

SHOW RULES

1. All exhibits are to be bona fide produce owned, and grown for at least 3 months by the exhibitor.
2. We have recently struggled with space on the show bench so we are reluctantly having to limit exhibitors to three entries per class at all shows from July 2018
3. All exhibits must be of exhibition standard and the stewards have the power to refuse any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with this rule.
4. Excessive foliage and soil must be removed from exhibits before staging.
5. For the benefit of the viewing public and where possible, it would be appreciated if exhibitors could name the varieties of their exhibits.
6. Exhibitor tickets must be placed upside down and remain so until judging has been completed.
7. All plates and other staging material must be provided by the exhibitor and will remain their own property.
8. All exhibits are to be staged at the exhibitor's own risk.
9. Exhibitors are **FORBIDDEN** to touch or move other exhibits once staged. **Please ask a Steward for any help.**
10. Judging will take place during the monthly meeting. Members are requested to respect the confidentiality of the judging area.
11. Exhibits will be judged in accordance with The Royal Horticultural Society's Handbook and the Rules or Regulations of the various National Societies.
12. In any class with less than four entries, the prizes may be restricted at the Judge's discretion.
13. If any complaint is made, it must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £1 to the Show Secretary within 2 hours of the Show opening to the public. This will then be considered by the Judge if present or the Committee, and if upheld, the deposit will be returned.
14. Prize monies may be collected from the Show Secretary at the end of the evening.
15. No exhibit must be removed before the end of the Show without the authority of the Show Manager.
16. Trophies, which are the property of the Society, must be returned in good and clean condition prior to the relevant Show.
17. The Society would be grateful to Exhibitors if their exhibits could be left on the Show bench for auction after the Show.
18. The Society will not be responsible in any way for injury or accident to any person, or for loss of, or damage to, property of any such person, from any cause whatsoever before, during or after, the Show.

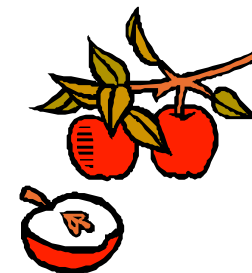
