

## GADD

**Septimus Sampson** Gadd, born Mar.qtr. 1843, East Leake, son of Sampson, miller and baker, and Mary. 1851 age 8, scholar, in parents' house at Pinfold Green, East Leake, 6<sup>th</sup> child listed. 1861 Septimus Gadd born "Leek, Notts", age 18, traveller, servant in the house of Jos. Kelly, brush maker employing 6 men, 3 boys and 2 females, at 101 Shude Hill, Manchester. 1864 Apr.qtr. Loughborough district, Septimus Sampson Gadd married Mary Waters, daughter of John, butcher and publican, and Catherine, of Clifton Notts. 1871 Septimus age 28, assistant farmer, with wife Mary age 26 on The Green, East Leake. 1881 Septimus age 38, innkeeper at Fox and Hounds, 19/20 Wellington St., Loughborough, with wife Mary age 35 born Barton and children Elizabeth 8, Nelly 6, Alice 3 scholars all born Clifton, and Frederick 1 born Loughborough, plus servant. 1891 Septimus age 48, innkeeper and farmer at the Red Lion, Main St., Costock, with wife Mary 45, children Lizzie 18, assistant school teacher, Alice 13 scholar, both born Clifton, Frederick 11 and Willie 9 scholars born Loughborough, plus a boarder. The Gadd family moved into the Bradmore farmstead on the day J P Smeeton was born (he was bapt. 14.8.1892). Gadd's Farm recorded by J P Smeeton as the last farm on the Bunny side of the village, 1890s next door to the Smeetons at Toft Farm. On Bradmore electoral roll with land & tenement, 1893 only, at Gadds Farm later known as Yorke Farm. Died 29.12.1892 aged 49, buried 3.1.1893 on north side of Bunny churchyard, with Mary. Admin 3.2.1893 to widow Mary, effects £817/7/10.

**Mary** Gadd, born 1846, Barton Notts, nee Waters, daughter of John, butcher and publican, and Catherine of Clifton Notts. 1851 age 5 in parents' house at Clifton. Not found in 1861. Married S S Gadd Apr.qtr. 1864. 1871 age 26 married to Septimus, at East Leake. 1881 age 35 married to Septimus, at Loughborough. 1891 age 45, married to Septimus at the Red Lion, Costock. Continued at Yorke Farm after his death. 1894 Whites Directory, Mrs Mary Gadd, farmer. 1895 Kellys Directory, Mrs Mary Gadd, farmer. 1895 Mrs Gadd applied to the Bunny & Bradmore Charities for the apprentice fee for her son. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement with no parish vote, 1896-1903. 1893-4 and 1897 rented grazing on Pendock Lane. 1898 contributed 10/- to the Bunny Clock Fund, memorial to 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign. 1900 Bunny Estate Rental, S S Gadd with farmhouse and land, 131 $\frac{3}{4}$  acres, paying £184/4/6 rent pa - presumably still refers to Septimus Sampson Gadd. 1901 Mary Gadd age 55 born Barton Notts, widow, head of household, farmer, employer, with children Elizabeth, Ellen F, Frederick, and William, and visitor Ann A Wild from Owthorpe, and yardman George Dalby of Gt Dalby, on Loughborough Turnpike (Yorke Farm) (Bradmore 49/1901). 1911 May Gadd age 65 widow (married 44 years with 7 children, 2 dead), farmer, employer born E Leake, with children William, Elizabeth, Ellen, Frederick (and Alice deleted), plus a servant. Census form signed by William for Mary, at Clipstone, Plumtree, Nottingham, 10-room house. Mrs Gadd died (6 or) 5.2.1931 aged 85, buried north side Bunny churchyard with Septimus. Mary Gadd of Manor Park Ruddington, widow, died 6.2.1931, probate 9.4.1931 to William Septimus Gadd farmer and Ellen Florence Gadd spinster, effects £2295/16/3.

**Elizabeth** Gadd born 1873, Clifton, daughter of Septimus and Mary. 1881 age 8 scholar in parents' house. 1891 age 18 asst. school teacher in parents' house. 1901 age 28 in mother's house (Bradmore 49/1901). 1911 age 35, single, no occupation listed, in mother's house at Clipstone.

**Ellen Florence** Gadd born 1875 Clifton, daughter of Septimus and Mary. 1881 Nelly age 6 scholar in parents' house. 1891 Ellen age 16, scholar, as niece in uncle John Gadd's house, age 50 farmer and steam cultivator born East Leake with wife Mary A age 46 born Clifton and son Sampson 19 plus 6 servants at Hill Farm, Edwalton. 1901 age 26, engineer's clerk, in mother's house (Bradmore 41/1901). 1911 age 33, clerk for lace machine builder, in mother's house at Clipstone. Unmarried at time of mother's death 1931. Ellen F Gadd died Dec.qtr. 1961, Nottingham district.

**Alice** Gadd born 1878, Clifton, daughter of Septimus and Mary. 1881 age 3, scholar in parents' house. 1891 age 13, scholar in parents' house. 1901 Alice age 23 nursery governess in house of James A Hemingway, civil engineer, with his wife Amy and children Ida 4 and Augustus G 1 at 19 Meadow Road, Beeston. 1911 Alice age 33 single on private means visiting David Carbutt, miller and farmer, employer, and wife Gertrude age 36 born Cotgrave, at Grassthorpe, Newark, 7-room house. Alice Gadd born 1878 died Mar. qtr. 1957, Basford district.

**Frederick** Gadd born 1880 Loughborough son of Septimus and Mary. 1881 age 1 in parents' house. 1891 age 11 scholar in parents' house. 1901 age 21, joiner, in mother's house (Bradmore 41/1901). 1911 age 29, joiner in mother's house at Clipstone.

**William Septimus** Gadd born 1882 Loughborough, son of Septimus and Mary. 1891 age 9, scholar in parents' house. 1901 age 19, worker, occupation not detailed, in mother's house (Bradmore 41/1901). 1911 age 27, farmer, employer, in mother's house at Clipstone, signed census form on her behalf.

## GARNER

**Sarah** Garner appears in Constable's Accounts March 1809, Constable paid £1.7s.7½d expenses for her funeral.

## GARRETT

**Maria** Garrett nee Christian born 1851 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 22.7.1851, daughter of Gideon, undergardener, and Mary of Bradmore. 1880 Dec.qtr. Basford district, Maria Christian married Robert Garret son of William, blacksmith, and Martha of Wells, Norfolk. 1881 Maria age 29 with husband Robert Garrett age 39 blacksmith born Wells, Norfolk, in her parents' house at the Green Ruddington. 1891 Maria age 38 dressmaker born Bradmore with husband Robert 49 blacksmith and children Lizzie 8, Mabel 5 born Nottingham, at 74 Carline St., St Anns, Nottingham. 1901 Robert Garrett age 60 blacksmith with wife Maria age 49 dressmaker working at home, born Bradmore, and children Lizzie age 18 cloth tailoress and Mable age 15 hosiery (pants) machinist both born Nottingham and father Gideon Christian, at 67 Caroline St., Nottingham. Not found 1911.

## GARTON

**John** Garton paid by Constable in 1801 for catching sparrows.

**Sarah** Garton born 1848, Normanton on Soar. 1861 age 13, general servant in the household of Thomas and Mary Rowbotham, Orchard House, Farmer St. (Bradmore 1861/19).

## GASKIN

**Elizabeth** Gaskin, born c1839, Wysall. 1861 age 22, married but no record for husband, general servant in the household of Joseph Nixon, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/17).

## GASCOYNE

**Joseph** Gascoine born c1864, age 20 of Bradmore, labourer, son of James labourer, married Elizabeth Taylor widow of Bradmore, daughter of James Jenkins deceased, sailor, at Bunny 2.12.1884.

**Elizabeth** Gascoine nee Jenkins daughter of James, sailor, born c1859. Previously married to Edwin Wootton Taylor who died 1882, at age 25 as widow married to Joseph at Bunny 2 Dec. 1884. Gascoyne's wife in Bradmore to receive 10/- from Bunny & Bradmore Charities, Nov.1885, on account of illness. Buried 17.5.1886 at Bunny, age 24.

## GAZE

**John** Gaze of Bradmore married Ann Rowbottom of Bradmore daughter of Thomas and Mary, 24.8.1813. Carpenter. Possibly 1841 John Gaze 50 joiner with wife Ann 45 and children John 20, joiner and Sarah 20, at Normanton on Soar.

**John** Gaze son of John, carpenter, and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 20.1.1814.

## GEE

**Agnes** Gee bapt. Bunny 27.4.1651 daughter of Thomas and Eleanour of Bradmore.

**Winifred** Gee bapt. Bunny 15.10.1652 daughter of Thomas and Eleanor of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Gee bapt. 19(or 29?).7.1660 son of Thomas and Eleanor.

**Mary** Gee bapt. 14.4.1663 daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Gee married Frances Beck, both of Bradmore, July 1663, date unknown.

**Thomas** Gee married Margaret Marshall of Outhrop at Bunny 8.4.1684.

**William** Gee bapt. Bunny 27.7.1684 son of Thomas and Margaret of Bradmore.

**Richard** Gee bapt. Bunny 8.3.1691 son of Thomas of Bradmore.

**Ann** Gee bapt. Bunny 5.11.1693 daughter of Thomas of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Gee bapt. Bunny 13.10.1695 son of Thomas of Bradmore.

**Alice** Gee bapt. Bunny 2.10.1698 daughter of Thomas of Bradmore. Married Ralph Lomas of Little Leak at Bunny 17.12.1728.

**Widow** Gee of Bradmore buried Bunny 19.11.1746.

**Mary** Gee of Bradmore buried Bunny 28.12.1757.

**Elizabeth** Gee niece of Ann Brown, beneficiary of Ann's will in 1774.

**Thomas** Gee, soldier, married Ann Henson at Bunny 24.11.1795, living in Bradmore late 1790s.

**Sarah** Gee born 9.2.1796 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 10.2.1796, daughter of Thomas and Ann.

**William** Gee born 2.3.1797 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 5.3.1797, son of Thomas, soldier, and Ann. 1841 William age 40 framework knitter with wife Charlotte age 40 seamster, children Thomas 15, Michael 8, Richard 4, and Elizabeth Gee 15, at Ruddington. 1851 age 51 framework knitter at Smiths Yard, Ruddington, married to Charlotte age 50 seamster born Bulwell, with children Michael 17 and

Richard 13 both born Ruddington. 1861 William age 64 framework knitter, cottager, born Bradmore, with wife Charlotte age 63 charwoman born Bulwell, and son Richard 24 ag.servant born Bulwell, at 46 East Thorpe Ruddington. Charlotte Gee born 1798 died Oct.qtr.1866 Basford district. 1871 William age 75, widower, ag.lab with son Richard age 30 ag.lab, both born Ruddington, at Vicarage Lane, Ruddington.

**William** Gee? bapt. Bunny 1.12.1808, bastard son of William Gee and Ann Davis of Bradmore, mother and child supported by the Constable 1808-1810, part of costs refunded by father William Gee. See also under Davis.

**Ann** Gee married James Wootton of Bunny at Bunny 9.4.1799.

**Elizabeth** Gee (married name), born c1790 Bradmore. 1841 Elizabeth age 50 launderess with children Mary 19 launderess, Richard 21 framework knitter, Thomas 15 framework knitter, William 13 and Stephen 11, all born Ruddington. 1851 Elizabeth Gee widow age 59 charwoman born Bradmore with children William age 28 framework knitter and Stephen 21 ag.lab born Ruddington and a lodger, at Ruddington. 1861 age 71, charwoman, widow, with son Stephen and his wife Hethzibah at 15 Wilford St., Ruddington.

#### GEESING

**Isaac** Geesing of Bradmore buried Bunny 29.8.1797.

#### GELL

**Emma** Gell bapt. Bunny 12.11.1843, daughter of Thomas, woolcomber, and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

#### GIBSON

**Sarah** Gibson born c1852, Orston/Thoroton, daughter of William ag.lab and Ellen. 1861 age 9 scholar with parents William 33 ag.lab born Thoroton and Ellen 22 born Bingham, at Thoroton. 1871 age 19, single, domestic servant for James and Sarah A Marratt at Blackcliffe Farm (Bradmore 1871/19). 1871 Apr.qtr. Bingham district Sarah Gibson married William Langham, son of Matthew and Ann of Bradmore. See Langham.

#### GILBERT

**Hannah** Gilbert bapt. 29.4.1834, at Tithby cum Cropwell Butler, daughter of Richard ag.lab. and Anne. 1841 Hannah Gilbert age 7 in parents' house at CropwellButler. 1851 age 17, single, house servant in the household of William James, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1851/44).

**Charles** Gilbert labourer of Bradmore son of John, labourer, married to Elizabeth Cross of Bunny daughter of Silas, labourer, at Bunny 4.12.1870.

#### GILES

**John** Giles, no parish specified, buried at Bunny 6.5.1743.

**Mary** Giles wife of John of Bradmore buried Bunny 3.9.1742. Possibly the Mary Smith who married John Giles at Bunny 2.3.1741, no parishes specified.

#### GISBURNE

**Thomas** supposed son of Thomas Gisburne and Elizabeth Humberstone of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 19.1.1654.

#### GLOVER

**Robert** Glover married Mary Tompson, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 13.1.1690.

**Eleanor** Glover daughter of Robert and Mary bapt. 1691, some time between 17 June and 25 September, no date given in the register.

**Thomas** Glover of Bradmore, husbandman at Bonsers Farm, married Mary Nixon daughter of John and Ann, 23.1.1719 at Ruddington. Carried out inventory of goods of Thomas Peet 1744, of Richard Gunn 1748, of William Mee 1750 to whom Thomas owed £1 and signed bond of 1750, of Mary Gunn 1756, and of William Street 1757. Signed bond for will of Robert Attenborough 1756. Buried at Bunny 20.6.1763. His own will dated 15.6.1763, proved 28.1.1764. Left to his wife Mary £60 payable 12 months later, and the best bed, head and bedding and all furniture there belonging, and 12 months board at the expense of the executors. To his daughter Ann Glover 2 guineas, to son John 2 guineas, to son Joseph 2 guineas, to daughter Mary Bennet £5, to son Benjamin Glover £10. To daughter Elizabeth Hebbe 1 guinea, all 12 months after his death. The residue to his son Philip, executor. Bond dated 17.12.1763, by Philip Glover and Edward Vose farmer.

**Mary** Glover of Bradmore widow of the late Thomas, buried Bunny 27.3.1772.

**Ann** Glover daughter of Thomas and Mary, mentioned in Thomas's will 1763.

**John** Glover son of Thomas and Mary, mentioned in Thomas's will 1763.

**Joseph** Glover son of Thomas, trustee for brother Philip. 13.10.1755 Dorothy Wheatley presented for having a bastard child by Joseph Glover of Bradmore. Witnessed will of Edward Vose 1771, signed bond 1772 and carried out inventory of goods 1771. Possibly the Joseph married to Elizabeth, no parishes specified, who bapt. son Philip at Bunny 17.3.1762, and son John at Bunny 30.7.1764.

**Mary** Glover daughter of Thomas and Mary, mentioned in Thomas's will 1763 as married to a Bennet. Possibly the Mary born c1723 who married William Bennet senior of Bradmore, died 1800.

**Benjamin** Glover bapt. Bunny 8.4.1736 son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore.

**William** Glover bapt. Bunny 21.3.1739 son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. William son of Thomas and Mary, no parish specified, buried Bunny 28.4.1743.

**Elizabeth** Glover, bapt. Bunny 21.3.1739, daughter of Thomas and Mary Glover of Bradmore, married Henry Hebb of Keyworth, died 7.12.1768 in her 29th year, buried on south side of Bunny churchyard. 'My loving Friends pray shed no Tears / I sleep but here till Christ appears / And at his coming hope to have / A joyful Rising from the Grave.' Buried with 2 children of Henry and Elizabeth Hebb, viz Mary died 7.4.1766 aged 3, and Sarah died 10.6.1769 in her 2nd year. Nearby are several Hebb tombstones.

**Philip** Glover of Bradmore, farmer at Bonsers Farm, son of Thomas and Mary, married Ann Nixon at Bunny 7.11.1754, no parishes specified. Buried Bunny 5.3.1771. Will dated 15.10.1769, proved 26.8.1771. Left to his mother Mary Glover £40 after 3 months, the sum left to him to pay to her in his father Thomas Glover's will. His son John Glover to receive £60 after 12 months, to be put out to interest for him till he was 21, he was to go to school till age 14 and the expense of schooling, meat, drink and lodging to be paid for by executors, and from age 14 to 21 he was to go to service or apprentice whichever he liked the best and clothes to be found for him. Residue to son Thomas and wife Ann Glover equally unless she remarried, then she had £20 only. If son Thomas married and Philip's wife Ann chose not to stay, then Thomas was to pay his mother Ann £60. Thomas and Ann executors, and Philip's brother Joseph Glover and his cousin William Nixon trustees for John. Inventory dated 10.5.1771 comprising: purse and apparel £5; household goods £40; light horses £80; one foal £5; 11 horses £44; 4 calves £6; 40 sheep £16; wheat in the brick barn £50; beans on the hovel £20; hay £20; 2 waggons and 3 carts £25; 10 acres of wheat and barley £72; 17 acres of beans £34; harrows plows and all other implements (sic) of husbandry £10; manures in the yard £5; 4 pigs £2; total £434, by Edward Vose, Joseph Glover and William Nixon. Bond £868 dated 20.7.1771.

**Ann** Glover probably nee Nixon married Philip at Bunny 7.11.1754. Survived her husband and continued at Bonsers Farm at least until 1777 when her son Thomas died.

**Thomas** Glover of Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 20.10.1755, son of Philip and Ann, no parish specified. Thomas, son of Ann widow of the late Philip, buried Bunny 17.2.1777.

**John** Glover, bapt. Bunny 5.2.1759, son of Philip and Ann, no parish specified. Mentioned in Philip's will, to go to school until age 14 and then to service or apprenticeship until age 21. He was 12 when his father died in 1771. May be the John Glover in Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 107 acres 3 roods 26 perches paying £94/14/10 pa. rent including £3/19/3 for house and homestead, Bonsers Farm. Paid land tax at £1/3/4 p.qtr. 1780-1832. Described in 1827 as farmer on land tax schedule. Signed Constable's Accounts 1779, 1781, 1783-1814, served as Constable in 1783, 1792, 1801 and 1810. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas included 4d gathered from John Glover. 13.10.1790 Constable paid Mr Glover when he took the duplicate forms in, 3/-. 12.5.1792 paid Mr Glover 2/- for taking Henry Henson's examination. Buried Bunny 24.9.1835 age 76.

**Mary** Glover born c1758, buried Bunny 7.10.1838 age 80, probably wife of John.

**William** Glover bapt. Bunny 20.1.1782 son of John and Mary of Bradmore.

**John** Glover bapt. Bunny 23.11.1783 son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the John Glover who was paid by the Constable for catching sparrows 1794 and 1795. Signed Constables Accounts as John Glover junior 1802-15. 1825 Constable paid Mr Glover 10/- for his dyke, 10 acres. Signed 1823-4, 1828-32, served as Constable 1831/2, and signed 1835, 1839-40 and 1843/4. 1832 Whites Directory, farmer. On Bradmore electoral roll 1838/9-1842/3 with 60 acres, Bonsers Farm. (No electoral roll records available for 1844 or '45.) 1841 age 55, farmer, householder with Anne Lewis, housekeeper (possibly his sister), servants Mary Holland, Charles Smith, William Crofts and John Lenries (Bradmore 1841/76). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. Buried Bunny 22.2.1846 age 63. Left a will dated 18.2.1846, probate granted 13.5.1847. Willed to be buried in Bunny. Left to his housekeeper Ann Lewis of Bradmore £5; to Elizabeth daughter of Ann Lewis £4; all other goods, chattels, estate and effects to be sold, proceeds and money to be shared in equal portions to Ann Lewis, Martha Hall of Gunthorpe and Mary, widow of Thomas Gunn late of East Leake,

carrier. Executors John Peet of Bradmore, farmer and maltster, and William Stubbs of Bradmore, saddler.

**Martha** Glover born 3.1.1788, bapt. Bunny 15.1.1788 daughter of John, farmer, and Mary of Bradmore. Married James Hall of Gunthorpe at Bunny 2.11.1834. 1841 James Hall age 65 independent means with wife Martha age 50, at Gunthorpe, Lowdham. Referred to in her brother John's will as Martha Hall, 1846. 1851 Martha Hall age 63 married to James Hall age 74 born Southwell, farmer of 137 acres with 4 labourers, no ref to children in the household at Costock.

**Joseph** Glover born 2.9.1789, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 2.9.1789, son of John, farmer, and Mary. Buried as infant 4.9.1789, Bunny.

**Mary** Glover born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 10.5.1791, daughter of John, farmer, and Mary. Died before 1793.

**Mary** Glover born 28.1.1793 Bradmore, daughter of John, farmer, and Mary, bapt. Bunny 28.1.1793. Married Thomas Gunn, both of Bradmore, 13.10.1817, witnessed by John and Martha Glover. Widow by 1847 when John Glover made his will.

**Ann** Glover, born 15.12.1785, bapt. Bunny 16.12.1785, daughter of John, farmer, and Mary. Possibly the Ann who married William Lewis of Bunny at Bunny 19.6.1809, in which case she may be the Ann Lewis referred to in John Glover's will and at 1841 census as housekeeper. See Lewis.

**Edward** Glover of Bradmore son of Philip and Ann buried Bunny 17.11.1767.

**Philip** Glover of Bradmore son of Philip and Ann buried Bunny 13.1.1768.

**Benjamin** Glover paid by Constable in 1782 for catching sparrows. Possibly Benjamin son of Joseph and Elizabeth of Bunny bapt. 31.1.1769.

**Catherine** Glover of Bradmore married John Hickling of Plumtree 2.1.1827.

#### GODDARD

**John** Goddard son of John Goddard married Mary Brewster of Ruddington at Bunny 1.1.1765.

**George** Goddard born 1866 Stanton on the Wolds, son of John ag.lab (born 1822 Gotham) and Mary Goddard nee Foster (born 1826 Stanton on the Wolds, grand-daughter of Robert Foster born 1778 Stanton on the Wolds). 1871 George H Goddard age 7 scholar in parents' house at Stanton on the Wolds. 1891 George H Goddard age 26 with wife Mary A age 24 born East Leake, children Sarah A 4 born Keyworth, John 3 born Stanton on the Wolds, and Thomas 1 born Wysall, in parents John and Mary F's house at Stanton on the Wolds. 1901 George age 35, head of household, waggoner on farm, with wife Mary and children John, Thomas, Elizabeth and Eliza on Village (Main) Street (Bradmore 26/1901). 1911 George age 46 gardener with wife Mary Ann and children Elizabeth May age 18 single, yarn winder, Eliza Ann age 12, Ann age 5 scholar and Ethel age 3 both born Ruddington, at Easthorpe Lodge, Ruddington, 4-room house.

**Mary Ann** Goddard born 1868 East Leake. 1891 age 24 married to George in in-laws' house at Stanton on the Wolds,. 1901 age 33 married to George (Bradmore 26/1901). 1911 age 44 (married 24 years with 7 children, 1 dead), with George at Ruddington.

**John** Goddard born c1889 Stanton on the Wolds, son of George and Mary. 1891 age 3 in grandparents' house, Stanton. 1901 age 12 in parents' house, Bradmore.

**Thomas** Goddard born c1891 Wysall, son of George and Mary. 1891 age 1 in grandparents' house Stanton. 1901 age 10 in parents' house, Bradmore.

**Elizabeth May** Goddard born c1893, Stanton on the Wolds, daughter of George and Mary. 1901 age 8 in parents' house, Bradmore. 1911 age 18, single, yarn winder, in parents' house, Ruddington.

**Eliza Ann** Goddard born c1899, Stanton on the Wolds, daughter of George and Mary. 1901 age 2 in parents' house, Bradmore. 1911 age 12, scholar in parents' house, Ruddington.

**Ann** Goddard born c1906, Ruddington, daughter of George and Mary. 1911 age 5, scholar in parents' house, Ruddington.

Possibly living in Bradmore 1878. 1881 Charles age 33 labourer with wife Harriett age 30 and children Walter 11 and Ellen 9 scholars born Ramsey, Philip 4 born (Bunny) Hill Top, Esther 2 born Bradmore, Andrew 1 born Hyson Green plus a boarder at 7 Knights Place, Hyson Green, Nottingham. 1891 Charles age 43

gen.lab with wife Harriet age 40 and children Walter 34 railway engine fireman, Esther 12, Andrew 11, Edith 8, Florence 7, Herbert 5, Lilian 3 scholars (Andrew to Lilian born Nottingham) and Daisy 7 mths born Nottingham, at 1 Florence St., Nottingham. 1901 Charges age 53 gen.lab with wife Harriet age 51 and children Esther 22 hosiery winder, Andrew 20 coal miner underground, Edith 18 dressmaker on own account at home, Florence 17, Herbert 15 coal miner underground, Lily 13, Daisy 10, born Nottingham, Cissley 8 and Constance 5 both born Ilkeston, at 51 Stanton Rd., Ilkeston. 1911 Charles age 63 labourer on sewage farm for Borough Council, with wife Harriet age 61 (married 42 years with 13 children, all alive), children Lily 23, Daisy ag 20 book-keeper in singer machine shop, Cissie 18 hosiery seamers machine hand, May 15 apprentice milliner and a boarder at 43 Stanton Road, Ilkeston, 5-room house.

#### GOODACRE

**Elizabeth** Goodacre nee Walker, daughter of Rebecca Walker (nee Street), married William Goodacre, miller of Wymeswold. Received £30 in Rebecca's will, d.1757. Their children John and Kathryn received £5 in Rebecca's will. £5 each also to Samuel, Rebecca, Ann, Elizabeth, Thomas and Mary Goodacre. Apparently a generation before the Goodacres of Bradmore. Note Elizabeth Goodacre married Jonathan Clements 18.3.1779, Willoughby on the Wolds, possibly the Elizabeth who received £5. In Willoughby 1841 / 1851, Jonathan Goodacre born Willoughby 1778 married to Ann, with children Jonathan born 1814, William 1816 and John 1829.

**Thomas** Goodacre, born c1760. Farmer of Bradmore, at Blackcliffe Farm. Married to Anne Savage, widow of John, at Bunny by licence 18.5.1784, no parishes specified. 1785 took over land tax payments £1/3/8½d p.qtr. on what had been John Savage's land holding, 1785 -1816, when reduced to £1/3/4 for that one year, returning to £1/3/8½d 1818-1820. Then taken over by William Goodacre temporarily. Put up bond 23.1.1794 for marriage of John Young of Countersthorpe and Ann Savage of Bunny. In Bunny Estate Survey 1792 with 110 acres 15 perches paying £110/7/8 pa rent including £2/5/9 for house and homestead. Signed Constable's Accounts 1784-1811, served as Constable in 1793, 1802, 1811 and 1814. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas includes 1/- gathered from Thomas Goodacre. 16.12.1790 Constable paid Thomas Goodacre 10/- for Samuel Hardy's coals. March 1801 Constable paid expenses for himself and Mr Goodacre going to Heanor and to Smaley, 16/-. 1808-9 rented lanes for £1/1/- pa. March 1814 paid the Constable £9/15/- for William Elliott (deceased)'s horse and cart. 1814 Mr Goodacre rented Pasture Lane at £3/15/- and Plumtree Lane at 9/-. 1815 he had Pasture Lane for £3/4/-. 1818 rented Ramper and town grazing for 9/6, and bought yarn 18/9 from the Constable. Died 3.3.1821 aged 61, buried south side of Bunny churchyard. 'Eternal God guide thou the mind / of those that I have left behind / Let grace and virtue join on earth / To make them happy after death.' Thomas Goodacre noted in burial registers buried 2.4.1821 age 62?

**Ann** Goodacre, born c1739, wife of Thomas and relict of John Savage of Bradmore. Widowed in c.1782 and married Thomas at Bunny by licence 18.5.1784, no parishes specified. Died 3.11.1811 aged 72. Buried Bunny 6.12.1811. 'One here inclos'd in silent slumber lies / Who in her lifetime sought the only prize / There's one thing needful, that desired she / To live with Christ to all eternity.' See Savage.

**William** Goodacre took over land tax payments of £1/3/8½d for 1821 only on death of Thomas, before land passed to James Goodacre. May be the William Goodacre paid by the Constable in 1794 for catching sparrows.

**James** Goodacre born 19.4.1787, bapt. Bunny 5.6.1787, son of Thomas, farmer, and Ann of Bradmore. Probably the James Goodacre paid by the Constable in 1792 and 1794 for catching sparrows. Possibly married Elizabeth Madkin or Madlain, 25.11.1810 at Normanton on Soar. Signed Constables Accounts 1801-2, 1808-10, served as Constable in 1823, signed the accounts 1824, 1827-32, and served as Constable again in 1832. Took over land tax payments of £1/3/8½d per quarter from Thomas Goodacre's land holding, Blackcliffe Farm, from 1822 to end of record 1832. 1827 land tax schedule described him as farmer. 1830 Methodist Chapel built, 1835 Methodist Church deeds refer to land recently in the occupation of James Goodacre as the site of the new chapel. 1832 Whites Directory, farmer. 1828 witnessed will of Thomas Roobotham. Died 20.9.1833 age 46, buried Bunny 29.9.1833 age 47 on the south side of the churchyard near east end of nave.

**Elizabeth** Goodacre born c1784, Edwalton, wife of James. Possibly nee Madkin or Madlain, married James Goodacre 25.11.1810 at Normanton on Soar. 1841 age 50, farmer, householder, living alone at Blackcliffe (Bradmore 1841/71). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. 1851 age 66, born Edwalton, widow,

farmer of 110 acres employing 5 labourers, householder at Blackcliffe Farm with brother (in law) Samuel, annuitant (note Thomas Goodacre, 1760-1821, had siblings Samuel and Elizabeth, referred to in Rebecca Street's will.) and grandchildren Sarah Maria Butler, Elizabeth Butler, a governess Eliza Bassett, servants Mary Atterley?, Elizabeth Elliot, William Burrows and William Mitchell (Bradmore 1851/27). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1855 (as Mrs.) Kelly's Directory, farmer. Buried Bunny 26.7.1856 age 72,

**Ann** Goodacre daughter of James, farmer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 28.6.1815. Probably Ann Goodacre of Bradmore, of full age, married at Bunny 6.6.1839 to John Butler, coachmaker of St Mary's Nottingham. Mother of Sarah Maria and Elizabeth Butler who were at Blackcliffe in 1851. See Butler.

**Samuel** Goodacre born 1778, Edwalton, brother (in law) of Elizabeth of Edwalton. 1851 age 73, single, annuitant, in Elizabeth's household (Bradmore 1851/27).

**Mary** Goodacre married John Richards of Keyworth at Bunny 27.11.1798

**Arthur Ernest** Goodacre born July 1880 Willoughby on the Wolds, son of William, ag.lab. and Sarah. 1891 age 10, scholar, in parents' house at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1901 age 20, waggoner on farm for Samuel Towle at Manor House, Burton on the Wolds. Jan qtr 1905 married at Loughborough, to Mary Hannah Gilbert, daughter of John, insurance agent, and Beatrice of New Normanton, Derby, and cousin of Samuel Towle of Manor House, Burton on the Wolds. 1911 Arthur Ernest Goodacre age 30, farm labourer, with wife Mary Hannah age 29, born Derby 1882 (married 6 years (1905) with 2 children), Mary Alice 5 born 1906 Burton on the Wolds and Annie Elizabeth 3 born 1908 Burton on the Wolds, living at Bradmore in a house with 3 rooms (Bradmore 55/1911). On electoral roll, house, 1912 only. 7.12.1915 age 35 yrs 5 mths living at 35 Mansfield Rd., Sherwood, Nottingham, farm labourer, enlisted in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Leicesters.

Left to his son John Goodwin 20/-, Francis the daughter (crossed out) of John Davis my daughter 20/-, residue to Elizabeth Goodwin, daughter and executrix. Witnessed by Richard Henson and Henry Lacy, and Thomas Barlow. Inventory 29.11.1697, document is very faint, includes 2 cows 1 heifer and a calf £6, barley and wheat in the barn £6; one cob of hay in the close £2; one ... of wheat growing in the field £1/6/-; ... one pigg 6/8; ... one box and bedding and one bed ... £1/3/-; one chest ... 4/-; ... 2 brass pans and one ... 15/-; one ... copper and 5 barrells 10/-; ... other things unseen and forgotten 2/- ... Total £23/8/10. Bond £40, 18.12.1697.

**John** Goodwin son of George Goodwin, miller, mentioned in his will 1697.

**Francis** Goodwin daughter of George, married John Davis, already married when mentioned in George's will 1697.

**Elizabeth** Goodwin daughter of George, miller, and executrix of his will 1697.

**George** Goodwin married Ann Taylor at Bunny 20.6.1771, no parishes specified.

**Elizabeth** Goodwin bapt. Bunny 8.6.1772, daughter of George and Ann of Bradmore.

**William** Goodwin bapt. 5.1.1776, son of George and Ann of Bradmore.

**Elizabeth** Goodwin born c1807, Southwell, maiden name not known. Married to John Goodwin of Dethick. 1841 John age 34, farmer, with wife Elizabeth age 30 and children John 9, Thomas 7, Edward 6 and George 5, at Dethick. 1851 Elizabeth age 43 widow, farmer, with children Thomas 17, Mary 9 scholar both born Ashover and Richard 6 scholar born Codnor Park, and cousin Humphrey Goodwin 45 agent born Crich plus servants, at Codnor Park. 1861 Elizabeth age 53 born Southwell, widow, with children Thomas 27 clerk born Dethick, Mary 19 governess born Dethick and Richard 17 clerk born Codnor Park plus servant at Butterley Hill, Ripley. 1871 age 64, retired farmer's widow, householder in a cottage by Manor Farm (Bradmore 1871/16).

**Edward** Goodwin born c1835, Dethick, bapt 14.6.1835. 1841 age 6 son of John Goodwin, farmer, and Elizabeth, of Dethick. 1851 age 15, lodger, assistant to Thomas Thoresby, farm bailiff at Butterley Farm House, Pentrich, Derbyshire. 1861 age 25, single, farm bailiff on 270 acre farm with 5 men and 6 boys at Elton, Nottinghamshire. Married Apr.qtr. 1865, Bingham district. On Bradmore electoral roll 1870 in category £12+ rent pa, then 1871-76 in £50+ category. 1871 age 36, farmer of 200 acres, Manor Farm, employing 3 labourers and 2 boys, married to Emma, children Mary A and David, servants Ann Richards, Elizabeth James, Henry Stapleford, John James (Bradmore 1871/18). 1871/2 Guardian, salary £1. 1876 PO Directory, farmer. Edward Goodwin appeared in 1870 East Leake Charity accounts carting coals, and 1871 also signing the accounts and taking charity dole to Widow Henson of Bradmore, with similar entries up to 1876. Rented grazing on Mill Lane 1870 and 1871 served as Guardian. No subsequent record found.

**Emma** Goodwin born c1833, Elton nee Ridge, daughter of David, farmer, and Elizabeth. 1841 age 8

in parents' house at Elton. 1851 age 18 single in brother Thomas's house, farmer of 165 acres at The Pasture, Hickling. 1861 age 28, farmer's daughter, visiting Robert Marriott, farmer at Old Dalby. Her marriage record not found, Edward Goodwin married Apr,qtr. 1865, Bingham district. 1871 married to Edward (Bradmore 1871/18). 1881 Emma age 48 born Elton, married but husband not present, with children Ann M 13 scholar born Hickling, David 11 scholar and Emma 8 both born Bradmore, at Market St., Bingham. 1891 Emma age 58 married, husband not present, living on own means, with children Elizabeth 24 born Elton, Emma 18 born Bradmore, at Long Acre East, Bingham. 1901 Emma age 68 widow on own means with grand-daughter Dorothy M Hardstaff 10 born Bingham, at Long Acre, Bingham. 1911 Emma age 78 widow on private means with daughter Elizabeth 44 single, domestic housekeeper, in 4-room house at Long Acre, Bingham.

**Ann Mary** Goodwin born 1868, Hickling, bapt. Bunny 24.11.1870, daughter of Edward, farmer and Emma of Bradmore. 1871 Mary A age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/18). 1881 age 13, scholar, in mother's house.

**David Ridge** Goodwin born Bradmore 1870, bapt. Bunny 24.11.1870, son of Edward, farmer, and Emma of Bradmore. 1871 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/18). 1881 David R age 11 scholar in mother's house. 1891 David Ridge Goodwin age 21 draper's asst in a row of houses with many other draper's assistants, cook and saleswomen, at 22/24/26/28 Darley Hall St., Bradford (no head of household). 1901 David R age 31 boarder, ironfounder's agent, in house of Ann Olverryhouse, widow living on own means, at 15 Avondale Rd., Derby. 1911 age 41, single, surveyor of highways for RDC, at Bingham Notts, 2-room house.

**Emma** Goodwin, born 1873 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 21.5.1876 (marginal note bapt. at same time Mary Alice was bapt.), daughter of Edward, farmer, and Emma of Bradmore. 1881 age 8 born Bradmore, in mother's house.

**Mary Alice** Goodwin bapt. Bunny 7.2.1876, daughter of Edward, farmer and Emma of Bradmore, buried Bunny 24.3.1877 age 1 year.

**Robert** Goodwin born 1813 Codnor Park, Derbys, son of Elizabeth, brother of George Goodwin farmer of Langar born 1806 Codnor (see below under George Goodwin), and possibly brother of John born 1807 husband of Elizabeth (see above, born 1807 Southwell). 1838 Jul.qtr. Bingham district, married Mary Ann Morris daughter of Samuel, farmer, and Sarah of Langar. 1851 Robert age 38 farmer of 308 acres employing 4 labourers with wife Mary Ann age 33 born Barnston, and children Mary Ann 10, Thomas 10, scholars, Sarah Elizabeth 5, Emma 3 and Robert 9 mths all born Gamston, and brother in law Thomas Morris 37 born Barnstone, assistant on farm, at Gamston. 1861 age 48, farmer of 310 acres employing 6 labourers, 2 men, 4 boys, with wife Mary Ann age 43 born Barnstone and children Mary Ann 22, Thomas 20 lace warehouseman both born Langar, George 17 born Codnor Park, Emma 13, Robert 10, Harriett 8 all born Gamston, at Gamston. On Bunny estate rental of 1867 renting house, buildings, orchard and land 200 acres, 2 roods, 30 perches, annual rent £335 pa. On Bradmore electoral roll with land, 1863/4-1870. Probably at Manor Farm. 1871 Robert age 58 farmer of 308 acres employing 4 labourers, with wife Mary Ann age 53 and children Emma 23, Robert 20, Harriett 18, Jane 16 all born Gamston, at Gamston. 1881 Robert age 68 farmer of 308 acres employing 4 men and 4 boys, with Mary A age 62, children Emma age 33, Robert 30, Lucy 24 and Jane 21 all born Gamston, and servants. Robert Goodwin died 11.2.1889, Gamston. Will proved 25.6.1889 at Nottingham by surviving executor John Hornbuckle Lowe of West Bridgford, personal effects £1733/14/-.

**Mary Ann** Goodwin nee Morris, born 1819 Barnston, daughter of Samuel, farmer, and Sarah nee James, of Langar with Barnston. Married Robert Goodwin Jul.qtr. 1838, Bingham district. 1851 age 33 married to Robert, at Gamston. 1861 age 43 married to Robert, at Gamston. 1871 age 53 married to Robert. 1881 age 62 married to Robert. 1891 Mary Ann, head of household, widow, age 72, retired farmer born Barnston, with daughter Jane 31 born Gamston, and grandsons Robert William Goodwin 18 butcher's apprentice and George Mullen 16 lace warehouse apprentice, both born Bradmore, plus servant, at Grantham Road, West Bridgford, Nottingham. Mary Ann Goodwin died Jan.qtr. 1889, Basford.

**George** Goodwin born c1844, Codnor Park, Derby, son of Robert and Elizabeth. 1851 George age 7 born Codnor Park, scholar, in house of uncle George Goodwin age 43 born Codnor, single, farmer of 400 acres employing 13 labourers, with George junior's grandmother Elizabeth Goodwin, widow, age 81 born Calow, Derby, annuitant, plus servants, at Langar. 1861 age 17 in parents' house at Gamston. 1864 Whites Directory, Bradmore, farmer. 1869 Morris's Directory, farmer. 1870 cited in Bradmore tenants valuation of the farm opposite the chapel, later Rufford Lodge, transferring from Levy Sharp to John Randall. 1870 served as Waywarden, salary 10/-, 1872 Guardian, 1876 Waywarden, salary 7/6. Rented grazing on Plumtree Lane 1868-70, and on Pendock Lane 1870. On electoral roll in 1870 in category £12+ rent pa, and from 1871-76 in £50+ category. 1871 age 27, farmer of 200 acres,

Debdale Farm, employing 3 men and 3 boys. Married but no entry for wife. Possibly married Katherine Amelia. Household includes servants William Knight (groom), John Whittaker, Martha Marriott and visitor Annie Smith (Bradmore 1871/5). 1876 PO Directory, farmer. Witnessed rental agreement between Ann Bosworth, widow, and Harriett Forteith of Bunny Hall. 1881 George age 37, valuer, estate agent born Codnor Park, Derbyshire, with wife Katherine age 30 born Knipton Norfolk, and children Robert W 7, George M 6, Kathleen 4 born Bradmore, living at Beeston. George Goodwin died Oct.qtr. 1884, Basford district.

**Robert William** Goodwin bapt. Bunny 13.7.1873, son of George, farmer, and Katherine Amelia of Bradmore. 1881 age 7 in parents' house at Beeston. 1891 Robert William age 18 butcher's apprentice in grandmother Mary Ann Goodwin's house. Not found 1901. 1911 Robert William age 35 single born Bradmore, butcher, visitor in house of George Marshall, commercial traveller (drapery) and family at 64 Kingsley Ave., West Ealing, Middx.

**George Mullen** Goodwin bapt. Bunny 20.3.1875, son of George, farmer and Katherine Amelia of Bradmore. 1881 age 6 in parents' house at Beeston. 1891 age 16, lace warehouse apprentice born Bradmore, in grandmother's house. 1899 Apr.qtr., Basford, George Mullen Goodwin married Linna Cooke. Not found 1901. 1911 age 35 lace agent and merchant on own account working at home, with wife Linna Cooke Goodwin age 41 born Crowland, Lincs (married 11 years with 1 child), Linna Mary 7 born Plumtree Notts, living at 23 Roseberry Ave., West Bridgford, Nottingham, 7-room house.

**Kathleen** Goodwin born Bradmore 1877, daughter of George and Katherine. 1881 age 4 in parents' house, Beeston. 1904 Apr.qtr. Kathleen Goodwin married George Marshall, Empingham, Norfolk. 1911 George Marshall age 35 born Halesworth, Suffolk 1876, commercial traveller (drapery) with wife Kathleen age 33 born Beeston (married 6 years with 2 children), Kathleen Marjorie 5 and Stanley George 4 both born West Ealing, and visitor Robert William Goodwin 35 butcher born Bradmore (Kathleen's brother), at 64 Kingsley Ave., West Ealing, Middx.

**George** Goodwin, born c1864 Nottingham. 1881 age 17, single, farm indoor servant in the household of Thomas Morris, Barn Close (Bradmore 1881/17).

**Sarah** Gothard of Bradmore married William Dexter of Bradmore, 13.7.1826.

#### GOULDING

**Jarvis** Golding arraigned before church courts for dancing on a Sunday, 1618. His sister married Harold Mapples, another of the Bradmore Morris Dancers. Gervas Goulding married Jane Bond at Bunny 16.11.1619. Daughters Elizabeth bapt. 8.12.1623, and Mary bapt. 16.12.1621, at Bunny.

**Richard** Goulding, weaver, of Bradmore. Will dated 18.11.1627, proved 8.5.1628.

**Thomas** Goulding married Jane Cragg at Bunny 12.8.1662.

**Jane** Goulding bapt. Bunny 10.1.1664, daughter of Thomas and Jane of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Goulding married Susanna Butler, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 6.6.1665. Thomas Goulding on 1674 Hearth Tax Return with 2 hearths.

**Susanna** Goulding, parish not recorded, buried Bunny 14.3.1693, possibly Susanna wife of Thomas Goulding.

**Richard** Goulding bapt. Bunny 29.4.1666, son of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**William** Golding bapt. Bunny 15.12.1667, son of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**Susanna** Goulding bapt. Bunny 7.11.1669, daughter of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore. Susanna Golding married John Mee 12.6.1688 at Bunny. Executrix of his will c1704. Thomas Golding signed the bond for John Mee's will with Susanna Mee nee Golding, and carried out the inventory of John Mee's goods after his death c1704. This Thomas could be Susanna's father or her brother.

**Anne** Goulding bapt. Bunny 28.7.1672, daughter of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**Elizabeth** Goulding bapt. Bunny 25.11.1673, daughter of Thomas and Susann of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Goulding bapt. Bunny 25.4.1675, son of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**Issabel and Mary** Golding bapt. Bunny 25.10.1676, twin daughters of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**Sarah** Golding bapt. 19.1.1681, daughter of Thomas and Susannah of Bradmore.

**Hanna** Goldring bapt. Bunny 8.7.1683, daughter of Thomas and Susanna of Bradmore.

**Elizabeth** Gray bapt. Bunny 15.4.1638, daughter of George and Mary of Bradmore.

**William** Green born c1831. 1841 age 10, in the household of Catherine Bosworth (Bradmore 1841/8).

**James** Greenwood born 1844 Leicester. 1871 age 27, framework knitter with wife Sarah 27, born Leicester, and niece Sarah Fox age 12 born Leicester, at Marl Pits, Ruddington. 1881 James age 37 framework knitter master with wife Sarah Ann age 36 and children William 9, Harriet 7 scholars, John 3 and Ann 11 mths all born Ruddington, plus niece Sarah Fox 23 stocking seamer, at Wilford Road, Ruddington. 1891 James age 47 hosier with wife Sarah Ann age 47 and children William 19 student for schoolmaster, John 13, Annie 10, Francis 8 scholars all born Ruddington, and brother John Greenwood age 60 framework knitter born Leicester, at Marlpit, Ruddington. 1901 James age 57 hosiery manufacturer, employer, with wife Sarah 57 and children John 23 manager of hosiery factory, Francis 18 fitter and hosiery machine builder, at Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1911 James age 67, hosiery mens half-hose, employer, with wife Sarah age 66 (married 45 years (1866) with 9 children, 5 dead), at Wilford Rd, Ruddington. (1841 Thomas Grimley age 40 male servant with wife Mary age 40 and children Mary 17, Elizabeth 15 at Winkbourn, Notts.) 1845 William Grimley married Eliza Parsons, Jul.qtr., Stamford district. 1851 William age 28 born Bradmore, gardener, with wife Eliza 32 born Ashton Northants, children Sarah Ann 4 born Bingham, Mary Jane 2 and Eliza E 11 mths both born Bunny, at Hoveringham. 1861 William age 38 publican and gardener with wife Eliza 41, children Sarah 14, Elizabeth 11 and Georgina 4, scholars born Hoveringham, at Lowdham. 1871 William age 48 inn keeper with wife Eliza age 51 and daughter Elizabeth 20 at East Bridgford. 1881 William age 59 retired publican with wife Eliza 62 in Eliza's brother's house, William Parsons single 67 retired farmer born Ashton Northants, and his niece Flora A Wilson 9 scholar born Edwinstowe, at East Bridgford. 1891 William age 69 and Eliza age 72 in Eliza's brother William Parsons' house, with Eliza's sister Ann Harris, widow ag 79 born Ashton, at East Bridgford. William Grimley born 1822 died April qtr 1893, Bingham district.

**Thomas** Grundy, born c1819 at Carlton. 1861 Thomas Grundy age 42 born Carlton, stationmaster, with wife Mary age 38 born Newark and children Thomas 15 railway porter born Bleasby, Louisa 12, Henry 9, William 8 scholars all born Southwell, George 4, John Farrand Grundy 2, Alice Mary 5 days, born Eagle Hall, at the railway station, Eagle Hall Lincs. 1871 Thomas age 52 coal dealer with wife Mary 48 and children George 14, John F 12, Alice M 10 scholars born Swinderby, daughter Louisa Wells 22 born Southwell and her husband Edwin J Wells 23 with their daughter Felicia A Wells 2 mths born Barrowby, plus a lodger (railway porter), at Swinderby. 1881 age 62 householder in farm house, farmer of 114 acres, Manor Farm, married to Mary with children George and Alice Mary, grand-daughter Constance Ellen Wells, servants George Hensher and William James (Bradmore 1881/16). 1881 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1884 rented grazing on Plumtree Lane. 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager. 1888 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1891 age 72, retired farmer, living on Farmer St. south end, near Orchard House, with grand-daughter Constance Wells (Bradmore 1891/38). On electoral roll 1883-5 in category £50+ rent pa, and with land & tenement 1886-1898. Died 23.10.1897 aged 79, buried 26.10.1897 in Bunny churchyard, south-east section.

**Mary** Grundy born c1823, Newark, nee Atkinson, married at Newark 1843. 1861 age 38 married to Thomas, at Eagle Hall Lincs. 1871 age 48 married to Thomas, at Swinderby. 1881 age 58, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1881/16). 1891 age 68 (Bradmore 1891/38). Died 14.3.1898 aged 75, buried Bunny 17.3.1898 with Thomas in south-east section of churchyard.

**Thomas** Grundy born c1846, Bleasby, son of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 15, railway porter, in parents' house at Eagle Hall railway station. 1871 Thomas age 26 railway station master with wife Ann age 26 born Garwell, Northants, and children Thomas 5 born Ketton and George 6 mths born Collingham, at Station Rd., North Collingham Notts. 1881 Thomas age 36 railway station master for Midland Railway, with wife Ann 35 and children Thomas R 18 railway clerk, George W 10, Rose E 9, Bertha A 7, Albert E 5 scholars born Collingham and Lauria A 2 born Bardon Hill Leics, at Station House, Bardon Hill. 1891 Thomas age 45 beerhouse keeper and coal merchant with wife Ann age 45

barmaid and children George W 20 carter, Rose E 19 milliner, dress, Bertha A 17 domestic servant, Albert E 15 railway low? dept, all born Collingham, plus Aline L 11 and Lenox A 9 scholars born Bardon Hill Leics, at Moulders Arms, Brightside Bierlow, Sheffield. Died at Bradmore 6.9.1895 aged 49, buried 9.9.1895 in south-east section of Bunny churchyard, gravestone commemorates him as beloved husband of Ann Grundy, Treeton, Yorks (west of Sheffield).

**Louisa** Grundy born 1849, Southwell, daughter of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 12 in parents' house. 1870 Jul.qtr., Nottingham district, Louisa Grundy married Edwin Joseph Wells of Claypole Lincs, son of Joseph, cordwainer, and Ann of Swinderby. 1871 Louisa age 22 and Edwin Wells age 23 shoemaker born Claypole plus their daughter Felicia A, 2 mths, born Barrowby, in Thomas and Mary's house at Swinderby. 1873 had a second daughter, Constance (see Wells). Louisa died 1874, Basford district.

**George** Grundy, born c1857 at Eagle, Lincs, son of Thomas and Mary. 1861 age 4 in parents' house at Eagle Hall. 1871 age 14 in parents' house at Swinderby. 1879/80-1883 George Grundy signed the Bradmore Methodist Sunday School accounts. 1881 age 24, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/16). 7.3.1882 George Grundy, farmer of Bradmore, son of Thomas, farmer, married Emma Jackson of Bradmore, daughter of Richard, farmer, at Bunny. Wife Emma died Oct.1885. Sunday School secretary 1885, Superintendent 1886 and 1888-95. Sunday school teacher 1<sup>st</sup> class boys Jul. 1887-Dec. 1888, deleted in 1889. Jan.qtr. 1888 Madeley district, Shropshire, George Grundy married Alice Emily Owen daughter of John, confectioner, and Martha of Much Wenlock. Bradmore electoral roll, house with no county vote, 1890-1897, then land & tenement 1898-9. 6.10.1889 Mr Grundy paid 3d for Sankey. 1891 age 34, farmer, married to Alice, children Harry and George, living at Manor Farm with nephew Charles A Harvy and servants Julia Attewell, John A Claxton (Bradmore 1891/33). Audited Sunday School accounts 1892. 1892/3 served on Sunday School rules committee, 1894-8 on leaders meeting. 1894 Methodist church trustee, to 1924, resigned. Listed as Sunday School teacher Jan.1894-July 1895, Sept and Dec 1895 and occasionally through 1896 and to end Feb.1897. 1894-7 served on choir committee. 1894-8 Methodist Society Steward. 1894 Whites Directory, farmer. 1895 Kellys Directory, farmer. Bradmore parish councillor and Overseer of the Poor, 1895 and 1896. 1897 parish council employed a man to clean out the open ditches at the north end of the village running between Mr Grundy's fields and Mr Ford's, now in a filthy state; Mr G Grundy to pay one half the cost of cleaning out the ditch adjoining his fields. 1898 contributed £1 to Bunny Clock Fund memorial to 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign. 1901 George age 43, carter on farm, born Swinderby Lincs, with wife Alice Emily age 42 born Much Wenlock and children George Owen 12, William Morris 8, John Andrew 5 all born Bradmore, at Sugden House, Bingley, Yorks. 1903 still listed as farmer and church trustee in Methodist Church deeds. Alice Emily died Jul.qtr. 1905, Wakefield. Jan.qtr. 1910 Wakefield district George Grundy married Emma Craven. 1911 George age 55 domestic gardener with wife Emma age 35 born Leeds (married 1 year, no children), with sons from previous marriages George Owen, William Morris and John Andrew all born Bradmore, at Stoney Lane, East Ardsley nr. Wakefield, 4-room house.

**Emma** Grundy born c1858, nee Jackson, daughter of Richard, farmer, and Ann, 1<sup>st</sup> wife of George. Married George 7.3.1882 at Bunny. Died 4.10.1885 in her 28th year, buried Bunny 6.10.1885, beloved wife of George Grundy of Bradmore, in south-east section of churchyard.

**Harry Jackson** Grundy, born 17.4.1884, Bradmore, bapt. 16.6.1884 Bradmore Methodist Church, son of George and Emma. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4<sup>th</sup> class 15.4.1888-Dec.1889, 3<sup>rd</sup> class Jan.1890-Dec.1891, 2<sup>nd</sup> class Jan.1892-Dec.1894, 1<sup>st</sup> class Jan.1895-6.11.1898. 1891 age 6 in George and Alice Emily's house (Bradmore 1891/33). 1898 apprentice fee applied for by Alice Emily, granted on condition indentures seen by two Governors of the Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1900 minuted in the Charities book that he was not apprenticed in 1898 so did not receive the fee, so a fresh application was made, granted, and the indentures were read by the Governors. 1901 age 16, single, blacksmith living with grandmother Ann Jackson (Emma Grundy's mother) on Village St (Main St) (Bradmore 38/1901). Outgoing apprentice fee of £2/10/- paid to H Grundy July 1906. 1911 age 26, blacksmith shoeing, employed, with wife Jessie Emily age 24 born Ruddington (married 1 year with 1 child), George Ernest 6 mths born Selby, at Haigh's Yard, Micklegate, Selby, Yorks, 3-room house.

**Alice Emily** Grundy, born c1858, Much Wenlock, Shrops, nee Owen, daughter of John, confectioner, and Martha of Much Wenlock. 2<sup>nd</sup> wife of George. 1861 age 3 in parents' house. 1871 age 13 in parents' house. 1881 age 23, housemaid for Anna Samuells, annuitant, at Paddington, London. Second wife of George Grundy, married Jan.qtr. 1888, Madeley district, Shropshire. 1891 age 33, married to George Grundy (Bradmore 1891/33). Mrs Grundy was Sunday School teacher 1896, Jan 1897-Feb.1898. 1896 assisted with the choir at the anniversary. Mrs Grundy applied to Bunny & Bradmore Charities asking for the apprentice fee for her son, May 1898 - probably for Harry who

would then be 14. £10 granted on condition the indentures were seen by two Charity Governors. 1901 age 42 married to George. Alice Grundy died before 1910.

**George Owen** Grundy born 24.12.1888, Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 20.1.1889, son of George and Alice Emily. 1891 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/33). Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Boys Jan.1893-Dec.1895 (sick Dec.1894), 3<sup>rd</sup> class Jan.1896-June 1898, 2<sup>nd</sup> class July 1898-26.3.1899. 1901 age 12 in parents' house. 1911 age 22, single, ironworker, barrowman, pig iron, in father George's house at Stoney Lane, East Ardsley, nr. Wakefield.

**William Morris** Grundy born 14.4.1892 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 25.5.1892, son of George and Alice Emily. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry boys 12.4.1896-June 1898, 3<sup>rd</sup> class 3.7.1898-2.4.1899, then deleted from the register. 1901 age 8 in parents' house. 1911 age 18, single, coalmine pony driver underground, in father George's house at Stoney Lane, East Ardsley nr. Wakefield.

**John Andrew** Grundy born 27.4.1895 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 5.6.1895, son of George and Alice Emily. 1901 age 5 in parents' house. 1911 age 15, single, coalmine hurrier? underground, in father George's house at Stoney Lane East Ardsley nr. Wakefield.

**Emma** Grundy born 1976, Leeds, nee Craven, married George Grundy Jan.qtr. 1910, Wakefield district. 1911 age 35 married to George 1 year, no children, at Wakefield..

**Alice Mary** Grundy born 1861, Eagle Lincs, daughter of Thomas, farmer, and Mary. 1861 age 5 days in parents' house. 1871 age 10 scholar in parents' house. 1881 age 20 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/16). Alice Mary of Bradmore married William Hutchinson, farmer of Bradmore, son of John, farmer, at Bunny 8.8.1882. See Hutchinson.

## GUNN

(**Richard** Gunn son of Richard and Mary christened 11.3.1698, Ruddington. Not definitely linked to Richard of Bradmore.)

**Richard** Gunn, husbandman of Bradmore. married Mary Street at Ruddington 9.5.1721. Buried Bunny 22.10.1748. Will dated 31.4.1746, proved 1.11.1748. Left all goods, cattle, chattells, stock and husbandry and all estate to his wife Mary Gunn, his executor. Inventory 19.10.1748, comprising: purse and apparel £5, pease? upon the Hovil £40, wheat unthrashed £60, barley unthrashed £20, hay on the ground £40, 16 horses £64, 25 cows £85, 7 store sheep £42, 12 swine £3/5/-; crops? sowed and unsowed £80, carts, waggons ploughs harrows and implements of husbandry £25/10/-; goods in the house and fire irons, brick irons, pewter and other goods £8/10/-; goods in the kitchen £5/5/-; goods in the best parlour £3/10/-; goods in the little parlour 15/-; goods in the best chamber £10/15/-; goods in the cheese chamber £10/5/-; the chamber over the dairy £8/10/-; 2 chambers over the kitchen £2/10/-; chamber over the little parlour £5/10/-; goods out of sight and forgotten £2/5/-; total inventory £525, by Thomas Glover. Bond 19.10.1748 £1,050 by Mary Gunn widow and Samuel Wells of Willoughby, farmer. Identity of farm not established, believed to be too large for Blackcliffe so possibly Rancliffe (new farmhouse built 1736), as occupants of other large farms in the village are known at this date.

**Mary** Gunn nee Street, of Bradmore, widow of Richard. Buried Bunny 28.12.1757. Will dated 3.1.1749, proved 21.1.1757. Samuel Wells of Willoughby husbandman, Humphrey Wainwright of Bunny, clockmaker, joint executors, and John Harwood of Bradmore, farmer, executor. Left to Richard Walker junior son of Richard Walker senior, husbandman, £50. To Dina Walker daughter of Richard £20. To Elizabeth Walker daughter of Richard £20. To Rebecca Walker youngest daughter of Richard £50. To her brother William Street of Bradmore, husbandman, £5. To Elizabeth Palmer wife of William Palmer of Bradmore, tailor, £1/1/-. To Mary Lee wife of William Lee of Bradmore taylor £1/1/-. To Ann Street daughter of William Street £1/1/-. To Martha Street daughter of William £1/1/-. To Hannah Street daughter of William £1/1/-. Residue to sister Rebecca Walker wife of Richard. Executors get £5 each. Inventory of 28.12.1756 included: purse and apparel £5; in the house £3; in the Great Parlour £2/10/-; in the Little Parlour £1; in the kitchen £2/10/-; in the 3 chambers over the house £10; in the Cheese Chamber and 2 lodging chambers £10; 15 horses £60; 30 cows £60; sheep £20; swine £5; white corn in the barn unthrashed £50; peas unthrashed £50; hay £20; corn growing upon the ground £50; implements of husbandry £10; total £359, by John Walker and Thomas Glover. Bond 5.1.1757. Identity of farm not established, possibly Rancliffe.

**Elizabeth** Gunn daughter of Richard and Mary of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 24.1.1722. Buried Bunny 6.2.1722.

**Thomas** Gunn carried out inventory of goods of Joseph Tomson 1727 and of Hugh Alsop 1730.

**Hannah** Gunn married Thomas Marriott of Bradmore at Bunny 10.12.1811.

**Thomas** Gunn born 27.4.1791 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 28.4.1791, son of John, farmer, and Ann. Married Mary Glover, both of Bradmore, 13.10.1817. 1841 Thomas Gunn age 45, carrier, with wife Mary age 45 and children Mary 20, William 14, George 12, Martha 10, Sarah 5, at East Leake. Died

before 1847, referred to in John Glover's will as late carrier of East Leake.

**Mary** Gunn born 1791 nee Glover, daughter of John and Mary, married Thomas Gunn of Bradmore 13.10.1817. Received bequest in her brother John's will 1847 when a widow.

**Martha** Gunn bapt. Bunny 9.2.1818, daughter of Thomas, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore.

**James** Gunn bapt. Bunny 15.11.1819, son of Thomas, labourer and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 20, joiner at East Leake. 1841 Oct.qtr. Loughborough, married Rosamond Cumberland. 1851 age 32 carpenter with wife Rosamond age 32 born East Leake and children Thomas 9, John 6, both born Quorndon, at Clinton St., Leicester. 1861 age 42, carpenter, with wife Rosamond age 42 and children Thomas 18 carpenter, John 16 shoemaker both born Quorndon, Catherine 8, Alice 1 both born Leicester, at 7 Clinton St., Leicester. 1871 age 52, carpenter, with wife Rosamond age 52 and daughter Catherine 19 hosiery mender, at 8 Johnson St., Leicester. 1881 age 62, carpenter, with wife Rosamond age 62, in married daughter's house; William Simpson age 30 hosiery warehouseman and wife Catherine A age 28 hosiery mender and their children Rosamund 8, John Albert 3, Marian R 7 mths all born Leicester, at 104 Clipstone St., Leicester. 1882 Oct.qtr., Rosamond Gunn died, Leicester. 1891 James age 72, widower, carpenter, father in law in house of William Simpson, 40 hosiery warehouseman and Catherine 38, with their children, at 104 Clipstone St., Leicester. James Gunn died Apr.qtr. 1900, Leicester.

**Thomas** Gunn of Ruddington married Mary Marriott of Bradmore 2.7.1822. Farmer at Ruddington. Died before 1841 (possibly before 1830 from birth dates of known children); his wife continued to run the farm.

**Mary** Gunn born 1785 Bradmore, nee Marriott, daughter of John and Elizabeth, married Thomas 2.7.1822. 1841 Mary age 50, farmer, with children Mary 15, Thomas 17, on East side of The Green, Ruddington. 1851 age 64 farmer of 70 acres employing two labourers, with her son Thomas 26 born 1824 Ruddington, daughter Mary 24 born 1827 Ruddington, dressmaker, and her brother John Marriott and niece Elizabeth Marriott both born Bradmore, at Ruddington. Died before 1861.

**Samuel Roberts** Gunn, born c1803, St Peter's parish (Ruddington or Nottingham). As widower, was married 2.8.1840 at Bunny to Ann Treece of Bradmore, of full age. 1841 Samuel age 35 gardener with wife Anne 40 and son James 4, at Ruddington. 1851 age 48, gardener, married to Ann, at Red Lion St Ruddington. 1861 Samuel age 58, widower, gardener, labourer, solo at 5 Butler's Yard, Ruddington. 1871 not found. 1881 Samuel R Gunn widower age 79, gardener, at Church St, Ruddington, solo. Samuel Roberts Gunn born 1803 died Jan.qtr. 1887, Basford district.

**Ann** Gunn born 1798 nee Treece, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore, married Samuel 2.8.1840. 1841 Ann age 40, married to Samuel, with son James age 4, at Ruddington. 1851 age 52 married to Samuel, at Ruddington. Ann died before 1861.
