John Nall born c1821 Cotgrave. 1841 age 20, servant in the household of Joseph and Mary Nixon at Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1841/77). Jul.qtr. 1845 Basford district John Nall married Eliza Marshall of Ruddington. 1851 John age 31 ag.lab with wife Eliza age 26 born Ruddington and children Mary 3, John 2 both born Ruddington, in Eliza's father's house. John Marshall 72 ag.lab widower (wife Hannah died after 1841) and his son Samuel 25, carrier, both born Ruddington. Eliza Nall died 1858. 1861 John age 41 widower, ag.lab, with children Mary 13, John 12, Eliza 9, William 7, James 5 scholars all born Ruddington, in the house of Sarah Marshall, single, housekeeper age 49, born Ruddington, living on The Green, Ruddington. John Nall died Mar.qtr. 1880.

NEW

Alfred New of Ruddington appears on Bradmore electoral roll 1879 and 1880 in the category £50+ rent pa, presumably with one of the farms but non-resident. 1861 Alfred T New age 16 assistant ironmonger born Nottingham son of David, iron merchant and Martha, at Waverley St., Sherwood Nottingham, 1871 Alfred New age 27 iron merchant employing 200 men born Nottingham with wife Annette age 26 born Lille, France and children Annette 2, David James 1 both born Nottingham plus 3 servants at 10 Elm Avenue, Nottingham. 1881 Alfred age 36 engineer employing 40 men with wife Annette age 33 born Lille and her married sister Albertine E Wright 35 born Lille plus 1 servant, at 1 Telford Rd., Streatham, London. 1891 not found. 1901 Alfred age 56 iron merchant, employer, widower with 2 servants and visitor Florence Burgurm, married, 29, born Camberwell, at "Wingfield", Kendal Ave., Epping. 1911 Alfred Turner New age 65 engineer, employer, born Nottingham, with wife Florence Ellen 60 (married 11 years, no children), born London, at 11 Old Market, Halifax, 4-room house.

NEWMAN

Samuel Newman of Bradmore married Ann Foster of Bunny 27.12.1820 (IGI: 1830), witnessed by Elizabeth Henson, Joseph Hickling. 1841 Samuel age 35 ag.lab with wife Ann 32, children Mary 10, Sarah 7, Thomas 5, George 1 and Ann 1, at Costock. 1851 Samuel Newmans age 48 paper (maltster) with wife Ann 42 and children George 11 plougboy, Ann 1, Sam 9, John 4, William 4 scholars all born Costock, at Costock. 1861 Samuel age 58 ag.lab with daughter Ann 21 dressmaker and grand-daughter Emma 4 all born Costock, at Costock.

Sam Newman bapt. 2.10.1842, Costock, son of Sam and Ann. 1851 age 9 in parents' house, Costock. 1871 age 29, private soldier, Grenadier Guards, and Welling Barracks No.2, Westminster, London.

William Newman born 16.5.1847, Costock son of Sam and Ann. 1851 age 4 in parents' house, Costock. 1861 age 13, carter in the household of Gervase Bosworth at Fairholme, Main St. (Bradmore 1861/58).

NIXON

Elizabeth Nixon married Robert Thurbarne of Melton Mowbray at Bunny 23.9.1616.

Thomas Nixon, yeoman of Bradmore. Will dated 5.9.1617, gravestone to be erected with an inscription, bequests to the poor, owned property in Bradmore, Bunny and Keyworth.

Alice Nixon of Bradmore married William Smyth parson of Keyworth by Ordinary's licence at Keyworth 10.2.1620.

Mr Nixon of Bradmore's servant John Egliston, 11.4.1621, presented for not receiving communion last Easter.

Edith Nixon married Richard Sewall of Keyworth at Keyworth by Ordinary's licence, recorded in Bunny parish registers, 23.6.1621.

Thomas Nixon married to Anne, in Bradmore in 1650s. Possibly the Thomas who took the Protestation Oath in 1641.

Francis Nixon bapt. Bunny 5.7.1652, son of Thomas and Anne of Bradmore.

William Nixon bapt. Bunny 25.4.1654, son of Thomas and Anne of Bradmore.

Mary Nixon bapt. Bunny 20.6.1655, son of Thomas and Anne of Bradmore.

Gervase Nixon, husbandman. Ger.Nixon on 1674 Hearth Tax Return with 3 hearths. Churchwardens Gervase Nixon and Richard Walker vs Thomas Clifton of Bradmore, farmer, libel regarding events up to June 1685. Will 1.9.1688, proved 20.3.1695. Left to son in law Christopher Barson 1/- and to his wife and each of their children 1/-. To his wife Mary Nixon and son John his personal stuff. To son in law Samuel Chamberlain £20. Mary Nixon his wife and John named as executors. Inventory 13.9.1688 comprising: purse and apparell £9?, ... mare's young etc £22 ... £20/3/- ... sheep etc £18 ... £2, wheat £20, barley £20, peas £10? ... £10, waggon, 2 carts ... £1 ... furniture ... Bond 25.2.1695.

Mary Nixon, widow, of Bradmore, buried 2.4.1695, Bunny. Will dated 25.2.1695, proved 19.6.1695.

Left to Elizabeth her daughter and Christopher Barson son in law £20 and to their children £24 to divide among them. Bequests to Samuel Chamberlain of Little Leake and Mary his wife, to son Richard? Nixon and to son John Nixon. Inventory 3.5.1695 comprising: purse and apparell £2, pewter brass ... and household goods £5/2/6, horses, mares ... £10/15/-, carts, plough and ... £2/17/8, corn ... and unsown £9, money owing £2/10/-, things unseen and forgotten 4/9. Bond 4.5.1695.

William Nixon bapt. 8.6.1652 in the house of Nicholas Chamberlaine, Bradmore, son of Gervase and Mary of Bradmore. Not mentioned in either Gervase's or Mary's wills, so probably died before 1688.

John Nixon bapt. Bunny 5.2.1655, son of Jervas and Mary of Bradmore. Executor of Gervase's will 1688 and mentioned in Mary's will 1695.

Elizabeth Nixon bapt. Bunny 15.2.1658, daughter of Gervas and Mary of Bradmore. Married Christopher Bars(t)on of Bunny at Bunny 6.2.1675. Mentioned in Gervase's will 1688 and in Mary's will 1695.

Mary Nixon bapt. Bunny 14.4.1663, daughter of Gervas and Mary of Bradmore. Probably married Samuel Chamberlain before 1688, mentioned as son in law in Gervase's will 1688 and as husband of Mary, living at Little (West) Leake, in Mary's will 1695.

Anne Nixon bapt. Bunny 10.6.1670, daughter of Gervas and Mary of Bradmore. Not mentioned in either Gervase's or Mary's wills, so probably died before 1688.

John Nixon husbandman/yeoman, Bradmore. Parents not known; if he is son of Gervase and Mary, born 1655, he was over 40 years old when he married Ann Hooton of Ruddington at Ruddington 28.3.1696, near the time of his mother's death. Carried out inventory of goods of Joseph Chamberlain 1711, also his trustee. Carried out inventory of goods of William Turping 1719. Will dated 4.12.1722, proved 13.2.1727. Left to his son-in-law Thomas Glover and Mary his wife 1/- each, they having already had a sufficient portion. To his grand-daughter Ann Glover 20/-, to son-in-law William Street and Elizabeth his wife 1/- each. To son Joseph Nixon £50 when 21. To daughter Ann Nixon £40 when 24. Residue to his wife Ann Nixon (noted mort above her name) and son John Nixon (noted jurat) as joint executors. Witnessed by John Street and John Roberts, who made their marks, and William Chamberlain who signed. Inventory 20.7.1726 comprising: purse and apparell £2/10/-; goods in the house £5; goods in the first parlour 15/-; goods in the next parlour 10/-; goods in the chambers £2/10/-; goods in the kitching £2/5/-; cows young and old £25; horse flesh young and old £27; swine £2/5/-; sheep and fleaks (hurdles) £12; carriages and plows and harrows and other husbandry implements 10/5; the crop on the ground £2/10/-; total £110/10/-, by John Hooton and Hugh Alsop. Bond 19.1.1727, £200, by John Nixon and John Hoanton.

Ann Nixon wife of John, nee Hooton of Ruddington. Married John at Ruddington 28.3.1696. Died between his will made 4.12.1722 and the bond/probate of 1727.

Mary Nixon bapt. Bunny 11.1.1697, daughter of John and Ann. Mary Nixon daughter of John (and Ann) married Thomas Glover, 23.1.1719 at Ruddington.

John Nixon bapt. Bunny 13.6.1698, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. In 1722 named as heir and executor of his father John's will, and signed the bond in 1727 on his father's death. Possibly the John Nixon of Bradmore buried Bunny 31.10.1732.

Gervase Nixon bapt. Bunny 21.7.1700, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. May have died young before 1707, when another Gervase bapt.

Elizabeth Nixon bapt. Bunny 6.9.1702, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore. John's will refers to Elizabeth's husband William Street, in 1722. Elizabeth married William Street 8.1.1722 at Ruddington.

William Nixon bapt. Bunny 16.1.1705 son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Not mentioned in John's will in 1722, may have died young.

Gervase Nixon bapt. 25.3.1707, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. No reference in John's will made in 1722, may have died young (already the second of this name born to John and Ann).

Ann Nixon bapt. Bunny 13.3.1711, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore, possibly twin of Joseph. Ann received a bequest in her father's will of 1722, to be held for her until age 24.

Joseph Nixon of Bradmore bapt. 13.3.1711, at Bunny, son of John and Ann. Joseph inherited £50 when age 21 in John's will of 1722. Married Mary Lowe 23.4.1734, Ruddington. Farmer, buried Bunny 27.3.1787 aged 77. Will dated 6.3.1787, proved 4.10.1788. Left to his son John 1/-, and to his grandson William Nixon son of John £5 payable at Joseph's death. The residue to his son William of Bradmore, his sole executor. Witnessed by James Henson and John Milligan. Inventory dated 22.3.1788, purse and apparell £50, household goods etc £50, signed by Francis Stephenson and William Rowbotham.

William Nixon bapt. Bunny 10.9.1735 son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore. William married (1) Sarah Gee, 10.7.1759, died 1769, married (2) Elizabeth Shepperson of Keyworth at Keyworth 27.11.1770. Trustee of his cousin Philip Glover and carried out inventory of his goods 1771. In 1792

Bunny Estate Survey with 90 acres 30 perches paying £86/4/7 rent pa including £1 for house outbuildings garden and foldyard, Barn Close. 1780-1799 on land tax schedule paying 17/8¼d p.qtr. Land passed to John Nixon, probably his son, later tax payments switched frequently between John and William, with William featuring 1802-4, 1807, 1809-1811, 1814, 1816-7. William Nixon signed Constables Accounts 1779-1801, served as Constable 1780 and 1789 and 1798. Died 2.7.1817 aged 82. Buried at Bunny 5.7.1817 on south side of churchyard. near chancel, with wife Elizabeth. 'A soul prepar'd needs no delays / The summons come, the saint obeys / Swift was his flight and short the Road / He clos'd his eyes and saw his God / The flesh rests here till Jesus comes / And claims the treasure from the tomb.'

Sarah Nixon of Bradmore nee Gee, married William son of Joseph and Mary 10.7.1759. Buried Bunny 6.8.1769

Mary Nixon bapt. Bunny 3.5.1760, daughter of William and Sarah, no parish specified, buried 9.5.1760.

Elizabeth Nixon of Bradmore, born c1741 nee Shepperson of Keyworth, married William at Keyworth, 27.11.1770. Died 5.2.1799, buried Bunny 7.2.1799, aged 58, on south side of churchyard. near chancel, with William. 'A tender mother and good wife lies here / Snatched from her husband and the children dear / Who hope that once more all will meet again / In the great joys of Heaven to remain.'

John Nixon born c1771 Bradmore, probably son of William and Elizabeth. Probably the John Nixon who signed Constables Accounts 1792 to 1795, and 1800-1815. Paid land tax at 17/8¼d p.qtr. alternating with his father William, John on land tax schedule for 1808, 1812-3, 1815, then after William's death from 1819 to end of record in 1832. Served as Constable in 1823, and signed Constables Accounts 1820-3, 1825-6, 1830, 1832-3, 1836, 1840, 1842, 1845-6. 1827 land tax schedule, farmer. 1832 Whites Directory, farmer. On electoral roll 1838/9 with 79 acres, and 1840-1853/4 with 86 acres, Rufford Lodge. 1841 age 65, farmer, householder, married to Martha, with son John, daughter Mary Page, widow of independent means and her daughter Mary, servants Jane Davy, Thomas Chamberlain and George Stevenson (Bradmore 1841/70). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. 1851 age 80, farmer of 140 acres employing 3 labourers, married to Martha, with daughter Mary Page and her daughter Mary, servants Martha Squire, James Hogg and John Spencer (Bradmore 1851/55). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1854 John Nixon signed Methodist Sunday School accounts. 1855 Kellys Directory, farmer. Made his will 23.11.1850, proved 12.9.1854, wife Martha and sons Joseph and John as executors. Martha received annuity of £40 pa payable half yearly, the first payment 6 months after his death. Lands including estate at Willoughby on the Wolds divided equally between Joseph and John as tenants in common, not joint tenants. Legacies of £300 to daughter Elizabeth Page, widow and £400 to daughter Mary Page, widow, taxfree, payable 6 months after his death. Goods and chattels split 2/3 to John and 1/3 to Joseph.

Martha Nixon born c1779 Stanton on Wolds, possibly nee Page. 1841 age 60, married to John (Bradmore 1841/70). 1851 age 72, married to John (Bradmore 1851/55). Martha Nixon died Apr.qtr. 1855, Basford district.

Joseph Nixon bapt. 25.8.1800, Keyworth Congregational Church, probably eldest son of John and Martha. April 1825 Mr Nixon had £2/10/- from the Constable for stubble for Jacques's house. Mr Nixon, farmer, reported in Methodist Outlook as one of the founders of a Methodist society in Bradmore, leading to building of the chapel c1830. 1835 listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in original deeds, described as farmer. On electoral roll 1838/9 with 77 acres, and 1840-1862/3 with 90 acres. Census sequence in 1841 indicates Yorke Farm, but that at 1861 indicates Rancliffe; no locational information in 1851 census. Served as Constable in 1840, Assistant Overseer in 1841, signed Constable's accounts 1842, 1845-50. 1841 age 40, farmer, householder, married to Mary with servants Sarah Shaw, John Nall and John Davy (Bradmore 1841/77). 1841 Whites Directory, farmer. 1846 he paid the Constable £2 for Richard Harwood, presumably working for him. 1851 age 57, farmer of 200 acres, employing 6 labourers, married to Mary, daughters Elizabeth and Eliza, and servants Ann Hattersley, Thomas Dexter, George Walker and Richard Davies (Bradmore 1851/57). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1855 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1861 age 60, farmer of 180 acres employing 2 labourers and 4 boys, married to Mary, with daughter Eliza, sister-in-law Charlotte Page, widow born Keyworth, niece Charlotte Page, servants Elizabeth Gaskin, William Wakerley, Amos Whittaker, George Bosworth and Thomas Astill (Bradmore 1861/17). 1871 Joseph age 70 retired farmer born Bradmore with wife Mary and servant Elizabeth Atherley 15 born Keyworth, at Keyworth. Joseph Nixon died Jan.qtr. 1874, Bingham district. By 1908 Nixons Farm was farmed in hand by Bunny estate.

Mary Nixon born c1817, Keyworth. 1841 age 25 married to Joseph (Bradmore 1841/77). 1851 age 32, married to Joseph (Bradmore 1851/57). 1861 age 54, married to Joseph (Bradmore

1861/17). 1871 age 54 married to Joseph, at Keyworth. 1881 age 64 widow living on income from land, plus a servant, living in Keyworth next door to married daughter Eliza. 1891 age 74 widow in the house of her daughter Eliza and son-in-law John Wales at Burton Bandalls near Cotes, Leics. Mary Nixon died Jul.qtr. 1894, Loughborough district.

Elizabeth Nixon born c1842, Bradmore, daughter of Joseph and Mary. 1851 age 9 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/57).

Eliza Nixon born c1849 Bradmore, daughter of Joseph and Mary. 1851 age 2, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/57). 1861 age 12, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/17). Married Jan.qtr. 1871 Bingham district to John Henry Wale of Wymeswold, son of Elizabeth Wale, farmer of 185 acres at Potter's Ford, Wymeswold. See Wale.

Elizabeth Nixon bapt. 8.5.1802, Keyworth Congregational Church, daughter of John and Martha, married Joseph Page of Stanton on Wolds at Bunny 23.12.1823. Was a widow by the time her father wrote his will, 1850, and received a £300 legacy as Elizabeth Page. See Page.

Mary Nixon bapt. Bunny 22.9.1806, daughter of John and Martha of Bradmore. Mary Nixon of Bradmore married William Page of Ruddington at Bunny 6.11.1831. See Page.

John Nixon bapt. 12.4.1819, Keyworth Congregational Church, son of John and Martha. 1841 age 20, farmer, in the household of John Nixon, Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1841/70). Oct 1846 John Nixon married Elizabeth Wells daughter of Joseph Wells, farmer, of Willoughby. 1851 John age 32 farmer of 115 acres employing 2 labourers, born Bradmore, with wife Elizabeth age 25 born Willoughby 1826, and son Joseph Wells Nixon 3 born Willoughby and servant John Atterwell 16 born Willoughby, at Willoughby on the Wolds. No later references, both John and Elizabeth apparently dead before 1861.

Joseph Wells Nixon born 1848 Willoughby on the Wolds, son of John and Elizabeth. 1851 age 3 in parents' house. 1861 age 13 with siblings Martha 9 and John 7, listed as children of householder John Widdowson widower 26 farmer of 82 acres with his sister Harriett Widdowson 24 housekeeper, all born Willoughby, plus 2 servants, on farm at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1871 Joseph Wells Nixon age 23 head of household, single, farmer of 85 acres with housekeeper Mary Merreman single 33 born Wymeswold, at farm in Willoughby on the Wolds. 1876 Oct.qtr. Loughborough district, Joseph Wells Nixon married Elizabeth Anne Clarke daughter of Frances, widow, farmer, of Willoughby on the Wolds. 1881 age 33 grazier with 103 acres and 1 labourer, with wife Elizabeth Anne age 33 and children John 3 scholar, Joseph Wells Nixon 2, both born Willoughby, and nephew William Merriman 9 scholar born Hickling plus 2 servants, at Willoughby. 1891 age 43 grazier with wife Elizabeth age 43 and children Joseph W 12, William C 9, Francis G 8, Edward H 6, Arthur G 4 scholars all born Willoughby and nephew William Merriman 18 grocer's apprentice born Hickling plus 3 servants on Main St., Willoughby. 1893 Jan.qtr. Elizabeth Anne Nixon died, Loughborough district. 1901 age 53, widower, farmer on own account at home with son William C 19, Edward H 16, Arthur G 14 on Main St., Willoughby. 1911 Joseph Wells Nixon age 63 grazier / dairy farmer, employer, with children Edward Hall Nixon 25, pig dealer on own account, and Arthur Guy 23 assistant on farm at Willoughby, 11-room house. Joseph Wells Nixon of Willoughby on the Wolds, farmer and grazier, died 12.6.1915, probate Nottingham 24.8.1915 to Ernest Victor Brown solicitor, effects £4609/18/5.

Joseph Nixon of Bradmore son of William and Elizabeth buried 1.1.1775, Bunny.

Elizabeth Nixon bapt. 12.5.1738, daughter of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore.

John Nixon bapt. Bunny 4.3.1747, son of Joseph and Mary, mentioned in Joseph's will 1787. Married Mary Attenborough at Bunny 23.6.1768. May be the John Nixon who carried out inventory of goods of Hannah Henson 1771.

Mary Nixon of Bradmore born c1747 nee Attenborough, daughter of Robert and Mary. Married John Nixon at Bunny 23.6.1768, no parishes specified, buried Bunny 15.6.1769 in her 22nd year. Stone on south side of chancel in churchyard, inscribed 'Death is the painful Way that all must tread / Joyful to them that are by virtue led / Grieve not dear spouse because I dy'd so soon / I my days journey finished at Noon: / My parents dear my Time was short you see / So live and die that you may rest with me.'

William Nixon, bapt. Bunny 1.6.1769, son of John and Mary. Grandson of Joseph, mentioned in Joseph's will of 1787. Possibly the William who married Elizabeth Lyne of Willoughby at Willoughby 31.3.1789. 1841 William Nixon age 70, ag.lab solo at Willoughby, living next door to Widdowson family including children John 8 and Harriett 6, and next door the other way to Joseph Nixon 35 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth 34, children Mary 13, Joseph 7, Edward 3 and William 6 mths.

John Nixon married Elizabeth Street 1726, Keyworth. If this is John son of John and Ann (see above)

his daughter was probably born posthumously, but not noted as such in the baptism register.

Elizabeth Nixon bapt. Bunny 18.12.1732, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried 24.1.1733.

Ann Nixon of Bradmore buried Bunny 12.4.1748.

William Nixon born c1776 Bradmore. Probably the William who received payment from the Constables in 1782 and 1784-8 for catching sparrows. Farmer, married 27.11.1797 to Elizabeth Voce of Bunny, 21, spinster, at Bunny, by vicar's licence, both recorded in register as of Bradmore parish, though bond of 25.11.1797 by William Nixon and John Voce of Bradmore, farmer, describes Elizabeth as of Bunny.

Elizabeth Nixon born 1776, Bradmore. 1841 age 65, farmer, with 3 servants, at East Leake. 1851 age 75 widow living in her son William's house, Gotham Lane End, East Leake.

Mary Nixon born 8.11.1798 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 8.11.1798, daughter of William, farmer, and Elizabeth. Buried as infant Bunny 11.11.1798.

William Nixon born 1801 Keyworth son of Elizabeth. 1841 age 50, farmer of 420 acres with 9 labourers, with wife Mary age 50 born Prestwold and daughter Mary 8 born East Leake, at Gotham Lane End, East Leake. 1851 William age 60 farmer of 250 acres with 6 labourers and 3 boys, born Keyworth, with wife Mary Glover Nixon age 60 born Prestwold and children John 24, Mary 18 both born East Leake, niece Annie Nixon 21 born Stanford and nephew John Mountney 8 born Burton on the Wolds, plus 3 servants, at Barton, Notts.

Joseph Nixon paid by the Constable in 1789 and 1790 for catching sparrows.

Mary Nixon born c1848, Ropsley, Lincoln, daughter of Henry, farmer and Mary of Nixon's Lodge, Ropsley, and sister of Elizabeth Barrand nee Nixon. 1851 age 2 in parents' house on 173 acre farm at Nixon's Lodge, Ropsley, Lincs. 1861 age 13 born Ropsley, pupil of schoolmistress Emily Sophia Smith, single age 30 born Bedford, at 8 Westgate, Grantham, with 2 other teachers, a governess, cook, housemaid, and total 14 pupils. 1871 age 23, single, in the household of Robert and Elizabeth Barrand, Yorke Farm Bradmore (Bradmore 1871/3).

NORMAN

William Norman(d) received payment from the Constables in 1784, 1785 and 1787 for catching sparrows.

Robert Norman in 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under Town Houses and Incroachments with a house and a garden of 3 perches. Buried Bunny 7.1.1808.

Mary Norman, probably wife of Robert, 17.2.1794 was paid 3/- by the Constable for her trouble, no explanation of the 'trouble', but 23.6.1794 the Constable paid her 6/- for nursing Ann Hardy for 2 weeks. 16.11.1794 Mary received 3/- for her trouble when Sarah Darker's child died. Mary Norman of Bradmore buried Bunny 15.3.1812.

John Norman bapt. Bunny 13.8.1782, son of Robert and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the John paid by the Constable in 1787 for catching sparrows. Married Mary Smith of Ruddington at Bunny 26.12.1805

William Norman bapt. Bunny 3.4.1806, son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 22.9.1810.

William Norman bapt. Bunny 24.12.1813, son of John, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore.

John Norman bapt. 10.12.1815 Nottingham St. Mary's, son of John and Mary. Buried Bunny 26.4.1816, age half a year.

John Norman bapt. Nottingham St. Mary's 9.2.1817, son of John and Mary.

Emma Norman, born Ruddington, married at Bunny 25.12.1852, then living at Bradmore, to John Harwood, of Bradmore. Later returned to Ruddington. See Harwood.

NORTH

John del North' of Bradmore 20.12.1374 witnessed land grant by William son of Hugh de Chyrche, vicar of Bunny, to Hugh de Annesley of Ruddington 1 plot called Prestplace in Bradmore between the tenements of the Priory of Lenton on the west and Torkarplace on the east.
