Herbert Astley Fearnside, born 1866, Headingley Yorks, son of William, oil merchant and Lucy. Brother of Mary Louise and of Martha Emily, who married Thomas Oliver, farmer of Bunny. 1899 Jan.qtr. Leeds district, Herbert Astley Fearnside married Florence Mary Longcake. 1901 Herbert A Fearnside age 35 grocer and provision merchant on his own account, born Leeds, with wife F Mary age 28 born Leeds plus a visitor, at 1 Welton Rd., Headingley Leeds. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main St., autumn 1921-1952, at the Post Office, May 1945-8. Kellys Directory 1932, 1936 and 1941, shopkeeper and Post Office, tel. Ruddington 022. 1949-1952 phone book, Herbert A Fearnside on Main St., Bradmore, tel Ruddington 349. Known locally as "Chummy" On Saturdays he went round the village selling cigarettes and chocolates door to door to boost sales (Source: G Randall). Herbert Astley Fearnside of The Nook, Bradmore died 16.3.1952, admin Nottingham 17.6.1952 to Florence Mary, widow; effects £237/16/2.

Florence Mary Fearnside, nee Longcake, born 1873. Jan.qtr. 1899 married Herbert Astley, Leeds district. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main St., autumn 1921-1952, at Post Office May 1945-8. Listed as WI member 1931-25.4.1938. Florence Mary Fearnside died 22.1.1957 Derby, probate 25.2.1957 Nottingham to Edith Lilian Frost and her husband Arnold Ernest Frost, company director; effects £956/19/6.

FEATHERSTONE

James Featherstone, b1881 Cottingham, Yorks. 1911 age 30, waggoner on farm, with wife Mary Agnes age 27 born 1884 Kilnwick, Yorks. (married 6 years (1905) with 3 children), Stanley 6 born 1905, Wilfred 5, both born S.Cave, Yorks, and Ethel 2 born Linby Yorks. On Bradmore electoral roll, house, 1911-1912.

FENN

John Dod(g)son Fenn born 1842, Plumtree, listed as clothier, of Nottingham City, Methodist Church trustee 1896, commercial traveller of Nottingham, and in 1903 Methodist Church deeds. 1901 John D Fenn age 59, tailor and outfitter on own account, with wife Eliza age 60 born Carrington, Nottingham, and John's sister Harriet Fenn at 53 Queens Walk, Nottingham. 1904 collected from Local Preachers for a stone for the new schoolroom and served on the building committee. 1911 John Dodson Fenn age 69 tailor and draper on own account, traveller, with wife Eliza age 70 (married 42 years (1869) with 4 children, 1 dead), with grand-son Lewis Pickard Houlst 6 scholar born Kintbury, Berks, at 148 Wilford Grove, Nottingham, 6-room house. John D Fenn died Apr.qtr. 1914, Basford district..

FIELDING

Isabell Fielding married Anthony Sheepheard of Wilford at Bunny 29.4.1639.

FISH

John Fish of Lenton married Ann Roobotham at Bunny 8.7.1794.

Mary Fish born 23.12.1794 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 5.1.1795, daughter of John and Ann.

Ann Fish of Bradmore daughter of John and Ann buried as an infant 11.5.1799, Bunny.

FLESSHEWERE

Roger Flesshewere and his wife **Elena** 29.11.1398 holding for 11 years 2½ acres and 1 rood of arable land with appurtenances in Bradmere, 1 acre next to Windmill, 1½ roods at Elrin furlong and 1 acre at Moke Wenge, granted by Peter de Goteham to Richard de Clifford of Ruddington, after 11 years the land to revert to Peter and then to be held by Richard de Clifford.

FLOWER

Mary Flower married Richard Bush both of Bradmore at Bunny 17.6.1684.

Thomas Flower married Hannah Baily, both of Bradmore, 13.11.1728.

Mary Flower married Thomas Burrows 7.1.1697, at Bradmore.

FORD

William Ford born 1810 Willoughton, Lincolnshire. 1861 William age 56 born Willoughton soda water manufacturer with wife Sarah age 54 born Upton Notts, children Wiliam 18 born Derby, Henry 14 and Fredric 12 both born Chapel en le Frith, at Crompton St., Derby. 1871 William age 62 mineral water manufacturer with wife Sarah age 64, children Henry 24 and Fredric 20 and grandson at

Parliament St., Nottingham. 1881 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1881 William Ford age 71 born Willoughton, Lincs, alderman, mineral water manufacturer, with wife Isabella age 57 born Maidwell Northants plus niece and servant at 8 Mapperley Rd., Nottingham. 1885/6 Whites Directory, farmer, house in Nottingham, 8 Mapperley Rd. 1885 and 1886 Alderman F W Ford donated £1 to the Sunday School each year. 1886 Isabella Ford died, Jan.qtr., Nottingham. William Ford of 8 Mapperley Rd., Nottingham, on Bradmore electoral roll with land and tenement 1886-1891. 1888 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1889 Mr W Ford donated 10/- to the Sunday School. 1891 William age 81, widower, manufacturing chemist born Willoughton Lincs, with niece and servant at 8 Mapperley Rd., Nottingham. William Ford of Mapperley Rd. born 1809 died 20.8.1891, will proved 26.9.1891 by William Joseph Ford of Sherwood Rise and Fredric Thomas Ford of Villa Rd., Nottingham, Mineral Water Manufacturers, sons and executors. Estate £12,809/4/1. 17.6.1892 F W Ford donated 10/- to the Sunday School. William Ford recorded as renting grazing on the Ramper in 1893 presumably is the son.

Frederick Thomas Ford of Elm Bank, Mapperley Rd., Nottingham, son and executor of William Ford. 1861 and 1871 in parents' house. 1881 Fredc. T Ford age 32 box manufacturer with wife Annie M age 27 and children Ethel N 6, Harry 4, William F 2 all born Nottingham, plus servants at 34 Parliament St., Nottingham. 1891 Frederic T Ford age 42, aerated water manufacturer, with wife Annie age 37, children Ethel S 16, Harry 14, Frederic W 12, Oscar O 6 scholars and Gladys M 5 plus servants at 19 Villa Rd., Nottingham. 1894 Whites Directory, farmer, house in Nottingham, no entry in the alphabetical directory of Nottingham. F T Ford donated 10/- to the Sunday School on 3.6.1894 and in 1898. 1895 Kellys Directory, Court Directory section, Frederick Ford living at Bradmere House, Elm Bank, Nottingham, employing farm bailiff Thomas Harris in Bradmore. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement, 1896-1898. 1897 parish council employed a man to clean out the open ditches at north end of the village running between Mr Grundy's fields and Mr Ford's, which were in a very filthy state. 1.4.1898 named on tenant valuation of Bonsers Farm, for incoming tenant of Miss Hawksley, Mr Randall. Frederic Thomas Ford died Jul.qtr. 1900, Nottingham; no will found.

FOR(E)LAND

John Forland, born c1838, St Germans, Cornwall. 1861 age 22, mine labourer in mother's house, Ann, widow, at 13 Croft Cottage, Menheniot, Cornwall. 1870 Oct.qtr. Mansfield district, John Forland married Elizabeth Heath. 1871 age 30, labourer born Cornwall, with wife Elizabeth 25 born Mansfield Woodhouse in Elizabeth's parents' house, John Heath 61 labourer and Hannah age 56, on Taylor Lane, Mansfield Woodhouse. 1881 age 43, householder, copper and lead miner, married to Elizabeth, with children Ada, Lizzie H, John Thomas, and Jannette. Lived on Main St. west of Steeple Cottage, (Bradmore 1881/56). 1891 John Foreland age 56 copper miner unemployed born St Germans with wife Elizabeth and children Lizzie H, John T and Jeanette at 19 Union St., Skipton. John Forland died Apr. qtr. 1900, Skipton.

Elizabeth Forland born c1842, Blidworth, nee Heath, daughter of John, labourer and Hannah. 1870 Oct.qtr. married John Forland. 1871 age 25 married to John, in her parents' house at Mansfield Woodhouse. 1881 age 39, married to John (Bradmore 1881/56). 1891 age 50 married to John at Skipton. Elizabeth Forland died Apr qtr 1899, Skipton.

Ada Forland born c1872 Mansfield Woodhouse, daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1881 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/56).

Lizzie H Forland born c1874, Westwoodville, Selston, daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1881 age 7, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/56). 1891 age 17, cotton spinner, in parents' house at Skipton.

John Thomas Forland born c1876, Westwoodville, Selston, son of John and Elizabeth. 1881 age 5, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/56). 1891 age 15 doffer in cotton mill, in parents' house, Skipton.

Jeanette Forland born c1880, Dudley Hill, West Bridgford, daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1881 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/56). 1891 age 10, scholar in parents' house, Skipton.

FOSTER

Hugh Foster, Morris Dancer, 5.11.1618, married Elizabeth Marshall at Bunny 9.12.1604.

Maria Foster of Bradmore born c1797, buried Bunny 28.6.1865, age 66.

Robert Foster married Mary Ball of Keyworth at Keyworth 15.11.1802. Possibly the Robert Foster who received 3d from the Constable 8.2.1796 for a fullmer, and 1792 for sparrows.

Elizabeth Foster of Bradmore married William Holland of Wilford 25.11.1816, witnessed by Elizabeth Voce.

Isaac Foster born c1787. Isaac Foster married Martha Smith at Plumtree 19.12.1803. Dec.1806 the

Constable paid part rent 6d for him. April 1807 he paid the Constable £5 in cash, no details given in Accounts. 22.4.1807 the Constable paid for Isaac's examination. Probably the Isaac Foster who married Jane Williamson, both of Bradmore, 15.6.1812, his second marriage after Martha died 1810/11. 1825 Isaac had 10/- from the Constable for 6 days work on Jakes's house. 1841 age 55, agricultural labourer, householder on Far St., with son Isaac (Bradmore 1841/65). Buried Bunny 11.4.1848, age 66.

Martha Foster nee Smith of Plumtree, married Isaac Foster at Plumtree 19.12.1803. Died c1810/11.

Ann Foster bapt. Bunny 1.6.1806, daughter of Isaac and Martha of Bradmore. Possibly the Ann Foster who married James/Thomas Jacques, both of Bradmore, 29.9.1829.

Elizabeth Foster bapt. Bunny 14.11.1810, daughter of Isaac and Martha of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 9.1.1811.

Jane Foster, born c1782, probably nee Williamson of Bradmore, married to Isaac at Bunny 15.6.1812, second wife. Buried Bunny 17.12.1828 age 40.

Elizabeth Foster bapt. Bunny 3.10.1814, daughter of Isaac, labourer, and Jane of Bradmore. Married George Herrick, waggoner, at Loughborough 15.2.1837. See Herrick for daughter Jane.

Robert Foster bapt. Bunny 29.3.1817 son of Isaac, labourer, and Jane of Bradmore.

John Foster bapt. Bunny 21.6.1821, son of Isaac, labourer, and Jane of Bradmore, died before 1825.

Isaac Foster bapt. Bunny 27.5.1824, son of Isaac, labourer, and Jane of Bradmore. 1841 age 15, frameknitter, in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/65). 1851 Isaac Foster age 29 born Bradmore, with wife Mary 44 born Nether Broughton, living at Nether Broughton. Mary Foster died Jul.qtr. 1853, Melton Mowbray. 1855 Oct.qtr. Isaac Foster married Harriett Hare, Lincoln district. Not found 1861. 1871 Isaac age 45 fishmonger born Bradmore with wife Harriett age 41 and children Robert 14 fishmonger, Jane 11, scholar, Ann, 2, Charles 1 mth, and brother in law Frederick Hare 26 labourer, all born Lincoln, at 1 Cavil's Court, Steep Hill, Lincoln. 1881 Isaac age 55 fishmonger with wife Harriett age 50, children Annie 12, Charley 10, Isaac 7 scholars and brother in law Frederick Hare 39 all born Lincoln, at 1 & 2 Cavill's Court, Steep Hill, Lincoln. 1891 Isaac age 67 widower, fish merchant, with children Annie 26 housekeeper, Charles 25, Isaac 18 general labourers, and brother in law Frederick Hare 47 boot closer, at 2 Wilson Row, Eastgate, Lincoln. Isaac Foster died Apr.qtr. 1898 Lincoln district.

John Foster born c1825, buried 8.1.1829 age 4.

Thomas Foster bapt. Bunny 15.9.1827, son of Isaac, labourer, and Jane of Bradmore buried Bunny 26.12.1828 age 1.

Mary Foster, born c1832, Lowdham. 1881 age 49, general domestic servant in the household of Robert Ranby, farmer at north end of Farmer St. (Bradmore 1881/14).

Thomas Foster bapt. 16.8.1802, Bunny, son of Thomas and Mary. Possibly the Thomas who married Elizabeth Bacon at Bunny 4.9.1826. 1851 Thomas Foster age 48 yardman's labourer born Bunny with wife Elizabeth age 46 and children Ann 15, Elizabeth 10 scholar, Thomas 3, Harriet 3 mths and William 20, tailor, all born Bunny, at Bunny. 1861 Thomas age 54 ag.lab. with wife Elizabeth 56 born Seagrave and children Elizabeth 20 spinster, Thomas 13 farmer's boy and Harriett age 10 scholar all born Bunny, at Bunny. 1871 age 69, agricultural labourer, married to Elizabeth, with children Harriett and Lizza, on Far St. (Bradmore 1871/31). 1873/4 the Constable paid Thomas's rate 1/4.

Elizabeth Foster born c1804, Seagrave, possibly nee Bacon, married Thomas 4.9.1826 at Bunny. 1851 married to Thomas. 1861 married to Thomas. 1871 age 67, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/31).

William Foster bapt. Bunny 24.9.1829, son of Thomas and Elizabeth. 1851 age 20, tailor, in parents' house. 1861 William age 32 tailor born Bunny with wife Priscilla J age 30 born Breedon on the Hill, with children Elizabeth A 12 born Breedon, Frederick W 3 and Ann P 8 mths both born Derby and 2 apprentice tailors, at Gerard St., Derby. 1871 William age 42 tailor, wife Priscilla J age 40 with children Frederick W 13, Edith J 7 scholar, Florence E 2, Bertha E 7 mths all born Derby and brother Thomas Foster 22 tailor born Bunny, at 38 Gerard St., Derby. 1881 William age 51 tailor with wife Priscilla J age 56, children Edith J 17 dressmaker, Florence E 12, Bertha E 10 scholars born Derby, and nephew Fredrick T Cross 20 joiner born Breedon, at 108 Gerard St., Derby. 1891 William age 62 tailor with wife Priscilla J age 60 and daughter Bertha E 20 milliner, grandchildren Edith E Foster 5 and Frederick J Foster 4 both born Derby, at 116 Gerard St., Derby.

Harriett Foster born c1851, Bunny, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth. 1851 age 3 mths in parents' house. 1861 age 10 in parents' house. 1871 age 20, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/31).

Lizza Foster born c1870, Wysall, daughter? of Thomas and Elizabeth, possibly their grand-daughter, i.e. daughter of Harriet. 1871 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/31).

William Foster, born c1805 at Bradmore (census 1851-61) or alternatively c1805 at Bunny (census 1871-81). Possibly son of Isaac and Martha. May be the William who has a brick in the Methodist Chapel wall dated MDCCCXXX (1830). 1851 age 45, farm labourer, householder, married to Maria or

Mary (born c1802 Charmouth, Dorset , age 44 in 1851) with servant/scholar Thomas Davies on parish relief (Bradmore 1851/26). 1861 age 56, agricultural labourer, married to Mary (born Charmouth), living on Far St. (Bradmore 1861/43). William Foster on 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house and garden at £2/10/- pa. Mary of Charmouth presumably died before 1871, when William is recorded as married to a younger Mary of Clifton, but no death or marriage entries found to confirm, and no children recorded. Census sequences indicate neighbour of Chamberlains and later Hornbuckle (who married Mary Chamberlain's daughter) throughout, so likely to be the same William if not the same Mary. 1871 age 65, noted born Bradmore, agricultural labourer married to Mary born Clifton (Bradmore 1871/27). 1881 age 75, householder, agricultural labourer, married to Mary born Clifton (Bradmore 1881/24). Probably the William Foster in Bunny & Bradmore Charities accounts 1879 who had 7/6, and was to have 1/6 p.wk. 16.9.1880-31.5.1881 payable only when there was no work. 1881 had 2/- p.wk. from the Charities. 1882-4 received 2/- p.wk. Probably the William Foster of Bradmore buried at Bunny 20.12.1884 age 79. By 1889 references to Widow Foster, i.e. Mary.

Mary Foster born c1802, Charmouth, Dorset. 1851 age 44, as Maria, married to William (born Bradmore) (Bradmore 1851/26). 1861 age 59, married to William, schoolmistress (Bradmore 1861/43).

Mary Foster born c1809 at Clifton. Possibly second wife of William? 1871 age 46 (64?) married to William (Bradmore 1871/27). 1881 age 72, married to William born Bunny (Bradmore 1881/24). 1887 Widow Foster of Bradmore received a ton of coal from Bunny & Bradmore Charities, and 1/- p.wk. 1888-94 a ton of coal a year, and 1/- p.wk. 1889 Widow Foster elected to the vacant weekly loaf, assumed to be Mary. 1891, age 73, widow, in house with 2 rooms, seamstress, born Clifton, living alone on Far St., so assumed the same person continuing to live in the same cottage (Bradmore 1891/26). 1897 Sister Mary Foster was given grant from the Methodist Church Poor Fund. 1898 received 2/- twice from the poor fund. Widow Foster on 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and garden at £2/10/- rent pa. 1901 Received grant from Methodist poor fund.

William Foster born c1857 in Ruddington son of Thomas, carter and Mary of Clifton. 1861 age 4 in parents' house at Clifton. 1871 age 14, farm servant, in parents' house at Clifton. 1881 age 24, householder, agricultural labourer, married to Catherine, with daughter Martha Ann, living at the north end of Loughborough Rd. (Bradmore 1881/12). 1891 age 32, agricultural labourer at Marlpit, Ruddington, married to Catherine in a 4-room house with daughter Ethel May, born in Ruddington. 1901 William age 44, farm labourer, with wife Kate age 42, hand seamer, hosiery, working at home, born Ruddington, with children Ethel M 13 and William ae 6, born Ruddington, at 15 Kelly St., Nottingham.

Catherine Foster born c1860 in Bradmore, possibly daughter of John and Mary Ann Chamberlain born 9.10.1859. 1881 age 21 married to William. (Bradmore 1881/12). 1891 age 31 married to William, at Marlpit Ruddington. 1901 age 42 married to William at Kelly St., Nottingham.

Martha Ann Foster born c1880/1 Bradmore, daughter of William and Catherine. 1881 age 7 mths in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/12).

FRISBY

Ann Frisby born 7.7.1793, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 9.7.1793, daughter of William, labourer, and Ann.

FRISKNEY

Robert Friskney, born c1854, Wadlingworth Lincs. son of Richard, shepherd, and Elizabeth. 1861 age 10 (should be 5) scholar in parents' house at Haddon, Hunts. 1885 Jan.qtr. Robert Friskney married Alice Buttery, Horncastle district. 1891 aged 37, householder, shepherd, married to Alice with daughters Annie and Nellie, living in Southwell House cottages (Bradmore 1891/63). Electoral roll, house with no county vote 1891-1898. 1901 Robert age 45 shepherd with wife Alice age 37 and children Annie 13, Nellie 13 both born Stixwold, Florence 5 born Bradmore, John R 2 born Ragnall, at Village St., Ragnall Notts. 1911 Robert age 56 shepherd on farm born Waddingworth Lincs with wife Alice age 48 born Horncastle (married 24 years with 4 children), Robert 12 scholar born Ragnall Notts and Florence 15 born Bradmore in 5-room house at Dunham on Trent.

Alice Friskney, born c1863, Horncastle nee Buttery. 1885 Jan.qtr. married Robert Friskney, Horncastle district. 1891 age 28, married to Robert (Bradmore 1891/63). 1901 age 37 married to Robert. 1911 age 48 married to Robert.

Annie Friskney, born c1888 Stixwold, daughter of Robert and Alice. 1891 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/63). Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 2.7.1893-25.11.1894, sick December 1894-Feb.1895; 3rd class 24.3.1895-27.9.1896, sick 24.1.1897-7.2.1897 then absent until 26.12.1897; 2nd class 2.1.1898-3.4.1898. 1901 age 13 in parents' house.

Nellie Friskney, born c1889, Stixwold, daughter of Robert and Alice. 1891 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/63). Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 2.7.1893-11.11.1894, sick

Dec.1894-Feb.1895, attended 26.5.1895-15.12.1895; 3rd class Jan.1896-11.10.1896, sick March 1896 and Jan/Feb 1897, absent until 21.3.1897, 3rd class to 3.4.1898. 1901 age 13 in parents' house.
Florence Friskney born 1896 Bradmore, daughter of Robert and Alice. 1911 age 15 in parents' house at Dunham on Trent.
