

SADLER

Thomas Sadler born 1804 Ticknall, Derbyshire. 1823 paid the Constable £5/16/- over various dates, presumably for upkeep of a child, possibly Sarah Sadler Middleton born Feb.1823 (see Middleton, and Beecroft). From ages and birth-places of children, in Ruddington before 1841. 1841 Thomas age 35, ag.lab, with wife Elizabeth age 40 and children Millicent 14, John 12, James 6, Lydia 4, Alice 2 and Thomas 8 mths, at Ruddington. 1851 Thomas age 47, head of household, farm bailiff, married to Elizabeth (age 50 born Bradmore, see Middleton) with children Alice 12, Thomas Ben 10, Joseph 8, William 6 all born Ruddington, in Ruddington some time before 1841. Also daughter Lydia age 14, in 1851 visting Elizabeth's sister Sarah Beecroft, at The Grange, Ruddington – see Beecroft. 1861 Thomas age 47 farm bailiff with wife Elizabeth 60 born Bradmore and children James 26 catler (cattleman), Alice 22, Thomas B 20 agricultural milkman all born Ruddington, at Grange Farm, Ruddington. 1871 Thomas age 67 widower, farm bailiff, on his own at The Grange, Ruddington. Thomas born 1804 died Jan.qtr. 1876, Basford district.

SARGENT

Ann Sargent of Bradmore buried Bunny 15.12.1803.

SARSON

Alice Sarson married Richard Greive of Hucknall Torkard at Bunny 14.1.1628.

Ann Sarson married Lawrence Hooton of Bunny at Bunny 7.7.1635.

SAUNDERS

William Saunders of Bradmore married Mary Bennett of Bunny, 24.12.1833, witnessed by Mary Saunders.

SAVAGE/SAVIDGE

William Savage of Bradmore buried Bunny 22.4.1747.

Mary Savage married William Street of Ruddington at Bunny 24.4.1759

Mary Savage of Bradmore buried Bunny 27.4.1775.

John Savage, born c1732, farmer, of Bradmore. Probably the John Savage involved in the case of William Barnes or Burn of Bradmore, labourer, who was sentenced at Nottingham on 7.10.1765 to be transported for 7 years to his Majesty's colonies or plantations in America for obtaining the sum of 6d of John Savage of Bradmore by falsely pretending that he, William Barnes, was lame of his right arm. John was executor and beneficiary of his aunt Ann Brown's will, 1774 (Ann Savage married Thomas Brown at Ruddington 4.10.1724). Paid land tax £1/3/8½d p.qtr. in 1780, payment taken over by Anne Savage in 1782. Buried Bunny 4.9.1781 in 49th year, buried south side of Bunny churchyard, stone refers to wife Ann and daughter Mary. Inventory dated 14.12.1782 comprising purse and apparel £19/10/-, household good £30/10/-, total £50. Bond dated 16.2.1782, by widow Ann, administration 22.4.1782.

Ann Savage wife of John, farmer of Bradmore, referred to on his tombstone. Possibly Ann nee Dodson, married John Savage 14.11.1758. Also tombstone of Ann, wife of Thomas Goodacre and relict of John Savage of Bradmore, died 3.12.1811 aged 72, i.e. born c1739. See Goodacre for verse on tombstone. Took over John Savage's land tax £1/3/8½d p.qtr. in 1782 and paid for 3 years, then it passed to Thomas Goodacre, so presumably she remarried in 1785. Widow Savage paid by the Constable in 1785 for catching sparrows.

Mary Savage of Bradmore born c1760, daughter of John Savage and Ann, died 7.8.1782 in her 23rd year, buried Bunny 16.8.1782 on south side of churchyard, with her late father John.

Ann Savage of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 20.12.1762, daughter of John Savage and Ann Dodson (no parish specified), buried Bunny 2.2.1770.

Ann Savage bapt. Bunny 17.8.1771 daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore. Possibly the Ann paid by the Constable in 1780 for catching sparrows, with brother Charles?

Elizabeth Savage daughter of John and Ann, no parish specified, noted at 27.12.1763 but not whether bapt. or buried.

Thomas Savage bapt. Bunny 13.6.1767, son of John and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 6.2.1770.

John Savage bapt. Bunny 5.1.1770, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Possibly the John paid by the Constable in 1792 for catching sparrows.

Rebecca Savage of Bradmore daughter of John and Ann buried Bunny 1.1.1773.

Charles Savage bapt. Bunny 1.3.1774 son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Paid by the Constable 1780-7 for catching sparrows.

Thomas Savage bapt. 28.5.1775, son of John and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 20.10.1776.

Edward Savage bapt. Bunny 30.9.1776, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Paid by the Constable for catching sparrows, 1785 and 1787.

Thomas Savage of Bradmore buried 26.4.1784.

Thomas Savage of Bradmore, born c1778, possibly son of John and Ann - their third Thomas after death of Thomas age 1½ in 1776. 1787 and 1790 paid by the Constable for catching sparrows. Signed the Constable's Accounts 1804 and 1809. 1807 married Catherine Ann Gillam of Countesthorpe. 1810/11 the Constable paid his bill 6/1. Died 19.8.1816 aged 38, buried 21.8.1816 Bunny churchyard on south side beside path to porch, overlaying a tombstone of a member of the Knight family. 'Reader, remember man is born to die / And in the dust like me you soon must lie / Let not the world ensnare your youthful breast / If you desire with Jesus Christ to rest.'

Catherine Ann Savage born c1783 daughter of William and Ann Gillam of Countesthorpe, Co. Leicester, married Thomas Savage of Bradmore 1807, died 28.3.1815 aged 32, buried 31.3.1815 (registers record age 30) in Bunny churchyard beside path to south porch. 'Tender mother and kind wife lies here / Snatched from her husband and two children dear / Who hope once more that they shall meet again / In heaven above, where saints immortal reign.'

William Savage bapt. Bunny 13.5.1811, son of Thomas and Catherine of Bradmore. 1851 William age 39 born Bradmore, occupation illegible, with wife Eliza age 38 born Desborough Northants and son Thomas E 2 born Countesthorpe, at Countesthorpe, Leics.

Anne Savage married John Young of Countesthorpe Leics by vicar's licence at Bunny 11.3.1794. Bond by Thomas Goodacre, farmer of Bradmore.

Charles Savage of Bradmore buried Bunny 7.9.1768.

John Savidge signed the Bradmore Constables Accounts 1792-1801. Possibly the John Savage of Bradmore buried Bunny 19.9.1804, death duty recorded 25.2.1805.

John Savage of Bradmore married Elizabeth Young of Countesthorpe, 1802.

Ann Savidge/Savage, bapt. Bunny 9.4.1803 daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore, died 25.8.1809 in her 7th year.

Elizabeth Savidge bapt. Bunny 20.11.1804, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

John Savidge bapt. Bunny 10.12.1808, son of Thomas and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 John Savage age 42 born Bradmore, private Royal Marines, with wife Elizabeth 36 born Ryde, Isle of Wight, and 2 lodgers at Dunstable Building, Brook, Chatham.

Ann Savidge of Bradmore buried Bunny 11.5.1809.

William Savidge of Bradmore buried Bunny 18.2.1808.

Thirzah Savidge born c1827, Bunny, daughter of John, farmer, and Elizabeth. 1841 age 14 in her parents' house, Bunny. 1851 age 24, single, farmer's daughter, visitor in the household of Thomas and Martha Holmes, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1851/37). 1861 in her uncle's house, Joseph R Marshall 57 farmer of 230 acres with 1 labourer and his son Joseph 19, his sister Ann 64 housekeeper all born Bunny, and 3 servants at Aston Lane, Shardlow. Oct.qtr. 1868 Thirza Savidge married Robert Cowley, Basford district. 1871 Robert Cowley age 34 born Risley Derbyshire, farmer of 62 acres with 1 man and 1 boy (temporarily absent), wife Thirza age 44 born Bunny, and Robert's children Sarah 12 and Elizabeth 10 both born Hemington, plus Thirza's mother Elizabeth Savidge 69 visiting, and a servant at Hemington, Leics. 1881 Robert age 50 farmer of 75 acres with wife Thirza age 54 and 4 servants at Hemington.

Elizabeth Savage of Bradmore married George Robert Vann Freer of Desford at Bunny 28.1.1836. 1851 George Freer age 38 surgeon apothecary born Enderby, Leics with wife Elizabeth age 35 born Bradmore and son Owen 11 scholar born Desford plus servant, at Church St., Donington. 1861 George age 47 general medical practitioner with wife Elizabeth age 47 and son Owen 21 mariner plus servant at Park Lane, Donington, Lincs. 1867 George Robert Vann Freer surgeon died 7.3.1876 at Donington, will proved at Lincoln 16.7.1867 by Elizabeth, widow and sole executrix, effects under £2000. 1871 Elizabeth age 57 widow annuitant plus servant at Donington, Lincs. 1.1.1882 Elizabeth Freer widow died at Donington Lincs, will and codicil proved at Lincoln by Richard Bothamley Acct and Edward William Jollye surgeon both of Donington, executors, estate £2095/7/8.

SAWYER

Mary Jane Sawyer nee Peet bapt. Bunny 13.9.1863 daughter of William, farmer, and Sarah Ann of Bradmore. Jul.qtr.1889 Mary Jane Peet married William Hanson Sawyer of Shoreditch, London, Leicester district. 1891 William H Sawyer age 27 commercial traveller, stationery, born Hackney, with wife Mary J age 27 born Bradmore and daughter Evelyn H 1 mth born Hull, plus nurse and servant, at 9 St Hilda St., Sculcoates, Hull. 1901 William H Sawyer age 37 publisher's commercial traveller born Shoreditch with wife Mary J age 37 born Bradmore and children Reginald 8, Frederick 5, both born Leicester, with Mary's parents William and Sarah Ann Peet visiting, at 50 Grove St., East Retford.

1911 William Hanson Sawyer director and manager of printing and stationery works, employer, with wife Mary Jane age 47 (married 21 years), and children Reginald Hanson Sawyer 15 traveller for printing and stationery, Frederick Charles 14 scholar, both born Leicester, and Mary Jane's mother Sarah Ann, at "Wyndcliffs", 57 Wellesley Ave., Hull, 7-room house.

SCOTHERN

William Scothern born 1839 Bingham, son of James, shoemaker and Ann. 1841 age 5 in parents' house at Bingham. 1851 age 15 scholar in parents' house at Bingham. Not found 1861. 1.11.1868 William Scothern labourer of Bradmore son of James, shoemaker, married Harriett James of Bradmore, daughter of Edward, blacksmith, at Bunny. 1871 William age 33 labourer with wife Harriett and daughter Annie 1, at 4 Melville Terrace, Melville St., Nottingham. 1881 William age 45 gen.lab with wife Harriett and daughter Annie 11 scholar born Nottingham at 4 Uppingham Terrace, Nottingham. 1891 William 55 gen.lab and wife Harriett and daughter Annie 21 at 4 Uppingham Terrace. 1900 Jan.qtr. William Scothern died.

Harriett Scothern nee James, born 1841 Bradmore daughter of Edward, blacksmith, and Harriett. Married William Scothern 1.1.1868 at Bunny. 1871 age 30 hosiery seamer working at home, married to William. 1881 age 50 seamer married to William. 1891 age 60 hosiery seamer married to William. 1901 age 60 hosiery seamer with daughter Anne 31 both hosiery seamers working at home, plus a boarder at 4 Uppingham Terrace, Nottingham. 1911 age 70, widow (married 41 years with 1 child), with Ann 40, hosiery seamer working at home, plus a boarder at 4 Uppingham Terrace, Nottingham.

Louisa Scothern Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class 5.7.1885-20.7.1885, left.

Ada Scothern Methodist Sunday School scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-27.12.1885, left.

Arthur Scothern Methodist Sunday School scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-10.1.1886, left. Received 2d for catechism book.

SCOTT(E)

Ellen Scott of Bradmore, housewife, on 12.5.1482 and on other occasions 'commonly and usually at Nottingham ... did regrate eggs, butter and cheese brought to the market ... and did sell them again in the same market, to the dearness and detriment of ... the King's folk and against his peace.' (Nottingham Borough Records.)

John Scotte of Bradmer made his will in March 1524. He desired to be buried in Bunney church and left a list of bequests, including land to his son Richard on condition that Richard and his heirs paid 6d yearly for evermore to provide a light before the rood (cross) at Flawforth. John appears to be a man of some wealth and standing from his bequests of money, land and property. The administrators of the will were the vicar of Buney and his son Richard, and there is reference to Hugh Annsly of Rodyngton probably as executor. John also bequeathed the house, land and meddowe in which he lived and the house and land in which he himself lived to another son Henry, but should Henry cause trouble with the executors they should have authority to sell the house and lands and dispose of the money for the wellbeing of John's soul. (Ruddington Local Hist Soc.)

Henry Scott son of John of Bradmer, may possibly be the Henry Scott warden of the college of chantry priests at Flawford c1550 who absconded with the chalice and allowed the college, or mansion house in the village, to fall into decay. Not a firm identification (Ruddington Local Hist Soc.).

John Scott between 1558 and 1579 had a suit in Chancery against Richard Darker and wife Dorothy.

John Scotte the elder, son and heir of late Henry Scotte, party to agreement of 7.1.1567 Henry Sacheverell of Ratcliffe on Soar, Geoffrey Whalley of Idersay Derbyshire, William Hydes of Ruddington, Robert Abbotte of Bradmore, John Scotte the elder, son and heir of late Henry Scotte of Bradmore, and John Scotte the younger, son and heir of Richard Scotte of Bradmore agree to levy fine of lands, tenements and hereditaments in Bradmore, Ruddington and Cortlingstocke to William Kinder and Richard Lane, all lands, tenements and hereditaments in Bradmore to the sole use of Geoffrey Walley, and in Ruddington and 1 cottage and land in Bradmore to the use of Robert Abbotte for life and after his death to Richard Hodge.

John Scotte the younger, son and heir of Richard Scotte of Bradmore, also party to the above agreement of 7.1.1567.

SELBY

Margery Selbey married Matthew English of Bunny at Bunny 3.2.1612.

Emmat Selby bapt. Bunny 2.2.1645, daughter of William and (blank) of Bradmore.

James Selby of Bradmore married Ann Sears at Bunny 22.3.1759. Buried Bunny 22.1.1769.

Ann Selby nee Sears, married James Selby at Bunny 22.3.1759, no parishes specified. Widow of Bradmore, buried Bunny 4.6.1769.

James Selby bapt. Bunny 19.2.1764, son of James and Ann, no parish specified. Possibly the James Selby of Bradmore buried Bunny 12.3.1772.

Benjamin Selby bapt. Bunny 3.8.1766, of Bradmore son of James and Ann.

Elizabeth Selby, bapt. Bunny 6.5.1769, daughter of Ann of Bradmore, widow of the late James Selby. Possibly Selby's girl referred to in Constable's Accounts 1781, Constable paid for a blouse, aprons, cloth for gown and other things, total 3/-.

William Selby born c1776/7, paid by the Constable in 1795 and 1800 for catching sparrows. Buried Bunny 31.1.1821 age 44.

John Selby paid by the Constable in 1800 for catching sparrows.

William Selby of Bradmore, married to Mary, living in Bradmore in 1800s. April 1803 the Constable paid for lawyer's advice about William Selby. 11.7.1803 Selby came to Bradmore. Jan.1804 Constable paid William Bennet house rent for William Selby, 12 weeks 18/-, i.e. 1/6 p.wk. 23.1.1804 Constable paid a Counciller and his man for advice for Selby, £1/3/6. Oct.1811 William Selby had 4/- to pay his housekeeper. Suggests his wife had died, so may be Mary who was buried Dec.1810. 28.10.1811 a towns meeting was held for Selby and Bexton. Dec.1812 Selby had £1 from the Constable. 1820 Sam Attewell was pad 6d for crying Selby's sale. 1832 Mr Walker was paid £13/5/7½d on Selby's account.

Mary Selby of Bradmore buried Bunny 11.12.1810, possibly wife of William who by 1811 was paying a housekeeper. William Selby married Mary Pike at Keyworth 23.3.1802, but if this is the right William and Mary it does nothing to explain the middle name Bayley for Mary's last child.

Henry Selby son of William and Mary of Bradmore buried Bunny 16.8.1804.

Elizabeth Selby bapt. Bunny 16.11.1805, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore.

John Selby bapt. 21.1.1808, son of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Henry Bayley Selby bapt. 21.12.1810, son of William and Mary of Bradmore, possibly bapt. after the death of his mother. Apr.qtr. 1844 Henry Selby married Ann Chambers Silvester, Radford district. 1851 Henry age 40 born Bradmore, engine minder, with wife Ann 34 born Gamston and children John 4 mths, Charlotte 9 capmaker, Emma E 5 and Ann 7 scholars all born Nottingham at 15 Mill St., Nottingham. 1861 Henry 48 labourer born Bradmore with son John 10 scholar and servant Ann Piggott 34 born Newark, at Elm Avenue, Nottingham; also 1861, wife Ann Selby age 45 lace clipper born Gamston with children Charlotte 19, Ann 17 both lace clippers born Nottingham and Kate E 1 mth born Nottingham, at 14 Mill St., Nottingham. 1871 Henry 60 engine driver with wife Ann age 54 and children John 20 engine cleaner and Kate 10 scholar at 27 Mill St., Nottingham. Henry Bailey Selby born 1810 died Oct.qtr. 1871, Nottingham. 1881 Ann widow age 64 former laundress born Gamston with daughter Kate E 20, hosiery maker up, at 14 Poplar St., Nottingham. 1891 Ann, widow age 74 with children John 40 married (wife not present), stationery engine driver, and Kate Ellen, single, 30, hosiery maker up, at 1 London Rd., Nottingham. Ann Selby died Oct.qtr. 1896, Nottingham.

George Selby born c1845, Plumtree, son of Benjamin, ag.lab, and Sarah. 1841 age 6 in parents' house, Plumtree. 1861 age 15, plough boy in the household of Thomas Morris, Barn Close (Bradmore 1861/21). 1871 age 26 single, labourer born Plumtree, lodging with William Miles labourer at Queen St., Nottingham. George Selby died Dec.qtr. 1877, Bingham district.

SHARP(E)

Sarah Sharp married John Bosworth, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.11.1788

Levy Sharpe bapt. 21.11.1802, Cropwell Bishop, son of Thomas and Elizabeth. 1851 Levi age 48 farmer of 23 acres born Cropwell Bishop with wife Ann and son Thomas, at Cropwell Bishop. 1861 age 57, farmer of 66 acres employing 2 boys, married to Ann with son Thomas and servants Catherine Sheffield, William Reed and Thomas Hallam, at Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1861/20). On electoral roll 1863-1870 with land. 1864 Whites Directory, farmer. 1867 Bunny estate rental, renting house, orchard, garden and land 63 acres 2 roods 28 perches in Bradmore, 3 acres 1 rood 30 perches in Bunny, total rent £135/3/7 pa. 1869/70 served as Waywarden, salary 10/-. 1870 signed valuation of farm opposite the chapel, later called Rufford Lodge, valuation of tenants right, from Mr Levi Sharp to Mrs Harriet Forteath or her appointed tenant Mr John Randall as on 6.4.1870. 1871 age 68, retired farmer, married to Ann, living at 15/17 Main St. (Bradmore 1871/55). Levy Sharpe died Oct.qtr. 1873, Basford district.

Ann Sharpe born c1811, Cotgrave/Gamston. 1851 age 40 married to Levi at Cropwell Bishop. 1861 age 51, married to Levy (Bradmore 1861/20). 1871 age 63, married to Levy (Bradmore 1871/55). Ann Sharpe born c1809 died Oct.qtr. 1876, Bingham district.

Thomas Sharpe born c1838, Cropwell Bishop, son of Levy and Ann. 1851 age 13 scholar in parents' house. 1861 age 23 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/20). Apr.qtr. 1863 Thomas Sharpe married Mary Ann Shelton of Cropwell Bishop, daughter of George, farmer and Mary. 1871 Thomas age 32, farmer of 96 acres with 1 man, with wife Mary Ann and children George Shelton Sharpe and Mary

Elizabeth both born Bradmore, Annie 2 and Adeliza 1 born Keyworth plus 3 servants, at Keyworth. 1881 age 43, farmer of 96 acres with 1 boy, with wife Mary A and children George S born Bradmore, Annie 13 born Keyworth, Adeliza 10, William 9, Amelia 7, Walter 5 scholars, Minnie 3 and Thomas 1 all born Keyworth, at Keyworth. 1891 age 52, farmer, with wife Mary A and children William 19, Walter 15, plus Thomas 11, Maud 9, Mable 7 scholars, all born Keyworth, on Main St., Keyworth.

Mary Ann Sharpe born 1841, Cropwell Bishop, daughter of George, farmer and Mary. 1851 age 12 in parents' house at Cropwell Bishop. 1861 age 21 dressmaker in parents' house at Cropwell Bishop. Apr.qtr. 1863 married Thomas Sharpe. 1871 age 30 married to Thomas. 1881 age 42 married to Thomas. 1891 age 50 married to Thomas.

George Shelton Sharpe born 5.6.1864, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 13.7.1864, son of Thomas and Mary Ann. 1871 age 6, scholar in parents' house in Keyworth. 1881 age 16 in parents' house. 1891 not found. 1892 July.qtr. George Shelton Sharpe married Sarah Ann Wright, daughter of Matthew, farmer, and Rebecca, of The Park, Normanton on the Wolds. 1901 George S age 36 railway signalman born Bradmore with wife Sarah A age 36 born Keyworth and daughter Aurea Isabel 7 born Bakewell, at Starkholmes? Matlock, Derbyshire. 1911 George Shelton Sharpe age 46 railway signalman with wife Sarah Ann age 46 (married 18 years with 3 children, 2 dead), dressmaker on own account at home, with daughter Aurea Isabel 17 single wood polisher for telephone works, born Bakewell, at 17 Church St., Kirby in Ashfield, 4-room house.

Mary Elizabeth Sharpe born 22.10.1865, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 20.12.1865, daughter of Thomas and Mary Ann. 1871 age 4 scholar in parents' house in Keyworth. 1881 age 15, born Bradmore, general servant for Thomas Eaton Mason, tailor and clothier at 7 Belgrave Square, Nottingham. 1891 not found. Jan.qtr. 1893 Nottingham district Mary Elizabeth Sharpe married Harry Hutchinson, ale bottler, son of Pendock, innkeeper and Labia of Sneinton. 1901 Harry Hutchinson age 35 born Sneinton, carter for brewery, with wife Mary E age 35 and children Harry 8, Tom 5, Nellie 3, Dorothy 1 all born Sneinton, at 47 Oldham St., Nottingham. 1911 Harry age 45 brewer and waiter with wife Mary Elizabeth age 45 born Bradmore (married 19 years with 5 children), Henry 18 printing platen hand, Tom 15 printing layer on, Nellie 13, Dolly 11 and Kate 9 scholars all born Sneinton, at 524 Mansfield Rd., Nottingham, 6-room house.

Annie Sharpe born 18.5.1868, Keyworth, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 1.7.1868, daughter of Thomas and Mary Ann. 1871 age 2 in parents' house in Keyworth. 1881 age 13 in parents' house.

SHAW

Nathan Shaw of Bradmore buried Bunny 9.5.1734.

Jonathan Shaw bapt. Bunny 30.12.1719, son of Nathan and Bridget of Bradmore. Family moved to Bunny by 4.2.1722, but Nathan was still described as 'of Bradmore' 1734.

Francis Shaw of Bradmore married Sarah Woodcock of Prestwold 1813.

Sarah Shaw born c1821. 1841 age 20, servant in the household of Joseph and Mary Nixon, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1841/77).

William Shaw born c1830, Ruddington. 1851 age 21, single, farm labourer in the household of Thomas and Martha Holmes, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1851/37).

SHEFFIELD

Henry Shelton born c1826 Ruddington, son of William, ag.lab, and Hannah. 1841 age 15, servant in the household of William Attenbrough, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1841/79).

SHEPPERSON

Jane Shepperson born c1778, daughter of William Shepperson of Keyworth, farmer, married as spinster of Bradmore age 21 on 18.11.1799 to John Page of Stanton on Wolds, age 21, bachelor, farmer, by vicar's licence. Bond dated 9.11.1799 by John Page and William Shepperson. Jane recorded on the bond as of Bradmore, in the marriage register as of Bunny.

SHILCROSS

Elizabeth Shilcross of Bradmore married John Lane, framework knitter of Bradmore, at Bunny 5.10.1843. See Lane.

SILLS

George Sills of Bradmore 24.4.1626 presented for fornication with Marie Pes before marriage, by common fame. George Sills of Bradmore noted on the 1641 Protestation Return as churchwarden. Probably the George who was married to Mary and had son George bapt. at Bunny 21.10.1630.

SIMKIN

Caroline Simkin born 1862, Normanton on Soar, daughter of Samson, platelayer on railway born Sutton Bonnington, and Jane, born Normanton on Soar. 1871 age 9 in parents' house at Normanton. 1881 age 18, single, gen.dom.svt for John Butler at Debdale Farm, Bradmore (Bradmore 1881/3). 1884 Apr.qtr. married Samuel Moody of Hathern, ag.lab.

SKERRETT/SKERRITT

Francis Skerritt born c1812 Keyworth, plumber and glazier, married Ann, living in Bradmore 1834. 1841 age 29 glazier with wife Ann and children Sarah 4, Charles 2, Elizabeth 3 mths and a servant at Ruddington. 1851 with Ann and children Sarah 14, Charles 11, Elizabeth 10 and Ann 4 all born Ruddington, at Ruddington, so the family must have left Bradmore before 1837. 1861 age 49 plumber and glazier with wife Ann age 51, daughter Ann 14 and son Charles 21 married to Sarah 18 born Clifton with their daughter Adelaide 6 mths born Ruddington, at The Green, Ruddington. 1871 age 59 retired plumber with wife Ann, daughter Sarah Buxton, widow, 34 born Ruddington, and her children Frank 8, Jack 6 scholars and George 6 mths all born Radcliffe on Trent, at The Green, Ruddington. 1881 age 69, plumber and glazier, with wife Ann and son Charles 42 with his son Edwin 15 (or 13?) both born Ruddington, at High St., Ruddington, next to the The Green.

Ann Skerritt born c1811, Bradmore. 1841 age 30 married to Francis. 1851 married to Francis at Ruddington. 1861 age 51 married to Francis. 1871 age 60 married to Francis. 1881 age 71 married to Francis.

Catherine Skerrett bapt. Bunny 30.12.1834, daughter of Francis, glazier, and Ann of Bradmore. Not on 1841 census, so may have died as an infant.

SKYFFHUT

John Skyffhut of Bradmore 20.12.1374 witnessed lan grant by William son of Hugh de Chyrche, vicar of Bunny, to Hugh de Annesley of Ruddington 1 plot called Prestplace in Bradmore between the

tenements of the Priory of Lenton on the west and Torkarplace on the east. Witnesses include, Roger Anne of Bradmore and John del North' of Bradmore

SLATER

Frederick Slater, born c1866 at Granby. 1881 age 15 single, farm indoor servant at household of Robert Ranby at the north end of Farmer St. (Bradmore 1881/14).

SLEE

John Slee married Abigail Lees both of Bradmore at Bunny 1.8.1680.

SMALLEY

Elizabeth Smalley of Bradmore married William Lightessell of Bunny at Bunny 9.12.1572.

Elizabeth Smalley married William Hardy, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 22.12.1812.

Eliza Smalley of Bradmore married George Chamberlain framework knitter son of George, framework knitter, at Bunny 13.5.1839. See Chamberlain.

SMEDLEY

Samuel Smedley born 1853, Bramcote son of Samuel, framework knitter, and Ann. 1861 age 8 scholar in parents' house, Samuel age 56 born Bramcote, framework knitter, and Ann age 49 born Bulwell, with their other son Frederick 16 gardener, at 30 Town St., Bramcote. 1871 age 18, single, railway engine cleaner in his parents' house at 7 Town Street, Bramcote. 1878 Samuel married Catherine. 1881 Samuel age 28 railway engine driver with wife Catherine age 33 born Ireland, son Frederick Thomas 2 mths born Nottingham and Samuels's sister Rachel, single, 43 lace hand born Bramcote, at Grey Friars Gate, Meadows. 1891 age 38 engine driver with wife Catherine age 42 and son Frederick 10 at Nottingham Meadows. 1901 Samuel age 48 railway engine driver with son Frederick T, single, 20, articled clerk, at 15 Kensington Green, Meadows. 1911 Samuel age 58 (married 33 years, 1 child), retired railway engine driver, with servant Ellen Hill, housekeeper, 59 single, born 1852 Melton Mowbray (Bradmore 1911/52). Rachel Smedley, sister of Samuel, born 1838 Bramcote daughter of Samuel, framework knitter and Ann. 1841 age 3 with parents in grandfather Richard Smedley's house, age 75, framework knitter, at Bramcote. 1851 age 13 with parents Samuel age 48 glovemaking and Ann 39, and siblings Elizabeth 8, Frederick 6, and grandfather Richard widower 87 framework knitter born Trowell, at Village St., Bramcote. 1871 Rachel age 32 maker up of hosiery, lodger with Ann Buxton at 11 Fink Hill St., Nottingham (also lodging there, William Attewell carpenter born Bradmore 1849, see Attewell). 1881 age 43, lace hand, in brother Samuel's house. 1891 age 48 maker up of hosiery with sister Elizabeth 46, maker up of hosiery, at 2 Melville Terrace, Nottingham. 1901 age 59 with sister Elizabeth 56, both hosiery finishers working at home, at 1 Melville Terrace, Nottingham. 1911 Rachel age 70 single, hosiery finisher, cotton and wool, working at home, plus a boarder at 1 St Nicholas St., Nottingham 7-room house. Died 6.3.1904 age 78, buried north of the tower in Bunny churchyard with Sarah. Thomas Bowes Smeeton farmer of Bunny died 6.3.1904, probate at Nottingham 29.3.1904 to William Smeeton and Walter Smeeton farmers, effects £1330/0/11.

William Smeeton married Elizabeth Platt, Shardlow district. 1881 William age 25 born Underwood, farm bailiff with wife Elizabeth, at Bunny. 1888 Whites Directory, William Smeeton, farm foreman. 1891 age 35, householder, farm servant, married to Elizabeth with children Ernest W, Thomas, Annie, Elizabeth, and servants William Elliott and Mary Henson at Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1891/50). 1894 Whites Directory, farm bailiff. Bradmore electoral roll, house, 1886-1897, without county vote from 1890 onwards; land & tenement with full vote 1898-1911. Overseer of the poor 1897-1900. 1898 contributed 15/- to the Bunny Clock Fund memorial to 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign. Parish councillor 1909-12. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with farmhouses and land 77 acres 2 rods 16 perches paying rent £116 pa. William Smeeton and John Randall are the only entries on this rental showing farmhouses in the plural; one was Tofts but not clear which was the second of William's farmhouses. 27.4.1901 agreement with Mrs Wilkinson Smith, addendum to original agreement with Thomas Bowes Smeeton, adding 9 acres with effect from 6.4.1901, rent increased from £120 to £135, but reduced at 6.4.1901 to £125 due to cottage erected in one of the Bunny fields. 1904 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1908 Bunny Estate rental, two entries for William, (1) 77 acres 2 rods 16 perches paying £109/12/- rent pa, (2) 9 acres 0 rods 30 perches paying £15 rent pa. Known as Breeze Smeeton because he often said it was a breezy day (Source: M Bagguley). 1901 age 45 head of household, farmer and employer, recorded as born Underwood, Notts, with wife Eliabeth and children Ernest, Thomas, Annie, Elizabeth, John, plus mother in law Elizabeth Pratt in a house on the Loughborough Turnpike (Bradmore 48/1901). 1911 age 55, farmer and employer, with wife Elizabeth and children Ernest, Thomas, Annie, Elizabeth, John Platt Smeeton plus mother in law Elizabeth Pratt, in 10 room house, (Bradmore 2/1911). Died 15.5.1914 age 58, buried north side of Bunny churchyard. with Elizabeth. 'Them which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him.' William Smeeton farmer of Bunny died 15.5.1914, probate granted at Nottingham 18.8.1914 to Ernest William Smeeton and Thomas Smeeton, farmers; effects £3832/17/2.

Married William Jul.qtr. 1880, Shardlow district. 1881 age 28 National Schoolmistress married to William. 1891 age 38, married to William (Bradmore 1891/50). Headmistress of Bunny school. 1901 age 48 married to William. 1911 age 58 (married 30 years, 5 children). Possibly the Elizabeth on the electoral roll for Main Rd. in her own right, autumn 1921-spring 1922. 1922/3 paid Methodist pew rent. 1925 vice-president of the Bunny & Bradmore W.I. Died 1.10.1940 aged 88, buried north side of Bunny churchyard with William.

Had eldest brother William (Ernest W.?). Died aged 68, 14.3.1961, leaving widow Ethel and family, cremation at Wilford.

Farmed Yorke Farm (Gadd's Farm) with Mr Hallam as bailiff when the fire broke out in the wagon hovel, recorded by J P Smeeton. 17.5.1881 John Smeeton farmer of Bradmore son of Thomas Bowes Smeeton, farmer, married Ann Winifred Baggaley of Bradmore daughter of William, farmer, at Bunny. 1891 age 23 butcher with wife Ann Winifred and children Frederick William, Walter 6 scholar, George 4 scholar, Henry 3 and John 10 mths plus servant Martha Henson age 14 born Bradmore, at 180 Arkwright St., Nottingham. 1901 John age 43 butcher/shopkeeper, employer, with wife Ann W, children Frederick William, Walter 16 joiner, George 14 butcher at home, Harry 12, John 10, Winifred M 7 and Arthur 3 all born Nottingham, at 180 Arkwright St., Nottingham. 1904 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 131 acres 3 roods 7 perches at £158/4/- pa rent, and a second entry at £3 pa rent. 1911 age 53 butcher and farmer, employer, with wife Ann Winifred and children George 24, Henry 23 and John 20, all assisting in the business at home, Winifred Mary 17, Thomas 12 scholar and Robert James scholar, at 180 Arkwright St., Nottingham. 1912 Kelly's Directory, farmer. Walter Smeeton born c1874 Bradmore, son of Thomas B and Sarah. 1881 age 7, scholar in parents' house. 1891 age 17 in parents' house at Bunny. 1901 age 27, single, in parents' house at Bunny. 1911 age 37, farmer, employer, with wife Christine age 29 born East Leake (married 5 years with 4 children), children Eric Albert 1 and an unnamed son under 1 mth old both born Bunny, plus Walter's sister Mary (see above) and a visitor Clare Emma Booth 51, monthly nurse, born Gt Gonersby, Lincs (married 33 years, 10 children, 1 dead) and servant Ada Glover 17 single dom.svt born Gotham, at Bunny. Died 14.12.1914 age 40, 'Father in thy gracious keeping / Leave we now they servant sleeping.' Buried with wife Christine, died 26.10.1978 aged 97, and eldest daughter Elsie Kathleen died 12.3.1984 age 77.

Smeeton family: Will had an older sister Lizzie who married Albert Oldershaw and owned many houses in Loughborough. Their grand-daughter Elsie married Walter Smeeton of the Grange, Bunny. Will also had siblings Elise, Sidney and Alfred. Elsie's mother and Elsie's family moved to Hinds Farm and later built 27 Moor Lane, Bunny. When Walter died he left 6 children under the age of 10. (Source: M Bagguley). Information does not readily fit other data recorded here, but included to assist further research.

SMITH

Jefferie Smith of Bradmore c1626 presented for carrying coals on St Michael's Day.

Richard Smythe and Ursula Osborne late servant to William Bond, 5.11.1627, presented by one church-warden (un-named) of Bradmore by common fame of fornication.

William Smith married to Mary, living in Bradmore in 1660s/'70s.

Elizabeth Smith bapt. 23.3.1666, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the Elizabeth who married Edward Watcham both of Bradmore, at Bunny 4.8.1681.

James Smith bapt. 6.2.1670, son of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Richard Smith of Bradmore buried Bunny 7.7.1762.

Mary Smith bapt. Bunny 5.11.1721, daughter of Richard and Ann of Bradmore.

Henry Smith married to Mary, living in Bradmore in 1730s. May be the Henry Smith who carried out the inventory of goods of Edward Vose 1772, and the Henry Smith of Bradmore, shepherd, buried Bunny 7.12.1776.

Mary Smith of Bradmore, 1772-21.8.1783 received 2/6 p.wk. and coals from Constable. Mary buried Bunny 24.10.1783. 7.5.784 Constable paid Robert Roobotham 11/- for Mary Smith's coffin.

Mary Smith bapt. Bunny 31.12.1731, daughter of Henry and Mary of Bradmore.

Martha Smith bapt. Bunny 20.6.1734, daughter of Henry and Mary of Bradmore.

Jane Smith bapt. 17.10.1739, daughter of Henry and Mary of Bradmore.

Samuel Smith, bapt. Bunny 20.8.1742, son of Henry and Mary, parish not specified, buried Bunny 11.4.1743.

Henry Smith, bapt. at Bunny 4.6.1746, son of Henry and Mary, no parish specified.

Francis Smith, bapt. Bunny 12.2.1744, son of Henry and Mary, no parish specified, buried Bunny 7.6.1823 age 80. May be the Francis Smith married to Sarah, resident in Bradmore in 1770s, in Constable's Accounts 1783 received a stock of Blencorn, 5/10, and barley, 6/4, and later coals. In Jan.1785 he was paid 5/- for dressing William Henson, who had recently had medical attention. June 1785 paid 5/- by the Constable when ill. 24.2.1786 Constable paid Francis Smith 10/6 for necessaries for his girl (possibly Mary) when she went out, and Jan.1787 paid 5/- for a strike of wheat for him. 1787 he had coals. Dec.1787 the Constable bought things for Francis Smith's girl, 10/6. 1789

Constable paid Robert Roobotham's bill for corn for Francis Smith when ill, £1/6/3. Possibly the Francis who owed the Constables 2/8 in Jan.1794 for chairs, presumably from the Darkers' effects. Sept.1811 Frank Smith had a pair of stockings from the Constable, 2/4. 1811 the Constable was paying 3d p.wk. to Sam Dalby for washing for Smith's boy, and 1812/1813 to Sarah Smith for the same. Oct.1811 paid Francis Smith for going to Statute with the boy. Jan.1812 Francis had 2 3/4 yards of cloth for a shift, 3/8. 13.1.1812 F Smith junior had shoes from Thomas Dalby. 20.1.1812 Smith's boy had a pair of quarter boots from John Dutton, and 10.2.1812 paid 10d for making a shirt for F Smith. 13.4.1812 a coat for Francis, 7/-. June 1812 a pair of stockings for Smith's lad 2/3, and a hat 2/6. Nov.1812 Francis went to Statute with his grandson, expenses 1/-. Jan.1813 F Smith had 2/- p.wk. Frank had 9/- when ill and a frock, making and thread 1/2. Feb.1813 he was paid for working on the house row, 3/-. March 1813 Frank Smith had 3/- p.wk. and 22.3.1813 had a pair of stockings, 2/4. He had wages £2/5/- working on the house row, continuing through the summer. 8.11.1813 a pair of stockings for Smith's boy 3/4, and a hat 2/-. March 1814, a frock for Smith's boy 5/6. 3½ yards of blue linen for Francis's frock, 6/1½d. July 1814 Francis Smith was paid 2/6 for beast tenting (guarding tethered animals while grazing). Feb.1815 Francis was paid 3 days chipping bricks (would now be termed a chippie), 3d. Jan.1816 the Constable paid for bricks for Smith's house floor, and for plaster. Identification of Smith's boy not clear, nor whether Frank and Francis are the same person. 1792 Bunny Estate Rental Francis Smith & Co are recorded with the row of cottages on Donkey Lane, but no firm link to this Francis.

Sarah Smith born c1743, buried Bunny 5.3.1814 age 70, probably wife of Francis. 1809 she had 16/- from the Constable for doing Redfern for 4 weeks, and in April 8/- for another 2 weeks. Dec.1812 Sarah had 1/- for making a shift for William Bosworth. Oct.1813 she had 1/-. Feb.1811 she had 3d p.wk. for washing for Frank Smith - presumably Frank is therefore not her husband. Feb.1811 Sarah Darker had 2/6 for nursing Sarah Smith when ill, and April 1813 Jane Bennet was paid £1/1/- for nursing Sarah.

Samuel Smith of Bradmore son of Francis and Sarah bapt. Bunny 15.7.1770. Possibly the Sam Smith who was paid by the Constable 1780 for catching sparrows. 1801 Constable paid Sam Smith 5/- p.wk., 2/6 in 1802. 1804 Sam had £1/1/- towards burying his child, and his wife was paid twice by the Constable in Dec.1805, 10/-. Jan.1806 Sam had 2 weeks pay, 9/- ongoing. March 1806 the Constable paid Mr Peet 10/6 for Sam Smith's wife. Aug.1810 Constable paid Samuel £1 when ill, and again in September. 1810 Sam's 9/- p.wk. was reduced to 7/-. March 1811 paid Samuel 4/- when he came over to Bradmore. April paid 5/6 for Sam Smith's lad's frock and 9/- for his britches. Jan.1812 Sam had 5/- when lame, and 2 weeks rent, 3/-. March 1812 the family had 6/- p.wk. Oct.1812 Sam had 2/- p.wk. The identities of his wife and child are not established.

Mary Smith bapt. Bunny 8.3.1772, daughter of Francis and Sarah of Bradmore.

Ann Smith bapt. Bunny 21.9.1775, daughter of Francis and Sarah of Bradmore, buried Bunny 23.9.1775.

Elizabeth Smith bapt. Bunny 22.2.1774, daughter of Francis and Sarah of Bradmore.

Mary Smith bapt. Bunny 22.9.1776, daughter of Francis and Sarah of Bradmore.

Sarah Smith bapt. 10.2.1783, daughter of Francis and Sarah. Married Thomas Widdowson of Normanton on Soar at Bunny 29.4.1800. Buried Bunny 1819 age 36. See Widdowson.

? Smith, 4.12.1804 Constable paid Nottingham Overseer for Smith's wife 4/6 and 5/8 for new shoes for her. 7.12.1804 Constable paid for a warrant to take Smith up, and 6/- for writing the commitments to take Smith to, and 2/6 for ale for the Constables. Not Francis or Sam because they were established in the village both before and after this date.

Thomas Smith of Bradmore buried Bunny 13.9.1741.

Ann Smith of Bradmore buried Bunny 13.4.1748.

Ann Smith married Joseph Woolly of Clifton at Bunny 24.2.1756.

John Smith married to Ann, living in Bradmore in 1770s/'80s. 1785 the Constable paid Enery Austin for a load of bricks for John Smith's house, 12/8, and carriage, 11/-. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey renting a house and garden 27 perches, at 10/- pa., on Far St. 1810 had 5/- p.wk. from the Constable, Oct.1810 had 5/- when ill, and another 10/6 later when ill. Nov.1811 he was paid for 3 days work on the house row 1/6. May 1812 he had 5/- per week, July 3/- per week. Jan.1813 John Smith of Basford had 8/-, possibly this John. John was paid for work at the house row, 4/-, and had new shoes for his boy April 1813, 8/6. Dec.1816 Constable had 2 days expenses for going with John Smith to Nottingham about John Smith junior.

Ann Smith of Bradmore buried Bunny 11.2.1784, possibly the wife of John.

Ann Smith bapt. Bunny 30.1.1773, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore.

Mary Smith bapt. Bunny 22.8.1775, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore.

John Smith bapt. 8.11.1778 Bunny, son of John and Ann of Bradmore. Possibly the John Smith paid

1781 by the Constable for catching sparrows, and a hedgehog. Married Sarah Pike at Keyworth 24.12.1799. 1841 age 50 (understated), frameknitter, householder with Sarah, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1841/55). 1851 age 72, farm labourer, married to Sarah, with son Jarvas and his wife Maria, and their daughter Sarah (Bradmore 1851/29). Probably the John Smith paid £1 by the Constable 27.6.1853 for securing Charles Stevenson. 1861 age 85, widower, pauper, householder with son Gervase and his wife Maria and their son William, living on the opposite side of Far St. (Bradmore 1861/38). 1866 Widower John Smith received blankets from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1867 Bunny Estate rental, as John Smith Senior, with house and garden at £3/4/- pa. Buried Bunny 15.12.1867 age 91.

Sarah Smith born c1779, Keyworth, nee Pike, married at Keyworth 24.12.1799 to John Smith. 1841 age 60, married to John (Bradmore 1841/55). 1851 age 72, married to John (Bradmore 1851/29). Buried 21.6.1851 age 72.

John Smith bapt. Bunny 21.10.1801, son of John and Sarah. Married Ann Stubbs, both of Bradmore, 19.6.1823. 1841 age 40, cottager, householder, married to Ann, with children Eliza, Martha, Sarah, William and Ann, living at north end of Farmer St. (Bradmore 1841/75). 1844 Whites Directory, collar and harnessmaker. 1851 age 49, framework knitter, married to Ann, with children William, Sarah, Ann, and Mary with her husband Gideon Christian and their children Martha and Frederick (Bradmore 1851/65). Possibly the John Smith who rented the village soil 1856. 1861 age 59, framework knitter, making merino shirts, married to Ann, with grandson Frederick Christian, living in part of Southwell House on Main St. (Bradmore 1861/63). 1867 Bunny Estate rental as John Smith Junior, renting house and garden at £8 pa. 1870 John Smith was paid 10/- for cleaning the Sunday School. 1871 age 71, widower, in the household of Gideon and Mary Christian on The Green, Ruddington.

Ann Smith born c1803, Bradmore, nee Stubbs. Married John Smith 19.6.1823. 1841 age 35, married to John (Bradmore 1841/75). 1851 age 46, married to John (Bradmore 1851/65). 1861 age 56, married to John (Bradmore 1861/63). From 1864 Ann Smith was paid 10/- by the Sunday School, probably for cleaning – she took over the job from Ann Langham. Buried Bunny 8.6.1870 age 67.

Mary Smith, bapt. Bunny 20.7.1825, daughter of John, collarmaker, and Anne of Bradmore.

Mary Smith born c1827, Bradmore, daughter of John and Ann. Married Gideon Christian of Bunny at Bunny 19.4.1847. See Christian.

Elizabeth Smith bapt. Bunny 15.1.1827 daughter of John, collarmaker, and Ann Smith of Bradmore. Probably Eliza Smith daughter of John and Ann in 1841 census age 15 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/75). Elizabeth Smith of Bradmore daughter of John Smith saddler, under age, married William Baggely of Bradmore at Bunny 28.11.1844. 1851 Elizabeth Bagguley age 23 married to William born Caythorpe, with 2-year-old son Robert at Ruddington. See Bagguley.

Ann Smith bapt. Bunny 30.7.1829 daughter of John, collarmaker, and Ann of Bradmore. Buried 26.2.1831 age 2.

Martha Smith bapt. Bunny 17.9.1831, daughter of John, collarmaker, and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/75). Buried 11.5.1844 age 13.

Sarah Smith bapt. Bunny 6.2.1834, daughter of John, collarmaker and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 7 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/75). 1851 age 17, single, seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/65).

William Smith bapt. Bunny 14.3.1835, son of John, saddler and collarmaker, and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 6 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/75). 1851 age 16 framework knitter in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/65). 14.7.1859 William Smith of Bradmore married Clara Hickling of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 26, householder, framework knitter making merino shirts, householder, married to Clara, with daughter Annie, in part of No.24 Main St. (Bradmore 1861/49). 1871 age 36, framework knitter, married to Clara, living on Main Rd., probably opposite Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1871/6). 1881 age 46 hosiery and smallware dealer with wife Clara age 44 and daughter Annie M 20 waitress in shop, at 90 Wilford Rd., Nottingham. 1891 age 56 framework knitter, married to Clara with son in law Charles Attewell, daughter Annie M Attewell and their children Clara and Charles, at Church St., Ruddington.

Clara Smith born c1837, Normanton, nee Hickling. 14.7.1859 then of Bradmore, married William Smith of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 24, married to William (Bradmore 1861/49). 1871 age 34, married to William (Bradmore 1871/6). 1881 age 44 married to William, at Wilford Rd., Nottingham. 1891 age 54 married to William, at Church St., Ruddington.

Annie Maria Smith bapt. Bunny 20.4.1860, daughter of William, framework knitter and Clara of Bradmore. 1861 age 11 months in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/49). 1871 age 10 scholar visiting neighbour George Goodwin, farmer (Bradmore 1871/15). 1881 age 20 waitress in father's shop. Married Charles Attewell, framework knitter of Ruddington, born c1869, before

1886. 1891 age 30 with husband and children in her parents' house at Church St., Ruddington.

Charles Smith bapt. Bunny 12.9.1836, son of John collarmaker and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 18.11.1839 age 4.

Ann Smith bapt. Bunny 18.8.1837, daughter of John, collarmaker, and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/75). 1851 age 13, single, seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/65). Married 7.8.1855, under age, daughter of John, saddler, to John Hutchinson of Bradmore. See Hutchinson.

Matilda Smith bapt. Bunny 1.8.1839, daughter of John, saddler and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 8..12.1840 age 1 year 4 mths.

William Smith bapt. Bunny 3.11.1803, son of John and Sarah of Bradmore.

Ann Smith born c1811, buried Bunny 16.4.1830 age 19, possibly daughter of John and Sarah?

Gervase/Jarvis Smith, bapt. Bunny 25.9.1812, son of John and Sarah. Married (1) Mary, (2) Elizabeth. 1841 Jarvis age 25, framework knitter, householder, married to Mary, living on Far St. opposite his parents (Bradmore 1841/56). 1851 Jarvis age 38, framework knitter, married to Maria, with daughter Sarah in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/29). 1861 Gervase age 46, merino shirt maker, married to Maria, with son William in father's house, a few doors down from Gervase's 1841 house (Bradmore 1861/38). 1867 Gervase Smith received sheets from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1871 age 58, householder, framework knitter, married to Maria, with son William, in the same house as before (Bradmore 1871/32). 1881 age 67, framework knitter, married to Maria, with grandchildren George Smith and Sarah A Henson Smith (Bradmore 1881/29). Nov.1885 received a ton of coals from Bunny and Bradmore Charities, and again Oct.1886. 24.1.1889 as widower, framework knitter of Bradmore, married at Bunny to Elizabeth Lane, widow of Ruddington, daughter of John Silcross, labourer. 1891 age 79, framework knitter, married to Elizabeth, 3-room house (Bradmore 1891/19). Electoral roll, house, 1887-1892. Gervase died 1893 aged 82, buried 7.3.1893.

Maria Smith, born c1814 Wymeswold. 1841 age 20, married to Jarvis/Gervase (Bradmore 1841/56). 1851 age 38, married to Jarvis, in his parents' house (Bradmore 1851/29). 1861 age 41, married to Gervase, housekeeper in father in law John Smith's house (Bradmore 1861/38) Recorded as born in Bradmore, date would be 1820, but seems to be the same Maria. 1871 age 58, married to Gervase (Bradmore 1871/32). 1881 age 67, married to Gervase (Bradmore 1881/29). 1881 Mrs Gervas Smith awarded donation of 20/- from Bunny & Bradmore Charities towards doctor's bill. 1883 Maria Smith to receive £2 towards doctor's bill on account of long illness. Buried Bunny 10.6.1883, age 70.

Sarah Smith bapt. Bunny 2.10.1850, daughter of Gervase, framework knitter and Maria of Bradmore. 1851 age 6 months, in grandparents' (John and Sarah's) house (Bradmore 1851/29). Buried 1.8.1851 age 1 year 10 mths.

William Smith bapt. Bunny 10.5.1852, son of Gervase, framework knitter and Maria of Bradmore. On Bradmore electoral roll as William Smith junior 1870 in category £12+ rent pa, then as William 1871-1880, presumably this William. 1861 age 8, scholar grandfather John Smith's house (Bradmore 1861/38). 1869-1887 William Smith signed Sunday School accounts with his mark, identified as Wm Smith Junior 1869, 1870,1874, 1879 and 1880 to distinguish him from William born 1813. 1871 age 18, single, framework knitter in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/32). 1872 Jul.qtr. Loughborough district, William Smith married Harriet Henson. William Smith junior signed Sunday School accounts 1869/70, 1874, 1879 and probably up to 1887 (but could possibly be William married to Clara, see above). Was paid 10/- for cleaning the Sunday School 1875, 1879. 1881 age 28, householder, framework knitter, married to Harriett, with sons Gervase and Thomas Henson Smith, living on Far St. a few doors up from parents, in the house they had occupied in 1841 (Bradmore 1881/32). Sunday school teacher 1885-1899, 1906-1912, 1917-1925. Sunday School Superintendent Sept 1885-1936. 1886-91 Methodist church trustee. 1887 as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church, signed the loan from Wesleyan Assurance Co for repairs after the collapse of the chapel ceiling. 1887-8 Sunday School auditor. 1888 Sunday School Secretary, secretary of teachers and singers' excursion fund. 1891 age 38, married to Harriett with children George, Sarah A, Thomas and Emma, living on Main St. (Bradmore 1891/59). 1892-3 Sunday School Rules committee. 1894-1909 on choir committee, treasurer 1897. 1897 representative to Keyworth & District Free Church Council. 1901 age 48 framework knitter working at home with wife Harriet and children George and Thomas, on Village Street (Bradmore 36/1901). Made silk underwear for I & R Morley, Nottingham, working mainly at night. Smallholder, expert gardener and beekeeper. Played cricket. Electoral roll, house, 1887-1914, from 1912 two house entries, one with no parish vote, the other with no county vote, and at Town End, Far St., 1920-1939/40. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and garden paying rent £5/10/- pa. 1911 age 58 framework

knitter (hosiery) working at home, employee, with wife Harriet, in 4-room house (Bradmore 47/1911). On 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £5/10/- pa rent. 1904 when Methodist Schoolroom was built, on the Building Committee, and he laid a stone on behalf of the children in his role as Sunday School Superintendent, and was presented with a hymn book which he still treasured in 1937. 1916 collected subscriptions to clear the trustees' debt on the new building. 1923 a presentation was made to him at a musical service. 1923-39 paid seat rent. Served as class leader to 1940. By 1924 listed as Methodist trustee, retired hosier. 1937 mentioned in Methodist Outlook as then 85 years old, formerly Local Preacher and still resident in the village and devoted to his chapel. Methodist Class leader. Clerk to the Parish Council 1895-1903, treasurer 1904-9 and 1913. Continued as parish councillor to 1918. Mens Institute Committee member 1928/9, 1934-6 and 1937/8. Received Bunny Charities dole, grant in lieu of coal and bread 1934 and 1939. Died 17.4.1940.

Harriett Smith, born c1853, Costock. 1861 Harriet age 68 scholar with parents Samuel ag.lab and Harriett, at Costock. 1871 age 18 dressmaker, niece in house of Richard Cripwell, 51 ag.lab born Ruddington, and wife Emma. Jul.qtr. 1871 Loughborough district Harriet Henson married William Smith. 1881 age 28, seamstress, married to William (Bradmore 1881/32). 1891 age 38 married to William (Bradmore 1891/59). 1898 made donation to Sunday School. 1890s Mrs Harriett Smith gathering stones from the fields into heaps on the headlands, from where the farmer would cart them to a central point for the stonebreaker (J P Smeeton). 1901 age 48 married to William (Bradmore 36/1901). 1911 age 58 (married 39 years with 6 children, 3 dead), seamstress, with William.

George Smith, born 21.6.1872, Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 17.7.1872, son of William and Harriett, grandson of Gervase and Maria. Baptised Bunny 20.10.1872. 1881 age 8, scholar in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1881/29). 1885 Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class 5.7.1885-26.6.1887, left. Teacher 4th class 1888, 3rd class Jan.1889-June 1890 replacing G Elliott, teacher Jan.1889-June 1903. 1891 age 18, single, frame work knitter in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/59). 1894-9 on choir committee. 1896 Sunday School Secretary. 1900 was put on the Constables list for Bradmore. 1901 age 28, single, framework knitter working at home, in parents' house (Bradmore 36/1901). 1901-3 poor steward. c1903 married to Sarah Baker Smith. 1904 Kellys Directory, George Smith, cowkeeper. 1908 Bunny estate rental with 6 acres 2 roods 21 perches paying £15/16/- rent pa. 1911 age 38 farmer on own account, with wife Sarah and children Gladys Hila and Stewart George, 4-room house (Bradmore 27/1911). Electoral roll, land & tenement, 1905-1912, house 1913-45 living at Town End, Far St. 1922 Sunday School hymn committee. 1923-33 choir master. 1923 joined Junior Church Leaders' Meeting. 1924-1946 Methodist Church trustee, hosiery hand of Bradmore. 1924 on garden party committee. 1924-31 paid seat rent. Died 2.5.1946 age 73, buried at Bunny 6.5.1946.

Sarah Baker Smith, born Nottingham 1875. 1911 age 36 (married 8 years, 2 children) with George. On electoral roll for Town End, Far St., 1920-1954. 1939-40 cleaned the church, 1949 on flower rota, 1972 made donation.

Gladys Hilda Smith (Hilda), born 1904 Bradmore, daughter of George and Sarah. 1911 age 7 in parents' house, Bradmore (Bradmore 27/1911).

Stuart George Smith (George) son of George and Sarah, brother of Hilda. 1911 Stewart George Smith age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 27/1911). Methodist Sunday School scholar infants class 7.7.1912-1913, 2nd class 1913-1917, 1st class 1918-4.6.1922, Jan-Mar.1924. 1924 Sunday School helper, became teacher, taught 1928-9. 1929-1934 Sunday School Secretary. Joiner and carpenter. Mens Institute Committee member 1927/8. On electoral roll in Far St., no local vote, 1929/3-1932/3, then on Main Rd. married to Ethel Ada 1933/4-1991, recorded as at Dunroming from 1956. Also appears on servicemen discharged roll in 1946. 1931 made seat of red deal painted slate colour, for waiting bus passengers, and made noticeboard indicating direction of public footpath from Ruddington in Manor Farm Home Field, repaired footplank at stile. 1947 made backrest for seat. (This seat no longer survives.) 1953 in charge of entertainment and sports for the Coronation Festivities. Recorded as George Smith, joiner, at 71 Main St., Bradmore. Collected public subscriptions from Main Rd. (as far as Mr W Randall's house) together with R R Jackson. 1975 did church repairs. 1977 on Bradmore Silver Jubilee Committee. Died c11.5.1991.

Ethel Ada Smith married to Stuart George, 1933/4-1984 at Dunroming, Loughborough Rd. Listed as WI member 1953-1977/8. Died c16.1.1984.

Sarah Ann Henson Smith, bapt. Bunny 20.9.1874, daughter of William, framework knitter and Harriett of Bradmore. 1881 age 7, scholar in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1881/29). Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class 5.7.1885-1.1.1889, left. Teacher 3rd class girls Jan.1889-June

1892, 2nd class 1892-4. 1891 age 17, single, stocking seamer in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/59). Married 28.11.1895 aged 21 to Richard Jamson, 26, labourer of Bradmore. See Jamson.
Gervase/Jervase Smith bapt. Bunny 16.7.1876, son of William, framework knitter and Harriett of Bradmore. 1881 age 5, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/32). Methodist Sunday School scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-26.6.1887, 1886 received prize for highest number of marks in previous year, 1st class 3.7.1887-1.1.1888, 1st class 2nd part 8.1.1888-July 1889, 1st class July 1889-1.3.1891, no entries March-June 1891, continues July 1891-13.9.1891, left. Married Harriet Cross of Ruddington, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Dinah. 1901 age 25 head of household, framework knitter working at home, married to Harriett age 25 born Ruddington, with son Albert 10 mths born Ruddington, on Village St (Far Street) 3-room house (Bradmore 13/1901). Oct.1903 Bunny & Bradmore Charities made a grant of £15 in favour of Gervase Smith of Bradmore in order to enable him to go to the Nottingham Consumption Sanatorium for 3 months. Jan.1904, Charity Governors resolved that the balance remaining in the hands of the authorities of the Consumption Sanatorium in the matter of G Smith should be presented to the funds of that Institution. Gervase buried at Bunny Tuesday afternoon, 23.11.1904, near his relatives; sympathies recorded in the Deanery Magazine of 1904, to parents Mr Smith of Bradmore and his family. 1911 Harriet age 35 widow doing sewing repairs at home on her own account with children Albert 10, Edith Maria 9 both born Bradmore, Mildred Alice 6 born Ruddington, all scholars, in her parents' house on Distillery St Ruddington, 4-room house.

Albert Smith born 1900 Ruddington, son of Gervase and Harriet. 1901 age 10 mths in parents' house. 1911 age 10, scholar, with mother in grandparents' house, Ruddington. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main Rd., 1939/40. Married to Ethel Gertrude. 1935 was Hon Treasurer of the Jubilee Celebrations committee. Note of his death in Deanery Magazine May 1944, but no date given.

Edith Maria Smith born 1902, Bradmore, daughter of Gervase and Harriet. 1911 age 9 scholar with mother in grandparents' house, Ruddington.

Thomas Henson Smith bapt. Bunny 21.10.1877, son of William, framework knitter and Harriett of Bradmore. 1881 age 3, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/32). Methodist Sunday School scholar 3rd class 5.7.1885-June 1887, 2nd class June 1887-Jan.1889, 1st class 2nd part Jan.1889-June 1890, 1st class July 1890-March 1891, 1st class 1st part March 1891-June 1893, 1st class July 1893-26.11.1893, received hymn book 11.9.1893, noted left Jan.1894. 1891 age 13, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/59). 1901 age 23, single, framework knitter working at home, in parents' house (Bradmore 36/1901). Thomas Smith on electoral roll, house, 1906-1907, 1909-1911 and on 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £2/10/- pa rent. 1911 Thomas age 32 agricultural labourer with wife Mary age 30, born 1881 at "Scarfed", Leics (married 6 years with 3 children), seamstress (hosiery) working at home, with children Harold 6 born 1905 Bradmore, Maria 5 born 1906 Bradmore, Annie 2 born 1909 (Bradmore 43/1911).

Samuel Ernest Smith born 19.5.1880 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 13.10.1880, son of William and Harriett. Buried 6.2.1881 at Bunny age 8 mths.

Emma Smith, born 25.7.1881 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 4.9.1881, daughter of William and Harriett. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class intermittent attendances 2.8.1885-31.10.1886, sick Sept/Oct.1885, attended 6.2.1887-22.6.1890, intermittent to Oct 1890, sick 4.1.1891, final entry 31.5.1891. 1891 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/59). Died 1896 aged 14, buried 31.3.1896.

Elizabeth Smith, born c1821, Normanton on Soar. Married at Bunny 24.1.1889, as widow of Ruddington, daughter of John Silcross, labourer to Gervase Smith. 1891 age 70, married to Gervase, his second wife (Bradmore 1891/19).

Elizabeth Smith bapt. Bunny 5.8.1808, daughter of John and Sarah of Bradmore.

Jane Smith bapt. Bunny 7.10.1781, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore.

Elisabeth Smith of Bradmore daughter of William and Elisabeth buried Bunny 17.2.1778.

Ann Smith daughter of William and Hannah of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 16.12.1781.

Mary Smith married William Trigge of Rempstone at Bunny 31.7.1786. See Trigge.

Mary Smith born 1787, Leake, married Thomas Davis, both of Bradmore, 5.11.1810. See Davies/Davy.

John Smith married Mary Pigot both of Bradmore at Bunny 2.2.1791.

John Smith born Bradmore bapt. Bunny 13.6.1791, son of John labourer and Mary. 1841 age 45 ag.lab with wife Ann age 55, at Gotham. 1851 age 59 ag.lab with wife Ann age 60 born Gotham, at Gotham. 1861 John age 69 ag.lab widower born Bradmore with lodgers niece Elizabeth Dutton 56 seamstress born Gotham and (probably) her father Samuel Dutton married 79 cotton stocking maker born Thrumpton, at Gotham. 1871 John age 79 widower ag.lab with niece Elizabeth Dutton 56

seamstress, at Gotham.

William Smith in 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under town houses and incroachments, with a house and a garden of 5 perches. 23.2.1795 William Smith had 3/- from the Constable for going twice to the Doctor for Thomas Trigg, and another 3/- on 12.4.1795 for the same. Possibly William born c1750, buried Bunny 27.5.1821 age 71.

Robert Smith, possibly of Ruddington, in 1792 Bunny Estate Survey renting land but no property in Bradmore. Paid land tax at 9½d p.qtr. 1780-1820, taken over by Elizabeth Smith in 1821, by Mary Smith 1822-1830, described 1827 as cottager, and finally taken over by Richard Smith for 1831-2, end of land tax records.

Elizabeth Smith of Bradmore buried 5.12.1797.

John Smith born Bradmore 20.12.1797 illegitimate son of Ann, bapt. Bunny 22.12.1797. May be the John Smith paid by the Constable in 1806 for catching sparrows.

Elizabeth Smith born Bradmore 1799/1800, maiden name not known, married John Smith, publican of Ruddington, son of Samuel, framework knitter. 1841 John age 35, publican, with wife Elizabeth age 40 and children Ruth 10, Catherine 5, John 3, Mary Ann 1, and John's father Samuel 60 framework knitter, plus 2 servants, at Ruddington. 1851 Elizabeth age 52, widow, victualler born Bradmore, with children Ruth 19, John 13 scholar, Mary Ann 10 and servant, all born Ruddington, at Ruddington.

T Smith, 8.2.1812, the Constable paid 6/- for a warrant for his removal.

Jarvis Smith married to Elizabeth, living in Bradmore 1800s/1810s.

Thomas Smith bapt. Bunny 14.10.1803, son of Jarvis and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried Bunny 30.11.1803.

William Smith bapt. Bunny 10.4.1805, son of Jarvis and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

John Smith bapt. Bunny 24.8.1811, son of Jarvis and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

John Smith son of Jarvis and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 14 November, no year stated, entry occurs on its own in a page of the register after 1812 baptisms and before the start of 1803 marriages on fiche. Note 1803 marriages are at the start of a separate register in the book.

John Smith bapt. Bunny 1.2.1813, son of Jarvis, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Mary Smith born c1817 buried 26.11.1842 age 25.

John Smith, labourer of Bradmore, buried Bunny 16.6.1799.

Mary Smith married William Spencer, both of Bradmore, 22.10.1827. Witnessed by James Smith and Elizabeth Hallam. See Spencer.

Elizabeth Smith of Bradmore married Thomas Attewell of Ruddington, 22.6.1832. 1841 Thomas Attewell age 27 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth age 32 and children William 8, John 5 and Emma 1 at Ruddington. 1851 Thomas age 47 ag.lab born Ruddington with wife Elizabeth age 40 born Bradmore and daughter Emma 9 scholar born Ruddington, at Ruddington. 1861 Thomas age 57 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth age 54 seamer and daughter Emma 19 seamer, at 38 Shaw St., Ruddington. Elizabeth Attewell died 1861 or 1862. 1871 Thomas age 67 widower, ag.lab, uncle in house of Thomas Blood, 50, framework knitter, and wife Mary 47, with their son in law Isaac Blood 17 framework knitter and daughter Hannah Eliza 2, all born Ruddington, at The Leas, Ruddington (family relationships not clear).

Lewis Smith bapt. Bunny 27.6.1830, illegitimate son of Jane Smith of Bradmore.

William Smith bapt. 30.7.1813, son of Thomas and Sarah of Bunny. Married (1) Catherine, (2) Sarah, (3) Charlotte. 1839, 1845-7 William Smith signed the Sunday School account with his mark. Also 1885 onwards, probably up to 1868. 1841 age 30, householder, gardener, married to Catherine, children Mary, George, John, Charles, living on Main St. (Bradmore 1841/26). 1844 Whites Directory, shopkeeper. Probably the William Smith who was Constable in 1849 and 1850. 1851 age 37, farmer of 14 acres, married to Sarah with children John, Charles, Martha, Frances, Jane, and daughter in law Harriett Rayner, 9 (Bradmore 1851/63). 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1855 rented grazing on the Turnpike. 1855 Kellys Directory, carrier to Nottingham, Saturdays. 1860 rented grazing on Pendock Lane, Moor Lane and the Turnpike. 1861 age 48, cottager of 13 acres and carrier married to Charlotte, with children Fanny and William (Bradmore 1861/70). 1862 rented grazing on Moor Lane. 1864 Whites Directory, farmer, and carrier to Nottingham, Tuesday and Saturday. 1868 listed as cottager and trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in the church deeds. William Smith Senior in 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house garden orchard and land 3 roods 17 perches, at annual rent £3. 1869 Morris's Directory, cottager and carrier to Nottingham, Saturday. 1869 and 1870 W Smith paid by East Leake Charity for carrying charity coals, presumably for Bradmore. 1870 on electoral roll as William Smith Senior in category £12+ rent pa, with land also in Bunny. Probably the William Smith on the electoral roll 1871-1880, not differentiated as either senior or junior. 1871 age 56, agricultural labourer, married to Charlotte, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1871/35).

Catherine Smith born c.1806. First wife of William. 1841 age 35, married to William (Bradmore

1841/26). Buried Bunny 16.1.1848 age 40.

Mary Smith born c1831 daughter of William and Catherine. 1841 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/26).

George Smith born c1837 son of William and Catherine. 1841 age 4 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/26).

John Smith bapt. Bunny 23.10.1838, son of William, cottager and Catherine of Bradmore. 1841 age 2 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/26). 1851 age 12, farm labourer, in father's house (Bradmore 1851/63).

Charles Smith bapt. Bunny 4.9.1840, son of William, cottager and Catherine of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 mths (Bradmore 1841/26). 1851 age 10 in father's house (Bradmore 1851/63). Buried Bunny 18.11.1855 age 15.

Martha Smith bapt. Bunny 28.10.1842, daughter of William, cottager, and Catherine of Bradmore. 1851 age 8, scholar in father's house (1851/63). Buried Bunny 24.4.1859 age 17.

Frances (Fanny) Smith bapt. Bunny 2.5.1846, daughter of William, cottager, and Catherine of Bradmore. 1851 age 5, scholar in father's house (Bradmore 1851/63). 1861 age 15, single in father's house (Bradmore 1861/70). Buried Bunny 28.7.1861 age 15.

Sarah Smith, born c1819, Kimberley, married to William, his second wife. 1851 age 32, married to William (Bradmore 1851/63). Possibly previously Rayner, from Kimberley, as household includes daughter-in-law Harriett. Sarah Smith buried Bunny 6.9.1857, no age given.

Jane Smith bapt. Bunny 18.8.1849 daughter of William cottager and Sarah of Bradmore. 1851 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/63). Buried Bunny 11.7.1851 age 2.

William Smith bapt. Bunny 29.4.1851, son of William, cottager and Sarah of Bradmore. Buried 3.7.1851 age 2 mths.

William Smith bapt. Bunny 7.8.1857, son of William, carrier and Sarah of Bradmore. 1861 age 4, scholar in father's house (Bradmore 1861/70).

Charlotte Smith, born c1813, Notts, Gonalston. William's third wife. 1861 age 48, married to William (Bradmore 1861/70). 1871 age 61, married to William (Bradmore 1871/35).

George Smith born c1836, Costock. 1851 age 15, single, farm labourer in the household of Thomas and Martha Holmes at Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1851/37).

Jane Smith, born c1815, Peckleton Leics. 1841 age 25 married to George ag.lab with children Mary 2 and Reuben 1, at Costock. 1851 age 36 married to George 39 born East Leake ag.lab with children Mary 12 born East Leake, Reuben 11 born Costock, both scholars, and Betsey J 2 born Costock, at Costock. 1861 age 47 married to George 49 ag.lab with children Betsey J 12, Ann 8 both born Costock, at Costock. 1871 age 56 married to George 59 ag.lab cottager of 4 acres with daughter Annie 18 dressmaker at Costock. 1881 age 66 widow with daughter Ann and her husband William Pierrepoint at Rectory Farm, Costock. 1891, age 76, widow, in son-in-law William Pierrepoint's house at the north end of Farmer St. (Bradmore 1891/34).

John Smith, blacksmith, married Sarah Richards at Bunny 30.4.1843, living in Bradmore in 1840s.

Sarah Smith born c1821 nee Richards, daughter of William and Mary, married John at Bunny 30.4.1843.

Elizabeth Smith/Richards born Sept.1841, Bradmore, grand-daughter of William and Mary Richards, daughter of Sarah Richards and possibly John Smith. 1851 age 9, scholar, in grandparents' house on Main St. (Bradmore 1851/61). Possibly married Charles Hodgett 1862; 1871 in house of married sister Emma Alton. See Hodgett.

Emma Smith bapt. Bunny 17.9.1843, daughter of John, blacksmith and Sarah of Bradmore. 1851 age 7, scholar, in grandparents William and Mary Richards' house on Main St. (Bradmore 1851/61). 1861 age 17, single, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1861/45). 1868 Emma Smith married George Alton, Derby district. See Alton.

Jane Smith of Bradmore, alias Mrs Parker, and in 1837 widow, of Radford, bapt. son George William at Bunny 3.7.1837.

George William Smith /Parker bapt. Bunny 3.7.1837, son of Jane Smith or Parker.

George William Smith bapt. Bunny 4.5.1879 son of George William, labourer, and Anna Smith of Bradmore. 1891 (George?) William Smith age 12 scholar born Bradmore son of (George) William age 45 born Lockington ag.lab and wife Annie age 42 born Newark, with siblings Joseph Smith 10 scholar born Bradmore, Benjamin 8 and Louisa 5 scholars born Burton Lodge, Lincs, at Aisthorpe, Lincs. (Some of this information may be inaccurately recorded – note 1901 George W Smith age 54 ag.lab born Lincs and wife Annie 53 born Newark with children Joseph 20 cattleman born Saxby Leics and Lousia B Smith 15 born Burton Lincs, at Broadholme, Newark Notts.) 1911 George William Smith age 31 ag.lab born Bradmore boarder with Walter Needham farm labr at Nocton Fen, Lincolnshire, 5-room house.

William Smith junior, 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house and garden at £2/10/- pa. 1869 Morris's Directory, cottager.

William Smith, on electoral roll as William junr, house, no county vote, 1909-1910, then house with full vote 1911.

William Arthur Smith born 1891 Gonerby Lincs. 1911 age 20, farm servant for John Randall, (Bradmore 16/1911).

Mary Smith born c1826. 1841 age 15, servant in the household of Isaac and Elizabeth Voce, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1841/73).

Charles Smith born c1821. 1841 age 20, servant in the household of John Glover, farmer, Bonsers Farm (Bradmore 1841/76).

John Smith and wife Mary Jane living in Bradmore 1880s. 1911 John Smith 50 coal miner born Kimberley with wife Mary Jane age 46 born Langar (married 24 years, 10 children, 2 dead), included Emma on their census return as their eldest child, but then deleted as not living at home. 7 siblings all born Watnall (2 married and deleted), at Watnall Lane, Nuthall.

Emma Smith born 1887 Bradmore, daughter of John and Mary Jane. 1901 Emma age 14 gen.domsvt to Francis Henjamin Heald, lace designer, Nottingham. 1905 Jul.qtr. Emma Smith married Ernest Carlisle, Basford district, and so became sister in law of George Carlisle and wife Gertrude Annie nee Whittaker of Bradmore. 1911 Emma age 24 (married 5 years, no children) with husband Ernest Carlisle age 26 coal miner born Bilborough, on Nottingham Rd., Kimberley, 5-room house.

SOAR

Eliza Soar born 1895 Langley Mill. 1911 age 16 domestic servant for Robert and Annie Mary Bagguley, Bradmore (Bradmore 15/1911).

SPADMAN

Margaret Spadman married William Marshall of Bunny at Bunny 25.2.1617.

SPENCE

John Spence born 1876 Enderby, Leics, son of Abraham quarryman and Louisa. 1881 recorded under parents but also age 5 scholar in grandmother Mary Spence's house, widow, seamstress 65, at Brooks Yard, Enderby. 1891 age 15, shoe riveter, in parents' house at Mill Hill, Enderby. Married May E Davis. 1901 age 26, gen. carter with wife May E age 25 born Birmingham, daughter Florence, and niece Mabel A Davis born Leicester plus a boarder at 11 Saby Terrace, Nottingham. 1911 age 37 waggoner on farm with wife May E age 36 (married 12 years, 5 children, 2 dead), with Florence May, Albert John 3 and Lettie E 10 mths both born Nottingham, and father in law Joseph Davis 60 widower, farm labourer, born Leicester, at Tollerton, 6-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll, house, no county vote, 1905-7; house, 1913.

Florence May Spence born 1901, Nottingham, daughter of John and May E. 1901 age 3 mths in parents' house. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 3rd class Jan-June 1905, Vestry Girls July-Dec 1905, records missing, then 1st class 7.7.1912-16.8.1914, last record 14.3.1915. 1911 age 10, scholar, in parents' house, Tollerton.

SPENCER

Ann Spencer paid by the Constable Nov.1785 for nursing the Davises. Dec.1804 she had 2 weeks pay, 6/-. March 1806 John Vose had 7 weeks pay 10/6 for Ann Spencer, 1/6 p.wk., and she also had £2/2/- via Mr Peet, and 4/- when she was ill.

Sarah Spencer of Bradmore married Isaac Woodhouse of Codnor Park by Selston at Bunny 8.4.1833, witnessed by John Stubbs.

Thomas Spencer born c1741, married Mary Wright at Wysall 23.11.1769. Buried Bunny 19.10.1825 age 84.

Thomas Spencer bapt. Bunny 14.9.1780, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. Probably the Thomas Spencer who married Mary Winfield at Bunny 29.11.1802, no parishes specified. Feb.1805 Thomas was paid 4d for 1 day working at the house row. 1807, 1808, 1810 Thomas had help from the Constable to pay his rent, 1/- each time. 21.12.1810 had 9 days pay at 6d a day, 4/6. 1841 age 60 agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary, with son Henry, living in part of Southwell House, Main St. (Bradmore 1841/63). 1851 age 71, agricultural labourer, married to Mary, with son John and his wife Mary and their son Thomas (Bradmore 1851/69). Died 9.8.1855 aged 76, buried Bunny 12.8.1855 in the churchyard south of the chancel with his wife, son John and John's wife.

Mary Spencer born c1776, Ruddington. Probably Mary Winfield who married Thomas Spencer at Bunny 29.11.1802. 1841 age 60, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1841/63). 1851 age 76, married to

Thomas (Bradmore 1851/69). Died 29.12.1854 aged 79, buried Bunny 1.1.1855 in the churchyard south of the chancel with Thomas, son John and John's wife.

William Spencer bapt. Bunny 28.10.1803, son of Thomas and Mary. William Spencer married Mary Smith, both of Bradmore, 22.10.1827, witnessed James Smith and Elizabeth Hallam. 1841 William age 40 ag.lab with wife Mary, children Sarah, Ann, John 7, Mary 3 and Eliza at Ruddington. 1851 age 47, farm labourer, married to Mary with children Sarah, Ann and Eliza (Bradmore 1851/67). No locational information at 1851 census so not known where in Bradmore they were living. 1861 age 56, agricultural labourer, married to Mary with grandson James living at 10 Back St., Ruddington. 1871 age 67, farm labourer, married to Mary with daughters Ann and Eliza and grandson James (recorded as 1 month old, born at Basford) living at Marl Pit, Ruddington.

Mary Spencer bapt. 25 or 29.12.1798, E Leake, daughter of Edward and Mary Smith. 22.10.1827 married William, then of Bradmore. 1841 age 40 married to William, at Ruddington. 1851 age 53, married to William (Bradmore 1851/67). 1861 age 60, seamer, married to William, living at 10 Back St., Ruddington. 1871 age 73, seamer, married to William, living at Marl Pit, Ruddington.

Henry Spencer bapt. Bunny 16.10.1828 son of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 possibly the Henry age 10 in (grandparents) Thomas and Mary's house (Bradmore 1841/63).

Sarah Spencer born c1830, Ruddington, daughter of William and Mary. 1841 age 11 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1851 age 21, single, seamer, in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/67). 20.1.1852 Sarah Spencer of Bradmore married Richard Winfield of Wysall, at Bunny. See Winfield.

Ann Spencer born c1832, Ruddington, daughter of William and Mary. 1841 age 9 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1851 age 19, single, seamer in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/67). 1871 age 33, single, seamer, in parents' house at Marl Pit, Ruddington.

James Spencer bapt. Bunny 11.2.1854 illegitimate son of Ann of Bradmore. 1861 age 7 in grandparents' house at 10 Back St., Ruddington.

Thomas Spencer? bapt. Bunny 9.5.1806 son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore.

John Spencer born c1810/13, Keyworth, son of Thomas and Mary. Married Mary Plowright at Colston Bassett 7.5.1832. 1841 age 30, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary, with son Thomas, living on Main St. north of Steeple Cottage (Bradmore 1841/28). 1851 age 41, farm labourer, married to Mary, with son Thomas in John's parents' house (Bradmore 1851/69). 1860 signed Sunday School accounts. 1861 age 50, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1861/41). 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house and garden at £2/10/- pa. 1871 age 60, agricultural labourer, married to Mary (Bradmore 1871/29). Died 26.5.1878 (age 65 on gravestone), buried Bunny 29.5.1878 (age 67 in register) in churchyard south of the chancel with wife and parents.

Mary Spencer, born c1812 Colston Bassett. Mary Plowright married John Spencer at Colston Bassett, 7.5.1832. 1841 age 30, married to John (Bradmore 1841/28). 1851 age 39, married to John, in in-laws' house (Bradmore 1851/69). 1861 age 49, married to John (Bradmore 1861/41). 1871 age 59, married to John (Bradmore 1871/29). 1879 Widow Spencer had 1/- p.wk. for 20 weeks from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1880 applied for the vacant almshouse at Bunny but didn't get it; granted the vacant weekly loaf instead. 1880 granted 1/- p.wk 16.9.1880-31.5.1881. 1881 age 69, widow, householder, living alone on Far St. (Bradmore 1881/26). 1881-2 had 1/- p.wk from the Charities. Jan.1884 the loaf vacated by Mary Spencer was given to Mrs Hart of Bunny. Mary Spencer of Basford Union House died 9.5.1889 aged 79, buried Bunny 11.5.1889 in the churchyard south of the chancel with husband John and parents in law.

Thomas Spencer born 8.9.1833, Keyworth, son of John and Mary. 1841 age 7 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/28). 1851 age 18, single, framework knitter, in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1851/69). 18.4.1854 Thomas Spencer of Bradmore married Ann James, under age, daughter of John blacksmith of Bradmore (Bunny register has Thomas as of Gotham). 1861 age 27, framework knitter, married to Ann, with children Mary Ann 5 born Langley, Derbyshire, William 3 born Bradmore, John J 1 born Ruddington, living at 56 Easthorpe, Ruddington.

Ann Spencer born Ruddington c1835, married to Thomas. 1861 age 26, married to Thomas at Ruddington.

Elizabeth Spencer bapt. Bunny 29.4.1856, daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore.

William Spencer bapt. Bunny 11.12.1857, son of Thomas, framework knitter and Ann of Bradmore. 1861 age 3 in parents' house at Ruddington.

John James Spencer born c1859, Ruddington, son of Thomas and Ann. 1861 age 1 in parents;

house at Ruddington. John James Spencer of Harlaxton Drive, Lenton Sands, Nottingham, on Bradmore electoral roll, land with no county vote 1912, land with parish vote only 1913-1914.

John Spencer born c1836, Ruddington. 1851 age 15, single, farm labourer in the household of John and Martha Nixon, Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1851/55). Possibly a son of John and Mary.

Henry Spencer bapt. Bunny 28.3.1813, son of Thomas, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore.

Mary Spencer bapt. Bunny 24.10.1815 daughter of Thomas, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 23.8.1824 age 9.

Sarah Spencer born 1805 Bradmore, maiden name not known, married William Spencer of Clifton. 1841 Sarah age 35 married to William 45 farmer with children Stephen 10 and William 2, at Clifton. 1851 Sarah age 47 born Bradmore married to William 50? farmer born Clifton with children Stephen 20, William 11 scholar and Mary 8 scholar all born Clifton, at Clifton. 1861 Sarah age 56 married to William 59 farmer of 50 acres with 1 man and 1 boy, with children Stephen 28 and Mary 19, at Clifton. 1871 Sarah age 68 farmer's widow in son William's house, 31, wine merchant, with his wife Fanny 30 born Clifton and children John H 3 born Clifton and William 1 born Nottingham, at St Anns, Nottingham. 1881 Sarah age 79 in son William's house, 41, farmer of 100 acres with 2 men and 1 boy, with wife Lydia 28 born Nottingham and children William 11, Stephen E 9, scholars born Nottingham, plus 2 servants, at Greasley Castle. Sarah Spencer died 1885, Basford district.

Mary Spencer born 1833 Bradmore, maiden name not known, married to William Spencer born 1827 East Leake. 1861 Mary age 28 with husband William age 34, ag.lab, and daughter Elizabeth at Gotham. 1871 Mary age 38 seamstress with husband William 44 ag.lab with 9 acres, at Gotham. 1881 Mary age 48 with William age 54 agl.lab and nephew George Payne 4 scholar born Ratcliffe on Soar (see under Elizabeth Payne born 1852), at Church St., Gotham.

Elizabeth Spencer born 1857/8 Bradmore, daughter of William and Mary of Gotham. 1861 age 3 scholar born Bradmore in parents' house, Gotham. 1871 Elizabeth age 14 gen.servant born Bradmore working for Augustus Taylor, farmer of 50 acres, at Low Field Farm, Carlton, Notts.

Samuel Spencer bapt. Bunny 24.7.1855, illegitimate son of Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 11.9.1855 age 6 mths.

SPICER

Arthur Spicer born 1895 Woolsthorpe. 1901 age 7 in parents' house, David, ag.lab born Colsterworth and Sarah A 46 born N.Witham, with sister Annie E 11, at Woolsthorpe. 1911 age 16 farm servant in John Randall's house (Bradmore 16/1911).

SPURR

Tom Spurr born 1889, Frisby. 1911 farm servant age 22 for Charles Fred Hutchinson at Manor Farm, (Bradmore 18/1911).

SQUIRE

Martha Squire bapt. 17.5.1835, Plumtree, daughter of Robert and Elizabeth. 1851 age 14, single, house servant in the household of John and Martha Nixon at Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1851/55).

STAFFORD

George Stafford, 1885/6 Whites Directory, farmer.

Joseph Stafford, born c1849/50, Annesley. 1851 age 1 in parents' house Richard 36 farmer of 38 acres employer born Stanton by Dale and wife Fanny 22 born Selston, at Millbrook, Annesley. 1861 age 11 scholar in parents' house at Middle Brook, Annesley. 1871 not found. 1881 Joseph age 38 farmer of 900 acres with 3 servants, with wife Ellen age 38 born Warsop and brother Arthur 20 born Annesley, plus 2 servants, at Felley, Annesley. 1888 Kellys Directory, farmer, apparently named Joseph Walker Stafford but Walker may possibly be an intrusion from the line below. 1891 age 41, householder, farmer, married to Ellen, at Barn Close, with servants John Stokes of Saltby, Sarah Ann White, and John Stokes of Melton Mowbray (Bradmore 1891/31). 1894 Whites Directory, farmer. 1895 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1898 contributed 10/- to Bunny Clock Fund, memorial to 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign. Mr Stafford in 1890s/1900s renting the house on corner of Far St. and Farmer St. and having a meadow in the moors with a footpath along the side and an old open wooden shed. Mr Stafford did not observe the sabbath, turned his hay on Sunday afternoons (J P Smeeton). Overseer of the poor 1898-1900, and 1910-1914. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with farmhouse and land 96 acres 6 perches paying rent £135 pa. 1901 age 51 farmer and employer, married to Clara, with servants Robert Burton waggoner and James C Hornbuckle cattleman, on Village Street (Bradmore 3/1901). On 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 95 acres 0 roods 20 perches paying £140 pa rent. Electoral roll, land and tenement, 1886-1914. From 1912 split into two plots, one without county vote, the second without

parish vote and from 1913 this is recorded as house without parish vote. 1904 Kellys Directory, farmer. Misses Pyatt lived in the house later (Barn Close), when Staffords moved to 24 Main St. (Source: Marion Bagguley). Date of move not known as no electoral roll records 1915-1919. 1911 age 61, retired farmer, with wife Clara, 6-room house (Bradmore 19/1911). Living in Main St. 1920-1931/2, married to Clara. Record in parish council minutes 1924 of one of two remaining parish pumps outside Mr Stafford's house being dismantled. Died 24.11.1932 aged 83. Left gift to Methodist church.

Ellen Stafford, born c1843, Warsop. 1891 age 48, married to Joseph (Bradmore 1891/31). Died 1895 aged 54, buried 2.7.1895.

Clara Ales Stafford, born c1857, married to Joseph. 1901 age 45 born Gedling, married to Joseph (Bradmore 3/1901). 1911 age 53 (married 14 years (1897), no children) with husband Joseph (Bradmore 19/1911). On electoral roll in Main St 1920-1931/2. Died 8.12.1931 age 74, buried north side of Bunny churchyard with Joseph. Wreath sent by WI.

STANFORD

Godfrey son of **John** de Stanford and **Petronilla** 5.4.1351 disposes of his inheritance in Bradmore and Ruddington to Sir Richard de Wylughby.

STAPLEFORD

Thomas Stapleford born c1848, Ab Kettleby, son of John Stableford, ag.lab, and Mary of Ab Kettleby, brother of Henry. 1851 age 3, as Stableford, in parents' house, Ab Kettleby. 1861 age 13, as Stableford, in parents' house, Ab Kettleby. Oct.qtr. 1870 Thomas Stapleford married Elizabeth Lyne, Loughborough district. 1871 age 23, householder, agricultural labourer, married to Elizabeth, at north end of Farmer St. (Bradmore 1871/15). 1881 age 33 farm labourer with wife Elizabeth and children Jjoseph 7, Emma 5 born Willoughby, John 2 and Herbert 10 mths born Wilford, at Wilford. 1891 age 43 farm labourer with wife Elizabeth and children Joseph Henry 17, Emma 15, born Willoughby, John 12, Herbert 10 and Charlotte 8 scholars, Mabel 3 and George 5 mths, born Wilford, at Wilford. 1901 age 53, foreman on farm, with wife Elizabeth and children Joseph Henry 27 iron planer, Herbert 20 imbecile, Charlotte 18 mother's help at home, Mabel 13 imbecile and George 10, at South Wilford. 1911 age 63 farm labourer with wife Elizabeth and children Mable 23, George 20 coal miner hewer, at Wilford, 3-room house.

Elizabeth Stapleford born c1850, Willoughby on the Wolds, nee Lyne, daughter of Joseph, ag.lab, and Ann. 1851 age 1 in parents' house, West Thorpe End, Willoughby on the Wolds. 1861 age 11 in parents' house, Willoughby. Oct.qtr. 1870 Elizabeth Lyne married Thomas Stapleford, Loughborough district. 1871 age 21, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1871/15). 1881 age 31 married to Thomas at Wilford. 1891 age 41 married to Thomas. 1901 age 53 married to Thomas. 1911 age 61 (married 40 years with 7 children, 1 dead), married to Thomas.

Henry Stapleford born c1850, Ab Kettleby, son of John Stableford, ag.lab, and Mary of Ab Kettleby, brother of Thomas. 1851 age 4 mths, as Stableford, in parents' house, Ab Kettleby. 1861 age 11, as Stableford, in parents' house, Ab Kettleby. 1871 age 21, single, farm servant for Edward Goodwin (Bradmore 1871/18). 1881 age 30 ag.lab with wife Sarah age 28 born Gt Dalby and children Mary A 7 scholar born Long Clawson, Sarah J 4 scholar born Sysonby, Elizabeth 1 and Charlotte 2 mths born Ab Kettleby, at Ab Kettleby. 1891 age 40 iron stone labourer with wife Sarah age 38, children Elizabeth 11, Charlotte 10, Ellen 6, Ruth 4, William T 1 all born Kettleby, on Main St Ab Kettleby, next to father John Stapleford widower 75 former labourer born Barnstone, living in cottage in field. Not found 1901. 1911 Henry age 60 ironstone labourer with wife Sarah age 57 (married 24 years with 7 children 1 dead), and grandsons Frank 10 scholar, John 5, born Ab Kettleby, plus a lodger, at Ab Kettleby.

STAPLES

Sam Staples born c1815, East Leake. 1841 age 25, servant in the house of Richard and Mary Walker, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1841/80). 1844 Oct.qtr. Loughborough district, Samuel Staples married Sarah Clarke born 1815 East Leake, daughter of Ann, cottager. 1851 age 35, ag.lab with wife Sarah age 35 and son Robert 2 mths on Pinfold Green, East Leake. 1861 age 47 ag.lab with wife Sarah age 46 and son Robert 10, on The Green, East Leake. 1871 age 54 ag.lab with wife Sarah age 55 and son Robert 20 bricklayer, on The Green, East Leake.

STEANS

Catherine Ann Steans nee Bosworth, born Gotham, baptised Bunny 13.9.1857, daughter of Valentine, bricklayer, and Mary of Bradmore. 1889 Jul.qtr. married William Francis Steans, Nottingham. 1891 William F Steans age 21 stableman for Midland Railway Company, born Scalford Leics, with wife Catherine A age 31 born Gotham and son Hector F 11 mths born Nottingham, at 8 St Johns Cottage,

Nottingham St Mary's. 1901 William Francis Steans age 31, railway goods porter, with wife Catherine Ann age 40 and children Hector Francis 10 imbecile from birth, Archebald Lancelot 6, Dulsie Eugenia 4 all born Nottingham, at 9 Dawson St., Nottingham. 1911 William Francis Steans age 41 caller-off for Midland Railway Goods, wife Catherine Ann age 51 (married 21 years with 7 children, 2 dead) and surviving children Hector Francis 20, Wilhelmina Jane 19 boxer pinafores, Archebald Lancelot 16 porter for midland Railway Goods, Dulcie Eugenie 14 apprentice dressmaker and Valentine William 9 scholar, all born Nottingham, at 164 Gordon Rd., Nottingham. Catherine A Steans born 1857 died Dec.1938, Melton Mowbray District.

STEEMSON

Robert Steemson, husbandman, bond dated 9.12.1758, £600, by George Attenborough and Thomas Peet, farmers, descendants and next of kin.

Mary Steemson daughter of Robert and Ann married George Attenborough, farmer, mentioned on his tombstone in Bunny churchyard.

STEVENS

Mary Stevens of Bradmore married 11.7.1850 at Bunny to John Attewell, framework knitter of Bradmore, son of William, cottager. See Attewell.

STEVENSON/STEPHENSON/STEVISON

Isabel Stevenson married Jarvis Laine of Bunny at Bunny 5.12.1581.

Everard Stevenson churchwarden of Bunny 1693; married to Anne. Widower 1693, remarried to Jane Dale, daughter of Mary Dale. Beneficiaries of Mary's will in 1708.

Anne Stevenson wife of Everard of Bradmore buried Bunny 7.2.1693.

Thomas Stevenson son of Everard and Anne of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 1.1.1689.

Samuel Stevenson son of Everard and Anne of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 22.1.1691.

Everard Stevenson bapt. Bunny 24.1.1693, son of Anne and Everard Stevenson of Bradmore (churchwarden of Bunny). 30.9.1695 estate in Bradmore leased by Everard Steveson from Sir Thomas Parkyns, plus an estate in Bradmore bought from Curtis & Rolfe. 22.2.1698 Excommunication of Richard Seagrave of Lenton, labourer, cause brought by Everard Steveson of Bradmore, farmer of the tithes of Bradmore, for detention of tithes.

Jane Stevenson nee Dale, daughter of Mary Dale, second wife of Everard, mentioned in Mary Dale's will of 1708.

Mary Stevenson bapt. Bunny 18.2.1696, daughter of Everard Stevenson of Bradmore.

Anne Stevenson bapt. Bunny 23.2.1699, daughter of Everard Stevenson of Bradmore.

Sophia Stevenson daughter of Everard and Jane of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 1701, undated but some time between 22.6.1701-13.11.1701 based on sequence in register.

Joseph Stevenson bapt. Bunny 9.3.1703, son of Everard and Jane of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Stevenson bapt. Bunny 12.7.1704, daughter of Everard and Jane of Bradmore.

? Stevenson bapt. Bunny 25.5.1708, son of Everard of Bradmore.

Hannah Stevenson bapt. Bunny 12.6.1710, daughter of Everard and (blank) of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Stevison bapt. Bunny 29.6.1718, daughter of Joseph and Mary.

Joseph Stephenson bapt. Bunny 23.10.1702, son of Joseph and wife of Bradmore.

Joseph Stephenson of Bradmore, husbandman age 20 (born 1702/3) married Mary Battle of Bunny, age 24 (born 1698) at Sneinton, 5.1.1722.

Joseph Stephenson married to Mary, living in Bradmore 1710s/1720s.

Benjamin Stevison bapt. Bunny 2.2.1723 son of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Stevison bapt. 23.4.1739, daughter of Joseph and Mary of Bradmore.

Samuel Stevison bapt. Bunny 30.11.1719, son of Joseph and Hannah of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 30.1.1746.

Elizabeth Stevison married John Priestly, no parishes specified, at Bunny 30.1.1739. See Priestley.

Rebecca Stevison of Bradmore buried 6.7.1752.

William Stevinson married Mary Wilkinson both of Bradmore, at Bunny 21.11.1731. May be the William Stevison, no parish specified, buried Bunny 6.5.1752.

Elizabeth Stevenson bapt. Bunny 5.10.1732, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Mary Stevison bapt. 10.1.1735, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Joseph Stevison bapt. 16.1.1737, son of William and Mary Stevison of Bradmore.

John Stevison son of William and Mary, no parish recorded, buried 8.2.1739.

Thomas Stevison, bapt. Bunny 26.12.1743, son of William and Mary, no parish specified.

Benjamin Stevison, bapt. 8.6.1733 named as father of Mary Allsop's boy John, both parents of

Bradmore.

Thomas Stevison married Rachel Hardy of Nottingham at Bunny 20.1.1737.

Rachel Stevenson of Bradmore nee Hardy, married Thomas at Bunny 20.1.1737, buried Bunny 3.12.1769.

Joseph Stevenson bapt. Bunny 15.5.1748, son of John and Mary, possibly the Joseph buried Bunny 9.11.1830, age 83.

John Stevenson of Bradmore son of widower John buried Bunny 17.1.1768.

Ann Stevenson born c1772, buried Bunny 31.8.1824 age 52.

Joseph Stephenson born c1710, buried Bunny 16.4.1782 aged 72, of Bradmore.

Francis Stephenson carried out inventory of goods of Joseph Nixon, 1788.

John Stevenson married Elizabeth Attenborough at Ruddington 4 or 24.5.1774. John Stevenson paid Bradmore land tax at 9½d p.qtr. 1780. 1782 his holding passed to wife Elizabeth. Based on later Marriott records, the land was probably associated with one of the cottages in Southwell House.

Elizabeth Stevenson widow of John, paid Bradmore land tax at 9½d p.qtr. 1782 only, then tax was taken over by John Marriott. Elizabeth married John Marriott of Bunny & Bradmore 24.3.1783.

John Stevenson bapt. at Ruddington 11.7.1777, probably son of John and Elizabeth. Had older sister Elizabeth bapt. 4.6.1775, Ruddington. May be the John Stevenson of Bradmore who married Mary Parker of Ruddington at Ruddington 13.1.1807. 1841 age 70, frameknitter, householder, with children Henry (married to Jane, both age 20) and James, grandchildren Thomas and William. No mention of wife Mary, presumed died between 1836 and 1841. Living in part of 30/32 Main St. (Bradmore 1841/46). 1851 age 74, widower, farm labourer, with daughter in law Jane, son George, grandsons William, John and Henry, and lodger Hannah Henson (Bradmore 1851/68).

Henry Stevenson bapt. 16.6.1818 at Ruddington, son of John and Mary. Stocking weaver, married Jane Hallam of Bradmore at Bunny 22.9/?10.1838 (IGI). 1841 age 20, in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/46). Buried Bunny 23.12.1849 age 31.

Jane Stevenson born c1818, East Leake, nee Hallam, married Henry Stevenson, stocking weaver, at Bunny 22.9/?10.1838. 1841 age 20, in father in law's house (Bradmore 1841/46). 1851 age 32, widow, seamer, in father-in-law's house (Bradmore 1851/68). Married brother in law George Stevenson Apr.qtr. 1852, Nottingham district. Continued below.

Thomas Stevenson, bapt. Bunny 19.1.1839, son of Henry framework knitter and Jane of Bradmore. 1841 age 2 in the household of John Stevenson (Bradmore 1841/46). 1851 age 13 ag.lab for Elizabeth Page, dairy farmer of 200 acres, at Stanton on the Wolds. Apr.qtr. 1860 Thomas Stevenson married Eliza Marshall, Basford district. 1861 Thomas Stevinson age 23 framework knitter cot., born Bradmore, with wife Elisa age 22 born Ruddington, son Henry 7 mths born Ruddington, daughter in law Sarah Ann Marshall 2 scholar born Ruddington, father in law John Marshall 48 framework knitter, widower, and Elisa's Marshall siblings William 12, Emma 9, Thomas 7 scholars all born Ruddington, at 13 Wilford St., Ruddington. 1871, age 31, framework knitter, married to Eliza age 30 born Ruddington, seamstress, with children Sarah Ann (12, seamstress), Henry 10, winder, Jane 6, scholar, Mary Ann 1 all born at Ruddington, living at Marl Pit, Ruddington. 1881 age 42, widower, framework knitter born Bradmore with children Henry 20 framework knitter, Mary Ann 10, Louisa 8, Martha 5, Bertha 3 scholars all born Ruddington, at Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1891 widower age 50, framework knitter at Marlpits, Ruddington with daughters Martha 15 and Bertha 13, seamers born Ruddington, living next door to uncle George Stevenson born 1825 and his wife Jane, at Ruddington. Jan.qtr. 1898 Thomas Stevenson married Sarah Gregg, widow, Nottingham district. 1901 age 60, gen.ag.lab with wife Sarah age 65 at Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1911 age 72 ag.lab with wife Sarah age 67 (married 13 years), and visitor Rebecca Blatherwick 16 (her parents lived at 7 Savage Row), on Wilford Rd., Ruddington.

William Stevenson bapt. 20.1.1841, son of Henry, framework knitter and Jane of Bradmore, grandson of John. 1841 age 6 months, in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1841/46). 1851 age 10, in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1851/68). 1881 age 41 unmarried in parents' house, Ruddington. 1891 age 50, born Bradmore, widower, framework knitter, with sons William 7, Percy 4, scholars born Ruddington, at Savages Row, Marlpit, Ruddington, 3-room house.

John Stevenson bapt. Bunny 14.3.1844, son of Henry, framework knitter, and Jane of Bradmore, grandson of John. 1851 age 7, scholar, in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1851/68). (Note 1861 and 1871 entries not found, but see John Stevenson born 1844 son of William and Mary – see below.) 1881 age 39 engine driver ironworks with wife Hannah age 41 born Clipstone, children John 18 single shunter ironworks born Clipstone, George William 13, Jane Elizabeth 10, Fanny 8 scholars born Stapleford, Jesse Henry 6 and William Whyatt Stevenson 5 scholars born Ilkeston, at 14 Crompton St., Ilkeston. 1891 age 48, engine driver with wife Hannah age 50 born Clipstone, children John 28 shunter points born Clipstone, Jane 20 born Stapleford, Jesse 16 clerk in

Henry Stevenson born Bradmore, bapt. 29.7.1846 son of Henry, framework knitter, and Jane, grandson of John. 1851 age 4, scholar, in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1851/68). 1891 age 40 furnaceman with wife Ann age 45 born Stanton, Derby and children Louise 14 born Stanton Derbyshire, Laura 6 scholar born Ilkeston, Emma 1 born Stanton, Rose 2 mths born Ilkeston, at 15 Albany St., Ilkeston. 1901 age 55 iron furnace keeper born Bradmore with wife Ann age 54 born Stanton by Dale, Derbys and children Laura 16 lace mender born Ilkeston, Emma 11 born Stanton by Dale, at 15 Albany St., Ilkeston.

George Stevenson bapt. 3.2.1825, son of John stocking weaver, and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 15, servant in the household of John and Martha Nixon, Barn Close (Bradmore 1841/70). 1851 age 26, single, framework knitter, in father's house (Bradmore 1851/68). Married Henry's widow Jane Jan.qtr. 1852, Nottingham district. 1859 was paid 5/- in Sunday School accounts. 1861 age 36, framework knitter in cotton, married to Jane with children Mary Ann and Bessie at 5 Easthorpe, Ruddington. 1871 age 46, framesmith, married to Jane, with daughters Mary and Elizabeth, at Marl Pit, Ruddington. 1881 age 56 framework knitter with wife Jane and son William at Marl Pit, Ruddington. 1891 age 66 framework knitter with Jane and grand-daughters Ellen 8 scholar and Florie 17 seamer born Nottingham, at Marl Pit, Ruddington, 4-room house, living next door to nephew Thomas, widower born 1841, see above.

Jane Stevenson born c1818 East Leake, nee Hallam, daughter in law of John, widow of Henry Stevenson (died 1849, see above). Married George Jan.qtr. 1852, Nottingham district. 1861 age 43, seamer of stockings, married to George, at 5 Easthorpe, Ruddington. 1871 age 53, seamster, married to George, at Marl Pit, Ruddington. 1881 age 64 married to George, at Ruddington. 1891 age 73 married to George, in Ruddington.

Mary Ann Stevenson bapt. Bunny 6.7.1852 daughter of George, framework knitter, and Jane. 1861 age 8 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1871 age 18, seamster, in parents' house, Ruddington.

Elizabeth (Bessy) Stevenson bapt. Bunny 9.11.1854 daughter of George, framework knitter, and Jane Stevenson. 1861 age 6 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1871 age 16, seamster, in parents' house, Ruddington. Bessy Stevenson married Joshua Ordish, railway waggon builder of Leicester, Oct.qtr. 1878 Nottingham district. Apr.qtr. 1893 Betsey Ordish, widow, married Thomas Morrison, joiner, of Hose, Leics. See Ordish and Morrison.

Jesse Stevenson bapt. Bunny 23.4.1827, daughter of John framework knitter and Mary. 1841 age 10, servant in the household of William and Rebecca Attenbrough, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1841/79).

Joseph Stevenson bapt. Bunny 20.4.1829 son of John, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 22.7.1830 age 1.

Mary Ann Stevenson bapt. Bunny 7.3.1831 daughter of John, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 3.1.1833 age 2.

James Stevenson bapt. Bunny 2.2.1833 son of John, framework knitter, and Mary. 1841 age 7 in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/46). 1851 age 18 born Bradmore, servant for John Daykin farmer of 62 acres employing 2 men and 2 boys, at West Bridgford. 1861 not found. 1870 Jan.qtr. Basford district, James Stevenson married Ann Foster, charwoman, daughter of William ag.lab and Ann of Ruddington. 1871 age 38 framework knitter with wife Ann age 35 born Clifton and son John 7 mths born Ruddington, at Distillery St., Ruddington. 1881 age 48 stocking framework knitter with wife Ann 45 and children John 10, Mary Ann 8, Jesse 7 scholars and Arthur 2 all born Ruddington, at Distillery St., Ruddington. 1891 age 58 framework knitter with wife Ann age 55 (blind) and children Mary A 18 stocking seamer, Jesse 17 gen.lab at Distillery St., Ruddington. 1901 age 68, framework knitter hosiery worker born Bradmore with wife Ann age 65 born Clifton, and children Mary Ann 28, plain lace mender at home, and Arthur, 22 clerk to lace warehouse, both born Ruddington, at Distillery St., Ruddington. 1911 age 78 invalid with wife Ann age 75 (married 41 years, 4 children, 2 dead), with children Mary Ann 38 single lace mender at home and Arthur 33 single lace packer, at Distillery St., Ruddington, 4-room house.

Mary Stevenson bapt. Bunny 8 April 1836 daughter of John, framework knitter and Mary. Mary Stevenson of Bradmore, under age, daughter of John, married 16.11.1854 at Bunny to Henry Preston of West Bridgford, son of George, gamekeeper and Ann, of Keeper's House near Fox Covert (near Melton Road Toll Gate). 1861 Henry age 31 gamekeeper born Edwalton with wife Mary age 25 born Bradmore and visitor Jane Stevenson 9 scholar born Wysall (daughter of William born 1820 and Ann, see below), at Nottingham Rd., Ruddington. 1871 Henry age 41 gamekeeper with wife Mary age 35 at Kennel House, Colwick. 1881 Henry age 51 ag.lab with wife Mary age 46 and 2

lodgers at 24 Lamcote St., Nottingham. 1891 Henry age 61 ag.lab with wife Sarah (error for Mary) age 55 born Bradmore, at The Green, Ruddington. Mary Preston b.1836 died Jan.qtr. 1895, Basford district. 1901 Henry age 71 ag.lab on his own at Hardy's Yard, Distillery St., Ruddington.

Thomas Stevenson paid Bradmore land tax 9½d p.qtr. 1780-1784, then holding passed to Richard Henson. May be the Thomas mentioned in the will of John Mee, shepherd, 1767.

Joseph Stephenson married to Ann, living in Bradmore 1770s-1790s. May be the Mr Stevenson paid, together with Richard Bennet, for burying Ann Manchester, Jan.1780. June 1785 he had from the Constable a total of £1/7/- when ill, and barley. July the Constable paid Sam Voce and Richard Walker's expenses when they took Joseph to the Infirmary, 2/6, and paid him 6/- for one week to 16.7.1785, 8/- for 2 weeks to 30.7.1785, then in September 11 weeks, £2/6/-. Jan.1786 the Constable paid Mr Maddock 11/6 for Joseph Stevenson. 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under Town Houses and Incroachments with a house (2 perches, houses usually are only one perch) and a garden of 3 perches.

William Stephenson son of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 30.4.1783, buried Bunny 5.6.1838, age 54.

Ann Stevenson born Bradmore 16.12.1792 daughter of Joseph, labourer, and Ann, bapt. 24.12.1792. Buried Bunny 7.7.1800 aged 8.

Thomas Stevenson of Bradmore son of Joseph and Ann, buried Bunny 2.11.1798.

John Stevenson son of Joseph and Ann of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 30.9.1776. Possibly the John Stevenson who was paid by the Constable for catching sparrows in 1788. Jan.1797 John Stevenson was paid 12/- by the Constable, no details. Probably the John who had a frame set up for him by William Henson, 3.4.1825, 2½ days work costing the Constable 5/-, possibly one of the two frames for which the Constable paid carriage from Nottingham Dec.1824.

Mary Stevenson of Bradmore, up to 1789. 1780-89 received 2/- p.wk. from the Constable, and coals. Had half a strike of Bencorn 1772, and 1773 was paid for attending Ann Manchester. 1789 the Constable paid necessaries, 8/-, for Mary and 18.3.1789 paid 4/6 for laying her out and 2/6 for funeral expenses.

Mary Stevenson of Bradmore, up to 1800. Payments to Mary Stevenson from the Constable continued after the other Mary Stevenson's funeral, paid for in March 1798. June 1789 she had coals, weekly pay, and in September 1/- cash. Nov.1789 the Constable paid her 2/- when ill, and 26.11.1789 paid 5/- when they went about Mary Stevenson, and gave her another 2/6 when ill. 1790-1799 she had 1/- p.wk. and coals. 10.4.1791 she had cloth to make 2 shifts 4/9. October had ½lb butter, and 13.12.1791 had 1/- when ill. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under Town Houses and Incroachments with a house. Jan.1792 Thomas Marriott was paid for doing her chimney, 3/-. 3.11.1794 Thomas Redfern was paid 2/- for thatching her house, Henery Henson assisting, took 35 thatch sheaves, total cost 7/8. Aug.1798 she had ½ strike of wheat, 3/6. 30.4.1799 Constable paid her bill at S Dalby's, 1/-, and 11.5.1799 she had 13/6 for clothing. 14.10.1799 had 4/- for ½ stone of flour. 6.1.1800 Constable paid Mary Stevenson for sundry things when ill 19/-. 14.1.1800 paid Rev Mr Beetham the burial money for M Stevenson 1/- and paid the clerk 1/6. Paid bread and ale for the burial 3/-. Paid S Dalby for flour on her account 1/6. Paid the Jury's dinner when called to Ruddington 10/-, possibly about Mary's death. Constables Accounts receipts for the year include 14/10 for Mary's goods. Buried Bunny 14.2.1800.

Mary Stevenson, widow, buried Bunny 17.2.1801.

William Stephenson, bapt. Bunny 31.1.1766 son of Mary, of Bradmore. Possibly the William Stevenson who was paid by the Constable in 1780 for catching sparrows and 1795 for a crow.

Mary Stevenson born c1793 of Bradmore, possibly the Mary in the Constables Accounts in the mid 1860s. 1846 and 1950 Constable paid her rates, 1865 paid for her arrears 10/10 and paid her rates 1866-1870. Buried Bunny 23.6.1872 age 79.

William Stevenson had the Constable pay 2/6 to William Bennett for mending his clothes, March 1827. Jan.1830 the Constable paid his barber 5/-, and his (Sick or Clothing?) Club expenses £1/-/9. 1832 Constable paid him 6d at Whitsuntide. 1833 Constable paid for a barber for him, 4/4. 1834 Constable paid William Bennet 3/4 to mend his clothes.

William Stephenson married Elizabeth Widdowson both of Bradmore at Bunny 4.12.1804.

Elizabeth Stevenson born c1781, buried Bunny 31.10.1839 age 58. Possibly nee Widdowson, wife of William.

William Stevenson son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 21.1.1809. Married with the consent of his parents to Mary Parker of Ruddington at Ruddington 3.3.1834. 1841 age 30, frameknitter, householder, married to Mary, with children Emma, Charles, Ann, also Ann Parkin/Parker and a child William Parkin/Parker living north of the Forge on the Main Rd. (Bradmore 1841/6). Buried Bunny 11.2.1843 age 34.

Mary Stevenson bapt. 1.4.1810 Ruddington, nee Parker, daughter of George and Ann. Married William Stevenson of Bradmore at Ruddington 3.3.1834. 1841 age 30, married to William (Bradmore

1841/6). 1851 age 39, widow, seamer, householder, with son William Parker, Stevenson children Charles, Ann and John, and her mother Ann Parker, widow (Bradmore 1851/62). No locational information in 1851, but by 1861 living in part of No.24 Main St. 1861 age 51, widow, pauper, former framework knitter, with children Emma, Charles and Ann (Bradmore 1861/51). 1866 Widow Mary Stevenson received blankets from Bunny & Bradmore charities, sheets in 1878, 6 cwt of coals in 1868 and 8 cwt in 1869. Probably the Mary Stevenson on 1867 Bunny Estate rental, renting house and garden at £1/10/- pa. 1871 age 61, with daughter Ann and grandchildren Elizabeth A and Martha (Bradmore 1871/51).

Emma Stevenson born c1836, Ruddington, daughter of William and Mary. 1841 age 5 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/6). 1861 age 25, single, seamstress in mother's house (Bradmore 1861/51).

Elizabeth Ann Stevenson born Bradmore, bapt. 6.4.1861 Bunny, natural daughter of Emma Stevenson of Bradmore, and grand-daughter of William and Mary. 1871 age 10, scholar, in grandmother's house (Bradmore 1871/51).

Charles Stevenson bapt. 3.4.1838, Ruddington, son of William and Mary. 1841 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/6). Possibly the Charles who was taken to the Infirmary 15.7.1847 by the Constable. 1851 age 13, scholar, in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/62). 27.6.1853 John Smith was paid £1 expenses for securing Charles Stevenson, may be this Charles. 1861 age 23, single, framework knitter making merino shirts, in mother's house (Bradmore 1861/51). Buried Bunny 4.10.1862 age 25.

Ann Stevenson bapt. Bunny 7.7.1840, daughter of William framework knitter and Mary of Bradmore. 1841 age 11 months in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/6). 1851 age 10, scholar in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/62). 1861 age 20, single, seamstress in mother's house (Bradmore 1861/51). 1871 age 30, single, in mother's house (Bradmore 1871/51). 1881 age 40, single, laundry, with daughter Martha and brother John at 78 Queen St., Basford, Nottingham. 1891 age 49, single, charwoman, in brother John's house with her daughter Martha at Silverdale Rd., Basford.

Martha Stevenson born 1871, Bradmore, grand-daughter of William and Mary, probably daughter of Ann. 1871 age 9 days in grandmother's house (Bradmore 1871/51). 1881 age 10, scholar, in mother Ann's house at Basford. 1891 age 20, lacemaker, single, in uncle John's house at Basford. Married c1893 to William Houghton, coal miner, son of John coal miner and Mary Ann of Markfield. 1901 age 31 born Bradmore married to William Houghton age 44 coalminer hewer born Ipstock Leics, with Houghton children Harriet 16 and Mary E 14 cigarette makers, Maria 12, Charles William 6 all born Nottingham, at 31 Crown St., Bulwell, Nottingham. 1911 age 40, plain net mender working at home (married 18 years with 1 child), with householder William Houghton age 52 born Ibstock, miner, son Charles W Houghton 16 single miner born Old Basford, and uncle John at 8 Queen Square, Queen St., Old Basford, Nottingham, 5-room house.

John Stevenson bapt. Bunny 22.6.1843, born Bradmore, son of William framework knitter and Mary. 1851 age 7 in mother's house (Bradmore 1851/62). (Note 1861 and 1871 entries here may possibly refer to John Stevenson born 1844 son of Henry and Jane – see above.) 1861 age 18 single born Bradmore, groom for John Brett farmer of 409 acres at Grange House, Oxtun. 1871 age 27 born Bradmore, domestic servant for Thomas Denman peer of the realm, Deputy Lieutenant of Derbyshire, at The Hall, Stoney Middleton, Derbyshire. 1881 age 37 single, gardener, in sister Ann's house at 78 Queen St., Basford. 1891 age 47 single, labourer in gas works, with sister Ann and her daughter Martha plus a lodger at 28 Silverdale Rd., Basford. 1901 age 57 single gen.lab born Bradmore, boarder with Annie Garner at 5 Plimsoll St., Nottingham. 1911 age 67, widower, labourer for Corporation, in the house of niece Martha and her husband William Houghton and their son Charles, at Old Basford Nottingham.

John Stevenson bapt. Bunny 4.7.1811 son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Joseph Stevenson bapt. Bunny 18.6.1813 son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. 1851 Joseph age 37, framework knitter born Bradmore, widower with daughter Charlotte (age 12 born Clifton), in the household of William Chamberlain, agricultural labourer, at Ruddington. 1861 age 47 framework knitter born Bradmore with wife Elisabeth age 44 charwoman born Ruddington (probably nee Chamberlain) and children Charlotte 23 seamer born Keyworth and William 3 born Ruddington, at Ruddington. 1871 as "son" John Chamberlain 57, widower, farm labourer in the house of William Chamberlain on Easthorpe St., Ruddington.

Mary Stevenson bapt. Bunny 21.4.1815 daughter of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth.

Thomas Stevenson bapt. Bunny 7.4.1817 son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. Buried Bunny 25.12.1832 age 15.

John Stevenson bapt. 1.9.1819, son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth Stevenson of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 25.11.1839 age 20.

Charles Stevenson bapt. Bunny 23.4.1822, son of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth of

Bradmore. Buried Bunny 6.4.1834 age 11.

Elizabeth Stevenson bapt. 3.3.1825, daughter of William, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. 1851 age 26 gen.dom.svt born Bradmore working for Rev De Respigny, perpetual curate of Emmanuel church, Camberwell, at the Parsonage House, Camberwell. Jul.qtr. 1854 Nottingham district, Elizabeth Stevenson married George Bland, groom, son of Henry ag.lab and Elizabeth of Corby. See Bland.

John Stevenson of Bradmore buried Bunny 22.3.1811.

William? Stevenson born c1812, buried Bunny 10.3.1816 age 4.

William Stevenson born ?1816 Bradmore. 1851 age 30 ag.lab with wife Ann 30 born Broughton Leics and children Lucy 7, William 5, Joseph 3, Francis 1 scholars born Wysall, at Wysall. 1861 age 40 ag.lab born Ruddington with wife Anne age 39 born Wysall with children Anne 7 scholar, Mary 1 both born Wysall and relative Jane Gascoigne 5 scholar born Keyworth, at Wysall. 1871 age 49 ag.lab born Ruddington with wife Ann age 48 Wysall, daughter Mary 12, grandson Jesse Stevenson 1 born Wysall, at Thorpe in the Glebe. 1881 widower age 65? ag.lab boarder with Thomas Camm ag.lab at Back Yard, Wysall. 1901 age 81, widower, ag.lab born Ruddington, with daughter Jane Wilson 49 born Wysall 1852, son-in-law Richard Wilson 50 ag.lab born Keyworth and their children Mary 23 born Keyworth, Ellen 11, George 9, Harry 7 all born Wysall, at Harrison's field, Wysall.

Mary Ann Stevenson born 1853 Bradmore, married to John Stevenson of Ruddington. 1891 John age 47 ag.lab born Ruddington with wife Mary Ann age 38 born Bradmore with children James William 15 ag.lab, Gertrude A 11, Minnie 7 scholars and niece Jane 4 mths all born Ruddington, living next door to George Stevenson born 1825 and his wife Jane, see above.

John Stevenson married Ann Davies both of Bradmore at Bunny 7.11.1836.

Sarah Stocks bapt. Bunny 17.9.1828, daughter of William, labourer, and Mary of Bradmore. Sarah not found in censuses, but by 1841 parents lived at Bunny. 1841 William age 40 ag.lab with wife Mary age 30 and children Catherine 11, Ann 9, Jane 5, Mary 2 and John 3 mths in the house of Richard Stocks age 70 ag.lab, at Bunny. 1851 William 51 ag.lab born Bunny with wife Mary age 42 born Gillingham Grange, Kent, with children Jane 14, no occupation, Mary 12, John 10, William 8, Richard 5 scholars and Walter 11 mths all born Bunny, at Bunny. 1861 William Stoakes age 61 ag.lab with wife Mary age 54 and children Richard 15 farmer's boy and Walter 10 scholar, at Bunny. 1871 William age 72 labourer with wife Mary age 64, at Bunny.

John Stokes, born c1872, Saltby Leics, son of Charles, horsekeeper, and Elizabeth of Saltby. 1881 age 9 in parents' house at Saltby, plus grandmother Rhoda Stokes 76 crippled, born Barkestone. 1891 age 19, single, farm servant, in the household of Joseph Stafford, Barn Close (Bradmore 1891/31). Jul.qtr. 1897 Melton Mowbray district, John Stokes married Mary Lizzie Hill of Scalford, daughter of Austin Hill ag.lab and Lucy. 1901 John age 29 railway engine stoker with wife Mary Lizzie age 25 and children Elise Marion 2, Ivy under 1 mth, both born Alfreton, at Catherine St., Alfreton. 1911 John age 39 Midland Railway loco stoker with wife Mary Lizzie age 35 (married 13 years with 4 children), Elsie Marion 12, Ivy 10 scholars, Charles Austin 7, Lucy Elizabeth 3 born Westhouses, Alfreton, plus a boarder, at No.21 Midland Terrace, Westhouses, Alfreton, 5-room house.

John Stokes, born c1875, Melton Mowbray. 1891 age 16, farm servant, in the household of Joseph Stafford, Barn Close (Bradmore 1891/31)

Fred Stokes, born c1883 Sneinton, Nottingham, son of Henry, tool fitter, and Harriet. 1891 age 9 scholar in parents' house, 47 Blue Bell Hill, Nottingham. 1901 age 20 iron turner in parents' house at 63 Blue Bell Hill, Nottingham. 1904 married Lydia Emma James, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore. 1911 Frederick Henry Stokes age 28 born 1883 Nottingham, iron turner, tool maker, general engineer, with wife Emma age 29 born Nottingham (married 6 years, no children (as at 2 April 1911)), at 100 Hampton Rd, Luton, Beds, 4-room house.

Frederick Stokes born 26.4.1911, bapt. 21.6.1911 at Bradmore Methodist Church, son of Frederick Henry and Lydia Emma, then living at Luton.

Fred Stoakes on Bradmore electoral roll, house, 1911 only.

STONE

Thomas Stone bapt. Bunny 20.10.1656, son of Edward and Anna of Bradmore.

Samuel and **Mary** Stone, bapt. at Bunny 28.9.1658, twin children of Edward and Anna.

Anne Stone married Richard Hinson, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 5.5.1664.

STREET

Richard Street married Jane Barrow both of Bradmore, at Bunny 16.2.1664.

Isabell Streete married Robert Yearwood both of Bradmore, at Bunny 14.9.1669.

William Street, bapt. Bunny 24.11.1681, son of Mary Street of Bradmore supposed to be begotten by John Hooton.

John Street bapt. Bunny 31.10.1694, son of John and Elizabeth Street of Bradmore.

John Street witnessed the will of John Nixon, 1722.

Thomas Street witnessed the will of Christopher Barson 1723.

Rebecca Street married Richard Walker, 30.3.1725, Ruddington. Sister of Mary Gunn. See Walker.

Mary Street married Richard Gunn at Ruddington 9.5.1721, and left bequests to her brother William and his daughters in her will of 3.1.1749. See Gunn.

William and **Widow** Street referred to in 1735. Rent from the farm at Bradmore occupied by William Street specified to fund Sir Thomas Parkyns' charitable bequests in his will of 1735. The same document refers to Widow Street in possession of these tenements etc. Possibly the William Street of Bradmore buried at Bunny 9.6.1750. Widow Street of Bradmore buried at Bunny 23.3.1780 may be this widow or possibly Elizabeth widow of William whose will was proved in 1757.

William Street, brother of Mary who married Richard Gunn, married Elizabeth Nixon, daughter of John and Ann, at Ruddington 8.1.1722. Referred to as John's son in law in John's will made in 1722. Carried out inventory of goods of Thomas Brown 1737, and signed bond the same year. William Street of Bradmore, husbandman, mentioned in will of Mary Gunn nee Street, widow of Bradmore, dated 3.1.1749 and proved 21.1.1757, as brother of Mary, and with daughters Ann, Martha and Hannah, all of whom received bequests. William's inventory dated 14.10.1757 comprising household goods £5; horses £17/10/-; cows £15; sheep £10; corn in the barn £20; corn growing in the fields £20; all other implements of husbandry £12/10/-; total £100, by Thomas Glover and John Atlee. Bond dated 19.11.1757 by Elizabeth Street, widow. Administration granted 3.12.1757.

Elizabeth Street born 1702 nee Nixon, daughter of John and Ann, married William at Ruddington 8.1.1722.

Ann Street bapt. Bunny 17.2.1732 daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Received bequest in aunt Mary Gunn's will of 1749. Probably the Ann Street who married John Mee of Normanton on Soar at Bunny 1.4.1756.

John Street son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore buried Bunny 6.10.1735.

Martha Street bapt. Bunny 8.1.1739, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Received bequest in aunt Mary Gunn's will of 1749. Probably the Martha who married Richard Attenborough at Bunny 27.12.1757, no parishes specified.

William Street bapt. Bunny 16.12.1736, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 2.1.1737.

Rebecca Street bapt. Bunny 16.12.1736, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 2.1.1737.

Hannah Street bapt. Bunny 9.11.1741, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Received bequest in aunt Mary Gunn's will of 1749.

Elizabeth Street married William Pawmer (Palmer), no parishes specified, at Bunny 29.9.1746.

Mary Street married William Lee at Bunny 13.4.1748, no parishes specified. Mary and husband William Lee, tailor, mentioned in Mary Gunn's will.

STUBBS

William Stubbs married Anne Lane both of Bradmore at Bunny 13.7.1680, having been cited as the supposed father of her son William bapt. at Bunny 13.6.1680.

John Stubbs bapt. Bunny 13.11.1681, son of William and Ann of Bradmore.

William Stubbs bapt. Bunny 20.3.1685, son of William and Anne of Bradmore.

John Stubbs married to Mary, living in Bradmore 1700s/1710s. May be John son of William and Ann. John Stubbs of Bradmore buried 8.10.1747.

Mary Stubbs of Bradmore, married to John, may be the Mary buried Bunny 22.10.1743.

Elizabeth Stubbs bapt. Bunny 17.4.1704, daughter of John and his wife of Bradmore, noted as pauper.

Mary Stubbs bapt. Bunny 6.2.1706, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore, noted as pauper.

Anne Stubbs bapt. 27.1.1708, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 3.2.1720.

Hannah Stubbs bapt. Bunny 17.2.1710, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore.

John Stubbs bapt. Bunny 16.10.1711, son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly John Stubbs born c1742 buried Bunny 18.9.1814 age 72. John Stubbs whittawer of Bradmore buried 23.11.1791 at

Bunny aged 80.

Sarah Stubbs of Bradmore wife of John Stubbs senior buried Bunny 19.2.1775.

Jane Stubbs bapt. Bunny 1.1.1738, daughter of John and Sarah of Bradmore.

William Stubbs bapt. Bunny 21.6.1741 son of John and Sarah of Bradmore.

John Stubbs born c1742, probably son of John and Sarah, married (1) Mary Long of Thrumpton at Thrumpton by licence 8.1.1765, married (2) Sarah Ballard, probably widow of John Ballard 19.12.1775 (IGI). Known as senior after his father's death in 1791, to distinguish him from John Stubbs junior born 1763. Paid Bradmore land tax 1/1½d p.qtr. 1780-1813, then passed to son William. Signed Constable's Accounts 1779-1800, 1803 and 1805. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas included 6d gathered from John Stubbs. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 7 acres 18 perches paying £7/12/9 rent pa including 15/- for house, outbuildings garden and yard, on Far St. beside the steeple. Had 3 acres in Cottage Moor and 1 in Rowends, also Near and Far Pendock Leyn fields, 2 acres. Possibly bought yarn from the Constable 1807/8 for £1/2/6. Buried Bunny 8.9.1814 age 72

Mary Stubbs nee Long of Thrumpton, married John Stubbs junior at Thrumpton 8.1.1765.

Mary Stubbs born c1766 buried Bunny 15.2.1818 age 52.

Katharine Stubbs bapt. Bunny 12.2.1767, daughter of John Stubbs junior and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 15.2.1767.

Sarah Stubbs born c1746, formerly Ballard, married John 19.12.1775 as his second wife (see Ballard). Buried Bunny 16.10.1825 age 79.

William Stubbs bapt. Bunny 4.3.1777, son of John and Sarah of Bradmore. 1787 paid by the Constable for catching sparrows. William Stubbs married Sarah Dalby both of Bradmore at Bunny 11.6.1804, after banns read on 27 May, 3 June and 10 June. Took over John senior's landholding and paid land tax 1/1½d p.qtr. 1814 to end of record 1832, described at 1827 as cottager. Witnessed marriage of Thomas Oliver and Rebecca Dalby, 31.7.1821. Signed Constables Accounts 1802-13, 1820-2, 1824-6, 1828-30, 1832, 1839-40, 1844 and 1849. Sarah died Nov.1831. 1841 age 60, cottager, householder, with children John, Thomas with his wife Hannah, and Emma, on Far St. beside the steeple (Bradmore 1841/69). 1844 Whites Directory, collar and harnessmaker. 1847 executor of John Glover, farmer. 1851 age 74, widower, harness maker employing one man, with John married to Hannah and their children Sarah, Mary Ann; also son in law, widower, Joseph Hallam and his daughter Emma (see Emma Stubbs below), and servant Mary Lacey (Bradmore 1851/64). 1853 Whites Directory, collarmaker. 1855 Kellys Directory, saddler. 1861 age 84, widower, harness maker, with John and Hannah and their daughter Mary A. (Bradmore 1861/44). 1864 Whites Directory, collar and harnessmaker. Buried Bunny 17.3.1863 age 86.

Sarah Stubbs born c1778 nee Dalby, married William Stubbs at Bunny 11.6.1804, buried Bunny 18.11.1831 age 53.

Mary Stubbs bapt. Bunny 20.12.1804, daughter of William and Sarah of Bradmore.

Rebecca Stubbs bapt. Bunny 6.11.1806, daughter of William and Sarah of Bradmore. Buried 3.6.1827 age 21.

Ann Stubbs bapt. 5.10.1809, daughter of William and Sarah of Bradmore, probably the Ann who married William Cross 18.6.1831, both of Bradmore, witnessed Anne Cross, John Stubbs.

John Stubbs bapt. Bunny 24.2.1812, son of William, harness maker, and Sarah of Bradmore. Married (1) Hannah Hallam of Bradmore at Bunny 10.4.1836, and (2) Eliza, by 1881. 1841 age 20 collar maker in father's house (Bradmore 1841/69). 1851 age 39, harness maker, married to Hannah in his father's house, with children Sarah and Mary Ann (Bradmore 1851/64). The saddler Stubbs who used to hang his tanned leather to dry beside the church tower before the Mission Hall was built in 1881. Signed Constable's Accounts 1853. 1861 age 49, harness maker, married to Hannah, in father's house, with daughter Mary A. (Bradmore 1861/44). On electoral roll 1868/9-1876 in category £12+ rent pa, and from 1882-5. 1869 Morris's Directory, cottager and saddler. 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house, garden and land 3 acres 2 roods 9 perches in Bradmore, 2 acres 3 roods 10 perches in Bunny, at rent £18/11/8 pa. 1871 age 59, householder, collar and harness maker, married to Hannah, with daughter Mary A., in the same house on Far Street by the steeple (Bradmore 1871/22). Wife Hannah died Sept.1874. 1876 PO Directory, saddler. Apr.qtr. 1876 Basford district John Stubbs married Eliza Horsley of Colwick. 1881 age 69, cottager, saddler, married to Eliza (Bradmore 1881/19). 1881 Kellys Directory, saddler. Probably the Stubbs in Nov.1885 who received a ton of coals from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1885/6 Whites Directory, horse collar maker. Electoral roll, land & tenement, 1886. 1891 age 79, collar and harness maker, with wife Eliza in Basford Union House. John Stubbs died Apr.qtr. 1895, Basford district.

Hannah Stubbs born c1810, Hoveringham. Nee Hallam, of Bradmore, married John Stubbs at

Bunny 10.4.1836. 1841 age 30 in father in law's house (Bradmore 1841/69). 1851 age 41, recorded as born Bradmore, married to John, in father-in-law's house (Bradmore 1851/64). 1861 age 51, married to John, in father-in-law's house (Bradmore 1861/44). 1871 age 61 married to John (Bradmore 1871/22). Buried age 72 at Bunny 27.9.1874.

Sarah Stubbs born c1842, Bradmore, daughter of John and Hannah. 1851 age 9, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/64). Possibly the Sarah buried Bunny 27.12.1860 age 19.

Mary Anne Stubbs bapt. Bunny 12.9.1850, daughter of John, saddler and Hannah of Bradmore. 1851 age 6 months, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/64). 1861 age 10, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1861/44). 1871 age 20, single in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/22). Married 4.11.1872 at Bunny age 22, daughter of John, saddler, of Bradmore, to George Preston age 22, labourer of Edwalton, son of Joseph, gamekeeper. See Preston.

Rebecca Stubbs bapt. Bunny 8.9.1836, daughter of John collarmaker and Hannah of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 26.5.1839 age 3.

Eva Stubbs bapt. Bunny 24.12.1841, daughter of John, collarmaker and Hannah of Bradmore.

Eliza Stubbs born c1813 Colwick, nee Horsley, daughter of Richard, farmer (died before 1841) and Mary (nee Hallam born Bradmore – see Hallam) cottager of Colwick. Apr qtr 1876 Basford district Eliza Horsley married John Stubbs of Bradmore, his second wife. 1881 Age 68, married to John (1881/19). 1891 age 80, occupation housework, married to John, with him in Basford Union House (Basford Union 1891). Eliza Stubbs died Apr qtr 1872, Basford district.

William Stubbs bapt. Bunny 29.3.1814, son of William, saddler, and Sarah of Bradmore.

Sampson Stubbs bapt. Bunny 5.4.1816, son of William, collarmaker, and Sarah of Bradmore. Oct.qtr. 1838 Bingham district Sampson Stubbs married Hannah Hart of Keyworth. 1841 age 25, shoemaker, householder, married to Hannah, with son Sampson, living in part of Town End (Bradmore 1841/49). 1851 age 35, shoemaker born Bradmore, with wife Hannah age 36 born Keyworth and children Sampson 11 born Bradmore, William 9 ag.lab, John 6 scholar, Ann 4, Arthur 1 all born Keyworth, and Hannah's father John Hart widower 75, ag.lab, born Wysall (baptised 31.8.1777 Wysall son of Thomas and Sarah), at Keyworth. 1861 age 45, cordwainer, with wife Hannah, children Arthur 12, ploughboy, Zillah 6 scholar, Aram 3 scholar, all born Keyworth, at Town St., Keyworth. 1871 age 55 shoemaker with wife Hannah age 56 seamstress and grand-daughter Emma 5 scholar born Cropwell Grange, at Keyworth. 1881 age 65 ag.lab with wife Hannah age 66, daughter Zillah 26 and 2 lodgers at Linby. 1891 age 75 ag.lab with wife Hannah age 76, daughter Zillah 36 housekeeper and a boarder at Linby village. Sampson Stubbs born 1816 died Oct.qtr. 1899, Basford district.

Hannah Stubbs born c1814, Keyworth nee Hart, daughter of John ag.lab and Hannah. 1841 age 25, married to Sampson (Bradmore 1841/49). 1851 age 36, married to Sampson. 1861 age 47, housekeeper, married to Sampson, at Keyworth. 1871 age 56, seamstress, married to Sampson, at Keyworth. 1881 age 66, married to Sampson, at Linby. 1891 age 76 married to Sampson, at Linby. Hannah Stubbs born 1814 died Oct.qtr. 1892, Basford, Nottingham.

Sampson Stubbs born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 6.11.1839, son of Sampson, shoemaker, and Hannah of Bradmore. 1841 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/49). 1851 age 11 at parents' home, Keyworth. 1861 age 23 carter for John Eggleston, farmer, at Keyworth. Jan.qtr. 1862 Bingham district, Sampson Stubbs married Mary Bradley, house servant for John Eggleston, born 1842 Whatton. 1871 age 30 ag.lab with wife Mary age 29 born Whatton and children William B 8 born Keyworth, Anthony 4 scholar born Cropwell Butler, Emma 6 scholar and George 2 born Papplewick, at Union St, Papplewick. 1881 age 40, shepherd, with wife Mary age 39 and children Arthur 13 ag.lab, George 12 ag.lab, Frank 11, scholar, all born Papplewick, Evenline 9, Harriett 7 scholars born Whatnall, and Ellen 4 scholar born Papplewick, at 7 Mill Houses, Papplewick. 1891 age 51 shepherd with wife Mary age 49 born Sibthorpe, children Arthur 23 corpn.lab. roads, George 22 coal miner, Ellen 14 at Seven Mile Houses, Papplewick. 1901 age 61 shepherd with wife Mary 60 and children George 31 domestic gardener and Ellen 24 dressmaker on own account at home, at Seven Mile Houses, Papplewick. Mary Stubbs died 1909, Basford district. Samuel Stubbs born 1939 died Mar.qtr. 1922 Basford district, but Sampson not found in 1911 census.

Thomas Stubbs bapt. Bunny 14.11.1819, son of William, collarmaker, and Sarah of Bradmore. 1841 age 20 in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/69). Jan.qtr. 1842 Basford district Thomas Stubbs married Sarah Mee, daughter of Mary Mee widow of The Green (North side), Ruddington. 1851 age 31 saddler at Ruddington, householder, married to Sarah age 30 born Ruddington, with children Walter 8, Edwin 7, Amos 3 and George 7 mths, all born Ruddington.

1861 age 41 harness maker with wife Sarah age 40 charwoman and children Amos 14, George 10 scholars and Agnes 2 all born Ruddington, in Sarah's mother's house, Mary Mee, widow 82 seamer born Bulwell, on The Green, Ruddington. 1871 Tom Stubbs, married but no reference to wife, with a daughter age 12, born Ruddington, at Little Town, Ruddington. 1881 age 54 harnessmaker with wife Sarah age 54, on The Green, Ruddington. 1891 age 71, saddler married to Sarah age 70, sick nurse born Ruddington, at The Green, Ruddington. Thomas Stubbs born 1819 died 1891, Basford district.

Emma Stubbs bapt. Bunny 18.4.1822, daughter of William, collarmaker, and Sarah of Bradmore. 1841 age 15 in her father's house (Bradmore 1841/69). Probably married Joseph Hallam, joiner, at Nottingham St. Nicholas, 18.7.1846, but had died before the 1851 census, leaving a daughter Emma Hallam age 4, with Joseph in William Stubbs' house (Bradmore 1851/64). See Hallam, and for daughter Emma see also Cross.

Mary Stubbs, bapt. Bunny 7.9.1746, daughter of John and Sarah, no parish specified. Buried Bradmore 13.1.1772.

Martha Stubbs bapt. Bunny 12.4.1714, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore.

Jane Stubbs bapt. Bunny 8.10.1716, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore.

Rebecca Stubbs bapt. Bunny 1.4.1719, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore.

Mary Stubbs married Henry Smith of Bunny at Bunny 12.4.1724.

Anne Stubbs daughter of John of Bradmore buried Bunny 30.5.1736.

John Stubbs born c1763, married Mary Dalby both of Bradmore by vicar's licence at Bunny 24.10.1802. Referred to as junior, i.e. born after 1742, see John senior above. John Stubbs junior in 1792 Bunny Estate Rental took over the holding of Daniel Underwood, probably on the Main Rd. opposite Debdale Farm, comprising 5 acres 3 roods 33 perches paying £6/6/- rent pa including a house and croft at £2/9/4. 1793-1832 (end of record), paid land tax at 9½ d p.qtr., described 1827 as cottager. Rented 3 gates on Cottage Moor. Signed Constables Accounts as John Stubbs junior in 1799, 1800, 1804 and 1806. Buried Bunny 23.6.1834 age 71.

Mary Stubbs nee Dalby of Bradmore married John at Bunny 24.10.1802, witnessed by John Gunn and John Voce.

Ann Stubbs bapt. Bunny 25.11.1803, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the Ann Stubbs who married John Smith of Bradmore 19.6.1823. See Smith.

SWAINE

Richard Swaine servant of Bradmore married Millicent Bennett of Bradmore at Bunny 14.3.1842. Not found 1851. 1861 Richard age 38 ag.lab born Cropwell Bishop with wife Millicent age 41 born Bradmore and children John 9, Valentine 2, both born Ilkeston, at Cropwell Bishop. 1871 not present with wife at Cropwell Bishop, not found elsewhere. Millicent died Apr.qtr. 1879. 1881 Richard age 58, widower, farm lab., with children John 29, single and Valentine 17, ag.labs, at Wilemans Lane, Cropwell Bishop. 1891 Richard age 48 widower, ag.lab with son John 39 ag.lab, single, at Smiths Row, Cropwell Bishop. Also 1891 Valentine Swain age 27, single, miller's waggoner, cart, with John Billigs, miller at Steam Mill, Cropwell Bishop.

Millicent Swaine born Bradmore 1821, nee Bennet daughter of William, cottager, and Elizabeth, married Richard Swaine 1842. Not found 1851. 1861 age 41 with husband Richard and children John and Valentine, both born Ilkeston, at Cropwell Bishop. 1871 Millicent age 50 lace spotter, married but husband not present, with children John Swain, 19, single, ag.lab born Ilkeston (1852), Valentine 7 born Cropwell Bishop, at 3 Whites Row, Cropwell Bishop. Millicent Swain died Apr.qtr. 1879 Bingham district.
