

## UNDERWOOD

**Samuel** Underwood in Constable's Accounts 1782 was paid 1/6 for a room.

**Daniel** Underwood of Bradmore buried Bunny 8.8.1781.

**Richard** Underwood paid by the Constable in 1789 for catching sparrows.

**Daniel** Underwood possibly son of Richard and Mary of Rempstone, bapt. 29.9.1751. May be the Daniel who married Sarah Shepherd at Bunny 12.6.1775, no parishes specified, though if first child born 1783 dates are not close. In Constable's Accounts 25.12.1782 to be paid £1 for John Priestley's house, due 1.2.1783. Jan.1784 he was paid another £1 for John Priestley's house. May 1785 he was paid 30 weeks pay for John Priestley's parlour, 15/-. In Bunny Estate Rental 1792 with 5 acres 3 roods 33 perches paying £6/11/0 rent pa including £2/9/4 for house and croft, but in summary statement this entire property is recorded as now John Stubbs junior. Daniel paid land tax at 9½d p.qtr. 1780-1792, then John Stubbs junior took over payments. Presumably Daniel died in 1792.

**Sarah** Underwood possibly nee Shepherd who married Daniel Underwood at Bunny 12.6.1775, no parishes specified. Jan.1786 she received 3/2 from the Constable for a shift cloth for Mary Brown.

**William** Underwood born 9.9.1785, bapt. Bunny 17.9.1785, son of Daniel and Sarah of Bradmore. 1841 William age 55 maltster with wife Flora and 2 servants at Radford. 1851 William age 65 maltster born Bradmore with wife Flora age 60 born Wellow and a servant at Blooms gate, Radford. 1861 age 76, maltster, widower, with niece Sarah Harrison cigar maker born Carlton and a servant at Blooms grove, Radford.

**Mary** Underwood bapt. Bunny 22.3.1783, daughter of Daniel and Sarah of Bradmore.

**Daniel** Underwood, born 2.2.1788, bapt. Bunny 15.1.1788, son of Daniel, cottager, and Sarah of Bradmore, buried Bunny 2.3.1791.

**Sarah** Underwood born Bradmore 8.11.1789, bapt. Bunny 18.11.1789 daughter of Daniel, cottager, and Sarah.

**William** Underwood born 26.2.1854, Ruddington, son of William, stocking weaver and Catherine. 1861 age 9 in parents' house at 38 Wilford Rd., Ruddington. 1869 played cricket for Ruddington village. 1871 age 19 professional cricketer in parents' house on Chapel St., Ruddington. 1875/6 one of the Colts XXII in the Notts trials. 1881 age 28 framework knitter and professional cricketer in parents' house on Shaw St., Ruddington. Played vs Gloucester at Clifton 1881 during a strike of Notts professional cricketers. Was engaged at Rock Ferry 1870-76, Edinburgh Collegiate 1878-9, and trained at HMS Britannia, Dartmouth 1886-c1900. Played cricket for Devonshire. 1889 Jan.qtr. Basford district, William Underwood married Kate Oliver, schoolmistress, daughter of Mary, widow, of The Green, Ruddington. 1891 William age 36 professional cricketer with wife Kate age 34, boarders with William Grant, draper, at Duke St., Dartmouth. 1901 age 49, pub/hotel proprietor, employer, with wife Kate age 47, son Charles W O 8 born Ruddington, nieces Ethel Collins 17 born Bunny and Florence Sadler 19 born Newark, nephew William Attewell 17 domestic servant born Ruddington, plus a servant at the Commercial Hotel, Victoria Road Dartmouth. 1911 age 58 farmer, employer, with wife Kate age 57 (married 22 years with 1 child), son Charles W O 18 single working on farm, at Bunny, 5-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement with no parish vote plus land with no county vote 1912-1914. Died by his own hand at Bradmore, 9.4.1914, buried in Ruddington churchyard with headstone.

## UPTON

**Mary** Upton appears in Constables Accounts 17.2.1794, paid 2/- for her trouble, but the trouble is not specified; usually indicates nursing an invalid. 23.3.1794 Mary Upton had 5/- for laying out Helliat's (Elliot's) wife.

**Benjamin** Upton born c1846, Lewes, Sussex. 1861 age 15, ploughboy, in the household of Catherine Bonser, Bonsers Farm (Bradmore 1861/14).
