

PACEY

Ellen Pacey bapt. 14.3.1844, Cropwell Butler, daughter of John and Hannah. 1851 age 7 daughter of John, 36, and Hannah 39 of Cropwell Butler. 1861 age 17, single, housemaid in the household of Edward G James at Manor Farm (Bradmore 1861/22).

PAGE

Elizabeth Page, born 1802, nee Nixon, daughter of John and Martha, married Joseph Page of Stanton on Wolds at Bunny 23.12.1823. 1841 Elizabeth Page age 35 farmer, with Martha Page age 25?, and children John 15, Joseph 14 and Samuel 12 at Stanton. Referred to as widow in John Nixon's will 1850, beneficiary. 1851 age 40 born Bradmore, dairy farmer of 200 acres employing 1 labourer, with sister Charlotte widow, annuitant born Keyworth, daughter Martha 32 and sons Joseph 23, Samuel 22, plus 4 servants at Hill Farm House, Stanton on the Wolds. 1861 Elizabeth age 58 widow, cottager of 8 acres born Bradmore with son Joseph 34 born Stanton, at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1871 age 68 cottager of 8 acres with son Joseph 44 at Cottage in village centre, Willoughby on the Wolds. Elizabeth Page died Oct.qtr. 1876, Loughborough district. 1881 Joseph Page age 54 grazier with wife Mary Ann age 46 born Willoughby and their son Samuel 3 scholar born Willoughby, plus Mary Ann's son Tom Sketchley 14 scholar born Leicester, at Westhorpe, Willoughby. Joseph Page died Apr.qtr. 1883, Loughborough district.

Mary Page born 1806 nee Nixon, Bradmore, daughter of John and Martha. 6.11.1831 married William Page of Ruddington at Bunny. 1841 age 30, widow of independent means in the household of John Nixon at Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1841/70). 1850 widow, beneficiary of John Nixon's will. 1851 age 44, widow, in her parents' house (Bradmore 1851/55). 30.6.1853 Mary Page widow of Bradmore married Thomas Rowbotham, son of Thomas, carpenter, farmer of Bradmore, at Bunny. See Rowbotham.

Mary Page born c1838, Bradmore, grand-daughter of John and Martha, daughter of Mary Page. 1841 age 3, in grandparents' house Bradmore (1841/70). 1851 age 13, scholar, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1851/55).

Charlotte Page nee Archer born c1826, Keyworth. 1841 Charlotte Archer age 14 with mother Sarah 50 and siblings Thomas 20 butcher, Elizabeth 15 and Ann 13, at Keyworth. 1848 Oct.qtr., Bingham district, Charlotte Archer married John Nixon Page. Logically this would be John son of Elizabeth Page nee Nixon age 15 in 1841 (the only alternative is John Page age 20 in 1841, servant for Ann Peet widow and her son John Peet farmer at Bunny). John Page died Apr.qtr. 1849, Bingham district. 1851 Charlotte age 25 widow annuitant born Keyworth in "sister" Elizabeth Page's house, Hill Farm House Stanton on the Wolds. 1861 age 35, widow, fundholder in the household of brother in law Joseph Nixon at Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/17). 1871 age 43, visiting Joseph Shepperson 32 farmer and maltster and his wife Louisa E 23 born Nottingham and their son at Broxtowe Hall, Bilborough. 1881 age 55 Charlotte Nixon living on income from land, in married daughter Charlotte's house at Keyworth. 1891 Charlotte Nixon age 63 on own means in daughter Charlotte's house at Keyworth.

Charlotte Page born c1849, Stanton, daughter of Charlotte. 1861 age 12, scholar, in the household of her uncle Joseph Nixon (Bradmore 1861/17). 1871 not found. 1881 age 32, Charlotte Flinders widow, householder living on income from land with son Richard T 9 scholar born Nottingham, with her mother Charlotte Nixon, at Keyworth. 1891 age 42 Charlotte Flinders living on own means with son Richard 19 apprentice hosiery born Nottingham, plus mother Charlotte Nixon, at Waterloo Rd., Nottingham.

PALMER

William Palmer (Pawmer) of Bradmore, married Elizabeth Street at Bunny 29.9.1746. Daughter Mary bapt. at Bunny 21.6.1747. William and Elizabeth both mentioned in will of Mary Gunn, widow, dated 3.1.1749 and proved 21.1.1757.

PARKER

Ralph Parker married Agnes Dore of Bradmore at Bunny, 25.6.1566.

William Parker married Alice Rhodely of Bunny at Bunny 28.1.1638. Possibly William senior who signed the Protestation Return 1641 supporting the true Protestant religion.

William Parker junior married to Anne, living in Bradmore 1640s. William Parker Junior signed the 1641 Protestation Return supporting the true Protestant religion.

? Parker bapt. Bunny Sept.1647, date illegible, daughter of William Parker junior and Anne of Bradmore.

Jane Parker bapt. Bunny 17.6.1649, daughter of William Parker junior and Anne of Bradmore.

John Parker married Ann Parker 15.11.1679, Ruddington, living in Bradmore 1680s.

Jane Parker bapt. Bunny 6.8.1682, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore.

Mary Parker bapt. Bunny 12.8.1686. daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore. May be Mary Parker who married Joseph Priestley at Ruddington 2.6.1705.

T Parker in Constable's Accounts 1811, the Constable paid Thomas Dalby's bill (shoes) for him and for Smith's boy, 16/5.

George Parker Dec.1807, Constable paid jury expenses over his case, 11/6. Possibly the George Parker who married Ann Price 14.2.1809 at Ruddington.

Ann Parker born c1791 Ruddington, probably nee Price, married George 14.2.1809. 1841 age 55 in the household of son in law William and daughter Mary Stevenson, in a cottage north of the Forge on Main Rd. (Bradmore 1841/6). 1851 age 60s, widow, seamer, in daughter's house (Bradmore 1851/62). Ann Parker died Jul.qtr. 1855, Basford district.

Mary Parker, born 1.4.1810, daughter of George and Ann, married 3.3.1834 at Ruddington to William Stevenson. See Stevenson.

William Parker born c1833, Ruddington, son of Mary Stevenson nee Parker. 1841 age 8 in the household of brother in law William and sister Mary Stevenson (Bradmore 1841/6). 1851 age 18, single, framework knitter, in sister's house (Bradmore 1851/62). c1858 married Ann Pike daughter of John, labourer and Hannah of Wilford. 1861 age 28 framework knitter married to Ann age 26 born Wilford, washerwoman, with daughter Emma 1 born Wilford, at Wilford. 1871 age 38 framework knitter with wife Ann age 37 laundress, children Emma 11 born Wilford, William 9, Hannah 8, John 5, Henry 3 scholars and Thomas G 1 all born Wilford, at Wilford. 1881 age 48 stocking framework knitter with wife Ann age 46, children Hannah 18 seamstress stockings, John 15 gardener's boy, Henry 13 cotton winder, Thomas 11, Charles 9, Joseph 7 scholars, all born Wilford, and Mary Ann 5 scholar born Ruddington, at Kirk Lane, Ruddington. 1891 age 58 hairdresser with wife Ann age 57 and daughter Mary Ann 15 embroideress, silk, plus a visitor at The Lyes, Ruddington. 1901 age 68 framework knitter hosiery with wife Anne age 66 and daughter Mary A 25 embroideress in silk, plus grand-daughter Florence P Bates 11 born Nottingham, at The Leys, Nottingham. William Parker died Jul.qtr. 1901, Basford district. 1911 Ann age 77 widow (married 53 years with 9 children, 4 dead), with children Joseph 38 single, milk seller born Wilford, Mary Ann 36 single, stocking embroiderer working at home born Ruddington, Florence 21 single, lacemaker born Radford, at The Leys, 4-room house, census form signed by Joseph for Ann. Ann Parker died Mar.qtr. 1917, Basford district.

George William Parker bapt. Bunny 3.7.1837, son of Jane Smith, alias Mrs Parker, formerly of Bradmore but now widow of Radford. (See also under Smith.)

Eliza / Elizabeth Parker born 1854/5 Bradmore, maiden name not known. 1881 age 27 married to Thompson Parker age 27 ag.lab born Threekingham, with daughter Louise 5 born Bradmore 1876, at Threekingham next to grocer's shop. 1891 Elizabeth age 36 married to Thomas age 39 farm foreman at 10 Church St., Broughton, Northants.

PARKYNS

Richard Parkyns of Bradmore received counterpart lease and copy mortgage by Francis and Percival Willoughby on various dates 1592-1596. 1593/4 grant of annuity by Richard Parkyns to Elizabeth Willoughby. 14.5.1596 Richard Parkyns esq purchased from Percival Willoughby esq of Middleton Warwickshire the manor of Bradmore and all appurtenances for £1400 per agreement of 25.3.1594 between Sir Francis Willoughby knight and Percival Willoughby, and Richard Parkyns.

PARRATT

Elizabeth Parratt nee Peet daughter of Thomas and Ann, born 1796 Bradmore, formerly Ball wife / widow of William – see Ball.

PAULING

George Pauling labourer of Bradmore son of Robert, labourer, married at Bunny 19.9.1881 to Elizabeth James of Bradmore, daughter of Thomas, labourer. No other reference found.

Elizabeth Paulin, born c1825, Bradmore, nee James. 1891 age 66, over-written married, householder, living alone in part of Steeple Cottage in a house with 4 rooms, no mention of husband in census (Bradmore 1891/57). 1901 age 75, widow, charwoman, living alone in 3-room house on Village (Main) Street (Bradmore 40/1901). 1911 Elizabeth Paulin(e) age 86 widow born Bradmore, patient in Basford Union Workhouse and Infirmary, Highbury Rd., Bulwell, Nottingham.

PAYNE

Elizabeth Payne born 1852 Bradmore, maiden name not known, possibly Spencer? 1881 Elizabeth age

29 born Bradmore married to Arthur, age 29 carter born Wing ?Derbyshire, with children Selina 2, William S 9 mths born Ratcliffe on Soar, at 19 Cobden St., Long Eaton. Also 1881, George Payne age 4 scholar as nephew in house of William and Mary Spencer (see Elizabeth Spencer). 1891 Elizabeth age 35 born Bradmore married to Arthur John age 39 coal carter born Wing Bucks, with children Selina 12, William 10 scholars born Ratcliffe on Soar, Arthur 6, Ernest 4, scholars and Bertie 11 mths born Long Eaton, at 5 College St., Long Eaton. 1901 Elizabeth age 43 married to Arthur John Payne age 49 bricklayer's labourer, with children George 23 painter, Selena 22 factory hand, William S 20 wheelwright all born Ratcliffe on Soar, Arthur 16 M.R.(rly) caller-up (porter), Ernest 14 Co-op warehouse hand, Bertie 12, Frederick 5 born Long Eaton, at 8 Northcote St., Long Eaton. 1911 Elizabeth age 54 (married 35 years (1876), 7 children), with husband Arthur John age 59 contractor's labourer and children William Spencer Payne 30 single, wheelwright at railway wagon works, Frederick 15 single, apprentice lace draughtsman, at 8 Northcote St., Long Eaton, 5-room house.

PEDINGER

Thomas Pedinger of Bradmore, 7.3.1574, received counterpart lease from Frauncis Willughby.

PEET

Thomas Peet, husbandman of Bradmore. Married Mary Pool 23.7.1734 at Ruddington. Died 26.1.1744 in 30th year, buried Bunny 27.1.1744, in churchyard. south of the chancel. Inventory taken 7.2.1744, comprising: purse and apparel £70/10/-; 2 horses and their gear £30; 2 Hoggs £7/10/-; corn unthrashed £95; 5? or 9? beasts £26; waggons carts plows harrows etc £21/10/-; 95 sheep £10/10/-; goods in the Kitching £10; in the brewhouse £6? or £8?; in the lower parlours £1/10/-; the lower kitching £1/5/-; the middle room and dayry £2/5/-; the best parlour £5/10/-; ale and bottells in the cellar £16; the best chamber £10/15/-; the chamber over the kitching £7/10/-; servants chamber £5/10/-; chamber over the great parlour £6/10/-; chamber over the little parlour £3/5/-; chamber over the lower kitching £4/5/-; goods in the garretts £3/10/-; the cheese garrett £5/10/-; plate £32; stable chamber goods £2; corn growing on the ground £25; total £951/5/-, by Richard ? and Thomas Glover. Bond dated 11.2.1744 £700, by Mary Peet and Thomas Peet. Administration 14.3.1744.

Mary Peet nee Pool of Ruddington, born c1714 per marriage record, c1715 (per inscription on gravestone) married (1) Thomas Peet 23.7.1734, married (2) Robert Attenborrow, 14.4.1747 age 34, widow. See Attenborough.

Thomas Peet bapt. 28.1.1736, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. Thomas Peat, innkeeper of Bradmore, married Elizabeth Attenborrow daughter of Mary and Robert, by 1760. Referred to in Robert Attenborrow's will 1754 as recipient of £300 bond by Robert Attenborrow when he married Thomas's mother Mary. Signed bond for will of Robert Steemson 1758. 1774 may be the Thomas Peet, glasier (grazier?) of Bradmore recorded as Country Voter who did not poll (register a vote) in the election of that year, no reason given. Executor of Mary Attenborrow's will 1778. April 1781 Constables Accounts, Thomas Peet received 1/- for a woman and 5 children's lodging and breakfast, and 2/- for ale when loading gravel. Died 10.8.1781 in the 45th year of his age. Buried Bunny 13.8.1781, gravestone in churchyard. south of chancel, verse: 'From stately pleasures we must all remove / The narrow lodgings of a grave to prove / Leave these bright scenes nor more enjoy the day / But lie benighted in our native Clay / God only is immortal. Man not so / Life to be paid at his demand we owe / Therefore both Old and Young prepare to die / That you may live with Christ eternally.' Will dated 21.6.1781, probate 22.4.1782 granted to his son Thomas Peet then aged over 17 years. Daughter Mary Peet to have £50 12 months after his death. Daughter Ann Peet to have £50 when 21. To his son John Peet £60 and a silver watch at age 21. To son Thomas Peet, executor, the residue, and if he died then son John Peet and friends William Nixon and Richard Walker to be executors. Inventory dated 28.11.1780 comprised purse and apparell £160, household goods £40.

Elizabeth Peet of Bradmore, born c1739, mentioned in her mother in law Mary Attenborough's will 1765 as wife of Thomas Peet, but died before Mary, on 23.7.1768 in her 30th year, buried Bunny 25.7.1768 in Bunny churchyard. south of the chancel. Verse: 'My days on earth they were but few / And wasted like the morning dew / When I could stay no longer here / I left my spouse and children dear / To the kind Providence of heav'n / And dy'd in Hopes to be forgiv'n.'

Mary Peet, bapt. Bunny 6.3.1760, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth, parish not specified.

Ann Peet, bapt. Bunny 13.12.1761, daughter of Thomas, innkeeper, and Elizabeth, parish not specified. Beneficiary under Thomas's will of 1781. May be the Ann Peet buried at Bunny 28.12.1842 age 80.

Thomas Peet bapt. Bunny 5.5.1763, son of Thomas and Elizabeth, parish not specified. Executor of Thomas senior's will 1781. 1780-1816 Thomas Peet paid land tax 12/-¼d p.qtr., then passed to John Peet. Probably the Thomas who signed the Bradmore Constables Accounts 1781, 1782, 1784-1814,

served as Constable in 1803 and 1812. Both the Nags Head and the Crown (James Henson) were used for Constable's meetings. 1782 Constable paid 4/- to John Lane at Thomas Peet's when they met about John Bennett's house. 1783 Constable paid Thomas Peet 1/- for lodgers. Jan.1787 had 7/6 from the Constable when they met about the labourers, 1/- in August for lodgers, 7/6 in December for ale at the gravel pit. Jan.1789 Constable paid 3/2½d for ale when they met about Sary Tomson, and June 1789 received 11/10 for ale at the common work. Sept.1789, the Constable paid 2/- when they met about John Darker. 6.11.1790 Constable paid Mr Peet 5/- when they met about William Toplis's house. In Bunny Estate Survey 1792 had 60 acres 29 perches, paying £65/6/9 pa rent, for lands in Bradmore and 3 acres 3 roods 32 perches in Row Close, Bunny. Farmed Tofts Farm. Rent included £7 for Nagshead Inn with outbuildings, garden, yard and malthouse. In the Ruddington section of the survey, Thomas Peat of Bradmear had plot No.212 Moor Close in Ruddington, 8 acres 10 perches at £18/acre, yearly value £7/5/-, Land Tax 4/-, rent settled with tenant £7 pa. Jan.1795 Constable paid Mr Peet for a man when ill 4/- and a poor woman's lodging 2/-, and taking care of that man when ill 2/-. 26.5.1795 paid for ale when called a meeting about S Hardy 8/6½d, and the next day paid for ale when he took the Inventory, 2/10½d. Payments to Peet stopped at this point, and were replaced by payments to William Attenborough from 1797, with James Henson picking up the ale and lodging payments in between. Witnessed will of Samuel Vose 1796 and carried out inventory of his goods 1797. Probably the Thomas Peet, farmer, involved in the bond of 21.10.1797 for marriage of Mary Attenborough of Bradmore and William Gunn, butcher, of Bunny. Carried out inventory of goods of Henry Marriott 1798. Probably Thomas Peet executor of George Attenborough's will 1805, referred to as George's cousin. Thomas Peet of Bradmore, farmer, administrator 1808 of the will of Sarah Randall widow deceased, of St. Mary's parish Nottingham. Died 9.11.1827 in his 65th year. Buried Bunny 14.11.1827 age 64, tombstone in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel commemorates John on the left and Ann on the right. Verse for Thomas: 'Rejoice for a brother deceased / Our loss is his infinite gain / A soul out of prison releas'd / And free from its bodily chain / With songs let us follow his flight / And mount with his spirit above / Escaped to the mansions of light / And lodg'd in the Eden of love.'

Ann Peet, born c1766, married Thomas before Oct.1785, from children's baptism records. 1841 age 76, householder of independent means, living at Tofts Farm. Household includes John Peet, farmer, and Hannah, with children George and William, and servant William Richards (Bradmore 1841/78). Ann relict of Thomas Peet of Bradmore recorded on Thomas's gravestone in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel, died 26.12.1842 'in the 76th year of her age'. Verse: 'In Christ's atoning sacrifice / She placed her only trust / And tranquil died in hope to (rise?) / Triumphant with the just.'

John Peet, born 7.10.1785, bapt. Bunny 18.10.1785, son of Thomas, farmer and innkeeper, and Ann of Bradmore. Maybe the John Peet paid by the Constable in 1794 for catching sparrows. Signed Constables Accounts 1801-1810, on 2 occasions signed just as Peet. Took over from Thomas Peet on land tax schedule, paid 12/-¼d p.qtr. from 1817 to end of record. in 1832. Served as Overseer 1825/6, signed Constable's Accounts 1826, 1828-30, 1840, 1842, 1847. April 1826 submitted his bill to the Constable (himself) for dyking 8 acres in Old Bradmore Dike, 8/-. Described in 1827 land tax schedule as farmer. 1832 Whites Directory, farmer and maltster. On electoral roll 1838/9 with 56 acres, and 1840-1862/3 in category £50+ rent pa. 1840 Constable paid Mr Peet £4/-/11½d. 1841 age 55, farmer, in his mother's house, married to Hannah (1841/78). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer and maltster. 1847 executor of John Glover, farmer. 1851 age 65, widower, farmer of 70 acres, Tofts Farm, employing 1 labourer, with children George and William, cousin Jane Rossell, servants John Bennett and Charlotte Harwood (1851/59). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer and maltster. 1855 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1856 Constable paid him 3/- for serving on a jury. 1861 age 75, formerly farmer, in his son William's house (Bradmore 1861/10). Possibly the John Peet of Leicester buried Bunny 12.5.1868 age 82.

Hannah Peet born c1793. 1841 age 48 in mother in law Ann Peet's house, married to John (Bradmore 1841/78). Died 18.1.1844 aged 54, buried Bunny 23.1.1844, gravestone in churchyard south of the chancel with verse: 'Thy memory dear Hannah will ever be dear / In grief too deep to be relieved by a tear / To thy husband and sons thy loss cant be repaired / By the ties of wife and mother so much endeared / May ours be thy life as long as they are given / And then we may hope to meet thee in heaven.'

George Peet bapt. Bunny 22.2.1832, son of John, farmer, and Hannah of Bradmore. 1841 age 9, in grandmother Ann Peet's house (Bradmore 1841/78). 1851 age 19, single, in father's house (Bradmore 1851/59). Signed Constables Accounts 1853-5, 1859. 1861 age 29 farmer born Bradmore, nephew of householder George Cook post horse proprietor born Nottingham and his wife Ann born Bradmore with family at 19 Halford St., Leicester. 1871 age 34 gamekeeper with wife Mary 23 born Redcastle, Ross-shire, probably nee Falconer daughter of Hugh, carpenter and

Mary of Killearnan, Ross-shire, at 3 Hayward Bottom, Berkshire. 1881 Scottish census, George age 46 gamekeeper with wife Mary age 34 and children John 9, Hugh 6, George 3, Margaret 2 and Ita 4 mths at Invergarry, Inverness-shire. 1891 age 54 farmer with wife Mary age 43 born Scotland, Mary 18, Hugh 15, George 13 all born Monmouthshire, Ita 10, Francis 6 scholars, Edith 3 all born Scotland, at Haughton Kennels, Bothamsall, Nottinghamshire. 1901 age 68 farmer, employer, with wife Mary age 53, children Hugh 25 born Coldbrook Park, Monmouthshire, Margaret 22, Ita E 20 student at Lincoln Training College, Francis 16 student, Edith E 13 all born Scotland, at Haughton Kennels, Bothamsall. 1911 age 79 farmer born Bradmore with wife Mary 63 born Redcastle, Ross-shire (married 40 years, 11 children, 2 dead), with children Hannah R 37 dairy work born Invergarry Inverness-shire, and Hugh F 35 born Boldbrook Park, Monmouthshire, working on farm, at Haughton R, Bothamsall, Retford, 8- room house.

William Hodgkinson Peet bapt. Bunny 6.2.1834, son of John, farmer and Hannah of Bradmore, cousin of Sarah Ball. 1841 age 7, in grandmother Ann Peet's house (Bradmore 1841/78). 1851 age 17, single, in father's house (Bradmore 1851/59). Signed Constable's Accounts 1860. Probably the Mr Peet renting grazing in Plumtree Lane 1860, the Ramper 1863 and Pendock Lane 1865. 1861 age 27, single, householder, farmer of 78 acres employing 1 man and 2 boys, Tofts Farm, with his father John, his cousin Sarah Ball, servants Emma Attewell and Thomas Taylor (Bradmore 1861/10). On electoral roll 1863-6 with land at £50+ rent pa. 1864 Whites Directory, farmer and maltster. Married Sarah Ann possibly Holmes, Jul.qtr. 1865 Basford? 1867 Bunny estate rental, renting house, buildings, garden, orchard and land 42 acres 2 roods 12 perches in Bradmore, 29 acres 2 roods 23 perches in Bunny, rent £140/10/6 pa. 1871 age 37, occupation unclear, born Bradmore with wife Sarah A and children Elizabeth Hannah and Mary J both born Bradmore, at 25 Morledge St., Leicester. 1881 William H age 47 coachman with wife Sarah A and children E H and Mary, at 48 St George St., Leicester. 1891 age 57 coachman with wife Sarah A and daughter Elizabeth H plus boarder at 48 George St., Leicester. 1901 age 67 retired farmer born Bradmore with wife Sarah A, visiting married daughter Mary J Sawyer and husband William H Sawyer at 50 Grove St., East Retford. William Hodgkinson Peet of Markham, Notts, farmer, died 6.12.1910, probate at Nottingham 7.2.1911 to John Hardy ironmonger's foreman and William Hanson Sawyer commercial traveller, effects £488/2/1.

Sarah Ann Peet born 1836, Leicester, possibly nee Holmes. 1871 age 35 married to William. 1881 age 45 married to William. 1891 age 55 married to William. 1901 age 65 married to William, in daughter Mary Jane's house East Retford. 1901 age 74, widow, living on private means, living with daughter Mary Jane at Hull. Sarah Ann Peet of Gotha St., Leicester (daughter Elizabeth's home), widow, died 24.12.1916, probate at Leicester 27.11.1917 to William Hanson Sawyer, company director; effects £213/4/2.

Elizabeth Hannah Peet bapt. Oct.qtr. 1898 Elizabeth Hannah Peet married John Hardy, Melton Mowbray district. 1901 John Hardy age 53 dairy manager with wife Elizabeth H age 38 and a servant at 11 Gotha St., Leicester. 1911 John age 63 ironmonger manager born Colsterworth, Lincs with wife Elizabeth Hannah age 49 born Bradmore (married 13 years with 1 child), Dorothy Mary 9 born Leicester plus a servant at 11 Gotha St., Leicester, 8-room house.

Mary Jane Peet bapt. Bunny 13.9.1863 daughter of William, farmer, and Sarah Ann of Bradmore. 1871 age 7 scholar in parents' house, Leicester. 1881 age 17 stationer's assistant in parents' house, Leicester. Jul.qtr. 1889 Mary Jane Peet married William Hanson Sawyer of Shoreditch, London, Leicester district. See Sawyer.

Charles William Peet bapt. Bunny 6.8.1865 son of William, farmer, and Sarah Ann of Bradmore. Died Apr.qtr. 1868, Leicester district.

Thomas Peet born 2.5.1788, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 7.7.1788, son of Thomas, farmer and innkeeper, and Ann. May be the Thomas paid by the Constable in 1793 for catching sparrows. 1851 Thomas age 62 lace manufacturer born Bradmore with wife Elizabeth age 60 and children Ellen S 21, Alexander B 20 lace warehouse, Margaret Jane 17, all born Nottingham, at Sneinton. Elizabeth Peet died Apr.qtr. 1860, Nottingham. 1861 Thomas age 72 widower lace manufacturer with daughter Margaret Ann 25 and servant at Colville St., Nottingham. Thomas Peet born 1789 died Apr.qtr. 1868, Nottingham.

Ann Peet born 9.1.1791, Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 17.1.1791, daughter of Thomas, farmer and innkeeper, and Ann. Died 15.6.1795 aged 4 years, buried, infant, at Bunny 18.6.1795, verse: 'Ripe for heav'n my soul ascending flew / And early bid this sinful world adieu / Short was my time, the longer is my rest / In the eternal mansions of the Blest.' Gravestone by Rowbotham.

Mary Peet born 14.6.1794 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 21.6.1794, daughter of Thomas, farmer, and Ann.

Elizabeth Peet born 3.4.1796 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 19.4.1796, daughter of Thomas, farmer, and Ann. Elizabeth Peet of Bradmore married William Ball of St. Margarets, Leicester, 14.3.1826, witnessed by Ann Peet. Presumably sister of John who married Hannah, and mother of Sarah cousin of William.

Jane Peet born 27.9.1799 Bradmore, bapt. 6.10.1799 Bunny, daughter of Thomas farmer and Ann.

Ann Peet born c1800, daughter of Thomas and Ann of Bradmore, died 7.1.1805 aged 5. Tombstone in Bunny churchyard. south of chancel, inscribed 'Jesus saith, Suffer the little children and forbid them not to come unto me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven.'

Edward Peet bapt. Bunny 30.8.1803, son of Thomas and Ann of Bradmore. Died 25.7.1810 aged 7, buried in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel, 27.7.1810, verse: 'Blighted by fell disease's breath / In childhood's early prime: / He sunk into the arms of death / And bid adieu to time: / So oft a fair and tender flower / Just budding fresh and gay: / Blasted in some untimely hour / Droops, withers, dies away.'

Ann Peet born c1803/4 daughter of Thomas and Ann, married George Cook(e) of Nottingham. See Cooke.

Ann Peet born c1812, daughter of Thomas and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 16.10.1814 age 2.

John Peet bapt. Bunny (no parish specified) 14.12.1764, son of Thomas and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried Bunny 19.4.1766.

John Peet bapt. Bunny 25.3.1767 son of Thomas and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the John Peet in Constable Accounts 1782, was paid £1/-/6 for work done in the church, and also took the money for Bunny Churchwarden's Book, £6/13/6, claimed expenses of 1/-.

Ann Peet married William Pettifor of Bunny at Bunny by vicar's licence 5.5.1785.

Ann Peet of Bradmore married William Sharpley of St. Margarets Leicester, 15.4.1828, witnessed by John Peet.

Thomas and Elizabeth Peet of Nottingham, parents of children buried at Bunny, not clear whether linked to Bradmore, but dates may fit Thomas son of Thomas and Ann.

Ann, Sarah, Eliza, John and Joseph Peet children of Thomas and Elizabeth of Nottingham, all died in their infancy, commemorated on a single undated gravestone in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel alongside other members of the Peet family.

Thomas Peet born 1804 son of Thomas and Elizabeth of Nottingham died 11.4.1830 aged 26 years, buried in Bunny churchyard south of the chancel alongside other Peet gravestones.

Mary C Peet born c1863 Cotgrave. 1871 age 7 daughter of Thomas age 42 boot and shoemaker and Betsy age 42 with siblings Stan 4, Betsy K 2 and Wiliam P 7 mths all born Cotgrave. 1901 age 38 cousin of Edwin and Clara Harriman, living as lady companion with the Harrimans in Bradmore (Bradmore 2/1901).

PENDOCK

John Pendock (Mr) married to Jane, living in Bradmore in 1640s. Possibly the John who married Jane Spencer 2.2.1631 at Widmerpool. 1641 signed the Protestation Return supporting the true Protestant religion.

Elizabeth Pendock bapt. 9.1.1640, daughter of Mr John Pendock and Jane of Bradmore.

Jane Pendock bapt. 13.2.1642, daughter of Mr John Pendock and Jane of Bradmore.

William Pendock bapt. 26.1.1645, son of Mr John Pendock and Jane of Bradmore.

Richard Pendock son of John and Sarah of Bradmore bapt. Bunny June 1666 (date unclear, before 10th.)

PEPPER

Joseph Pepper married Hannah Vose by licence at Bunny 27.2.1768, no parishes specified.

Hannah Pepper nee Vose born 1739, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth of Bradmore, married Joseph at Bunny 27.2.1768.

Thomas Pepper bapt. Bunny 28.5.1768, son of Joseph and Hannah of Bradmore. Paid by the Constable 1779 for catching sparrows.

PETTING

Isabel Petting married Thomas Longley of Bunny at Bunny 25.11.1578

Annes Petting married William Hopwell of Cropwell Butler at Bunny 21.10.1588.

PHILLINGHAM/FILLINGHAM

Isabel Phillingham married John Burton of Keyworth at Bunny, 18.5.1566.
Robert Phillingham of Bradmore 20.3.1574 received counterpart lease from Frauncis Willughby
Alice Phillingham married William Plowright of Bunny at Bunny 16.10.1575.
Elizabeth Fillingham married Clement Jherome of Diseworth at Bunny 11.10.1584.
Katherin Phillingham married Edward Caunte of Clawson at Bunny 21.4.1589.
Margaret Phillingham married Richard Guye of Claxton at Bunny 15.1.1598.
Ann Phillingham married Hugh Guye of Claxton at Bunny 15.1.1598.

PICKARD

Stephen Pickard of Bunny & Bradmore parish serving as a naval volunteer in 1790s, possibly from Bradmore.
Samuel Pickard 27.8.1876 witnessed marriage of William Fox of Loughborough and Ann Harwood of Bradmore, at Bunny.

PIERREPOINT

William Pierrepoint, born c1849, E Leake, son of John, ag.lab, and Elizabeth. 1851 age 2 in parents' house at Goudes, East Leake. 1861 age 12 servant for Richard Marshall age 52 born Bunny, farmer of 180 acres with 3 labourers, at Leake Hill, East Leake. Apr.qtr. 1873 married Ann Smith daughter of Jane Smith of Peckleton Leics. 1881 William age 32 foreman, ag.lab, born East Leake with wife Annie age 29 dressmaker born Costock and children Gertrude and Florence, plus mother in law Jane Smith widow age 66 born Pecklington (Peckleton) Leics, at Rectory Farm, Wysall Rd., Costock. 1891 age 42, householder agricultural labourer, married to Annie, with children Florence L, Beatrice A, and mother Jane Smith, widow, at the north end of Farmer St., 4-room house (Bradmore 1891/34). Electoral roll, house, 1886-1898, no county vote from 1890 onwards. 1901 William age 52, waggoner on farm, with wife Annie and daughters Florence J and Beatrice A, in Village St, Bunny. 1911 age 62, working farm foreman, with wife Annie at Bunny, 5-room house.

Annie Pierrepoint, born c1853, Costock nee Smith, daughter of George, cottager of 4 acres, and Jane. Apr.qtr. 1873 Loughborough district Annie Smith married William Pierrepoint. 1881 age 29 dressmaker married to William at Costock. 1891 age 38, dressmaker, married to William (Bradmore 1891/34). 1901 age 48, dressmaker on own account at home, married to William at Bunny. 1911 age 58, dressmaker on own account (married 38 years with 3 children), married to William, at Bunny.

Gertrude Mabel Pierrepoint born 1875, Costock, daughter of William and Annie. 1881 age 6 in parents' house. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class intermittent attendances 5.7.1885-19.6.1887, left.1911 Gertrude Mabel age 35 single, laundry hand born Costock, boarder with William Peach, shunter for Midland railway, at 2 Radcliffe Terrace, Radcliffe St., Nottingham, 4-room house.

Florence J Pierrepoint, born c1878, Sutton Bonnington, daughter of William and Annie. 1881 age 3 in parents' house at Costock. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-June 1887, 1st class 2nd part July 1887-2.12.1888. 1891 age 13, single in parent's house (Bradmore 1891/34). 1901 age 23, music teacher, self-employed, in parents' house at Bunny.

Beatrice Alice Pierrepoint bapt. Bunny 28.4.1889, daughter of William, labourer, and Annie of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 23.6.1889-June 1891, 3rd class July 1891-Dec.1894, 2nd class Jan.1895-9.8.1896, June 1898 returned thanks. 18.4.1898 Sunday School teachers' meeting agreed to give her a Bible although she had left the village. 1891 age 5, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/34). 1901 age 15 in parents' house, Bunny.

PIGHT

Jane Pight married Robert Dickinson of Bunny at Bunny 3.10.1622.
Elizabeth Pight married Oliver Martin of Bunny at Bunny 16.6.1634.

PIG(G)OT

William Pigot born c1746 (possibly the William son of John and Mary bapt. at Ruddington April 1747?), married (1) Martha Stubbs of Ruddington at Bunny 5.12.1769, no parishes specified; married (2) Elizabeth Henson, 1775; married (3) Ann Davy of Bradmore at Bunny 20.1.1793. Lived in Bunny 1770s. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey at Bradmore with 10 acres 2 roods 36 perches, i.e. 5 acres in Moor Close and 3 gates in Cottage Moor, paying £9/0/10 pa rent including 10/- for house and garden and 10/6 for croft, i.e. orchard on corner of Far St., living at The Cottage, Donkey Lane. Constable's Accounts 1789, paid William Piggot 4/- when ill. April 1812 the Constable paid him 1/6, and in October he had 2/- p.wk. for 2 weeks. Jan.1813 he had 8/-, and 14 weeks at 2/- p.wk. Feb.1813 he had 6/- for his grand-daughter. In April the Constable paid Dr Brown's bill £4/10/- for William, and he had

8/- p.wk. plus 2/- p.wk. for his grand-daughter. Dec.1813 he had 4/- per day for working on the house row. Jan.1814 he had 6/- when ill. Buried Bunny 14.8.1821 age 75.

Martha Piggot of Bradmore, nee Stubbs, first wife of William, married William Piggot at Bunny 5.12.1769, no parishes specified. Buried Bunny 26.7.1772.

Mary Piggot of Bradmore daughter of William and Martha bapt. Bunny 1.2.1770. 1780 Constable paid her for catching sparrows. Probably Mary who married John Smith, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 2.2.1791.

John Piggot bapt. Bunny 25.2.1771, buried Bunny 19.1.1772, son of William and Martha of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Pigot nee Henson of Bradmore, second wife of William, labourer, married William Piggot at Bunny 2.10.1775, no parishes specified. Buried at Bunny 3.1.1791.

Ann Piggot born c1748, nee Davy, of Bradmore, third wife of William, married William Piggot at Bunny 20.1.1793. March 1809 the Constable paid her 4/- for 6 days doing for Thomas Redfern. Buried Bunny 15.10.1825 age 78.

PIKE

Thomas Pike paid by the Constable in 1790 for catching sparrows.

Richard Pyke/Pike of Keyworth born c1788. 1795 age 7 apprenticed to a framework knitter in Bradmore.

Elizabeth Pike in Constables Accounts, Feb.1809 had £1/5/- for a month lying in, and then had 2/- p.wk. ongoing to 1814, when entries in the Constables Accounts ceased.

Thomas Pike born 1832 Keyworth, son of John, labourer and Mary of Keyworth. 1841 age 9 in parents' house, Keyworth. Thomas Pike of Bradmore married Martha Henson of Bradmore at Bunny 25.2.1855. 1861 age 29 carter born Keyworth with wife Martha and children Jan H 6 scholar born Ruddington? and Thomas 3 born Ecclesfield Yorks, at Commonside, Bradfield, Yorks. 1871 age 39 carter with wife Martha and children Thomas 12 steel roller, John William 9, Hannah 7 and Elizabeth 5 scholars and Rosanna 1 all born Yorkshire, at Bradfield, Yorks. 1881 age 49 carter with wife Martha 47 both born Notts, and children Thomas 23 steel roller, John W 19 labourer, Hannah R 17 dressmaker, Rosanna 12, Herbert 9, Sarah A 6 scholars and Martha 4 all born Yorkshire, at Ecclesfield, Yorks. 1891 age 57 carter with wife Martha 55, both born Notts, children Herbert 19 furnace-man, Sarah Ann 16, Martha 14, all born Bradfield, at Wisewood, Ecclesfield. 1901 age 69 gen.lab with wife Martha 66 both born Notts, at Wisewood, Ecclesfield, Yorks. Thomas Pike died Jan.qtr. 1907.

Married Thomas Pike 25.2.1855, Bunny. 1861 age 27 married to Thomas. 1871 age 37 married to Thomas. 1881 age 47 married to Thomas. 1891 age 55 married to Thomas. 1901 age 69 married to Thomas. 1911 Martha age 76 widow in house of married daughter Hannah Hutchinson 47 (married 28 years with 4 children 2 dead), and her husband Hugh 50 spring knife cutler born Wadsley Yorks, with son Harold 10 scholar born Wadsley, at Luke Lane, Wadsley, Yorks, 6-room house.

Peter Pike son of John Pike and Sarah Holmes born c1838, Keyworth. 1841 age 3 in parents' house, Keyworth. 1851 age 13 framework knitter in parents' house, Keyworth. 26.12.1859 Peter Pike, then of Bradmore, married Elizabeth Lane of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 23, glove framework knitter, married to Elizabeth with son William 5 mths born Keyworth, living on Selby Lane, Keyworth. 1871 age 33 framework knitter with wife Elizabeth and children William Lane Pike 11, Sarah Rebecca 7, Alfred 6 scholars, Elizabeth 3 and Selina 1, at Keyworth. 1881 age 43 framework knitter cotton with wife Elizabeth and children William L 20, Sarah R 17 both framework knitters, cotton, Alfred 16 hosier apprentice, Elizabeth 12, Selina 11, Mary 4 scholars, Grace A 2 and Claude O 6 mths all born Keyworth, at Keyworth. 1891 Peter age 53, bag hosier sox, married to Elizabeth with children Sarah R age 20, Selina age 21, Mary age 14, Grace A age 12, Claude O 10, all born at Keyworth, and grand-daughter Clarissa M Cripwell 1, born Nottingham, living at Wysall Lane, Keyworth,. 1901 age 53 hosiery maker on own account, with wife Elizabeth and daughter Grace Ann 22 at Main St., Keyworth. 1911 age 73 hosiery manufacturer, socks, employer, with wife Elizabeth at Wysall Lane, Keyworth, 5-room house. Peter Pike died Mar.qtr. 1920, Bingham district.

Elizabeth Pike born 1840, nee Lane, daughter of Thomas and Rebecca of Bradmore, married Peter at Bunny 26.12.1859. 1861 age 21, dressmaker, married to Peter, at Selby Lane, Keyworth. 1871 age 31 married to Peter. 1881 age 41 married to Peter. 1891 age 51 married to Peter. 1901 age 61 married to Peter. 1911 age 71 (married 51 years with 9 children, 4 dead), with Peter at Wysall Lane, Keyworth. Elizabeth Pike died Oct.qtr.1913, Bingham district.

Mary Pike of Bradmore married Francis Jacques of Bradmore at Bunny 31.7.1860. See Jacques.

PIPE

Ernest Edward Pipe, born 1881 Keyworth. 1911 age 30 single, So I class on HMS Implacable. Apr.qtr. 1916 married Annie Smeeton daughter of William, farmer and Elizabeth of Bradmore. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main Rd. autumn 1921-spring 1922, married to Annie. Lived in Bramleys Cottage, Main Rd. opposite the end of the Ramper. Moved to Keyworth. Served 25 years in Royal Navy. Died 27.7.1958, at St Francis Hospital Hucknall Rd., Nottingham, home address The Bungalow, Bunny Lane, Keyworth. Probate 23.10.1958 to Dorothy Margaret Tinsley and Hannah Elizabeth Davill, effects £1103/18/3.

Annie Pipe, nee Smeeton born Bradmore 1885, daughter of William, farmer, and Elizabeth. Married Ernest Edward Pipe Apr.qtr. 1916, Basford district. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main Rd. autumn 1921 -spring 1922. Died Sep.qtr. 1953.

William Place of Bradmore married Mary Henson, of Bradmore, at Bunny 5.1.1836.

PLOWRIGHT

Anne Plowright and her son **Robert** of Bradmore, 7.3.1574, received counterpart lease from Francis Willughby.

POLAND (see PAULING)

Elizabeth Poland (for Pauling) born 1826 Bradmore, nee James daughter of Thomas and Martha. See Paulin, and James.

POOL

Thomas Pool of Bradmore, barber, recorded Country votes for Notts in 1754 election, 6 for Sir Wilughby Aston, Bart., of Risley, Derbys, 6 for John Plumtree Esq., Nottingham, and 0 for Rt.Hon. Geo. Aug. Lord Vsct. Howe of Langar. Howe and Aston were eventually elected (Nottm Poll Book).

POULSON

William Poulson in Constables Accounts 1813/4, paid the Constable 2/- p.wk., presumably for child maintenance. Oct.1814 the Constable paid 4d for a letter from Shilton about Pulson. William possibly connected with 3/5 received from the Keyworth levy in 1814/5. May 1816 Constable paid 18/- jury expenses on Poulson's child of Keyworth. April 1817 received from William £9/2/- up to 9.8.1817, and £6 in April 1819. April 1818 Constable paid 1/- for letters from Poulson. No name given for mother or child, and not clear from Constables accounts which child is involved.

POYNE

John Poyn of Bradmore and brother Robert witness local grants, mid 13th century.

John Ponye of Bradmore, with William Pony, 12.1.1349, witnessed land grant by William Torkard of Bradmore to William Helot of Bradmore.

Lucy Preston, born c1855, Laxton, nee Pinder. 1861 age 6 in parents' house, John age 52 grocer and saddler, and Sarah age 35, Laxton. Jan.qtr. 1877 Southwell district Lucy Pinder married William Preston. 1881 age 26, married to William (Bradmore 1881/57). 1891 age 35 married to William. 1901 age 45 married to William. 1911 age 55 (married 34 years, 3 children), with William

Harriett Preston, born c1878, Widmerpool, daughter of William and Lucy. 1881 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/57). 1891 age 13 scholar in parents' house. 1901 age 23 dressmaker on own account working at home, in parents' house.

George Ernest Preston, born c1880, at Tithby, son of William and Lucy. 1881 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/57). 1891 age 11, scholar in parents' house. 1901 not found. Marriage record not found. 1911 age 31 domestic gardener with wife Sarah 31 born 1880 Widmerpool, nee Mottishaw, daughter of Robert, ag.lab and Elizabeth, (married 2 years with 1 child), Robert William 1 born West Bridgford, at 13 Clumber Rd., West Bridgford, 4-room house.

John Preston born 1883, West Bridgford, son of William and Lucy. 1891 age 8 scholar in parents' house. 1901 age 18 platelayer for Midland Railway, in parents' house. Apr.qtr. 1907, Bingham district, John Preston married May Marriott born 1883 Widmerpool, daughter of John, ag.lab, and Ann. 1911 John age 28 gamekeeper born Edwalton with wife May age 28 (married 4 years with 1 child), Lucy Annie 3 born Ruddington, at Distillery St., Ruddington, 5-room house.

PRICE

Sarah Price daughter of John and Martha of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 9.9.1781.

Sarah Price married James Hames both of Bradmore at Bunny 10.12.1798.

Henry Price witnessed will of Matthew Cumberland 1805. Possibly the Henry Price who paid land tax at Keyworth in 1820s, renting land from the rector.

Elizabeth Price of Bradmore married John Flower of Bunny, 4.2.1819.

C Price 1832 in Whites Directory as butcher of Bradmore.

Eliza Price born 1842Bradmore nee Hallam, daughter of Mary, grand-daughter of William and Ann, married Thomas Price Sep.qtr. 1859. 1861 age 20 seamer born Bradmore with husband Thomas age 25 framework knitter born Ruddington, daughter Mary Jane 1 born Ruddington, sister (aunt) widow

Elizabeth Dakin (nee Hallam daughter of William and Ann) and her children John and Ann, at 23 Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1871 Eliza age 28 seamer with husband Thomas age 35 framework knitter, children Mary Jane 11 seamer, George 8, Henry H 6, Fredrick 3 scholars and Matilda J 1 all born Ruddington, at Marlpit, Ruddington. 1881 age 38 seamer with husband Thomas age 47 framework knitter and children George 18 rotory hand, Herbert 16 box hand, Frederick 14, Hannah 8, Thomas 6, Arthur 4 scholars and grandson Thomas Marriott 9 mths all born Ruddington, plus 2 boarders, at 38 Hartford St., Ruddington. 1891 not found. 1901 age 58 with husband age 67 hand framework knitter and grandchildren Florrie 9 and William 4 born Nottingham. 1911 age 70, didn't know where born, (married 51 years, 8 children, 2 dead), with Thomas age 75 pensioner born Ruddington plus a boarder ,at Wilsons Row, Ruddington, 2-room house, signed by Eliza.

PRIESTLY

Joseph Priestley married Mary Parker 2.6.1705, Ruddington, living in Bradmore in 1700s.

Mary Priestley nee Parker, possibly born 1686 daughter of John and Ann, married John Priestly of Bradmore at Ruddington 2.6.1705. Buried Bunny 3.1.1722.

William Priestloe bapt. Bunny 23.2.1707, son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore.

Joseph Priestloe bapt. Bunny 19.2.1709, son of Joseph and Mary. Possibly Joseph who married (1) Frances and (2) Mary, died 1752 - see below.

Mary Priestloe bapt. Bunny 8.4.1712, daughter of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore. May be the Mary Priestly who married Joseph Buxton both of Bradmore at Bunny 15.2.1737.

John Priestly bapt. Bunny 22.7.1716, son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore. Entered twice in the Bunny register.

Samuel Priestly bapt. Bunny 7.12.1718, son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore.

Thomas Priestley bapt. Bunny 3.1.1722 son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore. Buried at Bunny 9.9.1723.

Thomas Priestley bapt. Bunny 11.8.1723, son of Joseph and Mary Priestley of Bradmore.

Frances Priestley, wife of Joseph of Bradmore by 1737, buried Bunny 27.5.1741.

Sarah Priestly bapt. Bunny 20.3.1737, daughter of Joseph and Frances of Bradmore, buried Bunny 4.4.1741.

Joseph Priestley buried Bunny 6.7.1752.

Mary Priestley nee Wilson, married Joseph 4.5.1745, Bunny. Mary wife of Joseph, no parish specified, buried at Bunny 29.5.1751.

John Priestly of Bradmore born c1709. Constables accounts 25.12.1782, £1 to be paid to Daniel Underwood for John Priestley's house, due 1.2.1783. Also in Accounts for 1784, payment to Daniel Underwood for John Priestley's house, £1, and 1785, payment to Daniel Underwood for 30 weeks for John Priestley's parlour 15/-. Buried Bunny 12.6.1785, age 76. 28.6.1785 Constable paid 1/6 to Mary Trigg for having laid him out.

John Priestley married Elizabeth Stevison, no parishes specified, at Bunny 30.1.1739.

Elizabeth Priestly of Bradmore, wife of John, possibly nee Stevison, buried Bunny 14.7.1765.

Samuel Priestley, bapt. Bunny 10.3.1741, son of John and Elizabeth, no parish specified, buried 11.4.1743.

Mary Priestley bapt. Bunny 6.5.1744, daughter of John and Elizabeth, no parish specified, buried Bunny 11.5.1744.

John Priestley bapt. 22.9.1747, son of John and Elizabeth, no parish specified, buried 23.9.1747.

Samuel Priestley, bapt. Bunny 5.1.1750, son of John and Elizabeth, no parishes specified.

Elizabeth Priestley kinswoman of John Mee, shepherd, who died 1767 - possibly wife of Joseph?

Joseph Priestley bapt. Bunny 23.4.1739, son of Joseph and Elizabeth Priestly of Bradmore.

Joseph Priestly, possibly son of Joseph and Elizabeth, may have married (1) Jane Wilkinson of Bradmore at Bunny 12.1.1762 and (2) Ann Treece of Barton in Fabis at Barton 6.11.1769. Received coals from Constable during 1780, and strikes of corn. Constable paid for 2 stone of flour for Joseph, 2/4d. Had coals from the Constable in 1785, in June had 2/- when ill, and a further 6/- and more coals. Buried Bunny 3.12.1780.

Jane Priestly of Bradmore wife of Joseph by 1765, possibly Jane Wilkinson who married Joseph Priestley 12.1.1762 at Bunny, no parishes specified. Buried Bunny 30.3.1769.

Sarah Priestly bapt. Bunny 21.7.1765, daughter of Joseph and Jane of Bradmore, then as daughter of Joseph and the late Jane buried Bunny 25.1.1770.

Ann Priestley, nee Triece of Barton in Fabis, married Joseph at Barton 6.11.1769. After his death in 1780 she received coals from the Constable, and in 1781 5/- for her child. May be Ann Priestly who married Matthew Cumberland at Bunny 18.5.1783, though not recorded as widow, but age 50 at death in 1787 may fit Ann Treece. See Cumberland.

Jane Priestly bapt. Bunny Sept.1770, daughter of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore.
Thomas Priestley bapt. Bunny 13.6.1773 son of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore. 1782-1787 paid by the Constable for sparrows, at 2d per dozen.
William Priestly bapt. Bunny 20.2.1775, son of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 6.11.1776.
Elizabeth Priestly bapt. Bunny 3.2.1777, daughter of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore. As daughter of late Joseph and Ann, buried Bunny 1.7.1781.
John Priestly bapt. Bunny 12.7.1792, illegitimate son of Jane Priestly of Bradmore.
Rebecca Priestly born c1778, Bradmore, married George Thompson of Thrumpton at Bunny 15.7.1799.
Richard Priestley 1784 received payment from the Constable for sparrows.
Catherine Priestly nee Chamberlain bapt. Bunny 24.7.1840, daughter of Benjamin, labourer, and (Mary) Ann of Bradmore. Catherine daughter of Benjamin, labourer married John Priestley labourer of Barton, son of Thomas, ag.lab, and Mary of Barton, at Bunny 30.12.1861. Not found 1871. 1881 John Priestley age 40 plaster labourer born Barton with wife Catherine age 40 born Bradmore and children Thomas 15, Benjamin A 12, Elizabeth A 8 scholar, Richard 6 scholar, John 1 all born Barton, at Barton. Catherine Priestley died Oct.qtr .1890, Basford district.

PUGSON

Isabel Pugson married John Millington, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 5.5.1672.
George Pugson married Mary Beardsley, widow, of Lenton, at Bunny 1.4.1673.
Widow Pugson on 1674 Hearth Tax return with 1 hearth, possibly of Bradmore?

PYATT

Henry William Pyatt born 4.8.1841. 1841 age 9 eldest child of Henry, 45, veterinary surgeon born Wilford and Sarah born Nottingham, at St James St, Park, Nottingham. (Henry senior in local directories as vet.surgeon up to 1862). 1861 Henry William age 19 gent in parents' house at St James' St, Park, Nottingham. Jul.qtr. 1867 Henry William Pyatt married Mary Brown of Nottingham, Basford district. 1871 Henry W age 30 student of music born Nottingham, lodging with Edward Jones, tailor, at Waldron Rd., 1 Albert Place, Harrow. 1881 Henry W age 38 vocalist visiting Henry Collins, Tailor, at 115 Bath Rd., Birmingham, with another vocalist George H Snazel from Sydenham. 1891 age 49 vocalist (music) with wife Mary and children Henry R 20 Oxford undergraduate born Nottingham, Mary, Frank, Margaret all born Harrow, plus a servant at Roxborough Park, Harrow. 1901 not found. 1911 age 69, retired vocalist, wife not present (married 44 years), with children Mary, Margaret Geraldine, Frank and his wife Jane Ethel and their child Barbara Mary Ethel, plus a servant, at The Grange, Bunny, 9-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll, but no address, spring 1920. Died 25.5.1920, buried Bunny churchyard. beside west gate.

Mary Pyatt nee Brown, born Nottingham 1854, married Henry William Pyatt Jul.qtr. 1867, Basford district. 1891 age 37 married to Henry, at Harrow. Otherwise not present with Henry at censuses (Henry travelling, as vocalist) and not found in census records. On Bradmore electoral roll with no address 1920, in Main Rd. spring 1921, in Farmers St. in her own right autumn 1921-1932/3. Possibly at Parkyns, Farmer Street, 1921-5 before moving to Barn Close (Source: M Bagguley). 1925 Kellys Directory, as Mrs Pyatt, private resident, and 1928 directory at Barn Close. Buried Bunny churchyard with husband Henry William, beside west gate.

Mary Pyatt junr (Dolly), born 1872, Harrow Middx, daughter of Henry and Mary. 1891 age 19, scholar at Royal Academy of Music, in parents' house at Harrow. 1911 age 37 in parents' house at Bunny. On Bradmore electoral roll for Farmers St. in her own right, autumn 1921-1939/40, then at Barn Close May 1945-1965. Sang in Carl Rosa Opera Company. 1953 on Coronation Festivities committee. Recorded as aged 85 in 1961. Died 18.12.1964, buried Bunny churchyard. near west gate, stone erected by sister Margaret Geraldine.

Margaret Geraldine Pyatt born c1879, Harrow, Middlesex, daughter of Henry and Mary. 1891 age 12 scholar in parents' house in Harrow. 1901 age 22 on own means, boarder with Rawden Haley bath-chair man at 9 Bank Square, Southport, Lancs. 1911 age 32 in parents' house at Bunny. On Bradmore electoral roll for Farmers St. in her own right, autumn 1921-1939/40, then at Barn Close May 1945-1969. Sang in Carl Rosa Opera Company. 1921 Founder member of Bunny & Bradmore Lawn Tennis Club. 1931-1943 listed as WI member, also 1948. 1940s Local Bradmore rep for Volunteer Land Corps (WI minutes). 1953 on the Coronation Festivities committee, and collected public subscriptions from Far St. and Manor Farm Cottages, together with Mrs Tunnicliffe. In 1961 age 83, 2 years younger than Mary, commented on gift of cottage to tenant Miss Rebecca Sales, age 78 of Bunny - 'Rebecca has worked for us and been in our house for more than 30 years. We thought

it would be rather nice while we were still here to give it to her. We wanted to give her some security.' 1961 Misses M and MG Pyatt were joint presidents of Bradmore Joint Conservative Association. Died 31.3.1969, buried Bunny churchyard. with sister Mary, near west gate.

Pyatt sisters Dolly and Geraldine were related to Forman Hardys of Nottingham Evening Post. 1932 Kellys Directory Misses Pyatt private residents at Barn Close, also Kellys 1936 and 1941. Article in Evening Post 18.8.1995 refers to the girls of the Pyatt family at Wysall who together with the 5 daughters of Mrs Cordeux at Bunny Hall (Hall Park and Woods bought in 1910, when Albert Ball bought the estate) used to form social clubs and organise drama and music events in the villages. Misses Pyatt remembered with affection in Bradmore village. Used to take the village children for rides in the pony and trap, and on Christmas Eve would go round the village with a lantern on a pole (there were no street lights until 1937) delivering gifts for every child. During the war they saved their sweet coupons for a year to get sweets for the children for Christmas. They were also remembered for having a houseful of cats, and would pay the vet bills for sick animals in the village. 1956 and 1958 the village garden party was held in their garden. Before coming to Bradmore they lived at the house on the far side of Rancliffe Wood on the Keyworth Rd.

Frank Pyatt born 1876 Harrow, Middlesex, son of Henry and Mary. 1891 age 15 in parents' house at Harrow. 1911 age 35, cotton planter, married to Jane Ethel age 39 born 1872 Nottingham (married 4 years with 1 child), Barbara Mary Ethel 3 born Barnes, in parents' house at Bunny. On Bradmore electoral roll for Farmers St., no local vote, 1939/40. On electoral roll at Barn Close 1945, and Oct. 1948-1951. Died 15.1.1951. Buried Bunny churchyard. with parents Henry William and Mary, beside west gate.

Barbara Mary Ethel Pyatt born 1908, Barnes Middx, daughter of Frank and Jane. 1911 with parents in grandparents' house at Bunny.
