Isaac Rains born 1863, Kirk Ireton, Derbyshire, son of Thomas, farmer and Mary A of Ashover. 1871 Thomas age 46 farmer of 56 acres born Matlock and wife Mary Ann age 46 born WInster, with children John 15, Sarah 13, Lucy 10, Isaac 8 and Annie 3 at North Britain, Ashover (eldest son Joseph already left home). 1881 Isaac age 18 groom (domestic) for Thomas H Harrison, accountant, at Hayles Mount, Duffield. 1891 age 28 coal merchant in brother's house, John Samuel Rains 35 dairyman born Winster, at 5 Newark Rd., Sneinton. Jan.qtr. 1894 married Alice Potter born 1865 Corringham Lincs, daughter of Francis colliery carpenter and Mary Ann (family living in Nottingham). 1901 age 38 dairyman on own account with wife Alice age 36 and children Constance M 6, Dorothy A 2 born Nottingham plus sister Annie 33, housework, at 12 Gt. Freeman St., Nottingham. Tenancy agreement for farm at Bradmore, 1.12.1906, rent £155 for 1st 3 years, £188/6/10 afterwards. Lands included garden, farmhouse, out-offices, Home Close, Spring Close, Far Bridge Leys, Pendock Close, Boom Flash, Vineyard fields, Well Close, Brick Kiln Close; also in Keyworth, Rancliffe Close (ie Rancliffe Farm). Rented grazing on Pendock Lane 1907. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement, 1908-1911, Rancliffe Farm. On Bunny Estate rental of 1908 with 179 acres 1 rood 20 perches paying £155 rent pa, and second entry for cottages paying £2 rent pa. 1909 renting herbage on Pendock Lane for 15/- pa. 1911 age 48, farmer born Kirk Ireton, with wife Alice age 46 born Gt. Canningham, Lincs (married 17 years with 3 children), Constance Mary 16, Dorothy Alice 12, Cyril Isaac 7 all born Nottingham, and his sister Annie 44 single born Kirk Ireton, plus a farm labourer at Silverdale Farm, Ruddington, 7-room house.

Joseph Rains born 1854 Sheffield, son of Thomas, farmer and Mary Ann of Ashover, older brother of Isaac. 1861 age 7 in parents' house, Main St., Kirk Ireton. 1871 not found. 1881 age 27 in parents' house at Yew Tree Farm, Ashover, with sister Annie age 13. 1891 age 36 in parents' house at Hardwick, Ashover, with sister Ann 23. 1901 age 47 coal dealer and grocer on own account with wife Sarah age 46 and children John H 5, Joseph 4 born Nottingham, at 26 Hewitt St., Nottingham. 1911 age 58 dairyman on own account with wife Sarah Jane age 57 born Ramsey Hunts (married 18 years, with 2 children), John Herbert 15 and Joseph 14 milk sellers at home, both born Nottingham, at 7 Montague Terrace, Mansfield Woodhouse, 5-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll, house, no county vote, 1909-1910.

RANBY

Robert Ranby born c1836 at Bransby, Lincs, son of Robert farmer 260 acres and Sarah of Ingleby, Lincolnshire. 1841 age 7 in parents' house at South Ingleby, Saxelby Lincs. 1851 age 17 in parents' house, South Ingleby. 1861 age 27 in parents' house, Ingleby. 1871 age 37 farmer of 295 acres with 2 labourers and 1 boy, with brother Francis 31 single visitor born Bransby Lincs and sister Elizabeth 29 single, housekeeper born Ingleby 1842, plus 5 servants, at Hoe Hill, Plumtree. 1881 age 45, unmarried, householder in farmhouse, farming 210 acres employing 4 men and 1 boy, with servants Mary Foster, Elizabeth Heale?, Joseph Burton and Frederick Slater at the north end of Farmer St., possibly Manor Farm (Bradmore 1881/14). 1881 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1891 age 50 ,farmer with 3 servants, at Cotgrave. Robert Ranby of Stragglethorpe, Notts, farmer, died 2.7.1983, admin Nottingham 2.8.1893 to Elizabeth Grammer wife of John (sister of Robert, married John Grammer, farmer 130 acres, Calverton, Oct.qtr. 1871), effects £470, re-sworn Sept.1894 £880/5/10.

RANDALL

William Ran(s)dale of Bradmore buried at Bunny 5.5.1572.

Annes Ransdale of Bradmore married Thomas Millett 21.1.1573.

Elizabeth Ransdale of Bradmore married Richard Richardson of Bunny at Bunny 3.2.1582.

Johan Randale of Bradmore buried Bunny 6.9.1588.

Ann Randall wife of George Randall of Bradmore buried Bunny Sept.1608.

Mary Randall of Bradmore married John Keat of Bunny at Bunny 12.10.1612.

George Randall of Plumtree married Agnes Barker of Bradmore at Plumtree by vicar's licence, 10.1.1588.

George Randall of Bradmore buried Bunny 21.4.1615.

William Randall born 1803, Lodge on the Wolds, bapt. 29.5.1803 at Kinoulton. son of Henry (d.1835, owned Lodge on the Wolds) and Suzanna (d.1837). 25.10.1836 William married (1) Anne Green of Kinoulton, who died at Lodge on the Wolds 1842 age 27, buried 19.10.1842 at Kinoulton. 27.3.1843 William of full age, widower, farmer of Lodge on the Wolds, married (2) Elizabeth Shipman of full age, housekeeper, of Cotgrave, who died at Lodge on the Wolds, buried 11.3.1869 age 71 at Kinoulton. 1871 William age 67, widower, in the house of son John and daughter in law Sarah, Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1871/21). Died 2.3.1872, age 68, buried 5.3.1872, Kinoulton.

John Randall, born 6.3.1840 at Lodge on the Wolds, Notts., son of William and Anne, bapt. 27.3.1840, Kinoulton. 1867, joiner, married Sarah White at Cropwell Bishop. Moved to Bradmore 25.3.1870, would have had to drive his stock on foot to Bradmore. Farm diary survives, containing references to trade as joiner and wheelwright for his own repairs, and as farmer. While at Bradmore he carted bricks to build Stanton on the Wolds railway tunnel using horse and cart. Lived at Rufford Lodge 1870-1900, then moved to Bonsers Farm. 1870 quoted as appointed tenant of Mrs Harriet Forteath as at 6.4.1870, at the farm opposite the chapel later called Rufford Lodge, which he took over from Levi Sharp. 1871 age 31, farmer of 67 acres married to Sarah, with children Clara H and William O, his father William, widower, and servants Charles Hand, George Leverton, Emma Henson (Bradmore 1871/21). On electoral roll 1872-5 in category £50+ rent pa. Served as Waywarden 1874, salary 10/-, and 1875, salary 9/6. 1876 PO Directory, farmer. 1876 was one of the overseers of the poor of the parish of Bradmore applying to the Charity Commission to re-establish Bunny Charities. 1878 signed the East Leake Charity accounts. 1879 helped James Marratt to move from Blackcliffe Farm to Thornton, Leics, a long day's journey by horse. 1881 age 41, married to Sarah, in farm house, farmer with 67 acres, with children Clara Kate and William Oliver, Annie Florence, John Edward, mother-in-law Sarah White, widow, and Ernest Walter White, nephew, also servants Edward Draper and Alice Widdowson (Bradmore 1881/18). 1881 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1883 rented grazing on Plumtree Lane, 1887 on Pendock Lane, 1887-9 on The Ramper, and 1887 on The Turnpike. 1885/6 Whites Directory, farmer. 1888 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1888 Mr Randall was paid 1/9 for cream etc for Sunday School public tea. 1891 widower, with children Clara Kate, William O, Annie F and John E (Bradmore 1891/36). 1894 Whites Directory, farmer. 1895 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1900 as treasurer of the Bradmore Queen's Jubilee Celebration Fund handed over the balance raised, £2/5/6 towards the cost of clearing out the Common Issue Ditches at each end of the village. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with farmhouses and land 185 acres 29 perches paying rent £271/6/10. Only he and William Smeeton are recorded as having farmhouses in the plural. In John Randall's case, this probably refers to the farm at Rufford Lodge and Bonsers Farm. 1901 age 61 widower, farmer, employer, with children William O, Annie F, John E and servant Maria Baker on Village (Main) St., (Bradmore 44/1901). 1904 Kellys Directory, John Randall, farmer. 30.5.1905 agreement with Arabella Wilkinson Smith to transfer land to WO and JE Randall, 193 acres 1 rood 9 perches, rent £271/6/10, specifying House Close, pasture of 3 roods 32 perches. 1908 Bunny rental schedule the land is held by John Edward and William Oliver Randall jointly. John Randall senior (i.e. senior to John Edward) on electoral roll with land and tenement 1886-1907. Moved to 15 Farmer St., lived there until 1928. 1911 age 71 retired farmer with son John Edward and his wife Maria, and Maria Baker companion, and servants William Arthur Smith and Arthur Spicer, 8-room house, census form signed by John Edward Randall. John Randall on electoral roll, house, no county vote, 1912-1914, may be same person. John senior on electoral roll for Farmer St., with no local vote, autumn 1921-1927/8. Never went to chapel, and never went on holiday. Died at Bonsers, 15 Farmer St., 17.4.1928 aged 88. Probate at Nottingham 26.6.1928 to William Oliver Randall and Oliver Herbert Randall, farmers, effects £562/2/2, re-sworn £450/11/2. Buried at Bunny churchyard beside path from west gate, with Sarah, 'Rock of Ages cleft for me.' John planted a chestnut tree in the corner of the field at the junction of the Ramper and Main Rd. as his own memorial; when the main road was widened the field boundary moved further back, but the tree was left standing at the newly formed verge until demolished May 2000 in the interests of road safety.

Sarah Randall, nee White, born 22.7.1835, bapt. 26.7.1835 at Cropwell Bishop, daughter of Edward White (plumber, d.1871, buried Cropwell Bishop) and Sarah nee Wild, sister of Joseph Wild of Owthorpe Lodge (Joseph was one of the executors of the will of Samuel Bonser, from whom Bonser's Farm took its name). 1871 age 35, married to John (Bradmore 1871/21). 1881 age 45, married to John (Bradmore 1881/18). Died 3.8.1888 at Bradmore, buried Bunny 5.8.1888 age 53, tombstone near path from west gate, with 23rd Psalm verse 4. John Randall also buried here.

Clara Kate Randall, born 5 or 7.12.1867 at Lodge on the Wolds, bapt. 12.1.1868, Kinoulton, daughter of John and Sarah. 1871 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/21). 1881 age 13, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/18). Methodist Sunday school teacher 1885-1892. 1891 age 23, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/36). 19.4.1900 age 32, married at Bunny to Edwin Harriman, 35, farmer of Bradmore. See Harriman.

William Oliver Randall (Will), born 28.10.1869 at Lodge on the Wolds, bapt. at Kinoulton 12.12.1869, son of John and Sarah. April 1870 moved to Rufford Lodge, Bradmore, there until 1911, then to 111 Loughborough Rd. until 1954. 1871 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/21). 1881 age 11 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/18). Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class 5.7.1885-6.6.1886. Teacher 2nd class Jan.1887-Dec.1888. 1887 signed Book Sales as Secretary. Teacher 1st class 2nd part replacing W Hutchinson, Jan.1889-1890, teacher Jan.1894-June 1905.

1896-1899 Secretary. 9.3.1886 applied for and was granted the apprentice fee, and on being bound, £10 was paid to John Randall from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1891 received £5 outgoing apprentice fee. Methodist Sunday School scholar 1885-6, teacher 1887-1954, secretary 1897 to ?, superintendent ?-1954. 80 years with the Sunday School in various capacities. Age 13 or 14 left school and learned lace drafting or designing, working in Nottingham with uncle Herbert Dalby, but with decline in lace trade returned to farm for his father and later with brother John Edward. 1889-1900, 1903-8 Sunday School Secretary. 1891 age 21, single, draught man in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/36). 1896 attended renovation fund meeting. 1896-1953 Methodist Church trustee. 1901 age 31, single, farmer's son working at home, in father's house (Bradmore 44/1901). 1901-1908 Methodist poor steward. Married Ethel Annie Dalby 3.3.1902. 1903 listed as farmer and church trustee in Bradmore Methodist Church deeds. 1904-1953 Sunday School teacher. 1908-9 choir committee. 30.5.1905 jointly with John Edward, agreement with Arabella Wilkinson Smith to transfer 193 acres, 1 rood, 9 perches at £271/6/10 rental, House Close specified, pasture of 3 roods 32 perches. 1911 age 41 farmer on own account with wife Ethel A and child Oliver H, in 7-room house (Bradmore 20/1911). Worked at Rufford Lodge to 1911, then at Bonsers farm to 1938. Special Constable, head of Bradmore Specials 1914-8. Received Certificate for Special Constable duties. On electoral roll, house, no county vote, 1904-1907, then land & tenement jointly with John Edward 1908-1914, without parish vote on this holding from 1912, but with land separately recorded 1912-14 which is with parish vote but without county vote. 1908 jointly with John Edward, on Bunny Estate rental with 185 acres 1 rood 9 perches at £271/6/10 pa rent. 1909 appointed governor of Bunny Charities and Bunny School. Overseer of the poor 1910 and 1911. 1912 Kellys Directory, William and John Randall, joint farmers, also 1922 and 1925. 1918-1928 Methodist Society Steward. 1918-1949 leader. 1918 collector for Circuit Debt Scheme. Living on Main Rd., 1920-1954. 1921 Methodist trustees secretary. 1923-53 paid Methodist seat rent. 1923-1949 Sunday School Superintendent. 1923-7 representative to Sunday School Council. 1921, 1925-51 Methodist church treasurer. 1924 on Water/Cleaning committee and garden party committee. 1925 responsible for inviting new village children to Sunday School Audited Bunny & Bradmore Womens Institute accounts to 1927. 1928 Kellys directory William Randall, farmer, Bonsers Farm, also 1932, 1926 and 1941. 1931 subscribed to organ fund. Celebrated Golden Wedding anniversary at St. Mary's Bunny, 1952. Died at home on Loughborough Rd., Bradmore Tuesday 2.2.1954, aged 84, probate 5.6.1954 to Ethel Annie Randall widow and Oliver Herbert Randall farmer, effects £11028/3/7. Buried at Bunny churchyard, beside path from west gate, with Ethel Annie; 'In heavenly love abiding.' Two collection plates and a reproduction of the painting 'I am the Light of the World' given in his memory.

Ethel Annie Randall, nee Dalby. 3.3.1902 married William Oliver. Was in service with the Rev Ernest C Kingdon, vicar of Bunny, and received a dinner service as wedding present from him. 1911 age 35, married 9 years to William, with 1 child (Bradmore 20/1911). On electoral roll for Main Rd. 1920-71, specified at Fircroft from 1964. Bradmore Methodist Church steward, Sunday School Superintendent from 1921 when Mr Walker died, teacher till 1954. 1934 Mrs W Randall on subcommittee for social. 1935 Mrs W Randall on King George V Jubilee Celebrations committee. 1949 flower rota. 1954 presented Sunday School prizes. 1954-64 paid seat rent. Founder member of Bunny & Bradmore WI. WI News: Oldest member of Bunny and Bradmore WI in 1954, greeted with a birthday song at the institute meeting, reported in the Notts Guardian Saturday 16.10.1954. Mrs G Randall was president, Mrs Waddingham and Mrs Wall hostesses. 1964 presented gift towards noticeboard for her 89th birthday. 1967 spent some time in hospital. Died 7.2.1971 age 95, living at Fircroft. Buried in Bunny churchyard. with William Oliver, 'At Rest.'

Oliver Herbert Randall born 30.1.1903, Rufford Lodge Bradmore, son of William, nephew of John, bapt. Bunny. Lived at Rufford Lodge 1903-11, then Fircroft 111 Loughborough Rd. formerly The Crown PH, 1911-1932. 1911 age 8 in parents' house, scholar (Bradmore 20/1911). Methodist Sunday School scholar 7.7.1912-1.6.1919. 1917 assistant teacher. 1921-32 Sunday School Secretary. 1926-68 teacher. 1922 on Sports Committee. 1923-30 poor steward. 1923-7 deputy representative to Circuit Sunday School Council. 1928-1932, 1945, representative. 1924 witness to trust deed. 1930-1959 society steward. 1933 to be Chapel Secretary if Mr C Jamson was not available. 1933-68 Sunday School Superintendent. 1939-1943, 1959-1981 secretary to leaders' meeting. 1940-86 Methodist organist. 1943 preacher. On electoral roll from 1926, no local vote. 1928-1961 audited Bunny & Bradmore WI accounts. Married Edith Alice Hill at Bunny, 1.10.1932, and moved to 107 Loughborough Rd., later returned to No.111. Worked on William and John's farm 1916, later for Frank and Ernest at Bonsers Farm. Ted Beeby of Manor Farm said if he went from here to London you would not see a better bean stack than that one built by Oliver Randall. Served in Home Guard 1940-44, Bradmore. On Main Rd. with full vote, 1933/4-1992,

specified at Fircroft from 1964. 1940, when Mr Robert Bagguley had an accident and did not play the chapel organ again, Oliver took over the organ playing until 1988. 1947-1980 church secretary, resigned. 1949-1975 Methodist trustee. 1949 on flower rota. 1961 donated the schoolroom clock. 1967 gave loan for boiler. 1970 loan to church. Listed his interests as woodwork, hedge laying, gardening, thatching stacks, laying out and building stacks of corn sheaves (Source: J Randall). Had a card with a drawing of the Bradmore post mill signed WD 1897 (possibly by his grandfather William Dalby). 1991 willed legacy to Sunday School. 1992 piano donated to the church. Died 19.3.1992 in his 89th year, living at Orchard House, Ruddington for about the previous year. Buried at Bunny 27.3.1992, tombstone in churchyard, north side of west tower, records that he was organist at Bradmore for many years, called to higher service.

Edith Alice Randall born 1905, Bunny, nee Hill, youngest daughter of George Hill, farmer of Bunny and Edith Annie. 1911 age 6, scholar, in parents' house at Bunny. Married Oliver Herbert, 1.10.1932.

Annie Florence Randall, born Bradmore, bapt. 27.8.1871, daughter of John, farmer, and Sarah. 1881 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/18). 1891 age 19 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/36). Methodist Sunday School scholar July 1885-29.5.1887(absent Feb/Mar.1886. Teacher 4th class Jan-Dec.1888, and 1897. 1901 age 29 single, working at home on farm, with parents (Bradmore 44/1901). Annie F Randall's Bible in Methodist church dated 1889. Died 26.9.1910 age 39, buried at Bunny 29.9.1910, north side of churchyard, stone seen autumn 1999 with cross leaning against the east side of it.

John Edward Randall, born 22.11.1873 at Bradmore, son of John and Sarah. Lived at Rufford Lodge from 1873-c1900, then Bonsers Farm to 1927. 1881 age 7, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/18). Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st Class 5.7.1885-1.6.1900, teacher 2nd class boys 1892-1903 or longer. Received Bible from Sunday School 1890. 1891 age 17, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/36). 1901 age 27, single, farmer's son working at home, in father's house Bradmore (Bradmore 44/1901). Farmer. 30.5.1905 jointly with William, agreement with Arabella Wilkinson Smith for 193 acres, 1 rood 9 perches at rent £271/6/10, House Close pasture specified. 1908 on Bunny Estate rental jointly with William Oliver, 185 acres 1 rood 9 perches at £271/6/10 pa rent. Electoral roll, land and tenement held jointly with William Oliver, 1908-1914, without parish vote on this holding from 1912, but with land separately recorded 1912-14 which is with parish vote but without county vote. 1909 Apr.qtr. married to Maria Cripwell at Ruddington parish church. 26.10.1909 John Edward Randall granted probate for Edwin Harriman, brother in law. 1911 age 37 with wife Maria in father's house, Bradmore. 1912 Kellys Directory, William and John Randall, farmers, also in 1922 and 1925. 1918 collector for Methodist Circuit Debt Scheme. In Farmer St. 1920-1926, autumn. 1921, 1924-5 Methodist preacher. 1923-7 paid seat rent. 1924-1927 Methodist Church Trustee. Had only one holiday, one weekend in Derbyshire when he was married. Special Constable during World War I, medals. Died 4.6.1927 age 53, at 18 Park Row, Nottingham, probate at Nottingham 17.1.1928 to Maria widow and William Oliver Randall, farmer, effects £7279/3/7. Buried at Bunny 8.6.1927, north side of churchyard, with Maria.

Maria Randall (Ria), nee Cripwell, born 6.12.1882 at Ruddington, daughter of Thomas, farmer and Mary. 1891 age 8 in parents' house at Ruddington. 1901 age 18, waitress in confectioner's, in widowed mother's house, Distillery St., Ruddington. Apr.qtr. 1909 married John Edward. 1911 age 28 (married 1 year, no children), with John Edward in his father's house, Bradmore. On electoral roll, Farmers St., 1920-1926 autumn, then in own right 1927-1939/40. 1928-1940 paid seat rent, used to sit right at the back of the gallery in Bradmore Methodist Chapel. Worked to look after the family, did some knitting and ordinary sewing. 1935 Mrs J Randall on K George V Jubilee Celebrations committee. Had 63 Loughborough Rd. built for herself to move to when Frank married. Died 24.4.1941 age 58, buried at Bunny, on north side of churchyard with John Edward.

Frank Cripwell Randall born 29.2.1912 at Bonser's Farm, 15 Farmer St., bapt. at Bunny, son of John and Maria. Methodist Church Sunday School scholar infants class 25.6.1916-1918, 3rd class to 1919, 2nd class to 1922, 1st class to 30.12.1928. Received Bible 1929. 1928 elder scholar recognised as teacher. Teacher and secretary 1929-1947, 1931-41 poor steward, 1933-1945 Sunday School secretary, 1935-1942 Temperance / Social Work Secretary, 1941 chaired Overseas Missions meeting, 1951 Home Missions Secretary, 1949-1997 church trustee. 1956-74 leaders' meeting treasurer, 1964-97 society steward, 1975 church secretary, and covenant secretary to 1994. Special Constable 1937-c1950. Farmed Bonsers Farm from April 1926, as own business jointly with brother Ernest from 6.4.1938 until retirement 25.3.1975. Won prizes with Lincoln Red cattle at Keyworth Show and Newark Show. Married Elizabeth Mary Whitaker 30.7.1938 at Widmerpool. Bunny School manager and chairman. Member Notts County Cricket Club. On electoral roll in Farmers St., no local vote, 1933/4-1938/9, then with full vote 1939/40-1998. 1966

appointed Mens Institute auditor. 1998 left legacy to church Renovation Fund. Died 12.5.1998 aged 86, buried in Bunny churchyard with Elizabeth Mary.

(Elizabeth) Mary Randall, nee Whitaker, born 14.4.1912 Widmerpool, daughter of George Whitaker, farmer, and Annie, of Hickling Pastures. Taught at Widmerpool School to 1937 then Cropwell Butler for 1½ years. Married to Frank at Widmerpool 30.7.1938 and came to Bonsers Farm, on electoral roll 1939/40-1993. 1949-1972/3 listed as WI member. Involved in Bradmore chapel catering committee and flower arranging. 1949 on Methodist flower rota. Had blue eyes. 1970 gave brass cross in memory of her parents (Whittakers). 1982 donation. 1984 communion steward. Died Wednesday 30.6.1993, aged 81, buried at Bunny 2.7.1993, north side of west tower.

Ernest William Randall son of John and Maria. Methodist Sunday school Scholar infants class 3.11.1919-1922, 2nd class to 1928, 1st class to 9.3.1930. 1935-7 church magazine secretary and distributor. 1942-51 Temperance / Social Work secretary. 1942 reserve Sunday School Secretary. 1952-63 magazine correspondent. 1953-60 Home missions secretary. 1965 secretary for garden effort. 1983-96 inter church committee representative. On electoral roll for Farmers St. with no local vote, 1937/8-1939/40, at South St. (i.e. Main St.) 1945, at Homeleigh, Loughborough Rd. 1946-69 and at Cintra, 101 Loughborough Rd. 1970-99, with Florence, house built by George Tustin. Harriett Rayner born c1842, Kimberley. 1851 age 9, scholar, as “daughter-in-law” in household of William and Sarah Smith on Main St. (Bradmore 1851/63).

RECKLESS

James Reckless born 1829, Clifton, son of Richard, ag.lab, and Frances. 1841 age 12 in parents' house at Clifton. Signed the Methodist Sunday School accounts 1846 and 1847. 1851 Jan.qtr. married Ann Attewell. 1851 census age 21 shoemaker in parents' house at Clifton. 1861 age 32 shoemaker with wife Ann and children William plus 3 others born in Ruddington, at Clifton. 1871 age 41 cordwainer and parish clerk, with wife Ann and children Ada (14, domestic servant, born Ruddington), and Sarah Ann 10, Mary 3 and Ernest 2 all scholars born Clifton. 1881 age 51 shoemaker and clerk, with wife Ann and children Mary 13, Ernest 12, James 9 and Louisa 6 all scholars born Clifton, at Clifton. 1891 age 61 shoemaker with wife Ann and daughter Louisa 16, at Clifton. James Reckless died 1899.

Ann Reckless nee Attewell, born c1828, Bradmore, daughter of John and Elizabeth. Apr.qtr. 1851 married James Reckless of Clifton. 1851 age 23 in her father's house on Main St. with son William, husband absent, at his parents' house (Bradmore 1851/2). 1861 age 33 married to James, at Clifton. 1871 age 43 married to James, at Clifton. 1881 age 50, married to James, at Clifton. 1891 age 63 married to James, at Clifton. 1901 age 73, widow living on her own means, with married daughter Mary Attewell and her son Ernest, and Ann's married daughter Louisa Shaw 26 with her husband John Shaw 25 cattleman born Ruddington (son of Joseph framework knitter and Mary Ann, married Louisa Jan.qtr. 1900) and their daughter Ethel Shaw 3 days old, born Clifton, at Village St., Clifton. 1911 age 83, widow, boarder with Fanny Tyler, 58, widow born Ruddington and her sons Henry 28 window cleaner self employed born Gainsborough and Arthur 19 machine builder's labourer born Nottingham, at 5 Mount St, Nottingham, 4-room house. Ann Reckless died Dec.qtr. 1917.

William Reckless, born Bradmore, bapt. 16.3.1851 Bunny, son of James and Ann. 1851 age 1 month, in house of grandfather John Attewell (Bradmore 1851/2). 1861 age 10, scholar, in parents' house at Clifton. 1871 age 20, manservant for Thomas Parkins Junr, confectioner, at Front Lane, Urmston, Lancs. 1872 Apr.qtr. William Reckless married Hannah Scholes age 23, cotton weaver, daughter of George, ag.lab and Elizabeth of Urmston. 1881 age 30, gardener born Clifton, with wife Hannah 32 and children John 6, Elizabeth A 4 scholars and Ernest W 2 all born Urmston, at Moss Rd., Urmston, Lancs. Oct.qtr. 1890 Hannah Reckless died, Conway district. 1891 not found. 1901 age 49 domestic gardener, widower, with children Elizabeth Ann 24 born Urmston, James Arthur 15 carter for provision stores born Denbigh, at Pen y Bryn, 1 Bryn Terrace, Eirias, Colwyn. 1911 age 59 widower, domestic gardener born Clifton, with son Albert 22 blacksmith born Denbigh, Ada 38 born Urmston, and Elizabeth 34 born Urmston, at Pen y Bryn, 1 Bryn Terrace, Old Colwyn.

Mary Reckless born 1868 Clifton, daughter of James and Ann. 1871 age 3 in parents' house. 1881

age 13 in parents' house. 1890 Apr.qtr. Mary Reckless married her cousin William Attewell, born 1865 Ripley, Derbyshire, son of William (born Bradmore) confectioner, and Ellen. 1891 Mary Attewell age 23 born Clifton with husband William age 26, pork butcher and son Ernest 1 mth born Ripley, at pork butcher's shop, Station Rd., Ripley. 1901 Mary age 33 and her son Ernest Attewell 10 scholar born Ripley in her mother Ann Reckless's house, Clifton. Also 1901 William age 36 journeyman baker is in his parents' house with his brother John and nephew John George Prescott at Chesterfield. 1911 Mary age 43 (married 21 years, 1 child) with William 36 colliery labourer and son Ernest 20 framework knitter, at Loscoe Grange, Codnor, 5-room house. See also Attewell.

REDE

Mary Rede of Bradmore married John Tebbott of Bunny at Bunny 11.10.1573.

REDFERN

Nicholas Redferne married to Alice, living in Bradmore 1640s. 1641 signed the Protestation Return supporting the true Protestant Religion.

Joseph Redfearne bapt. Bunny 27.6.1641 son of Nicholas and Alice of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Redfearne bapt. Bunny 24.12.1643, daughter of Nicholas and Alice of Bradmore.

Robert Redferne bapt. Bunny 7.12.1645, son of Nicholas and Alis of Bradmore. Probably the Robert who married Elizabeth Walker, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 28.11.1669 or 1670 (2 entries in IGI).

Thomas Redfern married (1) Dosal (Theodosia) Large, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 3.2.1763. Widower in 1765, married (2) Mary Eaton of Ruddington at Ruddington 6.5.1766. Paid 1/- by the Bradmore Constable in Jan.1781 for thatching, 10 days, assisted by Henry Mariot on that occasion. Dec.1785 Constable paid 15/- for thatching the Town Houses. 1786 had 4/- for doing Beckson's house. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under Town Houses and Incroachments with house and garden, total 5 perches. 3.11.1794 Constable paid Thomas Redfern 2/- for thatching Mary Stevenson's house, with Henry Henson assisting; 35 thatch sheaves cost 4/6. 1795 paid by the Constable for catching a magpie. Dec.1796, had 6d. for 3 days work by the house row. Feb.1799 Constable paid Mr Redfern, Gotham, the Doctor's bill £1/1/-, may be for Thomas Redfern. 20.5.1799 Thomas had 5/- from Constable when ill, and 27.5.1799 had 1 week's pay 3/6, and again 29.7.1799. Oct.1799 Thomas Redfern had coals paid by the Constable. 1800 had coals, and 24.3.1800 had 2/6 cash, and his doctor's bill £1/10/- paid for him by the Constable. May 1800 Constable paid 1/- for Thomas Redfern's oath. Dec.1800 he had a strike of barley. 18.1.1801 he had 2/- in money. 2.3.1801 had 2/- when ill. 25.5.1800 had 4/- when lame, and another 1/- on 1.6.1800. Feb.1802 had 2/6 when ill, Sept, Dec 13th and Dec 24th had 4 part payments towards House, total £4/1/- for repairs. Had 3 weeks pay July 1803, 3/-. Constable paid 1/- rent for him Jan.1804, but Thomas gave back £1/1/- towards cost of his coals. 1804 had 5/- p.wk., through to 1805. April 1804 Constable paid the doctor's bill 7/6 for him. Jan.1805 paid his rent 1/-. 23.4.1805 Constable paid Dr White's bill. 1808 Thomas had coals, and in July had 5 yds for a sheet, 5/-. Dec.1805 the Constable went to Wymeswold for the doctor for him. March 1809 Ann Piggot had 4/- for 6 days doing for him, and Sarah Smith had 16/- for the same, and another 4 weeks in April, and 6d for butter for him. Ale for the bearers at his funeral, 4/9½d, and burial expenses for the clerk 2/6. May 1809 Constable paid 2 women for sitting up with him 9/6. Thomas Redfern of Bradmore buried Bunny 24.2.1805 (or 1809?).

Theodosia (Dosal) Redfern married to Thomas, buried Bunny 26.11.1765.

Elizabeth Redfern bapt. Bunny 28.11.1763, daughter of Thomas and Dosal of Bradmore, buried Bunny 7.1.1768

Mary Redfern nee Eaton from Ruddington, wife of Thomas, married 6.5.1766 at Ruddington, buried at Bunny 17.7.1791.

William Redfern bapt. Bunny 12.3.1769, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 6.10.1770.

Elizabeth Redfern of Bradmore had weekly payments 2/- from the Constable from March 1805-8. April 1809 two women paid 10/- for doing for her. Buried Bunny 24.4.1808. Perhaps a third wife of Thomas?

George Redmile, born c1866, Easton Northants, son of George, ag.lab and Charlotte of Easton. 1871 age 6 in parents' house at Easton. 1881 age 15 ag.lab in parents' house at New Town, Easton. Jan.qtr.1890 married Sarah Alice Hardy, Nottingham district. 1891 age 25, householder, agricultural labourer, married to (Sarah) Alice with son George W, in part of Southwell Cottages (Bradmore 1891/62). Electoral roll, house with no county vote, 1892, 1894-8. 1901 age 37, ordinary ag.lab, with

wife Alice and children George William, Charles and Frederick on the Ruddington Turnpike / High St., Ruddington. 1911 age 46 farm labourer with wife Sarah Ann and children George William, Charles and Fred, at Bunny.

(Sarah) Alice Redmile, born c1872, Ruddington, daughter of William, highway labourer, and Eliza of Back St., Ruddington. Jan.qtr. 1890 married George Redmile. 1891 age 19, married to George (Bradmore 1891/62). 1901 Alice age 31, married to George. 1911 Sarah Alice age 38 (married 21 years with 5 children, 2 dead), with husband George at Bunny.

George William Redmile, born c1890/1, Ruddington, son of George and Alice. 1891 age 9 month in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/62). (George) William Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Boys 8.7.1894-June 1897, sick Dec.1894, 3rd class July 1897-1.5.1898. 1901 age 11 in parents' house. 1911 age 20, grocer's carter, in parents' house.

Charles Redmile, bapt. Bunny 10.4.1892, son of George, labourer and Sarah Alice of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Boys 15.3.1896-3.4.1898. 1901 age 9 born Ruddington, in parents' house. 1911 age 19, ag.lab, born Bradmore, in parents' house.

Fred Redmile, bapt. Bunny 15.4.1894, son of George, labourer, and Sarah Alice of Bradmore. 1901 age 7, born Bradmore, in parents' house. Admitted to Bunny School 8.3.1905, then of Bunny. 1911 age 17, ag.lab born Bradmore, in parents' house.

Rowland Redmile, bapt. 6.10.1896, son of George and Sarah Alice. Died Jul.qtr. 1898, Bingham district.

REED

William Reed born c1845, East Leake. 1861 age 16, single, agricultural carter in the household of Levy and Ann Sharpe at Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1861/20).

RHODELY (listed in IGI under Rodley)

Alice Rhodely of Bunny married William Parker of Bradmore at Bunny 28.1.1638.

Isabell Rhodely of Bradmore married William Hooton also of Bradmore, at Bunny 14.11.1642.

RICHARD(S)

Elizabeth Richard married William Bosworth of Stanton at Bunny on Michaelmasse daie, 25.9.1593.

William Richard born c1787, Keyworth. 1841 age 50, frameknitter, householder, married to Mary, with children Mary, Thomas and Ann, living on Main St. (Bradmore 1841/17). 1851 age 62, labourer, married to Mary, with children Mary and Ann, lodger Mary Stevenson, grand-daughters Elizabeth and Emma Smith, and lodger James Harwood (Bradmore 1851/61). 1861 age 74, pauper, former framework knitter, married to Mary, with grand-daughters Elizabeth Richards and Emma Smith, living in part of Rose Cottages (Bradmore 1861/45). Buried Bunny 9.4.1863 age 76.

Mary Richards, born c1786, Ruddington. 1838 Constable paid Mary Richards 5/- to clothe Henson's child, and 4/- for Stevenson's child. 1841 age 50, married to William (Bradmore 1841/17). 1851 age 63, married to William (Bradmore 1851/61). 1861 age 75, married to William (Bradmore 1861/45). 1866 had blankets from Bunny & Bradmore Charities, and 1868 received 6 cwt of coal.

John Richards bapt. Bunny 3.7.1817, son of William, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the John buried 12 August 1822, no age given.

Mary Richards bapt. Bunny 10.5.1819, daughter of William, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 20 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/17). 1851 age 31, single, seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/61).

Sarah Richards bapt. Bunny 27.3.1821, daughter of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Sarah Richards servant of Bradmore daughter of William, framework knitter, married John Smith, blacksmith of Bunny, son of George Smith, blacksmith, at Bunny 30.4.1843.

Elizabeth Richards, or Smith, grand-daughter of William and Mary, bapt. Bunny 12.9.1841 as illegitimate daughter of Sarah, servant, of Bradmore. 1851 age 9, scholar, surnamed Smith, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1851/61). 1861 age 19, single, surnamed Richards, seamstress, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1861/45).

Emma Richards or Smith, born 1843 Bradmore, grand-daughter of William and Mary. 1851 age 7 scholar with sister Elizabeth in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1851/61).

Ann Richards bapt. Bunny 15.7.1822 daughter of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 5 (should be 18), in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/17). 1851 age 28 seamer in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/61). Jul.qtr. 1854 married Robert James (born 1803) son of Edward and Mary. See James.

Thomas Richards bapt. Bunny 20.11.1823, son of William, stocking weaver, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 15 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/17).

William Richard born c1824 Bradmore, possibly son of William and Mary. 1841 age 20 in the household of Ann Peet, Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1841/78). 1851 age 32 born Bradmore servant for Ann Bradley, widow, farmer of 140 acres at Plumtree.

Samuel Richards bapt. Bunny 23.6.1826, son of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Buried 30.5.1827 age 1.

Job Richards bapt. Bunny 17.11.1827, son of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1851 age 23 confectioner born Bradmore, lodger with Ann Gibson, shopkeeper at Walnut Tree Lane, Nottingham. Oct.qtr. 1857 Job Richards married Harriet Barnes, Nottingham district. 1861 age 33 confectioner with wife Harriett 30 lace carder born Radford, at Wollaton St., Nottingham. 1871 age 49 confectioner with wife Harriett 40, nephew William Smith 13 errand boy and niece Harriett E Smith 7 scholar both born Nottingham, at 22 Kenilworth Terrace, Nottingham. 1881 age 53 confectioner with wife Harriett 50 and nephew William Henry Smith 22 lacemaker at 22 Kenilworth Terrace, Nottingham. 1891 age 63 confectioner with wife Harriet 60 and niece Harriet E 27 lace carder, at 22 Kenilworth Terrace, Nottingham. 1901 age 73 confectioner breadmaker with wife Harriett 70 lace scalloper working at home, at 3 Chapel Square, Nottingham. Job Richards died Oct.qtr. 1903.

Ann Richards daughter of William and Mary, born c1836.

Ann Richards c1853, Cotham, Notts, daughter of Richard ag.lab and Mary of Cotham. 1861 age 7 in parents' house at Cotham. 1871 age 18, single, domestic servant of Edward Goodwin, Manor Farm, birthplace mis-recorded as Gotham (Bradmore 1871/18).

RICHARDSON

Emma Richardson of Bradmore, born c1833 at Mapperley, Derbyshire, daughter of Edward, farmer. 1851 age 20 with parents Edward, 65, born Horsleywoodhouse, Derbyshire, farmer of 48 acres, and Mary 60 born Shottle, Derbyshire and Emma's brother Henry 28 born Mapperley, at Carr House, Denby, Derbyshire. 1861 age 30 single visiting William Bowmer farmer (born Shottle) of 280 acres at Park Farm, Osmaston, probably her uncle. 6.2.1865 then of Bradmore, married Thomas Morris farmer of Bradmore, son of Samuel, farmer. See Morris.

ROBERTS

John Roberts witnessed will of John Nixon 1722.

William Roberts married Anne daughter of William Dalby 2.10.1753 at Nottingham St. Marys. Both are referred to in William Dalby's will 1777.

ROBINSON

Robert Robinson on 1674 Hearth Tax list with one hearth.

Henry James Robinson, born 1878, Birmingham, son of Henry J, jeweller's bookkeeper and Sarah A of Gower St., Aston, Birmingham. On 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £3/10/- rent. Location of house not known. On Bradmore electoral roll, house, 1910 only. 1911 age 33, butcher's manager born Birmingham with wife Alice Clara age 30 born Birmingham, nee Dodd (married 10 years (Jul.qtr. 1900, Aston district) with 5 children), Alice Beatrice 10, Doris May 7 both born Birmingham, Henry James 5 born Nottingham, Ethel Ivy 3 and Herbert Albert 1 both born Bradmore, plus visitors brother Wallace John Robinson 28 iron plate worker with his wife Nellie 28 (married 6 years, 1 child) and son Wallace Leslie age 4, all born Birmingham, at Bunny.

ROE

Jane Roe born c1823. 1841 age 18, servant in the household of Sam Hordmer, Barn Close (Bradmore 1841/72).

ROPER

John Roper bapt. 21.3.1827, Langar cum Barnstone, son of Joseph and Mary. 1841 age 14 servant for Vincent Hall, farmer of Langar. 1851 age 24, single, farm servant, in the household of William James, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1851/44). 1861 age 32, ag.lab, in mother Mary Roper's house, widow 70 outdoor pauper born Aslocton, with John's sister Susan 34 housekeeper and Mary's grand-daughter Emma 15 labourer's daughter both born Barnstone, at Barnstone. 1871 John age 44 ag.lab with sister Susan 40 housekeeper and niece Emma 25 dressmaker at Barnstone. 1881 John age 54 ag.lab with sister Sunday 56 charwoman, niece Emma 33, both born Barnstone, and nephew John William Roper age 2 born Aslocton, at Barnstone. No occupations listed for Emma or John William. John Roper died Jul.qtr. 1884, Bingham district.

ROSS

John Ross, servant, killed by a Mare at Bradmore and buried at Bunny 22.5.1722. (No direct evidence, but there may be a connection with John the son of Martha Hemsley and supposed son of John Rosse Dr of Physicke, born 1709. See under Hemsley.)

ROSSELL

James Rossell signed Constable's Accounts 1804.

Sarah Rossell born c1792, buried Bunny 23.3.1831 age 39.

Jane Rossell born c1821 Bunny. 1851 age 30, single, housekeeper in house of cousin John Peet, Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1851/59).

ROWBOTHAM

William Rowbotham carried out inventory of goods of Joseph Nixon 1788.

Robert Roebbotham bapt. 10.11.1734, Bunny, son of Robert and Elizabeth (nee Staton, married at Bunny 28.4.1731), married Alice Henson at Bunny 16.11.1762. 1782 Constable paid Robert's bill 3/11 for work done at Henery Tomson's house, also his bill for gunn powder and shot to shoot at the Decoy, 19/5. Constable also paid 1/2 for 28 lb of 4½ flax, for the poor to spin. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas includes 1½d gathered from Robert Roobotham. 11.5.1785 he had 11/- for Mary Smith's coffin. 1785 had £5/-/2 for work on the Town Houses. 1786 his bill for £5 was paid. 1789 Constable paid him £1/6/3 for corn for Francis Smith who was ill. Jan.1792 Constable paid Robert Roobotham's bill £1/3/6, no details. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 13 acres 2 roods 7 perches including 2 acres 1 perch part of Moor Close in Bunny and land on Cottage Moor, paying rent of £12/12/2 including £2/11/4 for house, carpenter's shop, garden, and 1 acre foldyard and croft. Jan.1794 had 4/2 for a beam and scales, and 12/- for Ann Darker's coffin. Jan.1795 Constable paid his bill for 4/- (no details). Jan.1797 paid him 4/6 for Darker's child's coffin, and 3/6 for mending Joseph Attewel's chimney. Jan.1800 Constable paid Robert's bill for £1/18/6. June 1803 Constable paid his bill for £3/1/10 for work done. 1804 paid £2/16/11½d, 1806 had £2/5/- for 3 coffins, 1807 £20/4/3. 1809/10 had 16/6 for Elizabeth Redfern's coffin. 1811 bill 6/2 paid, 1812 bill £1/-/6, April 1818 bill 6/4½d for pinfold. Probably the Roobotham of Bradmore sculptor of gravestones of Bradmore people in Bunny churchyard, including Harwood 1780, Attenborough 1785 and 1799, Peet 1795. Buried Bunny 24.8.1817 age 79.

Alice Roebbotham nee Henson, married Robert at Bunny 16.11.1762.

Thomas Rubotham, bapt. Bunny 21.8.1763, son of Robert and Alice, no parish specified. Joiner and carpenter. 1825 the Constable paid his bill of £11/5/11. Buried Bunny 16.8.1828 age 65. Will dated 5.8.1828, proved 2.3.1829. Left to wife Mary all household furniture, goods, cattle, except tools and stock of wood, plus possession of and profits arising from cottage and lands held under Lord Rancliffe, if his lordship shall permit. At Mary's death, property to go to son Thomas. Also left to Mary the closes or grounds inclosed at Wymeswold, 13 acres in the occupation of John Voce, 2 other closes in Wymeswold and a house and garden of about 4 acres in the occupation of John Smith, another close at Wymeswold of 2½ acres in the occupation of Thomas Fox, and a close at East Leake of 3 acres with house and hereditaments in the occupation of Henry Follows. After Mary's death, John Voce's 13 acres to go to son Thomas Roobotham, 2 closes and house of John Smith to son John Roobotham, and Thomas Fox's 2 acres subject to payment of £5 pa to Sarah Bennet widow of Samuel Bennet of Nottingham as long as she lived, plus East Leake lands etc of Henry Follows, to son John Roobotham. Working tools and stock of wood to be equally divided between sons Thomas and John. To daughter Ann, wife of John Gaze, £60. To sons William and Samuel Roobotham all the residue of the estate and effects, book-debts etc, divided so that William received £60 less than Samuel, having already received £60 to buy a half of a machine. Executors Thomas and John Roobotham. Witnessed by Clement Rogers, schoolmaster of Keyworth, Richard Walker farmer of Bradmore, James Goodacre. All confirmed that erasures in the will were present when they witnessed it. Probate granted to Thomas Roobotham, joiner, and John Roobotham, joiner, sons.

Mary Roobotham, born c1769, wife of Thomas joiner and carpenter, beneficiary under his will of 1826. 1841 Mary Rowbotham age 75, born c1766, of independent means, householder, with Thomas and Mary and their children Thomas and John. The house may be either Parkyns or on Orchard House site on Farmer St. (Bradmore 1841/16). Buried Bunny 18.1.1849 age 80.

Ann Roobotham born 31.12.1791 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 2.2.1792, daughter of Thomas, carpenter, and Mary. May be Ann paid by the Constable in 1801 for catching sparrows. Married John Gaze of Bradmore, 24.8.1813. Beneficiary under father Thomas's will, 1828.

Mary Roobotham born 27.1.1794 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 5.2.1794, daughter of Thomas carpenter and Mary, presumably died before Dec.1796.

Mary Roobotham born 28.12.1796 Bradmore, bapt. 29.12.1796, daughter of Thomas, carpenter, and

Mary.

Thomas Rowbotham, born 30.3.1799, Bradmore, bapt. 4.4.1799 Bunny, son of Thomas, carpenter, and Mary. Beneficiary under Thomas's will 1829. Married Mary Dalby of Bradmore, 9.3.1830, witnessed by Henry Dalby. 1831 in Whites Directory as joiner, also in 1844. Signed Constable's Accounts 1832-3. On electoral roll 1840/1-1870 with freehold houses in Ruddington value £50+ rent pa, and in Bradmore 1868/9-1870 in category £12+ rent pa. 1841 age 41, farmer, with Mary Dalby age 42 recorded as married to Thomas and children Thomas and John, in his mother's house (Bradmore 1841/16). Probably this Thomas Rowbotham who signed the Sunday School accounts 1841 and 1846. 1848 had 10/6 from the Constable for work done, and 1848 had 1/- for keeping the Constables Accounts. 1851 age 52, householder, carpenter with one employee, married to Mary, with son Thomas and niece Mary Ann Dalby, daughter of Mary's brother Henry (Bradmore 1851/56). 1853 Whites Directory, joiner. 1855 Kellys Directory, carpenter. 1861 age 62, carpenter and farmer of 21 acres, married to Mary, with servant Sarah Garton, probably on site of Orchard House, Farmer St. (Bradmore 1861/19). 1864 Whites Directory, joiner. 1867 Bunny estate rental, as Thomas Senior, renting house, garden and orchard 3 roods 12 perches in Bradmore, and 12 acres 0 roods 39 perches in Bunny, at rent £29/17/4 pa. 1868 Thomas Rowbotham, farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in the deeds, may this Thomas or his son. Also 1871-81, Constable paid vestry rent 5/- to Thomas Rowbotham, could be either Thomas. 1871 age 71, joiner, married to Mary, with servant Mary Boot. Appears to be in Parkyns, Farmer St. (Bradmore 1871/71). 1881 age 82, cottager, farmer of 12 acres, married to Mary, back on Orchard House site (Bradmore 1881/65). 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager. Electoral roll with land and tenement, 1886-7, as Thomas senr. Died 19.10.1886 age 87, buried 22.10.1886 at Bunny north side of the tower, with wife Mary. Jan.1887 the executors of Thomas Rowbotham recovered the amount owing to Thomas as former Treasurer by Bradmore Methodist Church, paid out of £100 loan taken out to repay Thomas and to pay for repairs to the chapel ceiling.

Mary Rowbotham, born 1797, Bradmore, formerly Dalby. 1841 as Mary Dalby, age 42, married to Thomas, farmer, in his mother's house (Bradmore 1841/16). 1851 as Rowbotham, age 53, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1851/56). 1861 age 62, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1861/19). 1871 age 73, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/71). 1881 age 82, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1881/65). Died 23.1.1887 age 89, buried 26.1.1887 with Thomas at Bunny, north side of the tower.

Thomas Rowbotham, bapt. Bunny 6.6.1831, son of Thomas, carpenter and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 in grandmother's house (Bradmore 1841/16). 1851 age 19, single, carpenter, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/56). 30.6.1853 Thomas of Bradmore married Mary Page, widow of Bradmore, at Bunny. Probably the Thomas who signed the Constable's Accounts in 1859-60. 1861 age 29, cottager, farmer of 4 acres, married to Mary (Bradmore 1861/16). 1864 Whites Directory, farmer. 1867 Bunny Estate rental as Thomas Junior, renting house, garden and land 1 acre 3 roods 25 perches in Bradmore, 2 acres 0 roods 2 perches in Bunny, rent £15/17/9 pa. On electoral roll as Thomas Junior 1868-1870 in category £50+ rent pa with freehold houses at Ruddington and in 1871 in Bradmore in the category £12+ rent pa., concurrently with his father. 1869 Morris's Directory, cottager. 1871 age 39, cottager, married to Mary, on the site of Orchard House, Farmer St. (Bradmore 1871/70). 1881 age 49, married to Mary, at Parkyns (Bradmore 1881/66). 1885/6 Whites Directory as Thomas junior, cottager. Electoral roll, land & tenement, 1886-7, as Thomas junr. Buried Bunny 8.12.1886 age 56. See references under Thomas senior above, 1868, 1871 and 1887 regarding involvement with Bradmore Methodist Church, could relate to Thomas senior or Thomas junior.

Mary Rowbotham, born c1807, Bradmore. 30.6.1853 Mary Page widow of Bradmore married Thomas Rowbotham of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 54, married to Thomas. 1871 age 63, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/70). 1881 age 74, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1881/66). 1888 Kellys Directory, Mrs My. Rowbotham, cottager. Buried Bunny 5.12.1888 age 82.

John Rowbotham born c1834, Bradmore, son of Thomas and Mary. 1841 age 7, in his grandmother's house (Bradmore 1841/16).

John Rowbotham bapt. Bunny 12.1.1803, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. John Roobotham joiner, beneficiary under Thomas's will 1829. John Roobotham, joiner, married Hannah Roobotham, daughter of Robert and Elizabeth, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 22.7.1839. No record of John in Bradmore in 1841, but Hannah died before 1851 census. 1851 widower age 48, carpenter in the household of Elizabeth Rowbotham, widow, farmer of 13 acres born Normanton, 71, and her son Thomas 38, with John's daughter Catherine, 9 born Bunny, at Bunny. 1861 age 59 carpenter, householder living alone in Bunny. John Rowbotham born 1803 died Oct.qtr. 1870, Basford district.

Samuel Rowbotham bapt. Bunny 3 or 13.4.1807, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, possibly twin of William. 1841 Samuel baker age 30 with wife Rebecca age 30 and children Alfred 5, Mary

4, Sarah 3 and Eliza 4 mths plus a servant at Markfield, Leics. Oct.qtr. 1845 Rebecca Rowbotham died, Market Bosworth district. 1851 Samuel age 43 widower, baker born Bradmore, with children Mary Ann 14, Sarah 12, Eliza 10, Rebecca 8 all born Markfield, at 7 Stag Yard, Nottingham. Jul.qtr. 1858 Samuel Rowbotham died, Nottingham district.

William Rowbottom bapt. 3.4.1807, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, possibly twin of Samuel. William Roobotham witnessed will of William Voce 1829. Had a named brick in Bradmore Methodist Church, over the centre window, dated Sept.1830. Possibly William who married Elizabeth Voce 27.12.1830 at Nottingham St. Nicholas. Signed Constable's accounts 1835-6, 1838 and 1841, and headed the accounts as Assistant Overseer 1842-54. Signed Sunday School accounts 1836-8, 1849 and 1851/2. 1841 age 30, cottager, householder, married to Elizabeth with children William and Mary, living in part of Town End (Bradmore 1841/51). 1851 age 44, farmer of 20 acres, married to Elizabeth, with daughter Elizabeth Mirriam (Bradmore 1851/60). 1853 Whites Directory, William Rowbotham, assistant overseer, and in 1854. 1855 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1857 Mr W Rowbotham was owed 3/4¹/₄d for supervising men on the roads. Buried Bunny 31.1.1859 age 52.

Elizabeth Rowbottom born c1801/5 Wysall, nee Voce, married William 27.12.1830 at Nottingham St. Nicholas. 1841 age 35 married to William (Bradmore 1841/51). 1851 age 50, married to William (Bradmore 1851/60). Buried Bunny 3.4.1854 age 56.

William Voce Rowbottom, born 29.7.1832, son of William, cottager, and Elizabeth. "Christianed" at Bunny 21.1.1838 having previously been bapt. at Harley, Leicestershire. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/51). Not found in 1851. Buried Bunny 19.3.1856 age 24.

Mary Rowbotham bapt. Bunny 10.1.1833, daughter of William, cottager, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 8 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/51). Buried Bunny 12.9.1847 age 14.

Elizabeth Mirriam Rowbotham, bapt. Bunny 1.10.1842 daughter of William, cottager and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/60).

Elizabeth Roobotham bapt. Bunny 20.1.1765 of Bradmore daughter of Robert and Alice.

Ann Roobotham bapt. Bunny 31.1.1768, daughter of Robert and Alice of Bradmore.

Samuel Roobotham bapt. Bunny 12.3.1770, son of Robert and Alice of Bradmore. Probably the Samuel who received payment from the Constables in 1780 and 1783 for catching sparrows. Possibly the S Roobotham, sculptor of Bradmore, who signed the tombstone of Richard Attenborough (died 1785, stone in south-east section of Bunny churchyard. It might not have been erected until 1826, the date of administration of Richard's will.) May have married Elizabeth Gun of Bunny at Bunny 16.10.1804.

Robert Roobotham bapt. Bunny 22.9.1771, son of Robert and Alice of Bradmore. Probably the Robert who received payment from the Constables in 1780, 1782, 1784 and 1785 for catching sparrows, and in 1784 for crows. Married Elizabeth Marson of Bunny at Bunny 3.8.1807, banns having been read on 20th and 27th July and 3.8.1807.

Hannah Rowbotham daughter of Robert and Elizabeth married John Rowbotham of Bradmore son of Thomas and Mary 12.1.1803 - see under John.

Ann Roobotham married John Fish of Lenton at Bunny 8.7.1794.

Thomas Roobotham paid by the Constable in 1791 for catching a hedgehog.

Sarah Rowbotham born c1796, buried Bunny 1.5.1825 age 29.

Ann Rowbotham of Bradmore buried Bunny 10.1.1808.

Alice Roobotham of Bradmore buried Bunny 5.4.1809.

Catherine Eliza Rowbotham bapt. Bunny 29.10.1815, daughter of Thomas, carpenter, and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

John Rowbotham born c1826, Bradmore. 1841 age 15, shoemaker in the household of John Oliver, on Main Rd. opposite Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1841/13).

ROW(E)

Elizabeth Rowe of Bradmore married Thomas Hides of Ruddington at Bunny 26.11.1582.

Katherin Rowe married Thomas Henson of Plumtree at Bunny 8.9.1589.

Ellen Rowe married Thomas Angrave of Great Leake at Bunny 15.6.1612.

William Row of Bradmore, husbandman, left will dated 21.6.1613. Bequests 'to John my son £12 in full contentacion and satisfaction ... to Jane (or Anne?) my daughter £12 in like contentation of her child portion... to William my son £12 in full contentation and satisfaction of his child portion ... to Simon my son £12 etc... to Mary my daughter £12 etc... The rest and residue of all my goods and chattels ... I give and bequeath to Alice my wife, and Margaret my daughter and ... the said Alice and Margaret my executors... and I appoint John Polve? of Normanton in this parish of Plumtree,

husbandman, and John Alfre?... husbandman, my wife's brother ... and I give to other of them 2/6 for there paynes.'

ROWORTH

Joseph Roworth born 1809, Sutton Bonnington. Moved to Bradmore from Burton on the Wolds Leics, previously at Seagrave and Wymeswold. On Bradmore electoral roll 1870 in the category £12+ rent p.a., and 1871-5 in the category £50+ p.a. 1871 age 62, farmer of 170 acres (Rancliffe Farm) employing 1 labourer, married to Frances with children Sam, Sarah, Ann and Fanny and servant Thomas Corby (Bradmore 1871/1). 1881 age 71 widower in daughter Sarah Ann's house with her husband Royce Turner, 42 farmer of 260 acres at Clifton with Glapton, Notts.

Frances Roworth born 1804, Staunton Harold. 1871 age 67, married to Joseph (Bradmore 1871/1).

Sam Roworth born 1846, Burton Leics, son of Joseph and Frances. 1871 age 25, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/1).

Sarah Ann Roworth born 1844, Burton Leics, daughter of Joseph and Frances. 1871 age 27, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/1).

Fanny Roworth born 1848, Burton Leics., daughter of Joseph and Frances. 1871 age 23, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/1).

ROWS

Elizabeth Rows, bapt. Bunny 21.11.1703 daughter of William and wife, pauper, of Bradmore.

ROYSTON

Cuthbert Royston born 1823, North Wootton, Norfolk. 1851 age 28 basket manufacturer employing 5 men, plus servant at 8 Albert St, Nottingham. 1861 age 38, brush and basket manufacturer employing 7 men and 5 boys, with wife Elizabeth 35 born London plus servant, at 4 Albert St, Nottingham. 1867 Bunny Estate rental rented ozier beds, 8 acres 1 rood 8 perches in Bradmore and 5 acres 0 roods 1 perch in Bunny, at total rent £58/10/- pa accounted for in Bunny's rental rather than in Bradmore's. No house recorded in either place. 1871 age 48 basket manufacturer with wife Elizabeth 45 and servant at 20 Walton St., Nottingham. 1881 age 58 basket manufacturer with wife Elizabeth 55, and mother in law and servants, at Albert St., Nottingham. Cuthbert Royston died Jan.qtr. 1888, Nottingham district.

RUSSEL(L)

Mary Russel born Bradmore 1788, maiden name not known, married William Russel of Tollerton before 1851. 1841 William Russell age 40 servant for Pendock Barry Barry, 55, widower, at Tollerton (died 1847). 1851 William Russel age 50 farmer of 58 acres with wife Mary age 52 born Bradmore, daughter Elizabeth 4 scholar and 2 servants, at Tollerton. 1861 William 61 farmer of 83 acres employing 1 man and 2 boys, wife Mary 63, daughter Elizabeth 19 and 3 servants at Tollerton. 1871 William age 71 farmer of 72 acres with 1 man and 2 boys, wife Mary 73, daughter Elizabeth 29 plus 3 servants at Tollerton. William Russell born 1799 died Oct. 1876 Nottingham district. 1881 Mary Russel widow age 83 farmer born Bradmore, with servants including George Kettle.
