John Egliston, servant of Mr Nixon of Bradmore, 11.4.1621, presented for not receiving communion last Easter.

Sarah IGGLESTON married Edward Clemens both of Bradmore at Bunny 22.8.1802.

Elizabeth Egglestone married Thomas Carrington, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.6.1804, banns read on 10th, 17th and 24th June.

Sarah Eggleston born Keyworth 1792. 1871 Sarah widow age 79, mother of Ann married to William Henson of Bradmore, in William's house at Bunny Lane Keyworth.

Ann Egglestone born 1847 Keyworth, daughter of Sarah, married William Henson of Bradmore 1865. See Henson.

Ethel Eggleston born 1883 Bradmore, nee Hickling, daughter of Joseph and Ada of Bradmore, married Edward White Eggleston (born 1881, Keyworth) Oct.qtr. 1904, Nottingham. 1911 Edward age 30, farmer on own account, with wife Ethel age 29 (married 6 years, 1 child plus 1 before wedlock), with children Stanley 8, Dorothy 6, at Selby Lane, Keyworth, 5-room house.

Stanley Egglestone born 1903 Bradmore, son of Edward and Ethel. 1911 age 8 in parents' house.

ELLIOTT

Isabel Elliott married Robert Martin of Bunny at Bunny 14.9.1612.

William Elliott born c1772, buried Bunny 30.5.1813 age 41. Dec.1800, had a strike of barley from the Bradmore Constable, and William Oliver had 7/6 for repairing William Hellott's chimney plus 1/- for lime. 12.1.1801 William Helliot had 8 yards of cloth for sheets at 1/2 per yard, total 9/4. 11.11.1801 Constable bought William Helliot a blanket 7/-. Jan.1802 Constable paid William Heliot his expenses £2/5/-, no details, and also 3 weeks pay 7/6, i.e. 2/6 p.wk. Jan.1803 the Constable paid for midwife for Lady Elliott, 5/-, and 2/6 for fetching and carrying her back. Also a ton of coals for Mr Elliott and 3/6 cash. 14.1.1804 William was paid £1/1/- towards rat-catching for the year, and Jan.1807 another £1/11/6 for rat-catching. 1807 William paid the Constable 6/2 for 200 bricks. Jan.1812 William had 5/6 from the Constable for doctor's medicine, and 11/- later the same month. He had 8/- p.wk., increasing to 9/- in Jan.1813. March 1813 he had rum 1/6, sugar and honey 1/6½d, and a pint of gin 2/-, and in May had 15/- p.wk., followed by 2 weeks' payments to Mary Elliott. 12.7.1813 the Constable paid £1/4/- towards his funeral expenses.

Mary Elliott married to William, 1813 had 15/- p.wk. from Constable. Oct.1813 Constable paid £2 for clothing for Elliotts. Nov.1813 the Constable paid for a frock for Elliott's boy, not clear which one, and for repairs to the house, £1/1/- for stubble, 4/- for thatch and 10/6 to Attewell and 7/6 to William Cumberland, helping, for 3 days work on thatching, also reeds, 7/6. Dec.1813 Mary Chamberlain was paid for doing washing for Elliott's boy, and he had stockings 2/-, shirts 6/8 and a frock. Jan.1814 Mary had 9 yards of cotton at 10/6, and an apron 3/-. In 1814 she received 13/- p.wk., and the Constable paid 18/- for house repairs done by John Oliver. March 1814 Mr Goodacre paid the Constable £9/15/- for Elliott's horse and cart.

William Elliot born 20.2.1801 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 23.2.1801, son of William and Mary. 15.3.1802 William Elliott senior had 10/6 towards the burial of his child, possibly this one.

Violet Elliott born c1801, buried Bunny 9.10.1817 age 16. Possibly daughter of William and Mary.

Edward Elliott bapt. Bunny 20.12.1804, son of William and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 26.7.1845 age 41. Possibly the Edward Elliott who married Mary Youse? both of Bradmore 28.11.1825, witnessed by Henry Dalby. 1841 age 35, agricultural labourer, householder, with (second) wife Catherine age 26, children Violet and Joseph. Location not clear, somewhere in the Farmer St./Main Rd. junction area (Bradmore 1841/14).

Mary Elliott born c1807, nee Youse?, married to Edward 28.11.1825. Buried Bunny 28.7.1839 age 32.

Violet Elliott born c1826, bapt. 5.3.1828, daughter of Edward, labourer, and Mary Elliott. 1841 age 15, in Edward Elliott's house (Bradmore 1841/14). Married at Bunny 22.1.1849 to James Phipps of Stanford. 1851 Violet age 23 married to James Phipps age 24 born Sutton Bonnington, farm labourer, with son John 1 born Sutton Bonnington, at St Michaels Sutton Bonnington. Violet Phipps died Jan.qtr. 1854, Basford district.

Joseph Elliott born c.1831, son of Edward and Mary. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/14).

Catherine Elliott born c.1815, second wife of Edward. 1841 age 26, in the household of Edward Elliott near Farmer St./Main St. junction, (Bradmore 1841/14).

Richard Elliott bapt. Bunny 9.3.1807, son of William and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the Richard Elliott of Bradmore who married Ann Cumberland of East Leake at East Leake 25.11.1830. 1841 age 36, agricultural labourer in the household of Benjamin Bosworth (who married a Mary Elliott, relationship to Richard not clear) on Far St. (Bradmore 1841/62).

Mary Elliott born c.1833, 1841 age 8 in the household of Benjamin Bosworth (Bradmore 1841/62). Possibly a daughter of Richard and Ann, as Ann is no longer in the records by 1841.

Joseph Elliott bapt. Bunny 10.4.1809, son of William and Mary of Bradmore. Married Ann Jacques of Bradmore at Bunny 27.11.1837. 1841 age 30 agricultural labourer, householder, married to Ann with children William and George, living at Town End (Bradmore 1841/50). 1851 age 42, agricultural labourer, married to Ann with children William, George, Alice and Catherine at Wilford Lane, Ruddington.

Ann Elliott born c1811 (on census ages) nee Jacques; note Ann daughter of Sam and Catherine Jacques bapt.1804 looks too early? Ann Jacques married Joseph Elliott at Bunny 27.11.1837. 1841 age 30, married to Joseph (Bradmore 1841/50). 1851 age 42, seamer, married to Joseph, at Ruddington.

William Elliott, bapt. 5.8.1839, son of Joseph labourer and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/50). 1851 age 11, winder, in parents' house at Ruddington.

George Elliott bapt. Bunny 14.2.1841, son of Joseph labourer and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 4 mths in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/50). 1851 age 9, winder, in parents' house at Ruddington.

Alice Elliott bapt. 12.12.1842 daughter of Joseph labourer and Ann. 1851 age 8, seamer in parents' house, Ruddington.

Catherine Elliott bapt. Bunny 7.8.1845 daughter of Joseph, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 age 5, scholar in parents' house at Ruddington.

John Elliott, bapt. Bunny 27.3.1811 son of William and Mary Elliott of Bradmore. Possibly the John Elliott who married Mary Bishop at Barton in Fabis 22.10.1832. 1841 age 30, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary with children John, Thomas and Richard, on Main St. (Bradmore 1841/27). Possibly the John buried Bunny 9.9.1844 age 36.

Mary Elliott born c1811/2, Basford. Possibly Mary Bishop who married John Elliott at Barton in Fabis 22.10.1832. 1841 age 30, married to John (Bradmore 1841/27). 1851 age 39, widow, seamer, householder with children John and Richard (Bradmore 1851/23). 1854 Jan.qtr. married William Whittaker, Basford district - see under Whittaker.

John Elliott, born Bradmore, bapt. 26.3.1833, son of John and Mary (who later married William Whittaker). 1841 age 8 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/27). 1851 age 18, single, framework knitter, in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/23). 1859/60 J Elliott signed the Sunday School accounts. 1861 age 28, single, miller journeyman, in the household of John Treece the miller at Town End, working at the Far St. mill (Bradmore 1861/29). 24.3.1863 at Bunny John Elliott miller of Bradmore married Sarah Treece of Bradmore, daughter of John Treece the miller. 1867 Sarah died, John Hutchinson took over the mill. 1867 Bunny Estate rental shows John Elliott renting house and garden for £4 pa, though since the rental is usually slightly out of date this probably reflects the situation before Sarah's death. 1871 age 38, householder, framework knitter, married to Ann nee Whittaker, with son John, living at Mill Cottage (Bradmore 1871/37). 1876 PO Directory, miller and shopkeeper. On electoral roll 1878-1885 in the category £12+ rent pa. 1881 age 48, married to Ann. Farmer of 9½ acres, living on Farmer St. near Rancliffe Farm, 2 cottages, with children Elizabeth, George, William and Thomas and niece Mary Ann Morris, also lodger William Marriott and his wife Sarah Augusta (Bradmore 1881/68). 1881 Kellys Directory, shopkeeper. 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager and shopkeeper. Electoral roll with land & tenement 1886-1907, then house 1908-1909. 1888 Kellys Directory, shopkeeper and miller (corn). This is last known reference to John as miller, and he was the last miller at the mill at the top of Far St. Ron Draycott (grandson) has recollection of his mother mentioning Elliott's mill somewhere along the road to Ruddington – was this the 3rd mill? 1890 and the years around, Sunday School accounts entries for Elliott's and Mrs Elliot's bills in connection with anniversary. 1891 age 58, agricultural cottager married to Ann, children John, Elizabeth, George and Sarah, living at the top end of Main St., possibly Home Farm (Bradmore 1891/8). 1894 Whites Directory, cottager and shopkeeper. 1895 Kellys Directory, shopkeeper. 1895 had a ton of coals from the Charities. 1900 Bunny Estate Rental has John Elliott with cottage and land, 9 acres 2 rods 8 perches, paying £25/6/0 rent pa. 1901 age 69 farmer, grocer working on own account, married to Ann with children Thomas and Sarah A in a house of more than 4 rooms on Village (Main) St (Bradmore 25/1901). 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £3 pa rent; his acreage seems to have passed to L S Hutchinson. Per photograph formerly in possession of Sarah Ann Elliott / Draycott, now lost, he was a tall, well-built man. Photographed leaning against a studio table on which is laid his typically Victorian stove-pipe top hat. Sarah Ann remembered the

corners of his eyes were often filled with flour dust from the mill. His working hours were irregular, depending on the wind. On his death bed he asked for a drink of water from his favourite well (Source: Ron Draycott). 1908 Bunny & Bradmore charities granted 1/- p.wk. dole to John Elliott of Bradmore. Buried at Bunny 17.8.1908, aged 75 buried north side of Bunny churchyard with Ann, 'Until the day break and the shadows flee away'.

Sarah Elliott born 18.5.1838 nee Treece, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore. Married John Elliott 24.3.1863 at Bunny. Buried Bunny 23.9.1867 age 29.

John Elliott, bapt. Bunny 30.4.1865, son of John framework knitter and Sarah of Bradmore. 1871 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/37). 1881 age 16, agricultural labourer, on Main St. in the household of William Whittaker, who married John's grandmother Mary after her husband John died (Bradmore 1881/59). 1889 probably the John Elliott junior of Bradmore who was rheumatic and was recommended by his medical attendant to go to Devonshire Hospital at Buxton. A recommendation for 3 or 6 weeks was bought by Bunny & Bradmore Charities for him. 1891 age 26, in his father's house (Bradmore 1891/8). 1892 £2 donation granted by the Charities to John Elliott on account of illness. 1893 and 1894 received £2 each year from the Charities, in 1894 specifying John Elliott Junior. 1901 age 36, single, crippled with rheumatism, living with (step-) grandfather William Whittaker age 80 (Bradmore 38/1901). Died Oct.qtr. 1901, Basford district.

Ann Elliott, born c1848, Clifton, daughter of William and Mary Whittaker. 1871 age 22, married to John (Bradmore 1871/37). 1881 age 30, married to John (Bradmore 1881/68). 1891 age 41 married to John (Bradmore 1891/8). 1901 Ann Elliott age 53 married to John (Bradmore 25/1901). Remembered by grandson Ron Draycott as tall, well-built, as were all her children. In her widowhood she lived in Bunny almshouses. She was scared of thunderstorms and Ron aged 5 was sent to sleep with her during them. Remembered as a forbidding character. Was photographed standing outside her shop at Bradmore – photograph now lost. 1911 age 62, wife (should be widow) (married 40 years (1871) with 5 children), 4-room house (Bradmore 38/1911). On electoral roll, house, no parish vote, 1910-spring 1921 in Main St. Died 25.8.1930 age 82, buried north side of Bunny churchyard with John, 'Life's work well done / Life's race well run / Then cometh rest.'

Elizabeth Elliott, born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 20.8.1871, daughter of John labourer and Ann. 1881 age 10, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/68). Methodist Sunday School teacher from 1885, 2nd class girls Jan-Jun.1887, 1st class girls 2nd part Jan.1888-June 890 and listed Jan.1894-Sept.1895. 1891 age 20, single, dressmaker in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/8). Lizzie Elliott remembered by Ron Draycott as domineering. Married 10.6.1895 aged 24 to Charles Frederick Hutchinson, 23, farmer of Bradmore. Elizabeth's father described as farmer on the marriage entry. See Hutchinson.

George Elliott, born Bradmore, bapt. 20.10.1872, son of John framework knitter and Ann. 1881 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/68). Methodist Sunday school scholar 1st class 1885-June 1887, left. Teacher 2nd class (replacing William Randall) Jan.1889-June 1890. 1891 age 18, single, engine cleaner in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/8). Also recorded 1891 George Elliott age 18 railway engine cleaner born Bradmore as lodger with William Widdowson railway goods clerk at Curzon St., Carlton. Married 26.1.1897, as fireman (cottager crossed out) aged 24, son of John, cottager, to Constance Emma Ellen (Cissie) Wells, 24, of Bradmore, daughter of Edwin Joseph Wells, shoemaker and Louisa daughter of Thomas Grundy (deceased, 1874), witnesses George Grundy and Leticia Annie Wells. 1901 age 28, railway engine stoker born Bradmore with wife Constance age 28 born Barrowby Lincs, and son Rex 6 born Nottingham (1895, son of Constance) at 42 Bourne St., Netherfield. 1911 age 38 railway engine driver born Bradmore with wife Constance age 38 born Barrowby (married 14 years (1897), 2 children), with Rex 14 born Nottingham, Albert George 7 and Constance Anne (Connie) 2 both born Netherfield, at 37 Victoria Rd., Netherfield, 5-room house. Remembered by Ron Draycott as a jovial giant, living at Gedling.

William Elliott, born c1875, Bradmore, son of John and Ann. 1881 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/68). Methodist Sunday school scholar 1st class 1885-June 1889, left. Teacher 1891. 1891 age 16, farm servant, in the household of William Smeeton, Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1891/50). July qtr. 1900 married Eliza Jackson daughter of William, ag.lab., and Louisa of Blackhead Farm, 11 Bagnall Rd., Basford, Nottingham. 1901 age 25, railway engine fireman married to Eliza age 22 born Basford, no children, living at 44 Bourne St., Netherfield, next door to George and Cissie. 1911 age 35 railway engine fireman with wife Eliza age 31 born Old Basford (married 10 years (1901) with 2 children), and Doris Lilian 8 and Marie Louise 7, scholars born Netherfield, at 44 Bourne St, Netherfield, 5-room house. Remembered by Ron Draycott as farming at Rancliffe Farm with wife Eliza and daughters Doris and Louise, all lively and vivacious. Ended up in rooms at Ruddington with Louise who was sick. William Elliott of Rancliffe Farm, married to Eliza, on electoral roll from autumn 1921-1931/2. 1922 Kellys Directory, farmer, also in 1928.

William Elliott died March 1957, Basford district.

Eliza Elliott, nee Jackson, born Basford, married William Jul.qtr. 1900. 1901 age 22 married to William. 1911 age 31, married 10 years with 2 children.

Thomas (Tom) Elliott bapt. 12.8.1877, son of John cottager and Ann. 1881 age 3, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/68). Methodist Sunday school scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-16.6.1887, 1st class Jul-Dec.1887, 1st class 2nd part Jan.1888-Jun.1889, 1st class July 1889-March 1891, 1st class 1st part intermittently 15.3.1891-26.7.1891, left. 1891 age 13, single, farm servant in the household of William Baggaley Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1891/51). 1901 age 23, single, farmer's son living with parents (Bradmore 25/1901). 1906 Oct.qtr. Newark district, Thomas Elliott married Gertrude Hoe grand-daughter of George Hoe, painter and decorator of North Collingham. 1911 age 35 born Bradmore, coal miner hewer, with wife Gertrude age 36 born Collingham, married 4 years, no children, at 1 Little Debdale Lane, Mansfield 5-room house. Remembered by nephew Ron Draycott as genial, police constable, married to Gertrude Hoe with sons Tom and Frank. Involved in a breach of discipline, refused to apologise and became a miner at Mansfield.

Sarah Ann Elliott, born 3.8.1882 Bradmore, bapt. 10.10.1882, daughter of John cottager and Ann. 1891 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/8). Methodist Sunday school scholar 4th class 8.8.1886-Jan.1889, 3rd class Jan.1889-June 1890, 2nd class July 1890-Dec.1894, 1st class Jan.1895-Mary 1896, July 1896-24.4.1898, returned thanks. 1894 in the choir. Teacher/officer Apr.1898-Jun.1905. 1901 age 18, single, living with parents (Bradmore 25/1901). Salvation Army girl. Jul.qtr.1910 married Joseph Draycott, Basford district. See Draycott..

Thomas Elliott born 1835, bapt. 1.5.1835 (Elliott), son of John labourer and Mary. 1841 age 6 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/27). 1851 age 16, farm servant in the household of William and Sarah Cliff, farmer with 145 acres at Gotham. 1861 Thomas age 25 widower, coal miner born Bradmore, boarder with John Hobson, cordwainer, at West Hallam Common. Tom Elliott died Jan.1875, Basford district.

Ann Elliott bapt. 17.9.1837 daughter of John labourer and Mary Elliott, buried 19.5.1839 age 1 year 8 months.

Richard Elliott bapt. Bunny 16.2.1840, son of John labourer and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/27). 1851 age 11, scholar, in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/23). 1861 age 21, single, cotton stocking maker in the household of William Whittaker, stepfather, on Main St. (Bradmore 1861/67). 1869 Jul.qtr. Richard Elliott married Mary Isabella Gabbutt born Nantwich Cheshire, daughter of James, Inland Revenue Officer, and Maria of Bentygrange, Waterfall, Staffs.1871 Richard age 31, railway goods guard born Bradmore, with wife Mary age 26 born Nantwich, Cheshire and daughter Mary 11 mths born Derby, at 20 Oxford St., Litchurch Derby.

Eliza Elliott born c1842, buried 3.4.1850 age 8, possibly daughter of John and Mary.

William Elliott bapt. Bunny 2.7.1844, son of John, labourer, and Mary, buried 5.6.1845 age 11 mths.

Elizabeth Whittaker Elliott bapt. Bunny 18.8.1849, illegitimate daughter of Mary Elliott of Bradmore, buried Bunny 23.7.1850 age 1 year. Possibly a daughter of Mary, widow of John, after John's death in 1844 and before her marriage to William Whittaker in 1854.

Mary Elliot bapt. Bunny 29.4.1813 daughter of William, potter, and Mary of Bradmore.

Mary Elliott born c1799, Plymouth, Devon. In Bradmore 1815 when married Benjamin Bosworth of Bradmore 2.7.1815.

Mary Elliott married Richard Bates of Barton, 4.1.1834.

Esther Elliott born c1815, buried Bunny 18.5.1842 age 17.

Elizabeth Elliott born c1831, Arnold. 1851 age 20, single, house servant in the household of Elizabeth Goodacre of Blackcliffe Farm (Bradmore 1851/27). Possibly the Elizabeth who married Richard Harwood though not recorded born Arnold in later censuses - see Harwood.

Edward Elliot born c1832 buried Bunny 22.5.1849 age 17. Possibly the Edward Elliott in the Constables Accounts 1845, expenses of 3 witnesses examined about his settlement, 4/9, and 3/- for journeys, followed by 3/- expenses for his examination and 8/6 for a journey for fetching him. Sam Bennet's expenses 4/6, John Barker's 3/-, and in 1846 Ann Holland's expenses for a journey to Nottingham to be examined about Edward's settlement, 1/6. Possibly father of John bapt.1844, see below

Martha Elliott in Constables Accounts 18.12.1848, expenses 5/- for selling her goods, which raised £3/16/8½d. Mr Walker was paid 10/- for her rent in March 1849, for 1848/9.

John Elliott bapt. 25.9.1844 son of Edward, labourer, and Martha of Bradmore, buried Bunny 26.11.1844.

Elizabeth Elliott of Bradmore daughter of Thomas, labourer, married at Bunny 16.12.1862 to Thomas Langham, labourer of Bradmore. See Langham.

William Elliott bapt. 24.1.1875 son of John framework knitter and Mary.

William Elliott, born c1858. 1881 William Elliott age 22 joiner living with sister Betsy married to William Attewell, at 2 Tompson St., Sherwood (see William Attewell son of William, maltster and Ann). 1891 William age 32 joiner born Wysall, boarder with John Cockram, guard with Midland Railway, at 63 Brierly St., Nottingham. 1892 Jan.qtr. William Elliott of Wysall married Caroline (Carrie) Dalby, Nottingham district. 1901 William Elliott age 42 builder employer born Wysall, with wife Caroline at 121 Colwick Rd., Nottingham. 1911 William Elliott age 52 house builder on own account, employer, with wife Caroline plus her sister Olga Dalby, at Kirk Lane Ruddington, 7-room house. William Elliott of Kirk Lane, Ruddington, house and land, parish vote only, 1912-1914. 1910-11 and 1917 governor of Bunny Charities, at that time of Kirk Lane, Ruddington. Died 11.10.1955 age 97, buried at Bunny with Caroline, south of west tower, inscription added 'Also of William Elliott reunited with his dear wife 11.10.1955 aged 97 years. Sunset and evening star.' Commemorated on brass plate 1860-1955, on the seat by the bus shelter on Loughborough Rd. Bradmore. Seat paid for by Norah Elliott, adopted daughter, in 1957, then living at Bramley, Surrey, cost £25/4/11, inscription extra, provided by En-Tout-Cas Co Ltd, Syston, Leicester.

Caroline Elliott nee Dalby (Carrie) born c1864. See also Dalby. 1892 Jan.qtr. Caroline (Carrie) Dalby married William Elliott of Wysall, Nottingham district. 1901 age 36 married to William. 1911 age 44 (married 19 years, no children). Mrs Elliott listed as WI member for Bradmore 1931-1943. Died 12.12.1948 age 84, buried at Bunny, south of west tower, tombstone: 'Treasured memories of Caroline beloved wife of William Elliott who fell asleep 12.12.1948 aged 84 years. Love Sweetness, Goodness in her person shine so clear.' William also buried here.

Sarah Elizabeth Elliott nee Challands bapt. Bunny 20.5.1877 daughter of William, labourer and Mary of Bradmore. 1897 Oct.qtr. Sarah Elizabeth Challands married Frank Lester Elliott, Melton Mowbray district. 1901 Frank Lester Elliott age 26 farm labr. born Wysall with wife Sarah Elizabeth age 24, and son William Henry 2 born Bunny, at Willoughby Lane, Wymeswold. 1911 Frank age 36 farm foreman with wife Sarah Elizabeth age 34 (married 13 years with 3 children), William Henry 12 scholar born Bunny, Doris Blanche Mary 9 born Wymeswold and Edith Elizabeth 6 born Hickling, at Plumtree, 6-room house.

Emma Elliott born c1859, nee James daughter of William and Eliza bapt. 19.9.1859 Bunny. 1876 Walter Elliott married Emma James, Oct.qtr. Basford district. 1881 age 22 born Bradmore married to William Lester Elliott age 24 ag.lab, born Wysall, with children George 4 scholar and Lilian Ann 10 mths both born Wysall, on Main St., Wysall. William Elliott died Jul.qtr. 1900, Loughborough district. 1901 Emma age 42 born Ruddington, widow, head of household with children Eliza A, Isabella, Annie, Daisy and John, 3-room house on Village St (Bradmore 18/1901). Recorded as parent/guardian of Daisy in 1904. 1911 age 53 born Bradmore, widow (married 34 years with 9 children, 3 dead), with children Eliza 30 single, hosiery winder, Bella (who signed the census form) 28 single plain net mender, lace, both born Wysall, Annie 25 single plain net mender, lace, born Normanton on Soar, Daisy 12 scholar born Bunny Hill, John William 10 born Bradmore, scholar, at The Leys, Ruddington, 4-room house.

Eliza A Elliott born c1881 Wysall, daughter of Emma and William. 1901 age 20 single hosiery maker in mother's house (Bradmore 18/1901).

Isabella I Elliott born c1883 Wysall, daughter of Emma and William. 1901 age 18 single, lace mender in mother's house (Bradmore 18/1901).

Annie Elliott born c1886 Normanton on Soar, daughter of Emma and William. 1901 age 15 German seamer (hosiery maker) in mother's house (Bradmore 18/1901).

Daisy Elliott born c1899 Bunny, daughter of Emma and William. 1901 age 2 in mother's house (Bradmore 18/1901), admitted to Bunny School 11.4.1904.

John William Elliott, born 1900 Bradmore, son of Emma and William. 1901 age 6 mths in mother's house (Bradmore 18/1901). Admitted to Bunny School 1.5.1905.

ENGLAND

William A England, father of Ronald, recorded as of Bradmore in Bunny School Admissions Register

1904. Mr England appears with his wife and son and '3 other Bradmore natives' on a photograph of c1910 where he is described as the last keeper on the Bunny estate. Lived at Keepers Cottage on the Wysall Lane bordering the east side of Bunny Park, in Bunny parish.

Mrs England and son included in photograph of family group, and also separately photographed at Keepers Cottage, probably c1910.

Ronald A England son of William A, admitted to Bunny School 6.4.1904. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Boys 24.7.1904-July 1905, 3rd class one week only 16.7.1905.

EVATT/EVOTT

Edmund Evotte of Bradmore, 7.3.1574, received counterpart lease from Frauncis Willughby.

Jervase Evatt, yeoman of Bradmore, left a will dated 8.5.1605, proved 19.6.1606 with details of crops and livestock..

Elizabeth Evatt, widow of Bradmore, left a will dated 28.5.1608, proved 20.1.1610. Referred to Robert Bamber, and to grandchild ? Barker of Keyworth who has 20/-. To Elizabeth Randall she left a robe, a bed, a ewe and a hogg, a great panne ... a bolster ... a bolster and a form ... Also referred to Mary Randall, sister. Appointed John Lovatt and Richard G(olding?), witnessed by John Lovatt, Richard Golding, Gabrielle Evatt and Richard ?.

EVERETT

Annie Everett born 1852 Bradmore, possibly daughter of George and Ann. Oct 1878 Radford district Annie Harwood married William Everett, son of George, coal dealer and Mary Ann of Boongate, Peterborough. 1881 William age 29 born Peterborough, sexton/gravedigger with wife Annie age 28 born Bradmore plus a boarder at 19 Denton St., Radford Nottm. 1891 William age 40 cow keeper born Spalding with wife Annie 38 born Bradmore and son William E H 7 born Radford plus servant at 17 Cobden St., Lenton Nottingham. 1901 William age 49 dairyman on own account born Peterborough with wife Annie age 49 born Bradmore, son William Ernest 17 plumber's apprentice born Nottingham plus servant at 17 Cobden St., Nottingham. (Son William Ernest H Everett got married Apr.qtr. 1905) 1911 William Everett "occupier" age 59 born Peterborough, carting contractor, with wife Annie age 59, born Bradmore (married 31 years (1880) with 1 child), plus visitor/mother's help, and a boarder at 17 Cobden St., Old Radford, 5-room house.

EXTON

Sarah Exton born c1856, Ingoldsby, Lincoln. 1871 age 16, single, domestic servant in the household of Richard Barrand, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1871/3).
