George Albert Waddingham born c1872, Ludford Lincolnshire, son of Charles, farmer of 42 acres, and Sarah. 1881 age 9 in parents' house at Caistor Rd., Middle Rasen, 5 siblings. 1891 age 19 farm servant for Robert Willey, farmer of Bigby, Lincs. 3.10.1898 George Albert Waddingham age 26, porter of Nottingham, son of Charles Waddingham grocer, married Sarah Ann James daughter of William, blacksmith of Bradmore, at Bunny. 1901 age 29 railway drayman with wife Sarah A age 29 and daughter Florence H(ilda) 3 mths, at 20 Rosslyn St., Nottingham. 1911 age 39 carman for Midland Railway with wife Sarah A and children Hilda 10, Neville J 2 both born Nottingham, at 20 Rosslyn St., Nottingham 5-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll for Far St., autumn 1921-1939/40. Received Bunny Charities dole, grant in lieu of coal 1934, 1939 & 1940. Buried at Bunny 23.2.1943, age 70.

Sarah Ann Waddingham, born c1871 nee James, daughter of William James, blacksmith of Bradmore, married age 27 to George on 3.10.1898 at Bunny. 1901 age 29 married to George. 1911 age 39 (married 12 years with 2 children), with George. On electoral roll for Far St., autumn 1921-1946. Methodist church seat rent 1923-35. Mens Institute Committee member 1929/30, 1931/2-1944/5. Listed as WI member 1931-1947, noted deceased. WI wreath sent to funeral 17.3.1947.

(Florence) Hilda Waddingham born 1901 daughter of George and Sarah. 1901 age 3 mths in parents' house at Nottingham. 1911 age 10 in parents' house, Nottingham.

Neville James Waddingham born c1908 Nottingham, son of George and Sarah. 1911 age 2 in parents' house in Nottingham.

WAIT

Richard Waite and Richard Bush, husbandmen of Bradmore, gave depositions 30.11.1685 in the case vs Thomas Clifton.

Richard Wait, pauper, no parish so presumably Bunny, married Dorothy Bingham of Bradmore at Bunny 24.11.1703.

Dorothy Wait married Francis Archer of Bunny at Bunny 5.11.1709.

WAKELING

Robert Wakeling married Sarah Mariott at Nottingham St Nicholas 25.11.1798. Living in Bradmore 1799.

Mary Wakeling born Bradmore 8.3.1799, bapt. Bunny 21.3.1799, daughter of Robert and Sarah.

WAKERLEY

William Wakerley born c1839, Willoughby, son of Joseph, farmer and Mary of Willoughby on the Wolds. 1841 age 2 in parents' house, Willoughby. Not found 1851. 1861 age 22, single, carter, in the household of Joseph Nixon, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/17).

WALE

Eliza Wale nee Nixon born c1849 Bradmore, daughter of Joseph and Mary. Married Jan.qtr. 1871 Bingham district to John Henry Wale of Wymeswold, son of Elizabeth Wale, farmer of 185 acres at Potter's Ford, Wymeswold. 1871 Eliza A Wale age 22 farmer's wife married to John H Wale age 24 farmer of 185 acres employing 3 men and 2 boys, in the house of his mother Elizabeth Wale 57 widow, landowner born Woodthorpe Leics, with her niece Mary A Grundy 13, and nephew Joseph Grundy 10 scholar, both born Loughborough, children of Samuel ag.lab born Old Dalby and Ann born Woodthorpe, of Loughborough, plus a servant, at Potter's Ford, Wymeswold. 1881 Eliza A age 32 born Bradmore married to John H Wale age 34 born Wymeswold, farmer of 140 acres employing 3 men and 1 boy, with children Bernard N 8 and Nina A 7 scholars born Willoughby on the Wolds, plus 3rd cousin John E Merriman 7 scholar born Hickling and 2 servants, at Keyworth. 1891 Eliza A age 42 married to John age 44, farmer born Wymeswold, with son Bernard N 18 and Nina A 17, artist, both born Willoughby, and her mother Mary, plus 2nd cousin Charlotte E Merriman 15 draper's apprentice born Hickling Lodge, at Burton Bandalls, Burton on the Wolds. 1901 Eliza A Wale age 52, John Henry age 54 farmer employer, with children Nina A 27 born Pashire? Lodge, Willoughby, and 3 servants, at Burton Bandalls, Burton on the Wolds. 1911 Eliza Ann Wale age 63 born Bradmore with husband John Henry Wale age 64 retired farmer born Wymeswold plus 1 servant at Silia, Presteigne, Radnorshire, 9-room house (5 bedrooms). John Henry Wale of Silia, Prestiegne, Radnorshire died 17.10.1922, probate granted at Hereford 12.12.1922 to Bernard Nixon Wale farmer and Nina Annie Pullman wife of Thomas Dalby Pullman, effects £15878/2/6.

Nina Annie Wale born 1874 Willoughby, daughter of John Henry and Eliza Wale, 1881 age 7 in parents' house. 1891 age 17 in parents' house. 1901 age 27 in parents' house. Jul.qtr. 1902 married

Thomas Dobly Pullman son of Frederick, draper and Catherine of Jasmine Cottage, 12 Castle St., Sneinton. 1911 age 37 (married 8 years with 2 children), with husband Thomas Dolby Pullman age 44 insurance agent, employer born Nottingham and children Phyllis Wale Pullman 7 and Bernard Wale Pullman 2 both born Presteigne plus servant and a visitor, 12-room house at Presteigne (near her parents). Thomas Dobly Pullman of Silverwood, 140 Rosemary Hill Road, Sutton Coldfield died 15.2.1946 at The Home For Incurables, Leamington, probate at Nottingham 23.8.1946 to Nina Annie, widow, effects £1358/8/-

WALKER

John Walker married to Anne, living in Bradmore 1640s/1650s. 1641 took Protestation Oath supporting true Protestant Religion.

Alice Walker bapt. 9.12.1641, daughter of John and Anne of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Walker bapt. 22.12.1650, daughter of John and Anne of Bradmore.

John Walker bapt. 12.12.1654, son of John and Anne of Bradmore.

Thomas Walker bapt. at Bunny 25.10.1658, son of John and Anne.

John Walker bapt. Bunny 7.5.1655, son of Henry and wife of Bradmore.

Jean or **Joan** Walker bapt. at Bunny 28.1.1659, daughter of Henry.

George Walker married to Mary, living in Bradmore from 1650s. 1674 Hearth Tax Return with one hearth. Possibly George buried 4.5.1712.

Mary Walker married to George before 1658, possibly Mary Walker of Bradmore referred to in the will of Elizabeth Barnard of Bradmore, 1661.

George Walker bapt. at Bunny 2.6.1658 son of George and Mary.

Mary Walker, bapt. 10.9.1665, daughter of George of Bradmore and his wife, unnamed.

Elizabeth Walker married Robert Redferne, both of Bradmore, at Bunny 28.11.1670.

John Walker married to Dorothy, living in Bradmore in 1670s/1680s

Ann Walker bapt. Bunny 10.2.1678, daughter of John and Dorothy of Bradmore.

Mary Walker bapt. Bunny 13.8.1679, daughter of John and Dorothy of Bradmore.

Thomas Walker bapt. Bunny 31.7.1681, son of John and Dorothy of Bradmore.

John Walker married Elizabeth Brendern both of Bradmore at Bunny 28.4.1684.

Elizabeth Walker bapt. Bunny 13.5.1685, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Jane Walker bapt. at Bunny 6.3.1687, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Anne Walker married William Marshall of Bunny at Bunny 7.5.1687.

Mary Walker married Hugh Alsop 26.6.1706, Bradmore.

Mary Walker bapt. Bunny 24.7.1690, daughter of George and Alice of Bradmore.

Mary? Walker bapt. Bunny 14.1.1692, daughter of Georg Walker of Bradmore.

Gyles Walker bapt. at Bunny 28.4.1695, son of Georg Walker of Bradmore. Married Dorothy Henson at Bunny 23.4.1726. May be the Giles Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny 27.9.1765.

Dorothy Walker, no parish specified, buried Bunny 7.10.1762, probably the Dorothy nee Henson who married Gyles at Bunny 23.4.1726.

Dorothy Walker bapt. Bunny 16.10.1732, daughter of Giles and Dorothy of Bradmore.

Richard Walker bapt. Bunny 20.7.1735, son of Giles and Dorothy of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 7.5.1736.

Richard Walker married Diana Walker at Edwalton on 1 or 5.2.1664/5 (IGI). Possibly the Richard Walker on 1674 Hearth Tax Return with 1 hearth. Churchwardens Gervase Nixon and Richard Walker vs Thomas Clifton of Bradmore, farmer, libel regarding events up to June 1685.

Richard Walker bapt. 10.6.1666, son of Richard and Diana of Bradmore.

John Walker of Bradmore bapt. 10.6.1666 Bunny, son of Richard Walker weaver of Ruddington and Dinah Walker of Bradmore. 28.7.1689 John married Mary Wallis at Costock.

Mary Walker bapt. 2.1.1665, Costock, nee Wallis, married John at Costock 28.7.1689.

John Walker bapt. Bunny 1.5.1690, son of John Walker of Bradmore.

Mary Walker daughter of John Walker of Bradmore bapt. between 17 June and 25 September 1691, no date given in register.

Robert Walker bapt. Bunny 30.10.1692, son of John Walker of Bradmore.

Dinah Walker bapt. Bunny 25.2.1694, daughter of John Walker of Bradmore.

John Walker bapt. Bunny 24.6.1697, son of John Walker of Bradmore.

Katherine Walker bapt. Bunny 11.10.1697, daughter of John Walker of Bradmore.

Richard Walker bapt. at Bunny 11.2.1701, son of John and Mary. 30.3.1725 married at Ruddington to Rebeckah Street. Carried out inventory of goods of Hugh Alsop 1730, with John Walker. Probably at Manor Farm. Died 13.8.1776 age 75, buried Bunny 16.8.1776, recorded in the register as Richard Walker senior.

Rebecca Walker, born c1702 nee Street, bapt. 25.3.1702. Sister of Mary Gunn, beneficiary of Mary's will of 3.1.1749 proved 21.1.1757. Married Richard 30.3.1725 at Ruddington. 1780 paid land tax £1/-/4 p.qtr. as Widow Walker, to 1785. Lands passed to John Harwood. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas includes 7d gathered from Widow Walker. Died 6.9.1785 age 83 (in her 84th year). Buried Bunny 9.9.1785. As widow of Bradmore, will dated 13.11.1780, proved 23.12.1785. Her son Richard Walker, farmer, and grandson John Harwood joint executors, Richard to be the sole administrator until John Harwood is 21, to manage and improve his fortune. To daughter Elizabeth Goodacre wife of William Goodacre of Wymeswold, miller, £30. To her grandson and grand-daughter, their children, John Goodacre £5, Kathryn Goodacre £5. To Samuel Goodacre £5, to Rebecca Goodacre £5, to Ann Goodacre £5, to Elizabeth Goodacre £5, to Thomas Goodacre £5, to Mary Goodacre £5. To her grand-daughter Ann Dalby daughter of William Dalby of Bradmore miller by Rebecca his late wife, £10. To grandson and grand-daughter, children of Richard and Mary? Walker of Bradmore, to Mary Walker £5, to Elizabeth Walker £5, to Richard Walker £5, to Rebecca Walker £5, to John Walker £5. Inventory 21.10.1785, total £145 comprising: purse and apparel £5; in the house £3; in the parlour £2; in the kitchen £1; in the fires - chamber over the house and parlour £5; in the ? chamber £1; 3 horses £18; 5 cows £15; sheep £15; swine £2; white corn in the barn unthrashed £40; pease unthrashed £15; hay £15; grain growing on the ground £10; implements of husbandry £3. By James and Thomas Henson. Not clear whether this is Manor Farm, or Hill Farm which was inherited by John Harwood.

Mary Walker daughter of Richard and Rebecca of Bradmore buried 3.11.1732.

Mary Walker bapt. 25.2.1735 Bunny, daughter of Richard and Rebecca, married by licence 21.6.1764 at Bunny to John Harwood of Ruddington. See Harwood. John was executor of Mary's aunt Mary Gunn's will, and their son John Harwood was joint executor of Rebecca's will 1780.

Elizabeth Walker daughter of Richard and Rebecca, mentioned in aunt Mary Gunn's will 1749. Married William Goodacre of Wymeswold, miller, at Bunny 17.11.1755 (no parishes specified in register) and had children, John, Kathryn, Samuel, Rebecca, Ann, Elizabeth (bapt 1.6.1760, Bunny?), Thomas, Mary.

Richard Walker, bapt. Bunny 16.2.1737, son of Richard and Rebecca. Farmer, married Mary Hebb of Ruddington by vicar's licence at Ruddington 8.11.1764, witnessed by Richard Barker and William Street. Paid £1/19/11 p.qtr. land tax, recorded 1780-1786, paid thereafter by Mrs Walker. Farmed at Manor Farm. Signed Constables Accounts 1779-1786, served as Constable 1781. 1785 he and Samuel Voce received payment from the Constable when they took Joseph Stevenson to the infirmary. Died 7.5.1787 age 50, buried Bunny churchyard south of church tower, 10.5.1787. Will dated 14.4.1787, proved 3.3.1788. Wife Mary Walker and friends William Willows of Hoby, farmer, Matthew Wylde of Little Leake, farmer and John Win of Ruddington, farmer, to manage £1000 in trust to put into Real Government or other good security, until his son Richard is 21. A further sum of £1000 in trust for his son John until 21. If either son died before 21, their share to be divided equally between the survivors of his 4 children. A further £1000 in trust for his 2 daughters Elizabeth the eldest and Rebecca to have half each, and if either daughter died before 21 then 1/5th of her share to go to the other daughter and 2/5ths each to his sons. The goods and chattels to the trustees to manage the farms and support wife and children on the farm at Bradmore. When the eldest son was 21 he was to be tenant of the farm if the landlord consented, and to receive household goods, implements, cattle and stock as the trustees thought proper to the value of £600, and to be charged with the maintenance, education, clothing and bringing up of the younger children until 21 or married, and the maintenance of Mary his wife in the proper manner in the farmhouse. If his wife left the farm, the 2 sons were to pay £25 each to her annually for her life in half-yearly payments. His daughter Elizabeth died within days of Richard, 14.5.1787.

Mary Walker nee Hebb of Ruddington, married Richard at Ruddington 8.11.1764. As widow of Richard, paid £1/19/11 p.qtr. land tax 1787-1804, when it passed to Richard Walker. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 183 acres 1 rood 17 perches paying £172/9/11 rent pa including £2 for house outbuildings garden and foldyard, Manor Farm. Lands stretched to west of village as far as Peets Wife's Nook, and east of Barn Close on Mill Lane and towards Flawforth. Possibly the Mary Walker buried Bunny 9.3.1823 age 65, so born c1748 and married at 16.

Richard Walker bapt. Bunny 2.1.1766, of Bradmore son of Richard and Mary, buried Bunny 5.1.1766.

Matthew Walker bapt. Bunny 8.3.1769, of Bradmore son of Richard and Mary, died 6.3.1777 age 7, buried Bunny 13.3.1777.

Mary Walker bapt. Bunny 7.6.1771, daughter of Richard and Mary of Bradmore, died 30.4.1786 age 14, buried 3.5.1786.

Elizabeth Walker bapt. Bunny 5.9.1773, daughter of Richard and Mary of Bradmore, died after

Richard, 14.5.1787 in her 14th year, buried with Richard in Bunny churchyard south of church tower, 18.5.1787.

Richard Walker bapt. Bunny 4.9.1775, son of Richard and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the Richard Walker who received payment from the Constable in 1783-1789 for catching sparrows. Signed Constable's Accounts 1793-1815, served as Constable 1799. Married Ann Stokes at Bradmore 1.12.1801. Richard Walker took over the land tax of Manor Farm from widow Mary Walker in 1805 and in 1816 absorbed lands of Mr Boulby (formerly the Browns' holding). In 1827 described as farmer and in 1828 increased land tax from £4/5/4 to £7/7/4½d, taking over land from John Lane Senior (Rufford) and part of John Lane Junior's land (Rancliffe). Paid land tax to end of record in 1832. Bought yarn from the Constable 1819/20, 1 dozen at 1/8, and rented the grazing in Plumtree Lane 1815 for 16/-, and Pendock Lane for 7/-. 1814 rented the manor pond in Voce's for 11 (shillings or pence). Served as Constable 1820 and 1829/30, signed Constable's accounts 1821, 1823, 1826, 1828. May be the Richard Walker who witnessed the will of Thomas Roobotham 1828. Died 1.4.1834 age 58; buried Bunny 23.4.1834 age recorded as in 60th year.

Ann Walker born c1777 nee Stokes, married Richard Walker 1.12.1801, Bradmore. Buried 23.7.1829 age 52.

Mary Ann Walker bapt. Bunny 1.1.1803, daughter of Richard and Ann of Bradmore, died before Nov.1803.

Mary Ann Walker bapt. Bunny 17.11.1803, daughter of Richard and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 17.11.1828 age 24.

Richard Walker bapt. Bunny 1.2.1807, son of Richard and Ann of Bradmore. 1832 Whites Directory, farmer. 1835 listed as farmer and trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in original deeds. 1837 married Mary Ann Hind of Ratby. On electoral roll 1838/9 with 386 acres, 1840-1849/50 with 350 acres. Probably the Richard Walker signing the Constable's accounts 1835 and 1836, 1840-1, 1843, 1845-8. 1839 Constable paid Mr Walker 23 weeks at 1/- p.wk. for Welsh's boy. Also paid him chapel rent for meetings, 10/-, in 1838 and following years to 1948, also paying for vestry fires. 1841 age 30, farmer, householder, married to Mary with child Frances and servants June Grice, Ann Wilcox, Elizabeth Oliver, Sam Staples, Sidney Chamberlain, William Harwood and Richard Harwood, at Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1841/80). 1841/2 the Constable paid Mr Walker £1/14/- for watching (at night). 1844 Whites Directory, farmer. Continued to pay land tax at this rate up to end of the record in 1832. Family seem to have been in Bradmore up to 1849 when the Constable paid Mr Walker 10/- for Martha Elliott's rent for the year 1848/9. 1851 age 44 farmer of 430 acres employing 8 labourers with wife Mary Ann 35 born Whetstone? Leics, children Frances 11, Richard 8 scholars born Bradmore, Charles W 4 born Bradmore plus a visitor and 4 servants at The Parsonage, Great Bowden Leics. 1861 age 54, widower, grazier of 500 acres with 14 men and 4 boys, son Charles William 14 and visitor and 3 servants at Rectory House, Gt Bowden. Richard Walker of Great Bowden, Leics, grazier, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in 1868 deeds. 1871 age 64 widower owner of land and grazier with son Charles William 23 farmer and grazier plus a cook and housemaid, at Glebe House, the Parsonage, Great Bowden. 1881 age 74 grazier with 2 servants at Great Bowden. Richard Walker of Great Bowden, gentleman, died 20.8.1884, will proved at the Principal Registry by Charles William Walker of Great Bowden gentleman, son and sole executor, effects £44,361/19/11.

Mary (Ann) Walker born c1821, Ratby, nee Hind, married Richard 1837. 1841 age 20, married to Richard (Bradmore 1841/80). 1851 age 35 married to Richard, at Great Bowden. Died before 1861.

Frances Walker born 13.1.1840, bapt. 13.2.1840, daughter of Richard, farmer and Mary. 1841 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1841/80). 1851 age 11 in parents' house at Great Bowden.

Richard Walker bapt. 13.3.1843 son of Richard, farmer, and Mary. 1851 age 8 in parents' house at Great Bowden.

Charles William Walker born 30.3.1847, bapt. 27.4.1847, son of Richard, farmer and Mary Ann. 1851 age 4 in parents' house at Great Bowden. 1861 age 14 in parents' house at Great Bowden. 1871 age 23 farmer and grazier in father's house at Great Bowden. c1878 married Sophia Constance Smith born 1853 Leamington, Warks, daughter of Stephen silversmith and Mary of Kidbrooke, Kent. Record of marriage not found. 1881 Charles age 34 farmer with wife Sophia C age 28 and daughter Mary 1 born Gt Bowden, plus servant, at Gt Bowden. 1891 age 44 on own means with wife Sophia Constance age 38 and children Mary C 11, Margaret 9, Richard 7 all born Gt Bowden plus a governess and 3 servants at Papillon Hall, Lubenham, Leics. 1901 age 54 on own means with wife Sophia C age 48 and children Mary C 27,

Margaret 19 plus 3 servants at Holmshurst, Burwash, Sussex. 1911 age 66 on private means with wife Sophia Constance age 58 (married 33 years with 3 children), daughter Margaret 29, visitor and 3 servants at Holmshurst, Burwash. Sophia Constance Walker died Oct.qtr. 1915, Ticehurst district. Charles William Walker of Holmshurst died 13.7.1919, probate 7.10.1919 to Marian Buck, widow, (Charles's niece, daughter of William Henry Walker) and Claude Seabroke, solicitor, effects £64,680/13/9.

John Stokes Walker, bapt. Bunny 10.10.1808, son of Richard and Ann of Bradmore, died 31.1.1813 age 5.

Charles Walker bapt. Bunny 15.8.1810, son of Richard and Ann of Bradmore.

Thomas Walker bapt. Bunny 4.10.1812, son of Richard and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 31.10.1825 age 13.

John Stokes Walker bapt. Bunny 30.9.1814, son of Richard, farmer, and Ann. Died 21.12.1832 age 18, buried 27.12.1832, Bunny.

William Henry Walker born 23.3.1817, son of Richard and Ann, died 24.11.1817.

Henry Walker bapt. Bunny 31.3.1817, son of Richard, farmer, and Ann.

William Henry Walker bapt. 1.12.1818, son of Richard, farmer, and Ann of Bradmore. 1846 Oct.qtr., Leicester, William Henry Walker married Anne Jane Brewin, born 10.2.1818, daughter of Robert, worsted spinner, and Hannah of Ibstock (daughter of Thomas and Clara Paget). 1861 age 43 manufacturer born Bradmore, married, wife not present, children Ed. N Walker 7 scholar born Leicester, Hannah M 5 scholar born Liverpool, visiting Clara Paget, single, 72, gentlewoman born Ibstock, Anne J's maternal grandmother, with 4 servants, on principal Street, Ibstock. Also 1861, William's wife Anne J Walker age 43 and daughter Marian 10 scholar visiting Anne's married sister Elizabeth Worthington 49, married to Robert 56 registrar in County Court, and their children Charles J 17 commercial clerk born Altringham, Francis 12 born Leicester, Godfrey 12 born Ashton, Arthur M 8 and Ann C 7 born Crumpsall, scholars, plus servants, at 7 Hyde Rd., Ardwick, Manchester. 1871 William H Walker age 53 manufacturer of boots and hosiery with wife Ann J age 53 born Leicester and children Edward 17 clerk in counting house, Hannah 15 scholar, plus 2 visitors from France and visitor Elizabeth Worthington widow 59 of independent means born Leicester (Anne's sister), Frank Worthington 22 no occupation single, and Anne C Worthington 17 single both born Crumpsall Hall Manchester, plus 3 servants at Rose Cottage, No.1 Church St., Birstall, Leics. 1881 age 62 retired manufacturer with wife Anne J age 63 and daughter Marian Buck, married, 30, born Birstall and her husband William E Buck 32 physician born Birstall, niece Anne C Worthington 27 annuitant and nephew Charles Worthington 37 widower retired stockraiser born Sale Cheshire, great-niece Mary Worthington 4, great-nephews Robert E 2, and Frank less than 10 mths all born Colorado, USA, plus 2 visitors and 4 servants at The Holt, Birstall, Leics. 1901 age 82 retired boot manufacturer with wife Ann J age 83 born Leicester St Margaret, with daughter Marian Buck widow 50 on own means and Hannah M Hollins, married, 45, with her daughter Dorothy Hollins 19 both born Lancashire, and Ann J's brother Robert Brewin widower, 74, on own means born Leicester St Margaret, plus visitor, 4 servants and 2 nurses, at The Holt, Birstall. William Henry Walker of Birstall-holt, Birstall, gentleman, died 18.1.1905, probate Leicester 1.3.1905 to Thomas Fielding Johnson the younger, manufacturer, and Theodore Burgess Ellis merchant, effects £114,844/16/7.

Thomas Walker born 29.9.1819, son of Richard and Ann, died 12.11.1825.

Rebecca Walker bapt. Bunny 20.2.1778, daughter of Richard and Mary of Bradmore. Rebecca Walker married Thomas Cooper Angrave of East Leake by vicar's licence at Bunny 19.1.1801. See Angrave.

John Walker son of Richard and Mary, younger than their son Richard born 1775 and under 21 at the date of Richard senior's will 1787. May be the John Walker paid by Constable 1790 and 1794 for catching sparrows. Possibly the John Walker who signed Constables Accounts 1798-1801 and 1804/5 John Walker of Burrowash, Derbys., farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church 1835 in original deeds.

Ann Walker, bapt. 25.1.1741, daughter of Richard and Rebecca, no parish specified.

Rebecca Walker, bapt. Bunny 22.5.1743, youngest daughter of Richard and Rebecca, mentioned in aunt Mary Gunn's will 1749. Married at Bunny 10.1.1764 to William Dolby, no parishes specified, but elsewhere referred to as of Bradmore known as William Dalby junior. Died 22.4.1769 age 26, buried Bunny 26.4.1769. See Dalby.

Dina Walker daughter of Richard and Rebecca, mentioned in the will of her aunt Mary Gunn, 3.1.1749. Dinah Walker daughter of Richard and Rebecca, no parish specified, bapt. Bunny 13.3.1750 may be this Dinah bapt. late, or a second Dinah after the death of the first.

John Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny 12.2.1812.

John Walker of Bradmore married Mary ? of East Leake at East Leake 10.11.1715.

Henry Walker bapt. Bunny 27.4.1718, son of John and ?Margaret of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 28.11.1718 age 6 mths.

John Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny May 1720.

Mary Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny 9.2.1735.

Alice Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny 30.1.1733.

Ann Walker born c1746-54, buried Bunny 13.12.1826 age 79 or 70.

George Walker married Mary Spencer at Bunny 11.1.1758. 1784 Common Fine commonly paid at St Michaelmas included 1½d gathered from George Walker. April 1812 Thomas Peet, Constable, paid George 14/- for the use of his mare. 1812 George Walker rented Pendock Lane for £3/5/-.

Mary Walker nee Spencer, married George at Bunny 11.1.1758.

Elizabeth Walker, bapt. Bunny 20.3.1758, daughter of George and Mary, no parish specified.

William Walker, bapt. Bunny 4.2.1760, son of George and Mary, no parish specified.

Sarah Walker bapt. Bunny 9.11.1761, daughter of George and Mary of Bradmore, no parish specified, buried Bunny 5.5.1797.

Mary Walker bapt. Bunny 28.1.1764, daughter of George and Mary of Bradmore (no parish specified), buried Bunny 5.9.1787.

Dorothy Walker bapt. Bunny 25.8.1766, daughter of George and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 20.2.1768.

John Walker bapt. Bunny 5.8.1768, son of George and Mary of Bradmore, buried Bunny 12.2.1770.

Jane Walker bapt. Bunny Oct.1770, daughter of George and Mary of Bradmore.

George Walker bapt. Bunny 18.12.1772, son of George and Mary of Bradmore. Possibly the George Walker who was paid by the Constable in 1782, 1783 and 1785 for catching sparrows, 1801 for a hedgehog. Probably married (1) Ann, on the basis of 1792 baptism entry for George, cottager, who would be recorded in the 1792 estate survey. In 1792 Bunny Estate Survey with 11 acres 3 roods 35 perches paying £10/13/- rent pa including 15/- for house and garden. On corner of Main St. and Farmer St. opposite Rufford. George Walker, framework knitter, married (2) Elizabeth Baldock of Wysall at Wysall 10.6.1799. George Walker of Bradmore buried Bunny 31.1.1811.

Sarah Walker born Bradmore 14.5.1792, bapt. 18.5.1792, daughter of George, cottager, and Ann.

Elizabeth Walker nee Baldock of Wysall, born c1771. Married George at Wysall 10.6.1799. Note Mary Baldock of Wysall married William Voce 1797, and John Baldock married Elizabeth Lane 1806, later as farmer of Wysall, trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church, probably related. Elizabeth buried at Bunny 20.2.1825 age 54.

John Walker born Bradmore 30.4.1800, bapt. Bunny 1.5.1800, son of George, framework knitter, and Elizabeth. 1851 age 50 born Bradmore, widower, groom for Timothy Chouler banker's clerk, at Smith's Bank, South Parade, Nottingham.

Mary Walker bapt. Bunny 20.2.1803, daughter of George and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Walker bapt. Bunny 27.10?/11.1804, daughter of George and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

George Walker bapt. Bunny 3.4.1806, son of George and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Possibly the George paid by the Constable 1/6 for 3 dozen sparrows, Nov.1826. George Walker, cottager, married to Catherine, living in Bradmore 1830s. Signed Constable's accounts 1830/1. Sept.1831 was paid for taking a poor family to Nottingham. G Walker 1832 in Whites Directory as shopkeeper. Buried Bunny 19.10.1836 age 29.

Catherine Walker, married to George, no information other than baptism records of children.

Mary Walker bapt. 3.2.1832, daughter of George, cottager, and Catherine of Bradmore. Possibly Mary Walker in 1851 age 25 born Bradmore, house servant for Stephen Dummer age 30 tea and coffee dealer at 95 High Holborn, Middlesex. Possibly married Valentine Bosworth in 1850s - see Bosworth.

George Walker bapt. 28.9.1833, son of George, cottager, and Catherine of Bradmore, buried Bunny 24.11.1833, infant.

Elizabeth Walker bapt. Bunny 16.11.1835, daughter of George, cottager and Catherine of Bradmore, buried Bunny 22.1.1836, infant.

George Walker bapt. 15.4.1837, (born 12 March?) posthumous son of George, cottager and Catherine. 1851 age 15, single, farm labourer in the household of Joseph and Mary Nixon, Yorke Farm or Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1851/57).

Ann Walker bapt. Bunny 1.9.1807 daughter of George and Elizabeth of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 23.4.1826 age 18.

Jane Walker bapt. Bunny 1.8.1809, daughter of George and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Giles Walker bapt. 5.2.1775, son of George and Mary of Bradmore. Received payment from the

Constable in 1784 and 1789 for catching sparrows, and 1786 for a hedgehog. Oct.qtr. 1798 Giles Walker married Elizabeth Richardson, Basford district. Giles Walker died Oct.qtr. 1840, Nottingham. **Sarah** Walker bapt. Bunny 21.11.1770, daughter of John and Ann of Bradmore, may be the Sarah buried Bunny 30.10.1782.

Mary Walker of Bradmore buried 3.9.1782.

Sarah Walker in Constable's accounts at Nov.1800, received weekly payments.

Richard Walker of Bradmore born c1739, died 5.3.1823 age 84, buried Bunny churchyard near west tower.

Samuel Walker born c1839 Bradmore. 1851 age 12 in the household of John Henson farmer of 15 acres living at Bunny.

William Walker, born c1816, son of Thomas Walker, ag.lab., of Willoughby on the Wolds, and Elizabeth. 1841 age 25 ag.lab in parents' house, Thomas Walker 65 cottager and wife Elizabeth 65, with sister Elizabeth 25, at Willoughby on the Wolds. Oct.qtr. 1842 Basford district William Walker married Mary Henson. 1851 age 34, farmer of 67 acres with wife Mary and children Mary 7, Thomas and Betsey 4 mths both born Burton on the Wolds, plus William's father Thomas 77 widower born Willoughby, at Burton. 1861 age 44 farmer of 60 acres with wife Mary, Thomas, Hannah 7, William 4 scholars born Burton, Maria, plus farm servant at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1871 age 54 farmer of 57 acres with wife Mary and children Thomas, William 14, Maria, scholars at Wymeswold Common. 1881 age 64 farmer of 107 acres with 2 labourers and 1 boy, with wife Mary, children Thomas and Maria, on Station Road, Sutton Bonington St Michael. 1888 Kellys Directory farmer, joint entry with Thomas, and similarly in Whites Directory for the same year. Bradmore electoral roll land and tenement jointly with Thomas, 1886-1891. 1891 William age 74 farmer born Willoughby with wife Mary in married daughter Maria's house, householder her husband Henry Lester, with their children, at Twyford, Leicester. Died 5.9.1892 aged 76, buried Bunny 8.9.1892, beside path from west gate. Tombstone: William Walker of Bradmore who fell asleep in Jesus 5.9.1892 aged 76 years. 'Thou shalt come to thy grave in a full age like as a shock of corn cometh in his season.' Job v.xxvi, 'The memory of the just is blessed'. Wife Mary commemorated on the same stone – see below.

Mary Walker of Ruddington and Bradmore, born c1818, nee Henson, married William Oct.qtr. 1842, Basford district. 1851 age 34 married to William. 1861 age 44 married to William. 1871 age 54 married to William. 1881 age 64 married to William. 1891 age 74 in married daughter Maria Lester's house, Twyford Leics. Mrs Walker senior made donation to Sunday School 1899. Died 20.2.1900 aged 82, buried Bunny 24.2.1900, with William beside path from west gate, stone inscribed: 'Also of Mary, wife of the above, who fell asleep in Jesus 20.2.1900 aged 82 years.'

Thomas Walker, born at Sixhills, Burton on the Wolds; bapt. 29.11.1848 at Old Dalby, son of William and Mary nee Henson. 1851 age 2 in parents' house at Burton. Went to Sunday School at Wymeswold. 1861 age 12 scholar in parents' house at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1871 age 22 in parents' house at Wymeswold Common. Moved with parents to Sutton Bonnington, and when he married the whole family moved to Bradmore. 1881 age 33 in parents' house at Sutton Bonnington. Apr.qtr. 1881 Loughborough district, Thomas Walker married Lucy Burrows. 1881 signed Constable's accounts, and was present at 1899 meeting. Served as Governor and Overseer at the 1903 meeting. 1885 and 1893-1908 Methodist Sunday School Superintendent, Treasurer 1887-1908, Secretary 1886 onwards, teacher 1885-1892, Jan.1894-June 1905. 1885/6 Whites Directory, farmer. 1886 Sunday School Accounts noted at 1.1.1887 balance due to Thomas Walker late Secretary £3/9/10½. Signed sales of books at July 1885/6 and 1887. 1887 chapel steward, 1888 Methodist trustee to 1921, 1902 treasurer of Building Fund, 1904 on Building Committee. 1887 rented grazing in Plumtree Lane, to 1902, and in 1904 and 1907. Also rented grazing in Pendock Lane 1890, 1905-6, and on the Ramper in 1897. 1888 Kellys Directory, farmer, joint entry with William, also similarly in Whites Directory for the same year. Methodist Sunday School teacher 1887-95 and possibly beyond. 1891 age 42, householder, farmer at Debdale and local preacher, married to Lucy, with children Annie, Thomas and Lucy and servant Alfred Hopkinson (Bradmore 1891/49). 1892/3 on Sunday School rules committee, 1894-21 member of leaders meeting, 1895-1909 choir committee secretary. Governor of Bunny Charities 1893 onwards (recorded to 1906 when minute book ends). 1894 Whites Directory, farmer and surveyor of highways. First chairman of parish council 1895-1909, continued to serve as parish councillor until 1920/1. 1895 Kellys Directory, farmer. 1896 chapel secretary, treasurer, 1897 secretary of leaders meeting, representative to Keyworth & District Free Church Council, 1898 on 20th Century Fund Committee, junior society steward, 1900-1921 society steward. 1898 contributed £1 towards the Bunny Clock Fund, memorial of 60th year of Queen Victoria's reign, and also collected £1/2/9 in Bradmore village towards the same fund. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with farmhouse and land 200 acres 2 rods 30 perches paying rent £225 pa, and on 1908 Bunny Estate rental with 200 acres 2 roods 30 perches paying £225 pa rent, with second entry for cottages, £4 pa.

1901 age 50, head of household, farmer, employer with wife Lucy and children Annie M, Thomas W and Lucy E, on Loughborough Turnpike (Bradmore 47/1901). Overseer of poor 1901-1917. 1903 listed as farmer and trustee in Bradmore Methodist Church deeds. Electoral roll, land and tenement, jointly with William 1886-1891, in his own right 1892-1914, at Debdale Farm 1920. Referred to by J P Smeeton as the Father of Bradmore Wesleyanism, inspirer of the new Sunday School, parish councillor, local preacher, guide, philosopher and friend to many a poor troubled village person. 1904 Kellys Directory, farmer, and in 1912 edition. Trustee of Bunny & Bradmore Clothing Club 1906-1914. 1911 age 61, farmer with wife Lucy and children Thomas, William and Lucy Elisabeth and grandson Norman Walker, in 11-room house, Loughborough Road (Bradmore 3/1911). 1911 reference in valuation of Old Crown, 111 Loughborough Rd., as the outgoing tenant when W Randall and G Armstrong took tenancy. Died 21.1.1921 age 72. Buried at Bunny 26.1.1921, beside path from west gate. Tombstone: In loving memory of Thomas Walker (of Bradmore) who was called home Jan 21st 1921, 'Until day break', aged 72 years, Also Lucy wife of the above died 11.7.1938 aged 90 years, 'At rest'. Grandfather of Bagguleys. Member of Basford Board of Guardians. Prominent member of Bradmore Wesleyan Chapel, Sunday School and Band of Hope. Wesleyan class leader and local preacher on the Arkwright Street Circuit. At one time rate collector for combined parishes of Bunny and Bradmore. Wanted to be a lawyer, but it didn't work out. Did the accounts for Cordeux at Bunny Hall (Source: M Bagguley).

Lucy Walker, born c1851, Sutton Bonnington nee Burrow(e)s daughter of Thomas master wheelwright and Ann. 1851 age 3 in parents' house at Sutton Bonnington St Michaels. 1861 age 13 in parents' house, Church Lane Sutton Bonnington St Anns. 1871 Lucy age 23 born Sutton Bonnington housemaid for Frances Paget, annuitant born Warwick, (widow of William Paget farmer of 620 acres at Sutton Bonnington in 1861) at 2 Eversfield Place, Hastings. Apr qtr 1881 Loughborough district Lucy Burrows married Thomas Walker. 1881 census not found. 1885 on tea committee for Bradmore Village Tea. 1891 age 40, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1891/49). Mentioned in Sunday School expenses records 1893-1915, 1920-1. 1895 conducted the children for the Sunday School anniversary. 1896 attended church renovation fund meeting. 1901 age 47 married to Thomas (Bradmore 47/1901). 1911 age 58 (married 30 years, with 3 children) with Thomas. 1922 Kellys Directory, farmer, and in 1925 edition. On electoral roll at Debdale Farm 1920, in her own right spring 1921-spring 1926, and in her own right on Farmer St. autumn 1926-1934/5. Then on Main Rd. in her own right, 1935/6-1937/8. 1920-1934 member of Methodist leaders meeting. Paid Methodist seat rent 1923-5. Died 11.7.1938 age 90, buried 14.7.1938 at Bunny beside path from west gate. See under Thomas for text on tombstone.

Annie Mary Walker, born c1882, Sutton Bonnington, daughter of Thomas and Lucy. Bradmore Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 18.7.1886-June 1888. 3rd class July 1888-June 1889, 2nd class July 1889-June 1891, 1st class 2nd part July 1891-June 1893, 1st class July 1893-24.4.1898, returned thanks. 1891 age 9, scholar, in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/49). 1897/8 choir member. Sunday School teacher May 1898-June 1903. 1901 age 18 in parents' house (Bradmore 47/1901). Married Robert Bagguley and continued teaching to 1906. See Bagguley.

Thomas William Walker, born c1884, Sutton Bonnington, son of Thomas and Lucy. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 19.2.1888-June 1889, absent April 1888, 3rd class July 1889-June 1890, 2nd class July 1890-Dec.1891, 1st class 2nd part Jan.1892-June 1893, 1st class July 1893-4.3.1900, noted left 1901. 1891 age 7, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/49). Possibly the Will Walker, son of Thomas the local preacher, who played with J P Smeeton in 1890s/1900s. 1901 age 17 farmer's son working at home, in parents' house (Bradmore 47/1901). Married Ada, who died before 1911 census. 1911 age 27, widower, farmer, in parents' house with son Norman. On electoral roll living in furnished bedroom with use of other rooms, landlord Thomas Walker, no county vote, 1906-1910, then land and tenement 1911-1914. 1912 Kellys Directory, farmer.

Norman Walker, born 27.4.1910, Bradmore, bapt. 1.6.1910 Bradmore Methodist Church, son of Thomas William and Ada. 1911 age 1 in grandparents' house with his father (Bradmore 3/1911).

Lucy Elizabeth Walker, born 28.2.1886, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas and Lucy. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 2.3.1890-29.6.1890, 3rd class July 1890-June 1893, 2nd class July 1893-Dec.1897, 1st class Jan.1898-June 1901. 1891 age 5, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/49). 1901 age 15 in parents' house (Bradmore 47/1901). Assistant Sunday School teacher July 1901-July 1902, Oct-Dec.1902. Teacher Jan.1903-June 1905, 1907, 1908, 1910-1912, 1915 and 1917. 1911 age 25 in parents' house (Bradmore 3/1911). 1917 married John Newton Squires, the first wedding in Bradmore Methodist Church.

Maria Walker born 1859 Willoughby on the Wolds, daughter of William and Mary. 1861 age 2 in parents' house, 60 acre farm at Willoughby on the Wolds. 1871 age 12, scholar, in parents' house, farm of 57 acres, Wymeswold Common. 1881 age 22 in parents' house, farm of 107 acres, on Station

Rd., Sutton Bonnington St Michael. Apr.qtr. 1882, Loughborough district, Maria Walker married Henry Lester. See Lester.

George Walker born 1838 Bradmore. 1861 age 21 railway porter born Bradmore with wife Mary 22 born Eckington Derbyshire, children George 2, Frederick William 1 week, born Staveley, at Hague Lane, Staveley Derbyshire. 1871 George age 33 general railway porter with wife Mary 31, children George 11 scholar, Mary E 4, Frederick William 1 both born Holbeck, at 9 Clayton St, Holbeck Leeds. 1881 age 43 ginger beer cart driver with wife Mary 41 cook, children George 21 joiner born Eckington, Mary E 14, Frederick W 11, Arthur V 8, Albert C 5 scholars born Leeds, at 1 Enfield Terrace, Leeds. 1891 age 53, insurance agent, with wife Mary age 51 born Killamarsh, Derby, children Frederick William 21 book-keeper, Arthur V 18 HM postman, Albert E 15 telegraph messenger, born Holbeck, at 1 Enfield Terrace, Leeds.

William Walker born 1893, Thisleton. 1911 age 18 farm servant for Charles Fred Hutchinson at Manor Farm (Bradmore 18/1911).

WALLIS

Jane Wallis married Thomas Browne of Bunny at Bunny 2.10.1680.

WARD

Mary Ward married Harold Mapples of Bunny at Bunny 28.11.1615.

Ellen Ward married Thomas Draper of Diseworth Leics at Bunny 25.5.1641.

Mary Ward married John Benet both of Bradmore, at Bunny 30.4.1661.

WARREN

Joseph Warren of Bradmore 1674 Hearth Tax had 1 hearth, discharged by certificate. Married to Anne. Buried Bunny 25.12.1693.

Ann Warren bapt. Bunny 26.5.1675, daughter of Joseph and Anne of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Warren bapt. Bunny 3.3.1677, daughter of Joseph and Anne of Bradmore.

WATCHORNE

Edward Watchorne married Mary Aumbry both of Bradmore at Bunny 28.4.1690.

WATT?

Richard Watt? bapt. Bunny 27.4.1687, son of Richard of Bradmore.

WEAKE/WEATE

Richard Weake married Issabell Kempe of Wysall at Bunny 27.5.1673. Richard Weate on 1674 Hearth Tax list with two hearths.

WEBSTER

William W(h)ebster recorded in Constable's Accounts 2.5.1783, expenses £2/14/- when they went to Chilwill about Webster's lad. 16.3.1783, 3/- expenses when they went to Nottingham with Webster's lad. 19.6.1783 paid £1/2/- when they went to Bilper with William Webs(t)er, and 4/- charge for kiping (keeping) the lad. Possibly William son of Samuel and Jane Webster, no parish specified, bapt. Bunny 28.3.1749.

Reuben Webster of Bradmore born c1829, buried Bunny 13.4.1879 age 50.

Martha Webster born Bradmore 1825 nee Attewell, daughter of John, ag.lab, and Elizabeth, married William Webster shoemaker of Bunny at Bunny 9.4.1846. 1851 Martha age 26 married to William age 26 shoemaker born Keyworth, with children Mary Ann 4 born Costock, William 2 and Samuel 1 both born Keyworth, at Keyworth. 1861 age 36 married to William age 36 shoemaker master plus boy, with children William 12 apprentice, Samuel 11, Maria 8 scholars all born Keyworth, on Town St., Keyworth. 1871 age 46 married to William age 46 cottager with children William 23 cordwainer, Maria 14, at Keyworth. 1881 age 56 married to William age 56 cottager / farmer of 25 acres, at Keyworth. 1891 age 66 married to William age 66 farmer, on Main St., Keyworth. 1901 age 76 married to William age 76 farmer on Main St., Keyworth. Martha Webster died Apr.qtr. 1908, Bingham district. 1911 William age 86 widower, pensioner, retired dairy farmer, with daughter Mary Ann Webster 64 single housekeeper born Costock, in 4-room house on Main S., Keyworth.

WELLS

Julyan Wells of Bradmore married William Parre of Bunny at Bunny 3.6.1570.

Sarah Wells in Constables Accounts Dec.1805, had a meeting about her and paid Mrs Attenborough

(Nags Head) 4/9 for ale at that time. May 1806 paid a lawyer £13/3/8 for her and a pair of shoes 5/4, and expenses taking her to Nottingham three times, 2/3, and for keeping her 4 weeks 8/-, and expenses at her trial 8/-. Paid for a doctor for her 4/- and gave her 2/- cash.

Constance Ellen E Wells, born c1873 at Barrowby, daughter of Edwin Joseph Wells and Louisa nee Grundy, grand-daughter of Thomas and Mary Grundy. 1881 age 8, scholar, in her grandfather's house, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1881/16). Methodist Sunday School scholar 1st class 5.7.1885 and 16.8.1885-Dec.1887, left. Teacher 3rd class girls Jan.1888-Jan.1890, 1891-3, Sept-Dec.1894. 1891 age 18, single, dressmaker, in her grandfather's house, near Orchard House on Farmer St. (Bradmore 1891/38). Married 26.1.1897 aged 24, daughter of Edwin Joseph Wells shoemaker, to George Elliott, fireman cottager. See Elliott.

WELSH/WELCH

William Welsh 14.11.1829, the Constable paid 4/- for a warrant and 4/- for recognisance, and 10.5.1830 paid court fees £1/10/-. Married Hannah Harwood at Bunny 30.5.1830.

Hannah Welsh nee Harwood, possibly daughter of John and Mary, married William at Bunny 30.5.1830. 1833 the Constable paid expenses of burrowing (burying) her to Colston Basset, 15/-, and 1834 paid 1/3 per week to support her boy.

Richard Welsh, probably son of Hannah. 1837 Constable paid for a man's journey to Basford with Welsh's boy, 2/6. March 1838 paid H Harwood for Welsh's boy, 3/6 p.wk. and paid for 2 shirts for him in April. 1838 Constable paid Thomas Harwood for Welsh's boy 3/6 p.wk. May 1838 he had a new pair of boots 9/-, stockings in December 1/4, boots in March 1839 9/-, and Mr Walker had 1/- p.wk. for 23 weeks for him.

WESSON

Thomas Wesson, born c1854 Harby. John Whitaker born Bradmore 28.2.1796, bapt. Bunny 2.3.1796, son of Robert, labourer and Mary.

Married twice, both wives named Mary. 1841 age 40, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary(1), children Ann, William, Sam, Enoch and John, in part of No.24 Main St. (Bradmore 1841/42). 1851 age 56 farm labourer, married to Mary(1) with son George, widower, with his son Samuel, and other children Ann, Enoch, and Henry (Bradmore 1851/73). 1861 age 61, agricultural labourer, married to Mary(2) with daughter Emma (Bradmore 1861/50). Henry Whittaker born c1843, Gotham, son of John and Mary. 1851 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1851/73). 1871 age 37 starch maker born Bradmore with wife Eliza age 28 born Oxton and children John 2, Arthur 1 born Ilkeston and niece Anne Culley 4 scholar born Oxton, at Stapleford, Notts. 1881 age 38 labourer at starch works, with wife Eliza age 39 and children John W 12 born Ilkeston, Elizabeth 8, George 5, scholars, and Ada 9 mths all born Sandiacre plus a boarder at Church St., Sandiacre. 1891 age 47 general labourer with wife Eliza age 48 born Thoroton and children George 15 stove and grate fitter, Ada 10, Emma 8 scholars born Sandiacre and nephew Frederick 26 single carman born Ramston, Notts, on Church St., Sandiacre. 1901 age 58 railway

labourer with wife Eliza 59 born Orston, children Ada 20 lace mender, Emma 18 wire matting weaver, and grandson Ernest 1 all born Sandiacre, at Town St., Sandiacre. Oct.qtr. 1908, Nottingham district, Henry Whittaker married Harriett Clark. 1911 age 69 resigned platelayer on railway born Bradmore, with wife Harriett age 63 born Orston (married 2 years), at 32 Town St., Sandiacre, 2-room house.

Mary Whittaker, born c1818, Bradmore. Second wife of John, after first Mary died 1856. 1861 age 40, married to John, with daughter Emma (Bradmore 1861/50). 1871 census entry for Mary not found, but daughter Emma is still with John Whittaker (Bradmore 1871/52). 1881 age 63, widow, householder, with daughter Emma, continued to live in the same cottage (Bradmore 1881/47). July 1881 Widow Whittaker received the vacant weekly loaf from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1881-3 had 1/- p.wk from the Charities. Buried Bunny 6.8.1885 age 66, then of Basford Union House.

Emma Whittaker, bapt. Bunny 24.1.1860, daughter of Mary and John, labourer of Bradmore. 1861 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/50). 1871 age 11, scholar in father's house (Bradmore 1871/52). 1881 age 21, single, domestic servant in mother's house (Bradmore 1881/47).

Thomas Whittaker born Bradmore 30.7.1799, bapt. 1.8.1799, son of Robert, labourer, and Mary. Died before 1807.

Mary Whitaker born Bradmore 31.3.1801, bapt. 7.4.1801, daughter of Robert and Mary.

Elizabeth Whittaker bapt. Bunny 8.6.1804, daughter of Robert and Mary of Bradmore.

Thomas Whittaker bapt. Bunny 2.2.1807, son of Robert and Mary of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 28.8.1808.

Ann Whittaker bapt. Bunny 13.9.1809, daughter of Robert and Mary of Bradmore. Married Matthew Langham of Bunny at Bunny 18.3.1828, witnessed by Henry Langham and William Lane. See Langham.

John Whittaker born c1766, Edwalton. Married Zillah Glover of Bunny at Bunny 24.12.1798, witnessed by John Glover. Living in Bradmore by 1799. 1841 age 70, agricultural labourer, householder on Far St., with son? Thomas and wife Ann and their children John, George, William and Eustace (Bradmore 1841/60). 1851 age 85, widower, retired agricultural labourer, on parish relief, with son Thomas married to Ann, with their children George, William, Lettice, Zillah and Amos (Bradmore 1851/74). Buried Bunny 29.4.1854 age 89.

Zillah Whittaker, nee Glover of Bunny, married to John at Bunny 24.12.1798. Buried Bunny 2.8.1808.

George Whitaker born Bradmore 26.12.1799, bapt. 27.12.1799 son of John, labourer, and Zillah. Buried Bunny 10.1.1804.

Elizabeth Whittaker daughter of John and Zillah of Bradmore buried 30.3.1803.

Thomas Whittaker, bapt. Bunny 22.2.1804, son of John and Zillah of Bradmore. Thomas Whittaker married Ann Attewell, both of Bradmore, 23.11.1829, witnessed by William Whittaker. Thomas Whittaker signed Bradmore Methodist Sunday School accounts 1836, 18480-50 and 1853. 1841 age 35, frameknitter, married to Ann, with children John, George, William and Eustace in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/60). 1851 age 47, framework knitter, married to Ann, with children George, William, Lettice, Zillah and Amos in father's house (Bradmore 1851/74). 1847 had 3/- p.wk. from the Constable for lodging James Harwood. 1861 age 57, framework knitter making merino shirts, householder, married to Ann, with daughter Zillah, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1861/39). 1867 Bunny Estate rental, renting house and garden at £2/10/- pa.

Ann Whittaker born c1803, Bradmore, nee Attewell, married to Thomas. 1841 age 35, married to Thomas in his father's house (Bradmore 1841/60). 1851 age 49, married to Thomas, in his father's house (Bradmore 1851/74). 1861 age 58, married to Thomas (Bradmore 1861/39). Possibly the Widow Anne Whittaker who received blankets from Bunny & Bradmore Charities 1866, sheets in 1867, 6 cwt of coals 1868 and 8 cwt 1869. 1869/70 the Constable paid Ann's rates twice, 1/4 each time. 1871 Ann Whittaker age 70 (born c1801, Bradmore), widow, in Bunny almshouse with daughter Zillah. 1881 Ann age 78 widow with daughter Zillah in Bunny almshouses. 1891 widow age 89 living on her own means with her daughter Zillah at Bunny. Ann Whittaker born c1802 died Apr.qtr. 1891, Basford district.

George Whittaker bapt. 29.6.1831, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore, buried 2.10.1831, as an infant.

John Whittaker bapt. 7.9.1833, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore, 1841 age 7, in the household of John Whittaker (Bradmore 1841/60). Buried 31.3.1844 age 10.

George Whittaker, bapt. Bunny 27.5.1835, son of Thomas framework knitter and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 6, in the household of John Whittaker (Bradmore 1841/60). 1851 age 16, single, framework knitter, in grandfather John's house (Bradmore 1851/74). Buried Bunny 10.12.1854 age 20.

William Whittaker bapt. 10.10.1836, son of Thomas framework knitter and Ann. 1841 age 4, in the

household of John Whittaker (Bradmore 1841/60). 1851 age 14, single, winder, in grandfather John's house (Bradmore 1851/74). 1861 age 24, framework knitter making merino shirts, single, in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/39). 1881 age 44 single framework knitter living alone on Distillery St., Ruddington. Oct.qtr. 1888 Bingham district William Whittaker married Elizabeth Ann Camm. 1891 age 54 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth age 30 born Kimberley in mother-in-law's house, Ann Camm widow 75 living on own means, born Kegworth, at Church St., Ruddington.

Eustace Whittaker bapt. Bunny 24.1.1838, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Ann of Bradmore. 1841 age 3, in the household of John Whittaker (Bradmore 1841/60).

Lettice Whittaker born c1839, Bradmore, daughter of Thomas and Ann. 1851 age 12, seamer, in grandfather John's house (Bradmore 1851/74).

Mary Whittaker buried 19.1.1841, infant, possibly daughter of Thomas and Ann.

Zillah Whittaker, bapt. Bunny 14.12.1841, daughter of Thomas framework knitter and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 age 9, seamer, in grandfather John's house (Bradmore 1851/74). 1861 age 20, single, domestic servant, in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/39). 1871 age 30, single, charwoman, living with her mother Ann in the almshouse at Bunny. 1881 age 40 single stocking seamer living with her mother Ann in the almshouse at Bunny. 1891 age 57 living with mother Ann in Bunny almshouses. Zillah Whitaker was allowed to live in the newly whitewashed room over the Old School at Bunny at the discretion of Bunny & Bradmore Charities governors, June 1891, and thereafter received payments for cleaning the Old Schoolroom, up to the end of 1901. 1901 Zillah Whittaker single age 67 living on Village St., Bunny, between the church and school i.e. in the almshouses. (But note 1911 Zilla Whittaker age 69 single born Bradmore, no occupation at Back St., Ruddington, in 2-room house, signed the census form with her mark.)

Amos Whittaker bapt. Bunny 26.10.1844, born Bradmore, son of Thomas framework knitter and Ann. 1851 (no age recorded but younger than Zillah, would be 7) scholar, in grandfather John's house (Bradmore 1851/74). 1861 age 17, single, cow boy, in the household of Joseph Nixon, Rancliffe Farm (Bradmore 1861/17). 1871 age 26 ag.lab with wife Eliza 25 born Shardlow, with step-daughter Sarah Dawson 10 scholar and half-time hand, Thomas 4 both born Shardlow and Mary A 2 born Wilne, at The Newdylights, Wilne, Derbyshire. 1881 Amos age 39 ag.lab born Bradmore with wife Eliza age 39 born Wellington Shrops and children Thomas 14 ag.lab born Shardlow, George 11 born Wilne, John 9, Eliza 5, Flora 3 scholars born Wilford and Eliza 1 born Bradmore, at The Leys, Ruddington.

Eliza Whittaker born 1880 Bradmore, daughter of Amos and Eliza. 1881 age 1 in parents' house.

Hannah Whittaker bapt. Bunny 25.5.1806, daughter of John and Zillah of Bradmore, buried Bunny 21.2.1829 age 23,

John Whittaker bapt. Bunny 13.4.1808, son of John and Zillah of Bradmore.

William Widacre paid by the Constable for catching sparrows, 1794.

William Whittaker born 1795 Bradmore. 1841 age 38 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth age 35, children John 12, Robert 9, Charles 7, and Elizabeth 20 with son William 2 mths (illegit.), at Bunny. 1851 age 57 ag.lab with wife Elizabeth age 57, daughter Martha 26 dressmaker born Keyworth, grandson William 10 scholar born Bunny and visitor William Yates 21 single tailor born East Leake, at Bunny. 1861 age 65, ag.lab, married, solo at Bunny; wife Elizabeth age 66 in daughter Martha Yates's house with her husband William and son Arthur, at 2 High St., Ruddington (see Yates). 1871 William age 77 ag.lab born Bradmore with wife Elizabeth age 77 born Keyworth, at Bunny. Elizabeth Whittaker born 1794 died Apr.qtr. 1891 Basford district. 1881 William age 85 widower, outdoor pauper, solo in Bunny. William Whittaker born Bradmore 1795 died Apr.qtr. 1882, Basford district.

William Whittaker of Bradmore buried Bunny 18.5.1808.

Thomas Whittaker born c1812 of Bradmore, buried Bunny 8.6.1865 age 53

Martha Whitaker bapt. 29.12.1817, daughter of John, labourer, and Martha of Bradmore.

William Whittaker, born c1821, Keyworth. 1854 Jan.qtr. Basford district, married Mary Elliott widow of John Elliott. 1861 age 41, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Mary, with stepson Richard Elliott, living at the bottom end of Main St. (Bradmore 1861/67). Probably the William Whittaker in 1867 Bunny Estate rental renting house and garden at £3/10/- pa. 1871 age 50, agricultural labourer, noted born Bunny, married to Mary (born Basford) (Bradmore 1871/64). 1881 age 60, bricklayer's labourer, married to Mary, with grandson John Elliott (Bradmore 1881/59). 1891 age 70, widower, agricultural labourer, living alone (Bradmore 1891/58). 1895 William Whittaker added to the Bunny & Bradmore Charities list to receive a ton of Christmas coals and 1/- p.wk. 1897 granted a weekly loaf from the Charities. Electoral roll, house, 1886-1896. 1900 Bunny estate rental with cottage and garden in Bradmore paying rent of £3/10/- pa. 1901 age 80, widower, retired bricklayer's labourer, living with grandson John Elliott, rheumatic, in 3-room house on Village St (Main St) (Bradmore 39/1901). John, son of John and Sarah, is grandson of Mary formerly Mrs Elliott – see below.

Mary Whittaker, born c1811/13, Basford. Formerly married to John Elliott, who died 1844. Jan.qtr. 1854 Basford district Mary Elliott married William Whittaker. 1861 age 49, seamstress, married to William, with her son Richard Elliott in William's house (Bradmore 1861/67). 1871 age 66, married to William (Bradmore 1871/64). 1881 age 68 (age incorrect), married to William (Bradmore 1881/59). Possibly Mary buried Bunny 3.10.1887 age 77.

Elizabeth Whitaker bapt. 18.8.1849, natural daughter of Mary Elliott of Bradmore. See Elizabeth Whitaker Elliott.

John Whittaker born c1827/8 buried Bunny 17.10.1830 age 2.

Elizabeth Whitaker born c1834, eldest daughter of Isaac and Elizabeth Voce. Died 20.11.1898 age 64, recorded on parents' tombstone north side of Bunny churchyard as Elizabeth Whitaker.

John Whittaker bapt. Bunny 1.7.1840, natural son of Martha Whittaker of Bradmore, buried Bunny 28.6.1841 age 1 year.

Ann Whittaker daughter of William and Mary born c1848 Clifton, married John Elliott son of Mary later Whittaker. See Elliott.

John Whittaker born c1853, Bunny. 1871 age 18, single, farm servant in the household of George Goodwin, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1871/5)

Mary Whittaker nee Chamberlain bapt. Bunny 24.1.1855, daughter of Benjamin, labourer, and (Mary) Ann of Bradmore. Married at Bunny 7.11.1876 age 22, daughter of Benjamin labourer, to James Whittaker, age 22, labourer of New Radford, son of John, labourer. 1881 James Whittaker age 25 born Rauceby Lincs, sexton, with wife Mary age 26 born Bradmore and children William B 3, Ada Maud 1 born Nottingham, at Cemetery Lodge, 9 Canning St., Nottingham. 1891 James age 34, sexton, with wife Mary age 36, children William Benjamin 13 clerk, Ada Maud 11, Mary Ellen 9, Gertrude 7, Henry 6, scholars, and Sarah Ann 3, all born Nottingham, at Cemetery Lodge, 9 Canning St., Nottingham. 1901 Mary Whittaker age 46 born Bradmore visitor with Alfred Whittaker 33 publican and carrier born Wilsford, Lincs and family at Reindeer Farm, Main Road, Long Bennington, Lincs; James age 44 (noted widower) cemetery sexton with children William 23, Ada 21, Nellie 19, Gertrude 17 cigar maker, Henry 16 lace designer, Sarah A 13 scholar, Alfred 6, Herbert 4, at 9 Canning St., Nottingham. 1911 James age 54, caretaker at General Cemetery, with wife Mary age 56 (married 34 years with 8 children), with Gertrude 27 cigar maker for Alton & Sons, Sarah Ann 23 lacehand for A H Woolley & Co, Alfred James 16 education clerk for County Borough, Herbert 14 scholar, at 9 Canning St., Nottingham, 5-room house.

Charles Whittaker, born c1857, Bunny. 1871 age 14, farm servant to Thomas Morris, Barn Close (Bradmore 1871/20). 1891 age 34, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Elizabeth, with children Gertrude, Bertha and Ethel, 3-room house (Bradmore 1891/4). Electoral roll, house, 1886-1914, lived at No.15 Main St. 1920 (Source: M Bagguley). On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and garden paying rent £3/4/- pa. 1901 age 44 general labourer with wife Elizabeth and children Ethel, Frances and Florence in 4-room house on Village (Main) St (Bradmore 33/1901). On 1908 Bunny Estate rental paying £3/4/- pa. 1911 age 54 farm labourer with wife Elizabeth age 52 (married 29 years (1882) with 6 children, 1 dead), children Ethel 24, Frances 18 hosiery winder and Florance 11 scholar, 4-room house, form signed by Charles (Bradmore 26/1911). Died 11.5.1939 age 82, buried Bunny churchyard, north side.

Elizabeth Whittaker, born c1859, Derby. 1891 age 32, married to Charles (Bradmore 1891/4). 1901 age 42 married to Charles (Bradmore 33/1901). 1911 age 52 (married 29 years (1882) with 6 children, 1 dead) (Bradmore 26/1911). On electoral roll for Main St., 1920 only. Died 6 or 7.9.1927 aged 68, at her daughter's home at New Nuthall while on a short visit with her husband, buried Bunny 9.9.1927. Deanery Magazine: 'The parish has lost an old resident formerly of Bradmore and latterly of Bunny... A great sufferer for many years she is now at rest ... She will be missed in the village and in our Church life, always being present at Church when her uncertain health permitted. Mrs Whittaker was a keen member of the Mothers' Union...'

Gertrude Whittaker, born c1883, daughter of Charles and Elizabeth. Methodist Sunday School scholar 4th class 8.8.1886-Jan.1889, 3rd class Jan.1889-June 1890, 2nd class July 1890-Dec.1891, 6 mths gap, July 1892-25.8.1895, intermittently to 29.12.1895, 1st class intermittently Jan.1896-30.1.1898. 1891 age 8, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/4). 1894 choir member. Listed as Sunday School teacher 1898/9. 1891 age 19 domestic servant for Frederick Pearson, director, basket manufacturer and cycle dealer, at Forest Villa Lodge, Gregory Boulevard.

John William Whittaker born Aug.1885, of Bradmore, buried Bunny 4.11.1885 age 3 months, possibly son of Charles and Elizabeth.

Bertha Whittaker, born c1887, Bradmore, daughter of Charles and Elizabeth. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 23.11.1890-Dec.1891, 6 mth gap, July 1892-June 1893, 3rd class July 1893-Dec.1895, 2nd class Jan.1896-June 1898, 1st class July 1898-25.3.1900. 1891 age 4 in parents'

house (Bradmore 1891/4). 1897/8 choir member. 1901 age 14 domestic servant for William Barnes, lace manufacturer, at 10 Beckenham Rd., Old Radford. Oct.qtr. 1906, Basford district, Bertha Whittaker married Harry Dodson son of Henry, ag.lab, and Martha of Clifton. 1911 Harry Dodson age 29 railway engine stoker born Clifton with wife Bertha age 24 (married 4 years, no children), at 22 Cecil Street, Walsall, Staffs, 4-room house.

Ethel Whittaker, born c1890, Bradmore, daughter of Charles and Elizabeth. 1891 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/4). Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 4.3.1894-June 1897 (sick 29 Jul-19 Aug and 23 Oct-30 Dec.1894), 3rd class July 1897-June 1898, 2nd class July 1898-June 1901, 1st class July 1901-15.5.1904. Received "Family Friend" 1901. 1901 age 11 in parents' house (Bradmore 33/1901). 1911 age 24 (should be 21), single, no occupation, in parents' house (Bradmore 26/1911).

Frances Hannah Whittaker born c1893, Bradmore, daughter of Charles of Bradmore. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 28.3.1897-June 1899, 3rd class July 1899-June 1902, 2nd class July 1902-June 1904, 1st class July 1904-Dec.1905. 1901 age 8 in parents' house (Bradmore 33/1901). 1906 choir member. 1911 age 18 hosiery mender in parents' house (Bradmore 26/1911).

Florence May Whittaker born c1900 Bradmore, daughter of Charles of Bradmore. 1901 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 33/1901). Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 31 Jan.-2.7.1904, 3rd class July 1904-June 1905, Vestry Girls Jul-Dec.1905, 1st class July 1912-8.6.1911. Admitted to Bunny School 8.5.1905. 1911 age 11 scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 26/1911).

Kate Whittaker born c1875, daughter of Charles Whittaker born 1834 Bunny. 1901 age 26, single, born Bunny, in household of father Charles Whittaker, widower, 68, ag.lab born Bunny, with Harriett, 36, single, no occupation born Cotgrave and Walter 35, single, ag.lab born Cotgrave, plus Charles's grand-daughter Elsie. Married Robert Burton son of Samuel, platelayer, in 1901 when Kate is described as of Bunny, age 26. See Burton.

Elsie May Whittaker born 1899, daughter of Kate. Methodist Sunday School scholar Vestry Girls 19.7.1903-June 1904, 3rd class July - 6.11.1904 and 29 Jan - June 1905, Vestry Girls July - Dec 1905. Admitted to Bunny School 8.5.1905, Robert Burton listed as parent/guardian. 1911 Elsie May age 12 in parents Kate and Robert's house - see Burton.

Annie Whittaker nee Littlewood, born 25.9.1881, married George Whittaker farmer of Hickling Pastures 14.6.1910 at Ault Hucknall. Came to Bonsers Farm after George died 31.1.1953. On electoral roll at Bonsers Farm 1954-69. Listed as WI member 1961. Died 4.3.1969 at 15 Farmer St., age 87, widow of George Whittaker farmer, mother in law of Frank C Randall. Buried at Bunny with George, by western boundary of churchyard, 7.3.1969.

Mr & Mrs Whittaker made a donation to the memorial cross in 1970.

Thomas Widdowson bapt. Bunny 26.10.1809, son of Thomas and Sarah of Bradmore.

Sarah Widdowson bapt. Bunny 20.11.1810, daughter of Thomas and Sarah of Bradmore.

Mary Widdowson bapt. Bunny 4.3.1815, daughter of Thomas, labourer, and Sarah of Bradmore.

William Widdowson bapt. Bunny 31.3.1817, son of Thomas, framework knitter, and Sarah of Bradmore.

John Widdowson bapt. Bunny 15.3.1819, son of Thomas, labourer, and Sarah of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Widdowson married William Stephenson both of Bradmore, at Bunny 4.12.1804. Possibly Elizabeth born c1781, died 1839.

Alice Widdowson, born c1863 at Cropwell Butler. 1881 age 18, domestic servant in the household of John Randall, Rufford Lodge (Bradmore 1881/18).

George Widdowson, born c1830, Granby. 1841 age 11 in parents' house, Edward 44 ag.lab and Elizabeth 42, with siblings Mary 23, Sarah 19 lace runners, John 9, Eliza 7, Frances 5, Cyril 3, at Granby. 1851 age 20, single, farm servant, in the household of William James, Manor Farm (Bradmore

1851/44). 16.4.1854 George Widdowson of Bradmore married (1) Elizabeth Harwood of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 George and Elizabeth not found. Elizabeth died April 1866. 17.6.1867 George Widdowson age 37, widower, labourer of Bradmore son of Edward stonemason, married (2) Jane Hind, 49, widow of Bradmore daughter of Thomas Harwood, shoemaker. 1871 age 41, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Jane, with children William and George, at the bottom end of Main St. (Bradmore 1871/61). 1881 age 51, widower, agricultural labourer, living alone, now at the top end of Main St. (Bradmore 1881/45). 1881 signed Sunday School accounts. 1888 received "Sankey". 1891 age 61, agricultural labourer, living alone in 4-room house at No.24 Main Street (Bradmore 1891/6). 1893-4 received a ton of coals each year from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. 1900 received a weekly loaf and the dole of 1/- p.wk from Bunny & Bradmore Charities. Electoral roll, house, 1886-1900. On 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and garden paying rent £3 pa. 1901 age 72, widower, retired farm labourer, living alone in 4-room house on Village (Main) Street (Bradmore 28/1901). 1901 received grant of 2/6 from Methodist Church Pools Fund. George Widdowson died Oct.qtr. 1907, Basford district.

George Widdowson born c1863, Bradmore, son of George and Elizabeth. 1871 age 8, farmers boy in George and Jane's house (Bradmore 1871/61). 1881 age 17 indoor farm servant for Catherine Henson, widow, farmer of 40 acres in Bradmore (Bradmore 1881/49). Possibly the George Widdowson who emigrated to become a Methodist minister in America (O Randall).

Edward Widdowson bapt. Bunny 2.7.1865, son of George, labourer, and Elizabeth of Bradmore, buried Bunny 18.3.1866 age 14 mths.

Jane Widdowson born c1827/8, East Leake. 17.6.1867 as Jane Hind, age 49, widow of Bradmore, daughter of Thomas Harwood shoemaker, married George Widdowson age 37 widower. Age incorrect, should be 39. 1871 age 43, married to George (Bradmore 1871/61). Buried Bunny 11.3.1874 age 48.

Eliza Widdowson born c1842 buried Bunny 7.5.1876 age 34.

John Widdowson born c1853, Granby Leics, son of William, ag.lab, and Lydia of Granby. 1861 age 7 scholar in parents' house at Granby. Oct.qtr. 1871 Basford district, John Widdowson married Sarah Ann Murden of Ruddington, daughter of Samuel, ag.lab of Ruddington, and Mary, seamer of Normanton on the Wolds. 1881 age 29 born Granby with wife Sarah and children John Samuel 9, William 7, Eliza Ann 5 scholars, Thomas Henry 3 and George 1 all born Ruddington, on Back St., Ruddington. 1891 age 38 groom born Granby with wife Sarah A and children John Samuel 19 ag.lab, Eliza Ann 15, Thomas 13 ag.lab, George 12 ag.lab and Bertie at Back Street, Ruddington. 1901 age 48 cowman with wife Sarah Ann and children John Sam 28 married (wife not present), railway carman, and Bertie, at South Wilford. 1911 age 58, cowman on farm, with wife Sarah Ann, in 11-room house (but probably shared with Bert Widdowson and family, see below) (Bradmore 13/1911). Married John Widdowson Oct.qtr. 1871, Basford district. 1881 age 28 married to John. 1891 age 39 married to John. 1901 age 49 married to John. 1911 age 59 (married 38 years, 6 children).

Bertie Murden Widdowson, born 1885 Ruddington, son of John and Sarah Ann. 1891 age 6 scholar in parents' house with siblings, all born Ruddington, at Back St., Ruddington. 1901 age 16 horseman on farm, living with parents at South Wilford. Apr.qtr. 1908, Bingham district, Bertie Murden Widdowson married Mary Elizabeth Panton. Living in Bradmore in 1910s. 1911 age 26 waggoner on farm, with wife Mary Elizabeth age 25 (married 3 years with 2 children), in 11-room house (probably sharing with parents, see above) (Bradmore 12/1911).

John Joseph Murden Widdowson born c1909, son of Bertie and Mary Elizabeth. Methodist Sunday School scholar infants class 29.6.1913-19.10.1913, left. 2nd class 16.5.1915-7.7.1918.

George William Widdowson born c1910/11, son of Bertie and Mary Elizabeth. Methodist Sunday School scholar infants class 30.5.1915-Dec.1917.

Ann Wilcox born c1821. 1841 age 20, servant in the household of Richard and Mary Walker, Rancliffe

Joseph Wilcox, born c1832/7, Stanton on the Wolds, cottager. 1841 age 10 in parents' house, Thomas 40 ag.lab and Mary 40, with siblings Mary 8, Martha 6, George 3, Charlotte 1, at Stanton on the Wolds. 1851 not found. 24.5.1859 Joseph Wilcocks or Wilcox of Bradmore married Martha Davies of Bradmore at Bunny. 1861 age 29, agricultural shepherd, married to Martha, with son John, living at the bottom end of Main St. (Bradmore 1861/71). No entry in 1871 census for Bradmore, son John (2nd) born c1871 Bradmore but son Frank born c1875 at Nuthall. 1881 age 44, agricultural labourer, householder, married to Martha with children Mary Jane, John and Frank, living at The Cottage, Donkey Lane (Bradmore 1881/20). Donkey Lane appears on deeds of 16 Far St. as Wilcocks Lane. 1881 and 1885 rented grazing on Plumtree Lane. Also on Pendock Lane 1881-6 and 1891. 7.9.1885 received "Sankey" from Methodist church. 1885/6 Whites Directory, cottager. 1888 Kellys Directory, cowkeeper. 1891 age 54, married to Martha, with son Frank (Bradmore 1891/27). 1894 Whites Directory, cottager, and in 1888 edition. 1895 Kellys Directory cowkeeper, and in 1904. Electoral roll, land & tenement, 1886-1904. Joseph Wilcock on 1900 Bunny Estate rental with cottage and land, 10 acres 1 rod 3 perches, paying rent £20/19/2 pa. In 1908 this block of land appears to have passed to John Hutchinson junior, who was on the electoral roll from 1905 onwards with land and tenement. 1901 Joseph age 64, farm labourer, married to Martha living in Taylor's Lane (Bradmore 1901/5). John Wilcox bapt. Bunny 18.11.1859, son of Joseph, labourer, and Martha of Bradmore. 1861 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1861/71). Died before 1871.

Ann Wilcox born 31.7.1862, bapt. Bradmore Methodist Church 24.9.1862, daughter of Joseph and Martha. Ann Wilcox daughter of Joseph, cottager, domestic servant of Bradmore, married at Bunny 13.11.1882 age 20, to John Stathers age 22, stockman of Cotesbrook Leics, son of William, machineman? (John Stathers 1861 age 1 with parents Thomas ag.lab and Ann plus a sister at South End, Seaton Ross, Yorks. 1871 John age 11 crow tenter, servant for Stephen Midgley farmer of 200 acres at Everingham, Yorks. 1881 John age 23 coachman at Easthorpe House, Ruddington, no head of household recorded.) 1891 John age 31 groom born Seaton Ross, Yorkshire, with wife Ann age 29 born Bradmore and children John H 7, Robert 5 scholars born Cottesbrook, Leics, Joseph W 3 born Higham on the Hill plus 3 lodgers at the Cottage at Higham Stables, Higham on the Hill. 1901 John age 42 coachman, domestic, with wife Annie age 40 and children John 17 groom, Joseph 12, Alfred 10, Bertie 8, Ethell 3, Annie 2 and 2 boarders at Grange Cottage, Higham on the Hill. 1911 John age 51 groom/chauffeur with wife Ann age 49 born Bradmore (married 29 years with 10 children, 1 dead), children Bertie 19 single domestic gardener, Grace 13, Annie 11, Ethell 9, Florrie 9 all born Higham Grange, Nuneaton, at Higham on the Hill, 5-room house.

Arthur Wilcox bapt. Bunny 15.7.1864, son of Joseph, shepherd and Martha of Bradmore, buried Bunny 7.12.1885 age 20.

Mary Jane Wilcox, born c1868 Bradmore, daughter of Joseph and Martha. 1881 age 13 in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/20).

Jane Wilcox bapt. Bunny 14.3.1869, daughter of Joseph, labourer and Martha of Bradmore.

John Wilcox born c1871, Bradmore, son of Joseph and Martha. 1881 age 10, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/20).

Frank Wilcox, born c1875, Nuthall, son of Joseph and Martha. 1881 age 6, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1881/20). Methodist Sunday School scholar 2nd class 5.7.1885-Dec.1886, 1st class Jan.1887-11.9.1887, left. 1891 age 16, single, agricultural labourer in parents' house (Bradmore 1891/27).

Francis Wild 1641 took the Protestation Oath supporting true Protestant Religion. Married to Anne.

William Wild bapt. 22.4.1638, son of Ffrancis and Anne of Bradmore.

Ralph Wilde bapt. 28.2.1644, son of Ralph and Anne of Bradmore.

Ffrancis Wilde married to Elizabeth, living in Bradmore 1670s/1680s.

Ann Wilde bapt. Bunny 9.9.1677, daughter of Ffrancis and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Issabel Wilde bapt. Bunny 16.7.1679, daughter of Ffrancis and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Ffrancis Wilde bapt. Bunny 12.3.1682, son of Ffrancis and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Wild married James Lane of Ruddington at Bunny 5.5.1686.

Matthew Wilde signed Constables accounts 1787-92, served as Constable 1790. Richard Walker of Bradmore nominated Matthew Wilde of Little Leake as trustee for his son Richard in his will of 1787 - may be either this Matthew or an earlier generation. 1844 Whites Directory lists John Wild, Matthew Wild and Matthew Wild junior as farmers at West Leake.

Ann A Wild born 1869, Owthorpe, daughter of George, farmer, and Sarah. 1871 age 2 in parents' house, George farmer of 400 acres, at Kinoulton. 1881 age 12 scholar in parents' house at Kinoulton. 1891 age 22 at parents' house, Kinoulton. 1901 age 32 visitor in house of Mary Gadd (Bradmore Bradmore 1901/49). 1911 age 42 single in father's house, George age 83 widower late farmer, at Kinoulton, 4-room house. Ann A Wilk born 1869 died March qtr. 1936, Bingham district.

Margaret Wilkinson married Robert Mason at Bunny 7.11.1598.

Anne Wilkinson on 1674 Hearth Tax Return with two hearths.

William Wilkinson married to Katherine, living in Bradmore 1680s.

William Wilkinson bapt. Bunny 7.12.1679 son of William and Katherine of Bradmore.

Mary? Wilkinson bapt. Bunny 25.3.1683, daughter of William and Katherine of Bradmore.

Alice Wilkinson bapt. Bunny 29.8.1686, daughter of William and Katherine of Bradmore.

Jeffery Wilkinson married to Mary, living in Bradmore 1710s.

John Wilkinson bapt. Bunny 21.11.1711, son of Jeffery and Mary of Bradmore.

Mary Wilkinson bapt. Bunny 24.2.1714, son of Jeffery and Mary of Bradmore.

Ann Wilkinson daughter of Jeffery and Mary of Bradmore buried Bunny 20.12.1719.

Elizabeth Wilkinson of Bradmore, widow, married Thomas Smith of Arnold, framework knitter, widower, 9.3.1723 at Nottingham (St Peter or St Nicholas).

Mary Wilkinson married William Stevinson both of Bradmore, at Bunny 21.11.1731.

Tom Wilkinson born c1902. 1922 sang in Methodist choir. On electoral roll for (No.11) Main St. 1939/40-1955. Married to Mary Elizabeth nee Jackson at Bunny. Member of Bradmore & Bunny tennis club. Mens Institute Committee member 1940/1-1946/7. 1942 chaired Overseas Missions Meeting. Died 24.4.1955 age 53, buried at Bunny churchyard, by western boundary.

Mary Elizabeth Wilkinson born c1906, nee Jackson, daughter of Richard and Eliza. Married to Tom, on electoral roll for Main St. (No.11), 1939/40-1964, then 21 Far St. 1965-82, inherited from the Jackson family. Member of Bradmore & Bunny tennis club to 1943. Listed as WI member 1940-43, noted resigned. 1949 on Methodist flower rota. Died 27.4.1982 age 76, buried at Bunny with Tom, by western boundary of churchyard.

William Wilks, born c1834 Long Itchington Warwicks, son of John, Limeburner, and Elizabeth of Long Itchington. 1861 William age 24 gamekeeper, boarder with Richard Hemsley butcher and cottager of Bunny, at Bunny. 1871 age 37, gamekeeper, householder, married to Sarah, with children George A, Annie and Edwin, living on Far St. (Bradmore 1871/36). 1901 William age 67, widower, greengrocer on own account, with son Arthur and his wife Hannah at 1 Quarry Place, Bulwell.

Sarah Wilks born c1839, Bunny. 1871 age 32, dressmaker, married to William (Bradmore 1871/36).

George Arthur Wilks born c1866, Weelsby Lincs, son of William and Sarah. 1871 age 5, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/36). 1901 Arthur age 35, colliery labourer with wife Hannah age 37 born Dawley Shrops, in father's house at Bulwell.

Annie Wilks born c1868, Weelsby, son of William and Sarah. 1871 age 3, scholar in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/36).

Edwin Wilks born c1870, Bradmore, son of William and Sarah. 1871 age 1 in parents' house (Bradmore 1871/36).

Richard Wilks born 1842, Wickenby. 1851 age 9 in parents' house, Richard, farmer and Sarah, at Wickenby. 1861 age 19 apprentice druggist and chemist at Kirton in Lindsey. 1871 age 29 druggist and chemist with wife Lucy Ann age 32 born Kirton in Lindsey, children Richard 4, Lucy Ann 6 scholars born Lenton and nephew Thomas Hindley 18 apprentice chemist born Old Lenton, plus servant, at Willoughby St., Lenton. Lucy Ann Wilks died 12.3.1873, New Lenton, admin 6.6.1873 to Richard, chemist, effects < £200. 1881 age 39 victualler and farmer of 60 acres with wife Elizabeth age 27 born Bobbers Mill, children Lucy Ann 18, Fanny 11, Gertrude 8 born Lenton, plus a servant at White Hart Inn, Gregory St., Nottingham. 1891 Richard age 50, married (not widowed, but wife not present) in daughter Fanny's house at Lenton.

Fanny Wilks born c1870, Lenton, daughter of Richard and Lucy Ann of Lenton. 1871 age 1 in the household of John and Sarah Davis at The Cottage, Donkey Lane. Noted in a different hand as daughter, but given their advanced ages, more likely to be grand-daughter? No firm relationship

identified (1871/23). 1881 age 11 in parents' house. 1891 age 20, head of household, grocer, with sister Gertie age 16 restaurant waitress and father Richard, at 15 Abbey Street., Lenton.

WILLIAMSON

Jane Williamson born c1782, married Isaac Foster both of Bradmore, at Bunny 15.6.1812.

Alan G Williamson on electoral roll at 31 Main St. 1983.

WILLMOTT

Alice Willmott of Bunny married 14.11.1597 at Bunny to Edmund Wright husbandman of Bradmore by Ordinary's licence issued 10.11.1597.

WILSON

John Wilson, shepherd, beneficiary of Mary Cartwright's will 1668.

William Wilson born c1826. 1841 age 15, servant in the household of Sam Hordmer, possibly at Barn Close (Bradmore 1841/72).

WIN(G)FIELD

John Wingfield married to Elizabeth, living in Bradmore 1770s. Probably the John Wingfield who married Elizabeth Hardy at Bunny 24.12.1767, no parishes specified. John is not recorded in the 1792 Bunny Estate Survey, but in the Constable's Accounts from 25.8.1794 onwards John Winfield receives weekly money for Samuel Hardy, who in 1792 was in a cottage rented from John Henson at The Crown Inn.

Mary Wingfield of Bradmore daughter of John and Elizabeth buried Bunny 15.12.1769. Married Robert Whitaker both of Bradmore at Bunny 23.11.1793. See Whitaker.

Ann Winfield bapt. Bunny 9.7.1770, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Winfield bapt. Bunny 23.4.1772, daughter of John and Elizabeth of Bradmore.

Richard Winfield bapt. 30.11.1830 Wysall, son of Richard and Elizabeth. 1841 age 12 in house of mother Elizabeth re-married to John Brown, ag.lab, at Wysall. 1851 age 20, ag.lab servant for George Smith, blacksmith, at Bunny. Married Sarah Spencer at Bunny, 20.1.1852. 1861 age 30 ag.lab with wife Sarah at Wysall. 1871 age 42 ag.lab with wife Sarah in Richard's mother's house, Elizabeth Brown, widow, age 69 former lace-runner born East Leake, and her grand-daughter Betsey Brown 11 scholar born Wysall, at Wysall. 1881 age 47, ag.lab, with wife Sarah on Main St., Wysall. 1891 age 60, agricultural labourer, married to Sarah, at White Row, Wysall, 2-room house. 1901 age 68 ag.lab with wife Sarah on White Row, Wysall. 1911 age 85 ag.lab retired (OAP) with wife Sarah at Wysall, 3-room house. Richard Winfield died Jun.qtr. 1917, Loughborough district.

Sarah Winfield born 1830 at Ruddington, nee Spencer, daughter of William and Mary, living in Bradmore by 1851. Married Richard Winfield at Bunny 20.1.1852. 1861 age 30 married to Richard. 1871 age 43, seamer, married to Richard, in his mother's house. 1881 age 50 born Bradmore married to Richard. 1891 age 60, noted born Bradmore, married to Richard, living at Wysall. 1901 age 69 born Keyworth, married to Richard. 1911 age 86 born Bradmore, (married 58 years, no children) with Richard. Sarah Winfield died Jan.qtr. 1914, Loughborough district.

John Winfield bapt. Bunny 23.4.1852, son of Richard, blacksmith, and Sarah of Bradmore, buried Bunny 26.4.1852, infant.

WING

Edwin Wing born 14.11.1906. On Bradmore electoral roll at 16 Main St. 1965-78. Married Nora. Died 24.11.1977 aged 71, buried in Bunny churchyard with Nora, west of the church.

Nora Wing born c1910. On electoral roll at 16 Main St. 1965-88. Teacher. Married to Edwin. Went to Orchard House Nursing Home, Ruddington. Died 12.4.1997 aged 87, buried with Edwin at Bunny, west of the church.

WINNYE

Margaret Winnye of Bradmore married Jarvis Stoe of Bunny at Bunny 4.11.1574.

WOLLERTON

Joan Wollerton of Bradmore married Robert Dickins of Bunny at Bunny 28.11.1574.

2 and David 1 mth born Hucknall, at George St., Hucknall Torkard. 1891 age 38 coal miner with wife Ann Mary age 38 born Kirkby Notts, and children William Joseph 16 printer's assistant born Selston, Esther E 12, David 10, Arthur F 6 scholars born Hucknall, at 82 Beardall St., Hucknall Torkard. 1901 age 48, painter and decorator, employer, with wife Ann M age 48 and children Esther A 22 school teacher, David 20 house painter, Arthur F 16 house painter, at 45a Watnall Rd., Hucknall Torkard. 1911 age 59 master decorator, house and church, employer, with wife Ann Mary Burgess Wollerton age 59 born Kirkby (married 39 years, 8 children, 3 dead), assisting in shop, with son Arthur Frederick 26 decorator, and his wife Annie Jeanie 21 born Hucknall, and reference to her child of less than 1 mth, not listed on the census form, at 35 High St., Hucknall, 5-room house.

John William Wood born 1873, Wymeswold. On Bradmore electoral roll with house, 1892-5. Jan.qtr. 1891 John William Wood married Lucy Bramley, sempstress, daughter of Mark, grocer, and Ann (deceased), of Ruddington. 1891 Lucy Wood nee Bramley age 27 in father's house, Church St., Ruddington, John not present. 1901 John age 28, born Loughborough 1873, ag.cattle worker on farm, married to Lucy age 37 born Ruddington with children George Harold 7 born Bradmore, Dorothy A 5, Ada Lizzie 3 both born Ruddington, on Turnpike / High St., Ruddington. 1911 age 37 cowman on farm, born Wymeswold, with wife Lucy age 47 (married 20 years (1891) with 7 children 2 dead), with children Harold , Ada 13, Nelly 8 and son Leslie 5 both born Bunny, at Bunny.

Alick Edgar Wood, son of John and Lucy, buried 27.6.1891, age 1 month.

George Harold Wood born 1894, Bradmore, son of John and Lucy. 1901 age 7 in parents' house, Ruddington. 1911 age 17, cowman in parents' house, Bunny.

WOODWARD

Arthur Woodward buried Bunny 7.4.1856, age 3 mths.

WOOTTON

William Wootton paid by the Constable in 1795 for catching a crow. Feb.1813 had 5 weeks pay from the Constable, 10/-, and 5 weeks in March, working on the house row. 1825 had 2 days work on Jakes' house, 3/5. Aug.1825 provided post and rails for the pinfold, £2/10/- paid by the Constable.

Ann Wotton daughter of William and Hannah of Bradmore bapt. Bunny 3.4.1785.

James Wootton bapt. Bunny 15.10.1776, son of William and Hannah. Married Ann Gee at Bunny 9.4.1799. Living in Bradmore 1800s. 3.2.1801 Constable paid 2/6 for fetching James Wotton's goods from Ruddington. Jan.1802 he had 2 weeks pay from the Constable. Jan.1813 the Constable paid for fetching James's coals. Feb.1813 he had 2 weeks pay 6/- and a further 2 weeks in March working on the house row. Buried Bunny 14.7.1838 age 62.

Ann Wootton born c1776, buried Bunny 2.12.1838 age 62, possibly wife of James.

William Wootton bapt. 29.1.1802, Bunny, son of James and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 age 49, farmer of 108 acres employing 1 labourer, married to Juda age 47, born Derbyshire with children Albert 9, John 6, William Henry 4, all born at Chaddesdon, living in Bunny.

Thomas Wootton bapt. Bunny 8.3.1804, son of James and Ann of Bradmore. 1851 Thomas age 44 born Bradmore, widower , stable servant for Joseph Collyer, landed proprietor, at Castle Bury, Thundridge, Herts. 1861 age 56 watchman born Notts with wife Mary age 48 born Ockington, Kent plus a lodger, plus Elizabeth Cook and 2 children sharing the same house, at 26 Dorchester Place, St Marylebone (Dorset Square and Regents Park), Middlesex. 1871 age 66 Chelsea Pensioner born Bradmore with wife Mary age 58 former cook born Dover, Kent, at 25 Devonshire Square, Loughborough. Thomas born c1803 died Oct.qtr. 1878 Loughborough district.

James Wootton bapt. Bunny 13.6.1806, son of James and Ann of Bradmore.

James Wootton bapt. Bunny 6.10.1808, son of James and Ann of Bradmore. 1871 age 63 pauper widower job labourer born Bradmore (1808), at Strand Union Workhouse, Edmonton, Middx. Is this the same James Wootton in 1881 age 70 pensioner born Bradmore, uncle in the house of nephew Willaim Henry Wootton 34 licensed victualler born Chaddesdon, with wife Selina 36 born Wigston Leics and children Maria 10, Mary 7, Elizabeth 3 scholars, James 2, Albert 9 mths all born Loughborough, and William's brother John Wootton 36 mech.engr at works born Chaddesdon, at The Volunteers Inn, 13 Fishpool Head, Loughborough?

Sarah Wootton bapt. Bunny 26.12.1810, daughter of James and Ann of Bradmore, buried Bunny 21.9.1836 age 25.

Edward Wootton bapt. Bunny 18.4.1813, son of James, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore.

Elizabeth Wootton bapt. Bunny 29.7.1815, daughter of James, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore. Probably the Elizabeth who married John Taylor of Bradmore at Bunny 5.4.1836. See Taylor.

Jervis Wootton bapt. Bunny 25.5.1818, son of James, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore buried Bunny 8.9.1818 age 4 mths.

William Wootton married Ann Burrows at Bunny, 9.3.1799. Living in Bradmore 1800s/1810s.

John Wootton? bapt. Bunny 6?.3.1806, son of William and Ann of Bradmore.

William Wootton bapt. Bunny 22.7.1808, son of William and Ann of Bradmore. Buried Bunny 27.11.1810.

Elizabeth Wootton bapt. Bunny 20.4.1811, daughter of William and Ann of Bradmore.

Anne Wootton bapt. Bunny 10.9.1813 daughter of William, labourer, and Ann of Bradmore.

Mary Wootton in Constable's accounts 5.5.1821, Constable's expenses 1/- swearing Mary Wootton. Jan.1822 she had a month lying in £1/5/-, and 37 weeks back pay at 2/- p.wk., continuing to 1826. Payments ceased at the same time they commence to Jane daughter of James Wootton - was Mary her mother?

Jane Wootton referred to in the Constable's accounts as James Wootton's daughter, had 2/- p.wk. from the Constable 1827-9, and 1830 1/6 p.wk. for 45 weeks, 1/- p.wk. for 7 weeks. 1831, specifically named as Jane, had 12 weeks at 1/6, 33 weeks at 1/3. 1832 had 1/3 p.wk. and 14 weeks at 1/-. Note payments followed on from the date Mary Wootton's cease - was Mary her mother?

Jane Wootton bapt. Bunny 28.7.1821, natural daughter of Ann of Bradmore.

Isaac Wootton born c1822 buried Bunny 6.3.1837 age 15.

Lucy Wootton born c1830, Bunny, daughter of John, servant, and Mary of Bunny. 1841 age 11 in parents' house, Bunny. 1851 age 21, single, servant in the household of Isaac Voce, Manor Farm (Bradmore 1851/72).

Mary Wootton, born c1834, Wymeswold. 1851 age 17, single, house servant in the household of William Attenbrough, Debdale Farm (Bradmore 1851/1).

Francis Wootton, born c1857, Wysall, son of William, ag.lab, and Susanna, school mistress of Wysall. 1861 Francis age 4 scholar in parents' house, Wysall. 1871 not found. 1881 age 24 single farmer of 32 acres with his mother Susannah H widow 62 housekeeper born Boston, Lincs and sister Fanny 18 born Wysall, plus visitor, at Bunny (next to the vicarage). 1891 age 36 farmer with wife Bertha age 34 born Ruddington and children Maud E 2, Mable 8 mths both born Bunny and mother Susanna widow 73 on own means, plus servant, at Bunny. 1896-1924 trustee of Bradmore Methodist church, farmer of Bunny. 1901 age 44, widower, farmer, employer, with children Maud E 12, Katherine 4, Frank W 1 born Bunny and mother Susanna H widow, 82, on Village St., Bunny. 1903 Francis Wootton of Bunny, farmer, listed as trustee of Bradmore Methodist Church in deeds, possibly this Francis. 1911 age 53, widower, farmer on own account with children Maud Ellen 22 housekeeper, Kate 14 assisting at home, Frank 11 scholar, at Bunny, 6-room house. On Bradmore electoral roll, land & tenement with no parish vote plus land with no county vote, 1912-1914. 1912 Kellys Directory, farmer, also 1922, 1925, 1928, 1932, 1936 and 1941 editions. Parish councillor 1913, treasurer to the parish council 1914-1918. On electoral roll for Main St. 1920-1939/40, Hill Farm. Married Eliza as 2nd wife. Trustee of Bunny & Bradmore Charities 1897 onwards (recorded in 1906 when minute book ends). Woottons had a farmyard behind Rancliffe Farm House and had fields at the top of the village up the street (Source: M Bagguley). Frank Wootton had a smallholding 1930s on Main St., at Hill Farm (Morrismen booklet). F Wootton on addendum to Abstract of Albert Ball's title 1910 had field next to William James's, one west from the corner of Moor Lane bordering OS (1900 Map) fields nos 32 and 31. Died 12.4.1942 age 85, buried north side of Bunny churchyard with Eliza and son Leslie.

Frank William Wootton, born 1900, Bunny son of Francis Wootton of Bunny and Bertha. 1901 age 1 in father's house at Bunny. Registered at Bunny School 11.4.1904. 1911 age 11 scholar in father's house.

Eliza ("Grandma") Wootton, born c1876, married to Francis, his 2nd wife. On Bradmore electoral roll for Main St. 1920-1939/40. On electoral roll at Hill Farm, Main St., May 1945-1959. Died 26.12.1962 age 86, buried north side Bunny churchyard with Francis.

Leslie Wallis Wootton son of Francis and Eliza, born c1917. Methodist Sunday School scholar infants class 19.6.1921-1928, 2nd class 1928-1930, 1st class 1931-25.3.1934. Mens Institute Committee member 1935/6-1938/9, treasurer in 1938/9, but the secretary took over during his illness that year, for the rest of the year. Died 9.12.1938 age 21, buried north side Bunny churchyard with his parents.

WRIGHT

William Wright tenant of 1 tenement or messuage and 1 cottage and appurtenances in Bradmore 17.11.1544 when landlord Gervase Annesley of Ruddington for a sum paid by John Willughby of Wolleton knight, sells this land and all other lands, tenements, messuages, cottages, meadows and pastures and other hereditaments in Bradmore except only 1 piece of land called Flafurth Ferreys to

John Willughby. Legal possession on behalf of John Willughby taken on 21.11.1544 by Robert Perrot, clerk.

Edmund Wright of Bradmore 7.1.1574 received counterpart lease from Frauncis Willughby. Edmund Wright, yeoman, late of Bradmore, left will dated 14.6.1613, nuncupative, proved 28.7.1613. Left bequest to Bunny Church and 6/8 that he might lie in the church, plus bequest to the poor of Bradmore, a quarter of barley. Referred to a son Edmond, possibly the Edmond married at Bunny 1600, see below.

Anne Wright married Edward Martin of Keyworth at Bunny 24.10.1584, on Sanct Andrewe daie.

Ann Wright married George Chamberlaine of Ruddington at Bunny by Ordinary's licence 27.2.1592.

Edmund Wright, husbandman of Bradmore, (possibly son of Edmund died 1613, see above) obtained licence 10.11.1597 to marry Alice Wilmott; married at Bunny 14.11.1597.

Edmund Wright married Jaies (?Joyce) Morrice of Bunny at Bunny 30.9.1600.

Margery Wright married Martin Lacer alias Lacie of Wimeswold Leics at Bunny 20.6.1609.

Elizabeth Wright married Edward Symepill of Bunny at Bunny 12.5.1612.

Emerie Wright, taylor of Bradmore, left a will dated 9.3.1638, proved 9.2.1639. Buried at Bunny. Refers to his wife Agnes, sons ? and William who were to be apprenticed, daughters Alice and Elizabeth, His grandchild Emerie Wright has a ewe and a lamb or 10/- in money.

Alice Wright married Henry Barston of Edwalton at Bunny 17.6.1639. Possibly daughter of Emerie?

WYNTHORP

Elizabeth Wynthorp married William Briggs of Edwalton at Bunny 27.4.1699.
