

OLIVER

James Oliver of Bradmore, relative of Ann Oliver of Ruddington who married Benjamin Lane 22.4.1780 (IGI).

William Oliver married Elizabeth Vose at Bunny 26.12.1771, no parishes specified. 1780-1802 Paid land tax 9½d p.qtr., followed by Elizabeth Oliver. Signed Bradmore Constables Accounts 1780, 1781, 1784, 1788-1800. Dec.1782 Constable paid him £6/6/- for John Bennett's house, and also paid for carriage of bricks, stubble and lime for this house. 15.3.1783 Constable paid £6/16/6 (later crossed out) to William Olliver for making a bridge in Blacklif passter, and mending that bridge in/out of Bradmore. Jan.1786 the Constable paid William's bill for the Town Houses, 4/-, and Dec.1789 William had £2 for Topley's house. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 6 acres 13 perches in Rowends meadow paying £6/16/6 rent pa including £1/1/11 for house, buchens shop and garden, probably on Main Rd. opposite Debdale Farm. 1792 Constable paid John Harwood 10/- for fetching a load of bricks for William Oliver. 1.12.1800 William Oliver received 7/6 from Constable for repairing William Elliot's chimney, and 1/- for lime. Jan.1802 Constable paid William for flooring Hensons' house, 4/-, and for leading (bringing) brick and sand 2/6. William Oliver bricklayer left will 2.8.1802, proved 5.5.1803, referring to freehold houses, tenements, shops, lands and hereditaments in Ruddington which he divided by roads and fences into 3 lots to leave to his heirs. To his loving wife Elizabeth, his real and personal estate, but if she remarried her land was to go to son Thomas, who was to pay £5 each to the 5 daughters Mary Hickling, Elizabeth, Martha, Ann and Catherine Oliver. On the death or marriage of his wife, another lot of land was to go to son William Oliver, who was to pay the 5 daughters £2/10/- each, and another lot to go to son John Oliver to also pay each daughter £2/10/-. His personal estate on the death of his wife to be divided equally among the 8 children. Note the will has detailed descriptions of the three plots and their boundaries.

Elizabeth Oliver born c1751, sister-in-law of Mary Voce. Elizabeth Vose married William Oliver at Bunny 26.12.1771, no parishes specified. 1803-1828 took over land tax of 9½d p.qtr., schedule fails to recognise her death in 1825. 1827 land tax schedule, cottager. 1829 tax passed to Thomas Oliver. Had 8 children, Thomas, John William, Mary, Elizabeth, Ann and Catherine and Martha. Died 7.2.1825, aged 74, relict of William. Died the same day as sister-in-law Mary, buried 10.2.1825 in one grave in Bunny churchyard., south of the chancel near the path.

Mary Oliver daughter of William and Elizabeth, married Thomas Hickling of Wymeswold at Bunny 28.2.1797. Beneficiary of father William's will 1803 as Mary Hickling.

Ann Oliver bapt. Bunny 8.1.1773, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Died before 1785.

Thomas Oliver bapt. Bunny 14.10.1774 son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Probably the Thomas Oliver paid by the Constable in 1782 and 1785 for catching sparrows. 1802 Constable paid Thomas's bill for 8/- for work done. 1803 Thomas signed the Constables Accounts with an X, and received payment for his bill £1/4/-. 1804/5 Constables Accounts receipts included £3/6/- from Thomas Oliver, probably on behalf of brother John. March 1806 Thomas received 18/- for repairs to the Chapple and the Constable also paid £1/16/- for stone and lime for the chapple - presumably Bradmore steeple. 1807/8 Thomas paid the Constable 1/6 for 3 bunches of reed, and 1809 paid 53 weeks on behalf of John Oliver, £3/18/-, for John's daughter Sarah Davis. Married Rebecca Dalby 31.7.1821, witnessed by W Stubbs. Paid land tax 9½d p.qtr. 1829 to end of record 1832 after his mother Elizabeth. 1841 age 60, bricklayer, householder married to Rebecca, living on Main Rd. opposite Debdale Farm, with John Oliver, age 55, relationship not recorded (Bradmore 1841/12). 1843 signed Constables Accounts. 1851 age 73, mason(er), retired, married to Rebecca (Bradmore 1851/58). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1861 age 85, retired bricklayer, widower in the household of his brother John and wife Elizabeth at 2 Red Lion St., Ruddington. Died Jan.qtr. 1868, Basford district.

Rebecca Oliver born c1789 Bradmore, nee Dalby, married Thomas 31.7.1821. Mrs Rebecca Oliver signed the Sinday School accounts 1836-1839. 1841 age 50, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1841/12). 1851 age 62, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1851/58). Buried Bunny 7.10.1856 age 67.

Martha Oliver bapt. Bunny 28.12.1825, daughter of Thomas, bricklayer, and Rebecca of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 8.3.1840 age 14.

Charles Oliver bapt. Bunny 25.3.1777, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. May have died young, not mentioned in William's will of 1802.

William Oliver son of William and Elizabeth, born 1781, Bradmore. Married Elizabeth Davy both of Bradmore at Bunny 26.3.1801. Possibly the William who received payment from Constables in 1780, 1782 and 1783 for catching sparrows. Jan.1813 Constable paid £1/1/- for 7 weeks work on the house row. William Oliver signed Sunday School accounts 1833/4 and 1836. 1841 William age 60 framework knitter with son John and his wife Elizabeth with children Martha, William and George, at Ruddington. 1851 age 70, born Bradmore, widower, framework knitter in Ruddington with son John

and his children and George, plus grandson James Gunn, age 9, winder of cotton born Ruddington, at Ruddington. Died 1852 or 1857, Basford district.

Elizabeth Oliver nee Davy, married William at Bunny 26.3.1801. Died before 1841.

John Oliver born c1811, son of William junior and Elizabeth. 1841 age 30 framework knitter with wife Elizabeth 25 and children Martha, William and George at Ruddington. Elizabeth Oliver died Jul.qtr. 1845, Basford district. 1851 age 40, framework knitter, widower, householder, with his children and his father William at Ruddington. Oct.qtr. 1855 John Oliver married Mary Hopewell, widow of Philip Hopewell (died Apr.qtr. 1855) and next-door neighbour of the Olivers in 1851. 1861 John age 53 framework knitter with wife Mary age 56 born Moor Green Notts and son George 20 farm labourer at 4 Asher Lane, Ruddington. 1871 age 54, farm labourer with wife Mary age 55 born Greasley, at the Leas Ruddington. 1881 age 75 ag lab with wife Mary 75 at The Leys, Ruddington. John Oliver born 1807 died 1887, Basford district.

Martha Oliver born 1836 Ruddington, daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1841 age 5 in parents' house. 1851 age 16 seamstress with father in grandfather's house, Ruddington.

William Oliver born 1838, Ruddington, son of John and Elizabeth. 1841 age 3 in parents' house.

George Oliver born 1840, Ruddington, son of John and Elizabeth. 1841 age 9 mths in parents' house. 1851 age 10, scholar, with father in grandfather's house at Ruddington.

John Oliver bapt. Bunny 10.3.1782, son of William senior and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Probably the John Oliver paid by the Constable in 1789 for catching sparrows. May be the John Oliver who fathered a daughter Sarah in 1804, with Catherine Davis. March 1806 John Oliver paid £3/18/- cash to the Constable, presumably maintenance for child, and paid £3/16/6 in April 1807. 1808/9 paid 55 weeks at 1/6, £4/2/6, and 1809 paid 51 weeks, £3/16/6. 1812/3 John paid £4/11/6 and 1814 1/6 p.wk. Married Elizabeth Lane both of Bradmore at Bunny 29.12.1806. 1841 John age 55, in the household of brother Thomas Oliver on the Main Rd. opposite Debdale (Bradmore 1841/12); wife Elizabeth Oliver age 50 with brother Thomas Lane 60 bricklayer, Catherine Oliver 25 milliner and Thomas 1 at Red Lion St., Ruddington. 1851 John Oliver age 68 bricklayer born Bradmore with wife Elizabeth, age 66 and grandson Thomas 10 scholar born Ruddington (son of William and Sarah double-counted?), at Ruddington. 1861 John age 79, retired bricklayer master, with wife Elizabeth and brother Thomas, at 2 Red Lion St, Ruddington. Died Oct.qtr. 1865, Basford district.

Elizabeth Oliver nee Lane of Bradmore, married John 29.12.1806. 1841 age 50 with brother Thomas Lane 60 bricklayer, Catherine Oliver 25 milliner and Thomas 1 at Red Lion St., Ruddington; husband John with brother Thomas in Bradmore. 1851 age 66 married to John at Ruddington 1861 age 75, married to John. Died Jan. qtr. 1870 Basford district.

William Oliver bapt. Bunny 10.5.1808 son of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 30, bricklayer, with wife Sarah age 30 and children Thomas 10, Rebecca 9, Elizabeth 6 and Eliza 3, all born at Ruddington. 1851 age 42 builder, married to Sarah age 41 with children Thomas 21, single, builder, Elizabeth 1, Eliza 12, plus (uncle) Thomas Lane 71 labourer born Ruddington, (but referred to in 1861 as uncle born Bradmore) living in Clifton Lane, Ruddington. 1861 William age 52 builder employing 1 man, born Bradmore, with wife Sarah age 52 born Ruddington and daughter Eliza 22 married to Alfred Clarke 30 born Nottingham, maltster employing 1 man, and their son William O Clarke 7 mths born Ruddington, plus uncle Thomas Lane age 80 labourer born Bradmore (mother Elizabeth's brother), on The Green, Ruddington.

Elizabeth Oliver bapt. Bunny 1.1.1810 daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Thomas Oliver bapt. Bunny 15.3.1812 son of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Martha Oliver bapt. Bunny 16.5.1814 daughter of John, bricklayer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Oliver, bapt. Bunny 29.10.1779, daughter of William senior and Elizabeth, mentioned in William's will 1802.

Martha Oliver born 24.2.1789, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 2.4.1789, daughter of William senior, bricklayer, and Elizabeth. Mentioned in William's will 1802.

Ann Oliver, born 2.11.1785, bapt. Bunny 6.11.1785, daughter of William senior, bricklayer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the Ann who was paid by the Constable in 1791 for catching sparrows. Mentioned in William's will 1802.

Catherine Oliver born Bradmore 12.4.1792, bapt. Bunny 25.4.1792, daughter of William senior, bricklayer, and Elizabeth. Mentioned in William's will 1802. Catherine Oliver of Bradmore married John Hickling of Plumtree at Bunny 2.1.1827. See Hickling.

Elizabeth Oliver born c1826. 1841 age 15, servant in the household of Richard and Mary Walker at Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1841/80).

Thomas Oliver born 1864 Ruddington. 1871 Thomas Oliver age 7 scholar, son of Thomas 48 bricklayer master and Elizabeth at Little Town, Ruddington. 1881 age 17 apprentice butcher with Samuel Webster butcher of Keyworth. 1891 age 27 butcher and cattle dealer with wife Martha Emily

age 27 born Leeds Yorks and son Philip Fearnside 1 born Ruddington plus servant at Church St., Ruddington. 1901 age 37 cattle dealer on own account with wife Martha age 37 and son Philip F 11 scholar at Kirk Lane, Ruddington. 1911 age 47 farmer employer with wife Martha Emily age 47 (married 22 years with 1 child), son Philip Fearnside Oliver 21 single working on farm, and relative (Martha's sister) Mary Louise Fearnside 37 elementary school teacher born Leeds, plus servant, at Bunny, 9-room house. Thomas Oliver of Ivy House, Bunny, holding land in Bradmore with local vote only, 1937/8 only.

ONYON

Charles Herbert Onyon born 1884 Eastwood, married Isabella Challands Apr.qtr. 1919. Charles Herbert Onyon born 2.7.1884 died Dec.qtr 1974, Nottingham district.

Isabella Onyon born at Bradmore 25.5.1885, nee Challands, daughter of William and Nancy. Married Charles Onyon 1919. On electoral roll for Far St., 1928/9-1939/40 and for Main St. May 1945-1972, specifying No.12 Main St. from 1963. Received Bunny Charities dole, grant in lieu of coal and bread 1934, 1939 & 1940. Died at Bradmore 26.3.1973. Buried in Bunny churchyard, west of the church.

Dorothy Onyon daughter of Isabella, born c1920. Her parents were in a Southwell House cottage, the middle one of the three. Methodist Sunday School scholar infants class 14-21.11.1926, rejoined 13.5.1928-June 1928, 2nd class July 1928=Dec.1930, 1st class Jan.1931-24.5.1931, 30.8.1931-30.9.1934. On electoral roll for Main St. May 1945-88, at No.12 from 1963. Dorothy was a member of the tennis club in Bradmore, used to take turns at doing teas for the cricket team, and used to skate on the ponds in Donkey Lane and down Moor Lane. She recorded her memories for the Bradmore millennium booklet. On Bunny Church Fete days she used to help Mrs Ingram sell ice cream at the fete. Photo survives of Dorothy at a front door on Far St., next door to Mr Hickling. Poultry girl for Beebys, then worked for Boots. Worked briefly at Bunny, recalled memories for Evening Post 19.8.1995, then aged 75. Wrote to the Post after seeing photos of neglected Bunny Hall, remembered glorious days of garden fetes and vegetable shows in the grounds; during the war Mrs Cordeux and her daughters saved their sweet ration coupons for Christmas treats for the children of Bunny and Bradmore. 1935 on committee for K George V Jubilee Celebrations committee. 1953 on Coronation Festivities Committee, collected public subscriptions along the south side of Main St. together with Miss Ingram. 1961 committee member of Bradmore Joint Conservative Assocn. Listed as WI member 1962-1969. Used to park her car in the garage behind the barn of No.29 Main St. 1979 Parish Council sent her a letter wishing her a speedy recovery after a bad fall. Moved 9.11.1987 to West Bridgford. Died June 2003.

ORDISH

Betsy Ordish nee Stevenson, born Bradmore 1854 daughter of George and Jane. Oct.qtr. 1878 Betsy Stevenson married Joshua Ordish, Nottingham district. 1881 Betsy Ordish age 27 married to Joshua age 31 railway wagon builder born Leics, with children Beatrice 2 born Ruddington and George 3 mths born Hucknall, at Hucknall Torkard. 1891 Betsy age 37 married to Joshua age 43 waggon builder born Leics, with children Beatrice 13 born Ruddington, George 10, Harold 8, Ernest 5 scholars born Hucknall, at 44 Watnall Rd., Hucknall Torkard. Joshua Ordish died Jul.qtr.1891, Basford district. Apr.qtr.1893, Basford Betsy Ordish, widow, married Thomas Morrison, joiner, of Hose, Leics. See Morrison.

OSBORNE

Ursula Osborne late servant to William Bond and Richard Smythe 5.11.1627 presented by one churchwarden (un-named) of Bradmore, by common fame of fornication.

OXFORD

John Oxford married Anne Millett both of Bradmore, at Bunny 29.6.1642. John signed the Protestation Return 1641 supporting true Protestant religion.

Diana Oxford bapt. Bunny 9.4.1643, daughter of John and Anne of Bradmore.

William Oxford bapt. Bunny 7.5.1648, son of John and Anne of Bradmore.

Anne Oxford bapt. Bunny 24.11.1650, daughter of John and Anne of Bradmore.

Thomas Oxford bapt. Bunny 17.4.1653, son of John and Anne of Bradmore.
