5 CORRESPONDENCE

A resident had requested the trimming of a large overhanging tree along Farmer Street which hampered large vehicles and may cause a traffic hazard. The Clerk was asked to contact the owner of the tree to request trimming back.

Speeding cars along Farmer Street had also been reported, possibly using the street as a bypass to the A60. A 20mph speed limit would not be authorised by Notts. CC.

A60 Flower Bed - Residents had kindly responded to the request for plants. Once planted the area would be covered with bark.

Dog Fouling - An increase in dog fouling has been reported along Moor Lane. Bylaws allow for fines of £50-£80 for each offence, rising to £1000 for refusal to pay an initial fine. Nottinghamshire County Council signs are posted around the village and at the top of Moor Lane.

The Clerk was asked to contact Notts CC. to request the pavement/kerb outside the Methodist Community Hall be marked with fluorescent paint.

9 FOOTPATH WARDEN

Cllr Colwill circulated copies of his report. The Clerk reported that in July the path in the field towards Rushcliffe Park was so overgrown that residents had experienced difficulty walking. The path was later cut at the same time as the field was harvested.
