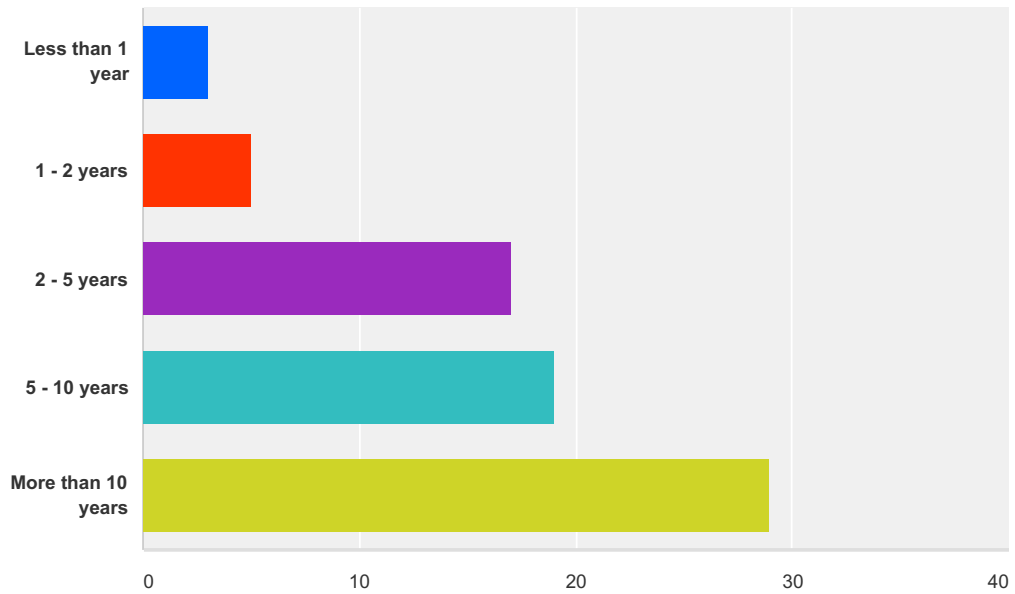


Q1 How long have you been a member of HOEOCA?

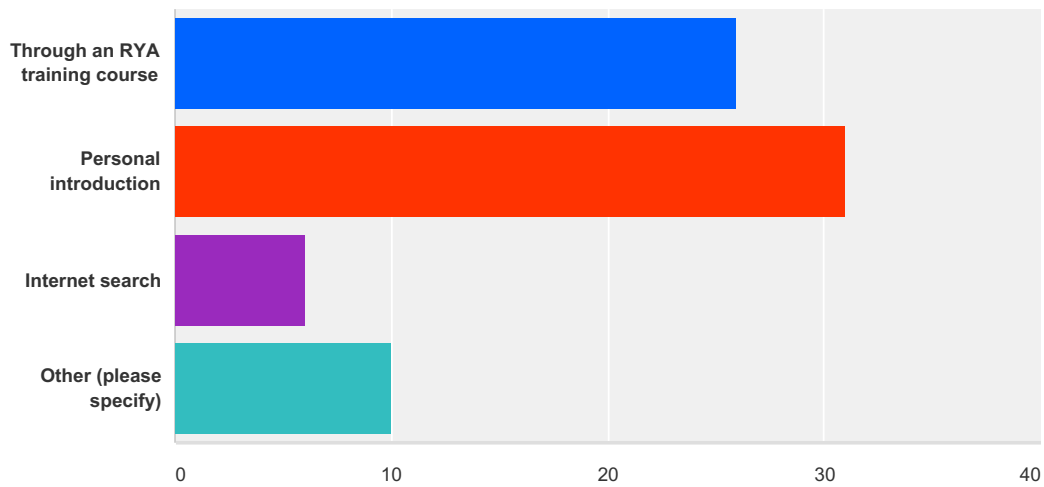

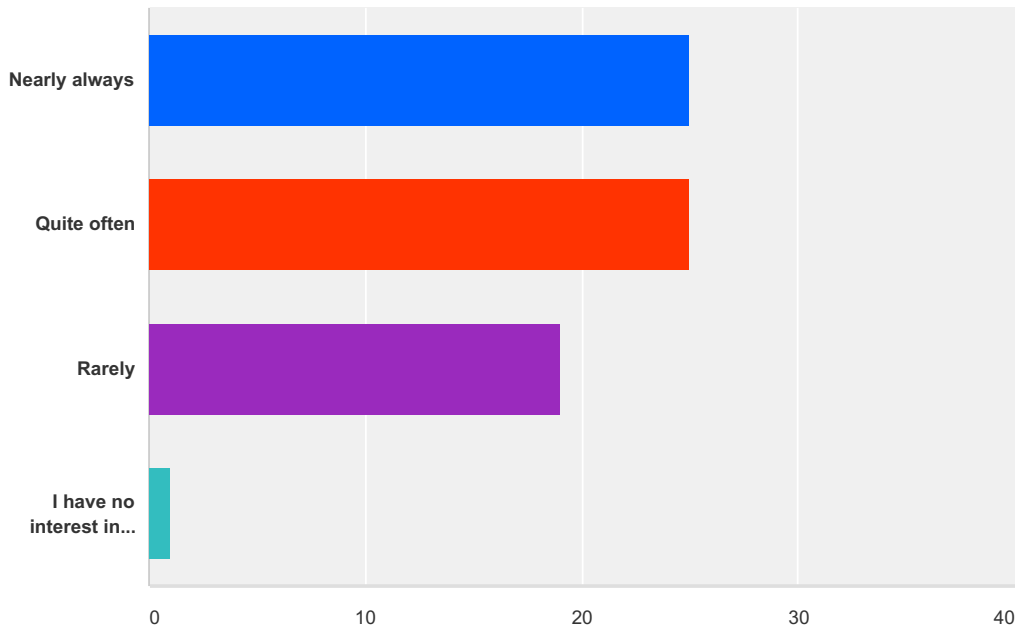

Q7 How often do you take part in club cruising activities?

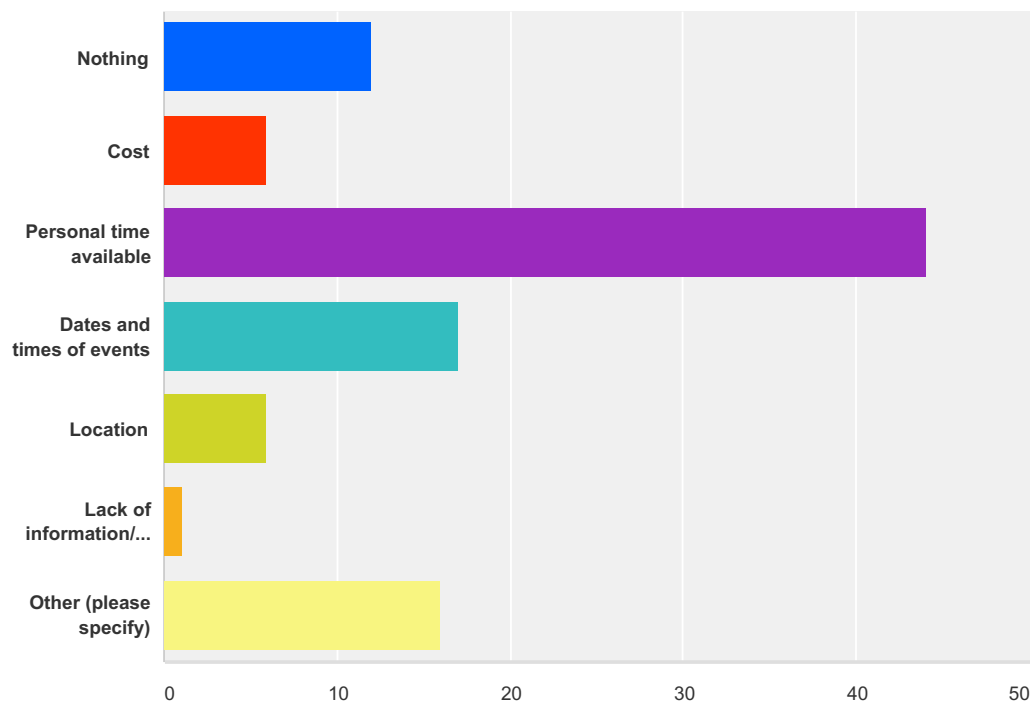

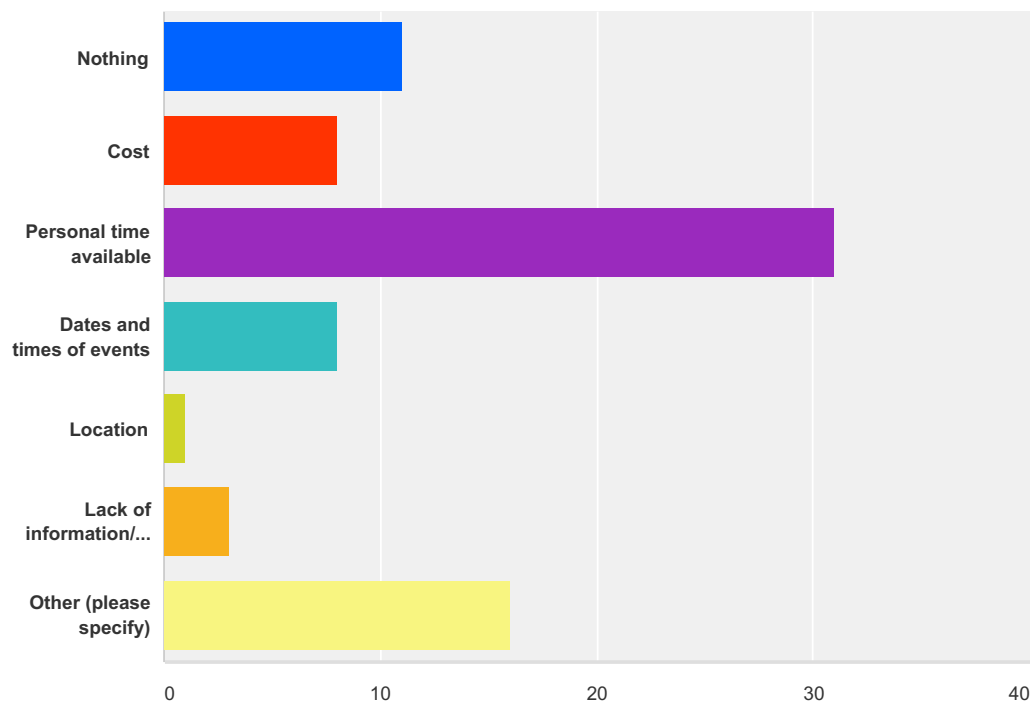

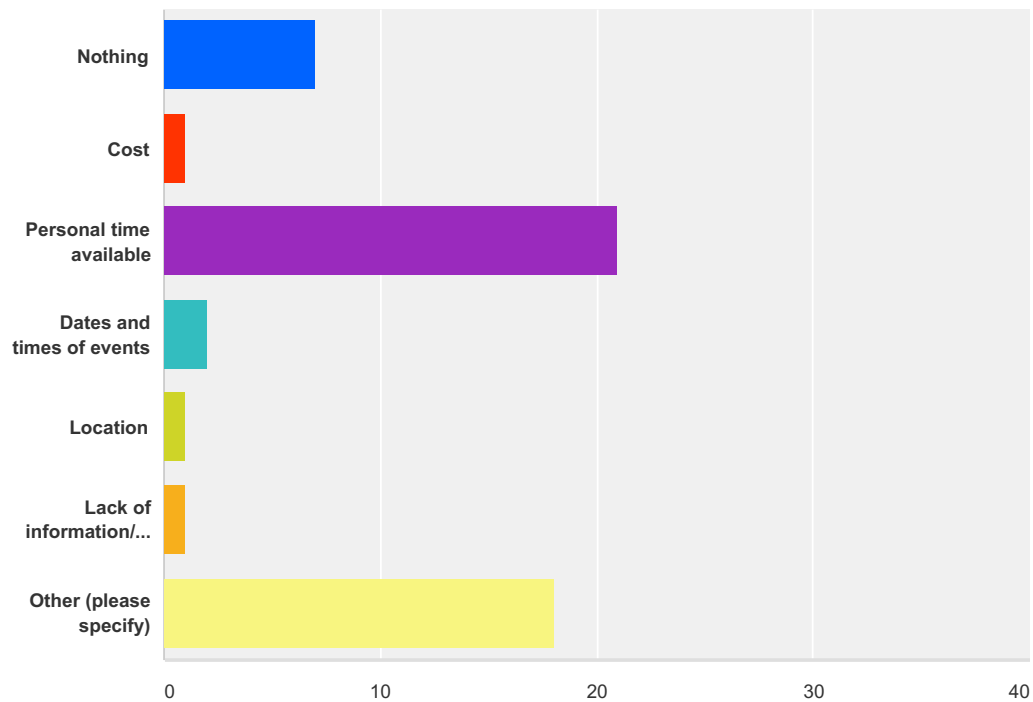

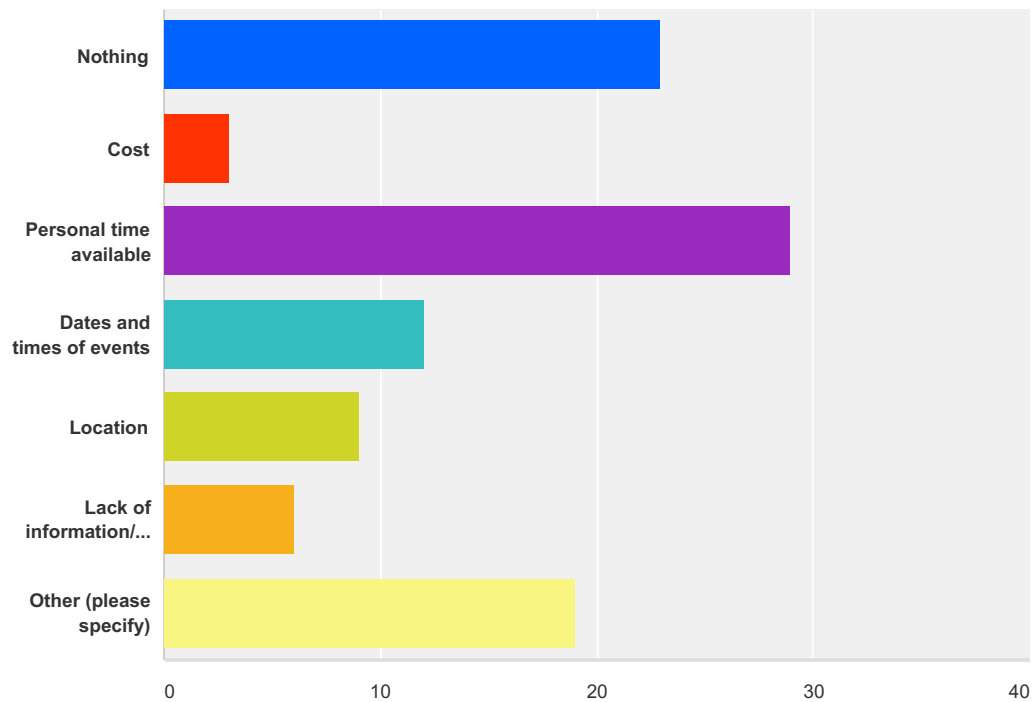

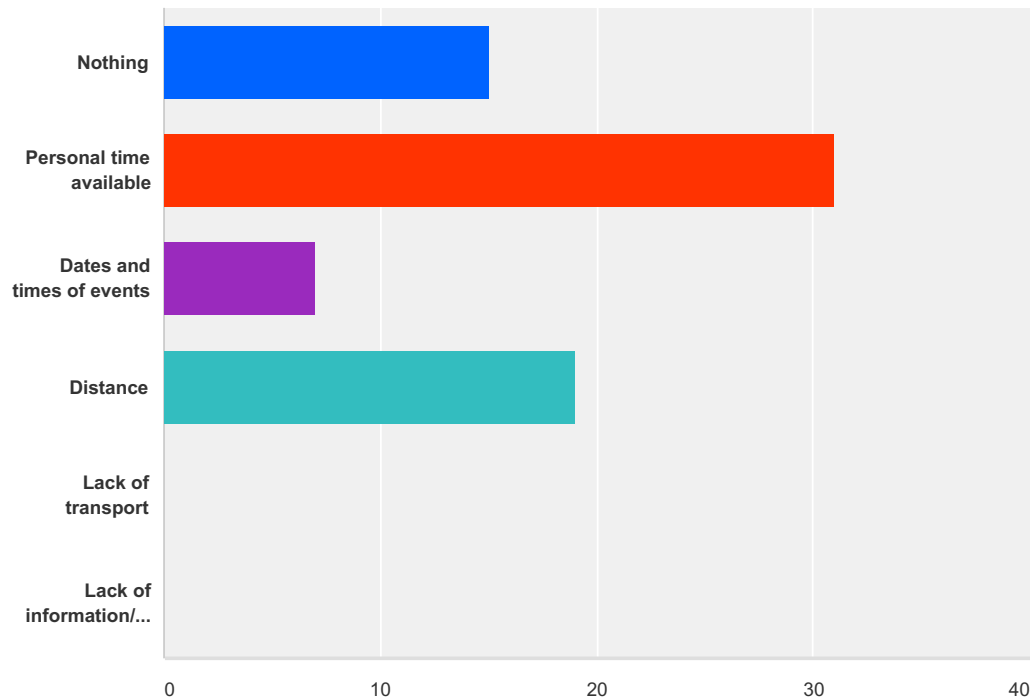

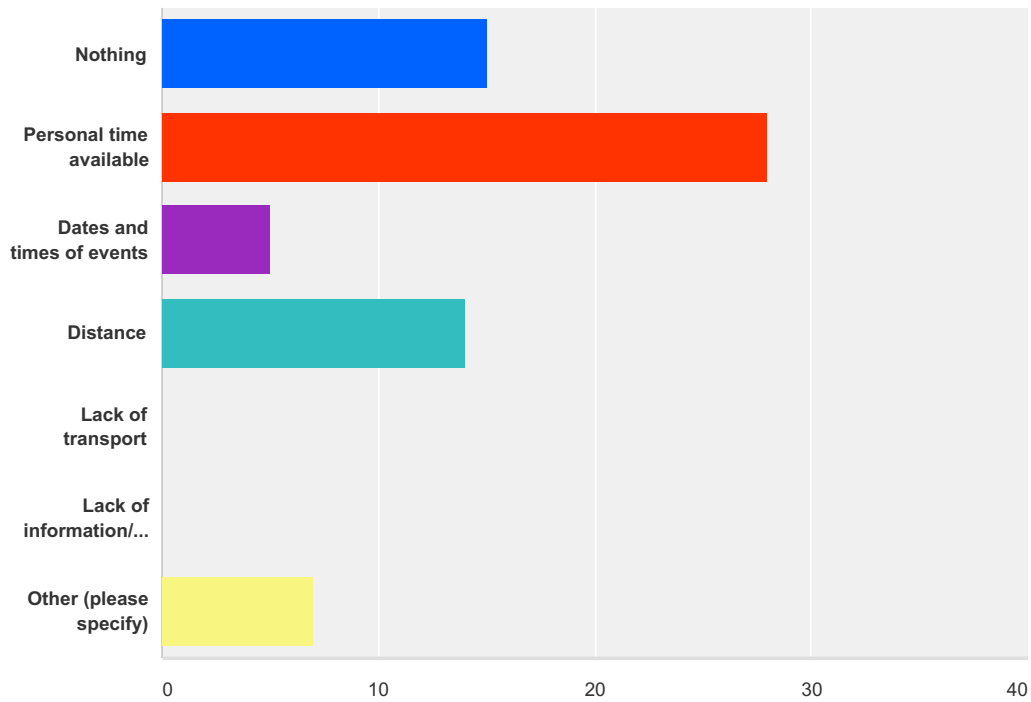

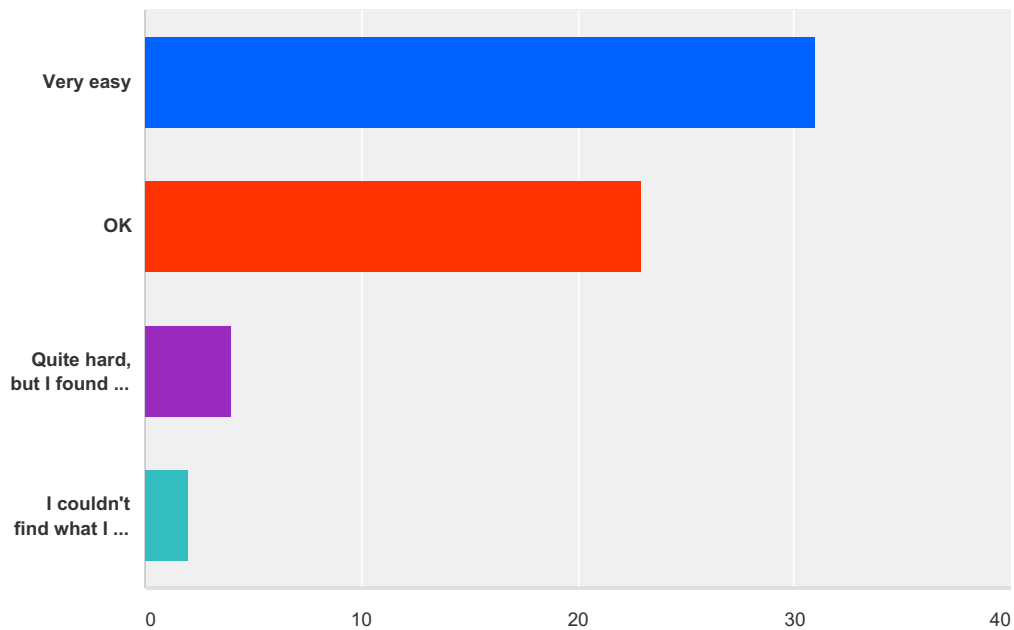

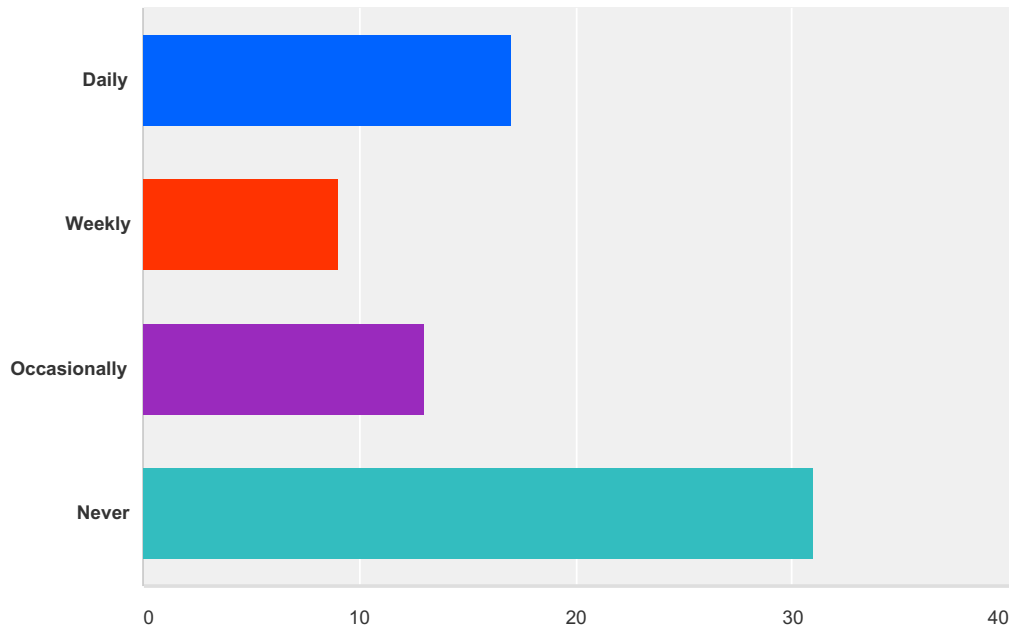

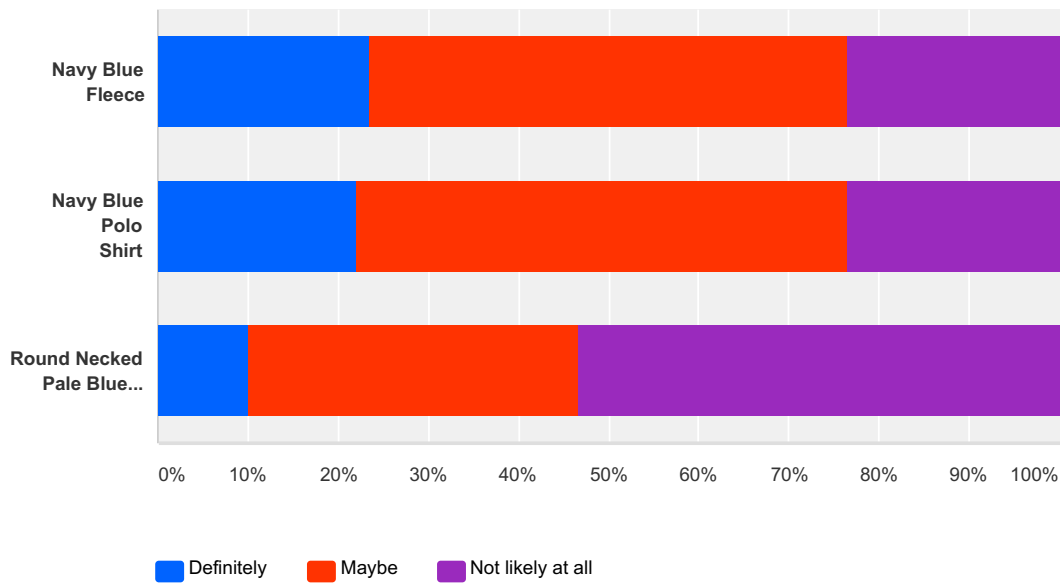

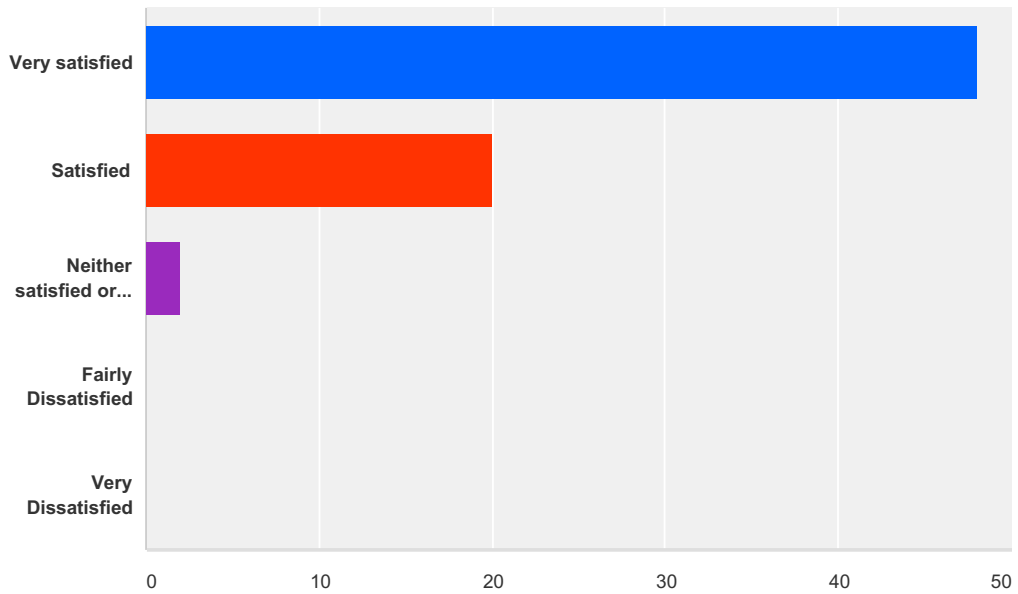

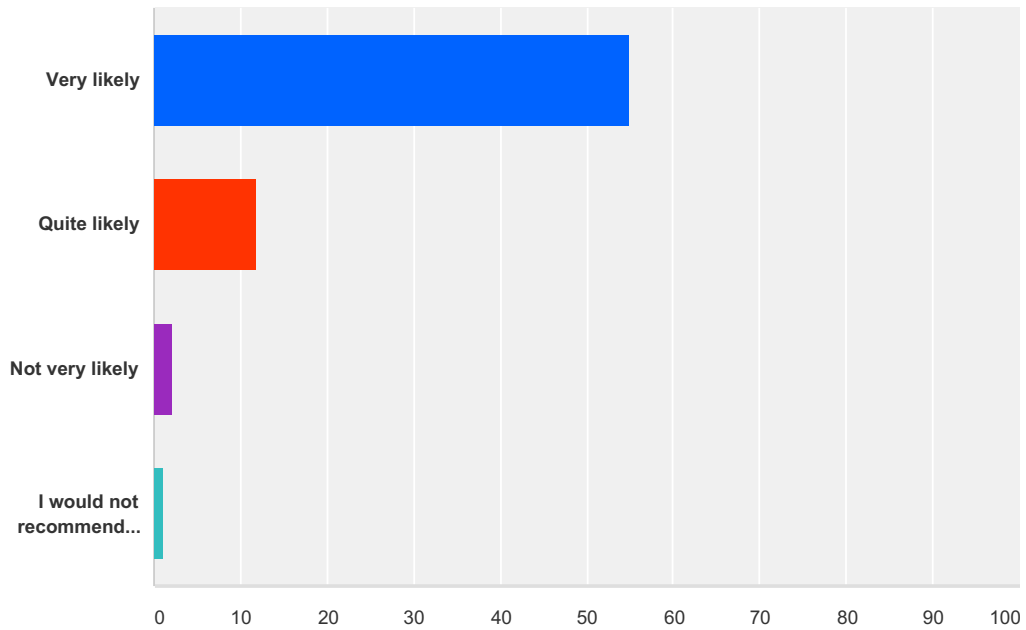

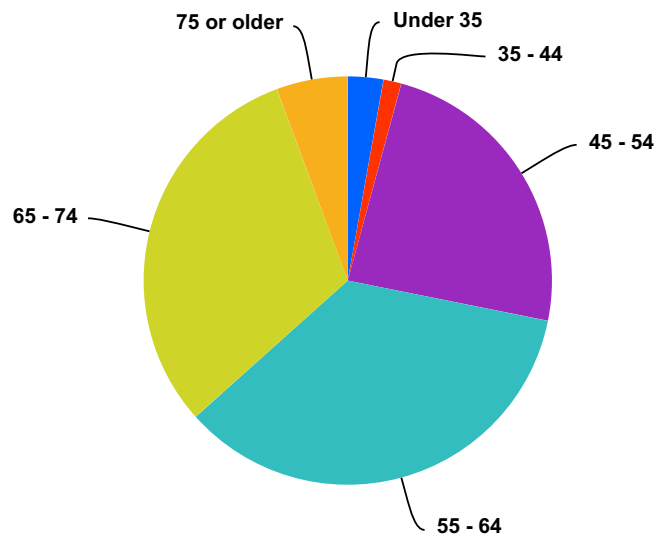

Q34 What is your age?

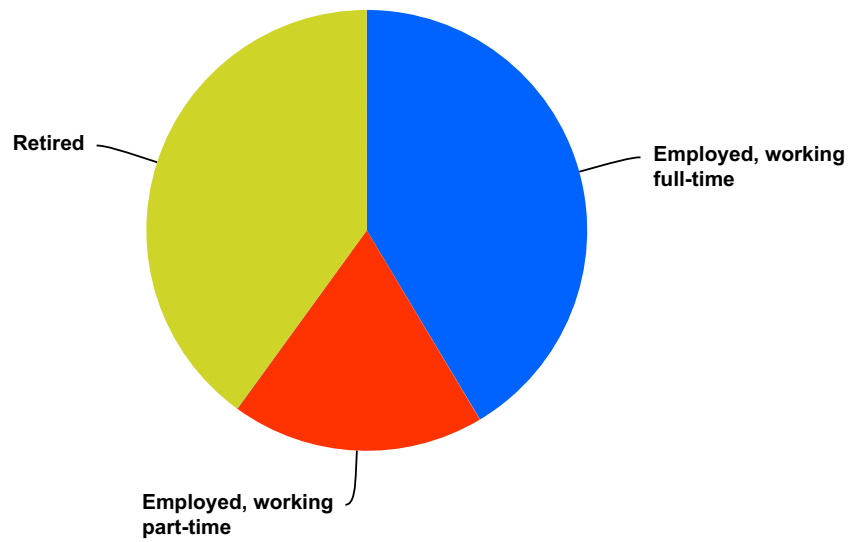

Q35 Which of the following categories best describes your employment status?

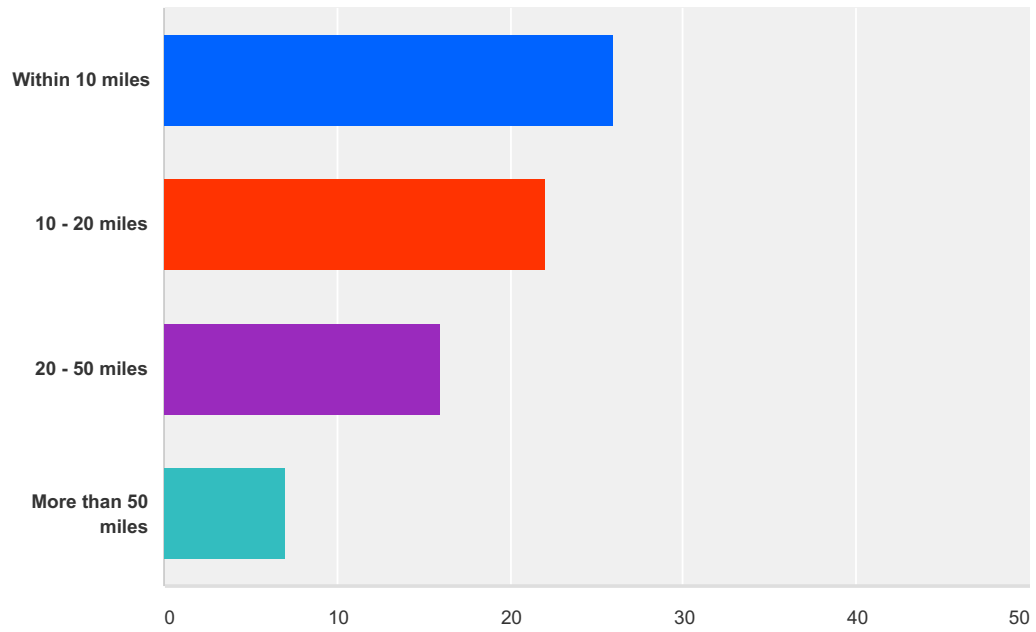
