

KEETHLEY/KEITHLEY

Thomas Keethley bapt. Bunny 1.5.1820, son of Sently?, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. Buried 29.5.1820 age 1 month.

Isaac Keithley bapt. Bunny 2.6.1821, son of Sently?, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore.

KENDAL

John Kendal of Bradmore, married Elizabeth Stephenson of Plumtree, 11.7.1756. Buried Bunny 1.7.1757.

Elizabeth Kendal daughter of John and Elizabeth, no parish specified, bapt. 24.5.1757, buried 12.6.1757.

KETTLE

George Kettle born 1857, Old Dalby. 1881 (April) age 23 indoor farm servant at Tollerton, single, working for Mary Russel, widow, farmer born Bradmore. 1881 Oct.qtr. married Mary Murden, daughter of John, ag.lab, and Elizabeth of Plumtree. Living in Bradmore 1883-4. 1891 age 34, farm labourer with wife Mary age 28 born Keyworth and children Horace 7 born Bradmore, Elizabeth 6, Ann 4, Gertrude 2, John G 11 mths all born Radcliffe on Trent, at Back Lane, Radcliffe on Trent. At Holme Pierrepont from 1894. 1901 age 43, stockman on farm, with wife Mary age 37 born Plumtree, children Horace born Bradmore and siblings born at Ratcliffe on Trent up to 1892, then born at Holme Pierrepont, at Holme Pierrepont. 1911 George age 52 with wife Mary 46 born Plumtree (married 29 years, 10 children), with 4 daughters at Radcliffe on Trent.

Horace Kettle born 27.10.1883 Bradmore, bapt. Feb.1884, son of George and Mary. 1891 age 7, born Bradmore, in parents' house at Radcliffe on Trent. 1901 age 17, gardener's assistant, born Bradmore, in parents' house at Holme Pierrepont. Jan.qtr. 1911 Horace Kettle married Ruth Wiggins of Calverton, daughter of Samuel, gardener, and Harriett (born Radcliffe on Trent). 1911 Horace age 27, platelayer for G.N..Railway Co., born Bradmore, with wife Ruth age 29 born Calverton (married less than 1 year, no children), and nephew George Stanley Wiggins 3 born Nottingham, at 7 Mary Terrace, Crocus St., Nottingham, 3-room house.

KEY

Charles Key bapt. 7.11.1841, son of William and Elizabeth of Elston Notts. 1851 age 8 son of William age 39 farmer of 19 acres with wife Mary 29, with 4 other children all born Elston, at Wigsley Rd., North Scarle, Lincs. 1861 age 20, single, carter in the household of Edward G James (Bradmore 1861/22). 15.5.1862, still a minor, Charles labourer of Bradmore, married Sarah Chamberlain, a minor, daughter of Benjamin labourer of Bradmore. 1871 Charles age 29 brickmaker, clay grinder, born Elston with wife Sarah and children Sarah A 5 scholar born Birley Moor and Benjamin 1 born Sheffield, at Blagdon Rd., Sheffield. Charles Key died 1872 Oct.qtr. Sheffield district.

Sarah Key nee Chamberlain daughter of Benjamin of Bradmore, married to Charles at Bunny 15.5.1862, both still minors. 1871 age 27 married to Charles, with 2 children, at Sheffield. Charles Key died 1872, Oct.qtr. 1874 Apr.qtr. Sarah Key married George Cotterill, widower (his wife Mary Ann died Jul.qtr. 1873). See Cotterill.

KIRK

Thomas Kirk son of Thomas and Elizabeth bapt. Bunny 1.5.1749. May be the Thomas who married Elizabeth Huggleston or Haggleston, IGI refs 18.9.1757 or 1758, or 18.9.1763 of Bunny & Bradmore. Possibly the Thomas Kirk of Bradmore buried Bunny 14.6.1772.

Elizabeth Kirk of Bradmore, wife of Thomas, buried Bunny 21.2.1772.

KNIGHT

William Knight born c1852, Nottingham. 1871 age 19, single, groom to George Goodwin at Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1871/5).

KNIGHTON

Richard Knighton of Bradmore born c1704, buried Bunny 1.1.1784, aged 80.

KNYFTON

Richard Knifton married Alice Dikeson at Bunny, 20.4.1747. 1780-1783 paid land tax at 9½d p.qtr. Holding passed to William Lane. Received weekly payments from Bradmore Constable from July 1781 onwards. Jan.1782 Constables accounts show payment for thatching Richard Kington's or Knifton's house. 14.1.1784 Constable paid £1 for Richard's coffin and funeral expenses.

Alice Knyfton nee Dikeson married Richard Knifton at Bunny 20.4.1747. May be daughter of John and Ffrideswide Dickinson, born 15.9.1711. Constable's Accounts 1782 record payments to Alice Knifton for spinning flax, and payments to Alice from Jan.1784 plus flour for her. Oct.1785 the Constable provided 1 dozen of 8½d flax for her, 8/6, and in March 1788 provided a dozen of 9d flax, 9/-. Widow of Richard, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 31.1.1789. Jan.1789 the Constable paid Richard Henson and Richard Walker on account of Alice Knifton's goods, 11/-. Feb.1789 paid 3/- for laying Alice Knifton out.
