the Old Crown, while William and Ethel Randall were in the north wing, i.e. after 1911 (Source: M Bagguley). Paid seat rent at Methodist Church 1926-1933. Died Oct.1933 of TB, death noted in Deanery Magazine, Dec.1933. Buried Bunny churchyard, west end, beside Thomas Walker.

Martha Bagguley born Dec.1848 nee Sharpe, daughter of Abraham Sharpe of Ruddington. Married Robert senior 1869. 1871 age 22 married to Robert. 1881 age 32 married to Robert. 1891 age 42 married to Robert. 1901 age 52 married to Robert (Bradmore 1/1901). 1911 age 62 (married 42 years with 8 children, 4 dead) married to Robert, on Village Street (Bradmore 5/1911). On Main Road, on Bradmore electoral roll, 1920-1933/4, then in her own right in cottage 1934/5-1939/40. Paid seat rent at Methodist church 1923-1935. Did hosiery work in Ruddington. Musician, played the cornet in the Ruddington Temperance Band. In her old age her son Robert called in to see her every morning after milking. Kown as Grandma Bagguley. Died 1941 age 93.

Alfred Claude Bagguley born 1868, Ruddington, son of Robert and Martha. 1871 age 3 in parents' house. 1881 age 12 framework knitter in parents' house. Married Louisa. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main Road, spring 1923 -spring 1924. Moved to South Africa. Died 1936.

Louisa Bagguley married to Alfred. Arrived Southampton from Durban on SS Canada, Dominion Line, on 4 April 1900, described as servant. 1901 age 21, born c1880 in Cape Town, South Africa, married, visiting in-laws Robert and Martha Bagguley on Village Street (Bradmore 1/1901).

Andrew Bagguley born 1870 Ruddington, son of Robert and Martha. 1871 age 1 in parents' house. 1881 age 11 scholar in parents' house. 1891 age 21 framework knitter in parents' house. Jan.qtr 1893, Leicester district, married Jane Ann Pick, fancy hosiery hand born Ibstock, daughter of Dorothy Pick, charwoman, of Denman St., Leicester. 1901 age 31, milk salesman, with Jane Ann age 28 and children Dorothy M and Walter L, at 36 Woodland Road, Leicester. Jane Ann Bagguley was buried at Bunny 21.5.1907. On Bradmore electoral roll, house, 1907-1910. Apr.qtr 1909 Basford district, married Letty Pearson, domestic cook, born 1873 Newbold Moor Chesterfield, daughter of Jonas, coal miner, and Martha. 1911 Letty Bagguley 37 (married 1 year, husband not present) domestic cook working for Joseph Brough, General Secretary, YMCA, at Morley House, Mansfield Rd., Nottingham, 16 rooms. Andrew and children not found 1911. Had one further child, moved to South Africa.

Dorothy M Bagguley born 1894 Leicester, daughter of Andrew and Jane Ann. 1901 age 7 in parents' house. Methodist Sunday school scholar 1st class 16.4.1905- 31.12.1905 (next register missing). 1906-9 choir member.

Walter Lionel Bagguley born 1897, Leicester, son of Andrew and Jane Ann. 1901 age 4 in parents' house. Methodist Sunday school scholar 2nd class 16.4.1905-25.6.1905 and 24.9.1905-24.12.1905.

Robert Bagguley, born 10.7.1873, Ruddington, son of Robert and Martha, twin brother of Horatio. 1881 age 7 in parents' house. 1891 age 17 lace warper in parents' house. Grammar school educated. Worked for I & R Morley Ltd and framework knitter, and worked for a farmer. Robert was only 5 ft 3½ ins. in height but played county cricket when age 18 for Notts, as a left-handed medium-paced bowler, but batted right-handed. In 1891 he played 10 matches for the country, having impressed early in the season with 8 wickets for 5 runs including a hat-trick for Notts Second Eleven vs Surrey Second Eleven at the Oval, and 6 wickets for 21 for Notts Colts vs Yorks Colts at Sheffield. His star performance was in 1895 when he scored 110 vs Sussex at Trent Bridge, he and Mr Howitt (119) adding 201 for the 7th wicket; he went on to score 62 in the return match at Brighton. His last appearance for Notts was in 1896 as he was finding it too time-consuming (Source: Notts Cricket & Cricketers, F C Ashley Cooper, 1923). Built two Parkyn Villas in Parkyn St., Ruddington, with his savings from his first season's cricket playing, and subsequently rented them out. Continued to coach cricket at boys' schools and colleges. Probably responsible for the newspaper cuttings from Daily Mail 1933 clipped into the front of the first book of parish council minutes, containing articles by A M Crawley about cricket techniques. Came to Bradmore about 1898 to take on Blackcliffe Farm towards the end of his cricketing career, moved for country air due to ailing child. Tried to coach cricket and run the farm with Freddie Hutchinson as farm manager, but the arrangement was

not successful. April 1899, paid half the cost of cleaning out the Common Issue Ditch between his fields (Blackcliffe Farm) and Mr Harriman's (Manor Farm), the council paying the other half. 1900 Bunny Estate rental has Robert with farmhouse and land, 141 acres 2 rods and 24 perches, paying rent £180 pa. Rented grazing on Plumtree Lane 1905-6. Listed in Kelly's Directory 1904 as farmer, and probably the R Bagguley listed in the 1912 directory. Methodist Sunday School teacher 1900-25, 1935. 1901 Robert age 27, single, farmer and employer, born Ruddington, living in parents' house on Village Street (Bradmore 1/1901). Apr. qtr 1903 married Annie Mary at Ruddington Primitive Methodist Church. 1905 invited to be Bradmore Methodist Chapel joint choirmaster and organist with A Attewell, to 1912, and continued to 1946 in spite of wishing to retire in 1931. On 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 3 entries, (1) for 141 acres 2 roods 24 perches at £180 pa rent, (2) for 18 acres 2 roods 24 perches at £40 pa rent, (3) for cottages at £3/10/- pa rent. As Robert junior, on Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement 1905-7 and 1912-1914. Rented Blackcliffe farm from Henry Lester, his wife's uncle, after 1910/11 when it was sold from the Bunny Estate. 1911 Robert age 37 farmer and employer, with wife Annie Mary and children Maud Lucy age 4, Cecil Percy and Marjorie Florence, plus Eliza Soar, domestic servant, age 16 born 1895 Langley Hill, at Blackcliffe Farm, 10 rooms (Bradmore 15/1911). Probably Overseer of the Poor 1915-26, though this could be Robert senior as neither senior nor junior is specified. Robert did not go into the army as he was a farmer. 1920 bought the farm from Henry Lester. On Bradmore electoral roll at The Farm (Blackcliffe) 1920-1948. Eligible for jury service from autumn 1922-1935/6. R Bagguley listed in Kelly's Directory as farmer, 1925, 1928 1936 and 1941. Originally had the fields from Stafford House opposite on Farmer St., but when he bought Blackcliffe Farm he wanted fields backing onto the Main Road. His land went over to the Plumtree boundary, across Blackcliffe Hill. Grew wheat up Mill Lane and had a herd of milking cows, milked by hand, but no sheep. When they couldn't milk they sold the cows and kept the calves. His children earned pocket money mangling turnips. Consulted Dr Allinson (of wholemeal bread fame) who gave him a diet for stomach ulcers. The children were brought up on the Allinson diet, excluding red meat, and including home-grown vegetables until age 16, and could then choose whether to remain largely vegetarian or not (Source: M Bagguley). 1918-1934 chapel leader. 1918-20 poor steward, 1921-30 society steward, 1932 became the 3rd chapel steward. 1922 Sunday School hymn committee and sports committee. Paid seat rent 1923-45. Trustee 1924-1946. 1937-45 representative on Sunday School Council. 1924 on Garden Party Committee, 1925 on piano committee. 1935-46 Class leader. 1943 age 70 Robert fell from a ladder, damaged his spine and was seriously paralysed for the last 3 years of his life. Had to give up playing the Bradmore Methodist Chapel organ. Died at Blackcliffe Farm 8.10.1946 age 73, buried at Bunny north of the tower, with Annie Mary. See also Professional Cricket and the Ruddington Framework Knitters by Brian Wright, 1996.

Annie Mary Bagguley, born 23.4.1882 daughter of Thomas and Lucy Walker. Methodist Sunday School teacher. Apr. qtr 1903 married Robert at Ruddington Primitive Methodist Church, and continued teaching in Sunday school as Mrs R Bagguley to 1906. 1911 age 28 (married 7 years, with 3 children), married to Robert (Bradmore 15/1911). On Bradmore electoral roll 1920-1975 at Blackcliffe Farm. 1939-63 Methodist Class leader. 1950 made new curtains and cushion covers for church. 1955 communion steward. 1956, 1958 and 1963 her garden was used for the Garden Party. 1962 invited to the prizegiving. 1942-69 chapel poor steward. Used to make raspberry vinegar and jam from raspberries brought by Eliza (Laura?) Smith, wife of William at the shop on Main St., who used to bring them down to the farm in a big yellow bowl (Source: M Bagguley). 1957 in correspondence with parish council regarding new bus shelter overhanging her property (i.e. Blackcliffe Farm). Died 27.10.1974 age 92, buried at Bunny north of the tower with Robert.

Marion Lucy Bagguley born 28.4.1906, daughter of Robert and Annie Mary. Bapt. 29.7.1906, Bradmore Methodist Church. Remembered seeing the Far St. Mill blown up c1910, watching with Hilda Smith from an upstairs window in the Smiths' house at the top of Far St. 1911 age 4 in parents' house (Bradmore 15/1911). Remembered going to celebrations at the end of the First World War at St Mary's Church in Nottingham. Remembered as a child going to collect the rents from her father's property in Ruddington, Parkyns Villas, and vaguely remembered a door or window on Far St. through which meat was sold. Methodist Sunday School scholar infants by July 1912 – Dec 1912, 2nd class Jan 1913-Dec 1915, 1st class Jan 1916-1.10.1922. 1921 invited to teach, teacher 1922-91. 1st Cradle Roll Secretary, to 1936. Choir member 1922-1934. 1923 and 1966-81 JMA Secretary, 1928-63 and 1982-1995 Missionary Secretary. 1954-73 choirmistress, member of choir 1980-1997. Representative to circuit Sunday School council 1933-6, 1941-9, 1954; representative to circuit committee 1947, 1956, 1968. 1943-7 magazine correspondent, 1945 magazine secretary. 1944-5 assistant class leader. 1964-81 class leader. 1946 Guild Literary Secretary. 1948 Sunday School Treasurer. 1951 convenor, Chapel Anniversary tea. 1952-87

Church Treasurer. 1953-68 Secretary, Womens Work. 1975-81 Womens Work Treasurer. 1960, 1964-91 Sunday School Superintendent, Honorary Superintendent to 1999. 1975-95 representative on Circuit Missionary Committee. 1979-95 representative on Circuit Ministries Committee. 1979 on 150th Anniversary Committee. 1987 bought the old church curtains. 1992 was given the Companion to Hymns & Psalms on her retirement. Member of Bradmore & Bunny tennis club. On Bradmore electoral roll at Blackcliffe Farm, 17 Farmer St, 1949. Died 2000.

Cecil Percy Bagguley born 1909, son of Robert and Annie Mary Bagguley. Bapt. Bradmore Methodist, no date. 1911 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 15/1911). Methodist Sunday school scholar infants 7.7.1915, 2nd class Jan 1916, 1st class Jan 1918 – 20.2.1927. Received Bible 1928. 1922 joined the Methodist choir. 1927 invited to become teacher, declined. 1968 proposed as chapel trustee, declined. On Bradmore electoral roll at Blackcliffe Farm. no local vote, 1930/1-1939/40. Remembered by his sister Marion as "needing a sensible wife". Jan.qtr 1945 Cecil Percy Bagguley married Jean M Bexon, Basford district. They had children Diana born 1945 and Robert Fernley born 1948/9. About 1945/50 Margaret Leslie (nee Randall) remembers them being at the Bunny (south) end of 106/8 Loughborough Rd., Laburnum Cottage. She collected 1d p.wk. Methodist Missionary Money from Cecil, usually going to find him in the milking shed. May 1945-1948 Cecil P at Blackcliffe Farm, then on electoral roll at Greenfields, 87 Loughborough Rd, 1949-1979, and at 83 Loughborough Rd 1980-1. However, R F Bagguley confirmed that he did live at Laburnum Cottage and Robert Fernley Bagguley was born there in 1948. About 1950 Cecil bought the pavilion from Bunny & Bradmore Lawn Tennis Club when they sold off their assets. Parish Councillor 1962-75. Mens Institute committee member 1929/30-1952/3, president 1955/6 and treasurer 1956/7-1966. Listed in Kellys Directory 1932 as Mens Institute Secretary. Hannah Baily married Thomas Flower, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 13.11.1728.

BAKER

Elizabeth Baker of Bradmore married Edward Bolsinne of Bunny at Bunny on midsomer daie, 1570

Richard Baker, carpenter, of Bradmore. Will dated 29.3.1630, proved 29.11.1630.

Susanna Baker daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 6.2.1659.

Peter Baker, not resident in Bradmore but was paid by the Constables for catching moles, 15/- per half year, 1785-1803, including 15/- payment 1785 for moles dug at May Day, with a second 15/- paid in Nov. 1826 Constable paid Peter Baker 2/6 for coming about Baker's settlement.

Elizabeth Baker born 1828 Bradmore nee Henson, daughter of Richard, labourer and Mary. 1851 age 21, house servant for John Burrowes of Rempstone, farmer of 224 acres, at Rempstone. Married John

Baker, 1854 Nottingham. 1861 age 31 laundress with husband John 60 tailor born E Retford and son Daniel Henry Henson Baker at Hunger Hill Gardens, St Anns, Nottingham. 1871 age 41 laundress with husband John 70 tailor and children Daniel Henry Henson and Elizabeth A 3 born Nottingham, at 50 Maple St, St Anns Nottingham. 1881 age 51 laundress with husband John 80 tailor and daughter Elizabeth Ann 13, scholar, at 27 Shelton Lane, St Anns Nottingham. John Baker died July qtr 1882, Nottingham. 1891 age 61 widow, laundress with daughter Elizabeth Ann single 23 lace curtain folder at Pelham Cottages, Pelham Crescent Nottingham. 1901 age 71 widow with daughter Elizabeth Ann Smith 33 and son in law Arthur W Smith 32 cabinet maker born Nottingham, at Pelham Crescent Nottingham. 1911 age 81 widow with daughter Elizabeth Ann Smith 42 (married 16 years, no children) and son in law Arthur William Smith 42 cabinet maker for house furnisher, at Barrack Yard, Barrack Lane Nottingham in a house with 5 rooms. Maria Baker born Sept qtr 1844 Carlton, daughter of William Baker, butcher, and Sarah. 1851-1871 in parents' house in Carlton. Not found 1881, 1891. 1901 age 57, single, general domestic servant in household of John Randall (44/1901). 1911 age 66, single, companion in house of John Randall (Bradmore 16/1911). Maria Baker died Oct.qtr 1913, Basford district.

Gladys M Baker on Bradmore electoral roll at The Bungalow, 113 Main Road May 1945-1965. Housekeeper to Edith Hopkinson. Listed as WI member 1943-1968, resigned Nov.1968. Deanery Magazine notes death of Edith Hopkinson Sept. 1964, and Miss Baker her very devoted companion hopes to remain in the parish if she can find a house preferably at Bradmore. On electoral roll at Willoughby, 22 Main St, 1967-80, house provided (built?) for her by the Hopkinsons. Died 29.1.1983, no longer living in the village at that time.

John Baldock of Wysall born 1800, Wysall, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church 1835 and 1868 in the church deeds. 1841 age 40, farmer, with wife Jane 40, children Isaac 12, William 10, John 8, Mary 6, George 4, Hannah 2 and James 1, and William Baldock 35 (brother?) farmer with wife Elizabeth 35, at Wysall. 1851 age 51, farmer of 260 acres employing 8 labourers, with wife Jane 53 born Granby, children Isaac 28, William 24, John 18, Mary 17, George 15, James 11, all born Wysall, plus 3 visitors, a house servant and a farm servant at Wysall. 1861 age 61 farmer of 215 acres employing 4 men and 2 boys, with wife Jane 63, son James 21, a house servant, a carter and a plough boy at Wysall. John Baldock died October 1868, Loughborough District.

BALDWIN

John B Baldwin, born c1849, Hougham, Lincs., son of Mary Baldwin. 1851 age 2, with widowed mother Mary 33 schoolmistress and 8 scholars at Hougham Lincs. 1861 age 12, ag. day boy, with mother Mary now married to William South at Hougham. Apr.qtr 1875, Newark district, John Baldwin married Eliza Bateman daughter of William, ag.lab and Mary of Long Bennington. 1881 age 30, ag.lab., with wife Eliza 30 and children John William, Fred and Eliza, at The Green, Ruddington. In Bradmore at least from 1887 to 1890. On Bradmore electoral roll, house with no county vote, 1890 only. Moved to Tollerton late 1890. 1891 age 42, farm horse-waggoner with wife Eliza and children John, Eliza, Charles, George and Harry, at Glebe Farm, Tollerton, 3 rooms. 1901 age 52 waggoner on farm with wife Eliza 50 and children Eliza 21 waitress in restaurant, George 14 help on farm and Harry, plus 2 boarders, at Main St., Edwalton. 1911 age 62 ag.lab. with wife Eliza and children Charles, George, and Harry, at Silk St., at Sutton in Ashfield, 5 rooms,

Eliza Baldwin, born c 1852, Long Benington, nee Bateman, daughter of William, ag.lab and Mary. 1861 age 9 in parents' house, Long Bennington. 1871 age 20 gen.svt at Kirklington Mill Road farm. Apr.qtr 1875, Newark district, married John Baldwin. 1881 age 30 married to John. 1891 married to John. 1901 age 50 married to John. 1911 age 59 (married 39 years with 6 children, 1 dead) married to John.

John William Baldwin born c1877 Swarby, Lincs, son of John and Eliza. 1881 age 4 scholar in parents' house. Methodist Sunday School 1st class 22 May – 26 June 1887, no further entries. 1891 age 14 in parents house.

Fred Baldwin born c1878 Graby, Lincs, son of John and Eliza. 1881 age 3 in parents' house. Methodist Sunday School 3rd class July/Aug 1887, 2nd class during July 1888, no further entries, deleted June 1889. Buried Bunny 9.5.1889 age 11, then of Bradmore.

Eliza Baldwin born 1880 Graby Lincs, daughter of John and Eliza. 1881 age 1 in parents' house.

Methodist Sunday School 3rd class 22 May – 26 June 1887, 2nd class July 1897-June 1888 and intermittently August 1888 to June 1889. 1st class 2nd part 14 and 21 July and 18.8.1889-9.3.1890, then left. 1891 age 11 in parents' house. 1901 age 21, waitress in restaurant, in parents' house.

Charles Baldwin born c1883, Ruddington, son of John and Eliza. Methodist Sunday School 4th class 2.6.1889, 3rd class 14 and 21 July 1889 and 20.10.1889-2.2.1890. 1891 age 8 in parents' house. 1901 age 18, railway engine cleaner born Ruddington, boarder in house of William Randerson, coal miner, at Mexborough Yorks. 1911 age 28 lace hand warp machine (operator) in parents' house.

George Baldwin born 17.4.1887 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist 20.11.1889, son of John and Eliza. 1891 age 3 in parents' house at Glebe Farm Tollerton. 1901 age 14, help on farm, in parents' house. 1911 age 23 general labourer for U D Ccl, in parents' house.

Harold/Harry Baldwin born c1890/1, Bradmore or Tollerton, son of John and Eliza. 1891 age 8 mths in parents' house. 1901 age 10 in parents' house. 1911 age 20, ag.lab., in parents' house.

BALFORD

Harriett Balford of Bradmore, daughter of John Henry, sailor (/tailor?), married at Bunny 4.5.1879 to Robert James, widower, labourer of Bradmore son of Edward the blacksmith. See James.

BALL

Elizabeth Ball / Bail of Bradmore, born c1650/1, age 22 married John Alsop of Rempstone, husbandman, 8.2.1672/3, Nottingham.

Elizabeth Ball of Bradmore buried Bunny 26.1.1771.

Rebecca Ball born c1803/6 S.Normanton Derbyshire, living in Bradmore when she married Samuel Henson, also of Bradmore, 29.11.1832. See Henson.

William Ball of Leicester married Elizabeth Peet, 14.3.1826.

Elizabeth Ball nee Peet later Parratt, born 3.9.1796 Bradmore, daughter of Thomas Peet, farmer, and Ann. 1841 age 45, widow, publican, wth children William 10, Elizabeth 5 and Sarah, at St. Margarets' Leicester. 1851 age 54 with husband William Parratt 55 stonemason, daughter Sarah Ball, son Thomas 20 stone manson journeyman born Leicester and daughter Caroline Clayton, widow, 27 dressmaker born Birmingham, and grandchildren Elizabeth Clayton 6 and George Clayton 11, scholars, born Leicester, at 20 Rutland St., Leicester. Elizabeth Parratt died Apr.qtr 1857, Leicester.

Sarah A Ball born c1836, Leicester, daughter of William Ball and Elizabeth nee Peet. 1841 age 5 in mother Eizabeth's house, at St Margaret's, Leicester. 1851 age 15, glove sticther, with mother Elizabeth and step-father, William. 1861 age 25, single, housekeeper in the household of her (second) cousin William Peet at Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1861/10).

Albert Ball born 1863, Lenton, Nottingham, son of George, plumber and Lois, of Lenton. 1901 age 38, dealer in landed estates, employer, with wife and family at 60 Sherwin Road, Nottingham. 1908 purchased Bulwell Hall with 575 acres and mineral rights for £35,000. 1909 Mayor of Nottingham. 1910 bought Bunny and Bradmore estate for £100,000, sold part to Dr Robert Henry Cordeux, and gave tenants the opportunity to buy their rented farms, cottages, etc. On Bradmore electoral roll, land, parish vote only, 1912-1914. 1911 age 47, real estate and land agent, employer, with wife and family at Sedgley House, Lenton Road, Park, Nottingham, house with 12 rooms. 1919 bought Papplewick Hall for £136,410. 1924 Knighted, Lord of the manors of Bunny, Bradmore and Tollerton. 1926 built his house, Stansted House, on Derby Road. 1929 Alderman of Nottingham. 1935 Lord Mayor of Nottingham. Vice President of Bradmore Mens Institute 1940-42? Died 27.3.1946, Bournemouth.

BALLARD

Sarah Ballard, widow of John, married John Stubbs of Bradmore 19.12.1775. See Stubbs.

Sarah Ballard bapt. Bunny 23.6. 1768, daughter of Sarah and John of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 30.3.1769 as daughter of Sarah widow of the late John Ballard, of Bradmore.

BARKER

Agnes Barker of Bradmore married Thomas Ragge of Bunny at Bunny on St Katherin daie 25.11.1570.

Agnes Barker of Bradmore married George Randall of Plumtree, at Plumtree 10.1.1588, by vicar's licence.

Katherin Barker married John Ladd, both of Bradmore, at Bunny, 24.5.1589.

Jane Barker, widow of Bradmore, married William Abbot of Bradmore at Bunny 27.1.1600, licence issued 19.1.1600.

Elizabeth Barker bapt. Bunny 6.7.1656 daughter of John and Elizabeth his supposed wife of Bradmore.

Jane Barker married Gervase Keightley of Tollerton at Bunny 25.4.1702.

BARNARD

Elizabeth Barnard, widow of Bradmore, left a will dated 6.9.1661, probate 20.6. 1667. Willed to be buried at Bunny. Left 20/- to the poor of the parish and 12d. each to the children of John Smith, John Chamberlin of Keyworth, John Wilson, Matthew Hornbuckle, William Blagg. Also 12d each to Robert Cartwright, Ann, and John Finley. Document faded, references to Elizabeth Chamberlin her sister, and to Mary Walker of Bradmore.

BARNES

William Barnes or Burn of Bradmore, labourer, was sentenced at Nottingham on 7.6.1765 to be transported for 7 years to his Majesty's colonies or plantations in America for obtaining the sum of 6d of John Savage of Bradmore by falsely pretending that he, William, was lame of his right arm.

Ann Barnes born 1831, Bradmore, nee Whittaker, daughter of John and Mary. Oct.qtr 1852, Basford district, married James Barnes son of John, stockinger and Esther, of Red Lion St., Ruddington. 1861 Ann 30 with husband James 30 framework knitter, cotton, and children Eliza 4, Mary Elizabeth 2, scholars, and Noah 2 mths all born Ruddington, at 4 White Hart Yard, Ruddington. 1871 age 38 with husband James 38 framework knitter and children Mary 11 nurse/scholar, Noah 9 cotton winder, Uriah 6, Ruth 6, Henry 4, scholars and Kate 15 mths all born Ruddington, at High St, Ruddington. 1881 age 49 with husband James 49 stocking framework knitter, and children Ruth 16 embroideress, stockings, Henry 13 and Kate 11 scholars, and married daughter Mary Palmer 21 stocking seamstress, plus grand-daughter Sarah Ann Palmer 5 mths, all born Ruddington, at High St., Ruddington. 1891 age 60 with husband James 60 gas lamp lighter and grand-daughter Kate Mills 5, at High St., Ruddington. Ann Barnes died Jan.qtr 1900, Basford district. 1901 James 69, widower, bill poster on own account, with grand-daughter Kate Mills 15 plain lace mender, at High St., Ruddington. 1911 James 80 widower, village crier, at High St., Ruddington, 5 rooms. James Barnes died July qtr 1911, Basford district.

Daniel Barnes bapt. 2.9.1835, Ruddington Wesleyan, son of John Barnes and Elizabeth nee Underwood. 1851 Daniel Barnes age 15 framework knitter born Ruddington, in parents' house at Ruddington, with John age 40 framework knitter and wife Elizabeth age 35 seamer, both born Ruddington. Daniel, framework knitter of Ruddington, married Martha Buxton, age under 21, of Bradmore daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, at Bunny 23.12.1860. 1861 age 25, cotton stocking maker, married to Martha nee Buxton, and in the household of in-laws Thomas and Mary Buxton on Loughborough Rd. north of the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1861/4). 1871 Daniel age 36 married to Martha with children Thomas 10, winder, John 7 and Ann 4, both scholars, all born in Ruddington, at Marl Pit Ruddington. 1881 age 55 labourer / bricklayer with wife Martha and son William 16 framework knitter born Ruddington, plus grand-daughter Isabel, 2 born Nottingham, at Easthorpe St. Ruddington. 1891 age 45 framework knitter with wife Martha and children Thomas 19 framework knitter, John 16 apprentice to blacksmith, Ann 14 seamstress, William 6 scholar, all born Ruddington, at Easthorpe St., Ruddington,. 1901 age 67, bricklayer's labourer, with wife Martha and 2 lodgers (no children) at Easthorpe Buildings, Ruddington. 1911 age 76 pensioner with wife Martha at Easthorpe St, Ruddington, 5 rooms. Daniel Barnes died July qtr 1912.

Martha Barnes, nee Buxton, born c1841 daughter of Thomas and Mary. Martha Buxton, age under 21, of Bradmore daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, married Daniel, framework knitter of Ruddington, at Bunny 23.12.1860. 1861 1861 age 20, seamstress, with Daniel in her parents' house (Bradmore 1861/4). 1871 age 30, seamstress, married to Daniel. 1881 age 40 hosiery seamstress married to Daniel. 1891 age 50 married to Daniel. 1901 age 60 married to Daniel. 1911 age 70 (married 50 years (1861)with 3 children 1 dead), married to Daniel.

BARNETT

Eliza Barnett nee Attewell born 1822 Bradmore, daughter of John and Elizabeth. Jan.qtr 1847 Eliza Attiwell married Thomas Barnett, Melton Mowbray district. 1851 Eliza 30 with husband Thomas 25 baker born Widmerpool and children Joseph 3 scholar, William 1, born Cropwell Bishop, and visitor Lucy Burton 38 born Widmerpool, at Saxtons Row, Cropwell Bishop. Thomas Barnett baker and carrier of Cropwell Bishop died 30.1.1858, admin 13.3.1858 to widow Eliza, effects less than £200. 1861 Eliza Barnett widow age 38, grocer's shop, with children Joseph 14, William 11 scholar, Sarah 8 scholar, all born Cropwell Bishop, at Cropwell Bishop. Eliza Barnett married Benjamin West Jan.qtr 1863, Nottingham. 1871 Eliza 50 with husband Benjamin West 55 baker/grocer born Shepshed and her son William Barnett 21 baker, plus daughter Annie West 6 scholar born Cropwell Bishop, at 2 Whites Row, Cropwell Bishop. 1881 Eliza 58 with husband Benjamin 67 grocer/baker, son William Barnett 30 baker, and daughter Annie Elizabeth West 16, at Wests Row, Cropwell Bishop. Benjamin West grocer and baker of Cropwell Bishop died 7.11.1885, will proved 12.2.1886 at Nottingham by John

Wilson coal dealer of Cropwell Bishop, executor (son-in-law, husband of Sarah A nee Barnett), estate £191/8/6. 1891 Eliza West 69, widow living on own means, with daughter Annie 26 domestic servant and son William Barnett 41 ostler/groom, at Cropwell Bishop. 1897 Annie Elizabeth West married John Parnham, Bingham district. 1901 Eliza West 79, widow on own means, mother in law in house of John Parnham 33 ag.lab born Colston Basset and his wife Annie E age 37 nee West, with their children Mary E 5, Joseph 1 on Salvins Row, Cropwell Bishop. Eliza West died Oct.qtr 1903 Bingham district.

Elizabeth Barnham married William Attawell both of Bradmore 28.9.1680.

Susan Barnsdall born 1816. 1841 age 25, independent means, in the household of John Dutton on Loughborough Rd, opposite Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1841/13A). Susannah Barnsdale of Bradmore married William Whitt/White, journeyman tailor, of Plumtree at Bunny 17.1.1842, both being of full age. See Whitt.

BARRAND

Robert Barrand born 1847, Kelby, Lincoln. 1851 Robert Barrand age 4 in parents' house, Edward Barrand 34 born Kelby, farmer of 127 acres employing 4 labourers, with wife Mary 33 and other children Elizabeth 8, Fanny 6, at day school, Thomas 2 and Mary 4 mths, plus servants, at Kelby, Lincs,. 1861 age 14 scholar in parents' house with siblings John Edward 8, Emma 5, Sophia 3, Anne 1, at Kelby village,. 1870 April qtr Robert Barrange married Elizabeth Nixon, Sleaford district. 1870 Robert Barrand signed the East Leake Charity accounts. 1870 on Bradmore electoral roll in £12+ rent pa category and 1871-1876 in £50+ rent pa category. 1871 age 24, farmer of 118 acres employing one boy, with wife Elizabeth and Elizabeth's sister Mary Nixon, farm servant Walter Locking and domestic servant Sarah Exton, at Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1871/3). 1873 Waywarden, salary 10/-. Guardian 1874 salary £1, and 1875 salary 19/-. Rented grazing on Pendock Lane 1873-5. 1876 PO Directory, farmer. Information from a descendant - Elizabeth Barrand believed to have died just before present descendant's grandfather was born, and Robert believed to have gone back to Lincolnshire after Elizabeth's death. 1881 Jan qtr Robert Barrand married Margaret Barrand , Lincoln district. 1881 age 34 born Kelby, listed as widower, farmer, nephew in the house of his uncle Joseph Barrand 77 born Kelby, farmer, and Margaret Barrand 46 born Snelland listed as Joseph's wife but actually Robert's, with 3 servants, at Kelby Lincs. Son Henry Edward in 1881 is with his grandmother – see below. 1891 age 44 farmer born Welby with wife Margaret 57 born Snelland Lincs, son Edward Henry and visitors Katherine Woolhouse, single, age 40 born Faldingworth, on own means, and Mary A Peel age 9, scholar born Warsop, at Newball, Lincs. 1901 age 54 farmer, employer, with wife Margaret 67, son Henry E, and 3 servants, at The Grange Farm House, Newball Lincs. Margaret Barrand died July qtr 1907, Lincoln district. July qtr 1910 Robert Barrand married Annie Marsden, Lincoln district. 1911 age 64, retired farmer, with wife Annie 44 born Wilsford, Lincs (married under 1 year, no children) and a servant at Newball Grange, Lincs. Robert Barrand died June qtr 1917, Lincoln district.

Elizabeth Barrand born 1845, Ropsley Lincolnshire, nee Nixon. 1851 at Nixon Lodge, Ropsley, Elizabeth Nixon age 6 in parents' house, Henry 49 farmer of 173 acres born Quenby? and wife Mary 38 born South Stoke. 1871 age 26, married to Robert (1871/3). Died before 1881, record not found.

Henry Edward Barrand born Dec.1872, Bradmore, son of Robert, farmer, and Elizabeth bapt. Bunny 25.12.1872. 1881 age 8, scholar, in the house of his grandmother Mary Barrand widow 65, farmer of 130 acres employing 1 man, with her son Thomas 33 and her grandson John Nixon 9 scholar, all born Kelby, at Kelby. 1891 age 17 ag.lab in parents' house. 1901 age 27 farmer's assistant in parents' house. 1903 Apr.qtr married Kate Ellen Ward, Lincoln district. 1911 age 38 farmer with wife Kate Ellen 30 born Reepham Lincs (married 7 years with 2 children, 1 dead) and son Arthur Edward 6 born Reasby Lincs, plus a sicknurse and 3 servants, at Colstead Stainton by Langworth Newball Lincs, 8 rooms. Henry Edward Barrand died Dec.qtr 1943, Welton Lincs.

BARRATT/BARRETT

Henry Barrett, born c1810 Oxton, Nottingham, married to Mary. 1841 age 30 ag.lab with wife Mary, no children at Cropwell Butler. 1851 age 42 farmer of 140 acres employing 1 labourer, with wife Mary and children Isabella, Charles, Henry and William and 4 servants, at Bunny. 1851 on Bunny electoral roll with freehold land in Bradmore, and on Bradmore electoral roll 1853-1860/1 with 191 acres, Debdale Farm. Signed Constable's accounts 1855, and rented grazing on Plumtree Lane the same year. 1855 in Kellys Directory, farmer. 1857 received 3/- from the Constable when he was on a jury. He was still in Bradmore in April 1860, but had moved to Stanton by April 1861. 1861 age 52, farmer of 207

acres employing 2 men and 4 boys, married to Mary with children Harry (13) and William (11) born Cropwell Butler, Eliza, Thomas, George and Mary born Bradmore, and charwoman Rebecca Henson age 52 (wife of Samuel, ag.lab of Bradmore), plus other servants at Stanton on the Wolds. (Note Charles and Isabella are still at Debdale Farm 1861 – see below.) 1867 in Bunny Estate rental renting 25 fields Nos. 27 to 51, with house, outbuildings, yard and garden $\frac{3}{4}$ acre, total 190 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres, total rent £190/3/23 pa, listed in separate schedule not shown under either Bunny or Bradmore. 1871 age 62 retired farmer with wife Mary and children Charles, Henry, Eliza, Thomas, George and Mary, at Cropwell Bishop. 1881 age 70 retired farmer with wife Mary and children Isabella, Charles, Henry, Eliza, Thomas, George and Mary, at Squire's Houses, Cropwell Bishop. 1891 age 81 widower living on own means with children Isabella, Charles, Henry, Thomas and George, at Cropwell Bishop. Henry died April 1891, Bingham district.

Mary Barratt born c1815, Bingham, married to Henry. 1841 age 37 (should be 27) married to Henry. 1851 age 35 married to Henry. 1861 age 46 at Stanton with Henry (Stanton 1861/21). 1871 age 56 married to Henry. 1881 age 64 married to Henry. Mary died Jan.1891, Bingham district.

Isabella Barratt, born 1843 Cropwell Butler, bapt. 3.3.1843, Tithby cum Cropwell Butler, daughter of Henry and Mary. 1851 age 8 scholar in parents' house. 1861 age 19, single, farmer's daughter in brother Charles's house, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1861/11). 1871 age 26 housemaid for Mary Marriott, widow, annuitant, at Cropwell Butler. 1881 age 34 in parents' house. 1891 age 46 in father's house. 1901 age 56 in brother Charles's house. 1911 age 65 head of household with sister Eliza at Cropwell Bishop, 4-room house. Isabella died Dec.1926, Bingham district.

Charles Barratt born 1844 Stanton on the Wolds Notts, bapt. 12.12.1844 at Stanton on the Wolds, son of Henry and Mary. 1851 age 6 scholar in parents' house. 1861 age 17, single, farmer of 191 acres at Debdale Farm, with sister Isabella, noted as leaving the farm (Bradmore 1861/11). 1871 age 26 in parents' house. 1881 age 32(/36?) ag.lab in parents' house. 1891 age 44 gen.lab in father's house. 1901 age 54 head of household, gen.lab with siblings Isabella, Henry and Eliza at Main Street, Cropwell Bishop. Charles died Oct.qtr 1905, Bingham district.

Henry Barratt born 1848 Cropwell Butler, son of Henry and Mary. 1851 age 3 scholar in parents' house. 1861 age 13 in parents' house. 1871 age 23 in parents' house. 1881 age 30(/33?) ag.lab. in parents' house. 1891 age 40 gen.lab in father's house. 1901 age 52 gen.lab in brother Charles's house. Henry died July 1906, Nottingham.

William Barratt born 1850 Cropwell Butler son of Henry and Mary. 1851 age 1 in parents' house. 1861 age 11 in parents' house. 1871 age 21, butcher's servant in house of John Newton, butcher, Cropwell Bishop (next door to parents).

Joseph Barratt born c1851, son of Henry and Mary, died 19.8.1858 aged 7 years, buried in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel.

Eliza Barrett born Bradmore 1854, bapt. Bunny 15.11.1854, daughter of Henry, farmer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 7 in parents' house at Stanton. 1871 age 16 in parents' house. 1881 age 25 in parents' house. Not found 1891. 1901 age 41 in brother Charles' house. 1911 age 51 housekeeper to sister Isabella.

Thomas Barrett born Bradmore 1856, bapt. Bunny 15.12.1856, son of Henry, farmer and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 4 in parents' house at Stanton. 1871 age 14 in parents' house. 1881 age 24 ag.lab in parents' house. 1891 age 32 gen.lab in father's house. 1893 Apr qtr Thomas Barratt married Minnie Louisa Sanders, Bingham district. 1901 age 44 hedgecutter and pig killer, with wife Minnie 30 born Walsall and children Thomas 6, Frederick 3, Gladys M 1 and baby less than 1 mth all born Cropwell Bishop, at Main St.,Cropwell Bishop. 1911 age 54 hedgecutter, ag.lab, with wife Maria Louisa 40 born Walsall (married 18 years with 7 children), Thomas 16 telegraph messenger, Frederick 13, Gladys Mary 11, Minnie Louisa 10, May 7, Charles Henry 5 scholars and William 1, all born Cropwell Bishop, at Cropwell Bishop, 3-room house.

George Barrett born 20.3.1858 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 6.5.1858, son of Henry, farmer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 2 in parents' house at Stanton. 1871 age 13 in parents' house. 1881 age 22 ag.lab in parents' house. 1891 age 30 gen.lab in father's house. 1893 July qtr George died, Bingham district.

Mary Barrett born Bradmore 1860, bapt. Bunny 20.4.1860, daughter of Henry, farmer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 1 in parents' house at Stanton. 1871 age 11 in parents' house. 1881 age 21, dressmaker, in parents' house. 1891 Jan qtr Mary died, Bingham district.

Catherine Barrat born 1822 Bradmore, maiden name not known, married to William Barrat, shipping merchant's clerk, son of John, retired baker and Arabella of 8 East St., Leicester. 1861 age 39 with husband William 55 landed proprietor born Leicester, and daughter Mary K K age 7 scholar born Liecester, with visitor Esther Russell age 26, married, born Liecester, at Wymondham. 1871 age 49 with husband William 65, daughter Mary K K age 17 and niece Clara Burdett 10 scholar, born Stonesby, daughter of George Burdett and Arabella nee Barratt, plus a servant at 46 Regent St.,

Leicester.

BARROW

William Barrow senior, churchwarden, of Bradmore, noted in 1641 Protestation Return (for supporters of true Protestant Religion) as a recusant, i.e. a dissenter refusing to attend Church of England services.

Jane Barrow married Richard Street, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 16.2.1664.

John Barrow, born Baslow. Married Mary Ann Voce daughter of John, publican and Elizabeth of Bradmore, July qtr 1860, Basford district. 1861 (age missing) gamekeeper, married to Mary A Voce, in the household of John Voce at the Crown Inn (1861/6). Possibly moved to Whittington, Warwickshire – see burial of Mary.

Mary Ann Barrow nee Voce born 1839, Bradmore, daughter of John and Elizabeth. Married John Barrow July qtr 1860, Basford district. 1861 age 23 married to John in her father's house, the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1861/6). Mary Barrow of Whittington Warks buried at Bunny 4.3.1867, age 28.

Elizabeth Voce Barrow, bapt. Bunny 6.4.1861, daughter of John, gamekeeper and Mary A, of Bradmore. 1861 newborn, in grandfather John Voce's house, The Crown Inn (Bradmore 1861/6). 1871 age 10, scholar, in grandfather John's house, The Crown (Bradmore 1871/7). Married at Bunny 16.11.1880 age 20 (i.e. in her 20th year), daughter of John Barrow, gamekeeper, to William Lane Buxton age 19, framework knitter of Bradmore, son of Thomas, framework knitter. See Buxton.

BARS(T)ON

Henry Bars(t)on married Alice Wright 17.6. 1639 at Bunny. May be the Henry, brother of Mary Hallam, mentioned in her will of 1695.

John Barston bapt. Bunny 10.8.1640, son of Henry and Alice of Bradmore.

Christopher Barson, servant, possibly the Christopher who married Elizabeth Johnson 9.2.1637 at Nottingham St Nicholas. 1641 Christopher took the Protestation Oath supporting the true Protestant Religion. Left will dated 25.7.1673, probate 20.2.1674. Left to his son-in-law George Archer £15 besides the goods given to him already to value of £2?, to be paid £5 on each of the next 3 May Days after Christopher's death, this in full satisfaction of all the portion he was to get with Ann, Christopher's daughter. To Elizabeth his grand-daughter he left £15, £5 pa for 3 years. The residue to his son Christopher, his executor.

Eliza(beth) Barson wife of Christopher, possibly nee Johnson, married 9.2.1637 at Nottingham St Nicholas. Died after 1651 but before Christopher's will 1673.

Alice Barston bapt. Bunny 26.1.1640, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

William Barson bapt. Bunny 16.2. 1645, son of Christopher and Eliza of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Barston bapt. Bunny 26.3.1643, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Anne Barston bapt. Bunny 7.9.1647, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Married George Archer 2.7.1671, Ruddington. Mentioned in Christopher's will 1673. See Archer.

Christopher Bars(t)on bapt. Bunny 13.4.1651, son of Christopher and Elizabeth. 1674 Hearth Tax shows Christopher Barson with 2 hearths – could be junior or senior. Married Elizabeth Nixon at Bunny 6.2.1675. Mentioned 1688 in the will of Gervas Nixon who left 1/- each to Christopher, his wife and his children. Probably the Christopher Barson, husbandman, who carried out inventory of goods of Mary Dale 1708 and of Joseph Chamberlain 1711. Left will dated 3.4.1723, probate granted 23.2.1728. Left to Elizabeth Cripps his eldest daughter 1/-, to Elizabeth Barson of West Leak 1/-, to Mary Husband his daughter £3, to Christopher Barson his son £3, to Alison Fortey his daughter £3, to William Barson his son £3, to Katherine Barson his daughter £3, these 5 legacies of £3 a year paid at 3 times equally one of the legacies £1 a year. To George Doge his grandson £1 when 21. The residue to Samuel Barson his son and sole executor. Witnessed Thomas Street and Hugh Allsop. Inventory dated 13.12.1727 comprising: purse and apparel 10/-; horse flesh £7/10/-; cows £7/10/-; swine 15/-; sheep 2/-; corn in the barns and pease £5/8/4; hay £1/2/6; corn on the ground £3; horse saddle 6/-; carriages 10/-; household goods £1; all things seen and unseen 5/4; total £29/13/6. Bond for £100 by Samuel Barson and Hugh Alsop dated 27.1.1728.

Elizabeth Barson nee Nixon, daughter of Gervas and Mary, married Christopher at Bunny 6.2.1675. Mentioned in her father Gervas's will 1688. Died after 1694, but before Christopher's will 1723.

Mary Barston bapt. Bunny 11.4.1677, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Died before 1683?

Elizabeth Barson bapt. Bunny 21.3.1680, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth, married to a Cripps by 1723, the date of Christopher's will, where she is referred to as the eldest daughter. Received token bequest, having already had her dowry at marriage.

John Barson bapt. Bunny 2.3.1682, son of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Barson married to John. Possibly the Elizabeth of West Leake referred to in Christopher's

will of 1723, which does not mention John who may have died before then, but puts Elizabeth's (token) bequest in the position where the second surviving child would be in the list.

Mary Barson bapt. Bunny 30.3.1712, daughter of John and wife of Bradmore.

Mary Barson daughter of Christopher Barston and Elizabeth (illegible) in Bunny registers entered under 1683. Died before 1688?

Ann Barston daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth, married George Dodge at East Bridgford 25.4.1703. Presumably they had a son George who is the grandson of Christopher mentioned in his will, under 21 in 1723.

Christopher Barson bapt. Bunny 2.11.1685, son of Christopher and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Mary Barson bapt. Bunny 23.4.1688, daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth. Possibly the Mary Husband referred to in Christopher's will, 1723.

Alison Barson daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth, referred to in Christopher's will of 1723 under married name (?Fortey), in sequence between Mary and William.

William Barson bapt. Bunny 15.6. 1690, son of Christopher and Elizabeth Barson of Bradmore.

Samuel Barson bapt. Bunny 1.7.1692, son of Christopher and Elizabeth Barson of Bradmore. Executor and inheritor of residue of estate of Christopher in his will 1723, and signed bond 1728.

Thomas Barson bapt. Bunny 23.2.1718, son of Samuel and Mary of Bradmore.

Katherine Barson bapt. Bunny 5.9.1694, daughter of Christopher Barson of Bradmore. Presumably died before 1723, not referred to in Christopher's will.

BARTON

Thomas Barton carried out inventory of goods of Mary Dale 1708.

BASSETT / BALSETT

Eliza Bassett born c1802, Nottingham. Probably the Eliza daughter of George Bassett and Mary nee Oldknow bapt. 21.10.1801 at Nottingham, Parliament St, formerly Hockley Chapel Methodist New Connexion. 1851 age 49, single, governess in the household of Elizabeth Goodacre at Blackcliffe Farm teaching Elizabeth's grand-children Sarah Maria and Elizabeth Butler (Bradmore 1851/27). 1861 age 59, single, friend of Sarah Maria Butler, fundholder living in Sarah's household, Blackcliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/15). 1871 age 69, sister in law of householder Charles Miller, draper and alderman, age 67, with his wife Anne age 67 born Nottingham, at No.62 High St Grantham. Eliza Bassett died, July qtr, 1877 Grantham district.

BASSFORD

Eleanor Bassford born 1858 Bradmore, nee Attewell, daughter of John framework knitter and Mary. Married Robert Bassford, Jan.qtr 1871. 1881 not found. 1891 Eleanor age 33 with husband Robert Bassford 39, general smith, born Walton, Leicestershire, and children Jessie Lilian 9 and Perry Steven 7, scholars, born Nottingham, and Elsie Nita 5 born West Bridgford, at Charnwood Grove, West Bridgford. 1901 age 43, widow, with children Jessie S 19, Telegraphist, GPO and Percy S 17, electrical engineer's clerk, both born Hyson Green, Elsie N 15 and Clarrissa I M, 8, both born West Bridgford, at 25 Charnwood Grove West Bridgford. 1911 age 53 widow (5 children, 1 dead) with children Jessie 19, clerk for Government Telegraph born Nottingham, Elsie 22 single, clerk Govt Telegraph born West Bridgford, and Clarissa 18, single, clerk shorthand typist born West Bridgford, plus a servant at 25 Charnwood Grove, West Bridgford, 6-room house. Eleanor died 1948.

BATE

George Bate of Bradmore 27.10.1621 presented for getting a child before marriage with Anne Dickinson.

BATES

Thomas Bates born 1845, Wymeswold. 1861 age 16, single, carter in the household of Edward G James, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1861/22). No other reference found.

Sarah Bates nee Henson born 1843-45 Bradmore, married Benjamin Bates Oct qtr 1865 Basford district. 1871 Sarah age 28 with husband Benjamin 27 railway guard born Barton Notts and children Elizabeth 4, Alice 3, Herbert 7 mths all born Nottingham, at Cremorne St, Nottingham St Marys. 1881 age 36 born Ruddington with husband Benjamin 35 railway foreman of shunters (pointsman) and children Herbert 10, Ellen 8, Mary 6, scholars all born Nottingham, and William 5 scholar, Elizabeth 3, Eliza 1 born Beeston, at Beeston. 1891 age 46 born Bradmore with husband Benjamin 47 goods foreman with Midland Railway and children Mary 16 lace hand born Nottingham, William 15 card puncher, Elizabeth 13 lace mender, Eliza 11, Benjamin 8, Sarah 5 all scholars born Beeston. 1901 age

58 with husband Benjamin 57 railway goods foreman, at 15 Dagmar Grove Beeston. 1911 age 68 (married 43 years with 10 children, 3 dead) with husband Benjamin 67 retired superintendent for railways plus a boarder at 39 Dagmar Grove, Beeston. Sarah Bates died Oct.qtr. 1911, Nottingham. Benjamin died Jan.qtr 1915, Basford.

BATTERSBY

Mark Battersbie presented by one churchwarden of Bradmore 14.5.1632 for uncharitable speeches in church on Sunday 6 May 1632, in giving the churchwarden the lie.

BAYSON?

Isabell Bayson? daughter of Francis and Susannah of Bradmore bapt. 2.9.1638.

BECK

William Beck married Jane Topley, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.1.1643. Probably the William who took the 1641 Protestation Return supporting the true Protestant Religion.

Robert Beck son of William and Jane of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 19.10.1643.

? Beck bapt. Bunny 27.9.1646, daughter of William and Frances of Bradmore.

Frances Beck married Thomas Gee both of Bradmore, at Bunny July 1663, day not known.

BEEBY

Walter Lacey Beeby of Manor Farm, born c1884, son of George, farmer and Sarah of Kingston on Soar 1891 age 6 in parents' house, George Beeby age 58 farmer born Hoby and wife Sarah age 47 born Cotes, with children Charles 23 clerk, Mary 20, George 18 clerk, Henry 16, Frank 15 scholar, Edward 14 scholar, Sarah Emily 13 scholar, Winifred Alice age 8 scholar, all born Kingston, at Kingston. 1901 age 17 in parents' house, George age 68 farmer, wife Sarah age 57, Charles 33 commercial clerk, Mary 30, Winifred A 18, George Junior 28 bank clerk, at Kingston on Soar. 1911 age 26, single, farmer and employer, in parents' house, George 78 farmer, employer and wife Sarah 67 (married 46 years with 13 children, 3 dead), Winifred Alice 28 and a servant, at Kingston on Soar. Oct.qtr 1914 Walter Lacey Beeby married Edith Sheppard, Basford district. Took over Manor Farm after Hutchinsons, before the end of World War I, c.1917. On Bradmore electoral roll 1920-1955, at Manor House eligible for service as special juror. Listed in Kellys Directories 1922 and 1925 as farmer. In 1928, 1932, 1936 and 1941 directories listed at Manor Farm, over 150 acres, tel.no. Ruddington 64. The 1941 directory described him as the principal landowner in Bradmore. Was the first in the village to use a tractor (Source: J Randall). Parish Councillor 1931-48. Governor of Bunny School and Trustee of Bunny Charities (1934 & 39/40 recorded). Mens Institute Vice President 1935/6-1939/40, President 1940/1-1945/6. Vice President 1946/7-1952/3. 1938 appointed Air Raid Warden under the ARP Scheme. Bred shire horses for the railway and paraded them along the Ramper. Judge at Newark Agricultural Show. Walter Lacey Beeby of The Manor, Bradmore, died 13.5.1955 age 71, probate 14.9.1955 to Norman Beeby and Kenneth Lacey Beeby, farmers, and George Whyley, secretary, effects £15,282/9/2. Buried Bunny churchyard south side.

Edith Beeby of Manor Farm, born c 1883, nee Sheppard, married Walter Oct.qtr 1914, Basford district. On Bradmore electoral roll 1920-1971 at "The Manst" May 1945-6 and "Manor House" 1947-71. 1935 Mrs W Beeby on K George V Jubilee Celebrations committee. In the hot summer of 1947 when most of the Bradmore wells dried up one at Manor Farm did not, and Mrs Beeby allowed Mrs Bagguley (Blackcliffe Farm) to use it, for a charge. Took on Rancliffe Farm when Edlingtons retired in 1958. Died 1.6.1971 age 88, buried Bunny churchyard south side.

Walter and Edith Beeby had children Norman born 1918, and Kenneth Lacy.

Edith Mary Beeby born c1897, died 3.5.1918 age 21, buried Bunny churchyard south side, recorded on Walter and Edith's gravestone – possibly sibling of Walter?

Richard Dennis Beeby born c1909 died 23.4.1918 age 9, buried Bunny churchyard south side, recorded on Walter and Edith's gravestone – possibly sibling of Walter?

BEECROFT

Sarah Beecroft born c1823 Bradmore, nee Sarah Sadler Middleton, daughter of Sarah Middleton and Thomas Sadler. Sarah Sadler married George Beecroft of Grange Farm Ruddington Apr qtr 1848, Basford. 1851 age 28 born Bradmore, with husband George 27 ag.lab and children William 2 and Elizabeth 6 mths, plus visitor Lydia Sadler age 14 born Ruddington (daughter of Sarah's sister Elizabeth Middleton and Thomas Sadler, see Sadler), at Stoke Newington, Middx. 1861 age 38 with husband George 37 and children William 12, Elizabeth 10, George 8, scholars born North Kensington, Sarah A 5 scholar and Thomas 8 mths born Ruddington, at Grange Farm Ruddington. 1871 age 48 with

husband George 47, ag.lab and children Elizabeth 20, George 18, Thomas Sadler Beecroft 10 scholar and Edith 8 scholar, born Ruddington, at The Grange, Ruddington. 1881 age 58, with husband George 57, of Grange Farm 99 acres employing 3 labourers and 2 boys, and children Thomas Sadler Beecroft 20 and Edith 18, teacher, grandsons George Ernest Harpham 7 and Alfred Harpham 6 both born Nottingham (children of George Harpham, gen.lab, and Elizabeth nee Beecroft, married Oct qtr 1872, Basford), plus servants, at Grange Farm Ruddington. 1891 age 68 with husband George 67, son Thomas 30 and grand-daughter Helena 12 at Grange Farm Ruddington. 1901 age 78, with husband George, retired farmer 78, and grand-daughter Margaret Harpham 17 born Keyworth and another not legible, age 7, at Ruddington. 1911 Sarah head of household, widow age 88, with a visitor from Ollerton and a servant, at Vicarage Lane, Ruddington, 5-room house. Sarah died 1918, Basford district. **Mary** Beecroft nee Bilby born 1818 Clifton, living in Bradmore 1841 (see Bilby). Married Samuel Beecroft Jan.qtr 1846. 1861 age 43 hosemaker with husband Sam 57 cab driver born Chilwell and children Samuel 19, Sarah A 6 scholars born Clifton and "inmate" William Bosworth 13 born Bradmore, at Mitchell St., Radford. Samuel Beecroft died Apr qtr 1867, Radford district.

BEESON

Thomas Beeson in Constable's Accounts Oct.1805, Constable (John Attenborough) paid for warrant to take Thomas Beeson, 3/-, and paid expenses for himself, John Lane and John Nixon going to Ruddington to take Thomas Beeson, 5/-. Accounts for that year have a first payment from Thomas Beeson, £5, included in receipts, and the next year 1806/7 he paid another £5 to the Constable.

BEESTON

Ann Beeston born c1784, Bradmore nee Henson, possibly daughter of John, labourer, and Sarah of Bradmore. Ann Henson married Thomas Beeston of Ruddington at Ruddington 12.8.1807. 1851 age 65 born Bradmore married to Thomas age 66 framework knitter born Ruddington (1785) with children Samuel 26, Frederick 25, Edward 19 and grand-daughter Emily age 11, all born Ruddington, plus a lodger at Ruddington. 1861 age 78, widow, house tenant, with son Sidney Edwin age 30 born Ruddington, at 28 Wilford Rd., Ruddington.

Jane Beeston, born 1844, Ratcliffe on Trent. 1871 age 27, single, housekeeper to Joseph Bonser at Bonsers Farm (Bradmore 1871/17).

BELSINNE

Ann Belsinne married Thomas Bolsworth of Bunny at Bunny 13.11.1598.

BELTON

John Belton married Elizabeth Marrot both of Bradmore at Bunny 8.11.1763.

BENNETT

Richard Bennet married to Elizabeth, living in Bradmore in the 1640s. 1641 took Protestation Oath supporting true Protestant Religion.

William Bennet bapt. Bunny 29.12.1644, son of Richard and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Richard Bennet bapt. Bunny 14.2.1647, son of Richard and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Bennet bapt. Bunny 1.7.1649, daughter of Richard and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

John Bennet married to Alice, living in Bradmore in 1650s.

Katharine Bennet bapt. Bunny 3.4.1653, daughter of John and Alice of Bradmore.

William and John Bennet bapt. Bunny 27.6. 1656, twin sons of John Bennet of Bradmore.

John Bennet bapt. Bunny 2.5.1658, son of John and Alice Bennet of Bradmore.

Hugh Bennett bapt. Bunny 25.9.1659, son of John and Alice.

John Bennet married Mary Ward, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 30.4.1661.

Thomas Bennet married to Ann, living in Bradmore in 1660s. Possibly the Thomas on the 1674 Hearth Tax return with 1 hearth.

Mary Bennet bapt. Bunny 11.10.1663, daughter of Thomas and Ann of Bradmore.

Sarah Bennet bapt. Bunny 25.2.1666, daughter of Thomas and Ann...Mary? his wife, of Bradmore..

William Bennet bapt. Bunny 30.1.1668, son of Thomas and of Bradmore.

Anne Bennet bapt. Bunny 29.7.1670, daughter of Batrix of Bradmore, base begotten supposed by Garrat? Wilkinson of Sutton Bonnington.

John Bennet bapt. Bunny 6.2. 1671, son of Thomas and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Thomas Bennet bapt. Bunny 22.1.1674, son of Thomas and Eliza of Bradmore.

William Bennet bapt. Bunny 5.2.1678, son of Thomas and Elnor of Bradmore.

Thomas Bennet married Dorothy Dent 5.11.1711 at Bunny. Living in Bradmore in 1710s-1730s.

Dorothy Bennet nee Dent, married Thomas at Bunny 5.11.1711, buried Bunny 31.8.1732.

Thomas Bennett bapt. Bunny 12.10.1712, son of Thomas and Dorothy of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 14.12.1722.

Samuel Bennet bapt. Bunny 7.4.1717, son of Thomas and Dorothy of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 28.4.1717.

Ffrancis Benet bapt. Bunny 13.7.1718, son of Thomas and Dorothy of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 9.10.1720.

John Bennet bapt. Bunny 10.9.1710, son of Thomas and Frances of Bradmore.

William Bennet born c1721, tailor. Married Mary nee Glover, daughter of Thomas and Mary. Probably William Bennet Senior in Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 10 acres 2 roods 21 perches, including 2 acres 16 perches in Bunny, and paying £9/9/6 rent pa including 19/11 for house, garden and croft. Buried Bunny 29.8.1798 aged 77.

Mary Bennett born c1723 nee Glover, daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bonsers Farm, mentioned in Thomas's will of 1763 as Mary Bennett. Probably the Mary Bennett recorded in Constable's Account for 1779/80 receiving payment for doing for Ann Manchester, 6d. As widow of Bradmore, buried Bunny 20.8.1800 aged 77.

Mary Benet bapt. Bunny 17.1.1749, daughter of William and Mary, no parish specified.

John Benet bapt. Bunny 31.7.1751, son of William and Mary, no parish specified.

Elizabeth Benet bapt. Bunny 24.12.1754, daughter of William and Mary, no parish specified. Elizabeth Bennet married Matthew Cumberland both of Bradmore at Bunny 31.1.1788. See Cumberland.

Alice Benet bapt. Bunny 15.5.1758, daughter of William and Mary, no parish specified.

Katherine Benet bapt. 12.7.1760, daughter of William and Mary, no parish specified.

Jane Benet bapt. Bunny April (before 21st), 1762, daughter of William and Mary, no parish specified.

Martha Bennet bapt. Bunny 3.2. 1765, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore.

John Benet bapt. 9.11.1733, son of John and Mary of Bradmore.

Thomas Bennet son of John and Mary of Bradmore buried 2.1.1744.

William Benet bapt. Bunny Dec 1756, son of John and Mary, no parish specified. Buried Bunny 28.12.1834 age 78. Possibly William Bennet Junior in Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 6 acres 13 perches paying £5/1/7 rent pa including 10/- for house and garden. William Bennet received 2/6 from the Constable in March 1827 for mending William Stevenson's clothes and 3/4 in Sept 1834, i.e. worked as a tailor.

William Bennet (not necessarily of Bradmore) received weekly payments from the Constable from 1794-1800 for Mary Darker's son John (age 4-10) and also for clothing and shoes for him – fostering? After payments for John Darker finish, he received payment for Francis Bennet. (See also William above).

Jane Bennet born c1752 buried Bunny 19.11.1828 age 76.

Elizabeth Bennet born c1762 buried Bunny 9.4.1828 age 66.

Richard Bennet recorded in Constable's Account for 1779-80 received payment with Mr Stevenson for burying Ann Manchester, Jan.1780. Richard Bennet, no parish specified, buried Bunny 13.9.1801.

Ann Benet wife of Richard, no parish specified, buried Bunny 14.2.1744. Not necessarily of Bradmore.

John Bennett, tailor, married Jane Webster of Costock at Bunny 27.2.1781, living in Bradmore in 1780s and 1790s. Possibly John son of William and Mary born 1751? John Bennett recorded in Constable's Accounts 1782 as having a house, expenses paid by the Constable, including 4/- paid to John Lane when they met at Thomas Peet's about John Bennet's house; 28.12.1782 the Constable paid for carriage of a load of stubble and lime for Bennett's house 10/-, and for carriage of 3 loads of bricks from Normanton for Bennett's house £10/10/-; also William Olliver's bill for John Bennett's house £6/6/-. Constable paid John Bennet 1/- for making gowns for Alsop's girl, Feb.1789. Probably the John Bennett in Bunny Estate Survey 1792 under Town Houses and Incroachments with a house. 1794 January the Constable paid John Bennett's money for the militia 5/-. Dec.1807 received 3/6 from the Constable for making a round frock for William Henson. May be the John Bennett of Bradmore buried at Bunny 29.1.1812.

Jane Bennet nee Webster of Costock, married John at Bunny 27.2.1781.

William Bennett bapt. Bunny 3.6.1781 son of John and Jane. Benet(t) paid by Constable in 1789 for catching sparrows. Married Elizabeth Smith of Edwalton? at Bunny 17 or 19.6.1804. 1841 age 60 agricultural labourer, with wife Eliza and daughter Milicent, living in part of Mill Cottage, Far Street (Bradmore 1841/52). 1851 age 69, farm labourer, with wife Elizabeth, and married daughter Ann Dacock, visiting them (Bradmore 1851/11).

(Note William Bennett of Bradmore married Elizabeth Cooper of Tollerton 18.8.1807, possible alternative or second marriage after birth of Samuel Jan.1807? May be the Elizabeth in the census

records?)

Elizabeth Bennett born c 1781, Wysall or Edwalton?, nee Smith, married William at Bunny 19.6.1804. 1841 as Eliza, age 60 married to William (1841/52). 1851 age 73, married to William (Bradmore 1851/11). (See also note above)

Samuel Bennett bapt. Bunny 20.1.1805, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1833 paid by Constable for one day's work, 1/6. 1838 Constable paid Samuel Bennet's club, 7/8. 1841 age 30, agricultural labourer, householder, with wife Elizabeth and children June, Elijah, John, William, George and Mary. Lived in part of Mill Cottage, Far St., next door to his parents (Bradmore 1841/53). 1842 Constable paid Samuel 2/6 p.wk. for 22 weeks. June 1844 Constable recorded 1/6 expenses going with Saml Bennet to the doctor. 1845 Sam claimed 4/6 expenses from the Constable regarding the examination of Edd Elliott. 1851 age 46, farm labourer, with wife Elizabeth and children Elijah, William, George, Mary Ann, Eliza (Bradmore 1851/12). 1861 age 58, agricultural labourer, with wife Elizabeth, children George, Eliza and grand-daughter Sarah A., 2, born 1959 Keyworth (no further record), living on Town St., Keyworth.

Elizabeth Bennett born 1814, Quorndon Leics. 1841 age 25, married to Sam (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 36, married to Samuel (Bradmore 1851/12). 1861 age 47, married to Samuel, at Town St., Keyworth.

Jane Bennett bapt. Bunny 4.7.1828, daughter of Samuel, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53).

Elijah Bennett bapt. Bunny 17.11.1831, son of Samuel, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 20, single, framework knitter, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/12).

John Bennett bapt. Bunny 14.2.1833, son of Samuel, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 9 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 17, ag.lab, servant for John Peet, farmer of 70 acres at Tofts Farm, Bradmore (Bradmore 1851/59). Apr qtr 1857 Bingham district, John Bennett married Elizabeth Aldridge, seamstress, born 1821 Tollerton, daughter of Francis, annuitant (sick club) and Elizabeth of Tollerton. 1861 age 27, with wife Elizabeth 39, born Tollerton, and daughter in law Mary 12 (age 2 in 1851, in Elizabeth's parents' house as grand-daughter) and Eliza 8, scholars, living at Tollerton. 1871 age 36, coal dealer's labourer, with wife Elizabeth age 50 at 5 Brunswick St., Nottingham, no children present, sharing the house with the Handley family (wife Eliza born Tollerton 1851). Elizabeth died Apr qtr 1878, Nottingham district. 1881 John age 48, widower, farm servant, head of household with 8 boarders in total, the Taylor family, related by marriage to the Aldridges of Tollerton, plus 2 Handley scholars, at 14 Blackstone? Street, Nottingham St Mary. 1891 age 57, widower, gen.lab, lodger with William Taylor, gen.lab, at 26 Newthorpe St, Nottingham. John Bennett died Jan.qtr 1895, Nottingham district.

William Bennett bapt. Bunny 27.5.1835, son of Samuel, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 7 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 15, single, winder, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/12). 1861 age 23, glover, nephew in his uncle John's house, with aunt Louisa and cousin Mary Ann, at Church St., Basford. 1871 age 35, framework knitter in his uncle's house at Knights Square, Arnold. 1881 age 36 (should be 46?), glovemaker born Bradmore, inmate at St Anns Workhouse, Nottingham. William Bennett born 1835 died July qtr 1881, Nottingham (but note William Bennett born 1846, possibly the glove-maker in the workhouse, died July qtr 1889 Nottingham).

George Bennett bapt. Bunny 29.3.1838, son of Sam, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 4 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 13, single, winder, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/12). 1861 age 21, cotton glove maker, in parents' house at Town St., Keyworth. 1871 age 31, framework knitter (born Bunny) with wife Jane 29 seampstress, on Park St, Lenton, Nottingham. 1881 George Bennett age 41, framework knitter born Bradmore, with wife Jane 39 born Purston nr Farthinghoe, Northants and son E Thomas age 15, fish trade journeyman born Leicester, at Basford. 1891 George age 49 porter born Bradmore, widower, on his own at 15 Althorpe St, Nottingham.

Mary Ann Bennett bapt. Bunny 3.6. 1840, daughter of Sam, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/53). 1851 age 9, seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/12).

Eliza Bennett bapt. Bunny 21.3.1844, daughter of Samuel, labourer and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 7, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/12). 1861 age 14, glove seamer, in parents' house at Town St., Keyworth.

Mary Bennett bapt. Bunny 7.2. 1807, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore, died before Dec.1808.

Mary Bennett bapt. Bunny 20.12.1808, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore, died before Nov.1809.

Mary Bennett bapt. Bunny 29.11.1809, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 30 with brother John 20, in house of William Daycock and his wife Ann (Mary's sister), with their children, at Basford. 1851 age 42 seamstress in house of brother in law William Deacock and family at High St Basford (his wife Ann, Mary's sister, is away visiting her parents in 1851, see Ann Bennett below and see also Dacock). 1861 age 52 laundress, boarder with brother in law William Dacock and his wife Ann at Nelson St., Basford. 1871 age 67 laundress in house of brother in law William Daycock and his wife Ann and family at Nelson St., Basford. 1881 age 78 housekeeper for brother in law William Daycock and his wife Ann and family at 26 Nelson St Basford. Mary Bennet died Apr qtr 1881, Basford district.

Ann Bennett bapt. Bunny 28.12.1810, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Died before 1814.

John Bennett bapt. Bunny 29.3.1813, son of William, cottager, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Died before 1817.

Ann Bennett bapt. Bunny 15.12.1814, daughter of William cottager and Elizabeth of Bradmore, married William Dacock before 1837. In Bradmore 1851 as Ann Dacock, age 35, married daughter visiting her parents' house (Bradmore 1851/11). See Dacock, and see sister Mary above.

John Bennett bapt. Bunny 10.10.1817, son of William, cottager, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 20, silk stockings, with sister Mary age 30 in house of brother in law William Daycock and wife Ann (John's sister) at Basford. Apr qtr 1844 John Bennett married Mary Monks, Basford district. Daughter Mary Ann born c1850. Wife Mary died Apr qtr 1850, Basford district. 1851 John age 33, widower, framework knitter gloves, silk, on his own on Alfreton Rd., Nottingham (daughter Mary Ann age 1 staying with William Deacock). Date of second marriage to Louisa not found. 1861 age 43 boot, shoe and glove manufacturer with wife Louisa 48 born Lyndhurst and daughter Mary Ann 11 scholar born Basford, plus nephew William Bennett 23 glover born Bradmore, son of Samuel and Elizabeth (see above), at Church St Basford. 1871 age 53, grocer, with wife Louisa 58 and daughter Mary A 21 plus nephew William Bennet 35 framework knitter, at Knights Square, Arnold. 1881 age 53 widower, warehouseman, father in law of householder Henry Hartnell 35 civil service clerk, telegraph, born Chard Somerset, and his wife Mary A age 31 (nee Bennett) born Basford, their 9 mth old son and 2 visitors, at 305 Mansfield Rd Basford.

Milicent Bennett bapt. Bunny 31.7.1820, daughter of William, cottager, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 20, in the household of William and Elizabeth (Bradmore 1841/52). 14.3.1842 married Richard Swaine, servant of Bradmore, at Bunny. See Swaine.

Mary Bennett bapt. 15.3.1784, daughter of John and Jane of Bradmore, buried Bunny 1.4.1784.

Jane Bennett born 24.2.1788, bapt. Bunny 26.2.1788, daughter of John, tailor, and Jane, died an infant, buried Bunny 1.3.1788.

Jane Bennett born 13.7.1790, Bradmore, bapt. at Bunny 13.7.1790, daughter of John, tailor, and Jane. Buried Bunny as an infant, 20.7.1790.

Catharine Bennett bapt. at Bunny 1 or 4.7.1791, daughter of John, tailor, and Jane, of Bradmore. Buried Bunny as an infant 15.8.1791.

Catherine Bennett born 11.3.1792, bapt. 11.3.1792, Bradmore, daughter of John, tailor, and Jane.

Francis Bennet 1786 in Constables Accounts, Constable paid 2/6 for his examination and 15/- to the Doctor for curing Francis Bennett's jaundice, and 3 weeks board for the same 15/-, and expenses 10d, and 1 week's pay for the same when he went to leckwork? 4/-. Jan.1787 Constable paid Francis Bennett 10/6. 16.9.1790 paid Francis 10/6 when ill, and again 4.11.1791. Francis was not named in the 1792 Bunny Estate survey either as householder or as tenant of a Town House. Either he was not present in the village or was not a householder – possibly lodging with another family. 1794-1796 received regular weekly payments from the Constable. 1798 had weekly pay of 2/6 for 4 weeks, and 31.10.1798 Constable paid Guareley of Stapleford £2/8/- for Francis, possibly a doctor's bill. Nov.1798 Francis had 5 weeks pay and a waistcoat £1/3/-. Jan.1799 Richard Henson was paid 3/- for fetching Francis. 19.7.1800 William Bennet had £1/1/- for Francis Bennet (not necessarily this Francis, may be a foster-child, see below). 1800 Francis had weekly pay and 2 new shirts, and in 1801 pairs of stockings at 2/4. 6.5.1801 the Constable paid 6/4 for laying Francis out, and for bread and ale, and paid Mr Beetham (vicar of Bunny) and the clerk 2/6. Buried at Bunny 5.5.1801.

Catherine Bennet married Thomas Hayes of Ruddington at Bunny 30.12.1794.

Alice Bennet Jan 1800 had 6d from the Constables Accounts, probably for helping when Mary Stevenson died. May be the Alice Bennett who married Thomas Trigg both of Bradmore at Bunny 25.5.1801.

Edward Bennett of Bradmore buried Bunny 30.8.1806.

Elizabeth Bennett of Bradmore buried Bunny 4.1.1807.

Mary Bennet of Bradmore buried Bunny 10.3.1813, no age given.

Anne Bennet married Thomas As(t)ill of Plumtree at Bunny 27.11.1815.

John Bennett born c 1826 Bradmore, recorded in 1861 as Notts but may be Bradmore, Staffs. 1861 age 35 coal mine labourer with wife Lettice age 40 born Burntwood Staffs, at Elder Corner, Burntwood Edial & Woodhouse, Staffs. 1881 age 66 greengrocer born Staffs with wife Lettice 65 and pauper James Darby 74 born Staffs, at Burntwood. 1891 Lettice Bennett age 74 widow born Ridware Hill Staffs with niece at Burntwood.

Joseph Bennet born c 1850, buried Bunny 20.8.1858 age 8, then of Bradmore.

BERESFORD

Richard Beresford born c1771. 1841 age 70, independent means, with servant Mary Marson in one of the cottages forming Southwell House, Main St. (Bradmore 1841/33). Died Apr qtr 1845, Nottingham.

BET(T)ISON

John Betison bapt. Bunny 25.4.1720, son of Robert and Ann of Bradmore.

Everard Bettison bapt. Bunny 15.3.1722, son of Robert and Ann of Bradmore.

BEXON

Joseph Bexon's rent paid by Constable Apr.1801, £2/12/6. Apr.1802 part of his rent, £1/1/- . 1.4.1805 his wife had £2/2/-, and Apr.1807 he was paid £1/-/9, no details. June 1809 expenses of 1/6 paid to Joseph Bexon, and 22.9.1809 the Constable paid for ale for him when he came over.

Widow Bexon April 1811 had 6/- p.wk. from the Constable, at May 1811 she was getting 5/- p.wk., and 2/6 p.wk. in Dec.1811. 28.10.1811 there was a Towns Meeting held to discuss Bexon and Selby. 1.3.1812 she had 10/- towards her child's burial, and the Constable paid a bill for 19/- for the funeral. 1812 payments of 4/- p.wk. to P Bexon/Widow Bexon.

BIDDLES

William Biddles born c1823, not of Bradmore. 1841 age 18, of independent means in the household of William and Rebecca Attenbrough, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1841/79). Probably of the Leicestershire Biddles family, possibly the William Biddles who died 1843, Nottingham.

BILBY

Maria Bilby nee Attewell born 1819 Bradmore daughter of John and Elizabeth, married James Bilby 15.12.1840. See Attewell.

Mary Bilby born 1821. 1841 age 20, independent means. The location of her house is not known, but may have been towards the bottom of Main St. (Bradmore 1841/23). Jan.qtr 1846 Mary Bilby married Samuel Beecroft, Basford district. See Beecroft.

BILLAGE

William Billage of Bradmore buried Bunny 6.8.1716.

BINGHAM

Dorothy Bingham married Richard Wait, pauper, at Bunny 24.10.1703.

BIRCH

Abigail Birch age 20, spinster of Bradmore, married Joseph Bowley, 30, of Bradmore at Bunny 20.3.1689 (1690 modern calendar).

John Burgess Birch born July qtr 1861, Southwell district, son of William, farmer, and Hannah of Oxton. 1871 age 9, scholar, in parents' house at Oxton. 1881 age 19, son of William farmer of 57 acres and Hannah at Shady Lane, Oxton. Marriage c1889 to Annie Bloor, daughter of Samuel, saddler and harnessmaker, and Ellen, of Belgrave St, Derby, details of marriage not found. 1891 age 29 farmer's son with widowed mother Hannah 62, and Hannah's "daughter" Annie Birch 23 born Derby, plus boarder Frank H Bloor 9 scholar born Derby and a servant at ?Selbe Farm, Oxton. 1901 age 39, farmer, employer, born Oxton, with wife Annie 33 born Derby and children Frank W 8, Samuel 6, scholars born Oxton, and Dorothy M age 1 born Newstead, plus sister in law May Bloor, single, 18 born Derby, with domestic servant and waggoner at Abbey Fields Farm, Newstead Priory. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement, 1905-7. 1911 age 49 colliery carter with wife Annie 43 (married 22 years, 3 children) and children Frank William 18 single colliery electrician, Samuel 16 single colliery clerk and Dorothy MacKlair Birch 11 scholar, at 10 Scargill St, Eastwood, 6-room

house.

Annie Birch nee Bloor, daughter of Samuel, saddler and harnessmaker, and Ellen, of Belgrave St, Derby; married John Burgess Birch c1889. 1891 with John at Oxton. 1901 married to John, at Newstead. No reference to her in Bradmore, but presumably living with her family 1904-7. 1911 married to John, at Eastwood.

Frank William Birch born 1893 Oxton, son of John and Annie. 1901 age 8 scholar in parents' house. Admitted to Bunny School 25.4.1904, Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class May 1904-Dec.1905 (no Sunday School records from 1906 onwards). 1911 age 18 colliery electrician in parents' house.

Samuel Birch born 1895, Oxton, son of John and Annie. 1901 age 6 scholar in parents' house. Admitted to Buny School 25.4.1904. Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class May/June 1904, 2nd class July 1904-Dec.1905. 1911 age 16 colliery clerk in parents' house.

Dorothy MacKlair Birch born 1900, Newstead, daughter of John and Annie. (Note George Maklaier, saddler and harness maker, was at Queen St, Derby between 1837-1848; also a George Maclair born Derby Oct.qtr 1892.) 1901 age 1 in parents' house. Admitted to Bunny School 25.4.1904. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls May-June 1904, 3rd class July-Dec 1905. 1911 age 11 scholar in parents' house.

BIRD

William Bird, married to Mary, living in Bradmore 1640s-1650.

George Bird bapt. Bunny 5.10.1646, son of William and Mary of Bradmore.

William Bird bapt. Bunny 10.10.1648, son of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Robert Bird bapt. Bunny 16.4.1650, son of William and Mary of Bradmore.

BISHOP

Samuel Bishop received payment from Constable in 1791 for catching sparrows.

Lucy Bishop nee Hodgett of Bradmore, daughter of Charles and Elizabeth, married July qtr 1884 Loughborough district to Henry John Bishop born 1863 Measham. See Hodgett.

BLAKE

Jane Blake nee Hutchinson daughter of Thomas and Alice of Bradmore, married July 1876 Wycombe Bucks district to Charles Blake born 1851 Gt Missenden. See Hutchinson.

BLAND

Elizabeth Bland nee Stevenson, born 1825 Bradmore, daughter of William and Elizabeth. Jul.qtr.1854 Elizabeth Stevenson married George Bland, groom, son of Henry ag.lab and Elizabeth of Corby. 1861 Elizabeth age 35 married to George age 33 groom, with children William Henry 5 scholar born Nottingham St Mary, John 1 born Nottingham St Nicholas, at Nottingham. 1871 Elizabeth age 46 married to George age 43 coachman (born Aslackby, Lincs) with children William H 15 iron turner and 3 lodgers, at South St., Sherwood. 1881 Elizabeth age 56 with husband George age 53 coachman and daughter Florence 9 born Nottingham, plus lodgers, at 14 North St., Sherwood. 1891 Elizabeth age 66 with husband George age 63 coachman and daughter Florence 19, at 1 Wollaton St., Nottingham. 1901 Elizabeth age 76 with husband George 73 coachman groom (nearly blind), at 5 Park Place, Nottingham. Elizabeth Bland died Jul.qtr., 1901 Nottingham. George Bland died Oct.qtr.1904, Basford.

Elizabeth Blood married Joseph Chamberlain both of Bradmore at Bunny 11.2.1692.

Emma Blood born 1839, Bradmore, nee Henson, daughter of Henry and Jane. 2nd wife of Thomas, framework knitter of Ruddington, previously married to Eliza Murden 17.4.1854. 1861 age 21 seamstress born Bradmore with husband Thomas Blood 26 framework knitter, cottager, born Ruddington and daughter Mary 5 born Ruddington (daughter of Thomas and Eliza) at 12 East St, Ruddington. 1871 age 31 with husband Thomas 36 framework knitter and children Mary 15, seamer, Eliza 9, Harriet 7 and Henry William 4 all scholars, and Jesse (son) 2, at The Leas, Ruddington. 1881 age 42 with husband Thomas 45 cotton weaver and children Harriett 17 tailoress, Henry William 14 cotton weaver, Jesse 12 ag.lab., Martha Ellen 9 scholar, all born Ruddington, plus lodger Fredrick Peacock 21 ag.lab born Thoroton, his wife Eliza 19 stocking seamstress (daughter of Thomas and Emma) and their daughter Elizabeth 8 mths born Ruddington, at The Leys, Ruddington. 1891 widow age 53 with daughter Hannah 9, visitors in the house of Levi Richards age 65 ag.lab and his wife

Letitia 61 both born Cotgrave, with their daughter in law and grand-daughter at Cotgrave. 1901 widow age 64 hosiery seamer at home with daughter Hannah 19, hosiery seamer at home, both born Ruddington, at Distillery Row Ruddington. 1911 age 72 widow with daughter Hannah 29 seamstress at home, both born Ruddington, at Sandys Yard, Distillery St Ruddington. Emma Blood died Dec.1923, Basford district.

Catherine Blood nee Jacques daughter of Frank and Mary of Bradmore, married 1889 Basford district to Henry William Blood of Ruddington. See Jacques.

William Blount married Agnes Trowell of Bunny at Bunny 5.5.1613.

BOATE

Ann Boate married Richard Bramley of Great Leake (East Leake) at Bunny 1.10.1604.

BOLDOCK – see Baldock

BOLY - see Bowley

BOND(E)

Isabel Bonde married William Burton of Plumtree at Bunny 26.1.1602.

Joan Bonde married Edmund Greene of Thrumpton by Ordinary's licence at Bunny 18.10.1604.

William Bond husbandman left a will dated 15.10.1611, proved 17.1.1612.

Alice Bond married Edward Tompson of Wymeswold at Bunny 1.7.1616.

Jane Bond married Gervase Golding of Bunny at Bunny 16.11.1619.

William Bond's late servant Ursula Osborne and Richard Smythe 5.11.1627 presented by one churchwarden (un-named) of Bradmore, by common fame of fornication.

Jane Bond married Robert Johnson both of Bradmore, at Bunny 30.11.1639.

BONSER

Thomas Bonser received payment from Constable 1794 for catching sparrows.

Elizabeth Bonser, born c1765, wife of Thomas, buried at Bunny 26.1.1794, died aged 29.

Ann Bonser born 16.5.1792, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 18.5.1792, daughter of Thomas, carpenter, and Elizabeth. Buried Bunny 5.8.1794.

Samuel Bonser, farmer, christened 17.2.1793, Kinoulton, son of Henry and Sarah (nee Rowe, married at Nottingham St Mary 22.9.1783). His farm, based on the farmhouse at 15 Farmer St., was later known as Bonsers Farm. On Bradmore electoral roll 1846-8 with 60 acres. Signed Constable's Accounts 1846. Buried Bunny 30.1.1849, age 55. Left will dated 28.10.1848, witnessed by J H Buttery and Jno. (John) Robinson. Ready money, live and dead farming stock, household goods and furniture, plate, linen and china and all estate left to his wife Catherine Bonser. Joseph Wild of Owthorpe Lodge farmer, John Bonser of Wisbeach, Wesleyan Minister (son of Henry and Sarah, bapt. Kinoulton 29.9.1785), and William Attenborough of Bradmore, farmer, as executors and administrators for Catherine to continue to carry on the farm and business for and during the term of her natural life or during her option for her own absolute use and benefit, and after her death, or declining to carry on, to continue until the youngest child was 21. Profits to be applied for the benefit of two daughters Catherine Phebe Bonser and Fanny Bonser and son Joseph Bonser equally, until the youngest was 21. To his son Edmund Bonser £5 pa until Catherine died etc., then to get the balance of £100. To his son Samuel Bonser a legacy or sum of £5. To his son Richard Bonser, £5. To his son William Bonser, £5. To his son Thomas Bonser, £5. To his son John Bonser, £5. To his son James Bonser, £5. To his daughter Catherine Phebe Bonser £25. To daughter Fanny £25. All to be paid within one year of the death of Catherine his wife or of the youngest coming to the age of 21, whichever was the later. At that time his estate to go to his son Joseph (the youngest, aged 14 when Samuel died), with possession of farm and buildings. If he was dead, trustees to dispose of the estate by public auction or private contract and the balance to be divided equally among wife, children and their issue. (Note that John Wild of Owthorpe Lodge, one of Samuel's executors, was brother of Sarah Wild who married Edward White, and their daughter Sarah White married John Randall, later farmer at Bonsers Farm. See Randall.)

Catherine Bonser, born 1792, Wysall, wife of Samuel. 1851 age 58, widow, householder, farmer of 82 acres employing 1 labourer, with children Catherine, Fanny, Joseph, and agricultural servant George Dexter in household (Bradmore 1851/9). 1853 Whites Directory, Cath. Bonser, farmer. C J Bonser signed Sunday School accounts 1853/4, presumably Catherine. 1855 Kellys Directory, Mrs Bonser, farmer. 1860-4 rented grazing in Mill Lane, and on Turnpike 1864. 1861 age 69, widow, farmer of 104

acres employing 1 labourer and 1 boy, with children Catherine, Fanny and Joseph, servants John Harlon carter, Benjamin Upton ploughboy and Mary Johnson general servant (Bradmore 1861/14). 1867 Bunny Estate Rental jointly with J(oseph) renting house, buildings, garden and land 104 acres 15 perches £190/9s/1d pa. 1869 Morris's Directory, farmer. Buried Bunny 5.1.1870 age 78.

Edmund Bonser, son of Samuel and Catherine, bapt. Bunny 26.5.1816, mentioned in Samuel's will of 1848.

Other children of Samuel and Catherine mentioned in in Samuel's will of 1848 but no other information found: **Samuel, Richard, William, Thomas** and **John**.

James Bonser bapt. Kinoulton 10.7.1831, son of Samuel and Catherine, mentioned in Samuel's will of 1848.

Catherine Phebe Bonser bapt. 19.9.1832, Kinoulton, daughter of Catherine and Samuel. 1851 age 18, single in mother's house (1851/9). 1861 age 28, single in mother's house (1861/14). Catherine daughter of late Samuel, farmer, married Edwin Francis Liversidge, tailor and outfitter of St Mary's parish, Nottingham, at Bunny 28.5.1863.

Fanny Bonser born 1834, Kinoulton, daughter of Catherine and Samuel. 1851 age 17, single in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/9). 1861 age 27, single, governess school, living in mother's house (Bradmore 1861/14).

Joseph Bonser, bapt. 26.7.1835, Kinoulton, son of Catherine and Samuel. 1851 age 15, single in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/9). 1858/9 J Bonser had salary of £4 in the Constables Accounts, no details – possibly for writing up the accounts. On Bradmore electoral roll 1859-1862 with 104 acres, and 1863-1880 with land. 1861 age 25, single in mother's house (Bradmore 1861/14). 1860-3, 1865-79, Joseph Bonser signed Methodist Sunday School accounts. 1864 Whites Directory, farmer. 1867 jointly with C(atherine senr) renting house, buildings, garden and land 104 acres 15 perches from Bunny Estate, £190/9s/1d pa., i.e. Bonsers Farm. 1868 Joseph Bonser, farmer, is listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in the church deeds. 1869 Morris's Directory, farmer. 1870, inherited from mother Catherine. 1871 age 35, single, farmer of 104 acres employing 1 labourer and 3 boys, with servants Jane Beeston, housekeeper, Walter Harrison and George Harris farm servants (Bradmore 1871/17). Married Sarah Sewell Apr qtr 1872, Glanford Brigg district. 1872 served as Waywarden, salary 10/-. 1873 Guardian, and Waywarden 1877 salary 7/6, 1879 salary 10/-, and 1881, no record of salary payment. 1876 PO Directory, farmer. 1881 age 45, retired farmer, with wife Sarah and children Mary Ann, Barratt S, John F and Edwin J plus a servant, at Bunny (listed next to Rancliffe Arms). 1886-97 trustee of Methodist Church. 1887 as trustee signed the Methodist Church's loan from the Wesleyan Assurance Co for repairs after the collapse of the chapel ceiling. 26.1.1891 Mr Joseph Bonser of Nottingham applied to Bradmore and Bunny Charities to receive the in-going apprentice fee for his son on the ground that he had lived in Bradmore for 40 years and the boy was born there, but on the application being put to the vote it was unanimously decided that being no longer a resident inhabitant as the scheme requires his son was not eligible. The son is not named, but was probably Barratt then aged 25. 1891 age 55 chapel keeper and poor rate collector with wife Sarah and children Mary Ann, Barratt Sewell and John Fred, at 89 Sneinton Rd, Sneinton Nottingham. 1896 described as rate collector of Nottingham in Methodist trustee records. 1900 Court Directory has Joseph Bonser at 14 Portland Rd., Nottingham. 1901 age 65, retired farmer, blind, with wife Sarah and daughter Mary at 14 Portland Rd., Sherwood, Nottingham. Died July qtr 1903, Nottingham. In 1903 Bradmore Methodist Church deeds, Joseph's name was deleted noted dead.

Sarah Bonser nee Sewell born 1839, Winteringham Lincolnshire, daughter of Barratt Sewell, farmer. 1841 age 2 in father's house at Winteringham with siblings. 1851 age 12 visiting Mary Crowther, draper, at South Kelsey. 1861 age 22 in father Barratt's house, farmer of 110 acres, with sister Elizabeth 20, at West End, Winteringham. 1871 age 32 visitor, single, to sister Elizabeth 30 and her husband Fredric Sutton, farmer of 306 acres, at Spridlington, Lincs. Apr qtr 1872 Glanford Brigg district, married Joseph Bonser. Lived in Bradmore with Joseph 1872-1880. 1881 age 42 married to Joseph, at Bunny. 1891 age 52, married to Joseph, at Sneinton. 1901 age 62, married to Joseph, at 14 Portland Road. Possibly died 1910.

Mary Ann Bonser born 24.1.1873, Bradmore, bapt. 26.2.1873, daughter of Joseph and Sarah. 1881 age 8, scholar, in parents' house at Bunny. 1901 age 18, Board schoolteacher, in parents' house at Sneinton. 1901 age 28, single, teacher in Board school, in parents' house at Portland St.

Kate Sewell Bonser born 1875, buried Bunny 9.6.1875 age 2 months.

Barratt Sewell Bonser born 18.4.1876 Bradmore, bapt. 31.5.1876, son of Joseph and Sarah. 1881 age 4, scholar in parents' house at Bunny. 1891 age 14 in parents' house at Sneinton. 1901 age 25, cabinet maker, single, in City Lunatic Asylum, Porchester Rd, Mapperley Hill.

John Fred Bonser born 12.7.1878 Bradmore, bapt. 25.9.1878, son of Joseph and Sarah. 1881 age 2 in parents' house at Bunny. 1891 age 12, scholar in parents' house, Sneinton.

Edwin Joseph Bonser born 18.2.1880, Bunny, bapt. 13.2.1881, son of Joseph and Sarah.
(Note: a **John** Bonser died 19.6.1844 buried at Knoulton St Luke's church, stone inscribed "This stone is set up as a tribute of affectionate regard by his surviving children who have cause to rejoice that in the year 1799 he was enabled in the midst of much opposition to license his house for the preaching of the Gospel by the Wesleyan Methodists". The house is the present Village Shop and Post Office. 1841 age 80, born c1760, of independent means, living at Kinoulton with children William 35 grocer and Ann 25. One of several Bonser households in Kinoulton, not immediately related to Samuel. In 1854 a Mr Bonser, probably a visiting preacher from elsewhere (Kinoulton?) did the annual Sunday School collection on 21 May, total £6/18/7.)

Sarah Ann Bonser nee Attewell born 1855, daughter of John, framework knitter of Bradmore. Married at Bunny 27.2.1882 to Alfred Bonser, grocer of Beeston, born 1860 son of James, lacemaker, and Elizabeth, lacemender of Beeston. 1891 age 35 with husband Alfred 31 grocer, at Chilwell Rd Beeston. 1901 age 45 with husband Alfred 41 grocer's assistant and caretaker and daughter Mary E 7 born Beeston, at 8 Friar Yard, Park St., Nottingham. 1911 age 54 (married 29 years with 1 child) with husband Alfred 51 grocer and daughter Mary Elizabeth 17 student teacher for Nottingham Education Committee, at 6 Victoria Rd, West Bridgford, 6-room house.

BOON

Elizabeth Boon nee Voce, born c1861, Keyworth or Bradmore, grand-daughter of Edward and Martha Harwood, daughter of Phoebe Harwood and Henry Voce. Elizabeth Harwood Voce of Bradmore age 20 daughter of Henry, butcher, married Andrew Boon age 26 groom of Belper Road, Hyson Green, son of Philip, groom, at Bunny 2.1.1882. 1891 Andrew age 35 foreman for oil company with wife Lizzie age 29 dressmaker born Bradmore, children Rosaline H B 8, Olga 6, Edward H A 3 recorded as born Bradmore, Hilda C M 1 and Winifred L L 3 mths born Flintham, and (Elizabeth's) brother Edward Voce, at 3 Bell St., Nottingham. 1901 Andrew age 45 coachman on own account, Eliza age 39 dressmaker on own account, children Rosaline 18, Olga 16 blouse machinists, Edward 13 milliner's errand boy, Hilda 11, Winifred 10, Philip 8, Andrew 4, William 2 at 4 Mabel St., Nottingham. 1911 Andrew Boon age 55 coachman for City Engr Borough Council, born Ramsey, Hunts, with wife Elizabeth age 42 born Bradmore (married 29 years with 8 children, 1 dead), and children Rosaline 28 dressmaker on own account at home, Edward 25 iron moulder in general engineering, both born Nottingham, Hilda 21 blousemaker born Flintham, Lilian 20 no occupation, Philip 18 joiner builder and William 12 scholar, all born Nottingham, plus brother in law Edward Voce 48 single, omnibus driver, born Bradmore, at 143 Arkwright St., Nottingham. Andrew Boon died Dec.qtr. 1929 Nottingham.

BOOT

Francis Boot witnessed will of Thomas Brown, 1708.

Mary Boot born 1858 Stanton, daughter of Samuel, ag.lab and Sarah, laundress. 1861 age 3 in parents' house at Stanton. 1871 age 13, domestic servant in the household of Thomas and Mary Rowbotham (senior) (Bradmore 1871/71).

BOSWORTH

Isabel Bosworth bapt. Bunny 3.7.1687, daughter of George and Issabel of Bradmore.

Gervase Bosworth married Jane Place, Gervase buried Bunny c1706.

Jervas Bosworth of Bradmore buried Bunny 17.4.1733.

Jane Bosworth wife of Jervase of Bradmore, buried Bunny 22.12.1723.

Gervase Bosworth bapt. Bunny 9.2.1707, son of Gervase and wife of Bradmore.

Mary Bosworth bapt. 6.3.1709, daughter of Gervase and Jane of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 18.3.1712.

Joseph Bosworth bapt. Bunny 16.3.1712, son of Gervase and Jane of Bradmore.

John Bosworth married Dorothy Turpin, no parishes specified, at Bunny 26.12.1740. Living in Bradmore 1740s-50s.

Dorothy Bosworth nee Turpin, born 1711, daughter of William Turpin and Ann Brown.

Thomas Bosworth bapt. 1.11.1741, son of John and Dorothy of Bradmore.

John Bosworth bapt. Bunny 21.4.1744, son of John and Dorothy of Bradmore.

Ann Bosworth daughter of John and Dorothy, parish not specified, buried Bunny 4.2.1753.

Thomas Bosworth born c1744, framework knitter. Married (1) Mary Cumberland at Bunny 26.5.1766, no parish specified, died April 1788, and (2) Elizabeth Haims both of Bradmore, at Bunny 14.8.1788. 1780-1799 Thomas Bosworth paid land tax 9½ p.qtr., followed by Elizabeth, his second wife, and in 1828 by Gervase, their son. Signed the Constable's Accounts 1783. In Bunny Estate 1792 Survey with 7 acres 3 roods 5 perches paying £8/7/2 pa rent including £3/11/2 for house, outbuildings, foldyard,

garden and croft. Lived at Fairholme (No.29) Main St. Buried Bunny 4.10.1799, aged 55.

Mary Bosworth, born c1746, nee Cumberland married Thomas Bosworth at Bunny 26.5.1766, no parish specified. First wife of Thomas, buried Bunny 27.4.1788, age 42

John Bosworth bapt. Bunny.4.1767, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. John Bosworth received payment from Constable in 1779 and 1782 for catching sparrows. John Bosworth married Rachel Davies, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 30.11.1801. March 1812 received payment from the Constable 2/-, probably for work on the house row, and 2/- p.wk. April 1813 for work done, also 2/- p.wk. for 1814/5. John Bosworth of Bradmore buried Bunny 12.11.1825 age 58.

Rachel Bosworth nee Davies of Bradmore, married John 30.11.1801 at Bunny.

Thomas Bosworth son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore born ?12.3.1770. Married Catherine, of Bradmore. Possibly the Thomas Bosworth paid by the Constable for catching sparrows, 1786. Framework knitter, later (1814) shopkeeper. Served as Constable 1807-1810, 3 consecutive years, taking over from John Lane in June 1806. From 1807 the office became salaried (£4/4/- per year) and the first year's accounts were audited by George Holcombe, one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County, presumably to ensure compliance with new rules or standards. Thomas signed the accounts again in 1813, and took over as Constable from 1814, when the Poor Book was split off from the Constable's Accounts, and continued to serve until 1820 by which time the salary was £15. May 1815 Thomas Bosworth was paid 10/6 expenses for carrying William Bosworth's boy down. Thomas died 10.3.1840 aged 70, buried with Catherine 13.3.1840 on south side of Bunny churchyard.

Catherine Bosworth born c1778, Bradmore, maiden name not known. 1841 age 70, schoolmistress, householder living on the Loughborough Rd (No.106) with son Thomas and William Green, 10, lacemaker (Bradmore 1841/8). 1851 age 73, retired schoolmistress, with son Thomas and daughter Rebecca (Bradmore 1851/14). Died 2.6.1853 aged 75, buried 4.6.1853 on south side of Bunny churchyard with husband Thomas and daughters Jane and Anne, stone erected by surviving daughter Rebecca.

Mary Bosworth born 6.3.1796 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 8.3.1796, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Catharine. Possibly the Mary Bosworth who married Enoch Bosworth 1833. Died before 1853 when Rebecca was the only surviving sister.

John Bosworth born 4.3.1798, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 7?3.1798, son of Thomas framework knitter, and Catherine. Referred to in brother Thomas's will as John of New Radford.

Jane Bosworth born 13.4.1800, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 16.4.1800, daughter of Thomas framework knitter and Catharine,. Died 10.8.1847 aged 47, buried 13.8.1847 in Bunny churchyard south side with parents.

Catherine Bosworth born c1803, buried Bunny 3.5.1818 age 15, may be daughter of Thomas and Catherine, died shortly before baptism of second Catherine 26.5.1818, see below.

Ann Bosworth bapt. Bunny 21.12.1804, daughter of Thomas and Catherine of Bradmore, died 16.9.1842 aged 37, buried 18 Sept Bunny churchyard south side with her parents. Not identified in 1841 census, not living in Bradmore at that time.

Elizabeth Bosworth bapt. Bunny 28.10.1807, daughter of Thomas and Catherine of Bradmore, buried Bunny 20.8.1826, age 19.

Sarah Bosworth bapt. Bunny 25.11.1809, daughter of Thomas and Catherine of Bradmore. Presumably died as an infant, before Nov.1810.

Sarah Bosworth bapt. Bunny 29.11.1810, daughter of Thomas and Catherine of Bradmore, buried Bunny 5.7.1826, age 16.

Thomas Bosworth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 10.3.1812, son of Thomas and Catherine the schoolmistress. 1836 Thomas Bosworth signed the Methodist Sunday School accounts. Thomas, stocking weaver, son of Thomas married Ann Bosworth daughter of John, of Bradmore, at Bunny 13.7.1837. Ann died 10.4.1840 age 24. 1841 age 30, lacemaker, in his mother's house (Bradmore 1841/8). 1851 age 39, widower, schoolmaster, in his mother's house (1851/14). Died 5.9.1853 age 41, buried 8.9.1853 south side of Bunny churchyard opposite porch, with Ann. Headstone recording his association with the Free School, erected by Rebecca his only surviving sister. Will dated 16.8.1853, left £5 to his brother John Bosworth of New Radford. To the furtherance of the glorious gospel of our Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, £10 to be paid in equal shares of £2 each to the British & Foreign Bible Society, the Church Missionary Society, the Church Pastoral Aid Society, the London Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews and the Scripture Reader Society also of London, in furtherance of their respective objects. The rest of the money and all property to his sister Rebecca Bosworth of Bradmore. Executors Joseph Bradbury of Ruddington and Thomas Lovatt of Wysall. Witnessed by William Dalby and Thomas Buxton of Bradmore.

Anne Bosworth born c1815/6, nee Bosworth daughter of John and Anne of Bradmore, married Thomas Bosworth stocking weaver at Bunny 13.7.1837, died 10.4.1840 aged 24. Buried 12.4.1840,

age noted as 25 in parish register, commemorated with Thomas on tombstone erected by her sister in law Rebecca.

Mary Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.8.1839, daughter of Thomas, cottager, and Ann of Bradmore, buried 16.10.1839, infant.

Edward Bosworth bapt. Bunny 15.7.1814, son of Thomas, shopkeeper, and Catherine, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 1.4.1815.

Rebecca Bosworth bapt. Bunny 20.1.1816, daughter of Thomas, shopkeeper, and Catherine of Bradmore buried Bunny 16.12.1817 age 2.

Catherine Bosworth bapt. Bunny 26.3.1818, daughter of Thomas, shopkeeper, and Catherine of Bradmore, buried Bunny 28.6.1828 age 10.

Rebecca Bosworth bapt. Bunny 19.6.1822, daughter of Thomas, shopkeeper, and Catherine Bosworth schoolmistress, of Bradmore. 1851 age 28, single, dressmaker, in Catherine's household (Bradmore 1851/14). Surviving sister of Thomas Bosworth schoolmaster. Erected tombstone south side of Bunny churchyard to parents Thomas and Catherine and her 2 sisters Jane and Anne, as the only surviving sister, some time after death of Catherine in 1853. Also erected stone to her brother Thomas and his wife Ann, as Thomas's only surviving sister, after his death in Sept 1853. Possibly the Rebecca Bosworth who died April 1855, Basford district.

Ann Bosworth bapt. Bunny 20.2.1775, daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore,.

Dorothy Bosworth bapt. Bunny 3.11.1772, daughter of Thomas and Mary Bosworth, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 12.11.1776 age 4.

Dorothy Bosworth bapt. Bunny 11.8.1784, daughter of Thomas and Mary Bosworth of Bradmore buried Bunny 31.8.1784.

Elizabeth Bosworth nee Haims of Bradmore, second wife of Thomas the framework knitter (born 1744), married at Bunny 14.8.1788, living at Fairholme, Main St. Widowed 1799. Paid land tax 9½d p.qtr. 1800-1827, when she was described as cottager in the land tax schedule. Tax liability passed to Gervase Bosworth. First appeared in Constables Accounts in May 1800, when the Constable paid 5/- for sowing Elisabeth's corn, and again at 14.10.1800 paid 1/- for fetching her coals. Dec.1800 the Constable paid for a strike of barley for her. 25.1.1801 Constable paid Elisabeth Bosworth 5 weeks pay for Samuel Jakes, 7/6, and February another 4 weeks, 6/- (1/6 p.wk.). Nov.1801 Constable paid to fetch Elizabeth's coals 12/-, and Jan.1801 paid 15/- for plowing and sowing her land. Jan.1803 the Constable paid 10/- for fetching her coals from the Warfe. Jan.1805 she had 11/- for 11 weeks rent for Chamberlain. 1812 possibly the Elizabeth Bosworth who received 1/6 from the Constable for coach fare to Nottingham?

Gervase or Jarvis Bosworth born Bradmore 11.10.1789, bapt. 11.10.1789, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. Gervis Bosworth was paid expenses by the Constable in Feb.1809 £1/15/6. May be the Jarvis Bosworth who married Ann Henson of Ruddington at Ruddington, 3.7.1809. Jarvis Bosworth paid 2/- p.wk. to the Constable in 1812/3, perhaps towards the support of William Bosworth and his wife? Payments to the Constable continued in 1813/4, 2/- p.wk. May 1815 Jarvis was paid £2/10/6 by the Constable for work on the poor houses. Jan 1816 Jarvis received 18/- from the Constable for flooring the poor houses, and for a bunch of laths. He signed the Constable's accounts 1823, 1825-6, possibly 1836, 1843 and 1845. After the death of his mother Elizabeth he paid land tax 9½d p.qtr. 1827-1832 (end of land tax record). Witnessed marriage of William Cumberland and Jane Attewell 3.12.1832. 1835 Gervase Bosworth, farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in church deeds. 1838-41 appeared on the electoral rolls as trustee for the Methodist chapel. 1841 age 50, keeper, with wife Ann and children John, Enoch, Lucy, Ann and Eliza living at Fairholme, Main St. (Bradmore 1841/43). 1847 had 3/- p.wk. from the Constable for lodging James Harwood. 1851 age 61, bricklayer, married to Ann, children William, Jervas, Valentine and grand-daughter Eliza (Bradmore 1851/15). 1855 Kellys Directory, George Bosworth, farmer. 1861 age 71, bricklayer, with wife Ann, and carter William Newman (Bradmore 1861/58). 1867 Bunny Estate rental, Jervoise Bosworth renting house garden and land, 4 acres 1 rood 21 perches in Bradmore, and 10 acres, 2 roods 3 perches in Bunny, rent £34/13/0 pa. Died 7.2.1867 in his 78th year, buried 10.2.1867 south side of Bunny churchyard opposite porch with his wife Ann and daughter in law Elizabeth. The stone also commemorates sons John and Thomas.

Ann Bosworth born c1790, Ruddington. Possibly nee Henson, of Ruddington, married Jarvis Bosworth at Ruddington 3.7.1809. 1841 age 50, married to Gervase / Jarvis (Bradmore 1841/43). 1851 age 61, married to Jervas (Bradmore 1851/15). 1861 age 71, married to Gervase (Bradmore 1861/58). 1867 Widow Ann Bosworth received sheets from Bunny & Bradmore Charities and 6 cwt of coals 1868 and 8 cwt in 1869. 1.4.1869 Ann Bosworth, widow, in agreement with Harriet Forteath (of Bunny Hall) for land rent £34/13/- including house, garden and 3 fields in Bradmore and 4 fields in Bunny, witnessed by Geroge Goodwin. Tenancy passed to son William. Ann signed with her

mark x after having the papers read and explained to her. 1871 age 81, widow, at Fairholme, Main St., but the householder was by then her son William (Bradmore 1871/50). Died 19.8.1874 (age 85 on gravestone), buried 23.8.1874 (age 82 in register), south side of Bunny churchyard opposite porch with Gervase and children.

Thomas Bosworth bapt. Bunny 10.6.1810, son of Gervase and Ann of Bradmore, married Elizabeth. Died in Ireland 10.4.1860 in his 50th year, recorded on tombstone of parents on south side of Bunny churchyard opposite the porch.

Elizabeth Bosworth born c1830, married to Thomas Bosworth who died in Ireland. She died 26.4.1863 aged 33, buried with Thomas's parents on south side of Bunny churchyard opposite porch.

Teresa Bosworth born c1861, Mulinigan? Ireland, (probably posthumous) daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth, niece of William and Ann. 1871 age 10, scholar, in the household of William and Ann (1871/50).

Thomas Bosworth bapt. Bunny 20.4.1813, son of Jarvis, bricklayer, and Ann of Bradmore - but note Thomas the eldest son was born 1810 and survived to 1860, and Enoch is baptised less than a month later.

Enoch Bosworth bapt. Bunny 9.5.1813, son of Jarvis, bricklayer, and Ann of Bradmore. Nov.1826 Enoch Bosworth paid by the Constable 1/- for 1 dozen sparrows. 1841 age 25, shoemaker, in his parents' house (Bradmore 1841/43). 18.5.1841 married Lucy Cook of Trowell at Trowell. 1844 Whites Directory, shoemaker. 1851 age 37, cordwainer, with wife Lucy and children Walter, Jane, Albert, George, John and Gervis (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 47, cordwainer, with wife Lucy, children Walter and Gervase born in Bradmore and John age 2 born Ruddington, at 47 East Thorpe, Ruddington. 1871 Enoch age 57 shoe finisher with wife Lucy and children John and Selenia, and his sister Jane and her husband Charles and children Mary Ann and Lucy as boarders at 8 Fleet St., Leicester St Margaret. 1881 age 67, cordwainer with wife Lucy, and grandson Valentine Bosworth, age 5, born Leicester (probably named after Enoch's brother Valentine who died 1872), at Wilford Rd., Ruddington. Enoch died Jan.1883, Basford district.

Lucy Bosworth born 1818, Trowell, nee Cook, married Enoch Bosworth at Trowell 18.5.1841. 1841 age 20 in in-laws Gervase and Ann's house (Bradmore 1841/43). 1851 age 33, married to Enoch (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 42 married to Enoch, at Ruddington. 1871 age 52 with Enoch and children John and Selenia, and Enoch's sister Jane and her family as boarders. 1881 age 62 married to Enoch.

Walter Bosworth bapt. Bunny 24.10.1841, son of Enoch, cordwainer, and Lucy of Bradmore., 1851 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 19, shoemaker, in parents' house.

Jane Bosworth daughter of Enoch, shoemaker, and Lucy of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 7.2. 1843. 1851 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 18, single, servant in her uncle William Bosworth's house at 13 Peal St Litchurch, Derby. 1868 married Charles Bosworth, born 1836 Barnwell, Northamptonshire. 1871 age 28 with husband Charles 35, shoe finisher born Northampton and children Mary Ann 5, Lucy 4 born Drayton, as boarders in brother Enoch's house.1881 at No.6 Court 6, Abley St., Daventry. 1881 Charles Bosworth age 43 shoe finisher with wife Jane 40 born Bradmore and children Lucy 13 nurse maid born Daventry, John A 8 born Leicester, Charles E 3 born Warks., William 3 mths born Daventry. Not found in 1891. 1901 Charles 64, shoemaker on own account at home with wife Jane 58, children John 28 shoe finisher born Leicester, Francis 17 shoe clicker born Ruddington and a boarder, at 100 Merridale Rd, W Humberstone Leicester. 1911 Charles age 73 OAP with wife Jane 68 (married 43 years (1868), 19 children, 6 dead), and 5 lodgers in the house at 4 Morton Rd., Leicester

Albert Bosworth bapt. Bunny 1.11.1844, son of Enoch, shoemaker and Lucy of Bradmore. 1851 age 6 in parents' house (1851/16).

George Bosworth bapt. Bunny 20.12.1846, son of Enoch, shoemaker and Lucy of Bradmore. 1851 age 4 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 14, plough boy, in the household of Joseph Nixon, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/17).

John Bosworth bapt. Bunny 24.7.1849, son of Enoch, shoemaker and Lucy of Bradmore. 1851 age 1 in parents' house (1851/16).

Gervase Bosworth bapt. Bunny 16.3.1851, son of Enoch, shoemaker and Lucy of Bradmore. 1851 age 1 month in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/16). 1861 age 10, scholar, in parents' house.

Elizabeth Bosworth bapt. Bunny 26.8.1815, daughter of Gervase, bricklayer, and Ann of Bradmore.

John Bosworth bapt. Bunny 15.6. 1818, son of Gervase, bricklayer and Ann. 1840 age 30, keeper, in his parents' house (Bradmore 1841/43). No reference to his wife in this census, but he appears to have a daughter – see below. Lost at sea, 14.1.1843, in his 25th year, commemorated with

Gervase and Ann on south side of Bunny churchyard opposite porch.

Eliza Bosworth born 1838 daughter of John and Ann, grand-daughter of Ann and Gervase/Jarvis. 1841 age 3 in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1841/43). 1851 age 13, scholar, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1851/15).

William Bosworth, bapt. Bunny 30.7.1820, son of Ann and Gervase/Jarvis, bricklayer, of Bradmore. 1851 age 30, single, wheelwright, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/15). Probably the William Bosworth of Bradmore who married Ann Buxton of Bunny at Bunny 25.12.1852. Moved to Derby after 1853 but before 1857, returned to Bradmore by 1869. 1861 William Bosworth age 40 M R C Joiner born Bradmore, with wife Ann and children Fanny, Ann and Elizabeth, and niece Jane Bosworth daughter of Enoch and Lucy, plus visitor Ann Harrison age 22 seamstress born Ruddington at 13 Peel St., Litchurch, Derbys. From 1.4.1869 William Bosworth in rental agreement for lands originally signed for by mother Ann, widow. 1871, age 50, joiner, householder of his parents' house, Fairholme, Main St., married to Ann with children Elizabeth, John, Mary, niece Teresa daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth, and mother Anne, widow (Bradmore 1871/50). 1872/3 Constable paid William Bosworth for noticeboard, 1/-. 1876 PO Directory, carpenter. 1881 age 60, married to Ann, with children Elizabeth, John, Mary, nephew Joseph Buxton and grandson William E Dunne (Bradmore 1881/46). 1881 Kellys Directory, carpenter. On electoral roll 1882-5 in category £12+ rent pa. 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager. Electoral roll with land & tenement, 1886-1897. 1888 Kellys Directory, carpenter. 1891, widow, age 70, householder with son John, daughter Mary Collings, son in law William Collings (Bradmore 1891/7). 1894 Whites Directory, cottager. 1895 Kellys Directory, carpenter. Died 1896 aged 75, buried 15.5.1896.

Ann Bosworth, nee Buxton, born 1823, Bunny. Married William Bosworth of Bradmore at Bunny 25.12.1852. Lived in Derby late 1850s and 1860s, returned to Bradmore by 1869. 1861 age 38 married to William living in Derbys. 1871 age 48, married to William (Bradmore 1871/50). 1881 age 58, married to William (Bradmore 1881/46). Buried Bunny 5.11.1890 age 68.

Fanny Bosworth born c1853, Bunny, daughter of William, carpenter of Bradmore. 1861 age 7, scholar born Bunny, in parents' house. Married 26.7.1875 at Bunny, age 22, to George Harrison Staniland age 21 joiner of New Radford, son of Reuben Staniland cowkeeper.

Ann Bosworth born c1857, Derby, daughter of William, joiner, and Ann, bapt. Bunny 1.8.1869 with their other children. 1861 age 4 scholar born Derby, in parents' house. Married Edward Dunne c1877? – see Dunne.

Elizabeth Bosworth, born c1858, Derby, daughter of William, joiner and Ann, bapt. Bunny 1.8.1869 with their other children. 1861 age 2 born Derby, in parents' house. 1871 age 12, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/50). 1881 age 23, single in parents' house (1881/46).

John (Jack) Bosworth, born 1862, Derby, son of William, joiner, and Ann bapt. Bunny 1.8.1869 with their other children. 1871 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/50). 1881 age 19, joiner, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/46). 1891 age 29, single in father's house (Bradmore 1891/7). Jack Bosworth, undertaker and smallholder on Main St., just below Ira Voce at Home Farm No.31, i.e. at Fairholme No.29. Took over Fairholme after William. On electoral roll, land & tenement, 1898-1911, then 2 entries for house without parish vote and house & land without county vote 1911-1914. 1901 age 39 farmer and carpenter, head of household with wife Fanny and farm labourer Ralph Dexter in house (of more than 4 rooms) on Village St. (Main St.) (27/1901). On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and land, 14 acres 3 rods 24 perches, paying rent £31/3/10 pa. and on 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 14 acres 3 rods 24 perches paying £34/13/- rent. Addendum to Abstract of title of Albert Ball in 1910, John Bosworth listed as holding OS (1900 map) field No.32, pasture, one field back to the north from the corner of Moor Lane, 3.366 acres, bordered on north by Randle, on west by F Wootton and on south by William James' field. Listed in Kellys Directories 1904, 1912, 1922 as carpenter, and 1925 as carpenter and undertaker. 1911 age 49, carpenter in agriculture on his own account, born Derby, with wife Frances and nephew Thomas Collings, in a 6-room house (Bradmore 31/1911). As John Bosworth junior Chairman of parish council 1912-1927, died in office. 1921 overhauled the Sunday School platform. 1922 did seat alterations. 1923 tendered for painting the chapel. 1925 governor of Bunny Charities. 1920-1927/8 John married to Fanny resident in No.29 Main Street. Died 8.11.1927 aged 66, buried south side of Bunny churchyard, with Frances Ann. When the house was sold to the Attewells they found coffin timbers and tools of John Bosworth's trade in the barn.

Fanny (Frances) Bosworth of Main Street, born c1861, Fulham, London. 1901 age 40 married to John (Bradmore 27/1901). 1911 age 49 born Kensington, married 15 years (1896) with no children (Bradmore 31/1911). On electoral roll 1920-1932/3. Fanny (Frances Ann) on electoral roll for Main St No.29 in her own right, 1933/4 - 1935/6. Listed in Kellys Directories 1928, 1932 and 1936 as Mrs J Bosworth, cowkeeper. Died 20.2.1935 aged 82, buried in Bunny churchyard with John, on

south side.

Mary Bosworth, bapt. Bunny 1.8.1869, daughter of William, joiner, and Ann of Bradmore; her older brother and sisters were bapt. at the same time. 1871 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/50). 1881 age 11, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/46). 1885-7 Sunday School teacher. Mary Bosworth married William Jex Collings, Jan.1891 Nottingham district. 1891 Mary Collings, dressmaker, in father's house with her husband (Bradmore 1891/7). See under Collings.

Ann Bosworth bapt. Bunny 14.2. 1823, daughter of Jervis, bricklayer, and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 15 in her parents' house (Bradmore 1841/43). Married Joseph Hickling of Bradmore at Bunny on 2.11.1846. See Hickling.

Jervas / Gervase Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.3.1825, son of Ann and Gervase/Jarvis, bricklayer, of Bradmore. 1841 age 15, apprentice in house of William Wright, shoemaker, at Ruddington. 1847 June qtr, Nottingham, Gervis Bosworth married Precilla Shaw. 1851 Gervase age 26 cordwainer born Bradmore with wife Priscilla age 32 silk winder born Nottingham in mother-in-law's house, Priscilla Shaw widow age 56 silk winder with daughters Maria age 28 milliner and dress maker, and Emma age 7 scholar, all born Nottingham, at 10 Rice Place, St Anns Nottingham. Note also 1851 Jervas age 26, married, cordwainer, in his parents' house but no reference to wife (Bradmore 1851/15). 1861 Gervas married age 36 cordwainer, boarder in house of William Wilkinson, tailor, in Wellington St Litchurch. (1861 Priscilla Bosworth age 42, married, nurse for Henry Sheldon, less than 1 mth old, in house of Thomas Sheldon, Lamartine St., Nottingham). 1871 Gervase age 46, married but wife not present, cordwainer in aunt Hannah Baxter's house, widow age 73, sempstress born Mansfield. (1871 Priscilla Bosworth married, 52, laundress, lodger at 80 Truman St., St Anns, Nottingham.) 1881 Gervase age 56 unmarried, cordwainer, with servant Margaret Hull age 20 born E India and her daughter Clara age 3 mths born Ruddington, at Wilford Rd., Ruddington. (1881 Priscilla Bosworth married age 61 laundress at Cooper St. Almshouses, St Anns.) 1891 age 66 shoemaker at Shaw St Ruddington in a house with 3 rooms, married but wife not mentioned, with 4 boarders, Maggie Hull single 30 stocking seamer born Madras, E India and 3 children Clara 10, Bertha 6, scholars, Henry 6 mths, all born Ruddington. (1891 Priscilla Bosworth, married, 72, occupation 'none', at Cooper St. Almshouses, St. Anns. Priscilla Bosworth born Nottingham 1819 died Jan.qtr. 1897, Nottingham). 1901 Gervase age 76 cordwainer on own account at home, with wife Margaret age 39, seamstress born Madras India, and children Bertha age 16 plain lace mender, Henry 10, Gervase 8, Frederick age 6 and grand-daughter Elsa Langham age 1 all born Ruddington.

Valentine Bosworth bapt. Bunny 18.2.1827, son of Ann and Gervase/Jarvis/Jervise, keeper, of Bradmore. 1841 age 15, gamekeeper, in house of Carver Savidge, game keeper at Saxondale, Notts. 1851 age 24, single, farm labourer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/15). 1861 age 34, bricklayer, householder, married to Mary with daughters Catherine and Elizabeth, living on Main St. possibly at no.15 (Bradmore 1861/60). 1867 Bunny Estate rental, renting house and garden at £3/10/0 pa. 1871 age 44 in Bunny, bricklayer, married to Mary with children Elizabeth, Fanny and Martha (Bunny Bradmore 1871/16). Died 21.3.1872 age 45, buried south side of Bunny churchyard in front of the porch, with son George Walker Bosworth and wife Mary.

Mary Bosworth born 1832, Bradmore, nee Walker, daughter of George and Catherine. 1857 Jan.qtr. Nottingham married Valentine Bosworth. 1861 age 29, dressmaker, married to Valentine (Bradmore 1861/60). 1871 age 39, dressmaker, married to Valentine, in Bunny. Widowed 1872. Died 29.6.1878 age 46, buried south side of Bunny churchyard in front of the porch with Valentine. Buried with son George Walker Bosworth.

Catherine Ann Bosworth born Gotham, bapt. Bunny 13.9.1857, daughter of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 3, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/60). 1871 at Angel Row, Nottingham, age 13 servant in house of Alfred Bilyeald, jeweller and wife. 1881 not found. 1889 July qtr married William Francis Steans, Nottingham. See Steans.

Elizabeth Bosworth bapt. Bunny 11.12.1859, daughter of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1861 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/60). 1871 age 11, scholar, in her parents' house at Bunny.

Fanny Bosworth daughter of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 3.11.1861.

George Walker Bosworth born Jan 1864, bapt. Bunny 25.9.1864, son of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore, died 14.4.1866 age 2 years 3 months, buried 17.4.1866 with his parents on the south side of Bunny churchyard in front of the porch.

Martha Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.7.1866, daughter of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1871 age 5 in parents' house at Bunny. 1881 Martha Bosworth age 16 born Bradmore, general domestic servant in house of Sarah Ann Marsh and family, lace manufacturers at 49 St James St Nottingham.

Benjamin Bosworth born 9.8.1791, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 5.9.1791, son of Thomas, framework

knitter, and Elizabeth. Possibly the Ben Bosworth in the Constable's accounts 1813, when Constable paid 3/- for a warrant for Ben and expenses when he took him to Nottingham, 5/-. 11.1.1813 Constable paid Ben's expenses at Bradmore 5/-, and £2/7/6 expenses at the Sessions for him. Married Mary Elliott at Bunny 2.7.1815. Probably the Benjamin Bosworth who had 5/- from the Constable Apr.1831 for taking care of William Hallam and was paid £2/15/- by the Constable in 1832. 1841 age 50, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary living on Far St. with son Benjamin and labourer Richard Elliott (Bradmore 1841/62). 1851 age 60, farm labourer on parish relief, married to Mary (Bradmore 1851/10). 1858 the Constable took Ben Bosworth to Nottingham and claimed 8/- expenses, could be this Benjamin or his son. Buried Bunny 2.10.1859 age 68.

Mary Bosworth born 1779, born Plimoth (sic), Devernsire. Mary Elliott married Benjamin at Bunny 2.7.1815. 1841 age 70 in the household of Benjamin Bosworth, but not recorded as his wife (Bradmore 1841/62). 1851 age 72, married to Benjamin and also on parish relief (Bradmore 1851/10). Possibly the Mary buried Bunny 16.8.1857 age 80.

Benjamin Bosworth born c.1816. 1841 age 25, frameknitter, in his father's house (1841/62). Probably the Benjamin of Bradmore who married Mary Monks of Bradmore at Bunny 3.8.1845. 1851 age 34, framework knitter in Ruddington, married to Mary, with daughter-in-law Eliza Monk 7, born Rempstone 1844. Buried Bunny 6.2.1859 age 42.

Mary Bosworth nee Monks born c1822, Rempstone. Married Benjamin at Bunny 3.8.1845, already with a daughter Eliza born c1844. 1851 age 29 married to Benjamin, at Ruddington.

Thomas Bosworth bapt. Bunny 27.5.1819, son of Benjamin, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Died as an infant.

Thomas Bosworth bapt. Bunny 20.5.1820, son of Benjamin, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Thomas son of Benjamin married Mary Jackson daughter of John of Bradmore 8.12.1839 at Bunny, both being under 21. 1841 age 20, householder, agricultural labourer, married to Mary (Bradmore 1841/3). 1851 age 32 agricultural labourer, married to Mary, with children Thomas 5, Elizabeth 3, Mary 7 months, all born Ruddington, at Ruddington. 1861 Thomas Bosworth age 40 born Bradmore, gamekeeper, with wife Mary A age 40 and children Mary 10, Elizabeth 13, Joseph 8, Walter 6, Rubens 3 and Emma 10 scholars born Ruddington, and Alice 6mths born Lockington, at Lockington, Leics. 1871 Thomas age 50 gamekeeper, Mary age 49 with children Walter 15, general labourer born Ruddington, Alice 10 and George 7 scholars born Lockington, at Oaken Wood, Little Bookham Surrey. 1881 Thomas age 60 former keeper with wife Mary 60 and son George 17, gardener, at Maddox Farm, Little Bookham. Thomas Bosworth died July 1883, Epsom district, Surrey.

Mary Bosworth born c1818/21, nee Jackson, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore, married Benjamin 8.12.1839 at Bunny, both being under 21. 1841 age 20, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1841/3). 1851 age 30 married to Thomas, at Ruddington. 1861 age 40 married to Thomas, at Lockington. 1871 age 49 married to Thomas, at Little Bookham, Surrey. 1881 age 60 married to Thomas. Mary died Jan.1890, Epsom district.

Charles Bosworth bapt. Bunny 2.6.1842, son of Thomas, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore.

Thomas Bosworth born c1846 Ruddington, son of Thomas and Mary. 1851 age 5 in parents' house.

Elizabeth Bosworth born c1848 Ruddington, daughter of Thomas and Mary. 1851 age 3 in parents' house. 1861 age 13 in parents' house.

Mary Bosworth born 1850, Ruddington, daughter of Thomas and Mary. 1851 age 7 mths in parents' house. 1861 age 10, scholar in parents' house.

Emma Bosworth born ?1851 Ruddington, daughter of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 10, scholar in parents' house.

Joseph Bosworth born 1853, Ruddington, son of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 8, scholar in parents' house.

Walter Bosworth born 1855 Ruddington, son of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 6, scholar, in parents' house. 1871 age 15, general labourer, in parents' house.

Rubens/Reuben Bosworth born 1858 Ruddington, son of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 3 scholar in parents' house. 1881 age 24 born Bradmore, footman in house of a barrister in practice, at 198 Queens Gate, Kensington, London. 1891 age 33 born Bradmore, valet to Arthur Cole, independent means, at The Hall, Eccles, Norfolk. 1901 not found. 1911 age 53 born Bradmore, beer retailer on own account at The Admiral, Clifton, with wife Minnie (nee Lunn) age 38 born Tongham, Surrey, married 8 years, no children. One boarder living with them, in pub with 16 public rooms, 2 private rooms.

Alice Bosworth born 1860, Lockington, daughter of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 6 mths in parents' house. 1871 age 10, scholar in parents' house.

George Bosworth born 1864, Lockington, son of Thomas and Mary. 1871 age 7, scholar in parents' house. 1881 age 17, gardener, in parents' house.

Hetty Bosworth bapt. Bunny 30.6.1822, daughter of Benjamin, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Twin sister of Jervis. Buried Bunny 21.3.1823 (age 1 crossed out in the register).

Jervis Bosworth bapt. Bunny 30.6.1822, son of Benjamin, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore, twin brother of Hetty. Buried Bunny 7.5.1823, no age given.

Enoch Bosworth of Bradmore, bapt. 1.10.1793, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. Married Mary Bosworth 1833.

Mary Bosworth born 1796, daughter of Thomas and Catherine Bosworth, married Enoch Bosworth, both of Bradmore, 13.5.1833, witnessed by Thomas and Ann Bosworth. Died before 1853.

Mary Ann Bosworth bapt. Bunny 6.2.1834, daughter of Enoch, shoemaker, and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 30.7.1834, infant.

Eliza Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.2.1836, daughter of Enoch, shoemaker, and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 16.4.1837 age 1.

Eliza Bosworth bapt. Bunny 26.7.1838, daughter of Enoch, shoemaker, and Mary of Bradmore.

John Bosworth of Bradmore buried Bunny 24.2.1781.

William Bosworth paid by Constable for catching sparrows (and a hedgehog 1789), 1789, 1792, 1795 for a crow, 1796 and 1800 for sparrows.

John Bosworth received payment from Constable in 1779 and 1782 for catching sparrows.

John Bosworth married Sarah Sharp both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.11.1788.

Sarah Bosworth, wife of John (possibly shoemaker but register entry on line below may refer to next record in register), buried Bunny 8.12.1797.

William Bosworth born 19.4.1789, bapt. Bunny 1.5.1789, son of John, framework knitter, and Sarah. Buried Bunny 16.5.1830 age 41.

Thomas Bosworth born 5.12.1791 bapt. Bunny 13.12.1791, Bradmore, son of John framework knitter and Sarah. Probably the Thomas Bosworth paid by the Constable for catching sparrows 1801.

Mary Bosworth bapt. 12.2.1794, Bunny, daughter of John, framework knitter, and Sarah of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 21.1.1796.

John Bosworth born 17.6.1797, bapt. Bunny 21.6.1796, son of John, framework knitter, and Sarah, of Bradmore. May be the John Bosworth paid by the Constable for catching sparrows 1801. May be the John Bosworth who married Ann Davey both of Bradmore at Bunny 26.12.1810, but if so she definitely died before 1841 and John remarried another Ann. 1841 age 40, agricultural labourer, householder at Manor Farm Cottages, Donkey Lane, married to Ann, with daughter Ann (Bradmore 1841/67). 1851 age 54, farm labourer, householder, married to Ann, with children John and Mary (Bradmore 1851/13). 1861 age 64, householder, agricultural labourer, no entry for wife, only for daughter Mary (Bradmore 1861/27). Probably the John Bosworth on the Bunny Estate rental of 1867 renting a house and garden at £3 pa. May be the John of Bradmore buried Bunny 17.7.1866 age 74.

Ann Bosworth born 1785 nee Davey, daughter of Thomas and Ann, married John at Bunny 26.12.1810, buried Bunny 2.2.1837 age 52, then of Bradmore.

Mary Bosworth bapt. Bunny 29.4.1812, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 10.10.1838 age 26.

Ann Bosworth bapt. Bunny 1.6. 1815, daughter of John, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. 13.7.1837 Ann Bosworth married Thomas Bosworth son of Thomas and Catherine, see Thomas Bosworth above.

Edward Bosworth bapt. Bunny 21.8.1822, son of John, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 28.2.1823, no age given.

Ann Bosworth born c.1831 daughter of John and Ann. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/67).

Ann Bosworth born 1807 x 1811, Wilford. 1841 age 30, married to John (Bradmore 1841/67). 1851 married to John, no age recorded (Bradmore 1851/13). 1861 no entry on census, but 1867-9 Ann Bosworth, widow, received payments from Bunny & Bradmore charities. 1871 age 64, widow, householder still at Manor Farm Cottages, formerly laundress (Bradmore 1871/26). Probably the Ann Bosworth who in 1878 received the 1/3d p.wk. from Bunny & Bradmore Charities previously given to Mary Low of Bunny.

John Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.3.1842, son of John, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 age 9, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/13). 1861 age 19, carter, servant, with Elizabeth Turner, farmer and publican, at the Griffin Inn, Plumtree. 1866 John Bosworth married Elizabeth Brooks, Jan.qtr., Basford district. 1871 John Bosworth age 29 born Bradmore, colliery labourer, with wife Elizabeth age 28, son (should be stepson) George age 7 scholar born Ruddington, daughter Mary Ann age 1 born Ilkeston, at 94 Bath St Ilkeston. 1811 John age 39 colliery labourer with wife

Elizabeth age 38 lacemender, stepson George Brooks age 17 colliery boy born Ruddington, Bosworth children Maryann age 11, Elizabeth J age 4, scholars, and John G age 1 all born Ilkeston, at 94 Bath St Ilkeston. 1891 John age 49 carter with wife Elizabeth age 48, stepson George Brooks age 27 colliery labourer born Ruddington and Bosworth children Elizabeth F age 14, James age 12 errand boy, John A age 11 scholar, all born Ilkeston, at St Mary St., Ilkeston. 1901 John age 59 widower, corporation labourer, with daughter Eliza F age 24 and son John A age 20 ironmonger's carter at 30 Slade St., Ilkeston. 1904 Oct qtr, John Bosworth married Mary Ann Shelton, widow of William Shelton bricklayer, Basford District. 1911 John age 68, general labourer, with 2nd wife Mary Ann age 56 born 1855 Coventry, (married 6 years with no children from this marriage, at least 6 from previous marriage), with her children from previous marriage Ralph Shilton age 27 married (wife not present), bricklayer in colliery born Ilkeston and daughter Dorothy Shilton age 15 single, hosiery machinist in factory, born Ilkeston, at 34 Burr Lane, Ilkeston, house with 5 rooms., John Bosworth born 1842 died Dec.1919 Basford district.

Mary Bosworth, bapt. Bunny 16.12.1848, daughter of John, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/13). 1861 age 12, scholar in father's house (Bradmore 1861/27).

Elizabeth Bosworth bapt. Bunny 4.12.1805, illegitimate daughter of Ann Bosworth, possibly Ann daughter of Thomas and Mary born 1775.

Jarvis Bosworth bapt. Bunny 21.1.1809, bastard son of Jarvis and Elizabeth Bosworth of Bradmore.

Richard Bosworth signed Constable's Accounts for 1810.

William Bosworth in Constable's accounts June 1812, Constable gave him 1/- when he went to Nottingham, and claimed his own expenses 9/- when he went to Nottingham about William Bosworth's settlement. Gave William £1 when he went away. 4.8.1812 the Constable gave William's wife 2/-, and £1 when she went away. Paid expenses of 5/- at a meeting about William, and 4/1 at a meeting about his wife. Redeemed William's wife's goods at Nottingham, 15/6, and paid for carriage home 8d. William Bosworth had coals that winter, and had 4/- in Dec when he could not work. His wife had 3/- on various occasions. 1813 William had 5/6, and his wife had 5/-. 5.4.1813, the Constable gave William 10/- towards redeeming his wife's goods out of pawn, and William had £1/3/- in cash in addition to his wife's pay. 1813 William received 5/- per week from the Constable. 1814 the Constable paid 1/3 for 2 letters from William Bosworth. May 1815 the Constable bought a frock for William's boy, and Thomas Bosworth was paid 10/6 for carrying William's boy down. 1829/30 paid the Constable 17/6, 1830/1 paid £2/6/- 'pension' to the Constable.

Thomas Bosworth bapt. Bunny 24.12.1812, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the William's boy referred to in the Constable's accounts May 1815 – see William above.

Mary Bosworth born c1817, buried Bunny 31.8.1853 age 36.

William Bosworth bapt. Bunny 22.8.1848, illegitimate son of Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the William of Bradmore in 1851 age 2, nursechild in the household of John and Elizabeth James (Bradmore 1851/39). 1861 age 13, "inmate", in house of Samuel Beecroft and wife Mary (nee Bilby, of Bradmore 1841 pre marriage) at Mitchell St., Radford.

John Bosworth senior Parish Councillor 1898-1909, then Chairman 1910-1912 and continued as parish councillor to 1918. Born before 1862, as John Bosworth junior's dates are 1862-1927.

John Bosworth born c1754, died 5.9.1837 aged 83, recorded on tombstone of Ellen Amelia on south side of Bunny churchyard.

Fred Bosworth, born 11.1.1806 or 1786?, died 10.9.1833, recorded on side of Ellen Amelia Bosworth's grave on south side of Bunny churchyard.

John Bosworth born c1844/5, Bradmore; nearest match would be John son of Enoch, shoemaker, and Lucy, born 1849. 1881 John Bosworth age 36 born Bradmore, married, shoe nailer, with Thomas Bosworth age 9 scholar born Bradmore, visitors in the house of John Biddle, shoe nailer, and family at 8 Fleet St., St Margaret's Leicestershire; also visiting the Biddles is Walter Bosworth age 12 errand boy born Leicester. John's wife not present. John Bosworth not found 1891, but Thomas Bosworth age 18 and Walter Bosworth age 21 plus 4 Biddles children all boarding with Isaac Voce, born Bradmore, at St Margaret's Leicestershire (see Voce). 1901 John Bosworth age 57 born Bradmore, tea seller on own account, blind, with wife Mary 56, born c1845 Grantham, Lincs., boot machinist working at home, and son Frederick born 1875 Walsall, Staffs., 26, single, shoemaker machinist working at home, at Tower Cottages, North St., Daventry. 1911 Frederick Bosworth son of John and Mary born 1875 Walsall Staffs., age 36, Rex machine worker pensioner, with wife Edith Mary 29 and un-named child under 1 mth, at 54 Brunswick St., Leicester.

BOTHAM

Samuel Botham married Elizabeth Smith at Bunny 15.5.1767.

Sarah Botham daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth bapt. at Bunny 11.7.1768.

Samuel Botham bapt. 19.12.1769, son of Samuel and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried Bunny 16.1.1770.

BOULTBY

Joseph Boulbty paying land tax of 3/8 p.qtr. on Bradmore schedule 1803 -1815 (formerly Brown family lands, taken over by Mr Hopwell and in 1803 by Mr Boulbty). These lands were absorbed into Richard Walker's holdings in 1816. Joseph Boulbtee was steward and brother in law of Sir Thomas Parkyns, whose 3rd wife was Jane Boulbty. Gentleman of Bunny, he was commissioner for Keyworth inclosure 1798, also for East LEake 1798 and Bunny 1797. Commander of the Bunny Troop of Yeomanry Cavalry.

BOWLEY

Joseph Bowley of Bradmore age 30 married Abigail Birch of Bradmore age 21, at Bunny 20.3.1689/90.

Mary Boly married Hugh Alsop both of Bradmore at Bunny 3.7.1738.

BRADBY

Martha Bradby bapt. Bunny 13.7.1718, daughter of Abraham and Joyce of Bradmore.

BRADLEY

Mary Bradley born c1808, buried Bunny 29.3.1845 age 37, then of Bradmore.

De BRADMORE

William and **Nicholas** de Bradmore 1209-1233 acted as witnesses regarding land at Willoughby on the Wolds.

Hugh son of **Robert** de Bradmore early to mid 13th century granted lands to John son of Nicholas de Bradmore. Mid 13th century Hugh son of Robert de Bradmore granted to Robert Poyne and his wife Alice 1 acre in Bradmore, that is 1 rood (¼ acre) at Blakerodes in Blacclif, 1 rood at Semitas, 1 rood in Scortescroftes, 1 rood at le Holm. Annual rent 1 grain of pepper on 1 November. Witnesses include Elyas and William de Bradmore.

John son of **Nicholas** de Bradmore, early to mid 13th century, received from Hugh son of Robert de Bradmore, 3 acres and 3 roods arable in Bradmore, being 1 selion (arable strip, roughly 1 acre) at Hoverlongelands, Estacres and Restepplot, 1 selion beyond Nottingham, 1 selion at Toringtongate, 1 at Asterholes and Forcelongelanes, Littelmere and Waterfaleys, and 2 selions at Netherlongelandes. Annual rent 1 grain of pepper on 24 June. Witnesses include **William** son of **William** son of **Frone** de Bradmore, John Poinye of Bradmore and Robert his brother. John son of Nicholas also witnessed land grant from Richard son of Lucy de Bradmore to Geoffrey Thorkart and his wife Matilda.

Richard son of **Lucy** de Bradmore early to mid 13th century granted to Geoffrey Thorkart de Bradmore and his wife Matilda 1 selion and appurtenances in Bradmore between the lands of Elyas de Bradmore and of **John** son of **Nicholas**, adjoining Geoffrey's land in Keyworth Sike. Annual rent 1 apple on 14 August. Witnesses include Elyas de Bradmore, William Thorkart, John son of Nicholas and William son of Ralph.

Marsilius de Bradmore and **Beatrice** his wife early to mid 13th century with the consent of Elyas their son and heir granted to their daughter **Helwisie** 1 toft held by William Kent and 6 acres in Bradmore, that is 1 bovate held by Henry Halfknyt being 1 selion on the road to Nottingham, 1 selion at Semitas, Lesingmarer, Pesingberer, Smallegesike, Littilhull and le Wyngard, 1 selion on the road to Kawrthe, 1 selion at Catteshon, Rampetlinemere, Clingoville, Thriddetlines, Bottokes, Landcroftes, Wadgarthes, Bacclif and Blakerodes. Annual rent ½d at Easter. Witnesses include **William** de Bradmar, **Anker** de Bradmar.

Elyas de Bradmore mid 13th century witnessed land grants by William son of Geoffrey Torkard to his brother John, and by Hugh son of Robert de Bradmore to Robert and Alice Poyne. c1240 Ellis de Bradmore witnessed a grant by Richard son of Ralph Bugge (ie Willughby family) in Nottingham.

John son of Elias of Bradmore witnessed a grant re Ruddington c1294, a grant in Upper Broughton 18.3.1326, a grant in Ruddington, 5.8.1331, a grant in Willoughby on the Wolds 2.6.1336, and in Cossall 13.7.1344.

William de Bradmore (still alive in 1323) and **Elias** witnessed a gift in Ruddington c1259.

Robert and **William** de Bradmore witnessed a grant of land in Upper Broughton c1280.

Elyas de Bradmore landholder in 14th century. Elyas de Bradmore and William Torkard of Bradmore 1.8.1337 witnessed land grants by Gervase son of John Helot of Bradmore to John Helot his brother,

including Iselion at Shortelonglandes adjoining the land of Elyas de Bradmore. 7.6.1340 Elyas de Bradmore and others witnessed land grant by William Helote of Bradmore to Robert de Donington of Bradmore. 11.6.1340 Elyas and others witnessed land grant by Robert de Donington of Bradmore to William Helote of Bradmore and his wife Avicia. 26.11.1347 Elyas witnessed land grant by Nicholas son of Ade de Bunny to William Torkard of Bradmore and his wife Petronilla. 12.1.1349 Elyas witnessed land grant by William Torkard of Bradmore to William Helot of Bradmore. 13.12.1349 Helia de Bradmore and William Torkard act as witnesses at Stanton on the Wolds. 30.3.1352 Elias de Bradmore and William Torkard of Bradmore act as witnesses at Ruddington. 12.1.1371 Elyas witnesses land grant by William Burne and his wife Joanna to Hugh de Annesleye.

William son of Elias de Bradmore 18.1.1376 gave power of attorney to William son of Hugo Attechurch vicar of Bunny and William de Deerham clerk, to place Hugo de Annesley in full seisin of lands, tenements, rents and services in Willoughby on the Wolds and homage and service of 5 named men and heirs which Nicholas Hatherne chaplain had for life by gift and fee of Elias of Bradmore.

29.9.1377 William Elyas of Bradmere quitclaims Hugh de Annesley in 2/- rent per annum owed at Michaelmas in all lands and tenements in Bradmore formerly held of William Torkard.

John de Bradmore 13.7.1344 witnessed a grant in Cossall.

William Bradmore bailiff of Nottingham 25.3.1411 witnessed a lease in Nottingham. 8.2.1416 William of Bradmore bailiff of Nottingham witnessed a gift in Nottingham.

BRADWELL

J Bradwell had a named brick in the Methodist chapel wall, above the left window, chapel opening 1830. Possibly John Bradwell b.1781 at East Leake in 1841, or John Bradwell b.1782 of St Anns, Sutton Bonnington, in Loughborough by 1851..

BRAISBY

John Braisby born 1829, Barton. 1841 age 12 at Barton in parents' house, Thomas and Sarah, with grandfather Thomas Braisby, ag.lab. John was eldest of 5 children at that time. 1851 age 22, farm labourer, married to Mary, in household of John and Elizabeth James (in-laws), in part of No.24 Main St. (Bradmore 1851/30).

Mary Braisby born 1830, Bradmore, nee James, daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1851 age 21, married to John, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/39).

Eliza Ann Braisby born 1850, daughter of John and Mary. 1851 age 3 months, in grandparents' house, John and Elizabeth James (Bradmore 1851/39).

BRAITHWAITE

William Braithwaite of East Leake, farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in 1868 deeds, but deleted noted dead in 1903 deeds. 1887 as trustee signed the Methodist Church's loan from the Wesleyan Assurance Co for repairs after the collapse of the chapel ceiling. 1896 of Stathern Lodge, Melton Mowbray.

BRAMLEY

Mary Bramley born 1833 Bradmore, nee James, daughter of Edward, blacksmith, and Harriett. Married twice, first to Thomas Marshall of Ruddington, later to Mark Bramley, grocer, of Ruddington. Died Oct.qtr. 1885. See Marshall and James.

BRANDI(S)ON

John Brandi(s)on of Bradmore, the elder, husbandman, in 1674 Hearth Tax Return with 1 hearth. Will dated 14.5.1683, probate 3.12.1683, leaving to his daughter Elizabeth £5 and a to be paid to her in 2 equal payments, 50/- at May Day following John's death and 50/- the next May Day, and left her the little brass pott for her filial portion. Son John was executor.

BRANSBY

Mary Bransby born 1824, Aslocton. (Probably related to Tom Bransby of Aslockton, farm steward, who died 3.8.1901 leaving a widow Fanny who signed the Admonition 30 Aug at Nottingham, and leaving effects value £79/17/-.) 1851 age 27, single, house servant in the household of William James (Bradmore 1851/44).

BRANSON

Elizabeth Branson born c1815, Nottinghamshire. 1841 age 25, of independent means in the household of Benjamin Hutchinson near Farmer St. / Main Rd. junction (Bradmore 1841/44).

BRE(N)DERN

John Bredern junior married Dorothy Lee both of Bradmore at Bunny 17.10.1682.

Elizabeth Brendern married John Walker, both of Bradmore at Bunny 28.4.1684.

BREWSTER

Mary Brewster married Richard Waine of Keyworth at Bunny 29.5.1632.

John Brewster of Plumtree, farmer, listed in 1835 as trustee in Bradmore Methodist Church deeds.

BREELY/BRILEY

John Breely married Mary Milner both of Bradmore at Bunny 12.6.1732.

Ada Briley?, born 1859, Mansfield. 1881, age 22, unmarried, visitor in William and Eliza Bagguley's household, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1881/1).

BRINDLEY

Joyce Brindley, widow, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 14.5.1773.

BROADHURST

Mary Broadhurst born c1854, Burton on the Wolds, Leicestershire, daughter of Edward, ag.lab, and Ann. Worked as domestic servant / housekeeper through her life at various addresses in Nottingham and 1901 in Yardley, Warwickshire. 1911 age 57, housekeeper living in the house of William Jacques, widower (Bradmore 1911/50).

BROOKS

Mary Brooks married John Shipman of Plumtree at Bunny 15.11.1702.

BROUNT

William Brount married Agnes Trowell of Bunny at Bunny 5 Dec 1613.

BROWN/BROWNE

Thomas Brown married Anne June, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 8.11.1656. (Probably not the Thomas Brown, ploughwright, who also married an Ann but whose daughters are below the age of 24 at 1708 so Thomas's marriage date looks too early.

Mary Brown bapt. Bunny 13.10.1657, daughter of Thomas and Anne of Bradmore.

Thomas Brown bapt. Bunny 16.7.1660, son of Thomas and Anne of Bradmore.

Thomas Brown married Jane Wallis at Bunny, 20.10.1680.

William Browne bapt. Bunny 8.4.1682, son of Thomas and Jane of Bradmore.

Thomas Browne junior, carpenter, in 1705 was living in the house where the Bradmore fire broke out.

Thomas Brown ploughwright of Bradmore, married to Ann. Possibly the Thomas who married Ann Spencer at Sneinton, 25.2.1687. Will dated 17.5.1708, proved 17.6.1708, leaving to Ann Brown his eldest daughter £30 at age 24, to Mary Brown his second daughter £20 at age 24, and the residue to his wife, who was his executor but is not named in this document. Bond dated 29.5.1708 is by Ann Brown, relict of Thomas. Inventory dated 24.5.1708 comprising: purse and apparell £5; household goods of all sorts £35; wheat in the chamber £3; all the cowkind £25; sheep and fleackes (hurdles) £12; all the horses £40; waggon, carts, plows, harrows, collers and gears and all manner of husbandry implements £15; plow timber and his? tools £2/10/-; crop of corn £60; total £198/10/-, by James Harwood, Joseph Tomson, Francis Boot.

Ann Brown married to Thomas who died 1708.

Ann Brown eldest daughter of Thomas and Ann, under 24 years old at 1708. Probably the Anne daughter of Thomas and Ann bapt. at Ruddington 10.3.1688.

Mary Brown second daughter of Thomas and Ann, under 24 years old at 1708. Probably the Mary daughter of Thomas and Ann bapt. at Ruddington 15.5.1692.

Susanna Brown of Bradmore buried 2.10.1720.

John Brown of Bradmore buried Bunny 20.12.1740.

John Brown married to Sarah, living in Bradmore in 1730s and through 1740s.

Elizabeth Brown bapt. Bunny 2.5.1733, daughter of John and Sarah of Bradmore. Died before 1743.

Ann Brown daughter of John and Sarah of Bradmore buried Bunny 1.2. 1737.

Martha Brown bapt. Bunny 20.3.1738, daughter of John and Sarah of Bradmore.

Sarah and Elizabeth Brown bapt. Bunny 7.9.1743, daughters of John and Sarah, parish not

specified.

George Brown bapt. at Bunny 21.7.1748, son of John and Sarah, parish not specified.

Samuel Brown married to Ann Marrot at Bunny 20.9.1733, living in Bradmore by 1734. Buried Bunny 29.6.1749.

Ann Brown nee Marrot, married at Bunny 20.9.1733, wife of Samuel of Bradmore buried Bunny 9.1.1743.

Sarah Brown bapt. Bunny 1.9.1734, daughter of Samuel and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 4.4.1743 age 8.

Piercy/Pearcy Brown bapt. Bunny 28.11.1736, daughter of Samuel and Ann Brown of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 21.8.1769, age 33.

Samuel Brown bapt. Bunny 22.4.1739, son of Samuel and Ann of Bradmore.

Thomas Brown of Bradmore, possibly the Thomas Brown born c1694, Ruddington, who married Ann Savage at Ruddington 4.10.1724. Buried Bunny 24.1.1737, left will dated 15.1.1737, proved 7.7.1737. To sister Anne Henson 1/-, to brother William Henson 1/-, to sister Dorothy Turpin 1/-, to brother Seder? Thompson 1/-, to brother John Ronton 1/-, the residue to his wife Ann. His inventory was dated 2.2.1737, and comprises: purse and apparel £5; Chimney piece £1; rest of the house £8; parlour £2; kitching £1/10/-; chamber over the parlour £2; chamber over the house £2; chamber over the kitching £1/10/-; garrets 10/-; horses £45; calves £30; swine £3; wheat £2; barley £15; Pease £12; hay £7; sheep £20; crops upon the ground £40; the Closes £6; stables £10; carts £3; things seen and unseen £5; total £231/10/-, by William Street of Bradmore. Bond dated 28.5.1737 £460, by Ann Brown and William Street.

Ann Brown, born c1696, wife of Thomas Brown of Bradmore, died 15.1.1774 aged 78, buried as widow at Bunny 17.1.1774 next to the south porch. 'Beneath this stone a faithful friend is laid / Who has the common debt of nature paid / When living honest generous and kind / A loss to all her friends she's left behind / But from this World her soul has took its Flight / To dwell in endless joys and sweet Delight.' Will dated 3.2.1737, probate 5.4.1774, bond £90 dated 22.1.1774. Left to her nephew Charles Savage £30 one month after her death, and a messuage or dwelling house and land, appurtenances and outhouses which she had bought from William Wheatley, situated at Ruddington. To her niece Elizabeth Gee £10, one month after Ann's death. The residue to her nephew John Savage of Bradmore.

Samuel Brown bapt. Bunny 25.4.1768, son of Mary Brown of Bradmore. Possibly the Samuel who received payment from the Constable in 1780, 1782 and 1783 for catching sparrows.

Sarah Brown received payment from Constable 1782 for catching sparrows.

Mary Brown, spinster, of Bradmore, died Sunday 5th.11.1786, buried Bunny 7.11.1786. (Possibly the Mary Brown of Bradmore who had two bastard children, Thomas and William, sons of William Ambrose of Bridgford, bapt. at Bunny in Oct. 1763 and buried them both in the same month, dates not clear in the register but burial may be 18th - though no firm evidence to link to this Mary.) Had 1/- p.wk. from the Constable 1779 through to 1786, and coals. Jan.1780 Mary Brown had 3/- for doing for Ann Manchester, when she died. 1781 Mary had 1/- when she was ill, and Constable paid 6d for bleeding her. She also had ½lb of butter, 4d. 1782 she had half a strike of Blendcorn and the Constable paid for 3 lb of flax for spinning, 2/-. 28.6.1785 she had 1/6 when ill. Dec. 1785 she had 3/8 for a pair of shoes, and Sarah Henson was paid 14/- for Mary Brown. Jan. 1786 the Constable paid Sarah Underwood 3/2 for a shift cloth for Mary Brown. In the winter of 1786 she had coals from the Constable. In April the Constable paid 5d for mending her shoes, and 3d for bleeding her. In August, a pair of sheets 7/- and an apron 1/9 for her. 27.11.1786 the Constable paid 2/6 for laying out Mary Brown who died Sunday 5.11.1786 and paid Messrs Beetham and Clark for burying her. Not clear whether two following entries concerning Coroners' Inquests at Ruddington and Bunny relate to Mary or not.

William Brown paid land tax at 3/8 p.qtr. 1780-5, 1788, 1791, with John Brown paying the years between and afterwards. Probably of Ruddington.

John Brown, probably of Ruddington, in Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 11 acres 35 perches paying £8/9/3 rent pa, no house specified. Paid land tax 3/8 p.qtr. 1787, 1789, 1790, 1792-5, alternating with William (1788 and 1791), and followed by Mrs Brown for one year, 1796. This is for the three Flawford Closes, which afterwards passed to Mr Hopwell and later Mr Boulty, before becoming incorporated in 1816 into Manor Farm under Richard Walker.

Lucy Brown married John Attewell, both of Bradmore, 24.12.1827. See Attewell.

Charles Brown born 1827, Costock. 23.5.1850 Charles then of Bunny married Elizabeth James, then under 21, daughter of Edward James of Bradmore, blacksmith, at Bunny. 1851 age 24, farm labourer, married to Elizabeth, in father-in-law's house at the Forge (Bradmore 1851/45). May be the same Charles Brown, widower, labourer of Bradmore who married Ann James, daughter of Thomas, labourer, at Bunny 24.1.1861. 1861 Charles age 30, noted born Bunny, agricultural labourer, married to

Ann at 7 Kirk Lane Ruddington. Died Jan.1870, Basford district.

Elizabeth Brown nee James born 1831, daughter of Edward and Harriett James. 23.5.1850 married Charles Brown of Bunny, at Bunny. 1851 age 21, married to Charles, in her father Edward's house (Bradmore 1851/45). Buried Bunny 30.1.1854 age 24.

Ann Brown bapt. Bunny 9.3.1852, daughter of Charles, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1861 Ann age 9 scholar in house of her aunt Mary Marshall nee James, Elizabeth Brown's sister, at High St., Burton on Trent.

Ann Brown born 27.7.1834 Bradmore, nee James, daughter of Thomas and Martha, married Charles widower, labourer at Bunny 24.1.1861. 1861 age 25 married to Charles at 7 Kirk Lane, Ruddington. 1871 Ann Brown age 36 widow with children Thomas age 9, John age 8, Mary age 5, William age 2 scholars born Ruddington, at White Horse Yard, Ruddington. 1881 Ann Brown age 44 charwoman, widow, born Bradmore with children Thomas single age 19 ag.lab, John age 17 ag lab and William age 12 winder all born Ruddington at Chapel St, White Horse Yard Ruddington. 1891 Ann Brown age 53 widow, charwoman, born Bradmore, solo in house at Chapel St, Ruddington. 1901 Ann Brown widow age 65, stocking/hosiery worker at home, born Bradmore, at White Horse Yard Ruddington. Died Jan.1909, Basford district.

Henry Brown, born 1854, Leasingham, Lincs. 1861 Henry Brown at Leasingham age 7, son of John Brown habster? and Mary A. 1871 Henry Brown age 17 farm servant indoors, born Leasingham, at High Grange, Temple Bruer on a farm with 869 acres employing 8 men and 4 boys. 1881 Henry Brown age 27 ag.lab born Leasingham with wife Mary age 25 and children John age 5, George age 2, all born Long Bennington, at Back Lanes, Long Bennington,. 1891 age 37, agricultural labourer, householder, 3-room house, married to Mary Ann, children George H, Charles W and Ethel, living on Farmer St., at or near Blackcliffe Farm (Bradmore 1891/35). Electoral roll, house with no county vote, 1890-1897. Son Albert's birth 1892 specifies at Barn Farm. 1901 Henry Brown age 47, drysalter's carter, with wife Mary A and children Ethel age 13 born Walcott Lincs, Albert 8 born Bradmore, Ernest 2 born Nottingham, at 70 Bathley St Nottingham. 1911 Henry Brown age 57 farm labourer born Long Bennington with wife Mary Ann age 53 (married 35 years, 6 children, 1 dead) with children George Henry age 32 gardener born Long Bennington and Ernest age 12 scholar born Nottingham, at The Green, Ruddington, 5-room house.

Mary Ann Brown, born 1857, Long Bennington. 1881 age 25 married to Henry at Long Bennington. 1891 age 34, married to Henry (Bradmore 1891/35). 1901 married to Henry at Nottingham. 1911 age 53 married to Henry at Nottingham.

John Brown born c1876 Long Bennington, son of Henry and Mary. 1881 age 5 in parents' house.

George Henry Brown, born c1879, Long Bennington, son of Henry and Mary. 1881 age 2 in parents' house. Attended Methodist Sunday School intermittently, 2nd class 17.3.1889, 1st class 2nd part 14.7.1889-June 1892, 1st class 1st part July 1892-June 1893, 1st class July 1893 – July 1894. 1891 age 18 (should be 12), single, agricultural labourer, day boy in parents' house (1891/35). 1911 age 32 in parents' house.

Charles William Brown, born c1882, Long Bennington, son of Henry and Mary. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 3.3.1889, intermittent attendances 3rd class Jul-Dec.1889, 2nd class Jan.1890-Oct.1894. 1891 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/35). 1901 Charles William Brown age 19, stoker, on HMS Albatross, 430 ton torpedo boat destroyer (steam) at Chatham. 1905 Oct.qtr. Charles William Brown married Frances Stapleton. 1911 Charles William Brown age 29 tramway motor man for Borough Council, with wife Fanny age 29 (married 5 years, 4 children) with children Charles Dennis age 3, Constance Irene age 2, Elsie May age 1, Olive age 4 mths all born Nottingham, living at 22 Glebe St, Nottingham, 5-room house.

Ethel Brown, born 1888 Walcott near Folkingham, Lincs, daughter of Henry and Mary. 1891 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/35). Methodist Sunday School scholar intermittent attendances in vestry Girls March 1893-Nov.1894, 3rd class Feb.1895-Aug.1896. 1901 age 13 in parents' house. 1911 Ethel age 23 single general domestic servant for William Potts, Wesleyan Methodist minister and his wife at Silverhorn, Bromley Road West Bridgford.

Albert Brown born 5.11.1892 Bradmore, Barn Farm, bapt. Bradmore Methodist 6.12.1892, son of Henry and Mary Ann. 1901 age 8 in parents' house. 1911 age 19, single, general farm servant born Barn Farm, Bradmore, at Manor House, Screveton on the farm of Henry Smith age 55 born Bunkershill Lincs and his family.

Walter John Brown Methodist Sunday School scholar (contemporary with Charles William Brown son of Henry and Mary) 4th class 3.3.1889 one week only, then intermittent 3rd class Jul-Dec 1889, 2nd class Jan 1890, 1st class Feb-Sept 1894, last attendance 3.2.1895.

John Brown born c1854, married 5.1.1890 at Bunny age 36, widower, engineer of Bradmore son of John maltster, to Ellen Rayment age 20 of Bradmore, daughter of Charles, warehouseman.

BRUCE

Hervey Jukes Lloyd Bruce of Clifton Hall, Nottingham, on electoral roll with land, no county vote, 1911 only. Not resident. Died 1919, listed as of Downhill Londonderry Ireland and of Clifton Hall, not present at Clifton Hall in 1911.

Revd. Francis Rosslyn Courtenay Bruce, Clifton Rectory, on electoral roll with land and house, no county vote, 1911 only. Not resident. 1911 at Clifton Rectory age 39, Church of England clergyman, born Barton, Notts, with wife Rachel age 24 (married 1908, Erpingham Norfolk), son, daughter, visitor and 5 servants; census form signed Rosslyn Bruce.

BURROW(E)S

Richard Borrowes of Ruddington, born 1712. 1737 married Mary Attenborough, daughter of Richard and Prudence. Richard was executor of Mary's brother Robert Attenborough's will made in 1754. Died 1785, buried at East Leake.

Mary Burrows nee Attenborough, born 1712, daughter of Richard and Prudence. 4.7.1737 married Richard at Nottingham St Nicholas. Children Robert (1739-1775), born Ruddington, later children born East Leake: John (b.1741), John (b.1744), William (b.1745, referred to in the 1785 will of Richard Attenborough, son of Robert and Elizabeth, as cousin, received Debdale Farm lands in trust.), Richard (1750-1838, married 1781 Dorothy North 1754-1838, had son John 1787-1828 of Rempstone and 4 daughters) and Ann (b.1757). Died 24.10.1791, buried at East Leake.

Richard Burrows born 1805, Ruddington. 1841 and 1842 Richard Burrows with freehold land, Flawforth Field, in Poll Books. Richard Burrows married Elizabeth Alice Hardmett, Apr.qtr.1838 Basford district. 1851 Richard Burrows age 46 farmer of 46 acres employing 1 labourer, and malster, born Ruddington, with wife Elizabeth Alice age 47 born Nottingham and children John ?Ardmel age 11 scholar born Kegworth, Mary Alice age 9 scholar and Arthur William age 7 scholar both born Borrowwash, and servants including Mary James age 18 born Bradmore, daughter of Edward and Harriett, at Ruddington. 1861 Richard Burrows 56 widower, farmer of 450 acres employing 16 men and 4 boys, with sister Mary Ann Burrows age 52, both born Ruddington, and children Mary Alice age 19, Arthur William age 16 both born Borrowwash Derbyshire, at 23 Easthorpe St., Ruddington. 1871 Richard Burrows age 66 widower, farmer of 42 acres employing 1 man, with son John ?Ardmel Burrows age 31 single commercial clerk born Kegworth, at Easthorpe, Ruddington. Probably the Richard Burrows of Ruddington, farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church on deeds of 1835 and 1868. Died 1872, Basford district.

Arthur Burrows born 1844 Borrowwash, Derbyshire, son of Richard and Elizabeth Alice of Ruddington. 1851 age 7 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1861 age 16 in parents' house. 1881 Arthur William Burrows age 36 Royal Insurance Company agent born Borrowwash, with wife Emma age 32, children Richard Stanley age 5 scholar, 2 daughters and another son all born Ruddington, at Easthorpe St. Ruddington. 1891 Arthur W Burrows age 46 painter and insurance agent with wife Emma age 42, daughter Eveline age 17 pupil teacher, son Richard S age 15 farmer's boy, another daughter and 3 other sons all born Ruddington, at Easthorpe St., Ruddington.

Richard Stanley Burrows born 1876 Ruddington, son of Arthur and Emma of Easthorpe St Ruddington. 1881 age 5 scholar in parents' house. 1891 age 15 farmer's boy in parents' house. 1901 Richard Burrows age 25, bus driver, with wife Emma age 22 and children Frederick age 3, Richard S age 1, all born Ruddington, at High St., Ruddington. 1911 Richard S Burrows age 35 farmer with wife Emma age 32 (married 13 years (1898) with 4 children, 1 dead), children Frederick E age 13 on farm, Richard S age 11 scholar, George H age 2, all born Ruddington, at Easthorpe St. Ruddington. May be the Richard Burrows of Ruddington on electoral roll, land, no parish vote, 1913-1914.

Mary Burrows, born c1787 Ruddington, married to Richard Burrows farmer of Ruddington. 1841 at Ruddington, Richard Burrows age 45 farmer with wife Mary age 50, daughter Martha age 15, plus John Burrows independent age 40 and Harriet Henson age 15, with 2 servants. 1851 Richard Burrows age 59 farmer of 100 acres employing 4 labourers, with wife Mary age 65, daughter Martha age 27 and grandson John age 4 mths, all born Ruddington, at Ruddington. 1861 Mary Burrows age 74, widow of Richard, farmer of 114 acres, with daughter Martha age 36 and her husband Robert Wrightson age 47 farmer born Kirk Ireton, and grandson John 10, scholar born Ruddington, with William Langham of Bradmore as cowman, at 16 Easthorpe St., Ruddington. Mary died Jan 1868, Basford district.

William Burrows born c1835, Keyworth. 1851 age 16, single, farm labourer, in the household of Elizabeth Goodacre, Blackcliffe Farm (Bradmore 1851/27).

John Burrows on Bradmore electoral roll 1852-1858 with 82 acres (89 acres in 1855/6 only). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1855 Kellys Directory, farmer. Signed Constables Accounts 1853-5. Not

known which property he was farming. Not clear where he fits into the Ruddington Burrowses family trees. Probably the John Burrows at Ruddington age 55 in 1841 with wife Mary age 55 and daughter Mary age 30; age 71 in 1851 farming 300 acres employing 9 labourers at Ruddington, with wife Mary age 69 born E Leake and daughter Mary Ann age 40.

Isabel Burton married John Millet of Bunny at Bunny 23.11.1612.

Elizabeth Burton married Henry Church of Keyworth at Bunny 6.11.1733.

John Burton of Bradmore buried Bunny 6.1.1732.

Thomas Burton son of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore buried Bunny 13.4.1732.

George Burton, born Sileby 1867. 1881 age 14, unmarried, indoor servant in the household of William and Eliza Bagguley at Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1881/1).

Joseph Burton born 1862 Sheldford. 1881 age 19, single, farm indoor servant in household of Robert Ranby, probably Manor Farm (Bradmore 1881/14).

Robert Burton, born 1879, Dronfield Derbyshire son of Samuel Burton platelayer and Elizabeth. 1901 Robert Burton age 21, born Dronfield Yorkshire, single, waggoner on Joseph Stafford's farm, living in Barn Close on Village Street (Bradmore 3/1901). 25.11.1901 labourer of Bradmore, married Kate Whittaker, 26, of Bunny, daughter of Charles Whittaker, labourer of Bunny. Witnesses A Davies and F J Pierrepoint. On electoral roll, house, 1904-1906. 2.5.1905 listed as parent / guardian of Elsie May Whittaker (born Bradmore) when she was admitted to Bunny School. See Whittaker. 1911 Robert Burton age 30, farm waggoner born Keyworth, with wife Kate age 35 born Bunny, married 9 years with 5 children, daughter Elise Whittaker age 12 born Bradmore (1899), Burton children Hilda, Leslie, Constance and Albert, at Holme Lane, Radcliffe on Trent, 5-room house.

Kate Burton nee Whittaker, born 1875 Bunny, daughter of Charles. Married Robert Burton at Bunny 25.11.1901. 1911 age 35 married to Robert.

Hilda Burton born 1902 Ruddington, daughter of Robert and Kate. 1911 age 9 in parents' house.

Leslie Burton born 1905 Bradmore, son of Robert and Kate. 1911 age 6 in parents' house.

Constance Burton born 1907 Radcliffe on Trent, daughter of Robert and Kate. 1911 age 4 in parents' house.

Albert Burton born 1909 Radcliffe on Trent, son of Robert and Kate. 1911 age 2 in parents' house.

BUSH

Ann Bush married Gervas Farrand/Forehand of Stapleford at Bunny 22.6. 1672.

Ann Bush mother of Robert, referred to in his will 1673 – see below.

Robert Bush, husbandman, son of Ann, left a will dated 10.4.1673, probate 21.11.1674. Willed to be buried at Bunny. Left to his mother Ann Bush 20/- pa for life 'as from when she refuseth to live with my executor and not before.' She had the best bedstead and feather bed and pair of sheets, 2 blankets, 1 coverlett and pillow and 1 bolster. To his sister Jane Bush he left £4 more over and above £15 he was obliged to pay her by bond, and also his best chest. To his brother Thomas Bush, 40/-. Both sums to be paid 12 months after his death. To Sarah Kemp of Wisall £4 to be paid 4 years after his death. The residue to his brother Richard Bush, his executor.

Jane Bush daughter of Ann, brother of Robert and beneficiary under his will. Married Richard White, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 5.5.1678.

Richard Bush son of Ann, executor of brother Robert. Married Mary Flower both of Bradmore at Bunny 17.6.1684. 30.11.1685 depositions by Richard Bush and Richard Waite, husbandmen of Bradmore re case vs Thomas Clifton.

Joseph Bush married to Ann, soldier, living in Bradmore 1790s.

Sarah Bush born 2.4.1795, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 8.4.1795, daughter of Joseph and Ann.

Thomas Bush born 6.12.1800, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 10.12.1800, son of Joseph, soldier, and Ann.

BUTLER

John Butler, Morris dancer, arraigned for dancing on a Sunday, 4.11.1618. May be John Butler who married Joan Hutchinson 6.10.1612, at Bradmore. Possibly the John who took the Protestation Oath in 1641.

Susanna Butler married Thomas Goulding, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 6.6.1665. Possibly Susanna daughter of Richard and Mary bapt. Bunny 16.11.1638.

John Butler born c1810, buried Bunny 11.7.1845 age 35.

John Butler senr, born 1809, Clifton, son of Thomas, farmer, and Hannah. 1841 age 30 in parents' house at Clifton. 1851 age 43 farm manager for mother Hannah on 104 acres with wife Rebecca age 38, their son John age 8 scholar, and brother Thomas, grandson George Wootton age 16 plowman, all

born Clifton, at Clifton. 1861 age 53, farmer of 100 acres employing 2 men and 2 boys, with wife Rebecca age 48 and children John age 18 and William age 5 scholar, at Clifton. 1871 age 63, retired farmer, with wife Rebecca in son John's house at Coalpit Lane, Basford. 1881 age 72, in son John and Emma's household, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1881/3). 1891 widower age 83, retired farmer, in son's house at Clifton. Died Jan 1895, Basford district.

John Butler, born c1843 at Clifton son of John and Rebecca. 1851 age 8 scholar in parents' house. 1861 age 18 in parents' house. 1867 Oct qtr John Butler married Louisa Wootton, Basford district. 1871 age 28 farmer with wife Louisa age 29, son Wootton, father John and mother Rebecca, and cousin Benjamin Butler age 15 farmer's son, all born Clifton, at Coalpit Lane, Basford. Wife Louisa died 1875, John remarried Apr qtr 1876 to Emma Shelton. On electoral roll 1879 and 1880 only with house and land at £50+ rent pa. 1878-9 rented grazing on Plumtree Lane, and 1880 on Pendock Lane. 1881 age 38, farmer, 201 acres (Debdale Farm), employing 2 labourers and 2 boys. Householder, married to Emma with children Wootton, Louisa, Frank Albert, and father John Butler, widower, mother in law Sarah Shelton and servants Caroline Simkin, John Monks and George Hornbuckle (Bradmore 1881/3). 1881 Waywarden. Moved back to Clifton before next census. 1891 age 48, farmer, at Clifton with his wife Emma and children Wootton, Louisa, Sarah, and his father John. 1901 John Butler age 58, farmer, employer born Clifton with wife Emma age 58, children Frank A, Sarah R and cousin Elizabeth Davill? mother's help age 16 born Keyworth, plus servants, at Manor Farm Clifton. 1911 John Butler age 68 farmer with wife Emma age 68 (married 38 years (1874) with 2 children), son Frank Albert and his wife and son, 2 farm workers, nurse and general domestic servant, at Clifton, 10-room house.

Louisa Butler nee Wootton, born c1842 Clifton, married John Butler Oct qtr 1867. 1871 age 29 married to John. Died Apr qtr 1875.

Wootton Butler, born 1869 at Clifton, son of John and Louisa. 1871 age 2 in parents' house. 1881 age 12, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/3). 1891 age 22 in parents' house at Clifton.

Louisa Butler, born 1873 at Basford, daughter of John and Louisa. 1881 age 8, scholar in parents' house (1881/3). 1891 age 18 in parents' house at Clifton.

Emma Butler nee Shelton, born 1843 at Ruddington. 2nd wife of John Butler, married Apr qtr 1876, Nottingham district.. 1881 age 38, wife of John. (Bradmore 1881/3). 1891 married to John. 1901 age 58, married to John. 1911 age 68 married to John.

Charles Butler born 1877, buried Bunny 6.7.1877 age 6 months, then of Bradmore, son of John and Emma.

Frank Albert Butler, born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 4.1.1880, son of John, farmer, and Emma of Bradmore. 1881 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/3). 1891 age 11 in parents' house at Clifton. 1901 age 21, single, in parents' house. 1907 July qtr. Frank Butler married Eleanor Howard, Chesterfield district. 1911 age 31 on father's farm with wife Eleanor age 34 assistant in dairy, born Chesterfield, (married 3 years (1908) with 1 child), and son John Howard Butler age 5 mths born Clifton.

Sarah Maria Butler, born 1841, Nottingham, daughter of John, gentleman, and Ann, and grand-daughter of Elizabeth Goodacre of Blackcliffe Farm. 1851 age 10, scholar at home, in grand-mother's house (Bradmore 1851/27). 1861 age 20, single, fundholder, householder at Blackcliffe Farm with sister Elizabeth, friend Eliza Balsall, servants Mary A Hickling and Thomas Attewell, groom (Bradmore 1861/15). 1864 Whites Directory, Misses Elizabeth and Maria Butler, no details. Sarah Maria Butler gentlewoman of Bradmore daughter of John, gentleman, married Henry John Hosking, clerk in orders and vicar of Bunny, of Bunny vicarage, son of Thomas rector of Rempstone, at Bunny 11.7.1867. Rev Henry John Hosking late of Bunny died at Rainhill Lancs, 8.3.1868 admin 15.4.1868 to widow Sarah Maria, effects less than £3000. 1871 Sarah Maria Hosking age 30 in brother in law Henry Arthur Cave's house with her sister Elizabeth and family, Bishopwearmouth. 1881 age 40, annuitant, in the Cave household at Bishopwearmouth. No records until 1917, Sarah Maria Hosking born 26.6.1840 died 15.10.1917 age 77 at Wanganui, Rangitikei, New Zealand, buried in Aramoho cemetery.

Elizabeth Butler born 1844, Ruddington, daughter of John, gentleman, and Ann, and grand-daughter of Elizabeth Goodacre of Blackcliffe Farm. 1851 age 7, scholar at home, in grandmother's house (Bradmore 1851/27). 1861 age 17, single, fundholder in sister Sarah Maria's house (Bradmore 1861/15). 1864 Whites Directory, Misses Elizabeth and Maria Butler, no details. Elizabeth Butler age 23 gentlewoman of Bradmore daughter of John, gentleman, married Henry Arthur Cave age 27 editor, of Bishop Wearmouth, son of Thomas Cave manufacturer, at Bunny on 30.4.1867. 1871 Henry Arthur Cave age 31 newspaper proprietor born Birkenhead with wife Elizabeth age 27 born Ruddington plus 3 sons, governess and servants, and sister in law Sarah Maria Hosking at 8 Thornhill Crescent, Bishopwearmouth. 1881 Henry A Cave age 41 printer, newspaper editor born Cheshire, with wife

Elizabeth age 37, 5 sons, 21 daughter and sister in law Sarah M Hosking widow age 40 annuitant, at 17 The Green, Bishopwearmouth. No records until 1890, Henry Arthur Cave born 2.10.1839 died 15.1.1890 age 50 at Wanganui, Rangitikei, New Zealand, buried in Heads Road cemetery Wanganui. 13.9.1915 spouse Elizabeth Cave died, Wanganui, New Zealand.

BUTTERY

Isaac Buttery recorded in Constable's accounts 1780/1, 1/10 paid as expenses when they went to Chilwell about Isaac. Nov 1802 Constable incurred expense 13/- on a jury for Isaac.

George Buttery received payment from Constables in 1782 and 1783 for catching sparrows. (Payments usually made to children in early teens).

BUXTON

Mary Buxton of Bradmore married Joseph Priestley of Bunny, 2.5.1722, by licence at Kinoulton.

Joseph Buxton married Mary Priestly both of Bradmore at Bunny 15.2.1737. Possibly the Joseph who was paid by the Constable 1780 and 1781 as mole catcher. 1790 Joseph Buckstone received 1/- from the Constable when ill.

Ann Buxton daughter of Joseph and Mary, no parish specified, bapt. Bunny 17.1.1749.

Joseph Buxton paid land tax 9½d p.qtr. from 1780 to 1793. Note the Bunny estate survey has John recorded in 1792, so the '72 and '73 entries (abbreviated to Josh. and Jno.) may be in error. Joseph, cottager, buried at Bunny 10.6.1791. Possibly married Katharine, with son John born 1738 – see below.

John Buxton bapt. Bunny 8.11.1738, son of Joseph and Katharine of Bradmore. John Buxton married Ann Wittington at Bunny 26.5.1767, no parishes specified. Paid land tax at 9½d p.qtr. after Joseph Buxton, shown from 1793 but probably paid from 1791, through to 1795. In Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 5 acres 3 roods 14 perches paying £6/11/4 rent pa including 15/- for house, shop and outbuildings and 2/9 for orchard. Based on the Loughborough Rd., north of the Crown Inn. Buried Bunny 11.11.1795, cottager aged 57. Land tax liability passed on to Thomas Buxton.

Ann Buxton born c 1747, wife of John, buried Bunny 30.1.1794, died aged 47. Possibly nee Wittington, married John Buxton at Bunny 26.5.1767, no parishes specified.

Thomas Buxton bapt. Bunny 24.1.1768, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Probably Thomas Buxton who married Martha Howard, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.11.1794. Took over land tax 9½dp.qtr. from 1796 to end of land tax record 1832, from John Buxton. 1827 described as cottager. 1841 age 70, frameknitter, householder, married to Martha with son Thomas, Mary and grandchildren Ann, James, Thomas and Martha, living on the Loughborough Rd., north of the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1841/19). Buried at Bunny 16.3.1842 age 75.

Martha Buxton born 1771. Probably Martha Howard who married Thomas Buxton, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.11.1794. 1841 age 70, married to Thomas (1841/9). Martha Buxton buried Bunny 4.5.1852 age 82 may be this one, but not found at 1851 census.

Thomas Buxton bapt. at Bunny 30.4.1804, son of Thomas and Martha of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 17.1.1806.

Thomas Buxton, born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 21.8.1806, son of Thomas and Martha. 1836 signed Sunday School accounts (though this may have been his father?). 1841 age 35 frameknitter, in parents' house, probably married to Mary with children Ann, James, Thomas and Martha (Bradmore 1841/9). Served as Constable in 1848. 1851 age 44, framework knitter, householder, married to Mary with children James, Martha, Elizabeth, Mary, William, John and Thomas (Bradmore 1851/17). 1853 witnessed the will of Thomas Bosworth. 1861 age 54, merino shirt maker, married to Mary with children Elizabeth, John and Catherine. Living in the family house on Loughborough Rd., north of the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1861/4). On 1867 Bunny Estate rental with house, orchard, garden and land 1 acre, 3 roods, 29 perches in Bradmore, 3 acres, 2 roods, 6 perches in Bunny, annual rent of £15/6/1, the lands which traditionally went with this house. 1869 Morris's Directory, cottager. Referred to but deleted in agreement between Ann Bosworth, widow, and Harriett Forteach re lands at rent £15/6/2, all deleted. 1871 age 64, framework knitter, married to Mary (Bradmore 1871/9). 1881 age 74, widower, with daughter Catherine, her husband Henry John Cowen, and their son William Andrew (Bradmore 1881/6). Received a ton of coal from Bunny & Bradmore Charities Nov. 1885 and again Oct. 1886. Electoral roll with land & tenement, 1886 only. Son Thomas took over the land – see below. Buried Bunny 20.8.1889 age 83.

Mary Buxton born 1814, Breaston, Derbys. 1841 age 25, frameknitter, in the household of Thomas and Martha Buxton, probably married to Thomas junior (Bradmore 1841/9). 1851 age 37, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1851/17). 1861 age 47, shirtmaker, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1861/4). 1871 age 57, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/9). Buried Bunny 18.11.1880 age 67.

Ann Buxton bapt. Bunny 2.8.1833, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 8 in her grandparents' house (Bradmore 1841/9). Not found at 1851 census. Possibly the Ann Buxton who married William Hutchinson of Bradmore at Bunny 25.12.1855.

James Buxton bapt. Bunny 11.9.1834, son of Thomas, framework knitter and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 7 in his grandparents' house (Bradmore 1841/9). 1851 age 16, single, framework knitter, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 1853 -1859 signed Methodist Sunday School Accounts. 1861 age 26, grocer, baker, Wesleyan local preacher, married to Jane with daughter Martha Marshall Buxton age 3 mths, at 11 West St., Ruddington. 1868 James Buxton of Ruddington, baker, listed as trustee in Bradmore Methodist Church deeds. 1871 age 36, baker, married to Jane who was also described as baker, with children Martha, Samuel and Frederick, at Church St., Ruddington. 1881 James age 36, hosier, with wife Jane both born Bradmore, children Martha 20 cutter in hosiery warehouse, Frederick 13 scholar, Thomas 9 scholar, Elizabeth 2 all born Ruddington, at High St Ruddington. 1886-1896 trustee of Methodist Church, listed as farmer of Old Dalby in 1896. 1887 as trustee signed the Methodist Church's loan from Wesleyan Assurance Co for repairs after the collapse of the chapel ceiling. 1891 James Buxton age 56 farmer with wife Jane age 55, children Thomas age 19 joiner's apprentice, Elizabeth age 12 scholar, both born Ruddington, at Dalby on the Wolds. 1901 James age 66, retired farmer, with wife Jane and daughter Lizzie age 21 milliner's assistant at Church St., Ruddington. 1903 James Buxton of Ruddington, Gentleman, trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church. 1911 James age 76, retired farmer, with wife Jane age 75 (married 54 years (1857), 7 children, 2 dead), at Easthorpe St., Ruddington, 7-room house. Died 1912, Basford district.

Jane Buxton born c1836, Bradmore, (possibly nee Marshall?) married to James in 1857. 1861 age 25, shop assistant, married to James at 11 West St., Ruddington. 1871 age 35, baker, married to James at Church St., Ruddington. 1881 age 45, married to James, at High St, Ruddington. 1891 age 55 married to James, at Dalby on the Wolds. 1901 age 65, married to James at Church St Ruddington. 1911 age 75, married to James, at Easthorpe St Ruddington. Died April qtr 1912, Basford.

William Buxton bapt. Bunny 12.1.1836, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 5.3.1841 age 5.

Joseph Buxton bapt. Bunny 2.3.1837, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 15.3.1840 age 3.

Thomas Buxton bapt. Bunny 2.2.1839, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 3 in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1841/9). 1851 age 12, framework knitter, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 7.11.1859 Thomas Buxton married Jane Lane of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 22, framework knitter and cottager, married to Jane, at 1 Chapel St Ruddington. Thomas Buxton junior on the Bunny Estate rental of 1867 renting a house and garden at £2 pa., the main Buxton land still being attributed to his father. 1871 age 33, framework knitter, householder, married to Jane with children William, Annie, Thomas, Elizabeth and Mary, probably living at Steeple Cottage on MainSt. (Bradmore 1871/65). 20.8.1871 had his 5 children all baptised at Bunny. 1881 age 42, framework knitter, householder, married to Jane, living in Manor Farm cottages on Donkey Lane (Bradmore 1881/23). 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager. Rented grazing on Plumtree Lane 1886. 1891 age 51, framework knitter, householder, married to Jane with children Rebecca, Henry and Mabel now living in the family house on Loughborough Rd., north of the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1891/41). 1894 Whites Directory, cottager. 1895 Kellys Directory, cowkeeper. Electoral roll 1886 with house, as Thomas junior, then with land & tenement 1887-1911. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and land, 5 acres 1 rod 34 perches, paying £13/15/8 rent pa. 1901 age 62 widower, framework knitter working on own account at home, living alone in a 4-room house on Loughborough Turnpike. 1904 Kellys Directory, Thomas Buxton, cowkeeper. On the 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 5 acres 1 rood 34 perches paying £15/6/2 pa rent. 1911 age 72 widower, framework knitter hosiery, self-employed at home, married 53 years with 10 children, 3 dead; living with daughter Rebecca Jane Elliott and grand-daughter Marion Elliott age 3.

Jane Buxton born 1842 at Bradmore, nee Lane, married Thomas 7.11.1859 at Bunny. 1871 age 30, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/65). 1881 age 39, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1881/23). 1891 age 49 married to Thomas (Bradmore 1891/41). Died 1891, buried 5.5.1891.

William Lane Buxton, born 1862, Ruddington, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Jane. Bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871 with their other children. 1871 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/65). Married at Bunny 16.11.1880 age 19, framework knitter of Bradmore, son of Thomas, framework knitter, to Elizabeth Voce Barrow, age 20, daughter of John, gamekeeper, of Bradmore. 1881 age 19, householder, framework knitter married to Elizabeth, with William's

sisters Elizabeth and Jane and his brother Alfred, living in Manor Farm cottages (Bradmore 1881/22). 1891 age 29, in house with 3 rooms, married to Elizabeth, children Wilfred, Frank, Ralph and Alick (Bradmore 1891/28). Electoral roll with house, 1886-1895, then land & tenement 1896-1900. 1900 Bunny Estate rental has William with cottage and land, 5 acres, 3 roods, 19 perches, paying £12/13/- rent pa. 1892 rented grazing on Pendock Lane, and on the Ramper in 1896. Died April qtr 1900, Basford district. Wife Elizabeth referred to as Widow by Nov 1900, in Bunny & Bradmore charity minutes. Land passed to Elizabeth and Frank Buxton.

Elizabeth (Voce) Buxton born 1861 at Bradmore, nee Barrow, daughter of John, gamekeeper. Married at Bunny 16.11.1880 age 20, to William Lane Buxton son of Thomas, framework knitter. 1881 age 20, married to William (Bradmore 1881/22). 1891 age 30, married to William (Bradmore 1891/28). Nov 1900 Bunny & Bradmore Charities awarded a ton of coals to Widow Elizabeth Buxton. She had also written asking for the apprentice fee for her son Frank, but as there was nothing stated as to what the boy wished to be and his brother (Wilfrid) had the apprentice fee 2 years since, the Governors agreed that they would not consider the application at present. 1901 age 40, widow, farmer on her own account on Village Street (Main St) with children Wilfred, Frank, Ralph and Clarice M in a house with more than 4 rooms (Bradmore 29/1901). On electoral roll, land and tenement, no county vote, 1901; land & tenement, no parish vote, 1902-1910. Mrs Elizabeth Buxton on 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £14/1/- pa (no reference to acreage, but line below for Frank Buxton has £3 rental, likely to be just a cottage, against 5 acres 3 roods 19 perches). Gave up land at split-up of Bunny Estate 1911. 1911 age 50, widow (married 18 years with 4 children), living with Clarice May age 15, no occupation recorded, 5-room house (Bradmore 30/1911). On electoral roll with house, no parish vote, 1911-1914; living on Main St, qualified by occupation, 1920- 1930/1. Died March qtr 1931 Basford district.

Wilfred Buxton, bapt. Bunny 31.7.1881, son of William, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School 4th class 5.7.1885-June 1887, 3rd class July 1887-June 1889, 2nd class July 1889-June 1890, 1st class 2nd part July 1890-Dec.1892. 1891 age 9, scholar in parents' house (1891/28). Sunday School 1st class 1st part Jan-June 1893. Intermittent attendances 1st class July 1893-26.5.1895. Choir member 1894-1897. 1898 awarded £10 apprentice fee from Bunny & Bradmore Charities on production of indentures, paid to his father, 28.3.1898. 1901 age 19, single, blacksmith's apprentice, in mother's house (Bradmore 29/1901). 1904 April quarter, Wilfrid Buxton married Eliza Ann James, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1911 age 29, blacksmith, with wife Eliza Ann age 28 (married 6 years with 2 children), Phyllis May age 6 scholar born Mansfield Woodhouse and Winnie age 3 born Mansfield, and a boarder, at 54 Clumber St., Mansfield, 7-room house.

Elizabeth Buxton born 1883 Bradmore, nee James, daughter of William and Elizabeth. Married Wilfrid Buxton April qtr 1904, Basford district. 1911 age 28 married to William at Mansfield.

Percy John Buxton bapt. Bunny 3.12.1882, son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Not present at 1891 census.

Frank Buxton, bapt. Bunny 11.1.1885, son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School 4th class / Vestry Boys 21.10.1888-June 1891. 1891 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/28). Sunday School 3rd class July 1891-June 1893, 2nd class July 1893-Dec,1897, 1st class Jan.1898-May 1899. 1900 his mother applied for the apprentice fee for him from Bunny & Bradmore Charities, but no indication as to what he wanted to be so the application was not considered at that time; also his brother Wilfrid had the apprentice fee 2 years previously. 1901 age 16, teamster (horse worker) on farm, in mother's house (Bradmore 29/1901). Jan 1902 £10 paid to Mr Cripwell (blacksmith of Ruddington) for apprentice fee for Frank Buxton learning to be a wheelwright, and whose indentures had been seen by the Charity Governors. April qtr 1906 married Amy Burton, Basford district. July 1906 outgoing apprentice fee £2/10/- paid to F Buxton. 1908 Bunny Estate rental, Frank Buxton renting 5 acres 3 roods 19 perches at £3 pa rent, but this rent is more likely to be just a cottage, with acreage transposed from the line above re Elizabeth Buxton. On electoral roll, house, 1910-1914. 1911 age 26, householder, labourer / market gardener, with wife Amy age 24, born Keyworth 1887 (married 4 years (1907) with 3 children, 1 dead), daughter Muriel Ada age 3 born 1908 Bradmore, and Margaret Anne age 18 mths born Bradmore. Also boarder Thomas Coleman, age 53, widower, farm labourer born Husband's Bosworth Leics 1858. House with 3 rooms. Census form signed by Amy (Bradmore 36/1911).

Amy Buxton born c.1887 Keyworth, married Frank Buxton Apr qtr 1906. 1911 age 24 married to Frank (Bradmore 36/1911).

Muriel Ada Buxton born 1908 Bradmore, daughter of Frank and Amy. 1911 age 3 in parents'

house (Bradmore 36/1911).

Margaret Anne Buxton born 1909 Bradmore, daughter of Frank and Amy. 1911 age 18 mths in parents' house (Bradmore 36/1911).

Ralph Buxton, bapt. Bunny 25.1.1890, son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1891 age 2 in parents' house (1891/28). Methodist Sunday School Vestry Boys 30.10.1892-Dec,1894, sick 4 weeks of Dec.1894 and mid Feb.-end March 1895. 3rd class Jan.1895 – June 1898, 2nd class July 1898-Dec,1899, 1st class Jan 1899 – 22.3.1903. 1901 received Family Friend and The Adviser. 1901 age 12 in mother's house (Bradmore 29/1901).

Alick/Alec Buxton, born 1890, son of William and Elizabeth. 1891 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/28). Methodist Sunday School Vestry Boys 18.2.1894-June 1897, sick 25.11.1894-30.12.1894, 3rd class July 1897-Dec.1899, 2nd class Jan 1900-Apr.1901, sick 14.1.1900-18.2.1900 and from 17.3.1901. Last entry 14.4.1901, marginal note 'Dead'.

Clarice May Buxton born c1896 Bradmore, daughter of William and Elizabeth. 1901 age 5 in mother's house (Bradmore 29/1901). 1911 age 15 in mother's house (Bradmore 30/1911).

Flora (Florrie) Buxton, born 28.12.1897 Bradmore, bapt. 25.1.1897 Bradmore Methodist, daughter of William and Elizabeth. Died 1898 aged 1 month, buried 8.2.1898.

Annie Buxton, born 1865 at Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter and Jane. Bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871 with their other children. 1871 age 6, scholar in parents' house (1871/65). 1881 age 16, seamstress/machinist in the household of William Jackson at 108 Loughborough Rd., across the road from the Buxtons' family house (Bradmore 1881/7). Possibly the Annie age 25 at Burton Bandalls, Burton on the Wolds, 1891 married to Edwin Attenborough, farmer, son of William and Rebecca of Bradmore. See Attenborough.

Thomas Buxton, born 1867 at Bradmore, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Jane. Bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871 with their other children. 1871 age 4, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/65). 1881 age 14 in the household of William Jackson at 108 Loughborough Rd., across the road from the Buxtons' family house (Bradmore 1881/7). Could be the Thomas Buxton 1883 elected to the Bunny & Bradmore Charities apprentice fee on condition of being properly apprenticed. May 1883, his uncle Thomas applied to have his nephew apprenticed to Felix Jacques for 2 years, which was refused. 1891 Thomas Buxton age 24, single, framework knitter born Bradmore in house of John Henry Savage, 29, framework knitter born Ruddington and wife Elizbaeth nee Jackson, 26, born Bradmore, plus their daughter, at Derby Rd., Heanor. 1892 July qtr. Basford, Thoms Buxton married Harriet Brough, framework knitter born 1872 Heanor, daughter of Herbert, framework knitter and Maria of Heanor. 1901 Thomas age 39, framework knitter, with wife Harriett 29 and children Thomas 7, Walter 6, Evelyn 3 and Leonard 1 all born Heanor, at 162 Ray St., Heanor. 1911 Thomas age 45, framework knitter in silk factory working on own account, with wife Harriett 39, silk socks and shirts working in factory (married 18 years with 9 children) and children Thomas 17 miner underground loader, Walter 18 miner underground, Evelyn 13 hosiery factory mending shop, Leonard 11, Douglas 9, Horace 7, Doris 5 scholars, Wilfred 3, Bernard 1, all born Heanor, at 55 Thorpes Rd., Heanor, 5-room house.

Elizabeth Buxton born 1869, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Jane. Bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871 with their other children. 1871 age 2, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/65). 1881 age 12, scholar, in the house of brother William Buxton at Manor Farm Cottages, Donkey Lane (Bradmore 1881/22). 1886 Miss E Buxton Sunday School teacher. Oct qtr 1886 Basford district, Elizabeth Buxton married Edward Cope. See under Cope.

Mary Buxton born 1870, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter and Jane. Bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871 with their other children. 1871 age 11 months in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/65). Methodist Sunday School teacher 1886, 1 week for 2nd class July 1887, and occasionally for 3rd class Jan-June 1889. 1881 age 10 scholar born Bradmore in house of aunt Mary nee Buxton (b.1845 daughter of Thomas, cottager and Mary) and her husband Richard Hamer, joiner, at 97 Hey Brow, Tonge.

Catherine Buxton bapt. Bunny 20.10.1872, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Jane of Bradmore, buried Bunny 5.4.1881 age 8.

Alfred Buxton, born 1874 at Bradmore, brother of William Buxton, so son of Thomas and Jane. 1881 age 7, scholar, in his brother William's house (Bradmore 1881/22). Note Alfred son of Thomas and Jane bapt. Bunny 1882 – may be a late baptism, or a second Alfred. Methodist Sunday School intermittent attendances 1st class July 1885-April 1888. 1891 Alfred Buxton 18 gen.lab. born Bradmore lodging with aunt Elizabeth Taylor, born Bradmore (daughter of Thomas and Mary) and her husband James, at Stockton-on-Tees, Durham.

Rebecca Jane Buxton (Jane), born 1877 at Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter and Jane of Bradmore. 1881 age 4, in her brother William's house (Bradmore 1881/22). Bapt.

Bunny 11.1.1885, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter and Jane of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School 3rd class 5.7.1885-June 1886, 2nd class July 1886-June 1887, 1st class 2nd part July-Dec 1887, intermittently Jan-Dec 1888. 1st class intermittently April 1898-Oct.1890, noted left 25.1.1891. Had hymn books and Sunday School task book 1885-7 as Jane. 1891 age 15, single, stocking seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/41). 1894 as Jane, in Methodist choir. 1898 Apr qtr, Nottingham, Rebecca Jane Buxton married Owen Elliott. See Elliott.

Henry Buxton, born 1879, Bradmore, son of Thomas and Jane. 1881 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/23). Probably the Henry son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Jane bapt. 14.2.1886 at Bunny. Methodist Sunday School 3rd class July 1885-June 1888, 2nd class July 1888-Dec.1889, 1st class 2nd part Jan-Dec.1890, catechism, intermittent attendances 1st class 2nd part Jan.1891-June 1892. 1891 age 13, stocking seamer in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/41). Left Sunday School on moving to 1st class 1st part 10.7.1892.

Mable Buxton, born 1881, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas and Jane. 1891 age 10, scholar in parents' house (1891/41).

Martha Buxton daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 13.10.1840. 1841 age 8 months in grandparents Thomas and Martha's house (Bradmore 1841/9). 1851 age 10, scholar, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 23.12.1860, still a minor, married Daniel Barnes, framework knitter of Ruddington, at Bunny. See Barnes.

Elizabeth Buxton, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, stockinger, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 12.3.1843. 1851 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 1861 age 18, seamstress in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/4). Elizabeth daughter of Thomas framework knitter married James Taylor labourer of Bradmore 6.10.1863. See Taylor.

Mary Buxton daughter of Thomas, cottager, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 8.4.1845. 1851 age 4 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 4.1.1875 Mary Buxton daughter of Thomas, farmer, then of Bradmore, age 28, married Richard Hamer, age 24, joiner of Astley Bridge Bolton, son of Richard tailor, at Bunny. See Hamer.

William Buxton son of Thomas, cottager, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 3.2. 1847. 1851 age 4, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 1861 age 13, groom in the household of Edward G and Mary A James (Bradmore 1861/22). 1871 William age 24 coalminer born Bradmore with wife Mary 20, housewife, born Heanor and son Edward 11 mths born Pentrich, at Waingroves, Pentrich.

John Buxton son of Thomas, cottager, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 6.3.1849. 1851 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/17). 1861 age 12, worsted winder in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/4). Not found 1871. 1881 age 33 framework knitter, with wife Sarah 33 born Ruddington 1848/9 and children Joseph 8, Thomas 5, scholars, Edith Mary 2 and John Henry 5 mths all born Ruddington, on Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1891 John age 42 coal miner with wife Sarah 42 and children Thomas 15 coal miner, Edith 12, Henry 10 scholars, Albert 2 all born Ruddington, at Dark St., Heanor. 1901 John age 52 coal miner hewer with wife Sarah 52 and children Charles 17 bricklayer, Albert 12, at Midland Road, Heanor. 1911 John age 63 coalminer hewer with wife Sarah 63 (married 40 years (1871) with 10 children, 3 died), and children Albert 22, single, coal miner loader and Florence 20, single, dressmaker on own account working at home, born Heanor, at 8 Midland Road Heanor, 5-room house.

Catherine Buxton daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 15.12.1851. 1861 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/4). 1874 Oct qtr Catherine Buxton married Henry John Cowen, Hartlepool district. 1881 with husband Henry John Cowen and son William Andrew, in father's house (1881/6). See Cowen.

Martha Buxton daughter of Thomas and Martha of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 4.3.1809.

Catherine Buxton daughter of Thomas and Martha of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 10.12.1811.

Ann Buxton daughter of Thomas and Martha of Bradmore buried Bunny 3.6. 1805.

Joseph Buxton son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Martha of Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 27.4.1814.

John Buxton son of John and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 18.2.1770. Received payment from Constable in 1780 for catching sparrows.

Joseph Buxton son of John and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 8.1.1773. May be the Joseph paid by the Constable in 1784 and 1789 for catching sparrows.

William Buxton son of John and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 11.1.1776. Possibly the William who was paid by the Constable in 1791, 1793 and 1795 for catching sparrows.

Catherine Buxton daughter of John and Ann, bapt. Bunny 5.2.1784, buried at Bunny 18.11.1787 aged 4(?).

Ann Buxton daughter of John, cottager, and Ann of Bradmore, born 24.12.1787, bapt. Bunny 1.1.1788.

William Buxton of Bradmore married Elizabeth Whitby of Wymeswold, 1804. Possibly William son of John and Ann born 1776?

Mary Buxton born 30.7.1797 Bradmore, daughter of John, framework knitter, and Ann, bapt. Bunny 14.8.1797.

John Buxton bapt. Bunny 8.11.1738, son of Joseph and Katharine of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 11.10.1795, cottager, aged 57.

Thomas Buxton of Bradmore buried at Bunny 14.2.1807.

Thomas Buxton born 1771. 1841 age 70, frameknitter, householder, married to Martha. Household includes Thomas, Mary, grandchildren Ann, James, Thomas, Martha (1841/9). Probably Thomas Buxton who married Martha Howard, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.11.1794. Possibly Thomas buried at Bunny 16.3.1842, age 75 in parish register, so would be born c1767, but not necessarily any more accurate than date in 1841 census. Possible link with Thomas bapt. 1768, son of John and Ann, but not proved.

Joseph Buxton has a named brick at the SW corner of the chapel wall, dated Sept 1830, put in as the chapel was being built.

John Buxton born 1821, Bunny. In Bradmore by 1860. First son Henry born in Bradmore 1847, but later children born in Keyworth 1849-57. First marriage to Emma, second to Charlotte. John Buxton married Emma Jacques daughter of Samuel and Catherine of Bradmore 9.8.1846, Bunny. 1851 John Buxton age 30, joiner, born Bunny with wife Emma age 26 born Bradmore, children Henry age 4, Mary age 1 mth born Keyworth, at Keyworth. 1861 age 40, tailor, married to Charlotte, children William, Henry, Mary, Kate, Emma, Fanny and Sarah, at (Bradmore 1861/31). 1867 on Bunny Estate rental renting a house and garden at £4 pa. 1871 age 50, tailor, married to Charlotte, children Emma, Fanny, Sarah, John, Thomas and Ann (Bradmore 1871/41). Buried Bunny 10.8.1875 age 54.

Emma Buxton born 1825 Bradmore, nee Jacques daughter of Samuel and Catherine of Bradmore. Married John Buxton 9.8.1846, Bunny (first wife). 1851 age 26 married to John.

Charlotte Buxton born 1834, Keyworth, married John Buxton (second wife). 1861 age 27 (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 age 30, married to John (Bradmore 1871/41). Buried Bunny 5.2. 1873 age 38.

Henry Buxton son of John, tailor, and Emma of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 30.9.1846. 1851 age 4 in parents' house. 1861 age 14, scholar in John & Charlotte's house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 Henry Buxton age 24 born Bradmore, carpenter, lodger at 3 Major St, Sherwood. Henry, joiner of St Mary's Nottingham, son of John, tailor, married Eliza Attewell, daughter of William framework knitter, at Bunny 19.10.1872. 1881 Henry age 34, joiner and builder employing 35 men and 3 boys, with wife Eliza age 35, both born Bradmore, and children Arthur 8, Ernest 6, scholars, and Florence A 2 all born Nottingham. Also sister Fanny age 24 single, born Keyworth, and brother John age 17, joiner born Bradmore, and a servant, at 20 Tennyson St, Sherwood Nottingham. 1891 Henry age 44 joiner and builder with wife Eliza age 45, children Arthur Henry 18 joiner's apprentice, Ernest 15 scholar and Florence Ann 14 scholar all born Nottingham, and a servant, at Belle Vue House, West Bridgford. 1901 Henry age 54 builder, employer, with wife Eliza age 55 and children Ernest 25 ironmonger, Florence A 22, both born Nottingham, and a servant, at 30 Bridgford Road, West Bridgford. 1911 Henry age 64 builder, employer, with wife Eliza age 65 (married 39 years with 3 children), with a servant at Melton Road, West Bridgford, 9-room house.

Eliza Buxton nee Attewell, daughter of William, framework knitter, married Henry Buxton 19.10.1872 at Bunny. 1881 age 35 married to Henry. 1891 age 45, married to Henry. 1901 age 55 married to Henry. 1911 age 65 married to Henry.

William Buxton born 1849, Keyworth, son of John and Emma. 1861 age 12, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 age 22 labourer born Keyworth, lodger in house of Joseph Buxton age 46 carpenter born Bunny with his wife Mary age 48 and children Henry 19 labourer, William 8 and Ann 4 all born Cotmanhay, living at Beggarlee Bottom, Greasley. 1881 William age 33 coal miner with wife Hannah age 35 dressmaker born Greasley, son William Clifford age 11 scholar born Radford, and Buxton children Ellen 5, John H 1 and Arthur 2 mths all born Eastwood. 1891 William age 42, coal labourer, with wife Hannah age 44 dressmaker born Beauvale, children Helen 15 born Eastwood, John H 11, Arthur 10, Fanny 5 scholars all born Eastwood, and a boarder, at Albert St, Eastwood. 1901 William age 52, colliery banksman born Bunny, with wife Hannah age 54, Ellen 26 boot shop asst, Fanny 16 pupil teacher, at 1 Albert St., Eastwood. 1911 William age 62, colliery labourer born Bunny, with wife Hannah age 64, born Greasley (married 36 years with 6 children, 2 dead), with children Ellen 35 single, shop asst boot and shoe shop; Fanny 25, single, teacher, elementary, council school, at Albert St., Eastwood 6-room house. Marriage c1875, not found.

Mary Buxton born 1851, Keyworth, daughter of John and Emma. 1851 age 1 mth in parents' house. 1861 age 10, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/31).

Kate Buxton born 1853, Keyworth, daughter of John and Emma? 1861 age 9, scholar in parents'

house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 Kate Buxton age 19, domestic servant born Keyworth in house of Sarah A Watts, widow, age 35, Lady, born Nuthall and her daughter, at 53 Park Row, Nottingham Park.

Emma Buxton born 1855, Keyworth, daughter of John and Charlotte. 1861 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 age 16 in parents' house (1871/41).

Fanny Buxton born 1857, Keyworth, daughter of John and Charlotte. 1861 age 4, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 age 14, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/41). 1881 age 24, single, in brother Henry's house at 20 Tennyson St, Sherwood.

Ann Buxton daughter of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 13.2. 1866, buried 15 Feb, infant.

Sarah Buxton daughter of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 19.9.1859. 1861 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/31). 1871 age 11, scholar in parents' house (1871/41).

John Buxton son of John, tailor and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 15.12.1863. 1871 age 7, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/41). 1881 age 17, joiner, in brother Henry's house at 20 Tennyson St., Sherwood.

Thomas Buxton son of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 7.2. 1869. 1871 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/41). 1881 age 13 scholar in house of uncle Thomas Buxton 63 cottager with 12 acres born Bunny 1818 and aunt Mary 45 born Coleorton, at Bunny. 1891 Thomas age 23, gardener, in house of uncle Thomas 73 cottager and aunt Mary 56, at Bunny. 1897 Jan.qtr. Thomas Buxton married Alice Davis, daughter of Thomas and Ann of Long Eaton, Shardlow district. 1901 Thomas Buxton age 32, domestic gardener, employed, born Bradmore with wife Alice age 24 born Wigston, Leics, and son Thomas 10 mths born Bunny, at Village St., Bunny. 1901 John Davis Buxton son of Thomas and Alice age 2 born Bunny in house of grandparents Thomas Davis age 50 railway shunter born Herefs and Ann age 48 born Bedfordshire, at 1 St James Terrace. 1911 age 40 domestic gardener born Bradmore with wife Alice age 33 (married 14 years (1897) with 3 children), John Davis Buxton 12, Thomas Arthur 10, William 7 scholars born Bunny, living at 8 Cross St., Long Eaton.

Ann Buxton daughter of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 4.9.1870. 1871 age 10 months in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/41). Buried Bunny 25.8.1875 age 5.

Joseph Buxton son of John, tailor and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 20.10.1872.

John Buxton son of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 20.10.1872.

Percy John Buxton son of John, tailor, and Charlotte of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 26.2.1882, buried Bunny 27.10.1885 age 3.

Ann Buxton daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 9.12.1864.

Joseph Buxton, born 1873, Bradmore, nephew of William and Ann Bosworth. 1881 age 8, scholar, in the household of William Bosworth (Bradmore 1881/46). Possible - tenuous- link with Jane Buxton born c1842 married to John Buxton and Jane Bosworth born 1843 daughter of Enoch and Lucy, but relationship of Jane to William and Ann Bosworth not established, appear to be separate branches of the Bosworths.

Ernest Buxton son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 14.2. 1886. Buried Bunny 6.3.1887 age 15 months.
