

INGRAM

Thomas Ingram born 1880, Wilboston Northants. 1901 age 19, baker and breadmaster boarder with James Sharp grocer's warehouseman, Kettering. 1911 age 30, farmer born Wilboston with wife Dinah age 43 born Gretton Northants (married 1 year, no children), with stepchildren Olive Annie 17 dairymaid, John Thomas 15, both born Sheffield, and Grace Ethel Olive 4 born Kettering plus 2 servants at Thatcher's Barn, West Hallam, Derby. On Bradmore electoral roll at Rancliffe Farm, 1920-1939/40, married to Dinah. Mens Institute committee member 1923/4, chairman 1925/6 and 1927-9, committee member 1929-1943, chairman 1940-2. 1927 village pump and well dismantled from outside his property, lead from the well sold, Thomas Ingram took responsibility for the safety of the filled in well. 1930s Thomas Ingram with smallholding and shop on Main St., at PO site (Morrismen booklet). Pork butcher (Source: J Randall). Parish Councillor 1923-31, then Treasurer 1932-43. 1938 under the ARP Scheme, appointed with Alf Lees in charge of Medical Services and First Aid. Parish councillor for 21 years, death noted in minutes of 11.11.1943, letter of condolence to his widow. Thomas Ingram died Sept qtr 1943, Kettering district.

Dinah Ingram born 1869, Gretton Northants, previously married to John Ingram of Twyford, Leics married Thomas Ingram 1910. 1901 Dinah age 33 born Gretton with husband John 37 fish salesman and daughter Olive 7 born Sheffield at 102 Kirkwhite St., Nottingham. 1911 age 43 married to Thomas, (married 1 year, no children, but with 3 children from previous marriage). On Bradmore electoral roll at Rancliffe Farm 1920-1939/40. 1925-9 Mrs Ingram was paid from Sunday School accounts for supply of sweets and nuts. 1928 Kellys Directory, shopkeeper. Listed as WI member 1931-51, treasurer to 1933. On electoral roll 1945-1951, no address given. Built 19 Main St. (Bella Vista) when retired from the shop. Dinah Ingram died March qtr. 1951, Basford district.

Olive Annie Ingram, born 1894 Sheffield, daughter of Dinah and John (1st marriage). 1901 age 7 in parents' house in Nottingham. 1911 age 17, dairy maid in Thomas and Dinah's house, West Hallam. 1922 on Sunday School Sports Committee. Founder member of Bunny & Bradmore Lawn Tennis Club. On electoral roll for Main St. 1929/30-1936/7, then without local vote 1937/8-1939/40. Listed as WI member 1931-62, treasurer 1933-1956. 1935 on K George V Jubilee Celebrations committee. 1939 evacuated, Mrs Harrison covered the WI accounts in her absence. On electoral roll May 1945-1955, no address given, then at Bella Vista, Main St. 1956-62. 1953 on Coronation Festivities Committee, collected public subscriptions on the south side of Main St. together with Miss Onyon. 1953/4 appointed auditor for the Mens Institute accounts. Kept the village shop and made ice cream, which she used to sell on Bank Holidays on the Main Rd., to passing traffic, from outside two houses on the main road. Also sold ice cream at Bunny Church Fetes, and from the back window of her house. In May 1962 parish council noted her passing, after 13 years as parish councillor since 1949. WI noted her death May 1962, sent a spray of flowers to her funeral 8.6.1962.

John Thomas Ingram born 1896 Sheffield, son of Dinah and John (1st marriage). Not found 1901. 1911 age 15 in Thomas and Dinah's house, West Hallam. On electoral roll at The Farm, 1920-autumn 1921.

Grace Ethel Olive Ingram born 1907, Kettering, daughter of Dinah and John (her 1st marriage). 1911 age 4 in Thomas and Dinah's house, West Hallam.

IVATT

Isabel Ivatt of Bradmore married William Sherwinne of Bunny at Bunny 18.1.1568.

Ciciley Ivatt married George Tompson of Gotham at Bunny 5.5.1595.

Ellan Ivatt of Bradmore married Thomas Shewell of Keyworth at Kinoulton 1.5.1597, recorded in Bunny parish registers.

John Ivatt husbandman of Bradmore obtained licence to marry Jane Wright of Glapton, widow, at St Nicholas 27.12.1598. Bond by **Gabriel** Ivatt of Bradmore, husbandman, and John Wrighte of Glapton, husbandman.
