

VALE

Mary Vale married Peter Hemsly of Gotham at Bunny 29.6.1682.

VARNHAM

Anne Varnham married George Hall of Keyworth at Bunny, 1686/7, on the 14th day, month not recorded but between Nov.1686 and May 1687.

VERNAM

Elizabeth Vernam bapt. 19.12.1652, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Anne Vernam bapt. Bunny 20.11.1654, daughter of John and Elizabeth.

Alice Vernam bapt. Bunny 8.3.1657, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Mary Vernam bapt. Bunny 10.2.1660, daughter of John and Elizabeth.

VICKERSTAFF

Mary Vickerstaff born 1844, Bradmore, maiden name not known. 1881 Mary age 37 married to John age 39 ag.lab born Radcliffe on Trent with children Martha 14, Ann 11, Mary 8, Sarah 6, Eliza 5, Emma 2, Ellen 6 mths all born 'ditto' under Bradmore but probably should be Radcliffe on Trent? at Chapel House, Radcliffe on Trent.

VINCENT

William Vincent married to Jane, living in Bradmore 1640s. 1641 took Protestation Oath, supporting true Protestant Religion.

Anne Vincent bapt. Bunny 27.1.1639, daughter of William and Jane of Bradmore.

William Vincent bapt. Bunny 15.2.1641, son of William and Jane of Bradmore. Probably William Vinson who married Ann Dale, daughter of Mary Dale, both of Bradmore, at Ruddington 17.11.1669. 1674 Hearth Tax, William Vincent had 1 hearth. Died 1684 before September baptism of son Clifton.

Ann Vincent nee Dale, daughter of Mary Dale, married William at Ruddington 17.11.1669.

John Vincent bapt. Bunny 10.10.1675 son of William and Ann of Bradmore. Notts. Archdeacon's Court Marriage Licence Bond dated 5 June, John Vincent of Bradmore, yeoman, age 25, to marry Mary Barston of Edwalton, age 26, at Edwalton or Sneinton.

Elizabeth Vincent bapt. Bunny 11.10.1677, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore.

Joseph Vincent bapt. Bunny 2.1.1680, son of William and Ann of Bradmore.

Ann Vincent bapt. Bunny 10 (or 12?).3.1681 daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore. As Vinson, grand-daughter of Mary Dale, beneficiary of her will in 1708.

Clifton Vincent bapt. September 1684 (before 10th, date not clear in register), son of Anne of Bradmore, relict of William Vincent lately deceased. As Vinson, grandson of Mary Dale, beneficiary of Mary's will in 1708. Died 9.1.1732 in his 48th year, buried at Bunny on south side of churchyard. Married to Ann.

John Vincent bapt. Bunny 5.5.1711, son of Clifton and Ann of Bradmore .

Elizabeth Vincent bapt. Bunny 13.11.1642, daughter of William and Jane of Bradmore.

Elnor Vincent bapt. Bunny 17.8.1645, daughter of William and Jane of Bradmore.

VOCE

Samuel Vose born c1717 of Bunny, husbandman of Bradmore, married Fortune Hubberd at Plumtree 3.2 or 3.11.1742 (IGI). Tenant of Yorke Farm. Mentioned in will of William Mee, shepherd, 1750, as owing William £1. Will dated 1.10.1766, proved 27.5.1767. Buried Bunny 24.11.1766. Left to his daughter Mary £8, to daughter Fortune Henson 1/-, to daughter-in-law Elizabeth Horn? 1/-, and left his wife Fortune Vose and son Sam Vose joint executors. Inventory 25.4.1767 comprising: purse and apparel £10; 4 horses £21; 5 cows £30; 2 calves £40; pigg £1; 30 sheep £10; wheat £5; pease and beans £5; hay £3; carts and husbandry goods £7; goods in the house Parlour and Chamber £10; total £116, by Edward and Samuel Vose. Bond 25.4.1767 £260 by Fortune Vose, Samuel and Edward.

Fortune Voce born c1706, married Samuel of Bradmore, buried Bunny, widow aged 87, 10.6.1793.

Mary Vows bapt. Bunny 21.4.1744, daughter of Samuel and Fortune of Bradmore. Possibly the Mary buried Bunny 10.2.1825 age 82, died the same day as sister in law Elizabeth Oliver nee Vose (married William Oliver 1771) and buried in the same grave, note in register.

Millecent Voce, bapt. 28.2.1746, daughter of Samuel and Fortune, buried Bunny 15.9.1765.

Samuel Vose, bapt. Bunny 9.5.1748, son of Samuel and Fortune, no parish specified. Samuel Vose, farmer of Bradmore, married Mary Mee of Ruddington at Ruddington 9.7.1772. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas includes 1½d gathered from Samuel Voce. Samuel signed the Constable's Accounts 1779-1795, served as Constable for 1785, and was reimbursed £5/2/2½d that he

was out of pocket at the end of the year. 1785 was paid expenses when he and Richard Walker took Joseph Stevenson to the Infirmary. 1780-1796 paid land tax 13/6½d p.qtr., land then passed to John Vose. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 55 acres 1 rood 38 perches paying £61/10/2 rent pa including £1 for house outbuildings garden and foldyard. Served as Constable again in 1795. Buried Bunny 12.6.1796, aged 48. Will dated 27.5.1796, proved 7.9.1797. Left £100 to daughter Elizabeth Vose when 21 with a further £100 when 25. Likewise £100 to daughter Mary Vose when 21 and a further £100 when 25. The rest of his estate to go to his wife Mary and son John, executors. If his wife Mary left John then she would surrender her share to John and he was to pay her £100 plus £25 for life. Witnessed by James Henson and Thomas Peet. Inventory 10.8.1797 total £285, comprising: purse and wearing apparel £10; household goods and furniture £30; horses and harness £30; horned cattle £40; sheep £20; swine £5; corn growing £90; hay £30; implements of husbandry £30; carried out by James Henson and Thomas Peet.

Mary Vose nee Mee, married Samuel at Ruddington 9.7.1772. Provided for in will of son John, 1829, still alive at that date.

William Voce, born c1772, farmer of Bradmore at Manor Farm, probably son of Sam and Mary. Married Mary Baldock of Wysall at Wysall 23.6.1797. Took over payment of £1/2/2½d land tax p.qtr. from Edward Voce in 1817, paid until 1829, then it passed to Isaac Voce. Served as Constable 1827, and signed Constable's accounts 1820-2, 1824-5 and 1828/9. Described in 1827 land tax schedule as farmer. Will dated 22.11.1829. Proved 16.8.1830 by Mary his wife and Isaack his son. Left his estate to Mary and Isaack, and to John his son 1/-, to Elizabeth his daughter £100, to Mary his daughter 1/-, to Reb. his daughter £100, to Edward his son £200. Witnessed William Roobotham 22.11.1829. Mary Voce, relict, and Isaac, farmer, executors. Died 23.11.1829 aged 50, buried in Bunny churchyard 26.11.1829, registers note age 57, near south corner of chancel with Mary. William's half of the stone has the verse 'Farewell my friends and wait awhile / My toilsome life is o'er / I trust to meet you all again / On Zion's happy shore.'

Mary Voce born c1768, nee Baldock of Wysall who married William Voce 23.6.1797. Note Elizabeth Baldock of Wysall married George Walker 1799, and John Baldock married Elizabeth Lane 1806 and was later farmer of Wysall and Bradmore Methodist Church trustee, probably related. Mary died 5.2.1838 age 70, buried in Bunny churchyard near south corner of chancel with William. Mary's half of the stone has the verse 'Tis finish'd! Tis done! the spirit has fled / The prisoner is gone, the Christian is dead / The Christian is living in Jesus's love / And gladly receiving a kingdom above.'

Mary Voce born Bradmore 19.12.1798, bapt. Bunny 25.12.1798, daughter of William, farmer, and Mary.

John Voce born Bradmore 23.5.1800, bapt. Bunny 4.6.1800, son of William, farmer, and Mary. See also under John born c1802 son of John and Mary - beware confusion of two Johns.

Elizabeth Voce born Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 25.9.1801, daughter of ?William and Mary. Possibly the Elizabeth who married William Rowbotham, with eldest son William Voce Rowbotham. See Rowbottom.

Rebecca Voce bapt. Bunny 11.8.1803, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore.

Isaac Voce, bapt. Bunny 9.11.1801, son of William and Mary of Bradmore. Signed Constable's Accounts 1829, served as Overseer 1830, signed Constable's accounts 1831, 1836, 1841, 1846 and 1848. 1830 took over William's land holding paying land tax £1/2/2½d p.qtr., to end of record in 1832, at Manor Farm. 1832 Whites Directory entry with Samuel (son of John and Mary), farmers. On electoral roll 1838/9 with 122 acres, 1840-1850 with 120 acres. 3.10.1839 Isaac Voce farmer married Elizabeth Voce at Bunny, both of Bradmore. 1841 age 35, farmer, householder, married to Elizabeth, with son William, servants Mary Smith, Eliza (or Elizabeth) James, James Wibbett and Daniel Henson (Bradmore 1841/73). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. 1851 age 48, farmer of 128 acres, married to Elizabeth with children William, John and Mary and servant Lucy Wootton (Bradmore 1851/72). 1861 Isaac age 58 farmer of 62 acres with wife Elizabeth 58, both born Bradmore, with children William, John and Mary, plus a servant, at Thorpe in the Glebe. 1871 Isaac age 68 retired farmer with wife Elizabeth age 68, at Brook St., Wymeswold. Isaac Voce, no parish specified, buried with Elizabeth Bunny 25.8.1878 E of chancel, age 76 in register.

Elizabeth Voce bapt. Bunny 22.1.1803, daughter of John and Mary Voce of Bradmore. A spinster when her father died 1829. 3.10.1839 Elizabeth Voce of Bradmore married Isaac Voce, farmer of Bradmore, at Bunny. 1841 age 35, married to Isaac (Bradmore 1841/73). 1851 age 47, married to Isaac (Bradmore 1851/72). 1861 age 58 married to Isaac, at Thorpe in the Glebe. 1871 age 68, married to Isaac, at Brook St., Wymeswold. Died Apr.qtr. 1879, Loughborough district, buried Bunny 7.6.1879 age 76, noted as of Wymeswold.

Elizabeth Voce eldest daughter of Isaac and Elizabeth born 1834. Died 20.11.1898 age 64,

recorded on parents' tombstone, north side of Bunny churchyard, as Elizabeth Whitaker. Not known who she married.

William Voce bapt. Bunny 30.8.1840, son of Isaac, farmer and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1841 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/73). 1851 age 10 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/72). 1861 age 20 in parents' house at Thorpe in the Glebe. 1869 proved brother John's will. 1871 age 30 farmer of 135 acres employing 2 labourers with wife Mary 27 born Cossington Leics and children William T 2, Elizabeth 1 plus a general servant and 2 farm servants, at Burton Wolds Farm, Burton on the Wolds. 1881 age 46 farmer of 50 acres with wife Mary age 38 born Cossington Leics and children William Thomas 12, Elizabeth 11, Pollie 9 scholars all born Burton on the Wolds, at Burton on the Wolds. 1891 age 51 grazier with wife Mary age 47 and children Arthur 17 and Isaac 16 gen.labourers, Annie 14, Patty 13 scholar, all born Burton on the Wolds, in cottage at Washpit Square, Burton on the Wolds. 1901 age 60 self-employed grazier with wife Mary age 57 and children William T 30, woodman, Arthur J 20 grazier, Isaac 26 self-employed pork butcher working at home, and Pattie 22 no occupation, all single, in Hall Road, Burton on the Wolds. William Voce of Cossington, retired grazier, died 8.3.1908, probate Leicester 16.5.1908 to Mary Voce, widow, and Isaac Voce, butcher, effects £2090/4/7. 1911 Mary Voce 66 widow of independent means (married 43 years with 8 children, 2 dead), with daughter Annie 33 single, no occupation, at Cossington in 8-room house. Mary Voce widow of Cossington died 27.12.1920, probate Leicester to Arthur John Voce butcher and Annie Voce spinster, effects £867/11/-.

John Voce born c1843 Bradmore, son of Isaac and Elizabeth. Not found in Bunny baptism register. 1851 age 8 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/72). 1861 age 19 in parents' house at Thorpe in the Glebe. 22.9.1869 John Voce farmer of Barrow on Soar died, will proved 30.11.1869 by oaths of William Voce of Burton on the Wolds, farmer and brother, and John Smith, butcher, of Bunny, executors, effects <£600.

Matilda Voce born 1845 Barrow, married to John, widowed 1869. Jan.qtr. 1871 Matilda Voce married William Marshall of Sileby, Melton Mowbray district. 1871 William age 40 butcher born Cossington and wife Matilda 26 born Barrow, with Marshall children Eliza 16 born Sileby, William 15 and Matilda 13 scholar both born Cossington, and Catherine Voce 2 born Bradmore, step-daughter, at 3 King St., Sileby. 1881 Matilda Marshall widow age 36 farmer of 33 acres born Burrow Fields, Leics with son William Marshall 25 butcher and daughters Katherine E Voce 12 scholar born Bradmore and Jane A Marshall 7 scholar born Sileby, at Barrow Road, Sileby,

Mary Matilda Voce bapt. Bunny 3.11.1867, daughter of John, farmer and Matilda of Bradmore.

Catherine Elizabeth Voce bapt. Bunny 20.12.1868, daughter of John, farmer and Matilda of Bradmore. 1871 age 2, stepdaughter in William and Matilda Marshall's house at Sileby. 1881 age 12 scholar, in mother's house at Sileby.

Mary Voce bapt. Bunny 22.6.1843, daughter of Isaac, farmer and Elizabeth of Bradmore. 1851 age 6 in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/72). 1871 age 17 in parents' house at Thorpe in the Glebe.

Frederick Voce born c1851, youngest son of Isaac and Elizabeth, died 28.4.1875 age 24, buried at Accrington cemetery and commemorated on parents' tombstone on north side of Bunny churchyard.

George Voce?, son of Isaac and Elizabeth, erected their tombstone. Possibly son of Elizabeth Voce/Whitaker also recorded on the stone?

Edward Voce bapt. Bunny 10.4.1809 son of William and Mary of Bradmore. Probably the Edward who was paid 1/- by the Constable for a dozen sparrows in Nov.1826. 1841 Edward age 30 farmer with wife Esther age 20 and daughter Mary 2 at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1851 age 42 ag.lab born Bradmore with wife Esther age 34 born Swithland Leics, children Esther 6 born Willoughby, William 3 born Newtown Linford and Rebecca 3 mths born Woodhouse, at Brand Road, Woodhouse Leics. 1861 age 50 dairy man with wife Esther age 40 dairy woman and children William 13, Rebecca 10, scholars, Edward 8 and Isaac 5 scholars born Mountsorrell, at Brook Banks, Syston. 1871 age 60 shepherd with wife Esther age 53 and children Edward 18 miller, Annie R 19 dressmaker born Swithland, at Main St. cottage, Mounsorrell. Edward died Oct.qtr. 1888, Barrow on Soar district.

John Vose bapt. Bunny 19.2.1775, son of Samuel and Mary of Bradmore. 1783 and 1784, Constable paid John Vose for catching sparrows, together with William Vose (unidentified), also in 1785, 1786 and 1788, and a hedgehog in 1788. Signed Constables accounts 1795-1815. Probably the John Voce farmer of Bradmore, 25.11.1797 put up bond for marriage of William Nixon, 21, farmer of Bradmore, and Elizabeth Voce of Bunny/(Bradmore) age 21. Elizabeth described as of Bunny on

bond, but as of Bradmore in marriage register, 27.11.1797. No further information on Elizabeth, presumed died before Sept.1800. John Voce farmed Yorke Farm after Samuel, 1797-8 paid land tax 13/6½d p.qtr. on land taken over from Samuel Voce, then Mary Voce continued and paid at the same rate until 1804, when it transferred to John Voce, farmer of Bradmore, but at a higher rate, £1/3/8½d p.qtr. from 1805, apparently incorporating half John Harwood's land. Marriage bond dated 13.9.1800, age 21, bachelor, farmer, of Bradmore, to marry Mary Belshaw of Keyworth age 21 spinster, at Keyworth, bond by John Voce and John Savidge of Bunny, farmer. Marriage took place 16.9.1800 at Keyworth. Served as Constable 1804, 1813. 1808/9 rented lanes for £1/1/-. Signed Constable's accounts 1820-1827, served as Constable 1826/7. Described in 1827 land tax schedule as farmer. 1829 land passed to Samuel Voce. Buried Bunny 16.5.1829 age 55. Will dated 5.4.1829 proved 18.2.1830. Inventory 10.11.1829 £235/5/9, refers to property of William Voce his son. Renunciation 10.10.1829. Bond 10.11.1829. Administration of estate by Samuel, Elizabeth spinster, John and Mary spinster the natural children and next of kin of John. All to continue as at date of will until his son William Voce reached 21, he being then about 20. The effects then to be valued, and the eldest son Samuel to have £150, and the residue to be shared among the children Samuel, Elizabeth, John, Mary and William equally. If any died, their share to go to the rest equally excluding Samuel. His aged mother Mary Voce to have a home with and be properly provided for by Samuel as long as she should live, and also daughters Elizabeth and Mary to reside with and be provided for as long as they remained single. Executors Mr William Nixon senior of E Leake, and Mr William Holmes of Willoughby, farmer. Witnessed by William Attenborough and Clement Rogers, 5.4.1829. (William Nixon senior, executor, may be brother in law of John, husband of Elizabeth nee Voce daughter of Samuel and Mary, in 1851 a widower with son William junior born 1801, farming at Gotham Lane End.)

Mary Voce nee Belshaw of Keyworth married John Voce, 13.9.1800. Buried Bunny 19.1.1809.

Samuel Voce born 8.4.1801 Bradmore, bapt. Bunny 10.4.1801, son of John and Mary. Signed Constable's accounts 1826, 1829-30, 1832, and served as Constable 1833-6. Samuel Voce of Bradmore married Martha Marshall of Bunny 27.12.1832, witnessed by Elizabeth and John Voce. Paid land tax £1/3/8½d p.qtr. from 1830 after the death of his father, to end of record in 1832. Farmed at Yorke Farm. Probably the Samuel Voce in Whites Directory 1832 in joint entry with Isaac as farmers. 1835 Sam Voce, farmer, Overseer of the Poor, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in the original deeds. Buried Bunny 25.9.1838 age 37. Samuel Voce, farmer, Admin 3.6.1839. Bond 16.3.1839 for £900, by Martha Voce, widow, John ? of Bunny and Benjamin Hawkridge of Bunny.

Martha Voce born c1806 nee Marshall of Bunny, married Samuel Voce at Bunny 27.12.1832. 1841 age 35, householder, farmer, with children Mary, Jane and Martha and servants William Maltby and John Harwood, living at the south end of Farmer St., exact location not clear but probably south of Rancliffe Farmhouse (Bradmore 1841/82). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. Martha Voce widow of Bradmore married Thomas Holmes of Ruddington at Bunny 10.4.1849 - see Holmes.

Mary Voce bapt. Bunny 30.6.1833, daughter of Samuel, farmer, and Martha Voce of Bradmore. 1841 age 8 in mother's house (Bradmore 1841/82). 1851 age 17, single, in household of Thomas and Martha (formerly Voce) Holmes recorded as daughter in law, i.e. step-daughter, of Thomas, at Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1851/37). 1861 age 27, single, shop assistant with uncle William, Baker, and his wife Eliza on Mansfield Rd, Nottingham.

Jane Voce bapt. Bunny 11.10.1835, daughter of Samuel, farmer, and Martha Voce of Bradmore. 1841 age 5 in mother's house (Bradmore 1841/82).

Martha Voce bapt. Bunny 30.12.1838 posthumous daughter of Samuel, farmer, and Martha of Bradmore. Step-daughter of Thomas Holmes. 1841 age 2 in her mother's house (Bradmore 1841/82). 1851 age 12, as daughter in law, i.e. step-daughter, of Thomas Holmes, in Thomas and Martha's house, Yorke Farm (Bradmore 1851/37). 1861 age 22, single, in the household of step-father Thomas Holmes (Bradmore 1861/9). 20.12.1864 Martha age 26 of Bradmore, daughter of Samuel deceased, farmer, married Frederick Henry age 25 of St Mary's Nottingham, ironmonger, son of Samuel Henry deceased, draper. 1871 Martha age 32 married to Frederick age 31 general dealer born Nottingham with son Samuel 4 born Nottingham and Frederick's mother Anne Henry, widow, 63, annuitant born Mansfield, plus a servant at 7 Beastmarket Hill, Nottingham. 1881 Martha age 42 married to Frederick age 41, clays/china/ironmongery and general dealer, master employing 19?, with son Samuel 14 scholar and Frederick's mother Anne 73, widow, plus 2 servants at Beastmarket Hill, Nottingham. Martha died before the next census. 1891 Frederick age 51 widower, house furnisher, with son Samuel 24 assisting in the business plus 2 servants and a cousin at 4 Clarendon St., Nottingham.

John Voce bapt. Bunny 21.1.1805, son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Married Elizabeth Henson both of Bradmore, 5.7.1825, witnessed by George Henson. Signed Constable's accounts 1827 as the second J Voce, then in 1831 and 1835, served as Constable 1838, signed the accounts 1841 and 1845-6. 1841 age 40, farmer, married to Elizabeth, in the household of Mary Henson, the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1841/11). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. 1851 age 49, widower, son-in-law of Mary Henson, farmer of 70 acres, in Mary Henson's Crown Inn (Bradmore 1851/31). On electoral roll 1851/2-1885/6 with 66 acres land. 1853 Whites Directory, farmer. 1855 Kellys Directory, Old Crown. 1861 age 59, licensed victualler, at the Crown Inn Public house, widower, householder with daughter Lettice, son Ruben, daughter Mary A married to John Barrow and their daughter Elizabeth V Barrow, and grand-daughter Sarah Ann Voce (Bradmore 1861/6). 1864 Whites Directory, victualler, Crown Inn. Also separate entry John Voce in list of farmers. On electoral roll 1863/4-1870 in category £50+ land pa. 1867 Bunny Estate rental has two entries for John Voce, one renting public house garden orchard and land 4 acres 2 roods 5 perches in Bradmore and 14 acres 0 roods 19 perches in Bunny, at rent £42/15/8 pa; the other John Voce (farmer) renting house garden and land, 169 acres 3 roods 6 perches in Bradmore only, £287/15/3 pa. (Yorke Farm). 1869 Morris's Directory, farmer, The Crown. 1867 rented grazing on the Turnpike as John Voce Senior, and rented grazing on the Moor 1868. Possibly also the Voce renting grazing on Mill Lane 1853 and 1856, Pendock Lane 1857, Moor Lane 1858, the Turnpike 1857, and Plumtree Lane and the Turnpike 1861-3. 1871 age 60, innkeeper, widower, at the Crown Inn with children Arthur and Lettice, sister Mary Morriss, widow, and grand-daughter Elizabeth V Barrow 10 scholar (daughter of Mary Ann nee Voce and John Barrow) (Bradmore 1871/7). On electoral roll 1871-1884 in category £12+ rent pa, i.e. no longer had Yorke Farm. 1876 PO Directory, Old Crown. 1881 widower, still at the Crown, with daughter Lettice (Bradmore 1881/4). 1881 Kellys Directory, Old Crown. Died 24.7.1884 aged 84, buried 26.7.1884 at Bunny beside south churchyard path, with wife Elizabeth. Age 83 in register.

Elizabeth Voce born 1803 nee Henson, daughter of James and Mary. 1841 age 35, married to John, in her mother's house, the Crown Inn (Bradmore 1841/11). Elizabeth wife of John Voce of Bradmore died 26.9.1844 in her 42nd year, buried 1.10.1844 age 43, tombstone at SW of Bunny church, next to south path. John also buried here.

Sarah Ann Voce, born c1853, Nottingham, grand-daughter of John and Elizabeth. 1861 age 8, scholar in grandfather's house (Bradmore 1861/6).

John Voce, bapt. Bunny 18.2.1823, son of John, publican, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Died before 1830.

James Henson Voce bapt. Bunny 7.6.1826, son of John, publican, and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Edward Voce bapt. Bunny 23.11.1827, son of John, publican and Elizabeth of Bradmore. May be the Edward Voce, son of John and Elizabeth, age 10 in 1841 census, in grandmother Mary Henson's house, the Crown (Bradmore 1841/11). 1851 Edward age 24 warehouseman born Bradmore with wife Sarah 24 born Leicester and son Reuben 4 mths born Leicester, plus Edward's brother Isaac 17 working in warehouse, at 32 Field Bridge St., Leicester.

Dutton Voce of Nottingham buried Bunny 24.8.1868, infant, possibly son of William and Martha.

Alfred Voce (Alf) son of John, publican and Elizabeth of Bradmore bapt. 7.2.1843. 1851 age 7, scholar, in grandmother Mary Henson's house, the Crown (Bradmore 1851/31). 1871 age 27, single, baker, in his father's house, the Crown (Bradmore 1871/7). 8.8.1872 Alfred Voce age 29 baker of Bradmore, son of John publican, married Eliza Jackson age 25 of Bradmore daughter of William, framework knitter. 1881 age 38, householder, baker, married to Eliza, children Florence Annie and Ira, living north of the Forge on Main Rd. On electoral roll, house, no parish vote, 1909-1927/8 living on Main Rd., possibly in Forge Cottage with Florence in the latter years. Apr.qtr. 1905 Basford district married Mary Ann Hickling. 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 6 acres 1 rood 19 perches paying rent £18/11/8 pa. On electoral roll, land & tenement 1909-11, then land & tenement with no parish vote and land & house with no county vote 1912-1914. 1911 age 31, joiner in building trade, employer, with wife Mary Ann in 8-room house (Bradmore 40/1911). 1912 on chapel renovation committee. Lived at Home Farm, Main St., married to Mary Ann, 1920-1946. 1921-46 Methodist class leader; 1921-3 poor steward, 1921-47 chapel steward, 121-37 secretary to leaders meeting. 1922 on Sunday School hymn committee and contributed to gift of communion glasses and tray, with Mr Dunsheath. 1923 Bunny & Bradmore Lawn Tennis Club fete held in Mr Voce's Orchard, raised £21 net. 1923 Sunday School fruit tea held in Voces' orchard, weather permitting; 1924 and 1926 sports and garden party likewise. 1924-46 Methodist chapel trustee, as farmer of Bradmore. 1924 on Water/Cleaning Committee. 1925 donated brackets to chapel. 1925 Kellys Directory, Ira Voce, smallholder, also 1928, 1932, 1936 and 1941 editions. Mens Institute President 1926/7-1931/2, also chairman most years, and governors representative to 1933/4. 1926 representative to Methodist Circuit Meeting regarding the 4th minister. 1926 repaired parish stiles for £14/12/0. 1927 gave table to Methodist chapel, with J Attewell. Overseer of the Poor 1928-9. Parish Councillor 1928, Chairman of the parish council 1929-43, continued as parish councillor to 1946. Trustee of Bunny Charities, recorded 1934, 1939 & 1940. 1930s undertaker and smallholder at Home Farm (Morrismen booklet). Took over from John Bosworth as undertaker (Source: J Randall). 1940 chaired Overseas Missions meeting, 1942-6 representative on circuit committee. 1942-7 Sunday School treasurer. Died 14.2.1947 aged 67, buried with Annie in Bunny churchyard, north side near path from west gate. 1947 his executors passed on a donation to the Methodist church.

Mary Ann (Annie) Voce, nee Hickling, born Bunny 1880, daughter of William and Mary of Bradmore and Bunny (see Hickling). Apr.qtr. 1905 married Ira Voce. 1911 age 31 (married 5 years, no children). Mrs Ira Voce Methodist Sunday School teacher 1908-31; received expenses from Sunday School 1911-28; Mrs Voce Methodist Class Leader 1921-34. 1924 Sunday School treasurer; 1928 Sunday School Superintendent. 1923-30 paid chapel seat rent. 1921-34 Methodist class leader. 1949 on flower rota. On electoral roll for Main St. 1920-1939/40, on Loughborough Rd. 1945-1948, and at Home Farm, 31 Main St., 1949-53. 1922 Kellys Directory, Mrs Ira Voce, shopkeeper. c1950 contributed 1d p.wk. missionary money collected by Margaret Randall, who recalled Mrs Voce was usually unwell and in bed. Died 26.9.1953 aged 73, buried with Ira in Bunny churchyard on north side, near path from west gate. Extract from will of Mary Ann Voce dated 3.7.1953: 'I wish to acknowledge the kindness shown to me by Eunice Revill and her husband Robert Revill who are now living with and looking after me and if they are still with me at the date of my death I direct that my Trustee shall give them jointly an option in writing to purchase my house at Bradmore known as Home Farm together with the garden orchard and outbuildings thereto for the sum of £600...' Also left bequest to Bradmore Methodist church.

Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 5.7.1885-Dec.1886 (absent Jan.1886), 3rd class Jan.1887-Jan.1889, 2nd class Jan.1889-June 1891, 1st class 2nd part July 1891-June 1893, 1st class July 1893-10.11.1895. 1891 age 9, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/46).

Herbert Voce born c1885, Bradmore, son of Alfred and Eliza. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 21.10.1888-Dec.1889, 3rd class Jan.1890-Dec.1891, 2nd class Jan.1892-Dec.1894, 1st class Jan.1895-2.5.1901, left. 1891 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/46). 1897-8 sang in Methodist choir. 1900 Bunny & Bradmore Charities agreed to give Herbert the ingoing apprentice fee of £10 on his indentures being seen by two of the Governors. £10 fee paid to T Barlow, Nov.1900. 1901 age 16 joiner's apprentice living with parents (Bradmore 58/1901). July 1906 outgoing apprentice fee £2/10/- paid to H Voce. 1910 H Voce was treasurer of the Bradmore Church Institute. 1911 age 26 single, joiner, employee living with mother in Bradmore (Bradmore 6/1911). On electoral roll, land, no county vote, 1913-1914. Jan.qtr. 1920 Herbert Voce married May Wheatley, Nottingham district. On roll for Main Rd., Forge Cottage, no local vote, 1920- autumn 1921, then full vote 1922-1952. 1922 founder member of Bunny &

Bradmore Lawn Tennis Club. Mens Institute Committee member 1926/7-1934/5, chairman 1932/3-1933/4, committee member 1937/8. 1929 elected parochial representative on the Assessment Committee of the Basford RDC. 1938 appointed Motor Car Messenger under the ARP Scheme, with A Alexander, and responsible for Communications. Parish Councillor 1947 & 1948. 1949 council minutes note sympathetic reference to his recent illness and good wishes for his speedy recovery. Died July 1952, WI sent a letter of sympathy to Mrs H Voce.

Mary Voce bapt. Bunny 6.10.1806 daughter of John and Mary of Bradmore. Spinster when her father died 1829.

William Voce bapt. Bunny 14.1.1808 son of John and Mary of Bradmore. Died before July 1809?

William Voce bapt. 16.7.1809 son of John and Mary of Bradmore. William Voce son of John, born c1809, ref. aged 20 when John made his will in 1829. Inventory of goods and chattels and credits of William Voce, a Minor aged 20 ... years and upwards, 10.11.1829, by Samuel, Elizabeth, John and Mary, on the death of their father John - valuation of stock and crops, household furniture and debts £235/5/9. 1841 William 30 baker with wife Eliza age 30, 2 servants and 3 lodgers, on Mansfield Road, Nottingham. 1851 age 42 baker and grocer with wife Eliza age 41 and 3 servants, on Mansfield Rd, Nottingham. 1861 age 52 retired baker with wife Eliza age 51 and niece Mary Voce 27 born Bradmore, daughter of Samuel and Martha, shop assistant, plus servant, at 101 Mansfield Rd. Oct.qtr. 1866 Eliza Voce died. Jul.qtr. 1867 William Voce married Martha Seamans, widow, niece of John Eggleston farmer of Keyworth. 1871 William age 62 retired baker with wife Martha age 53 born Keyworth and servant at 65 Forest Rd., Nottingham. 1881 age 72 retired grocer and baker with wife Martha age 63 and servant at 63 Forest Rd. Nottingham. 1891 age 82 retired corn merchant with wife Martha age 73 and servant at 63 Forest Rd east, Nottingham. William Voce of 63 Forest Rd. East, Nottingham gentleman, died 21.5.1894, probate granted at Nottingham 23.6.1894 to Fred Henry, glass and china dealer, and George Smart, furniture dealer, effect £20,049/11/8, re-sworn Aug.1894 £19,833/11/8. 1901 Martha Voce widow age 83 on own means born Keyworth with sister Betsy Smyth, widow 80 on own means born Keyworth, plus servant, at 60 Forest Rd., Nottingham. Martha Voce died Jul.qtr. 1903, Nottingham district.

Elizabeth Vose daughter of Samuel and Mary mentioned in Samuel's will 1796. Probably born before 1778 as mentioned first in Sam's will.

Mary Vose bapt. Bunny 25.10.1778, daughter of Samuel and Mary of Bradmore.

Fortune Voce daughter of Samuel and Fortune, married William Henson before 1756.

Elizabeth Voce born c1751, sister-in-law (married sister?) of Mary Voce. Elizabeth Vose married William Oliver at Bunny 26.12.1771, no parishes specified. See Oliver. Died 7.2.1825, aged 74, relict of William, the same day as sister-in-law Mary, buried 10.2.1825 in one grave in Bunny churchyard., south of the chancel near the path.

Thomas Voce paid by the Constable in 1787, 1790, 1794, 1795 and 1800 for catching sparrows, and 1805 for a hedgehog (may not be all the same Thomas?).

John Voce of Bradmore married Elizabeth Blount at Wymeswold, 1799.

Mary Voce born c1750 buried Bunny 18.4.1834 age 84.

Mary Voce born c1767 buried Bunny 11.2.1838 age 71.

Edward Vose senior, farmer, signed bond for will of John Glover, 1763, and inventory of goods of Philip Glover 1771. Farmed Manor Farm. Will dated 27.6.1771, proved 15.6.1772. The will confirmed the agreement between himself and his son Edward Vose wherein for £60 he became joint partner and resigned to him half his effects. To his daughter Elizabeth he left £30 payable at the end of 6 months. To daughter Hannah Pepper £50 after 12 months. To grand-daughter Ann Witacre and grandson Edward Witacre £5 each when 21. To son John Vose £100 12 months after he died. Residue to son Edward Vose, sole executor. Witnessed by Joseph Glover and John Buttery. Bond 20.6.1772, £680, by Edward Vose farmer and Joseph Glover labourer. Buried Bunny 12.2.1772. Inventory 9.6.1771 comprising purse and apparel £10; household goods £40; horses £50; cows £50; sheep £20; corn growing £100; carriages £30; manure and all other implements of husbandry £20; old beans £20; total £340, by Joseph Glover and Henry Smith.

Elizabeth Voce of Bradmore wife of Edward buried Bunny 7.8.1766.

Martha Vose bapt. Bunny 9.9.1735, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Mary Vose, bapt. Bunny 3.1.1739, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth, no parish recorded.

Hannah Vose bapt. Bunny 10.8.1739, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Beneficiary of Edward's will 1771. Hannah Vose daughter of Edward senior, married Joseph Pepper at Bunny 27.2.1768.

Edward Voce, farmer of Bradmore. born c1739/40, son of Edward and Elizabeth. Married Mary Wylde by licence at Bunny 4.6.1767, no parishes specified. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St

Michaelmas includes 5d gathered from Edward Vose. Edward signed Constable's Accounts 1779-1813, served as Constable in 1782 and 1800. Paid land tax £1/2/2½d p.qtr. 1780-1816, then passed to William Voce. Probably the Edward Vose in 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 104 acres 23 perches paying £94/19/6 rent pa including £1/1/- for house, outbuildings garden and foldyard. 17.2.1798 put up bond for marriage of George Page of Stanton on Wolds, farmer, age 21, and Mary Voce of Bunny age 21; Mary described as of Bradmore parish in marriage register, 20.2.1798. 1808/9 rented the pool for 2/6. Buried Bunny 18.9.1831 age 92.

Mary Voce nee Wylde, married Edward at Bunny 4.6.1767.

Mary Voce, bapt. Bunny 20.12.1767 daughter of Edward and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 3.1.1770.

John Voce bapt. Bunny 25.3.1770, son of Edward and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 26.3.1771.

John Vose bapt. Bunny 16.3.1774, son of Edward and Mary of Bradmore. May be the second John Voce who signs Constables Accounts in 1801.

Elizabeth Voce of Bradmore daughter of Edward and Mary buried Bunny 21.10.1780.

Thomas Vose bapt. Bunny 20.1.1783, son of Edward and Mary of Bradmore.

Edward Vose born 24.6.1785, bapt. Bunny 4.7.1785 son of Edward and Mary. May be the Edward Voce paid by the Constable 1792 for catching sparrows.

John Vows, bapt. Bunny 24.6.1744, son of Edward and Elizabeth, no parish specified.

William Vose, bapt. Bunny 9.3.1749, son of Edward and Elizabeth, no parish specified. Buried 19.3.1749.

Elizabeth Vose, bapt. 7.5.1750, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth, no parish specified.

Mary Voce married William Holmes of Willoughby at Bunny by vicar's licence 3.2.1801.

James Voce on Bradmore electoral roll with house, 1887 only.
