

## TAYLOR

**Thomas** Taylor married to Sarah, living in Bradmore in 1730s. Possibly Thomas Taylor of Bradmore buried Bunny 1.7.1752.

**Mary** Taylor bapt. Bunny 28.1.1733, daughter of Thomas and Sarah of Bradmore.

**Ann** Taylor bapt. Bunny 18.5.1735, daughter of Thomas and Sarah of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 8.2.1736.

**Thomas** Taylor bapt. Bunny 31.10.1737, son of Thomas and Sarah of Bradmore. Buried Bunny, son of Thomas and Sarah Taylor, no parish specified, 17.5.1748.

**Samuel** Taylor, bapt. Bunny Aug.1742, son of Thomas and Sarah, no parish specified, no date specified but probably after 20.8.1742. 1780-1789 paid by the Constable for catching rats, £1/11/6 a year, also 2d a head for hedgehogs, and 1784 was paid for catching moles. Dec.1782 Constable paid £1/4/- when they went to Chillwell and to Nottingham with Samuel Taler. 1784 Constable (Richard Attenborough) paid Mr Right for coming over to Nottingham to take Burges examination concerning Taylor, 3/-, and to Burges for his trouble 2/6. 8.5.1784 Richard Attenborough and Samuel Vose claimed 4/- expenses when they went over to Chelwell for Taylor, also 2/- attending the Justices at Nottingham concerning Taylor's charges, and going over to Chelwell with Taylor for fresh examination 4/-; 5.7.1784 Taylor's sefecort, getting, and the warrands of remueval and attending the Justices, £1/1/-; Jan.1785 Samuel was paid £2/2/- for 42 days shooting at the Decoy, and Daniel Smith got 6/8 for Samuel's ale. Sam also had 18/- from the Constables for keeping his mother 18 weeks and 3 days. Samuel Taylor, cottager of Bradmore, buried Bunny 8.12.1789 age 47.

**Elizabeth** Taylor born c1746 buried Bunny 10.12.1823 age 77.

**William** Taylor of Bradmore son of Samuel and Elizabeth buried Bunny 11.12.1774.

**Elizabeth** Taylor bapt. Bunny 15.3.1784, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

**John** Taylor born 18.3.1787, bapt. Bunny 19.3.1787, son of Samuel, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the 'Sam Taylor's boy' paid by the Constable in 1786 for catching fulmats (sic; fulmars not otherwise recorded for Bradmore, may mean large gulls), and in 1801 for sparrows and a hedgehog.

**Ann** Taylor, bapt. 1.10.1747, daughter of Thomas and Sarah, no parish specified.

**Mathew** Taylor of Bradmore married Elizabeth Severns at Bunny 10.8.1741. Buried Bunny 19.7.1743.

**Ann** Taylor bapt. Bunny 5.11.1741, daughter of Mathew and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried Bunny 30.12.1741.

**Sarah** Taylor 1780 was paid by the Constable for catching sparrows. 1785 at Wilford received 22 weeks pay from the Constable of Bradmore, £1/2/-.

**William** Taylor bapt. Bunny 19.7.1776, son of Sarah Taylor of Bradmore. Possibly the William Taylor paid by the Constable in 1788 for catching sparrows.

**Charles** Taylor born 8.3.1760 Normanton. Married Elizabeth. Died 10.3.1833 at Bradmore, buried Normanton 16.3.1833.

**Elizabeth** Taylor wife of Charles, born 1.10.1759, died 6.4.1819, buried in St Alkmund's churchyard.

**Elizabeth** Taylor born 26.9.1800 daughter of Charles and Elizabeth, sister of Charles. Married Samuel Dalby, son of John and Catherine of Bradmore, 22.11.1825. See Dalby.

**Catherine** Taylor of Bradmore married William Gasking of Ruddington, 7.10.1833. 1841 William Gaskin age 29 ag.lab born Kingston on Soar with wife Catherine age 29 born Bradmore and son John 6 born Kegworth, on London Rd., Kegworth. 1851 William age 39 ag.lab with wife Catherine age 39 lace worker and children Martha 7 scholar, Elizabeth 1 both born Kegworth, at Bridge Close, Kegworth. Catherine Gaskin died Oct.qtr. 1856, Shardlow district. Apr 1857 Basford district William Gaskin married Mary Smith. 1861 William age 49 with wife Mary age 56 born Ruddington and her daughter Mary Smith 14 scholar born Ruddington, and William and Catherine's daughter Elizabeth 11 born Kegworth, at Kingston on Soar.

**William** Taylor born c1774 Bradmore. William Taylor married Ann Howard, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 25.12.1800. 1841 age 65, frameknitter, householder, married to Ann, with grandson William, also Joseph Davy 16 frameknitter, and William Mee 6, relationships not specified, at No.1 Manor Farm Cottages, Donkey Lane (Bradmore 1841/68). 1851 age 77, widower, retired framework knitter, with son John and his wife Elizabeth, and their children William, Mary, James, John, Anne and Thomas (Bradmore 1851/66). Buried Bunny 5.11.1851 age 77.

**Ann** Taylor born c1778, nee Howard, of Bradmore. Married William at Bunny 25.12.1800. 1841 age 60, married to William (Bradmore 1841/68). Buried Bunny 11.3.1851 age 73.

**Sarah** Taylor bapt. Bunny 14.4.1803, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore. Buried 1.5.1831 age 28.

**Elizabeth** Taylor bapt. Bunny 21.1.1805, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore.

**Mary** Taylor bapt. Bunny 25.5.1806, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore.

**Ann** Taylor bapt. Bunny 26.10.1809, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 17.8.1829 age 20.

**Catherine** Taylor bapt. Bunny 24.5.1812, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore.

**Hannah** Taylor bapt. Bunny 14.11.1814, daughter of William, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore.

**John** Taylor bapt. Bunny 25.12.1816, son of William, framework knitter, and Anne of Bradmore. Married Elizabeth Wootton of Bradmore at Bunny 5.4.1836. 1841 age 20, householder, framework knitter, married to Elizabeth, with children Mary and James, living in part of No.24 Main St. (Bradmore 1841/41). John Taylor signed Methodist Sunday School accounts 1843, 1845. 1851 age 34, framework knitter, married to Elizabeth, in father's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 age 44, agricultural labourer, married to Elizabeth, with children Henry, Edward, Charles and Samuel, householder at No.1 Manor Farm Cottages, Donkey Lane (Bradmore 1861/25). 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house and garden at £3/10/- pa. 1871 age 53, framework knitter, married to Elizabeth, with son Samuel (Bradmore 1871/24). 1871-4 John Taylor received 10/- pa for cleaning Sunday School. 1881 age 62, married to Elizabeth, with grandchildren Ann and Sarah Hayward and Elizabeth Murden (Bradmore 1881/21). Buried Bunny 20.3.1882 age 65, buried on the same day as his son Edward Wootton Taylor.

**Elizabeth** Taylor nee Wootton, bapt. Bunny 29.7.1815, daughter of James, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore, married John Taylor at Bunny 5.4.1836. 1841 age 25 married to John (Bradmore 1841/41). 1851 age 36, married to John, in father-in-law William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 age 45, married to John (Bradmore 1861/25). 1871 age 52, married to John (Bradmore 1871/24). 1881 age 63, married to John (Bradmore 1881/21). Possibly the Widow Taylor Senr who was granted a weekly loaf from Bunny & Bradmore Charities July 1882, and awarded 2/- p.wk from Nov.1882, down to 1/- p.wk in 1884 as one of two Widows Taylor. The other Widow Taylor was Elizabeth wife of Edward Wootton Taylor, see below. 1885 as the only Widow Taylor listed, had the weekly 1/-. May be Elizabeth Taylor buried Bunny 13.1.1886, no age given, so no definite identification.

**William** Taylor bapt. Bunny 14.2.1837, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth, grandson of William and Ann. 1841 age 5 in grandparents' house (Bradmore 1841/68). 1851 age 14, in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1851/66). William Taylor of Bradmore married Ann Harwood of Bradmore at Bunny 8.3.1859. 1861 age 24 labourer with wife Ann and daughter Elizabeth 1 all born Bradmore, at Litchurch Derbyshire. 1871 age 34 iron turner with wife Ann and children Elizabeth 11 born Ruddington, Annie A 1 mth born Morley, at Litchurch. 1881 age 44 wheel turner with wife Ann and children Elizabeth 21 and Annie S 10 scholar born Litchurch, at Morleston St., Litchurch. William Taylor born 1837 died Oct.qtr. 1889 Derby.

**Ann** Taylor born 1836 Bradmore, nee Harwood daughter of Thomas, shoemaker and Sarah of Bradmore. Married William Taylor at Bunny 8.3.1859. 1861 age 25 married to William. 1871 age 35 married to William. 1881 age 45, houseworker, married to William. 1891 age 54, widow, with daughters Annie S 20 dressmaker born Derby and Elizabeth with her husband Jonas Rodgers and their son John William, at 30 Morlaston St., Litchurch. 1901 Ann age 65 widow in son in law Jonas Rodgers' house, 42, railway steam engine fitter, with his wife Elizabeth 41 and son John W 16, at Western Rd., Derby. Ann Taylor born 1836 died Apr.qtr. 1903, Derby.

**Elizabeth** Taylor born 1860 Bradmore (or Ruddington), daughter of William and Ann. 1861 age 1 in parents' house, Litchurch Derbyshire. 1871 age 11 in parents' house at Litchurch. 1881 age 21, book merchant? in parents' house at Litchurch. Married Tom Rodgers of Derby, Apr.qtr. 1883, Derby district. 1891 age 30 married to Tom age 32 engine fitter born Derby, with son John William 7 scholar born Derby, in Elizabeth's parents' house at Litchurch. 1901 age 41 married to Tom age 42 railway steam engine fitter, with son John W 16, in mother Ann's house at Derby. 1911 age 51 (married 28 years) to Tom age 52 engine fitter Loco Dept, Railway Company, 1 child not at home, at Sherwood Villa, Gordon Rd., Borrowash, 6-room house.

**Mary** Taylor bapt. Bunny 25.5.1838, daughter of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/41). 1851 age 12, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). Oct.qtr. 1859 Mary Taylor daughter of John and Elizabeth married Matthew Murden. See Murden.

**James** Taylor bapt. Bunny 9.4.1841, son of John framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 3 mths in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/41). 1851 age 10, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 age 20, single, agricultural carter, in the household of Thomas and Martha Holmes, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1861/9). 6.10.1863 James, labourer of Bradmore, married Elizabeth Buxton of Bradmore daughter of Thomas, framework knitter, at Bunny. 1871 age 30 iron driller with wife Elizabeth and children William born Bradmore, Thomas M 4 scholar and John 1 both born Derby, at 62 Park St., Derby. 1881 age 40 greengrocer with wife

Elizabeth and children William, Thomas M 14 errand boy, John 11 scholar, both born Derby, Alfred J 8 scholar born Stockton, at 83 Tilney Rd., Stockton on Tees. 1891 age 50, machine hand, with wife Elizabeth, children Thomas M 24 forge furnaceman, John 21 iron moulder, Alfred James 18 gen.lab, Beatrice A 9 scholar born Stockton, plus a servant, and lodger (Elizabeth's nephew) Alfred Buxton 18 gen.lab born Bradmore (son of Thomas and Jane), at No.1 Hodgson Lane, Stockton on Tees, Durham. John Taylor born 1841 died Apr.qtr. 1896 Stockton district.

**Elizabeth** Taylor, born 1843 Bradmore, nee Buxton daughter of Thomas, framework knitter and Mary of Bradmore, married James, labourer of Bradmore at Bunny 6.10.1863. 1871 age 28 married to James, at Derby. 1881 age 38 married to James, at Stockton. 1891 age 48 married to James. Elizabeth Taylor born 1843 died Jul.qtr. 1893 Stockton district.

**William** Taylor son of James, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 25.9.1864. 1871 age 6 scholar in parents' house, Derby. 1881 age 16 labourer, in parents' house at Stockton. William Taylor born 1865 died Apr.qtr. 1883 Stockton district.

**John** Taylor bapt. Bunny 1.8.1843, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 8, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 age 18 cowman for Benjamin Howard, farmer of 100 acres, with sister as house servant and Enoch Whittaker of Bradmore, carter, in the same household at Edwalton. John Taylor married Mary Smith of East Leake, daughter of Joseph, ag.lab and Elizabeth. 1871 John age 27 iron striker at works with wife Mary age 26 born East Leake and John's brother Henry Taylor 20 railway shunter born Bradmore, at 3, Court 3, Morleston St., Litchurch, Derbys. 1881 age 37 beerhouse keeper with wife Mary age 36 and daughter Ellen E 3 born Sheffield, at 11 Higher Hillpark, Stockport. 1891 age 46 smith's labourer assistant with wife Mary age 48 and children Elizabeth 13 born Sheffield, Annie 9 born Bradmore, and nephew John Murden, single, 19 labourer in iron foundry born Edwalton (son of Matthew and Mary, nee Taylor), plus a lodger, at 14 Falcon St., Loughborough. 1901 age 56 blacksmith's striker with wife Mary age 55 and children Ellen 23 shirt frame knitter born Attercliffe, Sheffield, and Annie 19 shirt machinist born Bradmore, plus Mary's sister Emma Smith, single, 53 born East Leake, at 20 Burden St., Loughborough. John Taylor born 1843 died 1906, Loughborough. Mary Taylor died Jan.qtr. 1909, Loughborough. Mary's sister Emma Smith in 1911 was an inmate in Loughborough Union Workhouse.

**Anne** Taylor bapt. Bunny 10.12.1845, daughter of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 6, scholar, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 Anne age 16 house servant for Benjamin Howard, 60, farmer of 100 acres, and his wife Elizabeth 50 born Tithby, together with brother John Taylor and also Enoch Whittaker of Bradmore at Edwalton. 1867 married Benjamin Howard of Edwalton, widower, farmer. See Howard.

**Thomas** Taylor bapt. Bunny 19.6.1849, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 2, in grandfather William's house (Bradmore 1851/66). 1861 age 12, ploughboy, in the household of William Peet, Tofts Farm (Bradmore 1861/10). 1871 Thomas Taylor age 22, worker, place of birth not known, with wife Harriett age 22 born Stanton and son Edward 2 mths born Derby, at Litchurch, Derbyshire. 1881 age 34 machine hand born Bradmore with wife Harriett age 33 born Stanton on the Wolds and children Edward 10, William 7 scholars, Charles 3, Eliza 5 mths, all born Litchurch, at Morlaston St, Litchurch, Derbyshire. 1891 age 40 railway machine hand with wife Harriett age 41 and children Edward 20 railway bolt maker, William 17 railway engine fitter, Charles 13, Eliza 10 Florence 8, Kate 5, Thomas 2 all born Derby at Taylor St., Osmaston Derbyshire. 1901 Thomas age 51 widower, general labourer in iron foundry, with children Edward 33 gen.lab in tanyard, Charles 24 gen.lab iron foundry, Eliza widow 21 tape weaver, all born Derby, Florence 18 born Osmaston, John 7 born Derby and grand-daughter Rebecca Taylor 1 born Derby, at 3, Court 4, Full St., Derby.

**Henry** Taylor bapt. Bunny 17.6.1851, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1861 age 9, bird scarer and agricultural boy in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/25). 1871 age 20 railway shunter in brother John's house at Morleston St., Litchurch. Buried Bunny 2.5.1876 age 23 (or 24?).

**Edward Wootton** Taylor bapt. Bunny 18.7.1853, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1861 age 7 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/25). Edward Taylor of Bradmore labourer, son of John framework knitter, age 27, married Elizabeth Jenkins age 23 of Bradmore, daughter of James, sailor (/tailor?), at Bunny 3.10.1881. Buried Bunny 20.3.1882 age 27, on the same day his father was buried.

**Elizabeth** Taylor born c1858 nee Jenkins, daughter of James sailor (/tailor?), married Edward at Bunny 3.10.1881. As Widow Taylor (junior), one of 2 Widows Taylor, had Bunny & Bradmore Charities 1/- p.wk at Oct.1884; the other Widow Taylor was her mother-in-law. 2.12.1884 as widow, daughter of James Jenkins deceased, married at Bunny to Joseph Gascoyne. See Gascoyne.

**Charles** Taylor bapt. Bunny 21.4.1857, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1861 age 4, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/25). 1871 age 15, groom to Thomas Morris at Barn Close (Bradmore 1871/20).

**Samuel** Taylor, born 22.4.1859, bapt. Bunny 10.5.1859, son of John, framework knitter and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1861 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/25). 1871 age 12, farmer's boy in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/24). Oct.qtr. 1887 Derby district Samuel Taylor married Mary Ann Rose, daughter of William, carter deceased, and Hannah of Derby. 1891 Samuel age 30 gen.lab with wife Mary A age 24 born Derby and children Samuel 2 and Hannah E 3 mths both born Osmaston, in Mary's mother Hannah Rose's house, Hannah widow 65 born Stapleford Notts, at 87 Liversage St., Derby.

**Jane** Taylor bapt. Bunny 27.5.1819 daughter of William, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore.

**Rebecca** Taylor bapt. Bunny 24.3.1823, daughter of William, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. 3.10.1839 Rebecca daughter of William framework knitter of Bradmore while still under age married Thomas Lane of Bradmore, also under age, son of William cottager, at Bunny. See Lane.

**Thomas** Taylor 1791-2 paid by the Constable in for catching sparrows. Possibly the Thomas Taylor who married Mary Henson of Ruddington at Bunny 1.10.1801. June 1811 the Constable paid Thomas Taylor of Radford 7/6, and paid his rent £2/5/-. Dec.1811 he paid Taylor's rent at Radford 5/6, and April 1813 paid 2/- p.wk. rent for him.

**J(ohn?)** Taylor 1859/60 had 2/- per day pay from the Constable for 16 days work, and 1860/1 had 57½ days pay, no details given. May be the John Taylor 1867 who had sheets from Bunny & Bradmore charities.

**Annie** Taylor born c1881, Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls Jan.1886 – 16.5.1886, left.

**Elizabeth Heap** Taylor born c1861 Wymeswold, nee Attewell daughter of Mary of Bradmore, married William Taylor, omnibus conductor, son of John, plumber and glazier of St.Anns, Nottingham, 18.6.1888. 1891 Elizabeth age 29 married to William age 25 tram conductor with son Henry A 3 mths and a boarder at 22, Brussels Terrace, Nottingham. 1901 Elizabeth age 40 with husband William age 34, tram conductor born Nottingham, with children Henry Albert 11, Mary Elizabeth 8, Arathea 6 all born Nottingham and a boarder at 5 Berlin Terrace, Nottingham. 1911 Elizabeth age 50 (married 23 years, 7 children, 2 dead) with husband William age 46 tram conductor for City Council, with children Albert 20 butcher, Mary Elizabeth 18, Arathea 17, both blouse hands, Harry 5, William 5 scholars all born Nottingham, at 2 Brussels Terrace, Banbury St., Nottingham, 5-room house.

**Christopher** Taylor bapt. Bunny 17.2.1884, son of Edward, labourer, and Emma of Bradmore. 1891 Edward Taylor age 33 born Costock (son of John, ag.lab, and Mary of Costock) ag.lab with wife Emma age 29 born Nottingham and children Christopher 7 born Bradmore, Thirza 5 born Draycott, scholars, and Edgar 3 born Draycott, at 5 Lindum Grove, Sneinton. 1901 Edward age 43 farm bailiff with wife Emma age 40 and children Christopher 17 domestic groom, Edgar 13 plumber's boy, Harry 9 born Nottingham, George E 5 and Arthur 7 mths born Radcliffe on Trent, at Asylum Farm, Notts Co Lunatic Asylum, Radcliffe on Trent. 1911 Christopher age 27 railway engine stoker, boarding with Frederick Lockwood railway engine drive at 29 Raikes St., Mexborough Yorks, 6-room house. Also 1911, Christopher's parents Edward 53 farm lab and Emma 49 (married 30 years with 6 children), with children Harry 19 groom, George Edward 15 farm boy, Arthur 10 scholar, and Edward's mother Mary Taylor 72 widow born Ruddington, at Thurgarton, 5-room house.

#### THOMPSON/TOMSON

**Thomas** Thomson of Bradmore presented 4.5.1663 for not suffering his child to be baptised.

**Ellin** Tomson of Bradmore received a blue coat in Mary Cartwright's will 1668.

**Francis** Thomson married to Helen, living in Bradmore in mid-1650s.

**John** Thomson bapt. Bunny 10.4.1654, son of Francis and Hellen of Bradmore.

**Francis** Thomson bapt. Bunny the last day of November, 30.11.1656, son of Francis and Hellen of Bradmore.

**Mary** Thomson bapt. 1668 (date illegible), daughter of James and Helen of Bradmore.

**Mary** Tompson born c 1664, Bradmore, married Robert Glover both of Bradmore, at Bunny 13.1.1690.

**Joseph** Tomson bapt. Bunny 22.12.1668, son of Joseph and Anne of Bradmore.

**Elnor** Tompson bapt. Bunny 2.2.1671, daughter of Francis and Eliza of Bradmore.

**Widow** Tomson on 1674 Hearth Tax Return with two hearths.

**Joseph** Tompson married Alice Gonne of Ruddington by licence at Ruddington 1.8.1675. Witnessed will of Thomas Brown, 1708. Carried out inventory of goods of William Turping 1719 and of Ann Turping 1721. Joseph Tomson senior, husbandman, left will dated 25.6.1726, proved 23.11.1727. To son Joseph Tomson £20 in 12 months time. Son Peter to give to son Joseph the carriage of 1 wagonload of coals to his house yearly during his life if he dwells in the Town of Nottingham or any

other place within 7 miles, Joseph to pay for the coals at the pits. To his son John's 3 children each 50/- payable to such of them as are capable of giving the executor a discharge within 12 months after Joseph's death, and to the rest at age 16. To son Peter's 3 children 50/- each at 15 years old. To his wife Alice Tomson the use of the whole estate for her life and £10. At her decease, his personal estate to his son Peter. Alice and Peter joint executors. Witnessed by William and Elizabeth Thompson. Inventory dated 16.10.1727 comprising: purse and apparel £1/5/-; horse flesh £66; cows young and old £34; swine hogs £3; sheep £1/5/-; horse gears £4; wagons and carts £16; plows and harrows £1/2/6; fleacks (hurdles) 12/6; corn in the barn £55/?/8; hay £18/15/-; goods in the house and kitching £5; goods in the parlour 15/-; goods in the chamber £1/15/-; all things unseen and forgotten £1/3/4; total £22, by John Clifton and Everard Hanson and Thomas Gunn. Bond dated 19.10.1727 £500, by Peter Tomson.

**Alice** Tomson nee Gonne (Gunn?) of Ruddington married Joseph at Ruddington 1.8.1675. Joint executor of Joseph's will dated 1726.

**Joseph** Tompson bapt. Bunny 11.9.1676, son of Joseph and Alice of Bradmore.

**John** Tompson bapt. Bunny 2.10.1680, son of Joseph and Alice of Bradmore.

**Peter** Tomson bapt. Bunny 23.12.1689, son of Joseph and Alice of Bradmore. Peter Tomson son of Joseph, carried out inventory of will of Ann Turpin 1721. Probably the Peter who married Mary Brown at Ruddington 26.5.1717, living in Bradmore from 1718-1723 on basis of children's baptisms.

Executor of his father's will 1726, which refers to the three children of this marriage. May also be the Peter who married Sarah Sterland at Nottingham, 15.11.1730, as second marriage, with children bapt. in 1730s. 2.3.1731 Bill of sale of livestock of Peter Tomson of Bradmore: John Nevill Esq High Sheriff of Nottingham County sells to Sir Thomas Parkyns baronet all the goods and chattels of Peter Tomson of Bradmore, yeoman, seized from Tomson by writ of Fieri Facias. Schedule of goods: 8 milk cows, 4 mares, 2 fillies. Sir Thomas Parkyns paid £38/10/-.

**Thomas** Tomson bapt. Bunny 25.3.1718, son of Peter and Mary of Bradmore.

**Rebecca** Tompson bapt. Bunny 18.9.1721, daughter of Peter and Mary of Bradmore. May be the Rebecca Tomson who married John Lovat at Bunny 12.1.1747, no parishes specified.

**John** Tomson bapt. Bunny 10.12.1723, son of Peter and Mary of Bradmore.

**Sarah** Tomson nee Sterland married Peter at Nottingham, 15.11.1730, possibly this Peter's second marriage, on the basis of subsequent baptism evidence.

**Peter** Tomson bapt. Bunny 24.2.1732, son of Peter and Sarah of Bradmore, buried Bunny 9.3.1732.

**Thomas** Tomson bapt. Bunny 15.7.1733, son of Peter and Sarah of Bradmore.

**Joseph** Tomson son of Peter and Sarah of Bradmore buried 8.2.1741.

**John** Thomson bapt. Bunny 18.12.1681, son of Joseph and Anne of Bradmore.

**Elizabeth** Tompson married William Lane of West Bridgford at Bunny 14.1.1686.

**John** Tompson married to Elizabeth, living in Bradmore in 1680s.

**Thomas** Tompson bapt. Bunny 12.4.1687, son of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

**Frances** Tomson bapt. Bunny 1.2.1690, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

**Anne** Tomson bapt. Bunny 25.9.1692, daughter of John Tomson of Bradmore.

**Joseph** Tomson bapt. Bunny 30.10.1691, son of Joseph Tomson of Bradmore.

**Joseph** Thompson of Bradmore the reputed father presented by Lydia Dickinson for bastard child, 26.10.1725

**John** Tomson of Bradmore buried Bunny 7.3.1718.

**Sarah** Tompson 1772-1789 had 1/6 p.wk. from the Constable and occasional help with rent.

**Hen(e)ry** Tomson's house had repairs Jan.1782 by Robert Roobotham, 3/11 paid by Constable.

**William** Thompson, born c1863, Hawksworth, son of William, ag.lab, and Sarah. 1871 age 7 in parents' house in Hawksworth village. 1881 age 18, single, farm indoor servant in the household of John Hutchinson, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1881/67). 1891 age 28, furnace labourer with wife Mary J age 30 born Burton on Wolds, seamer, and children Mary E 7, Sallan? 5, Harriet 4, scholars, Samuel C 2, all born Ruddington, and Mabel E 2 wks born Ilkeston, at 60 Brook St., Ilkeston.

**Thomas** Thompson of Long Row, Nottingham, on Bradmore electoral roll 1870-2 in category £12+ rent pa, equivalent of cottager.

**Elizabeth** Thynion? bapt. Bunny 8.5.1659, daughter of Francis and wife.

#### TOMLINN/TOMLINSON

**John** Tomlinn married Jane Cressell both of Bradmore, at Bunny 9.11.1663.

#### TONGE

**Pindar** Tongue married Sarah Marratt at Ruddington 4.6.1723. Buried Bunny 12.4.1737, no parish specified but see entry for Widow Tongue below.

**Sarah** Tongue nee Marratt married Pindar Tongue at Ruddington 4.6.1723. As Widdow Tongue of Bradmore, buried Bunny 10.8.1738.

**William** Tonge married Elizabeth Priestley at Bunny 31.12.1768, no parishes specified. 1785 the Constable paid William Tongue 3/6 for 14 score thatch for the Town Houses. May 1787, William had 2 cwt coals from the Constable, and on 19<sup>th</sup> he had 3/- when he buried his wife. 6.8.1787 George Attenborough was paid 12/- for yarn that William Tongue had. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey under Town Houses and Incroachments with a house. Jan.1802 Constable paid William Tonge's rent, 1/-.

**Elizabeth** Tonge nee Priestley married William Tong at Bunny 31.12.1768, no parishes specified. As wife of William of Bradmore buried Bunny 19.5.1787.

**William** Tonge bapt. Bunny 11.4.1769, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried 8.2.1770 Bunny.

**Elizabeth** Tonge bapt. Bunny 12.7.1771, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

**William** Tonge bapt. Bunny 28.5.1775, son of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried 21.10.1776, Bunny.

**Jane** Tonge bapt. Bunny 9.5.1773, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried 23.10.1776, Bunny.

**Jane** Tonge bapt. Bunny 13.4.1777, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

**Mary** Tongue bapt. Bunny 9.10.1784, daughter of William and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

#### TOPLEY/TOPLIS

**Jane** Topley married William Beck both of Bradmore, at Bunny 24.1.1643.

**William** Topley married (1) Fortune Wright of Ruddington at Ruddington 4.3.1783. Married (2) Ann Hawkins in 1787 after Fortune's death. Labourer. 1782 Constable paid William for catching a hedgehog. Possibly the Topley 1789 who was paid £2/8/- for the house by the Constable, and Dec.1789 the Constable paid William Oliver £2 for the house. 6.11.1790 Constable's meeting about William Toplis's house held at Mr Peet's, expenses 5/-.

**Fortune** Topley nee Wright of Ruddington, born c1757, married William Topley of Bradmore at Ruddington 4.3.1783. Buried Bunny 5.5.1787 aged 30.

**Edward** Toplis bapt. Bunny 6.4.1783, son of William and Fortune of Bradmore.

**Mary** Topley born 16.4.1786, bapt. Bunny 24.4.1786, daughter of William, labourer, and Fortune, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 3.7.1786.

**Ann** Topley nee Hawkins married William, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 27.11.1787, his second wife.

**William** Topley born Bradmore 19.5.1788, bapt. Bunny 22.5.1788, son of William, labourer, and Ann.

#### TORKARD

**Geoffrey** Thorkart de Bradmore and wife Matilda mid 13<sup>th</sup> century hold 1 selion (a 1 acre strip) and appurtenances in Bradmore between those of Elyas and of John son of Nicholas, adjoining Geoffrey's land in Keyworth Sike. Witnessed by William Thorkart, Elias de Bradmore, John son of Nicholas and William son of Ralph. Geoffrey and Matilda had sons William and John.

**William son of Geoffrey Torkard** mid 13<sup>th</sup> century grants to his brother John reversion of lands etc held by their mother Matilda in Bradmore, except 1 plot and 5 roods of land. Witnesses include John son of Elyas de Bradmore, Henry de Marteney of Bradmore, William Torcard of Bunny and Adam de Haytefeld of Bunny.

**William** Torkard of Bradmore and Elyas de Bradmore 1.8.1337 witnessed grants by Gervase son of John Helot of Bradmore to John Helot his brother, 2 selions, 1 at Smalehowes adjoining the land of John Poyne, 1 at Shortelonglandes adjoining the land of Elyas de Bradmore. 7.6.1340 William Torkard witnessed land grant by William Helote of Bradmore to Robert de Donington of Bradmore. 11.6.1340 William witnessed land grant by Robert de Donington of Bradmore to William Helote of Bradmore and his wife Avicia. 26.11.1347 Nicholas son of Ade de Bunny grants to William Torkard of Bradmore and his wife Petronilla 8 roods of land in Bradmore, 6 in Landcrofthstyis next to the land of Stephen de Ruddington and the other 2 in Blacclifmere next to the land of Richard Sewal. Witnesses include Elyas de Bradmore, his son John, John Pony of Bradmore, Henry Marteneye of Bradmore and William Gunter of Bunny. 12.1.1349 William Torkard of Bradmore grants to William Helot of Bradmore all his

lands and tenements in Bradmore and Bunny. Witnesses include Elyas de Bradmore, John Ponye of Bradmore, William Pony of Bradmore, Henry Marteneye of Bradmore, John Helot of Bradmore and 3 from Bunny. 13.12.1349 William Torkard and Helia de Bradmore act as witnesses at Stanton on the Wolds. 303.1352 Elias de Bradmore and William Torkard of Bradmore act as witnesses at Ruddington. 4.4.1356 William Torcard witnessed Roger de Pirpoint of Ruddington's quitclaim of John Tovin of Ruddington in 6/- rent and appurtenances in Bradmore.

**Joanna** Torcard daughter of William. 12.1.1371 William Burne and his wife Joanna grant to Hugh de Annesleye 4 messuages and 3 bovates with meadows and pasture lands and all appurtenances in Bradmore and Bunny which acceded to Joanna after the death of her father William Torcard. Witnesses include Elyas de Bradmore.

**James** Towle of Bradmore 1641 noted as recusant in the Protestation Return.

**Samuel** Towle born 1806 Beeston. 1861 age 55 ag lab with wife Ann age 50 indoor farmwork and children Thomas 23 licensed hawker of earthenware, Hannah 19, Samuel 13, Henry 7 scholar all born Sutton Bonnington on Main St., Sutton Bonnington St Anns. 1871 Samuel age 66 ag.lab born Beeston with wife Ann age 60 and grand-daughter Ann Elizabeth Homes 5 born Sutton Bonnington, at Forest Road, Loughborough. Samuel Towle born c1805 died Apr.qtr. 1878, Barrow on Soar. 1881 Ann age 70 boarder with son Samuel and his wife Sarah at Sutton Bonnington. Ann Towle born c1810 died Oct.qtr. 1883 Loughborough district.

**Samuel Hands Towle** born 1851 Sutton Bonnington. 1881 Samuel Hands (per census) age 30 carrier and gardener born Sutton Bonnington with wife Sarah age 36 born Wilson and children George 13 farm help, Fanny? 11, Samuel 9, Henry 3 scholars, Mary Ann 1, all born Sutton Bonnington and boarder Ann Towle widow 70, past work, also born Sutton Bonnington, at The Hobgoblin, Sutton Bonnington. 1896 Samuel Hands Towle senior, farmer of Bunny, was trustee of Bradmore Methodist church; resigned 1924. 1898-9 Methodist poor steward and leader, secretary of 20<sup>th</sup> Century Fund Committee. 1901 Samuel age 51 ag.lab farmer employer born Sutton Bonnington with wife Sarah 55 born Wilson and children Henry 23 worker with his wife Florence 28 born Ruddington, on Village Street, Bunny. 1911 age 60, farmer, with wife Sarah age 66 born Wilson, Derbyshire (married 43 years with 7 children), with daughter Sarah 23 dairymaid born East Leake and 2 servants, at Manor Farm, Burton on the Wolds, 9-room house.

**Samuel** Towle born 1872, Sutton Bonnington, son of Samuel and Sarah. 1881 age 9 scholar in parents' house at Sutton Bonnington. 1896 Samuel Towle junior attended the Methodist renovation fund meeting, was invited to the choir outing, and invited to read at the Service of Song. Jul.qtr. 1898 Samuel Towle married Annie Elizabeth Hutchinson of Bradmore, daughter of John, farmer, and Anne. 1901 age 29, farmer, employer born Sutton Bonnington with wife Annie E and son Samuel Leslie born Bradmore, and Samuel's siblings Thomas 19 farmer's son born Sutton Bonnington, Sarah 13 born East Leake, and cousin Mary H Gilbert 19 born Derby, at Manor House, Burton on the Wolds.

**Ann Elizabeth** Towle born 1862 Willoughby on the Wolds, nee Hutchinson daughter of John, farmer and Anne of Bradmore. Jul.qtr. 1898 married Samuel Towle. 1901 age 36, married to Samuel.

**Samuel Leslie** Towle born 6.6.1899 Bradmore, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 11.7.1899, son of Samuel and Annie Elizabeth. 1901 age 1 in parents' house at Burton on the Wolds. 24.5.1917 age 17 years 347 days, enlisted for short service for duration of emergency in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Leics. regiment. Then of Manor Farm, Burton on the Wolds.

**Mary Ann** Towle born 1880 Sutton Bonnington, daughter of Samuel Hands Towle and Sarah. 1881 age 1 in parents' house at Sutton Bonnington. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 1<sup>st</sup> class 14.4.1895 – 19.5.1895, choir member 1894. Oct.qtr. 1900 married Leonard Smith Hutchinson son of John and Anne, her brother in law.

**Thomas** Towle Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 1<sup>st</sup> class 21.4.1895-5.12.1897 (sick 17.11.1895-8.3.1896 and absent to 11.5.1896), last attendance 2.7.1899.

**Sarah** Towle Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 14.4.1895, 30.6.1895, 3<sup>rd</sup> class 7.7.1895-29.9.1895, sick Dec.1895, attended 5.1.1896, 6.9.1896-26.6.1898, 2<sup>nd</sup> class July 1898-17.3.1901.

**John** Treece born c1766. Married Mary Marriat both of Bradmore at Bunny 3.11.1794. May be the John Trees in the Constables Accounts 23.5.1801 who went with the Constable to have his examination taken, 2/- expenses. Jan.1802 had 6 weeks pay from the Constable. 1812 the Constable paid John

Trees's half year rent £1/16/9, July, to Thomas Oliver, and Nov.1812 had another half year rent £1/16/9. 1841 age 75, frameknitter, householder, married to Mary with son Henry, Mary Makeling and grand-daughter Mary, daughter of William and Sarah, living in part of Mill Cottage, Far St. (Bradmore 1841/54). Buried Bunny 5.10.1848 age 82.

**Mary** Treece born c1767 nee Marriat, of Bradmore, married John Trees at Bunny 3.11.1794. Mary had 4/- from the Constable 1805, 2 weeks pay. 1841 age 75, married to John (Bradmore 1841/54). Buried Bunny 23.5.1847 age 76.

**Sarah** Treece born Bradmore 13.6.1795, bapt. Bunny 16.6.1795, daughter of John, framework knitter, and Mary. Possibly the Sarah paid by the Constable in 1801 for catching sparrows.

**Mary** Treece born Bradmore 12.12.1796, bapt. Bunny 13.12.1796, daughter of John framework knitter and Mary.

**Ann** Treece born Bradmore 8.5.1798, bapt. Bunny 9.5.1798, daughter of John, framework knitter, and Mary. Ann Treece of Bradmore married Samuel Gunn, widower, at Bunny 2.8.1840?

**John** Treece born 26.6.1800 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 27.7.1800, son of John, framework knitter, and Mary. Married (1) Ann Hornbuckle of Ruddington at Ruddington 25.12.1836. 1841 age 40, miller, householder, married to Ann, with daughter Sarah, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1841/59). 1844 Whites Directory, corn miller. 9.7.1845 John Treece widower of Bradmore married (2) Mary Makeling of Bradmore at Bunny. 1851 age 50, miller, married to Mary, with daughter Sarah (Bradmore 1851/70). 1853 Whites Directory, corn miller. Rented village soil 1854, grazing on Mill Lane 1855 and 1858-9, and on Pendock Lane and Turnpike 1859. 1861 age 60, miller employing 1 man, married to Mary, with daughter Sarah and miller journeyman John Elliott, living in part of Town End (Bradmore 1861/29). 1864 Whites Directory, corn miller. Buried Bunny 12.1.1864 age 66.

**Ann** Treece born c1802 nee Hornbuckle, of Ruddington. Married John Treece at Ruddington 25.12.1836. 1841 age 30, married to John the miller (Bradmore 1841/59). Buried Bunny 16.5.1844 age 42.

**Sarah** Treece bapt. Bunny 18.5.1838 daughter of John, miller and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 3 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/59). 1851 age 12, scholar in father's house (Bradmore 1851/70). 1861 age 22, single, in father's house (Bradmore 1861/29). 24.3.1863 Sarah of Bradmore daughter of John Treece, miller, married John Elliott, miller of Bradmore, at Bunny. See Elliott.

**Mary** Treece born c1800, nee Makeling, of Bradmore. 1841 age 40 in the household of John Treece, part of Mill Cottage (Bradmore 1841/54). 9.7.1845 Mary Makeling of Bradmore married John Treece, widower of Bradmore at Bunny. 1851 at 51, married to John the miller (Bradmore 1851/70). 1861 age 61, married to John Treece the miller (Bradmore 1861/29). Buried Bunny 17.11.1861 age 62.

**Henry** Treece bapt. 28.10.1802, son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the Henry Treece in Constable's accounts 17.1.1825, Constable paid 1/- notice, no details. 1841 age 35, frameknitter in father's house (Bradmore 1841/54). 1851 age 48, framework knitter, householder, married to Sarah (Bradmore 1851/71). Buried Bunny 3.2.1861 age 59.

**Sarah** Treece born c1804, Bradmore. 1851 age 47, married to Henry (Bradmore 1851/71). Buried Bunny 6.2.1861 age 57.

**William** Treece bapt. Bunny 27.1.1805, son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Married Sarah Davis at Plumtree 21.10.1829. Buried Bunny 19.6.1832 age 28.

**Mary** Treece bapt. Bunny 8.3.1830, daughter of William, framework knitter, and Sarah of Bradmore. 1841 age 10 in the household of grandfather John Treece (Bradmore 1841/54).

**Jane** Treece bapt. Bunny 22.2.1807, daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore.

**Thomas** Treece bapt. Bunny 14.4.1810 son of John and Mary of Bradmore.

**Rebecca** Treece bapt. Bunny 15.10.1816 daughter of John, framework knitter, and Mary of Bradmore.

## TRIGG

**Alice** Trigg born c1759 buried Bunny 14.10.1815 age 56.

**Thomas** Trigg bapt. Rempstone 13.12.1747, son of John and Ann, married Mary Bagualey at Bunny 3.10.1769, no parishes specified. Possibly the Thomas who received payment from Constable for catching a hedgehog, 1782. Constable's Accounts 1784 record strikes of barley for Thomas Trig and 4/- in cash. Dec.1785 Thomas paid 1/6 by the Constable for drawing 6 score of thatch for the Town Houses. June 1789 Constable paid Thomas Trigg 6/- for falling? gravel. In Bunny Estate Survey 1792 under town houses and incroachments, with a house. 12.10.1792 Constable paid Thomas Trigg 5/- when ill, and another 2/- on 3.11.1792. Feb.1795 William Smith was paid 3/- for going twice to the doctor for Thomas, and Thomas received 8/- from the Constable. 12.4.1795 William Smith had another 3/- for going to the doctor for Thomas. 31.5.1795 Thomas had 6d for a bottle of oils, and 1/- for the same June 21st. 25.12.1796 Thomas had 1/- for 3 days work at the house row. Jan.1802 Constable paid



for ale that Trigg and Bexon had when letting water out of the gravel pit. March 1809 the Constable paid Thomas Trig for Sam Attewell's rent, 8 weeks, 8/-. June 1810 Thomas had 8/- when ill, and July he had 4 weeks at 9/- p.wk. Buried Bunny 28.8.1821 age 74.

**Mary** Trigg nee Bagualey married Thomas at Bunny 3.10.1769, no parishes specified. Probably the Mary Trig paid by the Constable 28.6.1785 for laying out John Priestley, 1/6. Mary Trig was paid 2/6 for nursing Ann Darker 10.2.1793, and a further 1/- in February. 15.2.1800 Mary Trigg had 2 pints of liquor from Constable, 2/6, and 2 pints more 2.3.1800.

**John** Trig bapt. Bunny 10.4.1770 son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. 1780 and 1784 received payment from Constable for catching sparrows. Possibly the John paid by the Constable 5/- for taking a poor family to Nottingham, Sept.1831.

**Thomas** Trig of Bradmore son of Thomas and Mary buried Bunny 1.12.1771, probably as a child.

**William** Trige, bapt. 6.12.1772, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, buried 9.12.1772.

**Thomas** Trige bapt. Bunny ?3.12.1773, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, buried 24.12.1776 Bunny.

**Ann** Trige bapt. Bunny 5.3.1776, daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore, buried 12.10.1776 Bunny.

**William** Trig bapt. Bunny 15.9.1777, son of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the William Trigg who married Mary Smith of Gotham at Bunny 4.5.1800. The Constable paid William Trigg 7/- for when he went over to his settlement, 7.8.1800. 4.1.1801 Constable paid Richard Henson 2/- for going with William Trigg to his settlement. 1841 William Trigg age 69 ag.lab with wife Mary at London Rd., Kegworth. 1851 William age 80 pauper, ag.lab, born Bradmore with wife Mary at Bridge Lane, Kegworth. William Trigg died Apr.qtr. 1852, Loughborough district.

**Mary** Trigg born c1772 nee Smith of Gotham, married William at Bunny 4.5.1800. 1841 age 68 married to William, at Kegworth. 1851 age 79, pauper born Gotham, married to William, at Kegworth. Mary Trigg died Oct.qtr. 1854, Loughborough district.

**Jane** Trigg born 19.2.1801, bapt. Bunny 20.2.1801, daughter of William and Mary.

**Elizabeth** Trigg bapt. Bunny 18.11.1781, daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly Elizabeth Trigg paid in 1785 by the Constable for attending John Henson's wife when ill, 1/6.

**Mary** Trigg bapt. Bunny 15.3.1784, daughter of Thomas and Mary of Bradmore.

**Ann** Trige born 15.9.1786, bapt. Bunny 17.9.1786, daughter of Thomas, labourer, pauper, and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 10.6.1791.

**Thomas** Trige born Bradmore 3.11.1788, bapt. Bunny 13.11.1788, son of Thomas, labourer, and Mary. May be the Thomas who was paid by the Constable in 1794 for catching a hedgehog. 1841 Thomas age 50 labourer with wife Ruth age 50 and children Elizabeth 20, Thomas 12, Sarah 10, at Lockington, Derbyshire. 1851 not found in Derbyshire, possible entry under Hanley Staffs but ages and birthplaces not matching well. Thomas age 72 ag.lab born Bradmore with wife Ruth age 72 born Ilkeston, at Lockington, Derbyshire. Thomas died Jul.qtr. 1870, Shardlow district.

**Samuel** Trigg born Bradmore 18.3.1791, bapt. 28.3.1791, son of Thomas, labourer, and Mary. 1861 Samuel age 70, widower, former soldier, pensioner born Bradmore, at West St, Corfe Castle.

**Thomas** Trigg married Alice Bennett both of Bradmore at Bunny 25.5.1801.

**Katherine** Trueman married John Walker of Bunny at Bunny 23.4.1683.

#### TUGMAN

**Elinor** Tugman married John Lovatt of Bunny at Bunny 20.8.1629.

#### TURFITT

**William** Turfitt born c1850 Swayfield, Lincolnshire. 1881 age 39 shepherd and foreman with wife Frances 38 born Woolsthorpe and children Mary 20 housekeeper born Barrowby Lincs, William 13 ag.lab born Aunby Lincs, Thomas, John, Alice, David and Hannah, at Deeping St James, Lincs. **David** Turfitt born 1876 Stoke Dry, Rutland, son of William and Frances. 1881 age 5 in parents' house at Deeping St James. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 2<sup>nd</sup> class 19.7.1885-7.7.1889, 1<sup>st</sup> class 2<sup>nd</sup> part 14.7.1889-1.6.1890, left. 1891 age 15 ag.lab in parents' house at Retford.

Bond 28.11.1719 by Ann Turpin.

**Ann** Turpin(g) born c1664, nee Spencer of Sneinton, wife of William of Bradmore, her second husband; widow of Thomas Brown who died 1708. Children Ann, Thomas and Mary from her former marriage, and possibly also Clifton, Peter and John. See Brown. Will as widow, cauldewife? of Bradmore dated 26.3.1721, proved 22.1.1722. Inventory 12.12.1721 comprising: purse and apparel £2/10/-; household goods £10/5/-; cows £10; horses and drawing harness £30/15/-; waggons carts plows and harrows £15; sheep and fleacks (hurdles) £12/10/-; swine 15/-; corn in the barns £41/15/-; crops in the ground £20; all things seen and unseen 15/-; total £152/5/-, by Joseph and Peter Tomson and Hugh Alsop. **Dorothy** Turpin bapt. Bunny 18.5.1711 daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore. Mentioned in the will of Thomas Brown of Bradmore as sister, 1737; Thomas was her half-brother.
